The post-season begins: LSU comes to Birmingham for the SEC Tournament as the conference champion for the first time since 1997.

- LSU has won 13 conference championships, including eight since 1986, tying the Tigers with Alabama for the most SEC titles since the conference formed in 1933.
- Coach Smoke Laval became the sixth coach to lead LSU to the championship, joining Skip Bertman (7 titles), Harry Rabenhorst (2) and Red Swanson, Ray Didier and Jim Smith (one each).
- The Tigers finished the regular season with 20 conference wins for the seventh time in school history and the first time since 1998.
- The SEC Tournament as at Hoover Metropolitan Stadium for the sixth consecutive year and the eighth time since 1990. LSU won the tournament championship in Birmingham in 1990 and 2000.

The Tigers' half of the draw: LSU has three SEC West opponents in its bracket in Arkansas, Ole Miss and Mississippi State.

- The Tigers completed their regular season by winning two of three from Arkansas in Fayetteville. This marks the first time LSU has opened the SEC Tournament with the same team it closed the regular season against.
- LSU is 4-2 against Arkansas in SEC Tournament meetings, but the Razorbacks have won both meetings at Birmingham, 8-4 in 1998 and 9-8 in 1999.
- LSU won two SEC Tournament meetings from Ole Miss in 2001, 13-2 and 12-6, and are 3-0 against the Rebels in the post-season.
- The Tigers won the regular season series from the Rebels in Baton Rouge, 2-1, their 12th straight series win at home.
- MSU holds a 6-5 edge in tournament meetings, including a 4-1 win in the 2001 championship game.
- LSU hasn't defeated State in an SEC Tournament game since a 14-6 win in the 1995 West Division tournament at Starkville.
- The Bulldogs won two of three meetings at Starkville on the first weekend of May.

The other half: LSU won the season series from three of the four bracket one teams.

- LSU took two of three from East Division champion South Carolina in April at Baton Rouge. The Tigers have won the season series
- South Carolina won two of three tournament meetings last year, but LSU has a 3-2 all-time edge in post-season meetings.
- LSU won the season series with Alabama, 2-1, at Tuscaloosa in March and has won 10 of the last 11 meetings between the schools.
- LSU won a pair of tournament meetings with Alabama in 2000, 18-12 and 6-5, and has a 5-3 all-time tournament edge.
- LSU won two of three from Auburn in May at home, the first time the home team has won the series since 1999.
- LSU beat Auburn 2-1 in last year's tournament to improve to 7-2 against the Tigers of the Plains in the post-season.
- The Tigers dropped two of three to Vanderbilt over Easter weekend in Nashville, the Commodores' second consecutive series win over LSU.
- LSU has won both SEC Tournament meetings with Vandy, 13-5 in 1990 and 7-2 in 1992.

Champions: LSU has won six tournament titles, the last in 2000.

- LSU has not won the regular season and tournament titles in the same season since 1993.

About the SEC Tournament

Record

LSU enters 37-18-1 overall and 20-9-1 in the SEC, winning the overall championship for the first time since 1997.

Radio

All games will be broadcast live by the LSU Sports Network and can be heard on WDGL-98.1 FM in Baton Rouge. Jim Hawthorne, Bill Franques and Charles Hanagriff call the action.

Live Television

Games on Wednesday and Thursday, plus the two "if necessary" games on Saturday will be shown by Comcast Sports Southeast. LSU games on CSS will be televised in Louisiana by Jumbo Sports Network affiliates.

Friday's games, the first two games on Saturday and the championship game will be shown by SEC-TV on Fox Sports Net Southwest in Louisiana, and on Fox Sports Net South and Sunshine Network in other SEC markets. Dave Neal and Larry Conley will call the action.

Tournament Record

LSU is 46-27 (.630) in 19 previous tournament appearances, the highest winning percentage in the SEC tourney. The Tigers have appeared in 19 consecutive tournaments and have won at least one game in every tournament since 1986.

Last Year

LSU won its first two games in the tournament, defeating Auburn (2-1) and South Carolina (8-3) before losing twice to the Gamecocks, 10-8 and 5-4.

Championships

LSU has won the tournament a record six times (1986, 1990, 1992, 1993, 1994, 2000) and has finished as runners-up five times (1987, 1991, 1995, 1997, 2001).

Coach Smoke Laval

Laval is 80-40-1 in his second year at LSU and 321-199-1 in his ninth season as a head coach.

