On the road: LSU plays its first road game of 2003 vs. Centenary in Shreveport.

- This is the second consecutive year LSU has played its first road game vs. the Gents at Shreveport's Fair Grounds Field.
- LSU was 13-12 on opponents' fields in 2002 and 16-14 combined away from Alex Box Stadium.
- LSU is coming off of a three-game sweep of Northwestern St. at home, giving the Tigers their sixth 3-0 start in the last eight years.
- LSU is seeking its first 4-0 start since 2000. The Tigers started 4-0 en route to the national championship in 1991, 1996, 1997 and 2000.
- The Tigers enter the game having won 11 of their last 12 vs. Louisiana opponents.

Scouting the Gents: Centenary is playing its final season as an independent.

- Centenary will join the Mid-Continent Conference for the 2003-04 athletic year, marking the first time the Gents have been a conference since leaving the Trans America Athletic Conference (now the Atlantic Sun) in 1998.
- The Gents were 15-41 last year, and have not enjoyed a winning season since 1991.
- Centenary's top hitter entering the game is senior catcher Jon Marshall, a transfer from TCU who is hitting .471 with 4 RBI.
- Infielders J.W. Pate and Tony Cardone, who are both hitting .333, are among the Gents' top returnees.

About the Series: LSU has won 19 consecutive games in the series to hold a commanding 24-7-1 edge.

- LSU and Centenary first met in a two-game series in 1895. The Gents won the initial meeting, 5-4, before the teams played to an 11-11 tie in the second game.
- Centenary is the Tigers' second-oldest intercollegiate athletic opponent, behind only Tulane, which played LSU in both baseball and football in 1893. The only other baseball series that pre-dates 1900 is Texas, who first played the Tigers in 1899.
- Centenary's last series victory came in 1956 at Shreveport, 2-1.
- This is the second of a five-game contract between LSU and the Shreveport Regional Sports Foundation.
- LSU won the last meeting in Baton Rouge, 21-1 in 1999.
- Skip Bertman was 18-0 vs. Centenary in his 18-year tenure as the Tigers' coach, and revived the series with the Gents after it went on hiatus from 1958-1983.

Looking back: LSU took a 7-6 victory last February 20.

- David Raymer saved the Tigers from defeat with a two-out, two-strike, two-run double in the ninth inning.
- Brian Wilson pitched the final 1 2/3 innings in relief to earn the win.
- Jason Determann started the game and pitched three scoreless innings, but did not pitch again the rest of the season due to an elbow injury that required Tommy John surgery.
- Eric Wiethorn hit his first career home run in the fourth inning.

On the road

Tonight's contest with Centenary is the first of 24 away games the Tigers will play in 2003 (the game vs. Tulane in the Superdome is technically considered a neutral site game, although Tulane promotes it as a home contest). In addition to tonight's game and the aforementioned game in the Superdome, LSU will visit the campuses of Southern and Northwestern St. later this season, while facing UNO and Tulane at Zephyr Field.

Over the last three seasons, LSU is 42-29-1 on enemy fields and 56-32-1 in all games outside of Baton Rouge, not bad considering the fierce competition the SEC and the fact the Tigers annually play in some of the nation's toughest places to win in non-conference action. LSU was 13-12 on the road and 3-2 at neutral sites last year.

LSU was 5-1 against in-state competition away from The Box in 2002, defeating Centenary, SLU, UL-Monroe, Tulane (at the Superdome) and UNO (at Zephyr Field), while losing to UL-Lafayette.

Great starts key on road to Omaha

LSU hasn't been to the College World Series since winning the 2000 national championship, and while a win over Centenary tonight won't guarantee a trip to Omaha, history shows it would keep LSU on the straight and narrow.

LSU already has a piece of history on its side, as in seven of the 11 years in which it went to the CWS, the Tigers have started 3-0. LSU began 3-0 and reached Omaha in 1986, 1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998 and 2000. Only once has LSU started out with a loss and made it to Omaha, and that was in 1990, when the Tigers dropped their opener to Wichita St. in the ABCA Hall of Fame Classic in Orlando.

