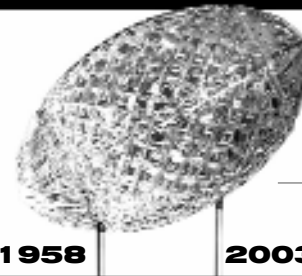

Tigers Welcome Troy To Tiger Stadium For Homecoming

After a much-needed and well-deserved weekend off, LSU returns to action tonight as the 17th-ranked Tigers host Troy at 7 o'clock in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised on LSU's in-house pay-per-view network, TigerVision. The Troy contest will serve as LSU's 2004 Homecoming game and it will also mark the first meeting between the teams in football. LSU is 51-25-3 all-time in Homecoming games, which includes a 3-1 mark under **Nick Saban**. Last year, the Tigers posted a 49-10 Homecoming win over Louisiana Tech. Troy dropped a 13-9 decision to Arkansas State on Saturday and fell to 3-3 overall. The Trojans are 1-2 in Sun Belt Conference play. After opening its season with wins over Marshall and nationally-ranked Missouri, Troy has now lost three of its last four games. LSU, coming off a 24-21 last-minute win over Florida in its last outing, stands at 4-2 overall and 2-2 in league play. The Troy game will serve as LSU's final non-conference regular season contest. LSU enters the Troy game having won six straight home games and the Tigers have been victorious in 11 consecutive home games against non-conference foes, a streak that dates back to the 2000 season.

Randall, Addai Lead Tigers Past Florida, 24-21

Marcus Randall came off the bench to rally LSU from a 14-0 first quarter deficit to beat 12th-ranked Florida, 24-21, in Gainesville. Down 21-17 with just over two minutes left in the contest, Randall guided the Tigers on a 6-play, 50-yard drive, capped with a 10-yard scoring pass to **Joseph Addai**, for the come-from-behind win for the Tigers. Trailing 14-0 following a pair of first quarter interceptions that led to Florida scoring drives of 5 and 3-yards, Randall took over for an injured **JaMarcus Russell**. Randall pulled the Tigers to within 21-14 at halftime after engineering a pair of 80-yard scoring drives. **Alley Broussard** got the Tigers to within 14-7 on a 1-yard plunge early in the second quarter. Florida extended its lead to 21-7 with just over a minute left in the first half, before Randall engineered a 7-play, 80-yard drive, capped with a 15-yard TD pass to **Early Doucet** with 12 seconds left in the first half. **Chris Jackson** kicked a 47-yard field goal in the third quarter to get the Tigers to within 21-17 before a fourth quarter defensive struggle paved the way for LSU's last-minute comeback against the Gators. For the game, Randall connected on 18 of 27 passes for 198 and 2 TDs, while Addai led the Tigers with 93 yards rushing. Addai also caught 4 passes for 26 yards, including the game-winner. Offensively, the Tigers put up 464 yards (210 rushing, 254 passing) compared to just 236 (94 rushing, 142 passing) for the Gators.

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right person to lead it. In four years as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban has proven to be that leader.

Since taking over a program that suffered through seven losing seasons in the 1990s, Saban has guided the Tigers to the pinnacle of college football - winning the 2003 BCS National Championship with a 21-14 victory over Oklahoma in the Nokia Sugar Bowl. The victory culminated a four-year ride under Saban that has been unmatched in the history of Tiger football. Since taking the reigns in 2000, Saban has guided the Tigers to a 43-15 overall mark, while claiming a pair of SEC titles in 2001 and 2003. LSU's 2003 BCS National Championship is just the second for the Tigers in football, and the first since 1958.

Saban's ability to successfully lead the Tigers comes from a management style that focuses on the entire program, one that puts his players in position to have success, both on the field and in the classroom. Armed with a plan that starts with recruiting quality people, outstanding football players and good students, Saban and his staff have transformed LSU into a team that is sure to be a fixture among the nation's elite programs for years to come.

On the field, Saban has developed a reputation as a defensive mastermind who is among the best in the game - professional or college - when it comes to game day coaching decisions. His defenses are physical, aggressive and deceptive, while offensively, the Tigers put up staggering numbers with a wealth of skill players leading the way. His teams play hard, make good decisions on the field and have proven that they are confident enough to overcome any type of adversity that is thrown in their direction.

It's a style and system that has proven to be successful, both for the team as well as the individual as six Tigers have earned First Team All-America honors in four years, while 18 of his LSU players have gone on to be selected in the NFL Draft, including six in the 2004 draft.

Off the field, Saban demands excellence from his players in both the classroom as well as the community. While the Tigers were marching to the 2003 national title on the field, the LSU football team combined for a 2.52 grade point average. A few months later, the squad bettered that mark with a 2.76 average for the spring semester as the Tigers had 50 players with a 3.0 or better during the spring and just six athletes that failed to reach a 2.0.

In addition to the honors the Tigers garnered on the field, LSU had 25 players earn a spot in the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 2003. Once again, numbers that show not only is Saban committed to academics, but his players are also dedicated to receiving an education as well. Since December of 2000, 51 football players who played under Saban at LSU have earned their degree, which includes 13 members of the 2003 national championship squad.