The schedule

LSU opens tournament play at 8 p.m. Wednesday against Arkansas, then will play either Mississippi St. or Ole Miss at 1 p.m. or 8 p.m. Thursday, depending on the results from Wednesday. The tournament continues through to Sunday's 3 p.m. championship game.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2003: Is 3-0 with a 2.40 ERA in 15 appearances (3 starts) over 45.0 innings

- Takes on big responsibility as the Tigers' starter in the SEC Tournament opener vs. Arkansas.
- Talented local product is the Tigers' only experienced southpaw due to injury to Lane Mestepey.
- Has recovered fully from Tommy John surgery on his elbow last season and has been a key component of Tiger staff.
- Has walked just six batters in 45 innings this year, and has walked only two batters in his last 32 1/3 innings.
- Allowing opponents to hit just .233 against him.
- Made his longest outing in an SEC game vs. Auburn (5/11), giving up two runs on six hits in 5 2/3 innings.
- Turned in the most impressive outing of his career vs. New Orleans (4/30), giving up just one earned run in eight innings with no walks and six strikeouts in the longest outing of his career.
- Improved to 3-0 with win over Southeastern La. (4/23) despite giving up four runs in the sixth inning.
- Took part in second shutout this season vs. Tulane (4/15), giving up just one hit in three scoreless innings.
- Turned in sterling relief outing to improve to 2-0 at Northwestern St. (4/9), striking out five and walking none while giving up just two hits in 3 2/3 scoreless innings.
- Made first start of the season vs. Nicholls St. (4/2) a memorable one, striking out a career high seven and allowing no earned runs in four innings.
- Made return with two scoreless innings at Centenary (2/11), striking out three.
- Added 2 1/3 scoreless innings vs. Kansas (2/16, Game 1).
- Earned save with a career high four-inning stint vs. Southeastern Louisiana (3/5), holding LSU shutout into the ninth inning and striking out a career high four.
- Picked up his first win of the season in relief vs. Winthrop (3/9), giving up no hits over two innings.
- Saw first SEC action by pitching ninth inning at Georgia (3/22).

2002: Was granted medical redshirt after making just two appearances (one start), posting a 1-0 mark with a 1.29 ERA in seven innings.

- Underwent Tommy John surgery in February after suffering a torn ligament in his left elbow.
- Made his first career LSU appearance vs. Birmingham-Southern (2/9) in relief and pitched four strong innings, giving up just one run on two hits and eventually picking up the win.
- Made first career start at Centenary (2/20), pitching three scoreless innings, but the elbow injury was discovered after this game.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2003: Named a second team All-SEC pitcher with a 9-2 record and a 4.07 ERA in 15 appearances (11 starts) over 79.2 innings.

- Has been pleasant surprise of the season by anchoring the Tigers' SEC pitching rotation.
- Is 8-1 with a 3.61 ERA in SEC games, having worked at least seven innings in all eight of his conference wins.
- Has pitched at least seven complete innings in seven of eight SEC starts this season.
- Allowed just one earned run over eight innings to pick up victory in the Tigers' SEC clinching win at Arkansas (5/16).
- Suffered worst outing of the year vs. Auburn (5/11), when he gave up five runs on seven hits in just 2/3 of an inning.
- Has given up both of the Tigers' biggest innings this year—7 runs vs. Kansas (2/16, Game 2, 3rd inning) and vs. Auburn (5/11, 1st inning).
- Has made his way to the SEC starting rotation after spending most of the first month in the Tiger bullpen.
- Has pitched at least seven complete innings in seven of eight SEC starts this season.
- Looking to bounce back from worst outing of the year vs. Auburn (5/11), when he gave up five runs on seven hits in just 2/3 of an inning.
- Fell just one out shy of his second complete game of the year at Mississippi St. (5/4), nonetheless picking up the win by giving up just one run in 8 2/3 innings.
- Turned in yet another outstanding outing, as he gave up no earned runs in seven innings vs. Tennessee (4/27), striking out seven.
- Gave up two runs in seven-plus innings at Vanderbilt (4/20), salvaging the series finale with his fifth consecutive SEC win.
- Turned in outstanding performance vs. Ole Miss (4/13), giving up just two runs and three hits in eight innings while striking out a career high 10.
- Fired first career complete game vs. South Carolina (4/6), striking out seven and walking only one. Allowed four runs, but only one run through the first eight innings.
- Turned in masterful outing in first conference appearance at Georgia (3/23), striking out a career high eight over 8.0 innings to earn the win.
- Won second consecutive start at Alabama (3/30), lasting seven innings and settling down after throwing three wild pitches in the first inning.
- Made stellar LSU debut on short notice vs. Northwestern St. (2/9), allowing two runs in 7.0 innings and striking out four. Took shutout into the seventh inning.
- Had rough second start vs. Kansas (2/16, Game 2), giving up eight runs on nine hits in 2 2/3 innings.
- Rebounded from Kansas game to pitch two scoreless innings vs. UL-Monroe (2/18).
- Allowed one run in 2.2 innings at Long Beach St. (3/1)
- Pitched two perfect innings of relief vs. Winthrop in series opener (3/7).
- Struggled in relief stint at Tulane (3/11), walking in two runs with the bases loaded without retiring a batter.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2003: Is 8-2 with a 4.99 ERA in 13 appearances (12 starts) totaling 83.0 innings

