Tigers Host In-State Foe Louisiana Tech in Homecoming Game

LSU will step outside the Southeastern Conference for the final time during the regular season on Saturday as the eighthranked Tigers host in-state foe Louisiana Tech for Homecoming at 7 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. LSU enters the contest coming off an impressive 31-7 win over then-No. 17 Auburn last week. The Tigers are 7-1 overall and 4-1 in league play. Louisiana Tech moved its record to 4-4 overall with a 42-34 comeback road win over Nevada. LSU is 50-25-3 all-time in Homecoming games and the Tigers will take a 16-game winning streak against in-state foes into Saturday's contest, which includes a 49-7 win over Louisiana-Monroe to open this season. LSU hasn't lost to an in-state team since a 31-28 defeat to Tulane in Baton Rouge in 1982. LSU is 3-0 against non-conference opponents this year and under **Nick Saban**, the Tigers have a 13-3 mark. Against Tech, the Tigers will face one of the nation's most potent offensive attacks as the Bulldogs are averaging 28 points and 459 yards of offense a contest. LSU enters the game with the nation's fourth-rated defense as the Tigers are allowing only 254.6 yards per contest. LSU ranks second in the nation in rush defense (52.8 yards per game) and the Tigers are 15th in pass efficiency defense. Offensively, the Tigers revolve around the play of quarterback **Matt Mauck**, who ranks third in the SEC in pass efficiency (144.3 rating) and second in the league with 15 touchdown passes. **Michael Clayton** leads the Tigers with 41 receptions for 620 yards and 5 TDs, while **Devery Henderson** has 36 catches for 530 yards and 7 scores. **Justin Vincent** leads the Tigers with 336 yards rushing and 4 TDs. Defensively, **Chad Lavalais** leads the Tigers with 6 sacks and 11 tackles for losses, while **Corey Webster** is tops on the team with 3 interceptions.

LSU Shuts Down Cadillac, Auburn in 31-7 Win

In a game that featured the nation's top rushing defense in LSU against one of the best at running the football in Auburn, LSU came out on top, limiting Auburn to 50 yards rushing in a 31-7 win in Tiger Stadium. LSU struck early and often in the game as the Tigers rolled up 21 first half points and never looked back in posting its biggest win over Auburn since a 35-7 victory in 1972. **Matt Mauck** connected with **Devery Henderson** on a 64-yard scoring pass on the sixth play of the game for a 7-0 LSU lead. After the LSU defense stopped Auburn on a fourth-and-one at the 48-yard line, the Tigers needed only six more plays for take a 14-0 advantage as Mauck found **Michael Clayton** for an 18-yard TD. **Alley Broussard** capped the first quarter scoring with a 5-yard run for a 21-0 LSU lead, which is where the game stood at halftime. **Ryan Gaudet** kicked a 33-yard field goal and then Mauck hit Henderson for another TD pass to give the Tigers a 31-0 lead in the third quarter. Auburn, who was held to only 193 yards of offense, scored its only points late in the fourth quarter. For the game, **Justin Vincent** led the Tigers with 127 yards rushing, while Mauck completed 17 of 28 passes for 224 yards and 3 TDs. Henderson caught 6 passes for 101 yards and 2 TDs, while Clayton had 6 catches for 59 yards and 1 score. The LSU defense limited Cadillac Williams, who was considered a Heisman Trophy Candidate, to 61 yards on 20 carries.

Nick Saban

HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right leader to lead it. Entering his fourth year as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban is that leader.

Since taking over in Baton Rouge in 2000, Saban has transformed the LSU football program into one that wins championships, while graduating players at the same time.

Equipped with a plan that gives his players the best chance to be successful on the field as well as in the classroom, Saban's impact on the program has been immediate and it's been powerful.

In just three years as LSU's head coach, Saban's on-field success has been nothing short of remarkable, as he's guided the Tigers to 26 victories, a pair of bowl wins, including one in the Bowl Championship Series, and the 2001 Southeastern Conference title. The Tigers have also played in back-to-back New Year's Day bowls for the first time since the 1960s.

On top of LSU's success on the gridiron, the Tigers are being recognized for their efforts in the classroom. Currently, all 22 of the Tiger seniors from the 2002 team are on pace to graduate within the next 12 months, while Rodney Reed earned First Team Academic All-America honors and Bradie James was awarded an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation last year.

Off the field, Saban and his players are active in the community, promoting goodwill by participating in such things as community service projects and visiting hospitals and schools in the Baton Rouge area on a regular basis. Saban has also worn the hat of fundraiser during his stay in Baton Rouge as he spearheaded an effort that raised more than \$15 million for a state-of-the-art academic center for student-athletes. The new Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is part of Saban's plan to give his players the best opportunity to be successful when they finish their football careers. The center, which spans 54,000 square feet, is the best of its kind and features 100 computers, a 1,000-seat auditorium, a library and a communications center for training student-athletes.

Saban became the 31st head coach of the LSU Tigers on November 30, 1999, after five years as head coach at Michigan State.

He didn't waste anytime making his impact felt as he guided a team coming off back-to-back losing seasons to an 8-4 mark and a win over 15th-ranked Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl in 2000 to rekindle the fire of a proud football tradition in Baton Rouge.

A year later in 2001, Saban guided the Tigers to their first outright SEC title since 1986 with a 31-20 win over second-ranked Tennessee in the SEC Championship game. LSU followed that with a 47-34 victory over Illinois in the Sugar Bowl to cap a 10-3 season for the Tigers.

Last year, Saban guided the Tigers to an 8-5 overall mark and a share of the SEC Western Division title. The Tigers also played in a New Year's Day bowl game for the second consecutive year, a first for LSU since the 1960's, with an appearance in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five seasons.

Win One For JB

The LSU Athletic Department suffered a tremendous loss this week as longtime equipment manager **Jeff Boss** passed away after a 10-month battle with brain cancer. Boss, who was 54-years old, is survived by his wife, Karen, and a 13-year old daughter, B.J. Over 500 people attended the memorial service for Boss on Wednesday, including former LSU football coaches Jerry Stovall, Bill Arnsparger and Mike Archer, along with current head coach **Nick Saban**. Boss had served as LSU's equipment manager since 1980. The LSU football team has dedicated the 2003 season to Boss. Several members of the team, along with coach Nick Saban, presented coach Boss with a game ball from the Louisiana-Monroe game on Sept. 12 at his home. The ULM game was the first time in 24 years that coach Boss was not on the sidelines for an LSU contest. Then, on Sept. 29, LSU named its football locker room in Boss' honor with a formal ceremony that saw dozens of former Tiger football players, covering three decades, attend. The team has worn the letters "JB" on their helmets since theGeorgia game. For the first time this year, the team will wear the letters "JB" on their jerseys against Louisiana Tech. The "JB" will remain on the helmets and the jerseys for the remainder of the season. In addition, the letters "JB" have been painted on the field in four areas for Saturday's game.

