LSU Set To Battle Auburn in Tiger Stadium On ESPN

The nation's top rated rushing defense will face one of the countries best at running the football on Saturday as ninth-ranked LSU hosts 17th-ranked Auburn at 6:45 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised to a national audience by ESPN. LSU enters the contest with a 6-1 overall mark and a 3-1 Southeastern Conference record after Saturday's 33-7 win over South Carolina in Columbia. Auburn, winners of five straight, stands at 5-2 overall and leads the SEC Western Division with a 4-0 mark. The Tigers are coming off a 45-13 win over Mississippi State last week. LSU enters the contest ranked No. 1 in the nation in both scoring defense (9.9 point per game) and rushing defense (53.1 yards per game). Through seven games, LSU has yet to allow an opponent to reach the 100-yard mark in rushing yards and the Tigers have allowed only 16 first half points all season. In 28 quarters of football, LSU has held its opponent scoreless in 18 of those. LSU is coming off a game in which they held South Carolina to zero yards rushing, the fewest yards yielded to an SEC team by the Tigers since Ole Miss had minus-50 yards rushing in 1982. Offensively, the Tigers are averaging 34.4 points and 399.1 yards per game. QB **Matt Mauck** ranks second in the SEC with 12 passing touchdowns, while **Michael Clayton** (35 rec., 561 yards, 4 TDs) and **Devery Henderson** (30 rec., 429 yards, 5 TDs) rank among the league leaders in receiving.

Tigers Ride Freshman Running Backs to 33-7 Win Over South Carolina

True freshman running backs **Justin Vincent**, **Alley Broussard** and **Barrington Edwards** combined to rush for 222 yards and 2 TDs and quarterback **Matt Mauck** connected on 24 of 30 passes for 199 yards and 2 scores as 10th-ranked LSU rolled past South Carolina, 33-7, in Columbia. Playing without its two starting running backs in **Joseph Addai** and **Shyrone Carey**, who were both out with knee injuries, the Tigers rushed for a season-high 263 yards on 52 carries. LSU finished with 482 yards of offense, while holding South Carolina to only 254 yards of offense, including zero rushing yards. LSU jumped out to a 19-0 first half lead and never looked back in cruising to the victory. LSU had first half drives of 21-plays and 97 yards and 14-plays and 91 yards that both culminated in touchdowns, the second of which gave LSU a 19-0 lead on a 1-yard run by Vincent just before halftime. South Carolina pulled to within 19-7 after a 77-yard TD early in the third quarter before LSU linebacker **Jason LeDoux** put the game out of reach with a 15-yard fumble return for a touchdown later in the quarter. Vincent added another 1-yard run midway through the fourth quarter for LSU's final point. Broussard led LSU with 108 yards rushing on 19 attempts, while Vincent had 77 yards and 2 TDs rushing and added another 46 yards receiving on four receptions.

The Series

LSU and Auburn meet for the 38th time on Saturday with LSU holding a slight 19-17-1 advantage in the series that dates back to 1901 ... Of all of LSU's series vs. SEC teams, its series vs. Auburn is the most tightly contested with only a 2-game difference in the win-loss column between the squads ... Auburn won the first meeting between the teams, 28-0, in Baton Rouge in 1901 ... After playing only seven times in the 1970s and 80s, the teams have met every year since 1992 ... Since 1992, Auburn has won seven of the 11 games between the teams, including last year's 31-7 victory in Auburn ... The last time the teams played in Baton Rouge, LSU posted a 27-14 win to clinch the SEC Western Division title in 2001 ... LSU owns a 10-5-1 mark vs. Auburn in games played in Baton Rouge ... In games between 1988 and 1997, the contest was decided by a touchdown or less seven times (in eight games) ... Since then, the winner has won by at least 12 points each time ... LSU coach **Nick Saban** is 1-2 vs. Auburn.

Nick Saban

HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right leader to lead it. Entering his fourth year as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban is that leader.

Since taking over in Baton Rouge in 2000, Saban has transformed the LSU football program into one that wins championships, while graduating players at the same time.

Equipped with a plan that gives his players the best chance to be successful on the field as well as in the classroom, Saban's impact on the program has been immediate and it's been powerful.

In just three years as LSU's head coach, Saban's on-field success has been nothing short of remarkable, as he's guided the Tigers to 26 victories, a pair of bowl wins, including one in the Bowl Championship Series, and the 2001 Southeastern Conference title. The Tigers have also played in back-to-back New Year's Day bowls for the first time since the 1960s.

On top of LSU's success on the gridiron, the Tigers are being recognized for their efforts in the classroom. Currently, all 22 of the Tiger seniors from the 2002 team are on pace to graduate within the next 12 months, while Rodney Reed earned First Team Academic All-America honors and Bradie James was awarded an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation last year.

Off the field, Saban and his players are active in the community, promoting goodwill by participating in such things as community service projects and visiting hospitals and schools in the Baton Rouge area on a regular basis. Saban has also worn the hat of fundraiser during his stay in Baton Rouge as he spearheaded an effort that raised more than \$15 million for a state-of-the-art academic center for student-athletes. The new Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is part of Saban's plan to give his players the best opportunity to be successful when they finish their football careers. The center, which spans 54,000 square feet, is the best of its kind and features 100 computers, a 1,000-seat auditorium, a library and a communications center for training student-athletes.

Saban became the 31st head coach of the LSU Tigers on November 30, 1999, after five years as head coach at Michigan State.

He didn't waste anytime making his impact felt as he guided a team coming off back-to-back losing seasons to an 8-4 mark and a win over 15th-ranked Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl in 2000 to rekindle the fire of a proud football tradition in Baton Rouge.

A year later in 2001, Saban guided the Tigers to their first outright SEC title since 1986 with a 31-20 win over second-ranked Tennessee in the SEC Championship game. LSU followed that with a 47-34 victory over Illinois in the Sugar Bowl to cap a 10-3 season for the Tigers.

Last year, Saban guided the Tigers to an 8-5 overall mark and a share of the SEC Western Division title. The Tigers also played in a New Year's Day bowl game for the second consecutive year, a first for LSU since the 1960's, with an appearance in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five seasons.