A major part of enhancing and cultivating the education experience for the student-athletes at LSU has been the addition of the \$15 million state-of-the-art Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes. Saban spearheaded the fundraising for the center, which included donating \$50,000 of his own money to the cause. The center, the best of its kind in college athletics, features a 1,000-seat auditorium with over 100 computers in a 54,000-square foot facility that gives all of LSU's student-athletes the best chance to have success in the classroom.

Saban's mission statement for the LSU football program is simple. He wants his players to become better people for having been a part of the program. He also wants to develop his players so they can reach their full athletic potential, which will enable them to have the opportunity to win a championship. Finally, it's his plan to help each player graduate and launch their career so that when they leave LSU they can have the best opportunities to be successful in life.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five years.

The Game

The Tigers step outside of conference play for the final time during the regular season as LSU hosts Troy of the Sun Belt Conference for Homecoming. LSU enters the contest following an open week. Troy is coming off a 13-9 loss to Arkansas State last week. LSU, ranked No. 17 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll and No. 18 in the AP poll, is 4-2 overall and 2-2 in league play following a 24-21 win over then-No. 12 Florida in its last outing on Oct. 9. Troy stands at 3-3 overall and 1-2 in Sun Belt action.

Who's In And Who's Out For The Tigers

LSU enters tonight's game with just two players out of action against the Trojans. LB **Dorsett Buckels** tore the ACL in his knee in the opening kickoff against Florida and will be sidelined for the remainder of the year. In addition, DB **Mario Stevenson** (foot) has been out since the first week of the season after suffering a broken bone in his foot. Stevenson's timetable for a return is still uncertain at this time.

In The Polls

The Tigers moved back into the top 20 on Sunday, rising from No. 21 to No. 17 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll and from No. 20 to No. 18 in the Associated Press poll. LSU has been ranked for 27 consecutive ranking periods in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll and for 26 straight in the Associated Press poll. LSU stands at No. 19 in the first Bowl Championship Series Standings, which were released on Monday. Last year, LSU came in at No. 12 in the first BCS Standings before climbing all the way to the BCS National Title.

About Troy

The Trojans are 3-3 overall and 1-2 in Sun Belt Conference action ... Troy, located in Troy, Ala., is in its first year in the Sun Belt Conference having played the last three years as a Division IA Independent ... The former member of the Southland Conference, went 7-4 in its first year in IA in 2001 ... The school changed its named from Troy State University to Troy University last April ... The Trojans are coached by Larry Blakeney, who is in his 14th year at the school with a record of 111-51-1.

It's Homecoming In Tiger Stadium

Homecoming will be celebrated this week on campus as the week-long festivities conclude tonight with the LSU-Troy football game in Tiger Stadium. LSU is 51-25-3 all-time in Homecoming games, which includes a 3-1 mark under **Nick Saban**. LSU has won three straight Homecoming games, including last year's 49-10 win over Louisiana Tech.

After An Open Date

The Tigers are 5-3 in games following an open date under **Nick Saban**. LSU was 1-1 following open dates in 2000, 2001 and 2003 and 2-0 following the open dates in 2002.

It's Good To Be Home

LSU returns to Tiger Stadium tonight for the first time since a 51-0 win over Mississippi State on Sept. 25. Nearly a month will have passed (29 days to be exact) between LSU home games, which marks the longest in-season stretch without a game in Tiger Stadium since 1988 when the Tigers went 35 days between home games. That year, LSU opened at home on Sept. 3 against Texas A&M before playing three consecutive road games. LSU didn't return home until Oct. 8 when the Tigers beat Auburn, 7-6, in what has become known as the "Earthquake Game".

Another Fourth-Quarter Comeback

LSU's comeback from a 21-17 deficit late in the fourth quarter against Florida represents the seventh time under **Nick Saban** that the Tigers have rallied to win a game despite trailing in the final quarter. Earlier this year, LSU rallied from a 15-7 fourth quarter deficit to force overtime against Oregon State before eventually beating the Beavers, 22-21. Prior to Oregon State win, the last time the Tigers rallied to win in the fourth quarter came against Kentucky in 2002 when **Marcus Randall** connected with Devery Henderson on a 75-yard TD pass as time expired for a 33-30 LSU win. Over the seven fourth-quarter comeback wins for the Tigers since 2000, Randall has been involved in four as he threw the game winning TD against Kentucky and Ole Miss in 2002 and then ran for the game-winning score against Oregon State in overtime. Spears A Semifinalist For Lombardi Award

LSU senior defensive end **Marcus Spears** has been named as one of 12 semifinalists for the Lombardi Award, the Rotary Lombardi Award selection committee announced on Tuesday. In six games, Spears has recorded 14 tackles, 2.5 tackles for losses, a sack and he's returned an interception 35 yards for a touchdown. He's also broken up three passes, forced a fumble and recovered a fumble for the 17th-ranked Tigers. The Lombardi Award goes each year to the college football lineman, offensive or defensive, who, in addition to displaying outstanding performance and ability, best exemplifies the character of Vince Lombardi.

