LSU GOES AFTER THIRD STRAIGHT SEC WIN VS. OLE MISS

The LSU Fighting Tigers will go after their third straight SEC win on Saturday as the Tigers play host to Ole Miss at 8 p.m. in Tiger Stadium in a game televised by ESPN2. LSU enters the contest with a 4-2 overall record and a 2-2 league mark after a 42-0 win over Mississippi State last weekend. Ole Miss, winners of four straight, is 5-1 overall and 2-1 in league play. The Rebels are coming off a 45-17 victory over Middle Tennessee. Saturday's game will feature a matchup of two of the SEC's top offenses as well as two of the premier quarterbacks in the nation in Rohan Davey and Eli Manning. LSU ranks 10th in the nation in total offense (456.5 yards per game), while Ole Miss is 13th in the country in scoring offense (36.5 points per game). Ole Miss features the nation's top rated passing defense (131.3 yards per game), while the Tigers sport the nation's 12th rated passing offense (299.3 yards per game).

TIGERS ARE DOMINATING IN 42-0 WIN OVER MISS. STATE

LSU delivered its most dominant performance of the season as the Tigers rolled to a 42-0 win over Mississippi State in Starkville. Josh Reed caught 10 passes for 146 yards and two touchdowns, while Rohan Davey threw for 255 yards and three TDs as the Tigers took a 14-0 halftime lead and blew it open with a 21-point third quarter. The shutout was the first for the Tigers in an SEC road game since shutting out Alabama 27-0 at Tuscaloosa in 1997. The margin of victory was the highest for LSU in an SEC game since 1986. The Tiger defense forced four turnovers with all four resulting in touchdowns for LSU. Damien James picked off his nation's best fifth pass in the contest.

LSU FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

LSU returns home for just the second time since Sept. 8 when they host Ole Miss on Saturday ... LSU is 2-1 at home this season with the loss coming to Florida ... Dating back to last season, the Tigers have won six of their last seven and eight of their last 10 home games ... LSU has also won four of its last five SEC home games ... With road wins over Kentucky and Mississippi State in consecutive weeks, LSU won back-to-back SEC road games for the first time since going 4-0 on the road in league play in 1997 ... LSU has scored 20 or more points in all 12 of its victories under Nick Saban ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 0-6 under Saban when failing to reach the 20 point mark ... LSU is 9-2 under Saban, including a 4-1 mark this year, when scoring first ... LSU is also 10-1 under Saban (4-1 in 2001) when leading at halftime and the Tigers are 9-0 under Saban (4-0 in 2001) when leading after three quarters ... Over his last 12 games (including the 2000 Peach Bowl), LSU QB Rohan Davey has thrown 22 TD passes compared to just four interceptions ... LSU hasn't been shutout since the Alabama game on Nov. 9, 1996 - a span of 56 games ... LSU RB LaBrandon Toefield has rushed for 10 TDs in just six games this year, tying Charles Alexander in 1977 as the two fastest running backs in school history to reach 10 TDs in a season ... The Tigers are 2-0 this season, 5-0 under Saban, and 37-9 since 1990 when an LSU running back rushes for 100 yards in a game ... Overall, LSU has won seven straight games when having a 100-yard rusher ... WR Josh Reed recorded his sixth straight 100-yard game vs. Mississippi State and tied Wendell Davis' school-record mark of 13 career 100-yard games ... Reed also became only the fourth player in LSU history to go over 2,000 receiving yards in a career ... Reed enters the Ole Miss contest with 2,074 yards on 115 receptions ... LSU forced four turnovers vs. Mississippi State and the Tigers responded with touchdowns on all four takeaways.

WHO'S IN AND WHO'S OUT FOR THE TIGERS

Senior cornerback Robert Davis (knee) is out for the remainder of the season after suffering a knee injury against Utah State in week two of the season. Cornerback Norman Lejeune (neck) remains out. Lejeune hasn't played since the Tennessee contest. Offensive guard Stephen Peterman (ankle) is questionable for Saturday's contest. Peterman was injured in the second half on Saturday and he didn't return.

