LSU Tigers (3-2) at #9 Florida Gators (4-1)

TIGERS TRAVEL TO THE SWAMP TO TAKE ON NINTH-RANKED FLORIDA

Fresh off a thrilling 38-31 OT victory over Tennessee at Death Valley, LSU hits the road for the second time this season, traveling to the Swamp to face ninth-ranked Florida. LSU enters with renewed life after defeating its first ranked opponent since 1998, while Florida enters on the wings of a 47-35 loss against Mississippi State. The game will be carried by Jefferson Pilot Sports (WAFB Ch. 9 in Baton Rouge) marking LSU's third television appearance this season. The Tigers haven't won in the Swamp since a 28-17 victory on Oct. 4, 1986. Overall, Florida has won 11 of the last 12 vs. LSU, which includes six straight in Gainesville. LSU's last SEC road victory was a 31-19 victory over Auburn in the second week of the 1998 season.

DAVEY'S FOUR TD PASSES LEAD TIGERS PAST VOLS IN OT THRILLER

Rohan Davey delivered one of the more memorable performances in recent Tiger history, capping a 318-yard, 4 TD performance with a 25-yard strike to **Robert Royal** on the first play of overtime to lead LSU past Tennessee 38-31. **Damien James** broke up a fourth down pass in the Tigers' end zone by **A.J. Suggs** to secure the victory for the Tigers. Davey threw a pair of first half TD passes to **Josh Reed**, while **LaBrandon Toefield** came up with a career-best 74-yard run to help the Tigers grab a commanding 24-6 lead at the half. Tennessee mounted a furious comeback, rallying for 16 fourth quarter points to knot the game at 31 with 1:30 to go. After LSU had a 46-yard attempt blocked as regulation expired, Davey calmly led the Tigers to the deciding touchdown. Reed finished with 146 yards and three touchdowns, while Toefield had his first career 100-yard rushing game, piling up 120 yards.

THE LSU-FLORIDA SERIES

Florida owns a slight lead in the all-time series, holding a 24-19-3 advantage. The Gators have dominated in recent years, however, having won 11 of the last 12 in the series and 9-of-10 in the Steve Spurrier era. The one win for the Tigers in that stretch was a memorable one, however, as LSU defeated then-No. 1 Florida 28-21 in 1997 in a game televised by ESPN. Florida owns an 11-8-1 advantage in Gainesville. The Tigers have not won at the Swamp since taking a 28-17 decision on Oct. 4, 1986.

Notes On The Game:

* **Rohan Davey** threw for a career-high four TDs (three to **Josh Reed**) which marked the most by a Tiger QB since **Herb Tyler** threw four against Kentucky in 1997.

* **Josh Reed** caught three TD passes in the game, making him the first Tiger to have three TD catches since **Shedrick Wilson** against Rice in 1995.

* **LaBrandon Toefield's** 74-yard touchdown run is the longest run from scrimmage by a Tiger since **Kevin Faulk's** 81-yard touchdown run against Idaho in 1998. Toefield's 120-yard effort is the first time a Tiger has rushed for over 100 yards since **Rondell Mealey** rushed for 118 yards against North Texas last season. It is the first 100-yard game against a SEC opponent since Faulk rushed for 201 yards against Alabama in 1998.

* LSU broke a six-game losing streak against SEC East foes, dating back to a 1997 win at Kentucky. LSU is now 7-17-1 against the East since the league went to division play in 1992.

LSU VS. FLORIDA

The LSU Tigers head into Saturday's contest coming off the biggest win in the Nick Saban era and the biggest victory for the program since 1997 when the Tigers knocked off then No. 1-ranked Florida, 28-21 in Baton Rouge. LSU's 38-31 win over 11th-ranked Tennessee in overtime on Saturday in Baton Rouge marked the first victory over a ranked team by the Tigers since a 35-10 win over 17th-ranked Arkansas last year in Baton Rouge. LSU enters the Florida contest having won just one of the last 12 meetings with the Gators. LSU has lost six straight in Gainesville with the last Tiger victory in the Swamp coming in 1986 by a 28-17 count. LSU is 1-9 vs. Florida in the Steve Spurrier era. Saturday's contest will be the third television appearance for the Tigers this season (1-1 record). LSU is 57-74-7 all-time on television, which includes a 3-9-1 mark on Jefferson-Pilot. Last year, the Tigers played two thrillers on Jefferson-Pilot, losing on the last-play of the game at both Georgia (lost 23-22) and Alabama (23-17). The Florida contest will mark LSU's third game this year against a top 25 team - LSU lost at then-No. 24 Auburn, 34-17 and beat then-No. 11 Tennessee, 38-31.