LSU's Won 11 Straight Non-Conference Games In Tiger Stadium

LSU won its 11th straight non-conference game in Tiger Stadium with a 53-3 win over Arkansas State on Sept. 11. LSU hasn't lost a home non-SEC game since dropping a last-second 13-10 decision to UAB in 2000.

LSU's 17-3 Against Non-SEC Foes Under Saban

The Tigers ran their non-conference record to 17-3 under **Nick Saban** following the 53-3 win over Arkansas State. The Tigers, who were 5-0 against non-SEC teams in 2003, haven't lost a non-conference game since dropping a 35-20 decision to Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl. LSU hasn't lost a regular season non-conference game since falling to Virginia Tech, 26-8, to open the 2002 season.

That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach **Nick Saban** has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In 4-plus seasons at LSU, Saban has put together a 26-5 mark at home, which includes a 13-4 record in SEC games. LSU finished its 2003 season 6-1 at home after going 6-1 in Tiger Stadium in 2002. Under Saban, the Tigers are 6-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium.

LSU's Won Six Straight In Tiger Stadium

With the win over Mississippi State, LSU has now won 6 straight home games. The Tigers are 3-0 this year at home after winning its final three games in Tiger Stadium last year. The last time LSU lost at home came on Oct. 11, 2003 when Florida posted a 19-7 win over the Tigers. Since then, LSU has outscored its opponents 261-65 at home for an average of 43.5-10.8 in those five games.

Taking Note On The Tigers Under Saban

Here is a look at some notable trends for LSU during its first 58 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 36-3 when leading at halftime and 34-3 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 40-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 36-0 when scoring at least 25 points in a game ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 3-12 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 12-3 in games decided by 7 points or less and 6-2 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 29-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 team rushing yards and the Tigers are 20-0 when having a player rush for 100 yards.

Tigers Second-Best In SEC Over Last 5 Years

Since 2000, LSU has won 43 football games, a number that ranks second to Georgia's 45 among teams in the SEC. LSU is 43-15 since 2000, all coming under **Nick Saban**. Georgia ranks first during that time span with a 45-13 mark. The following is a look at how teams in the SEC rank by wins over the last 5 years:

Randall Named SEC Player of the Week For Performance Against Florida

LSU senior quarterback **Marcus Randall** earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 11 after leading the Tigers to a 24-21 fourth-quarter comeback win over 12th-ranked Florida. For the game, Randall connected on 18 of 27 passes for 198 yards and two touchdowns, including the game-winner with 27 seconds left. Randall also rushed for 46 yards on 10 carries in the game. The 18 completions were one shy of tying his career best of 19 set against Texas in the Cotton Bowl. With the Tigers trailing 21-17 late in the fourth quarter, Randall, who has also engineered fourth quarter comeback wins over Ole Miss and Kentucky during his career, guided the Tigers on a 6-play, 50-yard drive during the final two minutes of the contest to beat the

Gators. Randall clinched the comeback with a 10-yard TD pass to **Joseph Addai** with only 27 seconds left in the contest. The SEC Player of the Week honor is the second of Randall's career. He was named SEC Player of the Week in 2002 after leading the Tigers to a 14-13 win over Ole Miss on Nov. 23.

LSU's Scoring Defense Average Misleading

While the Tigers are allowing 16.7 points per game, that number is not truly indicative of the type of defense that LSU has put on the field this season. Consider that of the 13 touchdowns LSU has allowed in 2004, 6 have come on drives of 40 yards or less, including 4 of 25 yards or less and 2 of 5 and 3 yards against Florida. On the other hand, LSU's defense has yet to yield a scoring drive of 80-yards or better. As a matter of fact, the longest sustained scoring drive against LSU came against Georgia for 71 yards.

Randall Leads Tigers To Another Fourth Quarter Comeback

Marcus Randall has already etched his name into Tiger football lore as the quarterback who was on the throwing end of the "Bluegrass Miracle", the 75-yard TD pass to Devery Henderson as time expired to beat Kentucky, 33-30, in 2002. Now, Randall has added another fourth comeback to his list of accomplishments, leading the Tigers from a 14-0 first quarter deficit to a 24-21 win over Florida on Oct. 9. Against the Gators, Randall guided the Tigers on a 6-play, 50-yard drive, culminating with a 10-yard TD pass to **Joseph Addai** for the winning points with only 27 seconds left. It marks the third fourth quarter comeback that Randall has directed during his career with the Tigers. The other came against Ole Miss in 2002 when Randall led LSU to a 14-13 win over the Rebels in Tiger Stadium.

Addai Runs Wild Against Florida

Even though he didn't quite get to 100-yards rushing against Florida, **Joseph Addai's** performance against the Gators will go down as one of the best performances in school history. Addai finished the contest with 93 yards on 10 carries for an average of 9.3 yards per carry. Of Addai's 93 rushing yards, 64 came after his first contact with a defender. On LSU's game-winning scoring drive, Addai accounted for 44 of the 50 yards in the scoring drive (34 on the ground and 10 receiving). Addai's 10-yard reception proved to be the game-winning points as he bowled over a pair of Florida defenders at the goal line for the score with 27 seconds left in the game.