This Week

LSU returns to Tiger Stadium tonight as the seventh-ranked Tigers face in-state foe Louisiana Tech for Homecoming in Tiger Stadium. Kickoff for tonight's non-conference contest between the Tigers and the Bulldogs is set for 7 p.m. The game will be televised on a pay-per-view basis by TigerVision. LSU enters the contest with a 7-1 overall mark as the Tigers are coming off a 31-7 win over then-No. 17 Auburn last week. Louisiana Tech will bring a 4-4 mark into the game as the Bulldogs rallied from a 21-3 first half deficit to beat Nevada on the road by a 42-34 count. A win tonight vs. Louisiana Tech would give LSU it's best start after nine games since the 1973 squad opened the year with a 9-0 mark.

In The Polls

The Tigers climbed two spots past Virginia Tech and Ohio State in the AP poll this week as LSU is ranked No. 7 in the nation in the poll that is voted on by the media. The Tigers surged past Ohio State even though the Buckeyes beat Indiana, 35-6, last week. LSU moved up one spot to No. 8 in the USA Today/ESPN poll. LSU has now been ranked in the top10 for seven straight weeks in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll, while the Tigers are in their sixth consecutive week in the top 10 in the AP poll. The six straight weeks in the AP top 10 is the longest for LSU since the 1987 team spent all season ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation. The Tigers also moved up five spots from No. 12 to No. 7 in this week's BCS standings.

Lavalais Named SEC Defensive Player of the Week

LSU defensive tackle **Chad Lavalais** earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors for his performance in the 31-7 win over Auburn. For the game, Lavalais recorded 8 tackles, 3 of which went for losses and added 1 sack. The 3 tackles behind the line totaled 24-yards in losses, which included a 13-yard loss on a sack. For the game, he led an LSU defense that limited Auburn to only 50 yards rushing, 150 yards below its season average, which included holding RB Cadillac Williams to just 60 yards rushing, his lowest total in a league game this season. Lavalais tackled Williams for a 5-yard loss on a fourth-and-one situation on Auburn's first possession of the game, which eventually led to an LSU touchdown and he followed that with sack of minus-13 yards on Auburn's second possession of the game.

About Louisiana Tech

The Bulldogs, who are a member of the Western Athletic Conference, enter the contest with a 4-4 overall mark ... All four of Tech's wins have come on the road, which includes a 42-34 victory over Nevada in their last outing ... The Bulldogs are 4-1 on the road this season and they are 0-3 at home ... Tech is coached by **Jack Bicknell**, who is in his fifth year with the Bulldogs ... In five years with Louisiana Tech, Bicknell has led the Bulldogs to one WAC title (2001), one bowl game (Humanitarian in 2001), as well as victories over Alabama (1999), Oklahoma State (2002) and Michigan State (2003) ... The Bulldogs are led by QB Luke McCown, who has thrown for over 12,000 yards and 81 TDs during his career ... Tech enters the LSU game averaging 39.5 points over its last four games.

Welcome Back To Tiger Stadium

The last time LSU and Louisiana Tech met on the football field, Bernie Moore was in his seventh season as head coach of the Tigers, the capacity of Tiger Stadium was only 46,000 and current head coach **Nick Saban** was still 10 years away from being born. The year was 1941 and LSU posted a 25-0 win over the Bulldogs in the season-opener on Sept. 21.

It's Homecoming on the LSU Campus This Weekend

LSU will also celebrate Homecoming this weekend against Louisiana Tech. LSU is 50-25-3 all-time in Homecoming games, which includes a 2-1 mark under **Nick Saban**. Last year, the Tigers posted a 48-0 win over Louisiana-Lafayette for Homecoming. Dating back to 1995, LSU has won seven of its last eight Homecoming games with the only loss being a 13-10 setback to UAB in 2000.

The LSU Injury Report

The Tigers came out of the Auburn game in good shape health-wise as LSU didn't suffer any significant injuries in the contest. LSU will still be without the services of OG **Nate Livings** for the Tech game as the sophomore is expected to miss 4-5 weeks with an MCL injury in his right knee. Livings had his knee scoped late last week. The Tigers could regain the services of running backs **Joseph Addai** (sprained MCL - left knee) and **Shyrone Carey** (sprained MCL - left knee) against the Bulldogs. Carey has been out of action since suffering an injury in the fourth quarter vs. Mississippi State, while Addai was injured in the first half vs. Florida. Both players practiced this week. TE **Demetri Robinson** will likely miss Saturday's game with a groin injury. Robinson was injured last week in practice and sat out the Auburn contest.

LSU's Rodney Reed Named National Scholar-Athlete

Rodney Reed, who is one of the most decorated student-athletes in LSU football history, added another honor to an already impressive resume as he was selected as a National Scholar-Athlete by the National Football Foundation. The award is one of the top academic honors available to a college football player and it carries with it an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship. Reed is one of only 15 football players covering all NCAA divisions as well as NAIA to receive the award. He also becomes the second National Scholar-Athlete in as many years for LSU, joining Bradie James, who was honored last year. Past LSU recipients of the award include: offensive lineman Robert Dugas (1977), linebacker Nacho Albergamo (1987), quarterback Sol Graves (1990) and punter Chad Kessler (1997). "This is a tremendous honor and something that I am extremely proud of," Reed said. "It is quite an accomplishment that two student-athletes from the same school have won the award two years in a row. It's good to get recognized and it speaks well for the program. I think this also speaks highly for the academic center and the way Coach Saban stresses academics and not just football."

Clayton Named One Of 10 Semifinalist For Biletnikoff Award

LSU WR **Michael Clayton** is one of 10 players from across the nation named as a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award, it was announced on Thursday. Clayton, a junior from Baton Rouge, is the only player from the Southeastern Conference on the list. Other semifinalists include Pittsburgh's Larry Fitzgerald, Oklahoma State's Rashaun Woods, Southern Cal's Mike Williams, Washington's Reggie Williams, Texas' Roy Williams, Oklahoma's Mark Clayton, North Carolina State's Jerricho Cotchery and Florida State's Craphonso Thorpe. Clayton currently leads LSU and ranks among the national leaders with 41 receptions for 620 yards and five touchdowns. Clayton is only 80 yards away from becoming the first player in LSU history to have at least 700 yards receiving in three consecutive seasons. Clayton has also caught at least one pass in all 34 games of his collegiate career. Former LSU standout Josh Reed won the Biletnikoff Award in 2001.