This Week

LSU returns to Tiger Stadium on Saturday as the ninth-ranked Tigers face 17th-ranked Auburn at 6:45 p.m. The contest will be televised to a national audience by ESPN. The game will mark LSU's sixth appearance on national television this year. LSU is 3-1 at home this year with the lone loss coming to Florida on Oct. 11 by a 19-7 count. LSU enters the contest with a 6-1 overall mark and a 3-1 league record. The 6-1 start matches LSU's start from a year ago. A win on Saturday vs. Auburn would give LSU's its best start since going 7-0-1 to open the 1987 season. LSU will also be looking for consecutive 4-1 SEC starts, a first for the Tigers since 1986-88 when those teams each won four of their first five conference games.

In The Polls

The Tigers climbed one spot in each of the national polls this week, moving from No. 10 to No. 9 in both the Associated Press Top 25 and the USA Today/ESPN poll. LSU has now spent five straight weeks in the AP Top 25, the longest stretch for the Tigers since the 1987 team was ranked in the top 10 all season. The Tigers are in their sixth week in the top 10 in the coaches poll. As far as the BCS standings are concerned, LSU opened at No. 12 in this week's poll, the first week of the poll for the 2003 season.

About Auburn

The Tigers are 5-2 overall and lead the SEC Western Division with a 4-0 mark ... Auburn has won five straight games since opening the season with back-to-back losses to Southern Cal and Georgia Tech ... Auburn is ranked No. 17 in the AP poll and No. 21 in the coaches poll ... The Tigers enter the contest averaging 202.3 yards rushing a contest, the second-highest average in the SEC ... They are led by Camell "Cadillac" Williams, who is averaging 101.9 yards rushing a game ... Brandon Jacobs is second on the squad with 54.6 yards per contest ... QB Jason Campbell has completed 89 of 145 passes for 1,127 yards and 5 TDs ... He has only thrown 3 interceptions all season ... Defensively, Auburn is led by LBs Karlos Dansby (46 tackles, 4 sacks) and Dontarrious Thomas (41 tackles, 6 TFL) ... The Tigers are allowing only 12.4 points per game and they rank third in the SEC and eighth in the nation in total defense (277.7 yards per game) ... Auburn is coached by Tommy Tuberville, who has a 2-1 mark vs. **Nick Saban** and a 5-3 mark against LSU.

It's ESPN for LSU-Auburn Matchup

LSU and Auburn meet again in what seems to have become an annual television event for ESPN. Prior to last year, ESPN televised the LSU-Auburn game for six straight years from 1996-2001. Last year, Jefferson Pilot televised the 31-7 Auburn victory from Jordan-Hare Stadium. In the six LSU-Auburn games that ESPN has televised between 1996 and 2001, each team has won three games. The Auburn contest will be LSU's first game on ESPN this year. LSU is 21-19 all-time on ESPN, which includes a 4-3 mark under **Nick Saban**.

Expect The Unexpected When LSU And Auburn Meet

Since 1988, the LSU-Auburn series has become one of close calls and one in which the teams and the fans have come to expect the unexpected. The following is a listing of some of the notable happenings in the series since 1988:

1988: LSU's **Tommy Hodson** hit **Eddie Fuller** in the back of the endzone on fourth down with 1:41 left to lift the Tigers to a 7-6 win over fourth-ranked Auburn. The noise from the stadium crowd after the play registered on a seismograph across campus prompting the game to be titled "**The Earthquake Game.**"

1994: Auburn intercepted five passes in the fourth quarter, returning three for TDs as the Tigers rally to post a 30-26 win over LSU in a game that become known as "**The Interception Game.**"

1995: LSU donned white jerseys at home for the first time since the early 1980's and promptly went out and upset fifth-ranked Auburn, 12-6. LSU preserved the win with an interception in the endzone on the last play of the game. The contest was dubbed the "**Bring Back the Magic**" game.

1996: With the old Auburn Sports Arena burning to the ground a couple hundred yards away, LSU beat Auburn, 19-15, in a game titled "**The Night the Barn Burned.**"

1997: Titled "**The Comeback**", Auburn QB **Dameyune Craig** engineered a 10-play, 80-yard drive late in the fourth quarter to spark the Tigers to a 31-28 upset of 10th-ranked LSU.

Win One For JB

The LSU football team has dedicated the 2003 season to longtime equipment manager **Jeff Boss**, who was diagnosed with brain cancer last January. Several members of the team, along with coach **Nick Saban**, presented coach Boss with a game ball from the Louisiana-Monroe game on Sept. 12 at his home. The ULM game was the first time in 24 years that coach Boss was not on the sidelines for an LSU contest. Then, on Sept. 29, LSU named its football locker room in Boss' honor with a formal ceremony that saw dozens of former Tiger football players, covering three decades, attend. In addition, the team will wear the letters "JB" on their helmets for the remainder of the season.

The LSU Injury Report

The Tigers added another player to the injury list last week as sophomore OG **Nate Livings** went down with an injury to his right knee in the first half against South Carolina. Livings did not return to the game. Livings is expected to miss 4-6 weeks of action with the injury. The Tigers are still without the services running backs

this week as **Shyrone Carey** and **Joseph Addai**. Carey, who has practiced this week, has missed the last two games with a sprained medial collateral ligament in his left knee, while Addai suffered the same injury to his left knee on Oct. 11 against Florida. Addai is out for the Auburn game, while Carey's availability will be a game time decision.

Just How Loud Is Tiger Stadium?

We'll find out on Saturday as three students from LSU's Physics and Astronomy Department will be on the sidelines to get a reading as the decibel level of the Tiger Stadium crowd. The loudest recorded reading from Tiger Stadium came at the Alabama game in 1996 when a 117 decibel level reading was recorded. While it is believed that LSU's game against Auburn in 1988 had a higher decibel reading, the only official reading from that game came on the seismograph machine across campus in the Geology Department. The following figures are example of decibel level readings, courtesy of Jim Giammonco from LSU's Physics and Astronomy Department:

Tigers Look For Best Start After 8 Games Since 1987

A win on Saturday against Auburn would give LSU a 7-1 record and it would mark the best start for the Tigers after eight games since the 1987 team opened with a 7-0-1 mark. Incidentally, the 1987 squad is the last LSU team to spend at least five straight weeks ranked in the top 10. The 1987 team was ranked in the top 10 all season as they posted a 10-1-1 mark under Mike Archer and beat South Carolina, 30-13, in the Gator Bowl.

