LSU LOOKS TO REBOUND AGAINST ALABAMA

The LSU Fighting Tigers will look to rebound from a disappointing 35-24 loss to Ole Miss last Saturday when they travel to Tuscaloosa to face Alabama. The Alabama contest will mark LSU's final road game of the season. The Tigers are 2-1 on the road this year. LSU enters the Alabama contest with a 4-3 overall mark and a 2-3 record in Southeastern Conference action. Alabama is 3-4 overall and 2-3 in league play. LSU will carry a two-game road winning streak into Tuscaloosa. LSU hasn't won three in a row on the road since 1997 when the Tigers were a perfect 4-0 away from Tiger Stadium.

OLE MISS TAKES ADVANTAGE OF LSU MISCUES IN 35-24 WIN

Ole Miss turned a pair of LSU turnovers and a blocked punt into 21 points as the Rebels posted a 35-24 win over the Tigers in Baton Rouge last Saturday. Eli Manning threw for 249 yards and three touchdowns to lead the Rebels. Ole Miss won the game despite trailing 24-21 with just under seven minutes left in the contest. Manning hit Doug Ziegler with a 17-yard TD pass with 6:26 to play which proved to be the game winner. LSU got to within the Ole Miss 45 yards line with five minutes to play but a fumble halted a potential game-winning drive for LSU. LSU trailed 21-10 at halftime but quickly got touchdowns from Domanick Davis and Michael Clayton to take a three-point lead heading into the final quarter. Davis finished with 266 all-purpose yards including 99 on the ground and a 71-yard punt return for a touchdown, while Clayton had two touchdowns, one rushing and one receiving.

Alabama holds a 9-4 advantage over the Tigers in games played in Tuscaloosa ... LSU last won in Tuscaloosa in 1997 by a 27-0 count ... Four of the last six games between the teams in Tuscaloosa have been decided by seven points or less, including the 1999 game in which Alabama won 23-17 as time expired with LSU on the Alabama 1-yard line ... LSU coach Nick Saban is 1-0 vs. Alabama.

NATIONAL HONORS

LSU FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

LSU plays its final regular season road game of the year on Saturday against Alabama in Tuscaloosa ... The Tigers are 2-1 on the road this year and they enter the Alabama game riding a two-game road winning streak ... LSU hasn't had a winning road record since going 4-0 in 1997 ... A win on Saturday would give the Tigers one more road victory than three previous years combined ... LSU is 12-1 under Nick Saban when scoring at least 20 points in game ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 0-6 under Saban when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 9-2 under Saban, including a 4-1 mark this year, when scoring first ... LSU is also 10-1 under Saban (4-1 in 2001) when leading at halftime and the Tigers are 9-1 under Saban (4-1 in 2001) when leading after three quarters ... Over his last 13 games (including the 2000 Peach Bowl), LSU QB Rohan Davey has thrown 23 TD passes compared to just five interceptions ... LSU hasn't been shutout since the Alabama game on Nov. 9, 1996 - a span of 57 games ... The Tigers are 2-0 this season, 5-0 under Saban, and 37-9 since 1990 when an LSU running back rushes for 100 yards in a game ... Overall, LSU has won seven straight games when having a 100-yard rusher ... WR Josh Reed's school-record streak of consecutive 100-yard receiving games came to an end vs. Ole Miss as he recorded 85 yards on three receptions ... Reed is tied with Wendell Davis for the most 100-yard games in school history with 13 ... Reed enters the Alabama contest with 2,159 yards on 118 receptions ... Over their last two games, the Tigers have forced five turnovers and they have responded with touchdowns on all five takeaways.

LSU'S INJURY UPDATE

The Tigers have three players listed as questionable for Saturday's contest - TB LaBrandon Toefield (ankle), OL Rob Sale (ankle) and SS Lionel Thomas (ankle). All three players were injured against Ole Miss with both Toefield and Thomas missing the entire second half. Senior CB Robert Davis (knee) is out for the remainder of the season after suffering a knee injury against Utah State in week two of the season. Davis underwent knee surgery two weeks ago. Also, FL Reggie Robinson (neck) underwent surgery back in August and will miss the entire season. Robinson will return next year to play his final season with the Tigers.