Addai Won't Be Tackled Behind The Line Of Scrimmage

In a case of what's more impressive, the 8.8 yards per carry or having carried the ball 34 times with a loss, **Joseph Addai** has done both through 6 games this year. On 34 attempts in 2004, Addai has yet to lose a yard as he's accounted for a team-best 300 yards on the ground. His 8.8 yards per carry is by far the best on the team.

Tigers Lead SEC In Rush Defense, Ranked 9th in Nation In Total Defense

LSU continued to stake its claim as one of the nation's top defenses as the Tigers moved atop the SEC standings in rushing defense, allowing only 104 yards per game. Through 6 games, the Tigers have allowed 624 yards and 2 TDs on 195 carries. In total defense, the Tigers are fourth in the league and 9th in the nation with 268.8 yards per game. Last year, LSU ranked first in the nation in scoring defense (11.0 points per game), and total defense (252.0 yards per game). The Tigers are also among the SEC leaders allowing only 16.7 points per game, a figure that ranks 21st nationally.

Turnovers Haven't Been Kind To LSU

Turnovers have been a problem for LSU through 6 games as the Tigers have turned the ball over 15 times, compared to just 12 takeaways by the Tiger defense. Of LSU's 15 turnovers, 10 have been fumbles, with the other 5 being interceptions. In addition, of LSU's 15 turnovers, 10 have come on the short side of the field and five have resulted in eventual touchdowns for the opponent. Florida and Georgia each scored 14 points off of LSU's turnovers.

Russell and Randall Have Tigers Ranked Fourth In SEC In Passing

LSU QB tandem of **Marcus Randall** and **JaMarcus Russell** have the Tigers ranked fourth in the SEC in passing offense with an average of 236.2 yards per game. Through 6 games, Russell has completed 48 of 95 passes for 743 yards and 6 TDs, while Randall has connected on 51 of 81 attempts for 587 yards and 5 scores. Randall has started all 5 games for the Tigers this year.

Tigers Have Kept Opponents To Less Than 20 Points 35 Times Under Saban

By holding Mississippi State scoreless in week 4, the Tigers have limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 35 of the 58 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 31-4 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game in 2003, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 35 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 19 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted five shutouts under Saban.

LSU Defense Finally Yields A Rushing TD

It took until the 20th quarter of the season, but LSU's defense finally allowed a rushing TD when Georgia's Thomas Brown scored on a 1-yard run last week. Through 6 games in 2004, LSU has allowed 13 touchdowns with only 2 of those coming on the ground. Florida had the other rushing TD against the Tigers. Dating back to last year's season-opener, LSU's defense has only allowed 9 rushing TDs, which covers a span of 20 games. Arkansas' Cedric Cobbs was the only player in the SEC to rush for a TD against the Tigers last year, and he did it with a 20-yard run in the final week of the regular-season.

LSU's Sack Streak At 31 Straight Games

With 1 sack against Florida, LSU ran its streak of games with at least one sack to 31 straight. The streak dates all the way back to the Miami (Ohio) game in 2002 when the Tigers sacked Ben Roethlisberger three times. Since then, LSU has had at least one sack in every game, which includes all 14 games in 2003. This year, through 6 games, the Tigers have 13 sacks that have accounted for 99-yards in losses. LSU FS LaRon Landry leads the Tigers with 3 sacks.

A Loaded Backfield

The return of RB **Shyrone Carey** from a 4-game suspension has only added to LSU's depth at the running back position. The Tigers have three running backs in its backfield that have a 100-yard game to their credit with sophomore **Justin Vincent** leading the way with 6 career 100-yard games. **Alley Broussard**, who had 73 yards and 3 TDs against Mississippi State, has 2 career 100-yard games, while Carey has done it once. LSU is also two yards away from having four players with 100-yard games as **Joseph Addai** has rushed for as many as 98 yards in a game, but he's never topped the 100-yard mark. LSU's four running backs of Vincent, Broussard, Addai and Carey have combined to rush for 3,657 yards and 34 TDs.

Webster Expected Back For Troy

LSU CB **Corey Webster** is expected to return to action on Saturday against Troy after missing the Florida contest with a hyper-extended knee. Webster, a First Team All-America in 2003, injured the knee against Georgia and has since sat out two straight weeks of practice. Webster is expected back on the practice field on Monday and should be in the lineup against the Trojans on Saturday. In 5 games, most of which he's played hurt, Webster has 16 tackles, 5 pass breakups and 1 interception.

12 Tigers Have Caught Passes In 2004

A trademark of a **Jimbo Fisher**-offense is that of spreading the ball around. Through 6 games, the Tigers have done a lot of spreading it around as 14 different players have been on the receiving end of passes. Of the 14 players who have caught passes, 7 are wide receivers, 4 are running backs and 3 are tight ends. **Dwayne Bowe** leads all receivers with 24 catches, Joseph Addai is tops among running backs with 12 catches and **David Jones** leads the tight ends with 4 receptions.

Randall Now 5-6 As LSU's Starting QB; 2-0 As A Reliever

LSU QB **Marcus Randall** has a 5-6 mark as LSU's starting quarterback, which includes a 3-2 record in 2004. Randall posted a 2-4 record as the Tiger signal caller in 2002. Randall is 2-0 when coming off the bench as he's been inserted into games and led the Tigers to wins over Ole Miss (2002) and Florida two weeks ago.