LSU and Louisiana Tech Ties

The only direct LSU-Louisiana Tech is that of current LSU Assoc. SID **Brian Miller**, who served as the SID for the Bulldogs in 1998 after serving as an assistant from 1996-97. Current Tiger starters **Jack Hunt** and **Kyle Williams** are both from Ruston, home of Louisiana Tech.

In-state Foe

LSU is 121-25-8 against opponents from Louisiana. The Tigers have defeated 16 straight in-state opponents, including a 49-7 victory over Louisiana-Monroe to open the 2003 season. The last time an in-state team defeated the Tigers was in 1982 when Tulane upended LSU 31-28 in Tiger Stadium.

Happy Birthday Coach

LSU coach **Nick Saban** celebrated his 52nd birthday on Friday, Oct. 31. Saban is 6-2 in games played the week of his birthday, which includes a 2-0 mark at LSU. Last year, LSU had an open date the week of Saban's birthday. Saban is 1-0 in games played on his birthday as Michigan State beat Northwestern, 29-5, in 1998.

Tigers Are 13-3 In Non-Conference Games Under Saban

After the win over Western Illinois, LSU moved its non-conference record under **Nick Saban** to 13-3. The Tigers were 3-1 in non-league games in 2000, followed by a 4-0 mark in 2001 and a 3-2 record last year. Included in the 13 non-SEC wins over the last three-plus years for the Tigers are bowl victories over Georgia Tech and Illinois.

Tigers Look For Best Start After 9 Games Since 1973

A win on Saturday against Louisiana Tech would give LSU an 8-1 record and it would mark the best start for the Tigers after nine games since the 1973 team opened with a 9-0 mark. LSU went 9-3 in 1973.

LSU Starting Defense Has Yet To Allow A Rushing TD

LSU's starting defense enters the Louisiana Tech game riding a streak of eight straight games without allowing a rushing touchdown. LSU has allowed 2 rushing TDs this season, but those came in the fourth quarter of wins over Louisiana-Monroe and Arizona, games in which the starting lineup had long left the field.

LSU Starts 4-1 in SEC In Back-To-Back Seasons

LSU's win over Auburn on Saturday moved the Tigers to 4-1 in league play, marking the second straight year in which LSU has won four of its first five conference games. The back-to-back 4-1 starts is something that hasn't been accomplished at LSU since the late 1980's when the Tigers won four of their first five league games from 1986-88.

Just How Loud Is Tiger Stadium?

Two students from LSU's Department of Astronomy and Physics were on the field for Saturday's game against Auburn. The students registered a reading of 117 decibels, which matched the highest reading ever recorded in Tiger Stadium. A reading of 117 decibels was first recorded in LSU's game against Alabama in 1996. Last night's reading of 117 decibels matched that of the 1996 reading and can be compared to that of a rock concert. It is believed that LSU's game against Auburn in 1988 had a higher decibel reading, the only official reading from that game came on the seismograph machine across campus in the Geology Department. Vincent and Broussard Are First True Frosh Tandem To Rush For 100 Yards in Same Season Since Hilliard and James

Two weeks ago, Alley Broussard, a true freshman from Lafayette, La., rushed for 108 yards in leading LSU to a 33-7 win over South Carolina. Last week, Justin Vincent, another true freshman, did the honors as he rushed for a career-best 127 yards on 14 carries for an average of 9.1 yard per rush. Vincent and Broussard are the first true freshman running backs at LSU to rush for 100 yards in a single-game in the same season since Dalton Hilliard and Garry James did it in 1982. Hilliard rushed for 100 yards five times as a true freshman in 1982, while James did it three times. In LSU' last two games, both of which Vincent has started, he's rushed for 204 yards and 2 TDs on 30 carries. Vincent leads all Tigers in rushing with 336 yards and 4 TDs on 60 carries. Broussard has accounted for 147 yards and 2 TDs on 43 attempts, while LSU's third true freshman running back Barrington Edwards has 89 yards rushing on 21 attempts.

LSU Defense Continues Its Dominance; Tigers Rated No. 1 In Scoring Defense And No. 2 vs. The Run

The Tiger defense continues to be not only one of the best in the SEC, but one of the top units in the nation. After Saturday's 31-7 win over Auburn, LSU remained as the nation's top scoring defense, allowing only 9.5 points a contest. Despite holding Auburn to just 50 vards rushing, more than 150 vards below its average, the Tigers slipped from No. 1 to No. 2 in the nation against the run with a 52.8 average. Ohio State is first in the nation vs. the run with a 51.5 average. The Tigers currently rank fourth in the nation in total defense, allowing only 254.6 yards per game. LSU has yielded only nine touchdowns all season - 2 rushing, 7 passing. Through eight games, the Tigers have allowed only 76 points, with just 16 of those coming in the first half. LSU is also limiting its opponents to only 1.8 yards per carry.

That Tiger Stadium Mystigue Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach Nick Saban has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In his fourth season at LSU, Saban has put together a 21-5 mark at home, which includes an 11-4 record in SEC games. Under Saban, the Tigers are 6-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium. LSU's 18 wins over Saban's first three years in Baton Rouge is the most over a three-year period for LSU in Tiger Stadium since the Tigers won 18 homes games from 1972-74.

Taking Notes On The Tigers Under Saban

Here is a look at some notable LSU trends during its first 46 games under Nick Saban ... LSU is 28-2 when leading at halftime and 26-2 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 31-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 30-0 when scoring 25 or more points ... On the other hand, LSU is 2-10 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 8-2 in games decided by 7 points or less and 3-1 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 21-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing and the Tigers are 14-0 when having a 100-yard rusher.

