### Tigers Play Host to Alabama This Weekend in Alex Box Stadium

Sixth-ranked LSU (32-11, 10-8) returns to SEC action this weekend as the Tigers play host to Alabama (25-18, 6-12) in a three-game SEC series at Alex Box Stadium.

First pitch for Game 1 of the LSU-Alabama series is 6:30 p.m. CDT Friday, Game 2 is set for 2 p.m. CDT Saturday and Game 3 will be played at 1 p.m. CDT Sunday.

The games can be heard statewide on the LSU Sports Network (WDGL-FM 98.1 in Baton Rouge). All three games can also be heard on the internet at [www.LSUsports.net](http://www.LSUsports.net).

Friday's game will be televised on a tape-delayed basis at 9 p.m. by Cox Sports Television (Cable Ch. 37 in Baton Rouge). There is no television coverage of the games on Saturday and Sunday.

The LSU-Alabama series matches the SEC's top hitting club -- LSU (.334 team batting average) -- versus the league's No. 1 pitching staff -- Alabama (2.94 ERA).

LSU trails first-place Arkansas (13-5) by three games in the SEC Western Division standings with 12 games remaining in the conference regular season. Arkansas plays host to Tennessee (10-8 in the SEC East) this weekend in Fayetteville.

Alabama is in sixth place in the SEC Western Division; however, the Crimson Tide is still in contention for a berth in the SEC Tournament.

LSU began this week Tuesday with a 9-5 victory over No. 13 Tulane in the Louisiana Superdome. The game was played before a paid crowd of 21,343, the fourth-largest regular-season attendance figure in NCAA baseball history.

### The LSU-Alabama Series

Alabama leads the all-time series with LSU, 182-135-3, as the teams first met in 1906. The Tigers and the Crimson Tide split four games last season, as LSU won two of three regular-season games in Tuscaloosa, and Alabama posted a 10-3 victory in the championship game of the SEC Tournament in Hoover, Ala.

LSU has won 10 of the last 12 meetings with the Crimson Tide, and the Tigers have won four straight SEC series over Alabama, including sweeps in 2001 and 2002. The Crimson Tide last won a series over LSU in the 1999 NCAA Super Regional at Tuscaloosa. Alabama hasn't won a series in Alex Box Stadium since 1996, when UA took two of three games from the Tigers.

Smoke Laval has a 7-6 career mark against Alabama during his 10-year collegiate coaching career, while Jim Wells, a former LSU graduate assistant coach (1987-89), has a 19-26 career record against the Tigers during his 15 seasons as a collegiate head coach. Wells served as head coach at Northwestern (La.) State (1990-94) prior to beginning his Alabama tenure in 1995.

## Tigers Begin Week with 9-5 Win Over No. 13 Tulane in the Superdome

LSU began this week Tuesday with a 9-5 victory over No. 13 Tulane in the Louisiana Superdome. The game was played before a paid crowd of 21,343, the fourth-largest regular-season attendance figure in NCAA baseball history.

*The Tigers are now 10-5 this season when facing a ranked team. LSU has won two of three games against five teams currently appearing in at least one of the Top 25 polls -- Central Florida, South Carolina, Auburn, Tennessee and Tulane.*

LSU center fielder J.C. Holt extended his hitting streak to 13 games Tuesday with a three-run homer that highlighted a five-run fourth inning. Holt, LSU's top hitter with a .414 average, leads the SEC in hits (75) and runs scored (57).

Left fielder Ryan Patterson extended his hitting streak to 15 games Tuesday as he doubled and scored three runs. During the streak, Patterson is batting .414 (29-for-70) with five doubles, two triples, five homers, 21 RBI and 20 runs.

Junior left-hander Lane Mestepey turned in his longest outing of the season to earn the win over Tulane, scattering 11 hits over 7.1 innings. Right-hander Jordan Faircloth earned his third save of the year, worked 1.2 shutout innings with three strikeouts. Faircloth, who inherited a one-out, bases-loaded jam in the eighth, recorded a strikeout and a groundout to end the threat.

## Zeringue, Bumstead, Holt Excel in Series Win at Tennessee

• LSU defeated No. 10 Tennessee in two of three games last weekend in Knoxville. The Tigers have won five of their six SEC series, and three of the series victories (at South Carolina, Auburn and Tennessee) have come on the road against a ranked team.

• Right fielder Jon Zeringue helped lead the Tigers to the series win at UT, as he hit .583 (7-for-12) with one double, one homer, five RBI, two runs and a .533 on-base percentage.

• Senior right-hander Nate Bumstead rebounded on Sunday at UT after a tough outing the week before versus Georgia, when he worked just 1.1 innings. He pitched seven innings against Tennessee, limiting the Vols to one run on five hits with no walks and one strikeout as the Tigers recorded an 11-1 victory.