DAVEY NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

LSU quarterback Rohan Davey was named the SEC Player of the Week on Monday after leading the Tigers to a 38-31 overtime win over Tennessee last week. Davey completed 23 of 35 passes for 318 yards, four TDs and no interceptions against the Vols. The 23 completions, 35 attempts, 318 yards and four TDs all marked career-highs for Davey. The honor is the second of Davey's career as he was named the league's player of the week following last year's 35-10 win over Arkansas in the season-finale.

THE SABAN RECORD

LSU coach **Nick Saban** enters Saturday's contest against Florida with a 46-28-1 overall mark after the Tigers' win over Tennessee last Saturday. Saban, who is in his seventh season as a collegiate head coach, guided Michigan State to four bowl games in five years. Saban opened his head coaching career at Toledo in 1990, where he guided the Rockets to a 9-2 mark and a share of the Mid-American Conference title.

Saban's string of serving six seasons as a head coach without suffering a losing record ranks as the nation's fourth-longest current streak.

LSU ON JEFFERSON-PILOT TV

LSU's game at Florida will mark the Tigers' 14th appearance on Jefferson-Pilot Television. LSU has a 3-9-1 mark on JP, which includes an 0-3 record in 1999. Last year, LSU played two thrillers on JP, losing to both Georgia (23-22) and Alabama (23-17) on the last play of the game. LSU also lost to Kentucky, 31-5, last year on JP. LSU has lost four straight JP games with the Tigers' last win on the network being a 28-20 win against Mississippi State in Baton Rouge in 1996.

DAVEY PLAYS CAREER GAME IN WIN OVER TENNESSEE

LSU quarterback **Rohan Davey** played the best game of his career on Saturday as the junior set numerous personal-best marks in the Tigers' 38-31 overtime win over 11th-ranked Tennessee. In his first start of the season and just the second of his career, Davey completed 23 of 35 passes for 318 yards and 4 TDs. Davey did not throw an interception in the contest running his streak of passes without an interception to 59. Davey also had a 32-yard run on the second play of the game, which marked the longest rush of his career. Dating back to last year's season-finale vs. Arkansas, Davey has completed 44 of his last 59 passes for 736 yards and 10 TDs with no interceptions.

TOEFIELD BREAKS LOOSE VS. TENNESSEE; RECORDS FIRST 100-YARD GAME

Redshirt freshman tailback **LaBrandon Toefield** recorded the first 100-yard rushing game of his career on Saturday vs. Tennessee as he netted a career-best 120 yards on 15 carries in the LSU victory. Toefield's best run was a 74-yarder early in the second half in which he stiff-armed and outran his way to the endzone. Toefield's 74-yard run was the longest run for a score by an LSU player since an 81-yard run by **Kevin Faulk** against Idaho in 1998. It was also the longest run by a Tiger in an SEC game since **Harvey Williams** scored on a 76-yard run vs. Ole Miss on Oct. 31, 1987. Toefield's 120 yards on the ground are the most for an LSU player in an SEC game since 1998 when Kevin Faulk rushed for 201 yards vs. Alabama.

LSU PUTS AN END TO DUBIOUS STREAK VS. THE SEC EAST

LSU's win over Tennessee snapped a 6-game losing streak for the Tigers against foes from the Eastern Division of the Southeastern Conference. The streak dated back the 1997 season when the Tigers routed Kentucky, 63-28, in Lexington. LSU is now 7-17-1 against the SEC Eastern Division since the league went to divisional play in 1992.

TIGERS DEFENSE CONTINUES TO BE TOUGH ON OPENING DRIVES

LSU extended its streak of holding the opposition without points on their opening drive against Tennessee on Saturday. The streak now stands at 10 straight games without allowing an opponent to score on their opening possession. The streak dates back to last year when Kentucky scored on its first possession on its way to a 31-5 victory over the Tigers in the sixth week of the season.

LSU DEFENSE HAS YET TO YIELD A FIRST QUARTER TD THIS SEASON

The LSU defense once again held an opponent without a first quarter touchdown on Saturday as the Tigers limited Tennessee to just a 47-yard field goal in the opening period. Through five games this season, LSU has allowed just six first quarter points (3 by UAB, 3 by Tennessee). LSU has not allowed a first quarter touchdown since Houston scored in the opening stanza in week 10 of the 1999 season.

ANOTHER FACT ABOUT THE LSU DEFENSE

Through five games the Tigers have allowed just one rushing touchdown, which ranks first in the SEC. The only rushing touchdown that the Tiger defense has allowed was a 2-yard run by Auburn's Rudy Johnson with just three seconds left in the game. Last year, the Tigers allowed 18 rushing TDs, a number that ranked 11th in the league.