Eight Straight For LSU Defense To Hold Opponent To Less Than 100 Rushing Yards

The LSU defense did it again on Saturday as the Tigers held their eighth straight opponent to less than 100 net rushing yards. Of the eight, Saturday's was the most impressive, limiting Cadillac Williams and Auburn to only 50 yards on 34 attempts. That's over 150 yards below its season average of 202 per game. Williams, who was considered a Heisman Trophy Candidiate, rushed for 61 yards on 20 attempts, his lowest total in an SEC game this season. The Auburn performance came one week after the Tigers held South Carolina to zero rushing yards on 17 attempts. The zero rushing yards were the fewest allowed by LSU since 1982 when the Tigers held Ole Miss to minus-50 yards rushing in a 45-8 win on Oct. 30. The last team to rush for 100 yards vs. LSU was Texas (113 yards) in last year's Cotton Bowl. Arkansas' Fred Talley (118 yards) is the last individual to rush for 100 yards in a game against LSU as he did it in Week 12 last year. Florida rushed for 81 yards against LSU on Oct. 11 to become the first team to beat LSU under Nick Saban despite gaining less than 100 yards rushing. The Tigers are 21-1 under Saban when holding their opponent to less than 100 yards rushing. The eight straight games under 100 yards is the best stretch by an LSU defense since the 1970 squad held 10 of its 11 regular-season opponents to less than 100 yards. The only team during the regularseason that gained 100 or more vards against the Tigers in 1970 was Baylor, who had 104 yards in Week three. The 1970 LSU team still holds the school record for rushing defense (52.2) and rushing yards allowed for a season (574). To date, LSU has allowed 422 yards on 320 carries.

Tiger Defense Continues To Be Spectacular In All Phases

Whether it's against the pass or the run, the Tiger defense has been one of the best all-around units in the SEC. LSU is ranked either Nos. 1 or 2 in the SEC in eight of 11 categories, including leading the conference in five categories. LSU leads the league and the nation in scoring defense (9.5 points per game), the Tigers are first in the SEC and second in the nation in rush defense (52.8 yards per game), and they are first in the SEC in pass efficiency defense (98.1 rating), sacks (25) and opponents' 3rd-down conversion percentage (26.2).

LSU's Been Good At Getting The Defense Off The Field On 3rd Down

One of the obvious keys to LSU's success has been their ability to get the defense off the field on third-down situations. Through eight games, the Tigers led the SEC with a 26.2 third-down conversion percentage by their defense. In 122 third-down attempts this season, LSU has allowed its opponent a first down on 32 of those tries. Florida is the only team to have a better third-down percentage than LSU in a game as the Gators converted 7 of 18 attempts, compared to just 3 of 12 for the Tigers. The Tigers are even better on third-down once the opponent crosses midfield as LSU has allowed only 7 of 35 third-down attempts this season for 20 percent.

Tiger Defense Still Tough To Score On

In eight games this year, LSU has yielded only 76 points to its opponents. The 76 points is the fewest by an LSU team since the 1985 squad held its first eight opponents to 72 points. Last year, through eighth games LSU had allowed 108 points.

Skyler Makes Most of Punt Returns; Leads Nation In Punt Return Average

Skyler Green finally has enough punt returns to gualify for the individual rankings both in the SEC and in the NCAA statistics and to no surprise, the sophomore is ranked first in both with a 26.1 average. On 11 punt returns this year, Green has 287 return yards. Against Auburn, Green opened with a 44-yard returned that setup LSU's third first-quarter TD. For the game, he finished with 87 yards on five punt returns. To date, Green has returned two punts for TDs, including an 80-yarder against Florida. On the first punt return of his career against Arizona, Green raced 62 yards for a touchdown. Green is the first player since Todd Kinchen in 1991 to have two punt returns for TDs in the same season and he's one shy of tying the school mark of 3 set by Pinky Rohm in 1937.

Mauck Tosses 3 TDs In A Game For Fifth Time; Ranks Eighth In School History

In just 14 games as LSU's starting guarterback. Matt Mauck has already tossed at least 3 touchdowns in a game five times after doing it to Auburn on Saturday. For his career, Mauck has 24 TD passes, which ties Josh Booty for eighth place in school history. This year, Mauck has thrown 15 TD passes, which ties for the seventh-highest total with Booty in school history. Tommy Hodson holds the school mark in both categories with 69 for his career and 22 in a season.

Tigers Rebound Again Under Saban After A Loss

One thing is certain and that is LSU does a good job of bouncing back after a loss under Nick Saban. After the 33-7 win over South Carolina, LSU is now 10-3 under Saban after a loss. LSU has lost back-to-back games under Saban only three times. LSU is 4-0 under Saban when the game following a loss comes on the road - LSU beat Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl following a loss to Arkansas in 2000; LSU beat Alabama in Tuscaloosa following a home loss to Ole Miss in 2001; the Tigers beat Kentucky in Lexington following a loss to Auburn in 2002; LSU beat South Carolina in Columbia following a loss to Florida in 2003.

LSU Secures Second Straight Winning Season vs. SEC Eastern Division

LSU's win over South Carolina gave the Tigers a winning record vs. the SEC Eastern Division for the second straight year and the third time in four years under **Nick Saban**. The Tigers were 2-1 vs. the East this year. LSU had won six straight against the East before Florida snapped the streak on Saturday. The last time LSU had a winning record against the SEC East in back-to-back seasons came in 1996-97. In all, Saban has a 9-4 mark vs. the SEC East, which includes a 31-20 win over Tennessee in the SEC Championship game in 2001. Prior to Saban's arrival and since the SEC went to divisions in 1992, LSU posted a 6-17-1 vs. the East from 1992 to 1999.

Clayton Joins The 2,000-Yard Club

Michael Clayton, a junior WR, became only the fifth player in LSU history to record 2,000 receiving yards in a career as he went over the mark against Florida. Clayton currently ranks fifth in school history with 2,123 receiving yards. He is also fifth in LSU history in receptions with 145, fifth in receiving TDs with 16 and seventh in career 100-yard receiving games with six. With 41 catches for 620 this year, Clayton is only 80 yards from becoming the first player at LSU with at least 700 yards receiving in each of his first three seasons. Clayton had 754 yards on 47 catches as a freshman and he followed that with 749 yards on 57 catches last year.

Donnie Jones Adds His Name To Another LSU Punting Record

Donnie Jones now holds two of LSU's three career punting records as the Baton Rouge native holds the school mark in punting yards (8,548) and total punts (203). In four years with the Tigers, Jones has a total of 8,548 punting yards, which broke the mark of 7,976 held by Chad Kessler (1994-967). In LSU's game against Mississippi State, Jones broke Kessler's career punts mark. For his career, Jones has punted 203 times for an average of 42.1 yards per kick, a figure that ranks second to Kessler's 42.9 career average.

Throwing To The Tight Ends

LSU's tight ends aren't just for blocking as the rotation of **Eric Edwards**, **David Jones**, **Keith Zinger** and **Demetri Robinson** have caught their share of passes this season. The foursome have accounted for 22 receptions for 264 yards and 1 TD. Edwards leads all LSU tight ends with 12 catches for 122 yards and 1 TD. Against South Carolina, LSU tight ends caught nine passes, that's the most in a single-game for that position in LSU history. Edwards led the way with 5 receptions for 37 yards and 1 TD. The 5 receptions by Edwards was the most by an LSU tight end since Robert Royal caught 5 passes for 72 yards against Utah State in 2001.

