Game 9: LSU at Houston—Friday, Feb. 22, 7 p.m., Houston

LSU plays its first weekend series away from Alex Box Stadium under Smoke Laval starting tonight at Houston.

- LSU is on a four-game winning streak following Wednesday's 7-6 win at Centenary in the Tigers' first road game of 2002.
- The Tigers are now 3-1 this year in one-run games after going 5-7 in those contests a year ago.

Scouting the Cougars: The Cougars come into their first home series of 2002 at 4-3 after Wednesday's 10-4 win over Baylor in their home opener.

- Houston began the season by beating Baylor and Texas A&M and losing to Texas in the Astros College Classic at Enron Field.
- The Cougars have twice appeared in NCAA regionals at Alex Box Stadium, coming in third in 1990 behind LSU and USC and tied for fifth in 1997.
- UH has made three straight trips to the NCAA tournament and four in seven years under coach Rayner Noble, a former UH pitcher.
- UH's talented pitching staff is led by sophomore right-hander Brad Sullivan, who has not allowed an earned run in 11.1 innings this year.

About the series: LSU swept three games last year at Alex Box Stadium but the Cougars still hold a 17-10 series edge.

- The Tigers won last year's games by scores of 9-4, 4-1 and 14-6. The victories were part of a season-high 11-game winning streak for LSU.
- The Cougars came into Baton Rouge and did the unthinkable in 2000, sweeping three games by scores of 10-2, 11-7 and 10-2. It marked the first non-conference sweep of three games or more at Baton Rouge since 1969, and the first time LSU had been swept at home since 1988.
- Houston won three of four in the first series between the teams in 1975, but LSU recovered that year to win the SEC championship.
- The teams have split two post-season meetings, as Houston won in the 1985 Central Regional at Austin, with LSU winning in the 1990 South I Regional at The Box.
- This will mark LSU's first visit to Houston since 1994, when the Tigers won two at the old Cougar Field.

Tonight's Starting Pitcher

#34 Junior RHP Bo Pettit (Jr.-2L, 6-0, 205, Houston–Sharpstown HS)

It's a big night for Bo Pettit, as the Tiger hurler will be starting on the hill in his hometown of Houston. Pettit has looked sharp in his first two outings of the season, and if healthy, will be a key cog in the Tigers' deep but inexperienced staff.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: Is 1–0 with a 2.63 ERA in two starts.

- Tied a career high with 12 strikeouts in the Tigers' Feb. 15 victory over Mercer.
- Went a career high 7.2 innings in Mercer game, not yielding an earned run and carrying a shutout into the eighth inning.
- Started season opener vs. Birmingham-Southern on Feb. 8 and struck out eight in 6.0 innings.

2001: Posted 4-0 mark with a 2.42 ERA, but only appeared in 7 games (4 starts) due to continuing shoulder ailments.

- Struck out five in two innings in his first appearance of 2001 vs. Nicholls St. on Feb. 27
- Earned his first win of the season against Southern on Mar. 13, going five innings and allowing two runs on two hits.
- Best outing of season came Mar. 23 at Mississippi St., as he allowed no earned runs in 6.1 innings to pick up the victory.
- Did not return to action again until May 1 at New Orleans, when he went three innings and allowed just one hit and no earned runs while striking out five.

2000: Went 5-3 with a 4.15 ERA in 16 games (7 starts), but season ended early due to tendonitis in his shoulder.

- Best effort came in Apr. 30 win at Ole Miss in first career SEC start. In that game, Pettit allowed one run on five hits and struck out a career-high 12 in seven innings.
- Earned his first career win in second game of doubleheader vs. Virginia on Feb. 12, starting and throwing six scoreless innings, striking out six and allowing just two hits.
- Threw two scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in relief stint vs. McNeese St. on Feb. 22.
- Hurlled four scoreless and hitless innings in start vs. New Orleans on Mar. 22, picking up victory with six strikeouts.
- Final outing of season came on May 6 at Kentucky, where he earned win with six strikeouts over 6.2 innings.

1999: Was granted a medical redshirt after pitching in only three early-season games.

- Made his first career appearance on Feb. 27 against Central Florida, going 1.1 innings and giving up two runs on four hits, walking one and striking out one.

Texas two-step

This weekend's series with Houston marks LSU's first visit to the Lone Star State since 1998, when the Tigers dropped two of three against Texas at Austin.

In fact, the Tigers played at least one school from Texas every year in the Skip Bertman era except in 1996. Under Bertman, LSU posted a 38-23 mark against schools from the Lone Star State, including a 12-0 record against two schools that no longer sponsor the sport—Stephen F. Austin (9-0) and North Texas (3-0).

LSU was 4-1 under Bertman in Space City, going 2-1 against Rice in 1990 and 2-0 against UH in 1994 at the old Cougar Field. Both schools in Houston built new facilities in the second half of the 1990s.

Bertman had a losing record against two Texas schools, going 4-7 against the Longhorns and 1-5 against Lamar.

Of course, Texas is a familiar place to LSU coach Smoke Laval. During Laval's seven-year tenure as coach at Louisiana-Monroe, the Indians played five schools from Texas each year in Southland Conference play.

LSU also appeared in two regionals in Texas, going 0-2 in the 1985 Central Regional at Austin and winning the 1989 Central Regional at College Station over No. 1 Texas A&M.

Determann to the rescue

How about having to pitch four innings of relief, all in extra innings for your first career college outing, then having to start on five minutes' notice in your second career game? LSU's Jason Determann did just that and came through with flying colors.

