Tigers tangle with Tide: LSU closes the regular season this week-end by hosting SEC leader Alabama at Alex Box Stadium.

- The Tigers will be at home for the first time since sweeping Arkansas in late April.
- LSU has won nine consecutive home games dating back to a 15-4 loss to Mississippi St. on March 29. LSU is 21-7 at home this year.
- The Tigers completed a 5-2 road trip with their 2-1 series victory at Florida last weekend. LSU also beat New Orleans and took two of three from Tennessee on the trip.
- The Tigers are 18-5 since April 1 and is batting .333 while posting a 2.97 ERA during that stretch.
- LSU is back in the top 15 in two of the three major polls after not being ranked at all just three weeks ago.

Scouting the Tide: Alabama has recovered from last year's disappointing season by winning the SEC West and holding a 1 1/2 game edge over South Carolina in the overall race.

- Alabama comes in ranked second in Collegiate Baseball, making them the first top five team to come to Baton Rouge since South Carolina was ranked second in 2000.
- Alabama finished the season 32-2 at home, losing only twice to Ole Miss in mid-April.
- The Tide failed to reach the SEC Tournament last year after going 15-15 in the league and 32-23 overall.
- Alabama has been to the College World Series three times (1996, 1997 and 1999) under Jim Wells, a former assistant to Skip Bertman from 1987-89.
- Wells' original assistant coaches at the Capstone, Mitch Gaspard (Northwestern St.) and Todd Butler (McNeese St.) are now both head coaches at Louisiana schools.
- The Tide has several honors candidates, led on the mound by Lafayette native Lance Cormier, a four-year starter who is 9-2 with a 3.12 ERA.
- Sophomore right fielder Peter Stonard leads the Tide with a .416 batting average and enters on a 12-game hitting streak.

About the Series: LSU has won five consecutive meetings from 'Bama, but the Tide still holds a 180-130-1 all-time lead.

- LSU swept last year's series in Tuscaloosa, winning 4-2, 8-7 and 8-3 for the first sweep by either team since 1988, when LSU pulled off the same feat on the road.
- The Tigers' streak dates back to the 2000 SEC Tournament, when LSU eliminated the Tide with 18-12 and 6-5 triumphs.
- Alabama's last win in the series was a 14-0 whitewash to close the 2000 regular season.
- The Tide has a 2-1 lead in NCAA Tournament meetings, sweeping LSU in the 1999 Super Regional in Tuscaloosa. But the Tigers beat the Tide 13-6 in the 1997 national championship game.
- Since Jim Wells came to the Capstone in 1995, the Tide and Tigers have split 30 meetings, although the Tide won eight of the first 10 and LSU has won eight of the last 12.
- The Tide's 28-2 win in 1997 at Tuscaloosa remains the worst loss in LSU's 109-year baseball history.

Tonight's Starting Pitcher

#46 Soph. LH Lane Mestepey (6-0, 187, Zachary–Central Private)

Lane Mestepey struggled a bit at Florida last Friday, giving up eight hits in seven innings and taking his first no-decision in two months. Tonight, he squares off with Alabama senior right-hander Lance Cormier (9-2, 3.12) in a re-match of a classic duel from last year in Tuscaloosa that Mestepey won, 4-2, with a complete game four-hitter.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: Is 9-3 with a 2.99 ERA on the season; 20-6 for his career.

- Did not allow a walk over a span of 33.0 innings from Feb. 23 to Mar. 23.
- Was 4-0 with a 1.89 ERA in four starts in April, and has not lost since Mar. 16.
- Giving up a miniscule 1.33 walks per nine innings (13 in 93.1 IP).
- Has thrown nine career complete games.
- Won his 20th game in spectacular fashion vs. Arkansas (4/26), throwing a complete game four-hit shutout for his first career shutout in 35 outings. Mestepey threw 80 of his 115 pitches for strikes and did not walk a batter and allowed just one batter to reach third base.
- Took no-decision at Florida (5/10), giving up eight hits in three runs over 7.0+ innings.
- Despite losing to Tennessee (5/4, Game 1), Mestepey allowed just one hit through the first 7.2 innings and four hits for the game.
- Gave up a career high 12 hits in 8.2 innings at South Carolina (4/19), but still earned the win.
- Pitched third complete game of the season and the seventh of his career to defeat Georgia (4/12). Gave up just two runs and struck out five.
- Earned third straight victory with 6.2 innings at Auburn (4/5), allowing just two earned runs and striking out four.
- Walked none in 6.1 innings to improve to 5-2 with win over Mississippi St. (3/30).
- Picked up second complete game victory at Ole Miss (3/23) despite walking a career-high five batters.
- Gave up five runs (four earned) on nine hits in last outing vs. Vanderbilt (3/16).
- Earned second consecutive LSWA Pitcher of the Week honor for effort vs. UL-Monroe (3/9), giving up one run in eight innings.
- Earned complete-game victory at Houston (2/23), giving up just one run on six hits in the final 7.0 innings.
- Followed up Houston game with brilliant 8.0 inning stint vs. Long Beach St. (3/2, Game 2), striking out a career-best eight to improve to 2-0 to earn LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors.
- Struck out six in 7.0-plus innings against Birmingham-Southern (2/9). Carried a shutout into the eighth inning.