LSU Looks For Back-To-Back 4-1 SEC Starts

A win on Saturday would also give the Tigers a 4-1 conference start for the second straight year. That is something that hasn't been accomplished since the late 1980's when the Tigers won four of their first five league games from 1986-88.

LSU-Auburn Ties

There are plenty of LSU-Auburn ties as the Tigers have three coaches who either played or coached at Auburn. LSU offensive coordinator **Jimbo Fisher** coached some of the finest quarterbacks in Auburn history from 1993-98. LSU defensive coordinator **Will Muschamp** served as a graduate assistant at Auburn from 1995-97, while offensive line coach **Stacy Searels** was a First Team All-America lineman, a four-year letter-winner and a three-year starter for Auburn from 1984-87. In addition, LSU's Director of Football Operations **Sam Nader** played quarterback for Auburn in the mid-1960s, earning a letter in 1967.

True Frosh RBs To The Rescue

With LSU's top two running backs sitting out of the game, the Tigers turned to a trio of true freshman running backs to carry the load against South Carolina and they delivered. **Justin Vincent** became the first true freshman to start at running back for LSU since Kevin Faulk in 1995 and he responded with 77 yards and 2 TDs on 16 carries. Vincent added 46 yards receiving on 4 catches. **Alley Broussard** became the first true freshman to rush for 100 yards in a single-game for the Tigers since Domanick Davis gained 109 yards on Sept. 11, 1999 against North Texas. Broussard finished with 108 yards, including a long run of 33 yards, on 19 carries for a 5.7 average. **Barrington Edwards**, the third of LSU's true freshman, rushed for 37 yards on eight carries. In all, the three freshmen rushed for 222 yards and 2 TDs on 43 attempts. So far this season, Vincent leads all LSU freshmen with 209 yards and 4 TDs on 46 carries, while Broussard has 116 yards on 30 attempts and Edwards 84 yards on 19 attempts.

LSU Defense Continues Its Dominance; Tigers Rated No. 1 Against The Run And In Scoring

The Tiger defense continues to be not only one of the best in the SEC, but one of the top units in the nation. After Saturday's 33-7 win over South Carolina, LSU moved to No. 1 in the nation in two defensive categories - rushing defense and scoring defense. LSU is allowing only 9.9 points per game and they are yielding just 53.1 yards rushing a contest. Through seven games, LSU has allowed only 69 points, with just 16 of those coming in the first half. LSU is limiting its opponent to only 1.9 yards per carry as they have held their first seven opponents to 372 yard rushing on 196 attempts.

LSU Starting Defense Has Yet To Allow A Rushing TD

LSU's starting defense enters the Auburn game not only as the nation's best against the run, but the starting unit has yet to allow a rushing TD this season. Through seven games, the Tigers have allowed only 2 rushing TDs all season. The first rushing TD came in the fourth quarter vs. UL-Monroe and the second came a week later with four minutes left in the game in a 59-13 win over Arizona.

That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach **Nick Saban** has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In his fourth season at LSU, Saban has put together a 20-5 mark at home, which includes a 10-4 record in SEC games. Under Saban, the Tigers are 5-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium. LSU's 18 wins over Saban's first three years in Baton Rouge is the most over a three-year period for LSU in Tiger Stadium since the Tigers won 18 homes games from 1972-74.

Taking Notes On The Tigers Under Saban

Here is a look at some notable LSU trends during its first 45 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 27-2 when leading at halftime and 25-2 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 30-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 29-0 when scoring 25 or more points ... On the other hand, LSU is 2-10 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 8-2 in games decided by 7 points or less and 3-1 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 20-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing and the Tigers are 13-0 when having a 100-yard rusher.

LSU Holds South Carolina To Zero Rushing Yards

For the first time in over 20 years, LSU held an opponent to no rushing yards as South Carolina accounted for zero yards rushing on 17 attempts last week. The zero rushing yards were the fewest allowed by LSU since 1982 when the Tigers held Ole Miss to minus-50 yards rushing in a 45-8 win on Oct. 30. Through seven games this year, LSU has yet to allow an opponent to rush for 100 yards in a game. The last team to rush for 100 yards vs. LSU was Texas (113 yards) in last year's Cotton Bowl. Arkansas' Fred Talley (118 yards) is the last individual to rush for 100 yards in a game against LSU as he did it in Week 12 last year. Florida rushed for 81 yards against LSU on Oct. 11 to become the first team to beat LSU under **Nick Saban** despite gaining less than 100 yards rushing. The Tigers are 20-1 under Saban when holding their opponent to less than 100 yards rushing.

Tiger Defense Continues To Be Spectacular In All Phases

Whether it's against the pass or the run, the Tiger defense has been one of the best all-around units in the SEC. LSU is ranked either Nos. 1 or 2 in the SEC in seven of 10 categories, including leading the conference in four categories. LSU leads the league and the nation in scoring defense (9.9 points per game), rush defense (53.3 yards per game), the Tigers are first in the SEC and sixth in the nation in pass efficiency defense (95.0 rating) and they are first in the conference in sacks with 22.

LSU's Been Good At Getting The Defense Off The Field On 3rd Down

A week after giving up its highest third-down percentage of the season to Florida, LSU rebounded and made life on third-down difficult for South Carolina last week as the Gamecocks converted just 5 of 14 attempts. For the year, LSU leads the SEC in opponents' third-down conversion percentage at 26.2 percent. In 107 third-down attempts this season, LSU has allowed its opponent to have success on 28 of those tries.

Tiger Defense Still Tough To Score On

In seven games this year, LSU has yielded only 69 points to its opponents. The 69 points is the fewest by an LSU team since the 1985 squad held its first seven opponents to 57 points. Last year, through seven games LSU had allowed 77 points.