• Game 3 of the UT series featured an eight-run second inning by LSU, which sent 12 men to the plate in the frame. The Tigers collected eight hits in the inning, including a bases-loaded double by center fielder J.C. Holt, who extended his hitting streak to 12 games. Holt has since increased the streak to 13 games entering this weekend's Alabama series.

## J.C. Holt Named to Golden Spikes Award Watch List

Junior center fielder J.C. Holt, a native of Sieper, La., is one of 30 players on the USA Baseball Watch List for the 2004 Golden Spikes Award. The award is presented annually to the nation's outstanding amateur baseball player.

Holt, the 2003 MVP of the Cape Cod League, is LSU's leading hitter this season, batting .414 (75-for-181) with 15 doubles, three triples, five homers, 34 RBI, 57 runs and 13 stolen bases. Holt leads the SEC in hits and runs scored, and he is No. 2 in the league in batting average.

LSU has had one Golden Spikes Award winner in his history -- right-handed pitcher Ben McDonald captured the award in 1989, the year he was the nation's No. 1 overall draft pick by the Baltimore Orioles.

## Clay Harris Named SEC Player of the Week April 5

LSU first baseman Clay Harris, who led LSU to a series victory at Auburn April 2-4, was named SEC Player of the Week by the league office on April 5.

Harris enjoyed a superb week, batting .467 (7-for-15) in four games with three homers, one double, eight RBI, six runs, a 1.133 slugging percentage and a .500 on-base percentage. Harris hit .455 (5-for-11) in the Auburn series with two homers, one double, seven RBI, three runs, a 1.091 slugging percentage and a .462 on-base percentage.

Harris, who led LSU in home runs last season with 16, entered the week with just one this season; however, he homered in three straight games to raise his total to four.

His solo shot at UNO on March 30 broke a 23-game drought without a homer. Harris hit a two-out, two-run blast in the top of the ninth inning April 2 at Auburn to send the game to extra innings, and his eighth-inning solo homer April 3 at Auburn tied the contest at 3-3 as LSU went on to a 5-3 win.

Harris broke a scoreless tie on April 4 at Auburn with a seventh-inning RBI single, sparking the Tigers to a 3-2 victory.

## Matt Liuzza Named to Johnny Bench Award Watch List

LSU catcher **Matt Liuzza**, a sophomore from Metairie, La., was named March 22 as the SEC Player of the Week after leading the Tigers to a series victory at South Carolina.

Liuzza hit three homers and one double in the series, collecting five RBI and posting a .933 slugging percentage. He hit two homers in Game 3 (a 12-7 victory), becoming the first LSU player to have a multi-homer game this season.

Liuzza's two homers came against USC ace Matt Campbell, who had not allowed run in 27.2 innings entering the game. Liuzza hit a solo shot in the second inning to tie the game at 1-1, and his three-run blast in the fourth gave the Tigers a 4-1 lead they would never relinquish.

Liuzza was 6-for-15 (.353) at the plate in LSU's four games from March 16-21 -- including a 14-0 victory over UNO -- with one double, four homers, seven RBI and five runs.

Liuzza compiled a 14-game streak -- the longest of his career -- from Feb. 14-March 12, exceeding the 12-game streak he compiled during the 2003 season. During the 2004 streak, Liuzza batted .407 (22-for-54) with five doubles, two homers, 13 RBI and 10 runs.

**Liuzza's name appears on the first Johnny Bench Award "Watch List" released in early March. The Johnny Bench Award is given annually to the nation's outstanding collegiate catcher. Former LSU Brad Cresse was the first recipient of the award in 2000.**

**The 2004 Johnny Bench Award ceremony will take place on June 30, in Wichita, Kan.**

## Dirks Named To Roger Clemens Award Watch List

Freshman left-hander **Clay Dirks'** name has been added to the "Watch List" for the 2004 Roger Clemens Award, which is given to the nation's outstanding collegiate pitcher. The "Cy Young Award" of college baseball, the Clemens Award ceremony will take place on July 15 in Houston.

In a four-hit shutout of Tulane on March 2, Dirks allowed just two Green Wave runners to reach second base, and he retired 20 of the final 22 batters he faced. For that effort, Dirks was named the SEC Pitcher of the Week by the league office, and he earned National Pitcher of the Week recognition from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Dirks, a redshirt freshman from Hernando, Miss., allowed just one double and three singles against Tulane, and recorded one walk and seven strikeouts. Dirks, who was making just the third start of his collegiate career, missed the 2003 season after undergoing surgery on his elbow in the summer of 2002.

## The LSU Injury Report

**INF Bryan Harris** -- Harris, a transfer from Santa Ana (Calif.) College, was projected to be the Tigers' starter at third base; however, a hernia operation limited his participation during fall practice, and he underwent arthroscopic surgery in January to remove bone chips from his right knee. He is scheduled to receive a medical redshirt this season.

**INF Matt Horwath** -- Horwath, a medical redshirt in 2003 after undergoing right shoulder surgery, started LSU's first seven games at shortstop this season before experiencing soreness in the shoulder. An MRI was performed on the shoulder on March 2, and the results showed no new injuries. Horwath has been cleared to play as long as he does not experience continued soreness in the shoulder.

