One of the most talented linebackers to ever play at LSU ... Decided to put the NFL on hold and return to school for senior season ... Enters senior season rated as the nation's No. 2 inside linebacker by the Sporting News ... Preseason All-American by Playboy and will be a contender for the Butkus Award for the nation's top linebacker ... Moved to the Mike linebacker position during the spring after spending the last three years at the Will linebacker spot ... Has tremendous speed and strength ... Has a knack for coming up with big plays on defense ... One of the team leaders, both on and off the field for the Tigers ... Outstanding in the classroom as well ... Has posted 100 or more tackles for the last two years and enters senior season with 264 career tackles and 11 career sacks ... Named Most Outstanding Defensive Player in the 2000 Peach Bowl after registering six tackles and recovering two fumbles in the 28-14 win over Georgia Tech ... Played and started in the Peach Bowl despite joining the team a day prior to the game due to the death of his father.

JUNIOR SEASON (2001)

Teamed with Trev Faulk to give LSU one of the best 1-2 punches at linebacker around ... Second on the team with 113 tackles, including a team-high 78 solo ... Played in all 13 games with 12 starts ... Capped junior season with back-to-back outstanding games ... Had eight tackles, one tackle for loss and two quarterback hurries in win over Illinois in the Sugar Bowl ... Played a dominating game vs. Tennessee in the SEC Championship contest as he recorded 10 tackles and was instrumental in holding the Vols to just 50 yards rushing ... During the regular season, had three sacks for minus-4 yards ... Recorded seven tackles, including two for losses vs. Auburn ... Had 11 tackles, including one sack and two tackles for loss vs. Arkansas ... Had a 14-tackle performance vs. Alabama, 13 of which were solo stops ... Forced one fumble and had nine QB pressures in 2001 ... Had season-best 16 tackles vs. Tennessee ... Had 12 tackles vs. Utah State and 10 vs. Florida ... Nominee for the Butkus Award at the beginning of the season.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2000)

Played in all 12 games with 11 starts ... Finished second on the squad and third in the SEC with 110 total tackles (56 solo) ... Led LSU with



five sacks, which totaled minus-25 yards ... Recorded double-figure tackles five times during the regular-season - career-high 17 vs. Tennessee and Kentucky, 11 vs. Auburn, 10 vs. UAB and Houston ... Played perhaps the best game of collegiate career vs. Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl as he registered six tackles, two for loss, one sack and recovered a pair of fumbles in the 28-14 Tiger victory ... Named Most Outstanding Defensive Player of the Peach Bowl for his efforts ... Had a pair of sacks in 34-0 win over Kentucky ... Started first game of career vs. Western Carolina in season-opener ... Only game in which he didn't start came against Houston when Tigers opened the contest in a dime package ... He entered the game on the second play from scrimmage.

FRESHMAN SEASON (1999)

A major contributor on the Tigers' defense ... Played all but one game for the Tigers ... Was the third linebacker in a two-man rotation ... A key player on special teams ... Finished with 41 tackles, including seven for losses of minus-36 yards, three sacks for minus-28 yards, three quarterback hurries, two pass breakups, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery and one interception ... One of two Tiger defenders to register a stat in seven different defensive categories ... Had a season-high nine tackles against Auburn, including one for a loss of one yard ... Best all-around performance was at Georgia where he made six stops, including a sack for minus-15 yards on elusive Quincy Carter, one pass breakup and a fumble recovery ... Was named Coaches' SEC All-Freshman Team and the Knoxville News-Sentinel SEC All-Freshman Team.