Tigers Rebound Again Under Saban After A Loss

One thing is certain and that is LSU does a good job of bouncing back after a loss under **Nick Saban**. After the 33-7 win over South Carolina, LSU is now 10-3 under Saban after a loss. LSU has lost back-to-back games under Saban only three times. LSU is 4-0 under Saban when the game following a loss comes on the road - LSU beat Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl following a loss to Arkansas in 2000; LSU beat Alabama in Tuscaloosa following a home loss to Ole Miss in 2001; the Tigers beat Kentucky in Lexington following a loss to Auburn in 2002; LSU beat South Carolina in Columbia following a loss to Florida in 2003.

LSU Secures Second Straight Winning Season vs. SEC Eastern Division

LSU's win over South Carolina gave the Tigers a winning record vs. the SEC Eastern Division for the second straight year and the third time in four years under **Nick Saban**. The Tigers were 2-1 vs. the East this year. LSU had won six straight against the East before Florida snapped the streak on Saturday. The last time LSU had a winning record against the SEC East in back-to-back seasons came in 1996-97. In all, Saban has an 9-4 mark vs. the SEC East, which includes a 31-20 win over Tennessee in the SEC Championship game in 2001. Prior to Saban's arrival and since the SEC went to divisions in 1992, LSU posted a 6-17-1 vs. the East from 1992 to 1999.

Skylar Green Makes Most of Punt Returns

Skylar Green has made the most of his opportunities in returning punts this year as the sophomore has returned two of his six punts returns for TDs, including an 80-yarder against Florida. On the first punt return of his career against Arizona, Green raced 62 yards for a touchdown. Green is the first player since Todd Kinchen

in 1991 to have two punt returns for TDs in the same season and he's one shy of tying the school mark of 3 set by Pinky Rohm in 1937. Through six games, Green has returned 6 punts for 200 yards, an average of 33.3 yards a return.

Clayton Joins The 2,000-Yard Club

Michael Clayton, a junior WR, became only the fifth player in LSU history to record 2,000 receiving yards in a career as he went over the mark against Florida. Clayton currently ranks fifth in school history with 2,064 receiving yards. He is also fifth in LSU history in receptions with 139, sixth in receiving TDs with 15 and seventh in career 100-yard receiving games with six. With 35 catches for 561 this year, Clayton is only 139 yards from becoming the first player at LSU with at least 700 yards receiving in each of his first three seasons. Clayton had 754 yards on 47 catches as a freshman and he followed that with 749 yards on 57 catches last year.

Donnie Jones Adds His Name To Another LSU Punting Record

Donnie Jones now holds two of LSU's three career punting records as the Baton Rouge native holds the school mark in punting yards (8,331) and total punts (198). In four years with the Tigers, Jones has a total of 8,331 punting yards, which broke the mark of 7,976 held by Chad Kessler (1994-967). In LSU's game against Mississippi State, Jones broke Kessler's career punts mark. For his career, Jones has punted 198 times for an average of 42.1 yards per kick, a figure that ranks second to Kessler's 42.9 career average.

Throwing To The Tight Ends

LSU's tight ends are just for blocking as the rotation of **Eric Edwards**, **David Jones**, **Keith Zinger** and **Demetri Robinson** have caught their share of passes this season. The foursome have accounted for 19 receptions for 218 yards and 1 TD. Edwards leads all LSU tight ends with 10 catches for 91 yards and 1 TD. Against South Carolina, LSU tight ends caught nine passes, that's the most in a single-game for that position in LSU history. Edwards led the way with 5 receptions for 37 yards and 1 TD. The 5 receptions by Edwards was the most by an LSU tight end since Robert Royal caught 5 passes for 72 yards against Utah State in 2001.

Mauck Starts Another TD Streak

After having his streak of consecutive games with a TD pass snapped at nine against Florida, QB **Matt Mauck** got started on another streak, throwing for a pair of touchdown passes vs. South Carolina. In 13 career starts, Mauck has thrown at least one TD pass in 10 games. The nine straight games with at least one TD pass was the longest streak by a Tiger since Herb Tyler did it in 12 straight games covering the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

TD-Less First Half Streak Comes To An End Against Florida

LSU's streak of keeping its opponent out of the endzone in the first half came to an end against Florida as the Gators became the first team this year to score a first half touchdown against the Tigers. Florida's first quarter TD marked the first time LSU had given up an offensive TD since last year's Cotton Bowl when Texas scored a pair of second quarter touchdowns against the Tigers. Through seven games, LSU has allowed only 16 first half points for an average of 2.3 points per game. Dating back to last year, LSU has had its opponents scoreless in the first half in seven of its last nine games.

LSU Buckles Down In The Redzone

The Tiger defense is holding its opponents to a staggering 46.2 percent scoring success rate when they get inside the LSU redzone. South Carolina did not have any redzone opportunities against LSU. Against Florida, the Gators had one redzone opportunity stopped at the 1-yard line when **Brandon Washington** forced a fumble that was recovered by **Adrian Mayes**. The Tigers also held the Gators to a field goal on another redzone chance in the second quarter. LSU also held Georgia to just three points despite three trips inside the redzone against the Tigers in a 17-10 win over the Bulldogs on Sept. 20.

Tigers Still Rank No. 2 In SEC In Scoring

LSU still ranks second in the SEC in scoring as the Tigers are averaging 34.4 points a contest as they have scored 241 points through the first seven games of the season. The 241 points by the Tigers are the most for an LSU team since the 1977 team scored 259 points over its first seven games. The 1977 team still holds the school record for most points in a season with 375.

How About Those Special Teams

A quick check of the special teams categories in the SEC shows that LSU leads the league in punt returns (15.4), and rank second in kickoff returns (25.8), kickoff coverage (17.2), and net punting (40.2). LSU ranks seventh in the nation in kickoff returns, eighth in punt returns and 14th in net punting.