10 Different Tigers Have Scored On Offense in 2004

Last year, LSU had 12 different players score offensive touchdowns all year. This year, through 6 games, the Tigers have already had 10 players reach the endzone for a score on offense. Five different players have rushed for a score this year, while the Tigers have had five different receivers score. **Alley Broussard** leads the Tigers with 4 rushing TDs, while **Dwayne Bowe** is tops among receivers with 5 catches for scores. Of the 10 players who have scored offensive TDs for LSU, six are either freshmen or sophomores and only two are seniors. The following is list of LSU offensive players who've scored this year:

Bowe currently ranks 5th in the SEC in 4.33 receptions per game and he's tied with teammate **Craig Davis** for 4th place in the league with 62.7 yards receiving per contest. Through 6 games, Bowe leads the Tigers with 24 receptions for 376 yards and 5 TDs. He's averaging 15.7

Bowe and Davis A Nice 1-2 Sophomore Punch At Receiver

LSU sophomores **Dwayne Bowe** and **Craig Davis** have teamed to give the Tigers a nice 1-2 punch at wide-out. Through 6 games, the duo has combined to catch 47 passes for 752 yards and 5 TDs. Bowe leads the Tigers with 24 catches for 376 yards and 5 TDs, while Davis has 22 receptions for 376 yards.

12 True Freshmen Have Seen Action So Far

Twelve true freshmen have seen action for the Tigers in 2004 with four rookies having seen action in all 6 games. LB **Ali Highsmith**, FB **Jacob Hester**, WR **Early Doucet** and DT **Glen Dorsey** have played in all 6 games this year. Other true freshmen who have seen action this year include DB **Chevis Jackson**, WR **Xavier Carter**, OL **Brett Helms**, OL **Herman Johnson**, TE **Mit Cole**, DE **Charles Alexander**, DB **Craig Steltz** and HOLD **Joe Lawrence**.

LSU's Defense Scores Again

LSU's defense was back up to its old tricks against Mississippi State as the Tiger "D" scored a touchdown, the ninth for the Tigers since the start of the 2003 season. Dating back to the first game in 2003, LSU has now scored 9 defensive TDs in 20 games. Against Mississippi State, DE **Marcus Spears** intercepted a pass and returned it 35 yards for a TD, the second TD of his career. Against Arkansas State in week 2 of the season, LSU linebacker **Ali Highsmith** intercepted a Nick Noce pass at the ASU 11-yard line and returned it to the 1-yard line where he fumbled, which was picked up by cornerback **Travis Daniels**, who walked into the end-zone for the score. Last year, the Tigers scored a school-record 7 defensive TDs (5 interception returns, 2 fumble returns).

Jackson Handles All Kicking Duties Except PATs.... And He Can Hit Too

LSU specialist **Chris Jackson** continues to handle all of LSU's kicking duties, except for that of point-after conversions. Jackson also serves as LSU's punter and he's averaging 38.5 yards on 26 punts. As LSU's field goal kicker, Jackson has converted on 4 of 8 attempts, which includes a career-long tying kick of 47 yards in the third quarter against Florida. Jackson also serves as LSU's kicker on kickoffs. Oh by the way, he's also expected to be a starting middle infielder for the LSU baseball team next spring.

Sporting A New "Do" Gaudet Takes Over PATs For Tigers

Ryan Gaudet, with a new bleached-blond hairdo, has taken away part of the kicking chores away from Chris Jackson as he serve as LSU's kicker for PATs. Gaudet was successful on all three point-after kicks against Florida after missing his only attempt against Auburn. For the year, Gaudet is 2 of 2 on field goals and he's 3 of 4 on PATs. Last year, Gaudet was 36 of 38 on PATs for the Tigers and 7 of 12 on field goals.

Webster Closing In On LSU Career Interception Mark

With an interception against Mississippi State, LSU senior CB **Corey Webster** moved a step closer to the school's career interception mark. For his career, Webster has 15 interceptions, just 5 shy of tying Mike Williams' school-record for interceptions at 20. Webster intercepted 7 passes in 2002 and 2003. He has 1 interception to his credit this year. Webster tied the school-record for interceptions in a single-game with 3 against Florida in 2002. Webster leads all active players in the SEC in both interceptions and pass deflections (45).

Margin Of Victory

LSU's 51-point margin of victory was the biggest in an SEC game for the Tigers since 1969 when LSU posted a 61-6 win over Mississippi State. It marked the largest margin of victory under **Nick Saban** since the first game of the Saban era when the Tigers beat Western Carolina, 58-0.

A Couple Of Changes For The Tigers

Just in case you missed it, LSU LB **E.J. Kuale** has switched numbers and will wear No. 51 for the remainder of the season. Kuale started the year wearing No. 2, but with the return to action of RB/KR **Shyrone Carey** (who also wears No. 2), Kuale made the number switch. In addition, **Brandon Washington** moved back to defense the week of the Mississippi State contest after playing on the offensive line for the first three weeks of the season. Washington, who also switched from No. 66 to No. 97, originally came to LSU as a defensive lineman before moving to offensive line last spring.