In four of the Tigers' five national championship seasons, the Tigers have started off at least 6-0 or better. The Tigers began 1991 at 6-0, 13-0 in 1996, 19-0 in 1997 and 6-0 again in 2000. LSU was (ga sp!) 3-3 in 1993 but eventually won the national title.

One caveat: LSU began the 1988 season 13-0, but then stumbled to a 26-21 mark the rest of the way and did not make the NCAA Tournament, the last time the Tigers have missed making a regional appearance.

Tigers looking to keep dominance going

LSU enters tonight's game with Centenary having won 20 consecutive games from the Gents, the Tigers' longest active winning streak over one opponent.

Even with a win tonight, LSU is still a long way away from its record over one team, which was a 35-game streak over Southern that began in 1970 and lasted through 2000, until the Jaguars won 13-6 on March 6, 2001.

The Tigers' next longest active streak is a 10-game streak over New Orleans, whom the Tigers play twice every year. LSU has defeated Alabama eight straight times, the longest active streak over an SEC foe.

The seven-game winning streak in Shreveport is tied for the Tigers' longest road streak, along with seven in a row over SLU in Hammond from 1990-2002.

Meier gets the call

Justin Meier will become the fourth Tiger pitcher to make his first career appearance tonight when he takes the mound to start against Centenary.

Meier is a true freshman right-hander from Windmere, Fla., and pitched two innings in the alumni game on February 1.

Ironically, the first start by a freshman in 2002 also came in Shreveport, when Jason Determann started and worked three innings. Freshmen started eight games in 2002, with five of those starts by Clay Harris, two by Jason Vargas and the aforementioned one by Determann.



Gill goes for a triple double

Last year, the Blake Gill Watch started after the Tigers' first series of the season, as Gill did not get a hit until the seventh game of the season and an 0-for-17 slump.

This year, Gill doesn't have to worry about such a slump, finishing the Northwestern St. series as the Tigers' leading hitter, batting .462 (6-for-13) with a double and a pair of RBI.

Gill was consistent throughout the weekend, collecting two hits in all three games. The biggest hit of the six was his RBI double in the eighth inning on Friday that scored the winning run in a 2-1 triumph.

Amazingly, Gill has already bettered his 2002 total in one statistical category. The Florida native was 4-for-9 against Demon left-handed pitching, compared to just 3-for-26 (.115) vs. southpaws for the ENTIRE 2002 season.

As was the case in 2002, Gill continues to fill the bill in clutch situations, going 2-for-4 with runners in scoring position and 3-for-9 with runners on base last weekend.

Gill was also golden with his glove, accepting 29 chances on the weekend without an error. Gill started Friday and Saturday at first base, then started at second base on Sunday and participated in two of LSU's three double plays.

Dating back to last year's SEC Tournament, Gill has now hit safely in his last nine games.

Nate is no Bum in Pettit's stead

So much for being nervous about making your first LSU appearance in an emergency start. Junior right-hander Nate Bumstead was more than up to the task when called upon Sunday to replace Bo Pettit, who was sick with a case of the flu.

Bumstead picked up the win over Northwestern St., pitching seven strong innings and allowing just one walk and two runs on five hits. Bumstead had a shutout going until two out in the seventh, when he gave up a two-run home run to the Demons' Jeff Martin. Until the home run, Bumstead allowed only one NSU runner to reach scoring position, and he got out of the jam by inducing a ground ball to the mound to start a 1-6-3 double play.

Bumstead, a Las Vegas native who transferred to LSU from Southern Idaho, was scheduled to pitch tonight vs. Centenary, but now will not see action again until this weekend's series at home against Kansas.

Tompkins still on his game

Jake Tompkins didn't get the win on Friday night in the season opener, but he showed he is back in the form that made him a second team All-SEC selection in 2002.