- Needs just nine more strikeouts to move into top 10 on the LSU career strikeout chart.
- Has struggled in the first inning this year, giving up 15 earned runs in his 12 starts for an 11.25 ERA.
- Rated as No. 15 senior nationally by Baseball America.
- Tied for ninth on the LSU career victory list with Mark Guthrie at 26, and is now one of 10 LSU pitchers with 25 or more career victories.
- Has won nine of his 26 career games in contests that immediately followed LSU defeats.
- Has struck out 10 or more batters four times in his career.
- Made impressive first start of season at Long Beach St. (3/2), giving up one run on five hits over six innings. Left eight Long Beach runners stranded in scoring position.
- Notched first career save in victory over Houston (2/23), throwing two scoreless innings of relief in first outing of season.
- Struck out nine over six strong innings vs. Winthrop (3/8), giving up just one run on five hits.
- Turned in first complete game of season and fifth of his career vs. Florida (3/15), walking none and striking out eight over nine innings to improve to 3-0.
- Won his fourth straight start at Georgia (3/22), striking out a season high 10 batters over eight innings.
- Walked a career high nine batters in 5 1/3 innings at Alabama (3/29), but still managed to hang on and improve to 5-0.
- Struggled in first loss of the season to South Carolina (4/5), giving up six runs on seven hits and five walks in five innings to fall to 0-4 in his career against the Gamecocks.
- Pitched 7 2/3 innings vs. Ole Miss to improve to team best 6-1 (4/12). After giving up six runs on seven hits through 2 1/3 innings, Pettit retired the next 14 batters he faced through the end of the seventh.
- Gave up four runs in first inning at Vanderbilt (4/19), but allowed just four hits over the final eight innings he pitched in taking a no decision.
- Was 10-2 in his last 12 starts prior to the no decision, his first since April 28 vs. Arkansas.
- Struggled early vs. Tennessee (4/26), giving up four runs in the first inning and six through the first 2 2/3, but recovered to shut out the Volunteers the rest of the way and picked up the win by going eight innings.
- Took loss at Mississippi St. (5/3), giving up five runs and seven hits in five-plus innings.
- Picked up his team leading eighth victory vs. Auburn (5/10) by giving up three runs on eight hits in six innings while striking out eight.
- Struggled again at Arkansas (5/17), walking six batters and giving up five runs over 6.0 innings, but getting off the hook when LSU rallied to tie the game in the ninth.
- The 13th-round selection of the Minnesota Twins in the 2002 draft.

2002: Finished 9-7 and ranked seventh in the SEC with a 3.35 ERA. Posted 121 strikeouts in 121.0 innings pitched.

- Struck out 10 or more batters three times during the season.
- Was healthy for a complete season for the first time in his LSU career and came of age.
- Gave up just two runs on seven hits in complete game regional victory vs. Tulane (6/1), saving the Tigers from elimination.
- Turned in a spectacular complete game in regular season finale vs. Alabama (5/19), striking out nine and giving up just one run on five hits.
- Turned in sterling 8.0 inning outing at Florida (5/12), giving up just four singles and one run to the SEC's top-hitting team. Allowed just two runners to reach third base over his final seven innings.
- Earned his first win in three weeks at Tennessee (5/5), striking out seven and allowing just two runs over 7.0 innings.
- Went 5.1 innings and gave up three runs but got no decision vs. Arkansas (4/28).
- Named the SEC Pitcher of the Week on Apr. 15. For that week, Pettit struck out 12 over 13.0 innings and fashioned a 2.08 ERA in defeating Tulane and Georgia.
- Took tough loss at South Carolina (Apr. 21), giving up four runs in 6.1 innings.
- Against Georgia (Apr. 14), Pettit overcame a slow start to strike out seven and walk just one over 7.0 innings to even his record and pick up first SEC win in a month.



- Pitched one of the best games of his career against Tulane in the Superdome (Apr. 10), giving up just one hit in 5.0 shutout innings. Pettit retired the first 12 batters he faced and did not allow a ball to be hit out of the infield in the first four innings.
- Had outstanding start in win over New Orleans (Apr. 2), pitching 4.0 shutout innings and giving up just two hits.
- Fired complete game, four-hit shutout vs. Vanderbilt (Mar. 15), tying a career high with 12 strikeouts.
- Tied a career high with 12 strikeouts in the Tigers' Feb. 15 victory over Mercer.
- Struck out 10 in 6.1 innings and got no decision vs. UL-Monroe (Mar. 8).
- Went a career high 7.2 innings in Mercer game, not yielding an earned run and carrying a shutout into the eighth inning.
- Started season opener vs. Birmingham-Southern on Feb. 8 and struck out eight in 6.0 innings.

2001: Posted 4-0 mark with a 2.42 ERA, but only appeared in 7 games (4 starts) due to continuing shoulder ailments.

- Earned his first win of the season against Southern on Mar. 13, going five innings and allowing two runs on two hits.
- Best outing of season came Mar. 23 at Mississippi St., as he allowed no earned runs in 6.1 innings to pick up the victory.
- Did not return to action again until May 1 at New Orleans, when he went three innings and allowed just one hit and no earned runs while striking out five.
- Final outing came in five-inning stint at Arkansas (5/6), giving up three runs in five innings.

2000: Went 5-3 with a 4.15 ERA in 16 games (7 starts), but season ended early due to tendonitis in his shoulder.