Tigers Rank Second In SEC In Interceptions

Despite not picking off a pass in its last two games, LSU still ranks second in the SEC in interceptions with 10. Florida leads the league with 14 interceptions. The Tigers have made the most of their interceptions as two have been returned for TDs (**Jack Hunt** 31 yards vs. UL-Monroe and **Travis Daniels** 48 yards vs. Miss. State) and another was returned to the opponent's 1-yard line. Of the 10 interceptions for LSU in 2003, four have resulted in a TD for the Tigers (2 by the defense and 2 by the offense). **Corey Webster** leads the Tigers with three interceptions, followed by Travis Daniels and Jack Hunt with two each.

The Defense Scores Again

For the third time this year, LSU's defense scored points in a game as senior linebacker **Jason LeDoux** picked up a fumble by South Carolina quarterback Dondrial Pinkins and rumbled 15 yards for a touchdown. LSU's defense has now scored against Louisiana-Monroe (**Jack Hunt** 31-yard interception return), against Mississippi State (**Travis Daniels** 48-yard interception return) and South Carolina. The three defensive TDs matches last year's total of three for the Tigers as LSU returned three interceptions for touchdowns in 2002.

Go Figure

Between 1997 and Nov. 16, 2002, LSU failed to reach 20 points in an SEC contest 15 times. The Tigers lost all 15 of those games. Dating back to last year's Ole Miss game on Nov. 23, LSU has now won two of its last four SEC games when failing to reach the 20-point mark. Last year, LSU beat Ole Miss 14-13 for its final SEC victory and the Tigers opened up conference play this year with a 17-10 victory over Georgia. Prior to last year's win over Ole Miss, LSU had not won an SEC game when scoring less than 20 points since a 7-6 victory over Vanderbilt in 1997. You have to go all the way back to 1993 to find a two-game span when the Tigers won SEC games despite failing to reach 20 points. That year, LSU beat Ole Miss, 19-17 and then followed with a 17-13 win over Alabama. LSU also beat Mississippi State 18-16 that year.

Saban Knows Pass Efficiency

One thing that LSU coach **Nick Saban** did over the summer was research pass efficiency and how a quarterback's efficiency related to wins and losses. Saban said the research proved that the quarterback with the better pass efficiency in a game usually leads his team to a victory. So far that has proven to be true as the Tigers have won all six games in which their quarterback pass efficiency was better than its opponent. The one time that the opponent had the better efficiency (Florida), the Tigers lost. Currently, LSU ranks second in the league and 16th in the nation in pass efficiency with a 147.2 rating. **Matt Mauck** is third in the SEC with a 142.8 QB rating.

Tigers Have Experience on the O-Line

The LSU offensive line has been touted as one of the best in the nation. The Tiger offensive line may be one of the most experienced as the LSU front five have 126 career starts between them. **Rodney Reed** leads the way with 41, followed by **Stephen Peterman** with 32, **Ben Wilkerson** with 26 and **Andrew Whitworth** 20. **Nate Livings** has started all 7 games this season. LSU is 20-5 when Reed, Peterman and Wilkerson start on the offensive line together (8-0 in 2001, 6-4 in 2002, 6-1 in 2003).

Tigers Keep Opponents To Less Than 20 Points For 25th Time Under Saban

By holding South Carolina to only 7 points, the Tigers have now limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 26 of the 44 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 23-3 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 26 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 13 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted four shutouts under Saban.

Clayton, Henderson, and Green... A Nice 1-2-3 Punch At Wide Receiver

One thing is for certain and that is if defenses key too much on **Michael Clayton**, then **Devery Henderson** will make them pay. Focus on Henderson, then Clayton takes over. Concentrate on Henderson and Clayton and then **Skyler Green** will take over. At least that's how it's been over the first seven games of the year. Clayton, Henderson and Green have combined for 87 catches for 1,265 yards and 12 TDs for the Tigers. Clayton has gone over 100 yards three times this year, while Henderson has done it twice. Clayton has led LSU in both yards and catches in three games, while Henderson and Green have each done it twice. Clayton ranks third in the league in receptions per game (5.0), while Henderson is fifth with 4.29 a contest. Clayton is third in the SEC in yards per game (80.1) and Henderson is seventh at 61.3 yard a contest. Clayton leads the team with 35 receptions for 561 yards and 4 TDs, with Henderson second with 30 receptions for 429 yards and 5 scores and Green next with 22 catches for 275 yards and 3 TDs.

Open Wide

QB **Matt Mauck's** spent Monday, Oct. 6 taking the Dental Admissions Test. Mauck, who also considered pursuing a career in medicine, has now opted to becoming a dentist. Mauck, who carries a 3.8 grade point average, will graduate in December with a degree in kinesiology.

Mauck Picks Apart South Carolina Defense

Matt Mauck reset his career high for completions for the second time this year, connecting on 24 of 30 attempts vs. South Carolina. The 24 completions bettered his previous high of 23 set against Western Illinois in the Week 3 this year. Against South Carolina, Mauck connected on his first five and 11 of his first 12 passes. Mauck was 14 of 17 at halftime and 20 of 25 at the end of the third quarter.

Mauck Ties LSU Record With 17 Straight Completions

Matt Mauck played perhaps the best game of his career in the Sept. 13 game vs. Western Illinois. Lost in his overall numbers was the fact that he tied an LSU record by completing 17 straight passes over a two game span. Mauck completed his final 10 passes in LSU's 59-13 win over Arizona on Sept. 6 and he followed that by completing 7 straight vs. Western Illinois. The 17 straight completions ties the mark set by Rohan Davey, who completed 6 straight vs. Arkansas to close the 1999 season and then opened the 2000 season by hitting 11 straight vs. Western Carolina.

Mauck Has Career Night In Win over Western Illinois

Matt Mauck put together a career night vs. Western Illinois as the junior from Jasper, Ind., posted a then career-high of 23 completions to go with career-bests for yards (305) and TDs (4). For the contest, Mauck connected on his first seven passes and went on to complete 23 of 35 passes. He became LSU's first 300-yard passer since Rohan Davey tossed for 444 yards vs. Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. The four TD were the most by an LSU player since Josh Booty threw 4 TD passes in a win over Alabama in 2000.