2001: Led the SEC in victories (11) and ERA (3.75), going 11-3 in 22 games (19 starts), pitching 139.1 innings.

- Named the national Freshman of the Year by Collegiate Baseball and was a third team All-American by the same publication.
- Named the 2001 SEC Freshman of the Year and was a first team All-SEC selection.
- Allowed two or fewer earned runs in 11 of 19 starts.
- Yielded only 2.39 walks per nine innings.
- Went 7.1 or more innings in his first eight SEC starts.
- Named SEC Pitcher of the Week on Apr. 16 for sterling Easter Sunday effort vs. Ole Miss. In complete-game victory, Mestepey walked none and scattered nine hits. Was 2-0 with a 1.20 ERA in two outings in 2001 against the Rebels.
- Four days before the Ole Miss victory, he allowed only one earned run over 7.2 innings against Tulane at Zephyr Field.
- Got victory in first career start vs. Kansas St. on Feb. 11, giving up six hits in 6.0 innings.
- Had superb effort in no-decision at Georgia on Mar. 10, giving up one earned run and striking out six in 7.2 innings.
- Fell just short of shutout on Mar. 24 at Mississippi St., allowing one run and no walks while fanning six over 8.1 innings.
- First complete-game came vs. Kentucky on Mar. 30, giving up one earned run and striking out five.
- Did not lose until Apr. 20 vs. Vanderbilt, and even in that loss, he threw a complete game.
- Turned in spectacular complete-game effort at Alabama on Apr. 27, giving up one earned run and fanning six to start LSU on its way to a three-game sweep in Tuscaloosa. He retired 18 of 19 batters faced in the fourth through eighth innings.
- Allowed no earned runs over 6.0 innings of victory vs. Ole Miss at SEC Tournament May 17.
- Made last effort of the year his best, going 10.0 innings and striking out six in Super Regional at Tulane, a game LSU won in 13 innings.

Tigers can't win title, but can stop Tide

LSU was eliminated from SEC title contention when Alabama swept Mississippi St. last weekend in Tuscaloosa, but the Tigers can prevent the Crimson Tide from celebrating a championship on the hallowed turf of Alex Box Stadium. Alabama leads South Carolina by a game and a half as the Gamecocks visit Georgia to close the season.

Only one team has defeated LSU to win a title at The Box, and that was Florida in the rain-plagued 1991 SEC Tournament. However, the 8-4 setback in the championship game would be LSU's last loss that season, as the Tigers swept the South Regional and the College World Series, defeating Florida twice in Omaha along the way.

Cal St. Fullerton won two regional championships in Baton Rouge, but beat Ohio State in 1992 and Rice in 1995. LSU was eliminated by the Titans in 1992 and by the Owls in 1995 in the game prior to the championship round.

LSU has won three SEC titles, two SEC tournament titles, a super regional and 11 regional crowns on its home turf since 1986.

Best against the West

The SEC West has often been labeled the toughest division in college baseball, but with one win over Alabama this weekend, the Tigers will clinch their seventh straight winning season against the West, making LSU the only school to pull off the feat. Since 1996, LSU is 61-39 in the regular season against the West.

The only time LSU has had a losing record against the West was in 1995, when the Tigers were 9-11 against division, going 6-9 in the regular season and 3-2 in the SEC West tournament, which counted in the standings from 1993-95.

After finishing 9-6 vs. the SEC East, LSU will become the only school to have a winning record against both divisions in each of the past seven years by beating Alabama once this weekend.

Sweet 16

LSU's win Sunday at Florida gave the Tigers their 18th consecutive winning season in SEC play, by far the longest in the conference, as no other league team has more than three straight winning years. The Tigers have now won 16 or more games in conference play in every year since 1989 after doing so only twice (1975, 1986) from 1893 through 1988.