- Best effort came at Ole Miss (4/30) in first career SEC start. In that game, Pettit allowed one run on five hits and struck out a career-high 12 in seven innings to pick up series-clinching win.
- Earned his first career win in second game of doubleheader vs. Virginia (2/12), starting and throwing six scoreless innings, striking out six and allowing just two hits.
- Final outing of season came at Kentucky (5/6), where he earned win with six strikeouts over 6.2 innings.

1999: Was granted a medical redshirt after pitching in only three early-season games.

So we meet again

The Tigers' first opponent in the SEC Tournament happens to be the same team that LSU closed its regular season with, Arkansas. The Tigers took two of three from the Razorbacks in Fayetteville this past weekend to win the SEC championship and win their first series in the Ozarks since 1997.

In the Tigers' 19 previous SEC Tournament appearances, LSU never began the tournament against the same team that it closed the regular season—until this year, that is, as Arkansas slipped into the eighth and final spot in the tournament after Kentucky beat Florida to knock the Gators out of the tournament.

This may mark the first time LSU has opened the SEC Tournament with its final regular season opponent, but not the first time LSU has met their final opponent in the tournament at some point. LSU played Kentucky in 1999 and Alabama in 2000 in the second game of the tournament after closing the regular season against both of those teams, and in 1997, LSU played Alabama twice in the tournament after closing the season in Tuscaloosa.

Together again

Since 1998, the SEC Tournament has been played in the Omaha format, with two four-team brackets whittling down to a two-team championship game.

One constant for the Tigers since that format begin is that whenever Arkansas has made the SEC Tournament, the Razorbacks and the Tigers have been paired in the same bracket. The Hogs and the Tigers didn't meet in the 2002 tournament, but in 1998 and 1999, Arkansas defeated LSU in bracket play. Arkansas did not qualify for the tournament in 2000 and 2001.

LSU is in the same bracket with Ole Miss for the second time under this format, as the Tigers beat the Rebels twice in the 2001 tournament. Mississippi St. is in LSU's bracket for the third time since 1998, as the Bulldogs eliminated the Tigers in 1998, but the teams did not meet in 2000 when State was ousted in two games.

LSU's two opponents from the 2002 tournament, Auburn and South Carolina, are on the other side of the bracket, along with Alabama, the 2002 tournament champion. Vanderbilt and LSU have not met in the tournament since 1992.

Tigers avoid the two-and-out

LSU winning a game at the SEC Tournament has been just as automatic as the Tigers making an appearance in the tournament in the last two decades.

Entering their conference record 19th consecutive tournament, LSU has won at least one game in the tournament in the last 17 seasons, with the Tigers' only two-and-out coming in 1985. The Tigers have a .667 winning percentage in the tournament (46-23) since 1986.

LSU has gone two-and-out only five times in a post-season tournament: the 1985 SEC Tournament, the 1985 Central Regional at Austin, the 1994 College World Series in Omaha, and super regionals in 1999 at Alabama and 2002 at Rice.

Bad omen?

LSU will be out not only to win its seventh SEC Tournament championship this week in Birmingham, but also reverse a trend that has witnessed the regular season conference champion falling short of pulling off the double in the tournament.

The last team to win the regular season and tournament titles in the same year was Alabama in 1996, although the Crimson Tide shared the regular season title with Florida and LSU. Last year's regular season champion, South Carolina, lost in the final to Alabama.

LSU has pulled off the double of the regular season and tournament titles twice, in 1990 and 1992. The 1990 tournament championship game between LSU and Mississippi St. was canceled in the fourth inning, and the Tigers and Bulldogs were declared tournament co-champions.

The 1992 Tigers are the last team to win the regular season title outright and the tournament title in the same year.

When LSU won its first conference championship in 1986, the tournament champion was declared the conference champion, and there was no regular season champion declared.

In 1993, LSU won the West division tournament, which at the time, counted in the overall standings. The Tigers' percentage after the tournament allowed LSU to edge Tennessee, the East division tournament winner, for the overall crown.

Great eight

In winning its first championship since 1997, LSU showed the consistency needed to survive the brutal 30-game schedule that is the SEC.

In 10 weekends of conference action, LSU won eight weekend series, becoming the only conference team in 2003 to win eight of 10 series. The only teams to win a series from LSU were Vanderbilt and Mississippi St., who each won two games from the Tigers at their home parks in a three-week stretch of late April and early May.

Last year, LSU was 6-3-1 in conference series, the Tigers' fewest series wins under the current format.

LSU had not won eight SEC series in a single season since going 8-2 in 2000. LSU also went 8-2 in league series in both 1996 and 1997, the first two years that teams played 10 conference series. The SEC and school record for series wins in one year is nine, done by LSU in a nine-series schedule in 1986 and by South Carolina last year.

Of the other 11 conference teams, Auburn won seven league series, while Ole Miss and Arkansas won six each. On the other hand, Vanderbilt is in the tournament despite winning only four conference series, while Alabama won just three series.

LSU continues road success in the SEC

By closing out the regular season with a pair of wins at Arkansas, LSU finished the regular season with a 9-6 mark in conference road games, marking the fourth consecutive year the Tigers have won a majority of their away games in the SEC.