Run Skyler Run

In seven games this year, **Skyler Green** has touched the ball in a variety of ways. He's rushed twice for 24 yards, he's caught 22 passes for 275 yards, he's returned six punts for 200 yards and he's returned four kick-offs for 89 yards. In all, Green has touched the ball 34 times and he's accounted for 588 yards for an average of 17.3 yards every time he gets his hands on the ball. Green has also accounted for 5 TDs, including the game-winner vs. Georgia. Green puts the ball in the endzone every 6.8 times he touches the ball, the highest ratio on the team. To date, he's recorded three receiving TDs and he's returned two punts for touchdowns.

100-150-300 vs. Western Illinois A Rarity For Tigers

LSU's trio of QB **Matt Mauck**, RB **Shyrone Carey** and WR **Michael Clayton** combined for a rarity vs. Western Illinois on Sept. 13. Carey rushed for 124 yards, Clayton caught passes netting 162 yards and Mauck threw for 305 yards as the trio became just the fourth group in school history to have 100-yards rushing, 150-yards receiving and 300-yard passing in the same game. The last time the Tigers had a 100-yard rusher, a 150-yard receiver and a 300-yard passer in the same contest came against Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. In that game, Domanick Davis rushed for 122 yards, Josh Reed had 239 yards receiving and Rohan Davey threw for 444 yards. The other two times came in 2001 as well as the Tigers did it against Kentucky (Toefield 129 rushing, Reed 160 receiving, Davey 383 passing) and then against vs. Arkansas (Toefield 173 rushing, Reed 183 receiving, Davey 359 passing).

100 On The Ground And 100 Through The Air

Against Western Illinois, LSU had its first 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver in the same game since the Sugar Bowl in January of 2002. Against Western Illinois, **Shyrone Carey** rushed for 124 yards, while **Michael Clayton** caught 11 passes for 162 yards. It's the first time the Tigers have accomplished that feat since Domanick Davis rushed for 122 yards and Josh Reed had 239 receiving yards vs. Illinois. In addition, Clayton had 120 yards receiving in that Sugar Bowl contest vs. Illinois.

Tiger Defense Continues To Be Stingy

Through 28 quarters this season, LSU's defense has held the opponent out of the endzone in 18 of those. Florida became the first team since Kentucky last year to score an offensive TD in the first quarter against the Tigers. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had allowed only 3 first half points all season, that being a field goal vs. Georgia in Week 4. In all, the Tigrs have held all seven of its opponents this year to less than 20 points, something that hasn't been done at LSU since 1972.

Mauck Win Streak Snapped At 10 Straight

Matt Mauck's winning streak as LSU's starter quarterback came to an end at 10 straight with the loss to Florida. Mauck, who is 11-2 as LSU's starting quarterback, had not lost a game since his first start vs. Virginia Tech in last year's season-opener. Mauck's 10-1 start was the best by an LSU QB since Herb Tyler won 10 of his first 11, including his first eight, as a starter from 1995-96. In addition, Mauck has played in 16 games in his LSU career and the Tigers are 13-3 in those contests.

Webster Nabs 10th Career Interception

He was a basketball superstar in high school. He came to LSU as a wide receiver and played there for a year before moving to the secondary. Now, in just his second season as a starter at CB Corey Webster has already

moved up to seventh place in school history in interceptions after recording the 10th career pick vs. Georgia. The interception, which made Webster look more like a magician, came with just over a minute left in the contest and sealed LSU's 17-10 win over Georgia. The pick was the third of the year for Webster, who ranks second in the SEC and 20th nationally in the category. Webster began his career at LSU as a WR, catching seven passes for 74 yards in 12 games as a freshman. In 20 games on defense, Webster has 10 interceptions for 98 yards and 1 TD.

The Long Ball

LSU has scored on plays of 40 yards or longer in three of its six games this year. While the Tigers did not have offensive scoring plays of at least 40 yards in their last three games, they did come close on two occasions. Against Georgia, **Matt Mauck** hit **Skyler Green** for a 34-yard TD late in the fourth quarter in what was the game winner for the Tigers. A week later, Mauck connected with **Devery Henderson** for a 36-yard TD pass to start the third quarter scoring for the Tigers. This year, LSU has thrown 14 TD passes with five of those going for at least 40 yards. Mauck has three TD passes of at least 40 yards this year, while backup QB **Marcus Randall** has accounted for the other two. Last year, the Tigers had just three touchdown passes from over 40 yards, with two of those coming in the Kentucky game.

Saban Gets Win No. 32 at LSU and No. 75 Overall

LSU coach **Nick Saban** moved past Mike Archer into sole possession of sixth place in school history in wins with his 28th victory in the Tigers' win over Arizona. Saban picked up win No. 32 vs. South Carolina, tying Gerry DiNardo for fifth place at LSU. In just over three years with LSU, Saban has posted a 32-13 overall mark. Saban also has 75 career victories. In his 10th season overall, Saban has put together an overall record of 75-39-1. Charles McClendon holds the school-record with 137 victories in 19 years as LSU's head coach.

Saban Adds Another Notch To SEC Belt

With the win over Georgia on Sept. 20, LSU coach **Nick Saban** has now recorded at least one win over all but one SEC team. The only team Saban has yet to beat in the only team he hasn't faced - Vanderbilt. In just over three years at LSU, Saban has recorded 18 SEC victories - 19 counting the SEC title game in 2001. Saban has four wins over Mississippi State, three over Kentucky, two each against Alabama, Ole Miss, South Carolina and Tennessee and one over Georgia, Auburn, Florida, and Arkansas. Saban's current SEC mark, which includes regular-season games only, stands at 18-10.

Tigers Are Now 13-3 In Non-Conference Games Under Saban

After the win over Western Illinois, LSU moved its non-conference record under **Nick Saban** to 13-3. The Tigers were 3-1 in non-league games in 2000, followed by a 4-0 mark in 2001 and a 3-2 record last year. Included in the 13 non-SEC wins over the last three-plus years for the Tigers are bowl victories over Georgia Tech and Illinois.