Laval most successful first-year coach
With Sunday's win at Florida, Smoke Laval led the Tigers to their 35th win of 2002, making Smoke the most successful first-year coach in the history of LSU baseball. The previous record for wins by a first-year coach was the 34-20 mark in 1979 posted by Jack Lamabe, but that marked the only year in Lamabe's five-year tenure that LSU reached the SEC Tournament.

Laval's mentor, Skip Bertman, was 32-23 in his initial season of 1984, missing the SEC Tournament for the only time in his 18-year tenure.

Barker a third-degree thief

Not only does he lead the Tigers in batting average (.392) and RBI (52), but LSU right fielder Sean Barker also paces the Tigers in stolen bases with a 20-for-24 ledger, impressive enough for a "power" hitter who stands 6-foot-3, 225 pounds.

Even more impressive is the fact that Barker is a perfect 5-for-5 when attempting to steal third base, a much tougher feat given the catcher's throw needs to go just 90 feet, not the 127 feet, 3 3/8 inches that a throw to second must travel.

Barker isn't the only Tiger who has had success swiping third, as the Tigers are 11-for-12 this year when trying to steal third, with the only miss was when Wally Pontiff was cut down on March 24 at Ole Miss. Matt Heath is 3-for-3 at third base, while J.C. Holt, Rocky Scelfo and Aaron Hill all have one steal of third each.

The Tigers are 60-for-77 in stolen base attempts this year, but only 10 different LSU players have swiped a base, with Barker the only player in double figures.

Heath has mixed homecoming

Matt Heath was looking to make an impression last weekend upon his return to Florida, where he played in 1999 and 2000. But in an 0-for-4, 4 strikeout game on Saturday, the Gator fans were the ones enjoying themselves.

Heath would have the last laugh, though. The senior outfielder was not in the starting lineup for just the second time this season, but when called upon to pinch hit in the eighth inning, he came through in a big way with his second three-run home run in seven days that gave the Tigers a 7-1 lead en route to an 8-5 victory.

Heath has struck out six times in his last 18 at-bats, but he is also 8-for-18 (.444) with a pair of home runs, 7 RBI and six runs scored in the Tigers' last five games.

Holt's streak at lucky 13

J.C. Holt continues to be one of the Tigers' hottest hitters, as he enters the Alabama series with a 13-game hitting streak, batting .469 (23-for-49) with 12 RBI during the streak, which actually dates back to April 6 at Auburn because he has not played in every game during that time.

Holt is batting .350 on the season, but more importantly, his .403 on-base percentage has steadily climbed throughout the year, allowing him to set the table for the Tigers' RBI producers (Aaron Hill, Wally Pontiff and Sean Barker) behind him. Since April 1, Holt is hitting .429 with 12 RBI, a .696 slugging percentage and a .467 on-base percentage.

Holt continues to come through in the clutch, batting .359 (14-for-39) with 18 RBI with runners in scoring position, and holding a gaudy .389 mark with RISP and two out.

Holt's streak is the second longest on the team this year, surpassed only by Pontiff's 19-game streak in February and March.

Phillips keeps hitting

With a hit in Friday's game against Alabama, Chris Phillips will join J.C. Holt with a double-figure hitting streak, as the LSU catcher enters the weekend on a nine-game hitting streak, as Phillips is hitting .441 (15-for-34) with 11 RBI during the streak.

Since April 1, Phillips continues to be one of the steadiest Tigers at the plate, batting .369 (31-for-84) with 26 RBI, just one fewer than Sean Barker's team-leading 27 during the 18-5 stretch. Phillips, who was batting just .263 on March 29, has raised his average an incredible 77 points in the last 24 games to .340, by far the biggest jump on the team in that stretch.

The Shreveport native, who will be honored on Senior Day this Sunday, also continues to be a top hitter in the clutch, batting .371 with runners in scoring position and .364 in all situations with runners on base.

Four on the floor

If the Tigers can win two games this weekend, they will win their final four SEC series for just the third time since 1976. LSU last did this in 1999 by taking series from Mississippi St., Auburn, Georgia and Kentucky. LSU took all nine SEC series in 1986, the Tigers' first College World Series season.



Tigers get quarter in ERA "super dozen"
Although two LSU pitchers saw their ERAs take significant jumps in Florida, the Tigers enter the weekend as the only SEC club to have four pitchers in the top 12 among the league leaders in ERA.

Leading the way is sophomore lefty Lane Mestepey, whose 2.99 ERA leads the Tigers and is fourth in the SEC only behind South Carolina's Blake Taylor (1.47) and a pair of Alabama hurlers in Taylor Tankersley (2.72) and Shane Sanders (2.88).