LSU matched the 9-6 road mark it posted in 2002, and joined Auburn and Mississippi St. as the only other SEC teams to post winning records on the road this year in the conference, as both the Tigers of the Plains and the Bulldogs were also 9-6 in the league. Auburn and Arkansas joined LSU as the only league teams to win a majority of its road series.

Since the start of the 2000 season, LSU is a solid 36-23 in conference road games, winning 14 of 20 series away from Baton Rouge and 16 of its last 22 since the end of the 1999 season, reversing a trend that had witnessed LSU lose eight of 11 league series away from home.

Tigers see 20-20 in SEC for seventh time

The Tigers' win at Arkansas to close the regular season allowed LSU to reach an important milestone with its 20th conference win of the season. The 20 wins are the most for LSU in a single conference season since the 1998 club was 21-9 in conference games.

The LSU single season record for conference wins was 22 in 1986 and 1997. LSU also won 21 games in 1994 and 20 games in both 1990 and 1996. LSU failed to win the conference title when winning 20 or more league games in 1994, when Tennessee went 24-5, and in 1998, when Florida edged LSU by one-half game.

The last team to win a conference title without winning 20 conference games? That would be LSU, which won the 1993 title with an 18-8-1 mark. Ironically, in 1993, Tennessee went 20-10 in the league, but the Vols were forced to play an extra game in the SEC East Tournament, which counted in the league standings, while LSU had two regular season games with Alabama rained out, leaving the Tigers percentage points ahead of the Vols (.685 to .667).

Tigers break the Fayetteville funk

The Tigers closed out the regular season by winning two games at Arkansas for the first time since 1997. LSU had gone a combined 1-5 on its previous two trips to Baum Stadium in Fayetteville, losing two of three in 1999 and getting swept in 2001.

With the series win in the Ozarks, LSU has now won at least one conference series at each of the 11 other SEC cities since May of 2000 (the last time LSU played at Kentucky), becoming the only conference team to achieve the feat. In that span, LSU has won twice at Alabama and once at the other 10 sites.

Tigers make it 20 in the tourney

This week, LSU becomes just the third SEC team to make 20 appearances in the conference tournament. Mississippi St. and Florida are tied with the most appearances, going 24 times in 27 tries since the tournament began in 1977.



Laval named SEC Coach of the Year

Every time LSU has won the SEC championship, the man leading the Tigers to the title has been tabbed as the SEC Coach of the Year, and 2003 is no exception, as second year skipper Smoke Laval becomes the sixth different Tiger coach to win the honor.

Laval, 47, who returned to LSU to succeed Skip Bertman, the Tigers' legendary Hall of Fame coach from 1984 through 2001, guided an injury-ravaged Tiger squad to its first conference championship since 1997 and the Tigers' seventh season of 20 wins in the SEC since 1986. Laval was part of four SEC championship teams and two national champions at LSU as Bertman's top assistant coach from 1984 through 1993.

Bertman won the SEC Coach of the Year honor seven times (1986, 1990, 1991, 1992, 1993, 1996 and 1997), with Harry Rabenhorst (1939, 1946), Red Swanson (1943), Ray Didier (1961) and Jim Smith (1975) also earning the prestigious award.

Laval is now 81-40-1 in his tenure at LSU and 322-199-1 as a head coach. Laval was 241-159 in seven seasons as at UL-Monroe from 1994 through 2000 and named the Southland Conference Coach of the Year twice.

Hill named SEC Player of the Year

Many times, a rule of thumb is that the best player on the championship team will win a league's Most Valuable Player award, and such a path came true this year, as LSU shortstop Aaron Hill was named the SEC Position Player of the Year on Monday.

Hill, a junior from Visalia, Calif., has been the glue of the Tigers' team through this injury-plagued campaign, batting a team high .367 while leading the SEC in doubles (24) and on-base percentage (.473). Hill also leads LSU in RBI (51), runs scored (55) and walks (38) heading into the post-season, and struck out just 15 times in 265 plate appearances this year.

Hill also led the SEC in batting average in SEC games at .398, while also posting a league high .483 on-base percentage in conference games. He also batted .404 on the year with 18 RBI with two out, and in SEC games, batted .389 with runners in scoring position.

Hill is the only LSU player to start all 56 games during the regular season, and was a standout on the 2002 United States national team that won the silver medal in the inaugural World University Games in Italy.

Hill becomes the fourth LSU player to win SEC Player of the Year honors, joining Todd Walker (1993), Russ Johnson (1994) and Eddy Furniss (1996), all of whom also earned first team All-America honors during the seasons in which they won the SEC MVP award.

Harris, Patterson also earn first team honors

For the second time in three years, LSU has three members of the All-SEC first team, as sophomore first baseman Clay Harris and sophomore designated hitter Ryan Patterson joined SEC Player of the Year Aaron Hill on the first team.

LSU had three first teamers in 2001 in Lane Mestepey, Mike Fontenot and the late Wally Pontiff. This year's three-man group ties South Carolina for the most on the first team.