Overall, the Tigers are allowing just 115.2 yards rushing a contest, sixth in the SEC and 33rd nationally, and LSU has already played against the top two rated running backs in the SEC in Auburn's Johnson and Tennessee's Travis Henry.

REED STRIKES AGAIN AS HE CATCHES 3 TD PASSES VS. TENNESSEE

When **Josh Reed** lined up at receiver for the first time against Alabama last season, the Tigers couldn't have possibly imagined what they discovered. Eight games later, Reed has developed into not only LSU's top receiving threat, but one of the most dangerous receivers in the SEC. Over the last eight games, Reed has surpassed the 100-yard barrier four times, including a 7-catch, 146-yard performance vs. Tennessee. Of Reed's seven receptions vs. Tennessee, three went for scores. Reed has already scored six TDs this season and four have been 45 yards or longer. Earlier this season, Reed caught a career-best eight passes for 167 yards vs. Auburn.

In LSU's two SEC games this season, Reed has caught 15 passes (7.5 per game) for 313 yards (156.5 per game) and 5 TDs.

Reed's 6 TDs this season are the most for an LSU player since **Sheddrick Wilson** had six in 1995. Wilson was the only LSU player in the 1990s with more than five TD receptions in a season. The last two LSU players to have more than six TD catches in a season were **Tony Moss** and **Eddie Fuller** with nine each in 1989.

Over the last eight games dating back to 1999, Reed is averaging four catches and 81 yards per game.

BOOTY PASSES TITTLE ON LSU'S ALL-TIME PASSING YARDAGE LIST

LSU junior quarterback **Josh Booty** moved past **Y.A. Tittle** into ninth place on the school's all-time passing yardage list vs. UAB. Since joining the Tigers a little over a season ago, Booty has passed for 2,666 yards. Booty currently stands 105 yards shy of moving past **Steve Ensminger** into eighth place.

REED LEADS SEC AND RANKS FOURTH IN NATION IN RECEIVING YARDS/GAME

With seven catches for 146 yards and 3 TDs vs. Tennessee, LSU sophomore wide out **Josh Reed** moved atop the SEC leaders in receiving yardage with 115.8 yards receiving a contest. The 115.8 yards a contest ranks fourth in the nation. Reed's six receiving TDs ranks first in the league as well, while his 5.4 receptions a contest are second in the SEC. In five games, Reed has caught 27 passes for 579 yards and six TDs. Reed's average of 21.4 yards per catch ranks second in the league to Boo Williams of Arkansas, who is averaging 24.5 yards per reception.

ROBINSON AND MYERS EXTEND RECEPTION STREAKS

With receptions against Tennessee, LSU's **Reggie Robinson** and **Jerel Myers** kept their streak of games with at least one catch alive. Robinson has caught at least one pass in his last 22 games, while Myers has caught a pass in 16 straight game, which also represents every game of his career. Robinson's streak of 21 straight games with a receptions is the longest active streak on the team.

BIG PLAY RETURNS TO LSU PASSING ATTACK

After a one-week hiatus, the big play returned to LSU's offensive attack on Saturday as the Tigers scored on two passing plays of 30 yards or more. **Josh Reed** was the recipient of both long scoring strikes as he scored on a 31-yard pass from **Rohan Davey** in the second quarter and then a 53-yard strike from Davey in the fourth quarter.

In five games this season, LSU has had nine scoring passing plays of 30 yards or longer. Included in that was **Josh Booty's** 75-yard strike to **Reed** against Auburn, which gave the Tigers two passing plays of over 75 yards in one season for the first time since 1994 (Jamie Howard to Brett Bech, 76 and 81 yard passes). Booty hit **Reggie Robinson** with an 80-yard TD pass in the season opener against Western Carolina.

So far this season, nine of LSU's 13 scoring plays through the air have been 30 yards or longer. Last year, the Tigers had just four TD passes of 30 yards or longer, three of which came in the season-finale vs. Arkansas.

LSU MAKING MOST OF BANGED UP O-LINE

Despite numerous injuries up-and-down the offensive line, LSU had its best overall offensive game on Saturday vs. Tennessee as the Tigers rolled up 460 yards of total offense, including a 142 yards on the ground.

Against Tennessee, the Tigers were without three season-opening starters on the line as **Trey Langley** (ACL), **Bob Wynne** (neck) and **John Compton** (concussion) all missed the contest. Langley, a four-year starter at tackle, is out for the season after tearing the ACL and MCL vs. Houston. Wynne, who hasn't played since the Houston game, and Compton will be evaluated this week. In their absence, **Louis Williams** moved from his normal spot at left guard to start at center and redshirt freshman **Rodney Reed**, a third team guard less than a month ago, started at left guard. The start was the first-ever for Reed, while Williams made his first-ever start at the center position.