LSU ON ESPN2

LSU enters the Ole Miss contest with a 5-2 mark in games televised by ESPN. LSU is 1-0 vs. Ole Miss on ESPN2 as the Tigers posted a 20-9 victory over the Rebels last year in Oxford in a game televised by the network. LSU is 2-1 at home on ESPN2.

REED REACHES 2,000 CAREER YARDS; MOVES TO 4TH ALL-TIME AT LSU

LSU receiver Josh Reed moved into fourth place on the all-time LSU receiving yardage list on Saturday with 2,074 career yards after hauling in 10 passes for 146 yards in the win over Mississippi State. Reed is only the fourth player in LSU history to reach 2,000 career yards joining Wendell Davis (2,708), Eric Martin (2,625) and Tony Moss (2,196). Reed is also the fastest to 2,000 yards, taking only 20 regular season games (counting only his games at receiver, not at running back). It took Wendell Davis 26 games from the time he recorded his first reception to reach 2,000 yards (37 if you add his freshman season where he lettered but did not record a statistic). Eric Martin went over 2,000 yards in his 34th game.

TIGERS AIM FOR THIRD STRAIGHT SEC WIN

With a win over Ole Miss on Saturday, the Tigers can win their third straight SEC game in the same season for only the third time since 1989. The Tigers won four straight SEC games a year ago en route to the Peach Bowl and won their final three conference games in 1997 en route to the Independence Bowl. The Tigers haven't won five straight

REED RANKS SECOND IN NATION IN RECEIVING YARDS PER GAME

Josh Reed continues to pile up the receiving yardage as the junior from Rayne, La., ranks second in the nation in receiving yards per contest with 135.5 yards per game. Reed is coming off a 10 reception, 146 yard receiving game vs. Mississippi State. Through six games, Reed has caught 42 passes for 813 yards and three TDs. Reed, who leads the SEC in both receptions per game and receiving yards per game, ranks 14th nationally with 7.0 catches a contest.

DAMIEN JAMES HAS ANOTHER PICK; LEADS NATION WITH FIVE

Damien James' knack for coming up with big plays continued on Saturday as he intercepted a Kevin Fant pass at the LSU 15-yard line and returned it 21 yards. The interception, which eventually led to LSU's second TD of the game, marked James' fifth of the season, a number that leads the nation. James has four interceptions over LSU's last three games, including a pair of picks against Kentucky. James had his first career start at cornerback vs. Mississippi State and he responded with four tackles to go along with the interception. James had four career starts prior to Saturday, all coming as a nickel back.

LSU RANKS SECOND IN NATION IN NET PUNTING

LSU's punt coverage unit continues to be outstanding as the Tigers lead the SEC and rank second in the nation in net punting with an average of 42.0 yards per punt. Through six games, the Tigers are allowing only 3.4 yards per return.

LSU'S FAULK NAMED ONE OF 12 SEMIFINALIST FOR BUTKUS AWARD

LSU linebacker Trev Faulk has been named one of 12 semifinalists for the Butkus Award, the The Downtown Athletic Club of Orlando announced last week. The Butkus Award is awarded annually to the nation's best linebacker in college football. Faulk, who was listed as the nation's top rated inside linebacker by the Sporting News during the summer, has registered 63 tackles in six games for the Tigers. Faulk, a junior from Lafayette, recorded a season-best of 18 tackles in LSU's loss to Tennessee and he had 13 tackles vs. Mississippi State last Saturday.

TIGER OFFENSE ON RECORD PACE

LSU is on pace to break some of its most prestigious offensive records all in the same season. With 1,630 yards passing through five games, quarterback Rohan Davey is on pace to become the Tigers' first 3,000-yard passer and break the single season LSU record of 2,655 by Tommy Hodson in 1989. At 271 yards a game, Davey is on pace for 2,988 yards. On the other end of Davey's passes, Josh Reed is averaging 135.5 yards per game and is on pace for 1,490 yards which would easily outdistance the 1,244 by Wendell Davis in 1986. With 10 rushing touchdowns in six games, LaBrandon Toefield is on pace for over 18, which would surpass the 17 registered by Charles Alexander in 1977.