Harris, who was a 2002 freshman All-America as a pitcher, did not move into the starting lineup until the Tigers' series in March at Long Beach St., and the spot became his throughout the year. Harris finished the regular season with a .346 batting average, 11 home runs, 48 RBI and a team best 22 RBI with two out.

Harris batted .353 with 10 doubles and a league high 36 RBI in conference games while batting .459 in league games with runners in scoring position.

Patterson came to LSU from Texarkana Junior College and enjoyed a breakout first season at LSU, batting .362 with a team high 13 RBI while also leading the club with a .417 batting average with runners in scoring position. Patterson batted a cool .391 in SEC games, and collected at least one hit in 45 of the 52 regular season games in which he played.

Since 1983, LSU has failed to have a selection on the All-SEC first team only once, and that was in 1999.

Tiger trio earns second team All-SEC honors

Three LSU players who contributed in varied ways earned second team All-SEC recognition on Monday, giving LSU a total of six players and one coach honored by the league, the most in the conference.

The three second team All-SEC players are sophomore second baseman Blake Gill, sophomore right fielder Jon Zeringue and junior right-handed pitcher Nate Bumstead.

Gill, who started all but two games this year after playing largely in a platoon situation in 2002, moved from first base to second base early in the year and hit a solid .304 on the campaign, driving in 20 runs with two out and knocking in 43 runs on the year. Gill also proved to be a steady hand in the Tiger infield, committing just 10 errors in 300 chances and participating in a team high 38 double plays.

For Zeringue, it was a meteoric rise, as the Thibodaux native batted just .204 over the first month of the year and was benched for three weeks. When he returned to the lineup, Zeringue batted .411 over the second half of the regular season to finish the year at .346.

Las Vegas native Bumstead was expected to be a reliever and a spot starter, but he moved into the SEC rotation in late March and became the anchor of the staff, finishing the regular season at 9-2 with a 4.07 ERA.



Zeringue caps sensational second half

Earning second team All-SEC honors was simply cherry on the cake for LSU right fielder Jon Zeringue, as the Thibodaux native enjoyed the best second half among Tiger hitters.

In the Tigers' last 28 regular season games, Zeringue batted .411 (44-for-107) with 27 runs scored, 19 RBI and strong slugging (.626) and on-base (.475) percentages. The Thibodaux native closed the year out in fine fashion by going 6-for-13 in the Tigers' three-game series at Arkansas, collecting three hits on Saturday and two more on Sunday.

This is a far cry from a player who began the season batting .204 after his first 14 games. Zeringue heads into the post-season with a solid .346 batting average overall and a .375 average in conference games.

Double double for Naccarata

Although LSU third baseman Ivan Naccarata remains tied for the SEC lead in triples with five through the end of the regular season, he also proved quite adept at doubles in the Arkansas series, as he doubled twice in the series finale last Sunday.

Naccarata is back in the LSU starting lineup full-time after a brief stint as a platoon player, and all indications are the Canadian wants to stay in the lineup. In the Tigers' last 10 games, Naccarata is batting .385 (15-for-39) with 10 runs scored as he has brought his season average back up to .314.

During his last 10 games played, Naccarata has hit safely in eight of those contests, including five games of two hits or more. Naccarata continues to lead LSU with a .379 batting average against right-handed pitchers.

Harris to reprise mound role?

LSU first baseman Clay Harris may have the opportunity to reprise the pitching role that earned him freshman All-America honors this week at the SEC Tournament. Harris, who was 3-0 with a 4.15 ERA in 16 appearances on the mound last year, has pitched only once this year, pitching 2 1/3 scoreless innings in relief on February 8 against Northwestern St.

Harris pitched in last year's SEC Tournament, giving up two runs (one earned) on no hits in three innings of a 10-8 loss to South Carolina.

At the plate, Harris will be looking to recapture the form that made him a first team All-SEC pick. Harris is batting just .216 (8-for-37) with 14 strikeouts in the Tigers' last 10 outings, dropping his season batting average by 38 points in the process to .346, the lowest it has been all year, a tribute to his consistency throughout. Harris is tied for second on the Tigers with 11 home runs, and continues to lead the team in slugging percentage at .636.

Hill returns to MVP form

The last two weeks of the regular season provided a return to form for Tiger shortstop Aaron Hill, who was crowned the SEC's MVP on Monday night.

After going through a 4-for-26 slump in late April and the first two games of May, Hill has picked up his game yet again, hitting safely in the Tigers' last eight games, batting .421 (16-for-38) with 12 RBI and 10 runs scored during that time span to bring his average back to a team leading .367.

Hill also showed off some of his power stroke in the Arkansas series, hitting home runs in each of the last two games to give him eight on the year, one shy of his total of nine in 2002.

Hill finished the regular season as the SEC leader in doubles (24) and on-base percentage (.473), and continues to lead LSU in RBI (51) and runs scored (55), striking out just 15 times in 265 total plate appearances.

Hill also led the SEC in batting average in conference games at .398, and in league games, batted .389 with runners in scoring position.