Talented runner who combines quickness with a bullish running style ... Enters junior season as one of the nation's best all-around running backs ... Earned First-Team All-SEC honors last year after rushing for 992 yards and 19 TDs ... Listed as the nation's sixth-best running back heading into 2002 by the Sporting News ... Runs with equal effectiveness on the inside or outside ... Has breakaway speed and is virtually unstoppable inside the 10-yard line ... Scored 14 of his SEC record-tying 19 touchdowns on runs of 10 yards or less ... Difficult to tackle, does not come down on the first hit ... Has good hands out of the backfield ... Outstanding blocker ... Tore ACL in left knee in the second quarter of the SEC Championship game against Tennessee and missed the Sugar Bowl ... Sat out spring practice after undergoing reconstructive surgery in December ... Cleared by the doctors in early summer and will be ready for fall camp ... Given clean bill of health by LSU doctors just six months after surgery ... Enters junior season ranked eighth in LSU history with 24 career rushing TDs ... Played for first time since junior year of high school (1997) in 2000 ... Missed his senior season of high school with a knee injury (1998) and redshirted his true freshman season of 1999.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2001)

LSU's starting tailback for 12 games ... Missed the Sugar Bowl after tearing ACL in left knee in second quarter vs. Tennessee in SEC Championship game ...A First-Team All-SEC pick at running back by both the AP and the Coaches ...Rushed for 992 yards and an SEC-record tying 19 TDs ...Led the SEC in touchdowns and total points (114) and ranked second in the league in rushing yards (992) and yards per game (82.7) ...Had four 100-yard games for the Tigers in 2001, all LSU victories ...LSU was 8-0 in games in which Toefield played from start to finish in 2001 ...Named SEC Player of the Week on Nov. 26 after rushing for 173 yards and three TDs in 41-38 win over Arkansas ... Scored on a 62-yard run on fourth play from scrimmage vs.Arkansas ... Followed that with 120 yards and one TD vs.Auburn ... Had a 48-yard run vs.Auburn ... Broke LSU single-season rushing TD record with three scores vs.Arkansas as he surpassed the previous mark of 17 held by Charles Alexander ... Rushed for 83 yards and two TDs vs. Middle Tennessee ... Had 73 yards and three TDs in win over Alabama ... Rushed for a career-best 183 yards and four TDs, including a 70-yard scoring run, in win over Utah State ... Opened season with three TDs and 58 yards vs. Tulane ...Rushed for 128 yards and one TD in win over Kentucky ... First player in LSU history to rush for seven TDs in first two games of year ... Fastest player in LSU history to nine

TDs (took only five games) and tied Charles Alexander (1977) for fastest to 10 TDs (six games) ... Missed second half vs. Ole Miss with ankle injury.

REDSHIRT FRESHMAN SEASON (2000)

Led all freshman running backs in the SEC with 682 yards rushing on 165 carries and five touchdowns despite missing the last two regular-season games of the year ... Went down early in the first quarter against Ole Miss with a sprained knee ... Sat out the Arkansas game ... Returned at full strength against Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl and rushed for 78 yards on 22 carries ... The 682 yards rushing ranks third among freshmen in LSU history and also ranks in the top 20 in SEC history for freshmen ... Had a pair of 100-yard rushing games, both of which came against two of the toughest teams in the nation against the run - Tennessee and Mississippi State ... Rushed for 120 yards and one touchdown vs. Tennessee ... Scored on a 74-yard run against the Vols on a play that was named ESPN's Play of the Week for Sept. 30 ... Had 119 yards rushing and two TDs against Mississippi State ... His second TD against the Bulldogs was a 13-yard run in overtime that was the game-winner ... Had 85 yards rushing on 21 carries vs. Alabama and rushed for 80 yards on 23 attempts against Houston ... Has good hands out of the backfield and caught seven passes for 44 yards.

Domanick Davis is one of the most versatile players in the SEC ... Last year, Davis played on both sides of the ball and returned both punts and kickoffs for the Tigers ... This year, Davis will remain only on the offensive side of the ball, while continuing to serve as LSU's return specialist ... Davis enters his final season with a chance at becoming LSU's all-time leader in both kickoff return yards and punt return yards ... Davis ranks eighth in school history in career all-purpose yards with 3,623 ... Davis is just 173 yards from breaking Robert Dow's school record of 1,780 career kickoff return yards.