LSU'S BACK ON CBS

LSU will make its second appearance of the year on CBS on Saturday with one more appearance remaining on the schedule. Earlier this year, Florida posted a 44-15 win over LSU in Baton Rouge on CBS. The LSU-Arkansas game on Friday, Nov. 23 in Baton Rouge will also be televised by CBS. LSU is 11-12-1 all-time on CBS, which includes a 3-1 mark vs. Alabama. Last year, LSU posted a 30-28 win over the Crimson Tide on CBS. LSU's other games against Alabama on CBS are a 19-18 win in Tuscaloosa in 1988, a 27-0 win over the Crimson Tide in Tuscaloosa in 1997 and a 22-16 loss to Alabama in Baton Rouge in 1998.

DOMANICK DAVIS HAS CAREER NIGHT AGAINST REBELS

Domanick Davis came up with a career night in the Tigers' last outing against Ole Miss, posting 266 all-purpose yards which ties for the fifth highest total in school history. Davis, who has played on both sides of the football this year, had 99 yards rushing as he filled in for an injured LaBrandon Toefield. He also added 15 yards receiving, 89 yards on punt returns and 63 on kickoff returns. The most spectacular play of the night came on Davis' 71-yard punt return for a touchdown early in the third quarter. The punt return for a TD was Davis' first return for a touchdown in his career and pulled the Tigers to within 21-17 in the contest. Davis currently leads the SEC with 18.5 yards per punt return.

REED CONTINUES TO MOVE UP LSU RECEIVING YARDAGE CHART

LSU receiver Josh Reed continues to move up LSU's career receiving yardage chart as he hauled in three passes for 85 yards against Ole Miss to move his career total to 2,159 yards. Reed is 38 yards shy of moving past Tony Moss (2,196) into third place in LSU history. Two weeks ago against Mississippi State, Reed surpassed the 2,000-yardage mark in just 20 games, becoming the fastest player in LSU history to reach 2,000 career receiving yards. It took Wendell Davis 26 games from the time he recorded his first reception to reach 2,000 yards (37 if you add his freshman season where he lettered but did not record a statistic). Eric Martin went over 2,000 yards in his 34th game. Davis finished his career as LSU's all-time leading receiver with 2,708 yards, while Martin stands second with 2,625 yards.

LSU LOOKS FOR WINNING ROAD RECORD

LSU will take a 2-1 road mark into Tuscaloosa on Saturday as the Tigers will look to have a winning road record for the first time since going 4-0 away from home in 1997. A win on Saturday will also give the Tigers three road victories this year, that's one more than in the previous three years combined. LSU was 1-4 on the road in 1998, followed by a 0-4 mark in 1999 and a 1-3 record last year. Since 1990, LSU has only posted a winning record on the road three times - 3-2 in 1991, 3-1 in 1996 and 4-0 in 1997.

REED'S STREAK OF CONSECUTIVE 100-YARD GAMES SNAPPED

Josh Reed's streak of consecutive 100-yard receiving games was snapped on Saturday vs. Ole Miss as he had only 85 yards receiving on three catches. Reed entered the Ole Miss contest with a school-record streak of six straight 100-yard receiving games. Reed was also just one of two players at the Division I-A level who had 100-yards receiving in every game this year. The other was Kevin Curtis of Utah State, who also had his 100-yard streak snapped vs. Central Florida on Saturday.

REED'S ONLY 102 YARDS AWAY FROM ELITE COMPANY

Josh Reed enters the Alabama contest just 102 yards away from recording his second straight 1,000-yard receiving season. When Reed reaches 1,000 receiving yards this season, he'll join Tennessee's Joey Kent (1995 and 1996) as the only two players in SEC history to have more than one 1,000-yard receiving seasons to their credit. Kent had 1,080 yards in 1996 and 1,055 yards in 1995. Last year, in his first full season at the position, Reed recorded 1,127 yards, the 10th highest total in SEC history.

