LSU Sports Information PO Box 25095, Baton Rouge, LA 70894 Seventh-Ranked Tigers To Face State In Starkville On ESPN2 LSU, ranked No. 7 in the nation in both the Associated Press and the ESPN/USA Today Coaches polls, will go after a 5-0 start tonight as the Tigers travel to face Mississippi State (0-3, 0-0) in Starkville. Kickoff for the contest is set for 8:15 p.m. and the game will be televised to a national audience by ESPN2. The Tigers are 4-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC action after last week's thrilling 17-10 win over seventh-ranked Georgia in Baton Rouge. Mississippi State, which is coming off a 42-35 defeat at Houston last week, is 0-3 overall. This game will serve as the SEC opener for State. The contest will mark the 97th in the series with the Tigers holding a commanding 60-33-3 advantage. LSU has won three straight and 10 of the last 11 with the Bulldogs, including a 31-13 victory last year in Baton Rouge. The Tigers will be after the school's first 5-0 start since 1973 when LSU won its first nine games. In addition, LSU will be after its second straight 2-0 start in league play. Tonight's contest will feature an LSU defense that ranks first in the SEC and eighth nationally, giving up only 260 yards and just 9.2 points a contest, against a Bulldog offense that is averaging 32.3 points and over 450 yards per game. Offensively, the Tigers are second in the SEC and ninth nationally as they are averaging 40.0 points a game. The Tigers are averaging 424 yards per game - 151.8 rushing, 272.5 passing - while MSU ranks last in the league by allowing 512 yards per game.

Mauck-To-Green Leads LSU Past No. 7 Georgia, 17-10

Matt Mauck connected with Skyler Green for a 34-yard touchdown pass with 1:22 left in the contest as 10th-ranked LSU knocked off seventh-ranked Georgia, 17-10, before a record crowd of 92,251 in Tiger Stadium. The win lifted LSU to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC action and it marked the first Tiger victory over a top 10 team in Tiger Stadium since a 28-21 win over No. 1 Florida in 1997. The Tigers led 7-3 at halftime thanks in part to an outstanding defensive effort by LSU over the first 30 minutes. In the first half alone. Georgia got inside the LSU 30-vard line five times and came up with only three points. Trailing 3-0, the Tigers took a 7-3 lead on a 21-yard run by Shyrone Carey with 3:10 left in the first half. The Tigers extended their margin to 10-3 on a 47-yard field goal by Ryan Gaudet at the 6:23 mark in the third quarter. LSU appeared to have the game in hand, but a fumble by Mauck at the Georgia 15-yard line with less than 5 minutes left gave the Bulldogs another chance. Two players later Georgia's David Greene hit Tyson Browning on a screen pass, which he took 93 yards for a touchdown to tie the score at 10-10. Devery Henderson returned the ensuing kickoff 48 yards to the LSU 49-yard line to setup the game-winning touchdown for the Tigers. Georgia got into LSU territory in the final minute, but an interception by Corey Webster at the 22-yard line sealed the Tiger victory.

Nick Saban

HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right leader to lead it. Entering his fourth year as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban is that leader.

Since taking over in Baton Rouge in 2000, Saban has transformed the LSU football program into one that wins championships, while graduating players at the same time.

Equipped with a plan that gives his players the best chance to be successful on the field as well as in the classroom, Saban's impact on the program has been immediate and it's been powerful.

In just three years as LSU's head coach, Saban's on-field success has been nothing short of remarkable, as he's guided the Tigers to 26 victories, a pair of bowl wins, including one in the Bowl Championship Series, and the 2001 Southeastern Conference title. The Tigers have also played in back-to-back New Year's Day bowls for the first time since the 1960s.

On top of LSU's success on the gridiron, the Tigers are being recognized for their efforts in the classroom. Currently, all 22 of the Tiger seniors from the 2002 team are on pace to graduate within the next 12 months, while Rodney Reed earned First Team Academic All-America honors and Bradie James was awarded an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation last year.

Off the field, Saban and his players are active in the community, promoting goodwill by participating in such things as community service projects and visiting hospitals and schools in the Baton Rouge area on a regular basis. Saban has also worn the hat of fundraiser during his stay in Baton Rouge as he spearheaded an effort that raised more than \$15 million for a state-of-the-art academic center for student-athletes. The new Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is part of Saban's plan to give his players the best opportunity to be successful when they finish their football careers. The center, which spans 54,000 square feet, is the best of its kind and features 100 computers, a 1,000-seat auditorium, a library and a communications center for training student-athletes.

Saban became the 31st head coach of the LSU Tigers on November 30, 1999, after five years as head coach at Michigan State.