Mauck Starts Another TD Streak

After having his streak of consecutive games with a TD pass snapped at nine against Florida, QB **Matt Mauck** got started on another streak, throwing for a pair of touchdown passes vs. South Carolina and then tossing 3 in the win over Auburn. In 14 career starts, Mauck has thrown at least one TD pass in 11 games. The nine straight games with at least one TD pass was the longest streak by a Tiger since Herb Tyler did it in 12 straight games covering the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

TD-Less First Half Streak Comes To An End Against Florida

LSU's streak of keeping its opponent out of the endzone in the first half came to an end against Florida as the Gators became the first team this year to score a first half touchdown against the Tigers. Florida's first quarter TD marked the first time LSU had given up an offensive TD since last year's Cotton Bowl when Texas scored a pair of second quarter touchdowns against the Tigers. Through eight games, LSU has allowed only 16 first half points for an average of 2.0 points per game. Dating back to last year, LSU has had it opponents scoreless in the first half in eight of its last 10 games.

LSU Buckles Down In The Redzone

The Tiger defense is holding its opponents to a staggering 46.7 percent scoring success rate when they get inside the LSU redzone. Auburn was successful on 1 of its 2 redzone chances against the Tigers. Against Florida, the Gators had one redzone opportunity stopped at the 1-yard line when **Brandon Washington** forced a fumble that was recovered by **Adrian Mayes**. The Tigers also held the Gators to a field goal on another redzone chance in the second quarter. LSU also held Georgia to just three points despite three trips inside the redzone against the Tigers in a 17-10 win over the Bulldogs on Sept. 20. So far this season, in 15 redzone chances for its opponent, LSU has allowed only 7 scores - 5 touchdowns and 2 field goals.

Tigers Still Rank No. 2 In SEC In Scoring

LSU still ranks second in the SEC in scoring as the Tigers are averaging 34.0 points a contest as they have scored 272 points through the first seven games of the season. The 272 points by the Tigers are the most for an LSU team since the 1930 team scored 289 points over its first eight games. The 1977 team holds the school record for most points in a season with 375.

How About Those Special Teams

A quick check of the special teams categories in the SEC shows that LSU leads the league in punt returns (15.7), kickoff returns (25.8), kickoff coverage (17.3), and the Tigers are second in net punting (40.6). LSU ranks fifth in the nation in punt returns, sixth in kickoff returns and 10th in net punting.

The Defense Scores Again

For the third time this year, LSU's defense scored points in a game as senior linebacker **Jason LeDoux** picked up a fumble by South Carolina quarterback Dondrial Pinkins and rumbled 15 yards for a touchdown. LSU's defense has now scored against Louisiana-Monroe (**Jack Hunt** 31-yard interception return), against Mississippi State (**Travis Daniels** 48-yard interception return) and South Carolina. The three defensive TDs matches last year's total of three for the Tigers as LSU returned three interceptions for touchdowns in 2002.

Go Figure

Between 1997 and Nov. 16, 2002, LSU failed to reach 20 points in an SEC contest 15 times. The Tigers lost all 15 of those games. Dating back to last year's Ole Miss game on Nov. 23, LSU has now won two of its last four SEC games when failing to reach the 20-point mark. Last year, LSU beat Ole Miss 14-13 for its final SEC victory and the Tigers opened up conference play this year with a 17-10 victory over Georgia. Prior to last year's win over Ole Miss, LSU had not won an SEC game when scoring less than 20 points since a 7-6 victory over Vanderbilt in 1997. You have to go all the way back to 1993 to find a two-game span when the Tigers won SEC games despite failing to reach 20 points. That year, LSU beat Ole Miss, 19-17 and then followed with a 17-13 win over Alabama. LSU also beat Mississippi State 18-16 that year.

Saban Knows Pass Efficiency

One thing that LSU coach **Nick Saban** did over the summer was research pass efficiency and how a quarterback's efficiency related to wins and losses. Saban said the research proved that the quarterback with the better pass efficiency in a game usually leads his team to a victory. So far that has proven to be true as the Tigers have won all seven games in which their quarterback pass efficiency was better than its opponent. The one time that the opponent had the better efficiency (Florida), the Tigers lost. Currently, LSU ranks second in the league and 15th in the nation in pass efficiency with a 148.3 rating. **Matt Mauck** is third in the SEC with a 144.3 QB rating.

Tigers Have Experience on the O-Line

The LSU offensive line has been touted as one of the best in the nation. The Tiger offensive line may be one of the most experienced as the LSU front five have 131 career starts between them. **Rodney Reed** leads the way with 42, followed by **Stephen Peterman** with 33, Ben Wilkerson with 27 and **Andrew Whitworth** 21. **Rudy Niswanger** got his first career start vs. Auburn, replacing the injured **Nate Livings** at left guard. Livings had started LSU's first 7 games before suffering a knee injury vs. South Carolina. LSU is 21-5 when Reed, Peterman and Wilkerson start on the offensive line together (8-0 in 2001, 6-4 in 2002, 7-1 in 2003).

Tigers Keep Opponents To Less Than 20 Points For 25th Time Under Saban

By holding Auburn to only 7 points, the Tigers have now limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 27 of the 45 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 24-3 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 27 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 14 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted four shutouts under Saban.

Clayton, Henderson, and Green... A Nice 1-2-3 Punch At Wide Receiver

One thing is for certain and that is if defenses key too much on **Michael Clayton**, then **Devery Henderson** will make them pay. Focus on Henderson, then Clayton takes over. Concentrate on Henderson and Clayton and then **Skyler Green** will take over. At least that's how it's been over the first eight games of the year. Clayton, Henderson and Green have combined for 101 catches for 1,443 yards and 15 TDs for the Tigers. Clayton and Henderson have each gone over 100 yards three times this year. Clayton ranks third in the league in receptions per game (5.12), while Henderson is fifth with 4.50 a contest. Clayton is second in the SEC in yards per game (77.5) and Henderson is fifth at 66.2 yard a contest. Clayton leads the team with 41 receptions for 576 yards and 5 TDs, with Henderson second with 36 receptions for 530 yards and 7 scores and Green next with 24 catches for 293 yards and 3 TDs.

Open Wide

QB **Matt Mauck** spent Monday, Oct. 6 taking the Dental Admissions Test. Mauck, who also considered pursuing a career in medicine, has now opted to becoming a dentist. Mauck, who carries a 3.8 grade point average, will graduate in December with a degree in kinesiology.