LSU'S FINALLY TAKING ADVANTAGE OF OPPONENTS TURNOVERS

LSU has finally started taking advantage of the turnovers that it forces as the Tigers have scored touchdowns on its last five takeaways. The streak started with a second quarter interception against Mississippi State two weeks ago. Since then, LSU has turned four interceptions into 28 points and one fumble into another seven points. Last week against Ole Miss, LSU's Randall Gay intercepted an Eli Manning pass in the second quarter and the Tigers responded with a touchdown just six plays later. Prior to the Mississippi State contest, LSU had only scored 17 points all season off of its 13 takeaways. The Tigers also went a span of three games - Tennessee, Florida, and Kentucky - of not scoring off a turnover. Over that three-game span, LSU had six takeaways that resulted in no points.

DAVIS MOVES UP ALL-TIME RETURN YARDAGE LISTS

With 89 yards on punt returns against Ole Miss, including a 71-yard return for a touchdown, Domanick Davis moved from 10th to eighth on the all-time LSU punt return yardage list with 512 career yards. Davis needs six yards to move past Tommy Casanova, who had 517 yards and three TDs from 1968-70. He needs 59 to move into sixth place past Craig Burns and 89 to move into fifth past Norman Jefferson.

CLAYTON HAVING FRESHMAN SEASON TO REMEMBER

True freshman Michael Clayton is putting together one of the finest freshman seasons ever at LSU. An exciting playmaker, Clayton scored two touchdowns in the Tigers' game against Ole Miss last Saturday, taking a reverse 29 yards for his first rushing touchdown, then making an unbelievable one-handed grab for a 39-yard touchdown to put the Tigers up 24-21 in the third quarter. The touchdown was his fifth of the season overall, the most by a Tiger true freshman since Kevin Faulk scored six touchdowns in 1995. Clayton has 23 catches for 401 yards, an average of 17.4 yards per reception. The 401 receiving yards rank second among freshmen in the SEC. Tennessee's Kelly Washington leads all rookie receivers with 655 yards.

TRACKING JOSH REED

Heading into the Alabama contest, LSU wide receiver Josh Reed has a chance to continue his move up the LSU career receiving charts. The following is a listing of how Reed ranks in each receiving category and who he may be passing with each reception, yard, or TD.

REED RANKS THIRD IN THE NATION IN RECEIVING YARDS PER GAME

Despite a season-low of 85 yards receiving against Ole Miss, Josh Reed continues to rank among the national leaders with 128.3 yards receiving a game. Reed currently leads the SEC and ranks third nationally in that category. Reed also ranks second in the SEC and 22nd in the nation with 6.43 receptions per contest. Through seven games, Reed has hauled in 45 passes for 898 yards and 3 TDs.

DAMIEN JAMES CONTINUES TO LEAD SEC IN INTERCEPTIONS

Damien James' continues to lead the SEC in interceptions as he has five to his credit this season. James' average of .71 interceptions a contest ranks fourth in the nation. James' streak of games with an interception ended at three as he went without an interception vs. Ole Miss.

LSU'S FAULK NAMED ONE OF 12 SEMIFINALIST FOR BUTKUS AWARD

LSU linebacker Trev Faulk has been named one of 12 semifinalists for the Butkus Award. The Butkus Award is awarded annually to the nation's best linebacker in college football. Faulk, who was listed as the nation's top rated inside linebacker by the Sporting News during the summer, has registered 76 tackles in seven games for the Tigers. Faulk, a junior from Lafayette, recorded a season-best of 18 tackles in LSU's loss to Tennessee. Faulk has had 13 tackles in back-to-back games against Mississippi State and Ole Miss. Last week Faulk was named SEC Player of the Week after leading an LSU defense that shutout Mississippi State in Starkville.