RODNEY REED JOINS FIRST-TIME STARTERS LIST FOR TIGERS THIS SEASON

LSU used another first-time starter on Saturday vs. Tennessee as redshirt freshman Rodney Reed got the nod at left guard for the Tigers. Reed becomes the 10th first-time starter for the Tigers this season.

In addition to those nine first time starters, **Kyle Kipps** started at defensive end vs. Western Carolina, making him both an offensive and defensive starter during his LSU career. Prior to this season, Kipps had started 13 games at tight end, but he had never seen any time on the defensive side of the ball.

With 15 sacks in his first two years with the Tigers, junior defensive end **Jarvis Green** is on pace to break the school record for sacks. **Rydell Malancon** holds the school record with 25 sacks from 1980-83 with **Ron Sancho** next with 23.

CLARK COMES UP WITH ANOTHER INTERCEPTION

LSU free safety **Ryan Clark** intercepted a pass in the second straight game when he picked off a halfback pass late in the fourth quarter against Tennessee. Clark also had an interception against UAB. Clark now has five interceptions in his career.

LOUIS WILLIAMS IS MR. VERSATILE ON LSU'S O-LINE

When **Louis Williams** lined up as LSU's starting center vs. Tennessee on Saturday, it marked the fourth different starting position that the senior has played during his career. Williams, who has started 27 straight games for the Tigers, has started at least one game at center (1 start), left tackle (22 starts), left guard (2 starts) and right guard (2 starts) during his LSU career.

DOMANICK DAVIS MOVES UP KICKOFF RETURN CHARTS

With 205 kickoff returns yards this season, sophomore **Domanick Davis** has moved up to ninth place on LSU's all-time list for kickoff return yardage. In two years with the Tigers, Davis has returned 34 kicks for 823 yards (24.2 average).

Davis needs just 22 yards to move past **Kevin Faulk** (844 yards) into eighth place, 28 yards to move past **Eric Martin** (851 yards) for seventh place and 41 yards to move past **David Butler** (863 yards) into sixth place.

Last year, Davis set the school's single-season kickoff return record with 618 yards on 25 returns.

CORBELLO KICKS CAREER-LONG 47-YARD FIELD GOAL VS. TENNESSEE

John Corbello's 47-yard field goal in the first quarter on Saturday vs. Tennessee marked the longest of his career. His previous best was a 43-yarder last year against Kentucky. It's also the longest field goal by an LSU kicker since Wade Richey hit a school-record 54-yarder against Kentucky in 1996.

WILLIAMS EXTENDS STARTING STREAK

LSU senior offensive guard **Louis Williams** made his 27th straight start on Saturday night. Williams, who has been in the Tiger starting lineup since the 1998 season-opener against Arkansas State, has the longest current starting string of any LSU player. Other starting streaks of significance are senior cornerback **Fred Booker** (22 straight), and sophomore split end **Jerel Myers** and junior free safety **Ryan Clark** each with 16 consecutive starts. Sophomore linebacker **Trev Faulk** has started 13 straight games.

TIGER STADIUM * BATON ROUGE, LA.

A 73-yard pass on the first play of the game and a 100-yard kickoff return early in the second quarter were two of the big plays that keyed seventh-ranked Florida's 31-10 win over LSU in a rain-soaked Tiger Stadium last year.

Florida's first touchdown came just 39 seconds into the contest, and the Gators added a field goal just four minutes later for a 10-0 lead. LSU then cut the deficit to 10-3 on a 22-yard field goal by John Corbello.

However, Florida's Bo Carroll returned the ensuing kickoff 100 yards to extend the Gator lead to 17-3. Florida led 24-3 at halftime.

LSU got to within 24-10 late in the third quarter when Josh Booty hit Robert Royal for a 10-yard score. The Tigers had a chance to pull even closer, but LSU was unable to score in the fourth quarter despite getting inside the Florida 40-yard line twice. Florida's only points in the second half came with just 45 seconds left.

The Tiger offense sizzled, amassing 507 yards of offense in the opening 30 minutes while building a 37-0 lead before ultimately defeating Western Carolina 58-0 before an LSU record 87,188 fans last Saturday. Josh Booty threw for a career high 291 yards and a pair of touchdown passes, while Rohan Davey was a perfect 11-for-11 for 194 yards and three TD strikes as LSU wracked up a school record 485 yards passing. The Tigers wound up with 680 yards of total offense, the second highest total in LSU history and the most since 1977. Booty hit Reggie Robinson over the middle for an 80-yard strike on the third play of the game and the Tigers never looked back. Jerel Myers caught six balls for 117 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while Josh Reed hauled in five balls for 137 yards.