The true freshman from Baton Rouge's Catholic High came into Wednesday's game against Centenary not having pitched in 10 days, but when scheduled starter Chad Vaught came up with a sore arm prior to the first pitch, Smoke Laval thrust the left-hander into the starting assignment.

Determann went three innings and did not allow a run, striking out three to lower his ERA on the year to 1.29. His only other outing prior to Wednesday was a 4.0 inning relief outing on Feb. 9 against Birmingham-Southern, where Determann got the win.

Despite only going three innings, Determann's start was another strong one for LSU's starters, who enter this weekend's series in Houston with a 3-0 mark and a 3.28 ERA in 46.2 innings pitched. Five of the eight starts have reached the seventh inning.

Comeback Kids

Yes, you would like to win more games by comfortable margins. But give LSU's kiddie corps a lot of credit, because they have shown the moxie of a veteran club on many occasions so far this season.

Wednesday's ninth inning rally over Centenary marked the third time this year that LSU overcame a last-inning deficit to win a game. The Tigers overcame ninth-inning shortfall to defeat Birmingham-Southern in the season opener, then twice came back in extra innings against BSC to win the second game in 13 innings.

Combined with a 4-3 loss to SLU on Feb. 12, the Tigers are now 3-1 this year in one-run games, compared to 5-7 in 2001.

The win over Centenary broke a long drought, as the last time LSU had won a road game when trailing entering the final inning was on Apr. 12, 1995, when the Tigers defeated Tulane 4-3 on a two-run home run by Warren Morris (fittingly) at Turchin Stadium.

Last year, LSU did not have to make one rally to win a game in its last at-bat. The only games LSU won in the final innings—at Georgia on Mar. 10 in 11 innings, and at Alabama on Apr. 28—were tied before the Tigers prevailed.

And with every comeback, there has been a different hero. Wednesday's hero was David Raymer, who drove in the winning runs with his two-run double in the ninth. That double, combined with an earlier RBI ground out, gave the senior center fielder a career-high 3 RBI in the game, Raymer's third three-RBI game of his career.

Pontiff gets night off

There was a familiar face missing from LSU's lineup in Shreveport on Wednesday, as Wally Pontiff was held out of the starting lineup to give young Clay Harris the opportunity to start at third base.

Pontiff was in the on-deck circle to pinch hit in the ninth inning, but after David Raymer doubled home the eventual winning run, Rocky Scelfo batted for himself.

It marked the first time since May 13, 2000 that Pontiff was not in the starting lineup, breaking a string of 88 consecutive starts. The Tiger with the longest games-played streak is now David Raymer with

Wiethorn, Hahn join homer parade

Two LSU players made personal history Wednesday at Centenary with their first career LSU home runs.

Eric Wiethorn got his in the fifth with a towering blast over the 20-foot high wall in left field, as the ball eventually landed in the parking lot behind the fence more than 410 feet away.

Hahn's homer was more crucial, as the true freshman hit for Wiethorn in the seventh and knocked a two-run blast off the scoreboard in right-center for a 5-4 lead, although that margin wouldn't last, either.

Hahn's home run is the third pinch-hit home run in as many games for the Tigers, and all of them have been by true freshmen in the seventh inning! Jason Vargas and Clay Harris hit grand slams last Saturday and Sunday, respectively, against Mercer. LSU had a total of three pinch-hit home runs from 1999-2001.

After failing to hit a home run in the Birmingham-Southern series, the Tigers have hit six round-trippers in the last five games, as Wednesday's game was the first multi-homer game of the year.

Tigers look to continue fantastic Friday
Winning the first game of a three-game series is important, because coaches stress that a game-one victory means that his team only has to play .500 baseball to win.

LSU has certainly been good on Friday so far this year, winning the series opener against both Birmingham-Southern and Mercer.

Last year, LSU was 11-4 in the opening game of a series (including the super regional against Tulane), and the Tigers won 9 of the 11 series when they won the opener. The exceptions were in the regular season finale against Auburn and the super regional.

LSU hasn't lost a non-conference series when winning the opening game since 1999 at home against Texas. Since then, LSU has won 9 of 10 non-conference series, with the lone loss being a three-game sweep by Houston in 2000.

Wilson a winner

Sometimes you'd rather be lucky than good, and for LSU closer Brian Wilson, he has certainly been the right man on the mound at the right time for the Tigers.

The New Hampshire native earned his second win of the year Wednesday at Centenary, as he pitched 1.2 hitless innings of relief in his first outing since Feb. 9.

The fireballer was also the winner in the season opener on Feb. 8 against Birmingham-Southern, when he worked out of a jam in the ninth inning as the Tigers won the game in the same frame.

Dating back to last year, Wilson has been the winning pitcher in three of his last four outings. He got the victory in the first game of the Super Regional against Tulane with three shutout innings.

LSU relievers are 4-1 on the year with a 4.30 ERA.

Locked and loaded

LSU hasn't had as many bases-loaded situations as they might like to have had so far this year, but when the Tigers have been presented with the opportunity, they've come through.

LSU is 6-for-9 so far this season with the bases juiced, and the Tigers have driven in 21 runs in those situations. Of course, two of the bases-loaded hits were grand slams by Jason Vargas and Clay Harris. Matt Heath had a three-run double last week against Mercer in this situation, while Darren Welch, Eric Wiethorn and Aaron Hill have also contributed to the Tigers' success with the sacks full.