TIGER OFFENSE STILL ON RECORD PACE

LSU is on pace to break some of its most prestigious offensive records all in the same season. With 1,813 yards passing through seven games, quarterback Rohan Davey is on pace to become the Tigers' first 3,000-yard passer and break the single season LSU

record of 2,655 by Tommy Hodson in 1989. On the other end of Davey's passes, Josh Reed is averaging 128.3 yards per game and is on pace for 1,419 yards which would easily outdistance the 1,244 by Wendell Davis in 1986. With 10 rushing touchdowns in seven games, LaBrandon Toefield is on pace to challenge Charles Alexander's record of 17 rushing TDs set in 1977.

As a unit, the LSU offense is averaging 444.3 yards per game, which is on pace to break the school record of 440.3 yards per contest set by the 1987 team. Through seven games, LSU has accumulated 3,110 yards of total offense, which puts the Tigers on pace to break the school-record of 4,843 yards held by the 1987 team.

DAVEY PASSES EMSINGER ON ALL-TIME PASSING YARDAGE LIST

On a 39-yard touchdown pass to Michael Clayton in the third quarter, Rohan Davey moved past Steve Emsinger and into ninth place on the all-time LSU passing yardage list. Emsinger threw for 2,770 yards from 1976-79. The pass gave Davey 2,804 yards at the time. Davey finished the game with 183 yards passing, giving him 2,879 for his career. Davey needs 363 to pass Chad Loup and move into eighth place all-time. Davey currently ranks ninth in school history with 21 career TD passes. Tittle ranks eighth with 23 TD passes, while Josh Booty is seventh with 24.

REED'S BIG PLAYS CONTINUE

Josh Reed continues to pile up huge chunks of yardage every time he gets his hands on the ball. Reed only caught three passes vs. Ole Miss, however two accounted for more than 30 yards each. Reed has at least one 30-yard reception in every game this season, and for the season, he has 12 receptions of 30 yards or better.

REED STILL TIED WITH DAVIS FOR MOST 100-YARD GAMES IN A CAREER

Josh Reed enters the Alabama contest still tied with Wendell Davis for the most 100-yard receiving games in a career at LSU with 13. Reed tied Davis with a 146-yard effort vs. Mississippi State two weeks ago. It took Reed only 20 games at wide receiver to reach 13 100-yard games for his career (Note: Reed played running back for most of his redshirt freshman season). Reed's school-record streak of consecutive 100-yard games was snapped vs. Ole Miss. LSU is 9-4 when Reed has 100 yards or more receiving in a game.

TIGERS UNDEFEATED WHEN DAVEY THROWS AT LEAST THREE TDs

The Tigers are a perfect 5-0 all-time when Rohan Davey throws for three TDs in a game. Davey did it last against Mississippi State. Davey's threw three TD passes against Arkansas in 1999, three vs. Western Carolina last year, four against Tennessee last year, three in the Peach Bowl victory over Georgia Tech and three against Miss. State.

TIGERS FALL FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 1999 WHEN SCORING 20+ POINTS

For the first time in the Nick Saban era, LSU lost a game when scoring 20 or more points. The Tigers are now 12-1 under Saban when scoring 20 or more. The Tigers had won 13 consecutive games overall when scoring 20+ points dating back to 1999. Ironically, LSU's last loss when scoring 20 or more came in their 42-23 setback to Ole Miss in Baton Rouge in 1999.

STREAKS EXTENDED

Senior free safety Ryan Clark made his team-leading 30th consecutive start dating back to the 1999 season opener against San Jose State. Trev Faulk made his 27th straight start at linebacker dating back to the fourth game of his freshman season at Georgia. Jerel Myers started for the 29th time in 30 career games. The only non-start during Myers' three-year career was the 1999 season finale against Arkansas when the Tigers started in a three tight end alignment.

MYERS A MODEL OF CONSISTENCY

With an 12-yard reception against Ole Miss, Jerel Myers has now caught a pass in 29 of 30 career games. The lone exception was last year's victory over Ole Miss. Myers has now caught at least one pass in eighth straight games, the second longest on the team behind Josh Reed's 22 game streak.