As a unit, the LSU offense is averaging 456.5 yards per game, which is on pace to break the school record of 440.3 yards per contest set by the 1987 team. Through six games, LSU has accumulated 2,739 yards of total offense, put the Tigers on pace to break the school-record of 4,843 yards held by the 1987 team.

TIGERS MAKE THE MOST OF MISSISSIPPI STATE TURNOVERS

LSU made the most of Mississippi State turnovers last week as the Tigers turned four Bulldog turnovers in 28 points. LSU scored on every turnover in which it received. Through six games, the Tigers have recorded 14 turnovers for 45 points. However, going into the Mississippi State game, LSU had only scored 17 points off of 13 turnovers. The Tigers nearly doubled their season-long production on points off of turnovers against Mississippi State. It also marked the first time since the Utah State game in week two in which the Tigers were able to capitalize off an opponents miscue.

DAVEY PASSES TITTLE, MOVES INTO TOP 10

With a 29-yard pass to Josh Reed in the second quarter, Rohan Davey moved passed legendary LSU quarterback and NFL Hall of Famer Y.A. Tittle into 10th place in LSU history in passing yardage. The pass gave Davey 2,546 yards at the time. Tittle, a letterwinner from 1944-47, threw for 2,525 yards in his career at LSU. For his career, Davey has completed 172 of 287 passes for 2,696 yards and 20 TDs. The 20 career TD passes ranks ninth in school history.

REED NAMED TO CNNSI.COM MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICAN TEAM

The nation is taking notice of junior receiver Josh Reed and with plenty of reason. Reed has had at least 120 yards receiving in each of the Tigers six games this season and is on pace to shatter the LSU single season receiving yardage record. Reed was recognized last week by CNNSI.com as a first-team receiver on its midseason All-American team. Through six games this year, Reed has caught 42 passes for 813 yards and three TDs.

REED'S BIG PLAYS CONTINUE

Josh Reed continues to pile up huge chunks of yardage every time he gets his hands on the ball. With a 42-yard reception on the Tigers' second offensive play, Reed now has at least one 30-yard reception in every game this season. The catch was his 10th play of better than 30 yards on the season.

REED TIES LSU RECORD FOR MOST CAREER 100-YARD GAMES

With a 29-yard reception in the second quarter, Josh Reed went over 100 yards receiving in a game for the 13th time in his career matching Wendell Davis for the most career 100-yard games in LSU history. Reed accomplished the feat in only 20 games since moving to the position in 1999. Reed has posted 100-yard games in all six of the Tigers' games this season and nine of the last 11 LSU regular season games. Reed is the first player in LSU history to open a season with six straight 100-yard games and his streak of six consecutive 100-yard games is a school-record. LSU is 9-4 when Reed has 100 yards or more receiving in a game.

TIGERS UNDEFEATED WHEN DAVEY THROWS THREE TDs

The Tigers moved to a perfect 5-0 all-time when Rohan Davey throws for three or more touchdown passes in their 42-0 victory over Mississippi State last weekend. Davey threw three TD passes against Arkansas in 1999, three against Western Carolina last year, four against Tennessee last year, three in the Peach Bowl victory over Georgia Tech and three on Saturday against Mississippi State.

TOEFIELD MATCHES CHARLES ALEXANDER FOR FEWEST GAMES NEEDED FOR 10 TOUCHDOWNS

With a 7-yard touchdown run in the second quarter of the Mississippi State game, LaBrandon Toefield matched Charles Alexander for the fastest Tiger ever to 10 rushing touchdowns, accomplishing the feat in the sixth game of the season. Alexander reached the mark in the sixth game of the 1977 season and eventually went on to score a school record 17. With 10 in six games, Toefield is still on pace to break the record. Toefield is on pace for 18.3 TDs this year.

BRIEFLY ABOUT THE MISSISSIPPI STATE SHUTOUT

The shutout was the first SEC road shutout for the Tigers since beating Alabama 27-0 in Tuscaloosa in 1997. It was the largest margin of victory in an SEC game since a 47-0 shutout of Mississippi State in Jackson in 1986 and their largest margin of victory on an opponent's home field since a 44-0 victory at Colorado in 1979. The 42 point victory also marked the largest margin of victory for the Tigers on an SEC opponents home field since LSU beat Tulane, 62-0, in New Orleans in 1958.