Russell In Elite Company

With a pair of TD passes in each of his first two games in an LSU uniform, **JaMarcus Russell** did something that hasn't been done at the school since at least 1970. As far as detailed records account, Russell is the first LSU quarterback to toss at least 2 touchdown passes in his first two games as a Tiger. The only player since 1970 that came close was Tommy Hodson, who threw for a pair of TDs in his debut against Texas A&M in 1986. Hodson didn't throw any TD passes the following week in a 21-12 loss to Miami (Ohio).

Tigers Reach 50-Point Mark Again

For the fourth time in the last two seasons, LSU reached the 50-point mark with a 51-0 win over Mississippi State. The 51 points came just two weeks after the Tigers racked up 53 points in a 53-3 victory over Arkansas State. Last year, the Tigers beat Arizona, 53-13, and Arkansas, 55-24. In all, the Tigers have scored 50 points in a game five times under **Nick Saban**. The first time came in Saban's debut at LSU as the Tigers rolled to a 58-0 win over Western Carolina to open the 2000 season.

Russell Shined In Debut

LSU QB **JaMarcus Russell** shined in his much anticipated debut as the redshirt freshman started the second half and rallied the Tigers to an overtime win over Oregon State. Russell led the Tigers on two second half scoring drives, which included tossing a 38-yard TD pass to **Dwayne Bowe** with just over a minute left in the contest to pull the Tigers to within 15-13. Russell then tied the game with a two-point conversion that sent the game into overtime. In overtime, Russell suffered cramps to his legs and was forced out of the contest midway through LSU's possession. For the game, Russell completed 9 of 26 passes for 145 yards and 2 TDs.

Georgia Halts LSU's Streak Of Outrushing Opponents At 12 Straight

With 221 yards rushing against LSU, Georgia became the first team to outrush the Tigers since Florida did it on Oct. 11, 2003. Prior to the Georgia game, LSU had outrushed its opponent in 12 consecutive games. LSU got back on track by rushing for 210 yards against Florida, who had only 94 yards on the ground.

Spears Adds Sack To Run Career Total To 11; Oliver Still At 10

LSU senior DE **Marcus Spears** ran his career sack total to 11 against Oregon State. Spears, who also forced a fumble, recovered a fumble and broke up a pass against the Beavers, finished with 5 tackles against the Beavers. Spears is now just four sacks shy of tying Corey White for 10th place on LSU's career sack list with 15. DT **Melvin Oliver** has 10 career sacks to his credit. Rydell Melancon holds the school mark with 25 career sacks from 1980-83.

Green's Caught At Least 1 Pass In 20 Straight Games

LSU junior WR **Skyler Green** ran his streak of games with at least one reception to 20 straight games in which he has played on offense with 5 catches for 44 yards against Florida. Green, who did not play on offense in LSU's 3 previous games, returned to action against Georgia. As a matter of fact, Green caught at least 2 passes in 16 straight games, including all 14 of LSU's games in 2003. Green's career high for receptions came against Louisiana Tech with 9 receptions. For his career, Green has 65 receptions for 726 yards and 7 TDs.

Green Moves Into 9th Place On LSU Career Punt Return List

With a 12 yards in punt returns against Florida, **Skyler Green** ran his career total to 495 yards, which ranks 9th in school history. For his career, Green has returned 30 punts for 495 yards and 2 TDs. He's averaging 16.5 yards per return. Last year, Green led the nation in punt returns with 462 yards on 25 returns. Domanick Davis holds the school record with 1,126 yards on 94 returns from 1999-2002.

LSU senior C **Ben Wilkerson** and junior OT **Andrew Whitworth** have combined to start 71 games on the offensive line for the Tigers over the last 2-plus years. Whitworth has started every game over the last two years, while Wilkerson started all 13 games a year ago. Dating back to the 2001 season, Wilkerson has started 39 of LSU's last 42 games and the Tigers are 31-8 in those games.

LSU Ranks Ninth In Active NFL Players

With 33 former Tigers on active NFL rosters, LSU ranks ninth among all schools with former players currently in the NFL. Miami tops the list with 43 followed by Florida State with 39. Notre Dame and Tennessee are next with 38, followed by Florida, Georgia and Ohio State with 36 each. Michigan is next with 35, then LSU at 33.

Webster Named SEC Defensive Player of the Week

LSU CB **Corey Webster** earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week following his performance in the 51-0 win over Mississippi State. Webster, a senior from Vacherie, La., recorded two tackles, had an interception, forced a fumble and recovered a fumble in the Tiger shutout of the Bulldogs. Webster did most of his damage in the first quarter as he forced and recovered a fumble that led to LSU's second touchdown of the game. Three possessions later, Webster intercepted an Ommar Conner pass at the LSU 30-yard line. The Tigers scored seven plays later for a 20-0 lead. Webster's interception was his first of the season and 15th of his career, leaving him just five shy of tying Mike Williams for the school record of 20. The honor for Webster is the third time in his career that he's been recognized as the league's player of the week. Webster first won the award following a three interception game against Florida in 2002 and then again last year for his performance in LSU's 17-10 win over Georgia in September.