Patterson stays sharp with solid series

Slump is not a word that can be used when describing the play of LSU's Ryan Patterson this year, as the first team All-SEC performer has shown an uncanny knack for avoiding the downturns that are often inevitable during a long season.

Patterson has hit safely in 45 of the 52 games in which he has played this year, and not once has he gone consecutive games without a hit this year. Patterson is batting .400 (14-for-35) with nine runs scored during an eight game hitting streak he carries into the tournament. Patterson earlier this year had a nine-game hitting streak, and also had four different hitting streaks of six games during the year.

Patterson hit his team leading 13th home run of the year last Saturday at Arkansas, and was 6-for-15 in the three-game set, leaving him with a .391 batting average in SEC games, second in the league only to Aaron Hill's .398 mark.

Patterson is also second on the team in overall batting average at .362, and is also second in slugging percentage (.633) and doubles (17).

Double vision hasn't failed the Tigers yet in 2003

Last Friday's win at Arkansas improved LSU to 18-0 this season when the Tigers score 10 or more runs and extended their two-year winning streak when hitting double figures to 28, dating back to a 12-11 loss at Houston last February 24. LSU is 31-1 under coach Smoke Laval when scoring 10 or more runs.

LSU scored 10 or more runs 12 times in SEC games, and has won 17 consecutive conference games when scoring 10 or more.



Meier caps regular season in style

LSU capped its SEC championship regular season in fine style on Sunday at Arkansas, thanks to the efforts of true freshman hurler Justin Meier.

Meier improved to 7-2 with his most impressive outing of the year, pitching eight shutout innings against the Razorbacks and scattering five hits. Meier frustrated the Hogs by forcing Arkansas to hit into 15 fly ball outs and threw 66 of his 95 pitches for strikes.

Meier lowered his ERA to 2.70 with the win, moving him up to sixth on the SEC charts, and leaving him as the freshman with the lowest ERA in the conference.

Heading into the SEC Tournament, Meier also has won back-to-back starts in conference play for the first time since moving into the SEC rotation for the injured Brian Wilson in early April. Meier's eight-inning outing last Sunday was eclipsed only by a complete game on April 4 vs. South Carolina.

Bumstead not bummed, bounces back

Unfortunately for Arkansas, the Razorbacks got a look at the Nate Bumstead who was a second team All-SEC performer last Friday, not the pitcher who struggled against Auburn five days earlier.

Bumstead bounced back from a rough outing at home on May 11 in which he gave up seven runs in 2/3 of an inning to pitch the Tigers to the SEC championship by giving up just one earned run on five hits in eight innings. Bumstead struck out seven in his stint as he finished the regular season at 8-1 with a 3.61 ERA in his nine conference starts.

Bumstead did not go fewer than seven innings in any of his eight SEC wins, and for the year, leads the Tigers with a 9-2 record.

Bumstead becomes the third first-year pitcher in as many years to earn All-SEC accolades. Freshman Lane Mestepey earned first team and Freshman of the Year honors in 2001, while junior Jake Tompkins earned second team honors in 2002.

Smith solid despite taking tough luck loss

Freshmen pitchers often undergo a learning curve, and that's what has happened to LSU left-hander Greg Smith this year.

Smith took a tough luck loss last week at Arkansas, giving up just two hits in 3 1/3 innings, but when Billy Sadler relieved him with two on in the 10th, he failed to retire a batter. Smith fell to 0-2 on the year, but in his 15 appearances, he has given up just six walks and 27 strikeouts in 31 1/3 innings, and he will be counted upon heavily out of the bullpen in the post-season.

Determann gets the call in opener

Last year, all Jason Determann could do was watch LSU's run to the post-season, as the highly touted left-hander out of Catholic High in Baton Rouge underwent Tommy John surgery to repair a damaged ligament in his elbow after just seven innings and two appearances.

Now, after a solid season that has seen Determann become a reliable swing man on the Tigers' mound corps, the southpaw has been entrusted with making the first start of the post-season for LSU on Wednesday against Arkansas.

Determann has not started a game against an SEC team in his career, but he did pitch the ninth inning against Arkansas last Friday in Fayetteville, giving up a leadoff home run to Ryan Fox before retiring the final three batters in order.

For the year, Determann is 4-0 with a 2.45 ERA, as he has walked just six batters in 45 innings while striking out 37 and holding foes to a .237 batting average.

Sadler has rough time in the Ozarks

Billy Sadler's weekend at Arkansas was one he would rather forget, as he struggled in both of his outings.

ON Saturday, he walked in the winning run with the bases loaded in the 10th inning, and on Sunday, he gave up a two-run double with two out in the bottom of the ninth to break up a shutout that was started by Justin Meier.

In his last 5 1/3 innings, Sadler has given up three runs and walked eight batters to see his ERA go up to 3.08. Sadler leads the Tigers with 23 appearances on the year, 22 in relief.