JUNIOR SEASON (2001)

Player who did it all for the Tigers ... Started on both sides of the ball as well as returned punts and kickoffs for LSU ... Started at tailback against Illinois in the Sugar Bowl and responded with 122 yards rushing and a Sugar Bowl-record four rushing touchdowns in the 47-34 LSU win ... Also returned three punts for 36 yards and four kickoffs for 103 yards in the Sugar Bowl ... Scored on runs of 25 yards, 16 and four (twice) in the Sugar Bowl ... Filled in for the injured Toefield in the SEC Championship game and rushed for 78 yards and LSU's final touchdown, a 1-yard plunge on fourth-and-one with less than three minutes to play in the contest ... Finished with 149 all-purpose yards vs. Tennessee (78 rush, 29 PR, 42 KR) ... In regular-season, rushed for 406 yards and five TDs for the Tigers ... Led the SEC in punt return average with 13.8 per return ... Returned 19 punts for 263 yards ... Had 22 kickoff returns for 418 yards ... Rushed for 49 yards and one TD vs. Auburn ... Missed most of Alabama game with an ankle injury ... Returned vs. Middle Tennessee to rush for 49 yards ... Also caught a 25-yard TD pass vs. Middle Tennessee ... Started for first time on offense vs. Ole Miss and responded with 99 yards on 21 carries ... Finished with 266 all-purpose yards (99 rush, 15 receiving, 89 PR, 63 KR) vs. Ole Miss - the fifth-best total in school history ... Returned a punt 71 yards for a TD vs. Ole Miss, the first return for a TD in career ... Had six tackles and one QB pressure on defense ... Started as LSU's sixth defensive back in win over Kentucky ... Rushed for 46 yards and one TD in win over Miss. State ... Missed Utah State game with a knee injury ... Missed most of last quarter of Ole Miss game with an ankle injury ... Ranks second in school history in career kickoff return yardage with 1,608 yards and is fifth in career punt returns with 627 yards.

SOPHOMORE SEASON (2000)

Proved to be one of the most dangerous return specialists in the SEC ... Ranked third in the SEC and 25th nationally in kickoff returns with a 23.8 average and was third in punt returns in the league and 34th nationally with an 11.0 average ... Averaged 130.5 all-purpose yards a



contest, a number that ranked fifth in the SEC and 35th in the nation ... Totaled 572 yards on 24 kickoff returns and had 298 yards on 27 punt returns ... Ranked as LSU's second-leading rusher with 445 yards and five touchdowns on 123 carries ... Had a 48-yard kickoff return vs. Houston and a 46-yarder vs. Alabama ... Season-long punt return was 30-yarder against Florida ... Rushed for 79 yards and two TDs in overtime win over 13th-ranked Mississippi State ... Answered the call against Ole Miss when starter LaBrandon Toefield went down with a knee injury in first quarter vs. the Rebels ... Filled in for Toefield and rushed for a season-best 106 yards and two touchdowns on a career-high 25 carries in the 20-9 win over Ole Miss ... Had 226 all-purpose yards against UAB and 193 against Florida.

FRESHMAN SEASON (1999)

A Second-Team Freshman All-American as a return specialist in 1999 ... The Tigers' second-leading rusher in 1999, playing behind senior Rondell Mealey ... He played in all 11 games and was the featured return specialist for the Tigers ... Set LSU records for most kickoff returns in a season with 25 and most kickoff return yards in a season with 618, breaking records set by Robert Dow in 1975 ... Had 64 carries for 274 yards and three touchdowns and caught 13 passes for 94 yards for the year ... Averaged 5.5 yards per punt return and 24.7 yards per kickoff return, including a long return for 56 yards ... Was fourth in the SEC in kickoff return average per game ... Ranked second on the team in all-purpose yardage with 1,052 yards (95.6 yds/per game) ... Ran for 109 yards on 17 attempts against North Texas, including a touchdown ... Made the Knoxville News-Sentinel SEC All-Freshman Team and the Sporting News Freshman All-America Team.