Mauck Picks Apart South Carolina Defense

Matt Mauck reset his career high for completions for the second time this year, connecting on 24 of 30 attempts vs. South Carolina. The 24 completions bettered his previous high of 23 set against Western Illinois in the Week 3 this year. Against South Carolina, Mauck connected on his first five and 11 of his first 12 passes. Mauck was 14 of 17 at halftime and 20 of 25 at the end of the third quarter.

Mauck Ties LSU Record With 17 Straight Completions

Matt Mauck played perhaps the best game of his career in the Sept. 13 game vs. Western Illinois. Lost in his overall numbers was the fact that he tied an LSU record by completing 17 straight passes over a two game span. Mauck completed his final 10 passes in LSU's 59-13 win over Arizona on Sept. 6 and he followed that by completing 7 straight vs. Western Illinois. The 17 straight completions ties the mark set by Rohan Davey, who completed 6 straight vs. Arkansas to close the 1999 season and then opened the 2000 season by hitting 11 straight vs. Western Carolina.

Mauck Has Career Night In Win over Western Illinois

Matt Mauck put together a career night vs. Western Illinois as the junior from Jasper, Ind., posted a then career-high of 23 completions to go with career-bests for yards (305) and TDs (4). For the contest, Mauck connected on his first seven passes and went on to complete 23 of 35 passes. He became LSU's first 300-yard passer since Rohan Davey tossed for 444 yards vs. Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. The four TD were the most by an LSU player since Josh Booty threw 4 TD passes in a win over Alabama in 2000.

Run Skyler Run

In eight games this year, **Skyler Green** has touched the ball in a variety of ways. He's rushed twice for 24 yards, he's caught 24 passes for 293 yards, he's returned 11 punts for 287 yards and he's returned four kickoffs for 89 yards. In all, Green has touched the ball 41 times and he's accounted for 723 yards for an average of 17.6 yards every time he gets his hands on the ball. Green has also accounted for 5 TDs, including the game-winner vs. Georgia. Green puts the ball in the endzone every 8.2 times he touches the ball. To date, he's recorded three receiving TDs and he's returned two punts for touchdowns.

100-150-300 vs. Western Illinois A Rarity For Tigers

LSU's trio of QB **Matt Mauck**, RB **Shyrone Carey** and WR **Michael Clayton** combined for a rarity vs. Western Illinois on Sept. 13. Carey rushed for 124 yards, Clayton caught passes netting 162 yards and Mauck threw for 305 yards as the trio became just the fourth group in school history to have 100-yards rushing, 150-yards receiving and 300-yard passing in the same game. The last time the Tigers had a 100-yard rusher, a 150-yard receiver and a 300-yard passer in the same contest came against Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. In that game, Domanick Davis rushed for 122 yards, Josh Reed had 239 yards receiving and Rohan Davey threw for 444 yards. The other two times came in 2001 as well as the Tigers did it against Kentucky (Toefield 129 rushing, Reed 160 receiving, Davey 383 passing) and then against vs. Arkansas (Toefield 173 rushing, Reed 183 receiving, Davey 359 passing).

100 On The Ground And 100 Through The Air

Against Auburn, LSU had its first 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver in the same game since Western Illinois earlier in the season. But, before that it was the Sugar Bowl in January of 2002 since any duo had done it. Against Western Illinois, **Shyrone Carey** rushed for 124 yards, while **Michael Clayton** caught 11 passes for 162 yards and against Auburn **Devery Henderson** had 101 receiving yards and **Justin Vincent** rushed for 127 yards. It's the first time the Tigers have accomplished that feat since Domanick Davis rushed for 122 yards and Josh Reed had 239 receiving yards vs. Illinois. In addition, Clayton had 120 yards receiving in that Sugar Bowl contest vs. Illinois.

Tiger Defense Continues To Be Stingy

Through 32 quarters this season, LSU's defense has held the opponent out of the endzone in 21 of those. Florida became the first team since Kentucky last year to score an offensive TD in the first quarter against the Tigers. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had allowed only 3 first half points all season, that being a field goal vs. Georgia in Week 4. In all, the Tigers have held all eight of its opponents this year to less than 20 points, something that hasn't been done at LSU since 1972.

Mauck Win Streak Snapped At 10 Straight

Matt Mauck's winning streak as LSU's starter quarterback came to an end at 10 straight with the loss to Florida. Mauck, who is 12-2 as LSU's starting quarterback, had not lost a game since his first start vs. Virginia Tech in last year's season-opener. Mauck's 10-1 start was the best by an LSU QB since Herb Tyler won 10 of his first 11, including his first eight, as a starter from 1995-96. In addition, Mauck has played in 17 games in his LSU career and the Tigers are 14-3 in those contests.

Webster Has 10 Career Interceptions

He was a basketball superstar in high school. He came to LSU as a wide receiver and played there for a year before moving to the secondary. Now, in just his second season as a starter at CB **Corey Webster** has already moved up to seventh place in school history in interceptions after recording the 10th career pick vs. Georgia. The interception, which made Webster look more like a magician, came with just over a minute left in the contest and sealed LSU's 17-10 win over Georgia. The pick was the third of the year for Webster, who ranks second in the SEC and 20th nationally in the category. Webster began his career at LSU as a WR, catching seven passes for 74 yards in 12 games as a freshman. In 21 games on defense, Webster has 10 interceptions for 98 yards and 1 TD.

The Long Ball

LSU has scored on plays of 40 yards or longer in half of its games this year, which includes a 64-yard TD pass from **Matt Mauck** to **Devery Henderson** vs. Auburn. This year, LSU has thrown 17 TD passes with six of those going for at least 40 yards. Mauck has 4 TD passes of at least 40 yards this year, while backup QB **Marcus Randall** has accounted for the other two. Last year, the Tigers had just three touchdown passes from over 40 yards, with two of those coming in the Kentucky game.

Saban Gets Win No. 33 at LSU and No. 76 Overall

LSU coach **Nick Saban** moved past Mike Archer into sole possession of sixth place in school history in wins with his 28th victory in the Tigers' win over Arizona. Saban picked up win No. 33 vs. South Carolina, moving past Gerry DiNardo into sole possession of fifth place at LSU. In just over three years with LSU, Saban has posted a 33-13 overall mark. Saban also has 76 career victories. In his 10th season overall, Saban has put together an overall record of 76-39-1. Charles McClendon holds the school-record with 137 victories in 19 years as LSU's head coach.