Tigers Pitch 5th Shutout Under Saban

LSU's 51-0 win over Mississippi State marked the fifth time under **Nick Saban** that the Tigers have held a team scoreless. The shutout against Mississippi State was the first for the Tigers since a 48-0 win over Louisiana-Lafayette on Oct. 5, 2002. Joe Lawrence at 27-years of age and **Andre Gill** at 26-years old are the two oldest members of the LSU football team. Lawrence, who is officially listed as a true freshman, is less than two-years younger than LSU defensive backs coach **Kirby Smart**. Lawrence spent eight years in pro baseball, while Gill spent time in the U.S. Armed Services.

Webster and Buckles Are Cap and Gown Tigers

LSU senior CB **Corey Webster** is not only an accomplished athlete on the field, but he's also done quite well in the classroom as he recently graduated with a degree in general studies. Webster is joined on the Tiger squad by LB **Dorsett Buckels**, who finished up his course work over the summer earning a degree in general studies.

I'd been warned prior to my first visit to Baton Rouge that the legendary Death Valley mystique was a myth. That assessment couldn't have been more wrong. Tiger Stadium was as loud as any I've ever heard during the dramatic fourth quarter of Saturday's Georgia game, the festivities surrounding it as advertised.

The streets were lined with purple and gold. Smoke emanated from the grills in the parking lot. Shouts of "Go Tigers" and "Tiger Bait" echoed from the stadium deep into the heart of campus.

And that was just Friday night. -- Stewart Mandel, SI.com (Sept. 21, 2003)

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 81st year in the venerable stadium on SATURDAY NIGHT.

• Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 26-5 HOME RECORD, including a 6-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 12-4 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 19-3 since Saban took over.

• LSU has won 14 OF ITS LAST 16 games at home, including a current six-game winning streak.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 30 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 21 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP FIVE IN THE NATION, including the last three.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 189-62-4 (.749) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 17-21-3 (.451) at home during the day in that span.

Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

Pair of QBs Lead LSU To 22-21 OT Win Over Oregon State

JaMarcus Russell started the comeback and then Marcus Randall finished it as the Tigers rallied from an 8-point deficit with less than two minutes remaining to force overtime and eventually beat Oregon State, 22-21, in Tiger Stadium in the season-opener for both teams. Trailing 9-0 at halftime, Russell replaced an ineffective Randall and pulled the Tigers to within 9-7 late in the third quarter on a 16-yard TD pass to Skyler Green. OSU answered with a 9-play, 65-yard drive to extend its margin to 15-7. The score remained that way until Russell rallied the Tigers on a 4-play, 64-yard drive capped with a 38-yard TD strike to Dwayne Bowe. Russell then converted the two-point conversion to tie the score at 15-15 with just over a minute left. In overtime and with Russell out with cramps, Randall returned to the field and scored on a 5-yard run to give LSU its first lead at 22-15. OSU followed with a TD of its own, however the extra-point attempt sailed wide right, the third missed PAT for the Beavers, and the Tigers escaped with a 22-21 win. For the game, Russell completed 9 of 26 passes for 145 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall was 7 of 18 for 66 yards and 1 interception. Vincent led the Tigers with 48 yards rushing, while Bowe caught 5 passes for 103 yards and a score.

Tigers Overpower Arkansas State, 53-3

Justin Vincent rushed for 102 yards and 2 TDs and three LSU quarterbacks combined to hit on 12 of 20 passes for 210 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers rolled to a 53-3 win over Arkansas State in Tiger Stadium. LSU wasted little time in establishing itself as the dominant team as the Tigers took the opening kickoff and marched 54 yards in 6 plays for a 7-0 lead following a 5-yard TD run by Vincent just two minutes into the contest. The Indians fumbled the ensuing kickoff and three plays later, Marcus Randall found Corey Webster for a 6-yard TD pass running the score to 13-0. From there, the route was on as the Tigers extended their lead to 23-0 after the first quarter and 37-0 at halftime. Arkansas State got on the board midway through the third quarter with a 34-yard field goal. LSU responded with a pair of touchdowns in a 3-minute span to stretch the lead to 50-3. Ryan Gaudet added a 33-yard field goal in the fourth quarter for the final margin. For the game, the Tigers limited ASU to just 54 yards rushing and only 201 yards of offense. JaMarcus Russell led all LSU quarterbacks by connecting on 7 of 11 passes for 151 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall hit on 5 of 7 for 59 yards and one score. Craig Davis led the Tigers with 4 catches for 73 yards, while Dwayne Bowe caught a pair of TD passes.