Jimbo Keeps Spreading It Around In The Passing Game

LSU offensive coordinator **Jimbo Fisher** has done a good job keeping opposing defenses off balance when it comes to the passing game. Through 7 games this year, LSU has had at 14 players catch at least one pass. Against South Carolina, nine different Tigers caught at least one pass and of the 26 LSU completions, 12 went to wide receivers, 9 went to tight ends and 5 went to running backs.

Clayton Runs Streak To 33 Straight Games

LSU WR **Michael Clayton** ran his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 33 after recording 2 catches vs. South Carolina. Clayton has caught at least one pass in every game in which he has played during his career.

Tigers Have Block Party vs. Western Illinois

LSU recorded both a blocked field goal and as well as a blocked punt against Western Illinois. **Travis Daniels** blocked the punt, which was the first for the Tigers since the 1999 game against Mississippi State, while **Chad Lavalais** blocked the field goal attempt. The blocked field goal was the first for LSU since 1998 when Arnold Miller blocked a kick against Notre Dame.

True Freshmen On The Field

Through seven games, LSU has now played 14 true freshmen. LSU opened the season by playing 11 true freshmen against UL-Monroe and then 12 played against Arizona. Reed Among Nation's Elite In Starts on Offensive Line

Senior OT **Rodney Reed** started his 41st straight game vs. South Carolina. Reed's 41 career starts ranks as the seventh-highest total among active Division I players. Marshall's Nate McPeck leads the way with 46 career starts.

Pancakes Are Breakfast of Choice For LSU O-Line

A new wrinkle to this year's offensive grade sheet is the tracking of both pancakes and knockdowns for the LSU offensive line. Through 7 games **Andrew Whitworth** leads the Tigers with 13 pancakes. Offensive guard **Stephen Peterman** is tops among the Tigers with 75 knockdowns.

Carey and Green Fill In Nicely For Domanick

A concern for LSU heading into the season was how to replace the departed Domanick Davis, the school's all-time leader in both punt return and kickoff return yards. The duo of **Shyrone Carey** and **Skylar Green** has put some of that concern to rest as they are combining to average 17.0 yards on 23 punt returns this season. Carey has returned 17 punts for 191 yards (11.2 average), while Green has six returns for 200 yards, including an 80-yard return for a TD vs. Florida and a 62-yard return for a score vs. Arizona.

Cap and Gown Tigers

LSU has two players on this year's roster who have already earned their bachelor's degree - OT **Rodney Reed** and C **Jimmy Courtenay**. Reed and Courtenay both graduated last May. Reed, who earned First Team Academic All-America honors last year, graduated with a 3.9 grade point average in accounting. He is currently pursuing his Master's in accounting.

Clayton Has Teams Seeing Double (Triple, really)

Michael Clayton finally had his much-anticipated debut on defense vs. Arizona as the two-way player saw action on three plays at safety. Clayton did not record any statistics on defense, however he did make a tackle from his wide receiver position after an intercepted pass on offense. Clayton is actually playing three ways for the Tigers as he also serves as the backup holder on all placekicks as well as being on the kickoff coverage team. The Arizona contest marked the second time in Clayton's career that he has seen action on both sides of the ball. He did it for the first time last year vs. Texas in the Cotton Bowl.

Peterman's Pulling Double-Duty Too

As of Tuesday, Aug. 26, senior offensive lineman **Stephen Peterman** began pulling double-duty as well, only his is as a player and daddy. Peterman's wife Colleen gave birth to a 6-pound, 10-ounce baby boy in Metairie, La. Peterman missed two days of practice to be with his wife during the birth, but he returned to the squad on Thursday and started on Saturday against UL-Monroe. The newest Peterman, Stephen Frederick, Jr., checked in at some 318 pounds lighter than his daddy.

Gaudet Joins Elite List With 47-Yard FG

Ryan Gaudet added his name to a very short list of LSU kickers with his 47-yard field goal against Arizona. Gaudet's 47-yard field goal marked the first of his career and it marked the third-longest at LSU for a kicker on his first career make. Juan Roca holds the record as he connected on a 52-yard field goal vs. Wisconsin for his career make, while Wade Richey's first career make was a 48-yarder vs. Michigan State in 1995. Gaudet added another 47-yarder against Georgia. Gaudet, who made a pair of field goals vs. Mississippi State, is now 4 of 7 this season.

- LSU is 8-2 in games played on Oct. 25, including 7-0 at home.
- LSU is 1-1 vs. Auburn on Oct. 25, including a 21-02 victory in 1924 at home and a 3-0 loss on the road.

Memories vs. Auburn

- This will be the 38th meeting between the two SEC rivals.
- Games from 1988, the earthquake game, to 1997 were all decided by a touchdown or less seven of the eight times, but each game since has been decided by at least 12 points.

I'd been warned prior to my first visit to Baton Rouge that the legendary Death Valley mystique was a myth. That assessment couldn't have been more wrong. Tiger Stadium was as loud as any I've ever heard during the dramatic fourth quarter of Saturday's Georgia game, the festivities surrounding it as advertised.

The streets were lined with purple and gold. Smoke emanated from the grills in the parking lot. Shouts of "Go Tigers" and "Tiger Bait" echoed from the stadium deep into the heart of campus.

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 80th year in the venerable stadium on SATURDAY NIGHT.

• Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 20-5 HOME RECORD, including a 5-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 9-4 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 15-3 since Saban took over.

• LSU has won NINE OF ITS LAST 10 games at home, including an eight-game win streak during the stretch. That was the longest home streak for the Tigers since winning eight straight from 1995-96.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 23 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 15 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP FIVE IN THE NATION, including the last three.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 184-62-4 (.745) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 15-21-3 (.434) at home during the day in that span.

• Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 91,600 fans.

Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

Five Turnovers Doom LSU in Loss

A combination of turnovers and poor field position did LSU in as the Tigers dropped a 31-7 decision to Auburn at Jordan-Hare Stadium. LSU fumbled on its first play from scrimmage to set the tone for the game that saw the Tigers commit five turnovers. Despite four first half turnovers, the Tiger defense kept LSU in the game as Auburn managed to hold only a 17-0 advantage at halftime. Auburn put the game out of reach early in the third quarter when Jason Campbell found Robert Johnson in the endzone for a 3-yard TD pass to make the score 24-0. Auburn tacked on another score early in fourth quarter before the Tigers scored their only points of the game on an 8-yard run by Joseph Addai midway through the final quarter. Marcus Randall led LSU with 74 yards rushing, while Addai added 44 yards and 1 TD on 10 carries. Randall connected on 9-of-20 passes for 79 yards and 4 interceptions for the Tigers. Bradie James led the defense with 14 tackles.

LSU's Rolls Past UL-Monroe, 49-7

Matt Mauck threw three touchdown passes, Joseph Addai rushed for 81 yards and Michael Clayton caught six passes for 152 yards and a pair of TD passes as LSU rolled to a 49-7 win over Louisiana-Monroe in the season-opener for both teams. The game was only four minutes old when a thunderstorm rolled into Baton Rouge and caused a 39-minute delay because of lightning. After a scoreless first quarter, Mauck then threw three TD passes over the final seven minutes of the second quarter to put the Tigers up 21-0 at halftime. Shyrone Carey added a 1-yard run midway through the third quarter to give LSU a 28-0 advantage and the Tigers stretched the margin to 35-0 with a 31-yard interception return just 16 seconds later. Louisiana-Monroe scored its only points of the contest on a 12-yard run by Kevin Payne with 14:10 left in the fourth quarter. Freshman Alley Broussard capped the scoring for the Tigers with a 1-yard run with 10:39 left in the contest. For the game, the Tigers racked up 474 yards of offense (306 passing, 168 rushing) compared to just 240 yard for the Indians (59 rushing, 181 passing).

LSU QB Matt Mauck connected on 23 of 32 passes for a career-best 305 yards and four TDs as the Tigers overcame a slow start to post a 35-7 win over Western Illinois last Saturday in Tiger Stadium. Mauck-To-Green Leads LSU Past No. 7 Georgia, 17-10

Matt Mauck connected with Skyler Green for a 34-yard touchdown pass with 1:22 left in the contest as 10th-ranked LSU knocked off seventh-ranked Georgia, 17-10, before a record crowd of 92,251 in Tiger Stadium. The win lifted LSU to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC action and it marked the first Tiger victory over a top 10 team in Tiger Stadium since a 28-21 win over No. 1 Florida in 1997. The Tigers led 7-3 at halftime thanks in part to an outstanding defensive effort by LSU over the first 30 minutes. In the first half alone, Georgia got inside the LSU 30-yard line five times and came up with only three points. Trailing 3-0, the Tigers took a 7-3 lead on a 21-yard run by Shyrone Carey with 3:10 left in the first half. The Tigers extended their margin to 10-3 on a 47-yard field goal by Ryan Gaudet at the 6:23 mark in the third quarter. LSU appeared to have the game in hand, but a fumble by Mauck at the Georgia 15-yard line with less than 5 minutes left gave the Bulldogs another chance. Two players later Georgia's David Greene hit Tyson Browning on a screen pass, which he took 93 yards for a touchdown to tie the score at 10-10. Devery Henderson returned the ensuing kickoff 48 yards to the LSU 49-yard line to setup the game-winning touchdown for the Tigers. Georgia got into LSU territory in the final minute, but an interception by Corey Webster at the 22-yard line sealed the Tiger victory.

LSU turned three Mississippi State turnovers into 21 points and the Tiger defense limited the Bulldogs to only 31 yards rushing as LSU rolled to a 41-6 win in Starkville. After a slow start, LSU took a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by Shyrone Carey. Leading 10-0 after a Ryan Gaudet field goal, the Tigers stretched the margin to 17-0 midway through the second quarter on another 1-yard run by Carey. A flat LSU football team couldn't overcome a series of penalties and a key injury to starting running back Joseph Addai as the Tigers dropped their first game of the season to Florida, 19-7, in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers actually scored the first points of the game as Skyler Green, subbing for an injured Shyrone Carey, returned a first quarter punt 80-yards for a touchdown and a 7-0 LSU lead. The Gators took the lead for good at 10-7 on a 29-yard field goal by Matt Leach at the 3:17 mark in the first quarter. The Gators led 13-7 at halftime after another field goal by Leach. Then late in the fourth quarter with the game still in doubt, Mauck hit Devery Henderson in stride with a pass to the Florida 31-yard line, which he then fumbled away at the UF 14-yard line. For the game, the Tigers sacked Leak six times and forced another Florida turnover on the LSU 1-yard line. Mauck completed 19 of 33 passes for 231 yards and a pair of interceptions, while Leak led Florida with 18 of 30 passing for 229 yards and 2 TDs.

Tigers Ride Freshman Running Backs to 33-7 Win Over South Carolina

True freshman running backs Justin Vincent, Alley Broussard and Barrington Edwards combined to rush for 222 yards and 2 TDs and quarterback Matt Mauck connected on 24 of 30 passes for 199 yards and 2 scores as 10th-ranked LSU rolled past South Carolina, 33-7, in Columbia. Playing without its two starting running backs in Joseph Addai and Shyrone Carey, who were both out with knee injuries, the Tigers rushed for a season-high 263 yards on 52 carries. LSU finished with 482 yards off offense, while holding South Carolina to only 254 yards of offense, including zero rushing yards. LSU jumped out to a 19-0 first half lead and never looked back in cruising to the victory. LSU had first half drives of 21-plays and 97 yards and 14-plays and 91 yards that both culminated in touchdowns, the second of which gave LSU a 19-0 lead on a 1-yard run by Vincent just before halftime. South Carolina pulled to within 19-7 after a 77-yard TD early in the third quarter before LSU linebacker Jason LeDoux put the game out of reach with a 15-yard fumble return for a touchdown later in the quarter. Vincent added another 1-yard run midway through the fourth quarter for LSU's final point. Broussard led LSU with 108 yards rushing on 19 attempts, while Vincent had 77 yards and 2 TDs rushing and added another 46 yards receiving on four receptions.