He didn't waste anytime making his impact felt as he guided a team coming off back-to-back losing seasons to an 8-4 mark and a win over 15th-ranked Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl in 2000 to rekindle the fire of a proud football tradition in Baton Rouge.

A year later in 2001, Saban guided the Tigers to their first outright SEC title since 1986 with a 31-20 win over second-ranked Tennessee in the SEC Championship game. LSU followed that with a 47-34 victory over Illinois in the Sugar Bowl to cap a 10-3 season for the Tigers.

Last year, Saban guided the Tigers to an 8-5 overall mark and a share of the SEC Western Division title. The Tigers also played in a New Year's Day bowl game for the second consecutive year, a first for LSU since the 1960's, with an appearance in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five seasons.

Tonight's Game

LSU hits the road for the second time this year as the seventh-ranked Tigers take on Mississppi State in Starkville, Miss. The contest will be televised to a national audience by ESPN2. LSU, 4-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC action, enters the game coming off a 17-10 win over then-No. 7 Georgia last week in Tiger Stadium. Mississippi State is still winless after a 42-35 setback at Houston. The Bulldogs are 0-3 overall. Tonight's contest will be the conference opener for MSU.

In The Polls

LSU continued its climb up the national rankings as the Tigers are ranked No. 7 in both polls this week. The Tigers jumped three spots from No. 10 to No. 7 in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll and they moved four spots from No. 11 to No.7 in the Associated Press poll. The No. 7 ranking is the highest in-season ranking for the Tigers since 1998 when LSU moved to No. 6 in the nation following a 53-20 win over Idaho in Week 3. Overall, the No. 7 ranking is the highest for an LSU team since being ranked No. 7 in the final AP poll in 2001. That year, the Tigers beat Illinois, 47-34, in the Sugar Bowl and were ranked No. 7 following that contest.

About Mississippi State

The Bulldogs are 0-3 overall ... They are averaging over 32 points and 450 yards of total offense a contest ... They also rank second in the SEC and 18th in the nation in passing offense with an average of 297 yards per contest ... Defensively, MSU ranks last in the SEC and 116th in the nation in total defense, giving up 512 yards per game - 169.3 rushing and 342.7 passing ... MSU is also minus-7 in the turnover ratio margin this season as they have turned the ball over 12 times compared to just 5 by its opponent ... The Bulldogs are coached by Jackie Sherrill, who is in his 26th year overall and 13th at State ... Sherrill has an overall mark of 178-113-4, which includes a 73-68-2 record at State ... Sherrill, who has also served as the head coach at Washington State, Pittsburgh and Texas A&M, is 2-13 all-time vs. LSU.

Webster Named National and SEC Defensive Player of the Week

Corey Webster picked up both a national and conference honor this week following his performance against Georgia last Saturday. On Monday, Webster was named SEC Defensive Player of the Week and then on Tuesday he picked up the Bronco Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week honor. Webster, who leads the SEC with three interceptions through four games, sealed the victory for the Tigers with an interception of a David Greene pass at the LSU 22-yard line with just under a minute left in the contest. Webster led the Tigers with nine tackles, seven of which were solo, against Georgia. He also added one quarterback pressure and he broke up five passes. The honor is the second of Webster's career as he won the award last year after picking off three passes in a 36-7 win over Florida.

Win One For JB

The LSU football team has dedicated the 2003 season to longtime equipment manager Jeff Boss, who was diagnosed with brain cancer last January. Several members of the team, along with coach Nick Saban, presented coach Boss with a game ball from the Louisiana-Monroe game last Friday at his home. The ULM game was the first time in 24 years that coach Boss was not on the sidelines for an LSU contest. LSU will name the football locker room in Boss' honor with a formal ceremony on Sept. 29. In addition, the team will wear the letters "JB" on their helmets for the remainder of the season

Who's In And Who's Out For The Tigers

The Tigers have only a couple of players injured heading into tonight's game as both defensive end **Marquise Hill** (ankle) and linebacker **Adrian Mayes** (wrist) are questionnable for the game. Both players missed practice time this week. There availability will be a game-time decision. Both players were injured vs. Georgia.

What A Week For LSU

While there are still eight more football games to be played during the regular season, it's been a long time since so much attention has been thrust upon an LSU football as there was for last week's game against Georgia. In case you missed it, in addition to the game being televised by CBS, ESPN's GameDay and GameDay Radio were both on campus. **Nick Saban** also made an appearance of Fox Sports' Best Damn Sports Show Period on Friday afternoon. In all, LSU issued 625 media credentials for the game, which included the likes of Sports Illustrated, USA Today, the New York Times, ESPN.com, CBS Sportsline and the Washington Post.