Jake Tompkins fell from his number two perch behind Taylor last weekend, but his 3.06 mark still leaves him seventh in the league, just ahead of Alabama's Lance Cormier at 3.12. Cormier and Mestepey hook up Friday in the series opener, while Sanders will take on Bo Pettit on Sunday.

Speaking of Pettit, the junior right-hander's sparkling eight-inning, one-run performance in Gainesville vaulted him to 12th with a 3.60 ERA, just behind Brian Wilson's 3.56 mark that ranks him 11th.

With seven of the top 12 pitchers at The Box this weekend, it's no surprise Alabama (3.37) and LSU (3.65) are 1-2 in the SEC in ERA heading into the weekend.

Tompkins making it interesting

He hasn't cost LSU a game so far this year, but certainly Tiger relief ace Jake Tompkins has caused more than a few hearts to into the throats of Tiger fans with his on-the-edge performances, especially last weekend at Florida.

Tompkins came into Friday's game in the eighth inning for Lane Mestepey with no outs and two runners on second and third. Tompkins struck out the first batter he faced, issued an intentional walk, then got a force out and a strikeout to end that inning.

The bases would be loaded in the ninth inning, but after a sacrifice fly tied the game, he induced a double play that sent the game to extra innings, getting another double play in the 10th to preserve the LSU win.

Tompkins would give up four runs in the ninth inning on Sunday, turning an 8-1 breeze into an 8-5 nail-biter.

Tompkins has given up four runs on six hits in his last three outings, but the Tigers have won all three of those games, as he is 5-0 on the year.

Not giving up extra

LSU still is the stingiest team in the SEC when it comes to giving up extra base hits despite yielding three home runs and five doubles to Florida last weekend.

The Tigers have given up a total of just 110 extra base hits out of 497 hits yielded. LSU continues to lead the league in fewest home runs given up (27) and are second in triples (4) and third in doubles (79). Last year, LSU gave up 170 extra base hits, including 105 doubles, 14 triples and 51 home runs.

Florida became just the third team to hit three home runs in a series this year, joining Vanderbilt and South Carolina, as the Gamecocks hit three in the first game of that series in Columbia and four homers overall.

Tiger starters among the most durable

LSU starters continue to make the bullpen needed only in certain situations, as the Tiger starting pitchers have now reached the sixth inning in six consecutive games and 14 of the last 15, missing only on April 30 at New Orleans because Jake Tompkins was slated to go just four innings.

In the Auburn series, only one starter (Lane Mestepey) went past the third inning, but since then, the Tiger starters have reached the sixth inning in each of the last 15 SEC contests, including three complete games by Mestepey and another complete outing by Brian Wilson. In 10 of those 15 conference games, the Tigers' starter has gone at least seven innings.

The Tigers' starters are 24-11 with a solid 3.38 ERA this year, and have pitched nearly 70 percent of the total innings by the Tigers, throwing 322.1 of the 465.2 innings this season.

Although LSU is only 11th in the league with six saves, the Tigers are second in complete games with seven, one behind league leader Alabama.

Strikeouts missing

LSU enters this weekend second in the SEC with 375 strikeouts, but the Tigers didn't get many of them at Florida, fanning just 11 Gators in 124 batters faced, the fewest number of batters the Tigers have struck out in a three-game series, with the previous low being 13 at Houston in February.

In fact, LSU had struck out 13 or more batters in two of the previous five games prior to the Florida trip, fanning 16 at UNO on April 30 and 13 at Tennessee on May 4.



Broken clutch

LSU was fortunate to win two of three at Florida, as while the Tigers had 31 hits in three games, the clutch hitting was noticeably absent.

The Tigers, who came into Gainesville hitting .360 with runners in scoring position from April 1 through the Tennessee series, was an anemic 6-for-38 (.158) against the Gators with RBI opportunities, including a 1-for-9 effort in the 6-3 loss to Florida ace Alex Hart on Saturday. Only Wally Pontiff had more than one hit with RBI opportunities in the series, and he was just 2-for-6.

In their previous two SEC series vs. Arkansas and Tennessee, LSU was 24-for-60 (.400) in those same situations. The Tigers are now hitting .297 with RISP for the year (a nine-point drop) and .312 in SEC games (a 16-point drop).

LSU has struggled most of the season to get two-out hits, and the series in Gainesville was no exception, as LSU was just 6-for-32 (.188) facing the end of an inning. Pontiff was 2-for-4 in those situations, but Sean Barker was just 2-for-9, while J.C. Holt and Chris Phillips were both 0-for-3.