Tigers' extra inning blues continue

Last Saturday's loss to Arkansas in 10 innings dropped LSU to 0-4 in extra inning games this year. The Tigers have lost one extra inning game in each of the four months of the year, falling on February 14 to Kansas, March 11 to Tulane at Zephyr Field and April 19 at Vanderbilt in addition to last Saturday's game. Except for the Tulane game that went 11 innings, the other three games were ended in the 10th inning.

This year is a total reversal from 2002, when LSU was 3-0 in over-time outings.

LSU also fell to 6-4 in one-run games with the loss to the Hogs.

Striking out

LSU batters struck out 29 times in the three-game series at Arkansas, the most the Tigers have fanned in the Smoke Laval era in a series.

The Tigers' 14 strikeouts on Saturday were a season high and the most since LSU fanned 15 times last February 22 at Houston.

Tigers hold steady at No. 6 in pseudo-RPI

Heading into this week's SEC Tournament, LSU is in great shape to be one of the eight schools to be a super regional host should the Tigers not bomb out in Birmingham.

For the second consecutive week, the Tigers are ranked No. 6 in the latest pseudo-RPI rankings compiled by Boyd Nation of Birmingham. Nation, who will be in attendance at this week's tournament at the Hoover Met, has been very accurate on his projections compared to the official RPI ratings compiled by the Division I baseball committee. The committee uses the ratings to select the NCAA tournament field of 64 teams and seed them.

The formula is computed by taking a team's winning percentage (25 percent), its strength of schedule (50 percent) and the strength of schedule of a team's opponents (25 percent).

The Tigers, however, suffered, as several opponents went down in their RPI rankings, which will, in turn, affect the Tigers. Here's a look at the breakdown of the Tigers' opponents in 2003 by ranking:

Great moments in LSU's SEC Tournament history

May 16-17, 2001—LSU opens the tournament by winning by the 10-run rule in two games, defeating Florida 10-0 and Ole Miss 13-2. The Tigers remain the only team to win two games in the same tournament by the mercy rule.

May 21, 2000—LSU freshman Wally Pontiff launches a grand slam as part of a seven-run first inning in the championship game against Florida. Pontiff wins tournament MVP honors as LSU claims a 9-6 victory as part of a 14-0 post-season run that ends with the Tigers' fifth national championship in 10 years.

May 14, 1998—Randy Keisler fires a four-hit shutout, and backed by a Brad Cresse grand slam, the Tigers eliminate South Carolina, 6-0.

May 16, 1997—Eddy Furniss ties the school record for doubles in a game with three in a 12-5 win over Tennessee.

May 16, 1996—Eddie Yarnall tosses a complete game four-hitter as the Tigers open the tournament with a 3-1 victory over Tennessee.

May 19, 1995—LSU sets a school record for hits in an SEC Tournament game with 20—including 19 singles—in a 14-6 win over Mississippi St.

May 22, 1994—LSU becomes the first team to win three consecutive SEC Tournament titles with a 6-5 win over Auburn in the West division tournament championship game at Oxford.

LSU Coach Smoke Laval

Smoke Laval had a very successful first year as LSU's coach, leading the Tigers to the NCAA Super Regional round for the fourth consecutive year and posting a 44-22 record. For his efforts, Laval was named the Louisiana Sportswriters' Association Louisiana coach of the year.

Laval was named Skip Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, and spent the 2001 season as the LSU administrative assistant. From 1994-2000, Laval coached for seven years at Louisiana-Monroe, guiding the Indians to three NCAA regional berths (1995, 1999, 2000) and a 241-159 mark. Among Laval's pupils at ULM was Ben Sheets, a 2000 member of the United States Olympic gold medal team and a 2001 major league all-star with the Milwaukee Brewers.

Laval was Bertman's top assistant at LSU from 1984-1993, helping the Tigers reach the College World series six times and win the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval was also a graduate assistant at LSU under Jack Lamabe in 1979 and an assistant at Florida in 1982 and 1983.

On deck for next week

The first order of business for the next round of the post-season takes place on Sunday, when the NCAA Division I Baseball Committee will announce the 16 sites that will host four-team regionals. On Monday, the 64-team field will be announced live on ESPN2 at 11: 30 a.m.

At the time of the bracket announcement, the eight "national seeds" will be announced, and it will be these eight teams that will enjoy the inside track to hosting an NCAA super regional series June 6-8 or June 7-9.

It is widely expected that LSU will host a regional for the 14th consecutive year, extending the longest current streak in the NCAA and leaving LSU just two years shy of the record of 16 straight years by Texas from 1979 through 1994.

The regionals get underway on Friday and run through Sunday, June 1 (or Monday, June 2, depending on the weather). More than likely, the regional will NOT feature four Louisiana teams as was mandated last year by the NCAA's overzealous travel restrictions. Regional balance is in, and the Tigers more than likely will see a team that they haven't played in a very long while, or maybe even a new opponent.

LSU has won seven consecutive regionals and 11 of 13 overall contested in Baton Rouge, with Cal St. Fullerton winning the other two in 1992 and 1995. Last year, LSU overcame a second game loss to UL-Lafayette to win its last three games, including a two-game sweep of the Ragin Cajuns on championship Sunday, to reach the super regional for the fourth time.
