

Bowl Championship Series

Starting in 1998, the Bowl Championship Series (BCS) determined the Division 1-A National Championship in football. In the BCS's first season, Tennessee defeated Florida State 23-16, in the Fiesta Bowl to claim the National title. The following year, Florida State topped Virginia Tech 46-29 in the Sugar Bowl for their second national title in seven years. Last year, Cinderella Oklahoma defeated Florida State 13-0 in the Orange Bowl to claim their first national title since 1986.

The BCS Series consist of the Rose Bowl, Orange Bowl, Sugar Bowl and Fiesta Bowl. Conferences with automatic berths include the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big Twelve, Pacific Ten, and Southeastern Conferences.

In January 2000, BCS members voted to extend the BCS agreement with ABC through the 2005 regular season and 2006 bowl season allowing for e of the four bowls to host two national championship games.

The BCS also notes the importance of regional consideration regarding team selection. Specifically, as a member of the BCS, the Rose Bowl w host the Big Ten and Pac-10 champion in those years when the Big Ten and Pac-10 champion is not ranked No. 1 or No. 2. Other regional consideration tie-ins

A year ago 1.25 million fans nded college football's 25 bowl games. This season there will be 26 post-season bowl games, from the 88th Annual Rose Bowl, to the first year New Orleans Bowl.