Saban Adds Another Notch To SEC Belt

With the win over Georgia on Sept. 20, LSU coach **Nick Saban** has now recorded at least one win over all but one SEC team. The only team Saban has yet to beat in the only team he hasn't faced - Vanderbilt. In just over three years at LSU, Saban has recorded 18 SEC victories - 19 counting the SEC title game in 2001. Saban has four wins over Mississippi State, three over Kentucky, two each against Auburn, Alabama, Ole Miss, South Carolina and Tennessee and one over Georgia, Florida, and Arkansas. Saban's current SEC mark, which includes regular-season games only, stands at 19-10.

Jimbo Keeps Spreading It Around In The Passing Game

LSU offensive coordinator **Jimbo Fisher** has done a good job keeping opposing defenses off balance when it comes to the passing game. Through 8 games this year, LSU has had at 14 players catch at least one pass. Against South Carolina, nine different Tigers caught at least one pass and of the 26 LSU completions, 12 went to wide receivers, 9 went to tight ends and 5 went to running backs.

Clayton Runs Streak To 34 Straight Games

LSU WR **Michael Clayton** ran his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 34 after recording 6 catches vs. Auburn. Clayton has caught at least one pass in every game in which he has played during his career.

Tigers Have Block Party vs. Western Illinois

LSU recorded both a blocked field goal and as well as a blocked punt against Western Illinois. **Travis Daniels** blocked the punt, which was the first for the Tigers since the 1999 game against Mississippi State, while **Chad Lavalais** blocked the field goal attempt. The blocked field goal was the first for LSU since 1998 when Arnold Miller blocked a kick against Notre Dame.

Carey and Green Fill In Nicely For Domanick

A concern for LSU heading into the season was how to replace the departed Domanick Davis, the school's all-time leader in both punt return and kickoff return yards. The duo of Shyrone Carey and Skyler Green has put some of that concern to rest as they are combining to average 15.7 yards on 31 punt returns this season. Carey has returned 17 punts for 191 yards (11.2 average), while Green has 11 returns for 287 yards, including an 80-yard return for a TD vs. Florid and a 62-yard return for a score vs. Arizona.

Gaudet Joins Elite List With 47-Yard FG

Ryan Gaudet added his name to a very short list of LSU kickers with his 47-yard field goal against Arizona. Gaudet's 47-yard field goal marked the first of his career and it marked the third-longest at LSU for a kicker on his first career make. Juan Roca holds the record as he connected on a 52-yard field goal vs. Wisconsin for his career make, while Wade Richey's first career make was a 48-yarder vs. Michigan State in 1995. Gaudet added another 47-yarder against Georgia. Gaudet, who made a pair of field goals vs. Mississippi State, is now 4 of 7 this season.







LSU's Rolls Past UL-Monroe, 49-7

Matt Mauck threw three touchdown passes, Joseph Addai rushed for 81 yards and Michael Clayton caught six passes for 152 yards and a pair of TD passes as LSU rolled to a 49-7 win over Louisiana-Monroe in the season-opener for both teams. The game was only four minutes old when a thunderstorm rolled into Baton Rouge and caused a 39-minute delay because of lightning. After a scoreless first quarter, Mauck then threw three TD passes over the final seven minutes of the second quarter to put the Tigers up 21-0 at halftime. Shyrone Carey added a 1-yard run midway through the third quarter to give LSU a 28-0 advantage and the Tigers stretched the margin to 35-0 with a 31-yard interception return just 16 seconds later. Louisiana-Monroe scored its only points of the contest on a 12-yard run by Kevin Payne with 14:10 left in the fourth quarter. Freshman Alley Broussard capped the scoring for the Tigers with a 1-yard run with 10:39 left in the contest. For the game, the Tigers racked up 474 yards of offense (306 passing, 168 rushing) compared to just 240 yard for the Indians (59 rushing, 181 passing).




LSU Storms Past Arizona, 59-13, In The Desert

LSU scored on its first seven possessions, including a 15-play, 80-yard drive to open the contest, as the Tigers had little trouble with Arizona, posting a 59-13 win over the Wildcats in Tucson, Ariz. Quarterbacks Matt Mauck and Marcus Randall combined to connect on 19 of 25 passes for 299 yards and two TDs and Joseph Addai rushed for 86 yards and a pair of scores to lead the Tigers. Michael Clayton led all receivers with six catches for 109 yards and a 48-yard TD reception. Addai opened the scoring for LSU with a 1-yard run midway through the first quarter. Ryan Gaudet nailed a 47-yard field goal three minutes later and then Addai added an 8-yard TD run less than a minute after Gaudet's field goal to give the Tigers a 17-0 lead. LSU stretched the advantage to 38-0 at halftime, as the Tigers were never threatened in the contest. In all the Tigers, had five rushing TDs, two passing TDs and Skyler Green returned a punt 65 yards for a TD. Arizona scored its first points with 10 minutes left in the contest on a 1-yard fumble return. Defensively, LSU limited the Wildcats to only 182 yards of offense.

Mauck Passes Tigers Past Western Illinois, 35-7

LSU QB Matt Mauck connected on 23 of 32 passes for a career-best 305 yards and four TDs as the Tigers overcame a slow start to post a 35-7 win over Western Illinois last Saturday in Tiger Stadium. Shyrone Carey rushed for a career-best 124 yards and a TD to lead the Tiger ground attack, while Michael Clayton hauled in 11 receptions for 162 yards and a score. Defensively, Corey Webster intercepted two passes for the Tigers. On its first possession, LSU marched 58 yards on 10 plays and took a 6-0 lead on a 10-yard pass from Mauck to Clayton. The Tigers, who fumbled twice inside the Western Illinois 15-yard line in the first quarter, led 13-0 at halftime after a 1-yard TD run by Carey. After an on-side kick to start the second half, the Leathernecks cut the deficit to 13-7 on a 3-yard TD pass from Russ Michna to Terrence Hall at the 10:08 mark in the third quarter. It was all LSU from there as Mauck threw TD passes of 8 and 40 yards to Skyler Green to stretch the advantage to 28-7. The Tigers added a final score on a 16-yard TD pass from Mauck to Devery Henderson midway through the fourth quarter.