Tompkins set a new career high with 11 strikeouts vs. Northwestern St., breaking his old mark of 10 done last April 30 at New Orleans.

Tompkins, who allowed no earned runs in 5 2/3 innings, got his strikeouts when it counted the most, leaving Demon runners stranded in scoring position in the second, fourth and fifth innings. Tompkins also fanned the side in order in the third inning and threw 89 pitches.

Tompkins has been at his best throughout his career in tough situations, and has now allowed just one hit and one sacrifice fly in 16 bases loaded situations in his career.

Nall slams the door twice

LSU hasn't had a true closer since the days of Rick Greene from 1990-92, but Brandon Nall may be ready to take the mantle that has for so long been dormant for the Tigers.

The submariner notched two saves in the weekend sweep of Northwestern St., allowing one infield hit in 2 2/3 scoreless innings.

Nall gave up a walk on Friday when he relieved Billy Sadler, but then retired the Demons on back-to-back ground balls to second base. On Sunday, he gave up an infield hit and a sacrifice fly to cut the LSU lead to 4-3, but induced an inning ending double play before working a 1-2-3 ninth.

The LSU record for saves in a season is 14 by Greene in the 1991 national championship season, and Nall is off to a good start in quest of that record.

Sadler looks to build on strong debut

Junior right-hander Billy Sadler will likely see action tonight, and he will be coming off a very strong performance in the his debut on Friday.

IN the season opener, Sadler notched the victory by pitching 2 2/3 scoreless innings in relief of Jake Tompkins. Sadler struck out four and walked one as the Tigers rallied for a 2-1 victory with a pair of eighth inning runs.



Tigers strike back strong

LSU did what all good teams do over the weekend vs. Northwestern St., and that's respond to an opponent's score by scoring themselves.

In four of the six innings in which the Tigers scored in the three-game series, it came in response to runs scored by the Demons in the top half of the same frame. In all, the Tigers scored 13 of their 17 runs after Northwestern St. tallies.

The "giveaway-takeaway" statistic in baseball is simple—if the opponent scores, and the other team responds in the next half inning, it's a "takeaway", while a "giveaway" are runs allowed in the next half inning after scoring in your turn at bat. For the Northwestern St. series, LSU was a plus-10 in the statistic, as the Demons did not score immediately after the Tigers put runs on the board.

Tigers handcuff Demons when it counts

LSU's pitching staff made life tough on Northwestern St. in the Tigers' three-game sweep, holding the Demons to a .250 batting average and nine runs in the three game series.

The Tiger hurlers were at their best when it counted most, as Northwestern St. was just 4-for-34 (.118) with runners in scoring position for the series. The Demons were 1-for-12 on Friday and 1-for-17 on Saturday before getting two hits on Sunday, but those hits came in only five opportunities.

In all situations with runners on base this weekend, LSU limited Northwestern St. to a .200 average (9-for-45).

Consistency the order of the weekend

LSU's .312 batting average in the Northwestern St. series wasn't overwhelming, but the key to the sweep was consistent hitting throughout the order.

All 13 position players who got an at-bat in the series got at least one hit, and of those 13, eight players had at least two hits. Blake Gill (see page 3) led the way by going 6-for-13, while Bruce Sprowl (4-for-13), Aaron Hill (3-for-8), Jon Zeringue (3-for-9) all ended the weekend above the .300 mark.

Gill, Zeringue and Sprowl all hit safely in every game, while Dustin Weaver, J.C. Holt, Matt Horwath and Hill each had hits in two of the three games.

Eight players also collected at least one RBI on the weekend, with four collecting two. Zeringue and Horwath each tallied three RBI to lead the team.

Holt off and running

J.C. Holt was moved from second base to center field to utilize his speed, but the sophomore is showing that speed on the basepaths as well as in the field.

Holt was a perfect 3-for-3 on stolen bases in the two games in which he played against Northwestern St., as he was given a day of rest on Sunday.