**RHP Brandon Nall** -- LSU's closer at the beginning of 2003, he pitched in just six games last season before suffering a torn labrum in his shoulder, which required surgery. He could return to the mound at some point this season, depending upon the progress of his rehabilitation.

**OF Quinn Stewart** -- A starter in 37 games last season, Stewart had the hamate bone in his left wrist removed in early March, and he will receive a redshirt this season. Even without the wrist injury, Stewart likely would have received a redshirt this year due to the tremendous depth LSU has in the outfield. With current starting outfielders Jon Zeringue, J.C. Holt and Ryan Patterson expected to be drafted this June, Stewart should be one of the outfield starters in 2005.

# Smoke Laval

HEAD COACH • THIRD YEAR

Raymond "Smoke" Laval enhanced his reputation as one of the country's top college baseball coaches, as, in just his second season at the helm of the LSU program, he guided the 2003 Tigers to the Southeastern Conference title -- LSU's first since 1997 -- and a berth in the College World Series.

Laval, the 2003 SEC Coach of the Year, directed LSU to a 45-22-1 overall record and a 20-9-1 conference mark, as the Tigers finished No. 5 in the final Baseball America rankings.

The magnificent '03 campaign augmented the success Laval enjoyed in his inaugural season as LSU's coach, as he led the 2002 Tigers to a 44-22 overall mark, an appearance in the NCAA Super Regional and a No. 11 final national ranking.

Laval, who served seven seasons (1994-2000) as the head coach at the University of Louisiana-Monroe, assumed control of the LSU program from Bertman, who led the Tigers to five NCAA championships and 11 College World Series appearances during an 18-year (1984-2001) tenure. Laval worked as Bertman's top assistant coach for 10 seasons (1984-93), helping lead LSU to its first two NCAA titles in 1991 and 1993. During Laval's 10 years as assistant coach, LSU posted a 483-182-1 record, won five SEC titles, appeared in six College World Series and captured two national championships.

Laval was known at LSU as one of the nation's best recruiters and brightest assistant coaches, as the Tigers reached the College World Series in only the third season (1986) of the Bertman-Laval regime. LSU followed the '86 CWS appearance with Omaha berths in 1987, 1989 and 1990 before the Tigers claimed the school's first baseball national title in 1991. After LSU captured its second NCAA crown in 1993, Laval departed Baton Rouge to become the head coach at Northeast Louisiana (now Louisiana-Monroe).

During his assistant coaching tenure at LSU, Laval -- who worked as the Tigers' primary recruiter - tutored 24 players who would eventually reach the major leagues. Some of the major leaguers with whom Laval worked include all-stars Albert Belle and Paul Byrd and first-round pick Todd Walker.

Laval compiled a 241-159 (.603) mark as the head coach at ULM, guiding the Indians to NCAA Regional appearances in 1995, 1999 and 2000.

Laval began his coaching career in 1977 as an assistant at Jacksonville University before moving to Wolfson High School in Jacksonville as a baseball and football coach. He served as a graduate assistant at LSU in 1979 under former Tiger head coach Jack Lamabe before working two years as an assistant at Gulf Coast Community College in Panama City, Fla.

Laval served as an assistant coach at Florida for two seasons (1982-83) before returning to LSU to work under Bertman.

Laval holds a bachelor's degree (1977) from Jacksonville in physical education and a master's degree (1979) from LSU in administration. The McDonald, Pa., native played two seasons at Gulf Coast Community College, where he lettered as a catcher. He completed his playing career at Jacksonville, where he led the ninth-ranked Dolphins in hitting at the 1976 NCAA South Regional.

Laval and his wife, Pam, are the parents of two children, Brandon and Jamie.

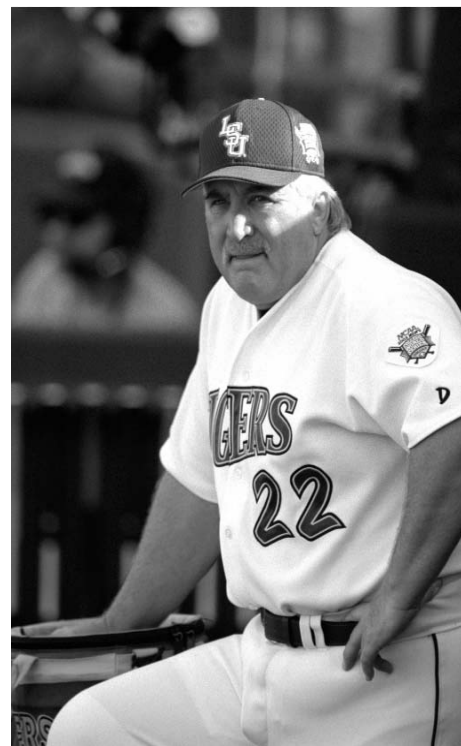