For the year, LSU is hitting just .266 with two outs in all games and .272 in the SEC in those situations.

Pettit healthy, getting stronger

For the first time in his four years at LSU, Bo Pettit heads into the final weekend of the regular season ready to take the mound rather than spending time in the training room.

That's because the right-hander from Houston has finally gone through a whole season without missing a single start due to injury, and if his last two starts are any indication, he's ready to tackle the post-season head-on.

Last Sunday at Florida, Pettit turned in 8.0 stellar innings, giving up just four singles and one run to a Gator team that was second in the nation and first in the SEC with a .358 batting average. After giving up three walks and a run in the first inning, Pettit allowed just two runners to reach third in the second through eighth innings.

Combined with a 7.0 inning stint at Tennessee on May 5, Pettit has allowed just nine hits and three runs in his last 15.0 innings, winning both starts to lower his ERA from 3.94 to 3.60. In each of the last two years, Pettit started in the next-to-last SEC series, but did not pitch after that due to continuing arm trouble.

Great eighth

Earlier in the season, LSU had a bad habit of getting runs early and coasting the rest of the game, a strategy that cost them a few games, especially a March 5 contest against rival Tulane in which LSU had a 5-0 lead in the fourth, only to lose 6-5.

That's not the case any more. LSU has been especially strong in the seventh and eighth innings this year, scoring 118 of their 372 runs in those two frames. In the eighth inning alone, LSU is hitting .366 with 59 runs scored, seven home runs and a .431 on-base percentage.

In fact, four LSU hitters are batting .500 or better in the eighth, led by Sean Barker's .667 mark (14-for-21), followed by Chris Phillips and J.C. Holt both at .545 (12-for-22), and Dustin Hahn's .500 mark (5-for-10).

Road warriors

Sure, LSU gets a tremendous advantage by playing at Alex Box Stadium, posting a 568-131-1 mark since 1984, good for an .812 winning percentage.

But the Tigers have more than held their own away from Baton Rouge, as the Tigers' 14-10 combined away/neutral mark leaves LSU poised to post its fourth straight winning mark in games away from The Box. Given the fact LSU will play the SEC Tournament in Birmingham and possibly the remainder of the season following this weekend away from Baton Rouge, the road mark will certainly come into play.

Since 1999, LSU is 69-41-2 (.625) in games played away from home, including the stellar 24-6 mark that led to the 2000 national championship.

LSU has also proven tough in SEC rubber games this year, going 3-2 on the road in those contests, including victories in each of the last two weekends at Tennessee and Florida.

Tough with two out

While LSU may be struggling at the plate with two out, the Tiger hurlers are holding down opposing batters with two outs even better, as the LSU pitching staff is giving up just a .242 batting average with two out, yielding just 93 two-out runs.

With runners in scoring position and two out, the Tigers are even better, giving up just a .234 mark with a two-out RBI opportunity awaiting an opposing batter.

LSU coach Smoke Laval
 Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.

This weekend in the SEC

For four teams, the off-season begins after this weekend's contests. For the others, greater glory awaits as the SEC Tournament begins Wednesday in Birmingham. Here's what's going on in the final weekend around the league:

Ole Miss at Mississippi St.—Who would have dreamed the "Golden Egg" battle on the diamond would be for survival in the SEC Tournament? Ole Miss has lost seven of nine in the league, while State has lost seven straight. Rebels need one win to clinch, State needs sweep or to win one more than Arkansas to make 16th consecutive SEC tourney.

Auburn at Arkansas—Razorbacks were given up for dead after losing two to Kentucky at home, but sweep in Oxford has breathed new life into the Hogs, who need to match MSU to reach first SEC Tourney since title year of 1999. Auburn needs one win to clinch and has enjoyed nice recovery after sweep by Alabama.

South Carolina at Georgia—Gamecocks need to win in Athens and root for Bayou Bengals in Baton Rouge to have any hope of SEC championship. Bulldogs are 9-3 at home in the SEC and have clinched berth in SEC Tourney, likely headed for first-round match with LSU at Hoover Met.

Florida at Kentucky—Gators have remote chance at share of overall title (will need to sweep Bat Cats and hope LSU sweeps Alabama), but still have chance to host a regional on the line. Bat Cats out of SEC Tourney in back-to-back years for first time since 1989 and 1990.

Vanderbilt at Tennessee—Volunteers have wins over LSU and South Carolina in May, but will need to sweep and get a lot of help to reach Birmingham. Commodores won second conference series of the season last weekend against Kentucky.