Mauck-To-Green Leads LSU Past No. 7 Georgia, 17-10

Matt Mauck connected with Skyler Green for a 34-yard touchdown pass with 1:22 left in the contest as 10th-ranked LSU knocked off seventh-ranked Georgia, 17-10, before a record crowd of 92,251 in Tiger Stadium. The win lifted LSU to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC action and it marked the first Tiger victory over a top 10 team in Tiger Stadium since a 28-21 win over No. 1 Florida in 1997. The Tigers led 7-3 at halftime thanks in part to an outstanding defensive effort by LSU over the first 30 minutes. In the first half alone, Georgia got inside the LSU 30-yard line five times and came up with only three points. Trailing 3-0, the Tigers took a 7-3 lead on a 21-yard run by Shyrone Carey with 3:10 left in the first half. The Tigers extended their margin to 10-3 on a 47-yard field goal by Ryan Gaudet at the 6:23 mark in the third quarter. LSU appeared to have the game in hand, but a fumble by Mauck at the Georgia 15-yard line with less than 5 minutes left gave the Bulldogs another chance. Two players later Georgia's David Greene hit Tyson Browning on a screen pass, which he took 93 yards for a touchdown to tie the score at 10-10. Devery Henderson returned the ensuing kickoff 48 yards to the LSU 49-yard line to setup the game-winning touchdown for the Tigers. Georgia got into LSU territory in the final minute, but an interception by Corey Webster at the 22-yard line sealed the Tiger victory.

LSU turned three Mississippi State turnovers into 21 points and the Tiger defense limited the Bulldogs to only 31 yards rushing as LSU rolled to a 41-6 win in Starkville. After a slow start, LSU took a 7-0 lead late in the first guarter on a 1yard run by Shyrone Carey. Leading 10-0 after a Ryan Gaudet field goal, the Tigers stretched the margin to 17-0 midway through the second quarter on another 1-yard run by Carey. Carey's second TD was setup by an interception by Jack Hunt, who returned the pick to the MSU 1-yard line. The Tigers led 24-0 at halftime after Travis Daniels returned an interception 48-yards for a TD with less than a minute remaining in the first half. MSU then fumbled on its third play of the second half and the Tigers struck again one play later, this time Matt Mauck connected with Devery Henderson for a 36-yard TD pass to stretch the lead to 31-0. LSU led 34-0 before MSU finally scored with just over 10 minutes left in the contest. For the game, Mauck completed 12 of 19 passes for 171 yards and 1 TD, while Justin Vincent led the Tigers with 58 yards rushing and 1 TD on six carries. Carey added 50 yards rushing and 2 TDs on 13 carries. Henderson led all receivers with a career-best seven receptions for 114 yards and a score. Defensively, the Tigers sacked MSU quarterback Kevin Fant five times and limited the Bulldogs to only 239 yards of offense.

Flat Tigers Fall to Florida, 19-7

A flat LSU football team couldn't overcome a series of penalties and a key injury to starting running back Joseph Addai as the Tigers dropped their first game of the season to Florida, 19-7, in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers actually scored the first points of the game as Skyler Green, subbing for an injured Shyrone Carey, returned a first quarter punt 80-yards for a touchdown and a 7-0 LSU lead. Florida responded with a 13-play drive to tie the game at 7-7 on a 22-yard pass from Chris Leak to Ran Carthon. The Gators took the lead for good at 10-7 on a 29yard field goal by Matt Leach at the 3:17 mark in the first quarter. The Gators led 13-7 at halftime after another field goal by Leach. Florida extended its lead to 19-7 on a 35-yard pass from Leak to Ciatric Fason with 5:21 left in the third quarter. The Tigers had a couple of chances to get back in the game negated, one by a penalty and another on a fumble. A penalty wiped out a 42-yard pass from Matt Mauck to Michael Clayton in the third guarter that would have given the Tigers the ball at the Florida 28-yard line. Then late in the fourth quarter with the game still in doubt, Mauck hit Devery Henderson in stride with a pass to the Florida 31yard line, which he then fumbled away at the UF 14-yard line. For the game, the Tigers sacked Leak six times and forced another Florida turnover on the LSU 1yard line. Mauck completed 19 of 33 passes for 231 yards and a pair of interceptions, while Leak led Florida with 18 of 30 passing for 229 yards and 2 TDs.

Tigers Ride Freshman Running Backs to 33-7 Win Over South Carolina

True freshman running backs Justin Vincent, Alley Broussard and Barrington Edwards combined to rush for 222 yards and 2 TDs and guarterback Matt Mauck connected on 24 of 30 passes for 199 yards and 2 scores as 10th-ranked LSU rolled past South Carolina, 33-7, in Columbia. Playing without its two starting running backs in Joseph Addai and Shyrone Carey, who were both out with knee injuries, the Tigers rushed for a season-high 263 yards on 52 carries. LSU finished with 482 yards off offense, while holding South Carolina to only 254 yards of offense, including zero rushing yards. LSU jumped out to a 19-0 first half lead and never looked back in cruising to the victory. LSU had first half drives of 21plays and 97 yards and 14-plays and 91 yards that both culminated in touchdowns, the second of which gave LSU a 19-0 lead on a 1-yard run by Vincent just before halftime. South Carolina pulled to within 19-7 after a 77-yard TD early in the third guarter before LSU linebacker Jason LeDoux put the game out of reach with a 15-yard fumble return for a touchdown later in the guarter. Vincent added another 1-yard run midway through the fourth quarter for LSU's final point. Broussard led LSU with 108 yards rushing on 19 attempts, while Vincent had 77 yards and 2 TDs rushing and added another 46 yards receiving on four receptions.

LSU Shuts Down Cadillac, Auburn in 31-7 Win

In a game that featured the nation's top rushing defense in LSU against one of the best at running the football in Auburn, LSU came out on top, limiting Auburn to 50 yards rushing in a 31-7 win in Tiger Stadium. LSU struck early and often in the game as the Tigers rolled up 21 first half points and never looked back in posting its biggest win over Auburn since a 35-7 victory in 1972. Matt Mauck connected with Devery Henderson on a 64-yard scoring pass on the sixth play of the game for a 7-0 LSU lead. After the LSU defense stopped Auburn on a fourth-andone at the 48-yard line, the Tigers needed only six more plays for take a 14-0 advantage as Mauck found Michael Clayton for an 18-yard TD. Alley Broussard capped the first quarter scoring with a 5-yard run for a 21-0 LSU lead, which is where the game stood at halftime. Ryan Gaudet kicked a 33-yard field goal and then Mauck hit Henderson for another TD pass to give the Tigers a 31-0 lead in the third quarter. Auburn, who was held to only 193 yards of offense, scored its only points late in the fourth quarter. For the game, Justin Vincent led the Tigers with 127 yards rushing, while Mauck completed 17 of 28 passes for 224 yards and 3 TDs. Henderson caught 6 passes for 101 yards and 2 TDs, while Clayton had 6 catches for 59 yards and 1 score. The LSU defense limited Cadillac Williams, who was considered a Heisman Trophy Candidate, to 61 yards on 20 carries.