20 POINTS THE MAGIC MARK FOR LSU

Nick Saban has been head coach at LSU for 18 games now and there has been one constant theme in all of those games - the Tigers are 12-0 when scoring 20+ points and 0-6 when scoring under 20 points. This season, LSU is averaging 37.5 points in its four victories, while managing only 16.5 points in its two losses. In their seven regular season wins a year ago they averaged 36 points per game. In their four losses, they scored a total of 39 points.

TIGERS PIN 40 POINTS ON STATE FOR THIRD TIME IN FOUR YEARS

The Tigers have had three 40-point-plus games in conference play over the last four years and all three have come at the expense of Mississippi State. The Tigers won 41-6 in Baton Rouge in 1998, 45-38 in overtime a year ago, and then tagged a 42-0 pasting on the Bulldogs in Starkville last weekend.

TRUE FRESHMEN CONTINUE TO PLAY A KEY ROLE

Several Tiger true freshmen continue to play a key role on this 2001 squad. Michael Clayton hauled in a 20-yard reception to the Mississippi State 1-yard line, giving him at least one catch in every game this season. Ben Wilkerson started his second consecutive game at center, while Marcus Spears has been used in a variety of roles, from tight end to fullback and even on the defensive side of the ball in the Mississippi State game. For the season, Clayton has caught 22 passes for 362 yards and three TDs, while Spears has a pair of receptions for 21 yards.

STREAKS EXTENDED

Senior free safety Ryan Clark made his team-leading 29th consecutive start dating back to the 1999 season opener against San Jose State. Trev Faulk made his 26th straight start at linebacker dating back to the fourth game of his freshman season at Georgia. Jerel Myers started for the 28th time in 29 career games. The only non-start during Myers' three-year career was the 1999 season finale against Arkansas when the Tigers started in a three tight end alignment.

ALL HE DOES IS CATCH TOUCHDOWNS

Eric Edwards caught a 29-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter of the Tigers' victory over Mississippi State. It moved his season totals to two catches and two touchdowns for 32 yards. Of his last five catches dating back to last season, four have been for touchdowns.

MYERS A MODEL OF CONSISTENCY

With an 11-yard reception, Jerel Myers has now caught a pass in 28 of 29 career games. The lone exception was last year's victory over Ole Miss. Myers has now caught at least one pass in seven straight games, the second longest on the team behind Josh Reed's 21 game streak.

DAVEY TIES LSU RECORD FOR MOST CAREER 300-YARD GAMES

With 383 yards passing against Kentucky on Oct. 13, Rohan Davey posted the third 300-yard game of his career, matching the school record for career 300-yard games. Davey matched former Tiger signal-caller Jamie Howard, who posted three 300-yard passing games between 1992-95. All three of Davey's 300-yard games have come in his last seven starts. Through the first six games of the season, true freshman Michael Clayton has quickly emerged as a strong compliment to receiver Josh Reed. The Baton Rouge native had career-highs of nine receptions for 105 yards and two touchdowns in the Tigers' dramatic victory over Kentucky. Clayton hauled in the game-winning reception with just 13 seconds remaining to lift LSU to victory. On the Tigers final drive, Clayton came up huge, catching four passes for 46 yards. Three of his four catches came on third down while his other was an 18-yard grab on second-and-19 after Davey had been sacked the previous play. Clayton followed the Kentucky game with a two receptions for 47 yards against Mississippi State.

TIGERS PUT THIRD QUARTER WOES BEHIND THEM AT MISSISSIPPI STATE

LSU's season-long third quarter scoring drought came to an end on Saturday against Mississippi State as the Tigers produced 21 third quarter points against the Bulldogs. The 21 points vs. Mississippi State tripled LSU's third quarter output heading into the contest. Going into the Mississippi State game, LSU had produced only seven

TOEFIELD CONTINUES TO LEAD THE SEC IN SCORING

LaBrandon Toefield continues to lead the SEC in scoring as the sophomore running back scored his 10th TD of the season on Saturday against Mississippi State. Through six games, Toefield has scored 60 points for an average of 10 a contest, a figure that ranks ninth nationally.