Holt wasn't the only Tiger off and running, as LSU was 8-for-9 in stolen base attempts for the weekend. The only Tiger to get caught was Ryan Patterson on Sunday, and that came when Patterson was caught leaning off of first base and caught in a run-down.

Holt led the Tigers with a .556 on-base percentage for the weekend, getting on base with two hits and three hit by pitches.

Holt would need to average three stolen bases for every four games played to tie the LSU single-season record for steals, which is 42 by Rob Hartwig in 1987.

Patience at the plate

The Tigers not only were consistent up and down the lineup, but also were patient at the plate in the Northwestern St. series.

LSU batters struck out only eight times in 113 total plate appearances, an average of one every 14.13 trips to the plate. Compare that to the final 2002 numbers, which saw the Tigers fan 404 times and once every 6.63 plate appearances.

The problem was that three players did all of the striking out. Jon Zeringue fanned three times, while Quinn Stewart and Aaron Hill each fanned twice. But the fact that 10 of 13 players did not strike out is an encouraging sign.

Only Zeringue took a called third strike in the series, something LSU had trouble with in 2002, ringing up 56 called strikeouts.

Tigers end homer drought early

LSU needed only 8 2/3 innings to hit its first home run of 2003, as Jon Zeringue hit a three-run homer in the first inning on Saturday. Last year, LSU went 37 1/3 innings without a home run, with Sean Barker connecting in the fourth game of the season vs. SLU.

LSU sticks with lineup in first two games
LSU needed 26 games in 2002 to finally start the same lineup in back-to-back games, but the Tigers started the exact same batting order in the first two games of the Northwestern St. series on Friday and Saturday.

Sunday's lineup was changed radically, as four players got their first starts of 2003, including three starting for the first time in their LSU careers.

Last year, LSU used a different starting lineup in every game until the final two games of the Ole Miss series on March 23 and 24. However, the Tigers began to settle into a more consistent regular lineup as the season progressed, and in conference series at South Carolina and Tennessee, LSU started the same players in the same order in all three games.

A total of 17 different players started at least three games for the Tigers in 2002, while 10 different pitchers started at least one game.

No extras, please

LSU ended the 2002 season as the SEC's stingiest team when it came to giving up extra base hits, yielding only 145 in 589 2/3 innings pitched.

That trend appears to be continuing into the 2003 season, as LSU hurlers gave up only two extra base hits in 27 innings. Northwestern St. collected a double on Saturday and a home run on Sunday, but otherwise held the Demons to singles.

Smoke starts with piece of history

LSU coach Smoke Laval has done something none of his predecessors—not even Skip Bertman—were able to achieve, and that's start 3-0 in each of his first two seasons.

Laval started off 3-0 in 2002 with a sweep of Birmingham-Southern and this year by sweeping Northwestern St., running Laval's mark with the Tigers to 47-22. In only one year and three games, Laval is seventh on LSU's all-time victory total list, and his .681 career winning percentage trails only Bertman's .724.

Laval, who coached seven seasons (1994-2000) at Louisiana-Monroe, will more than likely win his 300th career game by the end of March, as his career record stands at 287-181.



LSU Coach Smoke Laval

Smoke Laval had a very successful first year as LSU's coach, leading the Tigers to the NCAA Super Regional round for the fourth consecutive year and posting a 44-22 record. For his efforts, Laval was named the Louisiana Sportswriters' Association Louisiana coach of the year.

Laval was named Skip Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, and spent the 2001 season as the LSU administrative assistant. From 1994-2000, Laval coached for seven years at Louisiana-Monroe, guiding the Indians to three NCAA regional berths (1995, 1999, 2000) and a 241-159 mark. Among Laval's pupils at ULM was Ben Sheets, a 2000 member of the United States Olympic gold medal team and a 2001 major league all-star with the Milwaukee Brewers.

Laval was Bertman's top assistant at LSU from 1984-1993, helping the Tigers reach the College World series six times and win the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval was also a graduate assistant at LSU under Jack Lamabe in 1979 and an assistant at Florida in 1982 and 1983.