LSU LOSES FOR FIRST TIME UNDER SABAN WHEN LEADING AFTER THREE

LSU lost for the first time under Saban when holding the lead after three quarters; the Tigers are 9-1 under Saban when entering the final 15 minutes with an advantage. LSU's last loss when leading after three quarters came in 1999 at Georgia, when LSU squandered a 16-13 edge and lost 23-22.

TIGERS TURN REVERSAL OF FORTUNES IN THE THIRD QUARTER

After being outscored 37-7 in the third quarter in their first five games of the season, the Tigers have outscored their opponents 35-0 in the third quarter of their last two games. The Tigers put 21 points up against Mississippi State on Oct. 20, then put themselves in position to win last weekend with a 14-point burst that gave them a 24-21 lead heading into the final quarter.

TOEFIELD CONTINUES TO LEAD THE SEC IN SCORING

LaBrandon Toefield continues to lead the SEC in scoring despite sitting out the second half of the Ole Miss contest. Through seven games, Toefield has rushed for 10 touchdowns for an average of 8.6 points per game, slight ahead of Auburn's David Duval (8.4 points per game).

TIGERS SPREAD THE WEALTH IN PASSING GAME

One thing is for sure, LSU can never be accused of focusing on one receiver in its passing game as 14 different players - six split ends, four tight ends, three tailbacks and one fullback - have caught passes for the Tigers this season. Spreading the football around has become a trademark of the Jimbo Fisher offense as last year, 13 Tigers caught passes during the regular-season. The Tigers have five players - three wide receivers, one tight end and one running back - with at least 10 receptions this year.

LSU CONTINUES TO BE THE BEST IN THE LEAGUE ON THIRD DOWN

LSU continues to be the best in the SEC when it comes to third down situations as the Tigers have converted on 50 of their 101 third down opportunities this year for 49.5 percent.

LSU'S SPECIAL TEAMS COVERAGE HAS BEEN OUTSTANDING

LSU's special teams coverage continues to be outstanding as the Tigers are allowing an SEC-best 14.6 yards per kickoff return and only 4.3 yards per punt return. On 34 kickoff returns this season, the Tigers have allowed only 20 yards or more just seven times. LSU has kicked off 39 times this year and its opponent has started outside the 20-yard line only 13 times.

HEAD COACH NICK SABAN

In his second year with the Tigers and eighth overall ... Has an overall mark of 55-33-1, which includes a 12-7 record at LSU ... Coached one season at Toledo (1990) and then spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State (1995-99) ... In first season as a head coach in 1990, led Toledo to a 9-2 mark and a share of the MAC title ... Spent the 1991-94 seasons as defensive coordinator of the Cleveland Browns ... In seven years as a collegiate head coach, has never had a losing record ... Guided Michigan State to a 9-2 overall mark and a second place finish in the Big 10 in 1999 ... Josh Booty earned SEC Player of the Week honors as he threw four touchdown passes, and the Tigers once again came up with a big fourth quarter to end a 31-year drought against Alabama in Baton Rouge with 30-28 victory over the Crimson Tide in Tiger Stadium.

Trailing 21-14 with just over 12 minutes left in the contest, the Tigers scored 16 points over a five-minute span to take control of the game. Booty connected with tight-end Robert Royal for a pair of fourth quarter TD passes, and John Corbello added a 28-yard field goal to give the Tigers a 30-21 lead before holding on for the final margin of victory.

The win guaranteed LSU its first winning season since 1997 by outgaining the Tide 408 to 314 yards.

LSU got to within the Ole Miss 45 yards line with five minutes to play but a fumble halted a potential game-winning drive for LSU. LSU trailed 21-10 at halftime but quickly got touchdowns from Domanick Davis and Michael Clayton to take a three-point lead heading into the final quarter. Davis finished with 266 all-purpose yards including 99 on the ground and a 71-yard punt return for a touchdown, while Clayton had two touchdowns, one rushing and one receiving.