TIGERS SPREAD THE WEALTH IN PASSING GAME

One thing is for sure, LSU can never be accused of focusing on one receiver in its passing game as 13 different players - six split ends, four tight ends, two tailbacks and one fullback - have caught passes for the Tigers this season. Spreading the football around has become a trademark of the Jimbo Fisher offense as last year, 13 Tigers caught passes during the regular-season. The Tigers have five players, three wide receivers, one tight end and one running back, with at least 10 receptions this year.

LSU CONTINUES TO BE THE BEST IN THE LEAGUE ON THIRD DOWN

LSU continues to be the best in the SEC when it comes to third down situations as the Tigers have converted on 48 of their 89 third down opportunities this year for 53.9 percent. On Saturday vs. Mississippi State, the Tigers were four of 11 on third down opportunities.

LSU'S SPECIAL TEAMS COVERAGE HAS BEEN OUTSTANDING

LSU's special teams coverage continues to be outstanding as the Tigers are allowing an SEC-best 13.9 yards per kickoff return and only 3.4 yards per punt return. Against Mississippi State, the Tigers kicked off seven times and the Bulldogs started their possessions inside the 20 five times, including three inside the 10-yard line. On 29 kickoff returns this season, the Tigers have allowed only 20 yards or more just five times. LSU has kicked off 33 times this year and its opponent has started outside the 20-yard line only nine times.

PUNTER JONES' PLAY HAS BEEN CRITICAL

The play of sophomore punter Donnie Jones has been vital to the Tigers' success this season. Through six games, Jones is averaging 43.9 yards per punt, fourth in the SEC and 19th in the nation. Jones, who punts left-footed, punts a high ball with enough hang time which gives LSU's defenders the opportunity to get down field to be in position to make a play on the returner.

HEAD COACH NICK SABAN

In his second year with the Tigers and eighth overall ... Has an overall mark of 55-32-1, which includes a 12-6 record at LSU ... Coached one season at Toledo (1990) and then spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State (1995-99) ... LSU led 7-3 at halftime and increased its lead to 14-3 on a 1-yard run by Davis late in the third quarter. The Tigers sealed the victory on another 1-yard run by Davis with 4:08 left in the contest.

LSU's defense limited Ole Miss to just three field goals, and the Tigers held Heisman Trophy Candidate Deuce McAllister to just 48 yards rushing on 24 carries.

Rohan Davey's hail Mary attempt on the game's final play fell just short as LSU dropped a 26-18 decision to seventh-ranked Tennessee in Knoxville on Saturday. Davey threw for a career high 356 yards and a pair of touchdown passes, but the Tiger defense could not contain Tennessee receiver Kelley Washington, who hauled in 11 passes for 256 yards, including a 70-yard touchdown reception. The Tigers led 7-6 at halftime by virtue of a 67-yard strike from Davey to true freshman Michael Clayton. Tennessee took over the game in the third quarter, however, scoring a pair of touchdowns before building an insurmountable 26-7 lead early in the fourth quarter. The Tigers added a touchdown and a field goal in the fourth quarter and was inside the Vols' 45-yard line when time expired. Josh Reed hauled in seven passes for 125 yards and a TD for the Tigers.

LAST MINUTE HEROICS LIFTS LSU PAST UK, 29-25

Rohan Davey fired a 6-yard touchdown pass to true freshman Michael Clayton with just 13 seconds remaining as the LSU Tigers rallied for a dramatic 29-25 win over Kentucky in Lexington. Davey threw for a career-high 383 yards - the third best performance in LSU history - while Clayton caught a career-high nine passes for 105 yards and two touchdowns. With LSU leading 22-10 in the third quarter, Kentucky brought in back-up quarterback Jared Lorenzen who rallied the Cats to back-to-back touchdowns, giving Kentucky a 25-22 lead with just under nine minutes remaining before LSU rallied.