Auburn Scores Late To Hand LSU A 10-9 Defeat

Jason Campbell connected with Courtney Taylor on a 16-yard TD pass with just over a minute left to lift 14th-ranked Auburn to a 10-9 win over No. 4 LSU. The victory by Auburn snapped LSU's 10-game winning streak, one that dated back to a 33-7 win over South Carolina last October. The Auburn TD capped a contest that saw the LSU defense hold Auburn in check, limiting the Tigers to just 301 yards of offense, including only 131 yards on the ground. The LSU defense held Auburn's running back tandem of Carnell Williams (75 yards) and Ronnie Brown (67 yards) to 142 combined yards, 70 yards below their season average. LSU appeared to be in good shape early in the contest, taking the opening kickoff and marching 80 yards on 14 plays for a 6-0 lead following a Marcus Randall 9-yard TD pass to Dwayne Bowe. LSU's Ryan Gaudet pushed the PAT wide right, a point that would come back to haunt LSU. Auburn responded with a 14-play drive of its own that ended with a field goal. LSU, with JaMarcus Russell at QB, answered right back, going 55 yards on eight plays, capped with a 42-yard Chris Jackson field goal. That's all the scoring either team would get until the final minutes of the contest. LSU did have its chances in the second half, getting inside the Auburn 35-yard line twice, but the Tigers failed to capitalize on the opportunity. Alley Broussard led all running back with 84 yards on 10 carries, while Randall and Russell combined to hit on 12 of 28 passes for 168 yards and a TD.

Tigers Score Early And Often In 51-0 Rout Of Mississippi State

Alley Broussard scored a career-best 3 TDs, all in the first 17 minutes of the game, as the Tigers racked up 599 yards of offense in rolling to a 51-0 win over Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium. LSU set the tone early in the contest going 74 yards on 7 plays, five of which were runs, for a 7-0 lead just three minutes into the game. Following a MSU fumble on its first possession, the Tigers need only 6 plays to go 18 yards for a 14-0 lead midway through the first quarter. From there, the route was on as the Tigers built a 27-0 lead early in the second quarter following a 35-yard interception return for a TD by Marcus Spears. LSU led 34-0 at halftime. In the second half, the Tigers stretched the margin to 41-0 on an 8-yard run by QB JaMarcus Russell and then 48-0 on a 67-yard TD reception by Xavier Carter. For the contest, LSU picked up 31 first downs, while limiting MSU to just 7. LSU also held MSU to only 130 yards of offense, while intercepting a season-high 4 passes. The 51-point margin of victory was the biggest by LSU in an SEC game since a 61-6 win over Mississippi State in 1969. It was also LSU's first shutout since a 42-0 win over Mississippi State in 2001.

Greene Passes Georgia Past LSU, 45-16

David Greene threw 5 touchdown passes as third-ranked Georgia, behind a pair of first half LSU turnovers, raced out to a 24-0 lead midway through the second quarter and never looked back in a 45-16 win over the Tigers in Athens. Trailing 24-0, LSU mounted a rally that pulled the Tigers to within 24-10 at half-time. First, JaMarcus Russell guided the Tigers on a 7-play, 80-yard drive, capped with an 18-yard TD strike to Dwayne Bow with 1:23 left before halftime. After holding Georgia to three plays and out on its next series, the Tigers quickly moved 24 yards in two plays setting up a 31-yard field goal by Chris Jackson as time expired in the first half pulling LSU to within 24-10. With an apparent momentum swing towards LSU, the Tigers got the ball to start the second half and moved all the way to the UGA 34-yard line before the drive stalled out. From there, LSU could muster little offense as the Bulldogs stretched their lead to 31-10 at the 5:12 mark on a Greene-to-Fred Gibson pass. LSU wouldn't get any closer the rest of the way. The Tigers did close the contest with an 8-play, 80-yard TD drive engineered by QB Marcus Randall. For the contest, LSU managed only 314 yards of offense, compared to 430 for the Bulldogs. Russell led LSU by hitting on 9 of 17 passes for 131 yards and 1 TD, while Alley Broussard rushed for 45 yards in his first career start.

Randall, Addai Lead Tigers Past Florida, 24-21

Marcus Randall came off the bench to rally LSU from a 14-0 first quarter deficit to beat 12th-ranked Florida, 24-21, in Gainesville. Down 21-17 with just over two minutes left in the contest, Randall guided the Tigers on a 6-play, 50-yard drive, capped with a 10-yard scoring pass to Joseph Addai, for the come-from-behind win for the Tigers. Trailing 14-0 following a pair of first quarter interceptions that led to Florida scoring drives of 5 and 3-yards, Randall took over for an injured JaMarcus Russell. Randall pulled the Tigers to within 21-14 at half-time after engineering a pair of 80-yard scoring drives. Alley Broussard got the Tigers to within 14-7 on a 1-yard plunge early in the second quarter. Florida extended its lead to 21-7 with just over a minute left in the first half, before Randall engineered a 7-play, 80-yard drive, capped with a 15-yard TD pass to Early Doucet with 12 seconds left in the first half. Chris Jackson kicked a 47-yard field goal in the third quarter to get the Tigers to within 21-17 before a fourth quarter defensive struggle paved the way for LSU's last-minute comeback against the Gators. For the game, Randall connected on 18 of 27 passes for 198 and 2 TDs, while Addai led the Tigers with 93 yards rushing. Addai also caught 4 passes for 26 yards, including the game-winner. Offensively, the Tigers put up 464 yards (210 rushing, 254 passing) compared to just 236 (94 rushing, 142 passing) for the Gators.