Tigers Back At Full Strength; McGill, Pittman and Gay Play vs. Georgia LSU returned to full strength on Saturday as OG Terrell McGill, DE Kirston Pittman and DB Randall Gay all played against the Bulldogs. McGill played for the first time this season after suffering a bruised kidney in the second scrimmage of preseason. McGill, who was a projected starter for LSU before the injury, saw action on 11 plays at right guard. Pittman (knee) returned to action after missing most of the Arizona game and the entire Western Illinois contest. Pittman had two tackles and one QB pressure in 3 plays vs. Georgia. Gay (broken left arm) saw action on one play against the Bulldogs. Gay, who's been out since Week 1, is expected to see more action this week vs. Mississippi State.

Tigers Eye 5-0 Start

LSU heads into the Mississippi State contest looking to run its record to 5-0 for the first time since 1973 when the Tigers won their first nine games. LSU is 4-0 for the first time under Nick Saban. The Tigers were last 4-0 in 1996 when they beat Houston, Auburn, New Mexico State and Vanderbilt to open the season before falling to No. 1-ranked Florida in Week 5. Prior to that, LSU was 4-0 in 1978.

The LSU-Mississippi State Ties

The biggest connection between LSU and Mississippi State is that of MSU cornerbacks coach Curley Hallman. Hallman served as LSU's head coach from 1991-94, guiding the Tigers to a 16-28 mark over that span. Hallman, who is in his second year at Mississippi State after coaching at Alabama for two years, posted a 3-1 mark vs. MSU as LSU's head coach. In addition, current MSU offensive coordinator Morris Watts had two coaching stints at LSU, the first coming in 1983 with Jerry Stovall and then again from 1995-98 with Gerry DiNardo. Watts was the offensive coordinator on Nick Saban's staff at Michigan State in 1999. Saban and Watts also coached together as Michigan State in 1986 and 1987. MSU tight ends coach Terry Lewis coached with the Tigers from 1984-86.

LSU On ESPN2

It's almost become an annual event, LSU and Mississippi State squaring off before a national audience on ESPN2. Four of the last five years, LSU and Mississippi State have played on ESPN2 with the Tigers winning three of those games. Last year, LSU posted a 31-13 win over the Bulldogs on Jefferson Pilot. In all, the Tigers have appeared on ESPN2 10 times, four of those coming against Mississippi State. LSU is 7-3 all-time in games televised by ESPN2. LSU coach **Nick Saban** must be a fan of ESPN2 as he coached the Tigers to a 5-1 mark on the all sports channel, which includes a 14-13 win over Ole Miss in LSU's last appearance on the network.

Tiger Defense Leads The SEC, Ranks 8th Nationally

After an outstanding performance against a powerful Georgia offense on Saturday, the LSU defense remained as the No. 1 rated unit in the SEC and the eighth-best in the country. Through four games, the Tigers are allowing only 260.2 yards per contest - 65.0 rushing, 195.2 passing. The Tigers are second in the SEC and ninth nationally in rushing defense and they are second in the league and fifth in the nation in points allowed with a 9.2 average.

LSU Defends The Endzone

Through four games LSU has given up only 37 points with only 30 of those coming against the defense. The 37 points over the first four games is the fewest allowed by the Tigers since 1979 when LSU opponents scored only 23 points over the first four games of the year. This year, LSU allowed 7 points to Louisiana-Monroe and Western Illinois, 10 to Georgia and 13 to Arizona. The 1979 team held Colorado scoreless in Week 1, followed by allowing 3 points to Rice, 17 to Southern Cal and 3 to Florida.

Offense Still Among The Best In Nation

While the defense has been tough to score on, the Tiger offense has been just as effective as they have piled up 160 points through the first four games of the season. Despite scoring only 17 points against Georgia, the Tigers are still currently averaging 40.0 points a game, second in the SEC and ninth in the nation. The 160 points over the first four games are the most by the Tigers since the 1997 team scored 163 points in its first four games.

Go Figure

Between 1997 and Nov. 16, 2002, LSU failed to reach 20 points in an SEC contest 15 times. The Tigers lost all 15 of those games. Dating back to last year's Ole Miss game on Nov. 23, LSU has now won its last two SEC games when failing to reach the 20-point mark. Last year, LSU beat Ole Miss 14-13 for its final SEC victory and the Tigers opened up conference play this year with a 17-10 victory over Georgia. Prior to last year's win over Ole Miss, LSU had not won an SEC game when scoring less than 20 points since a 7-6 victory over Vanderbilt in 1997. You have to go all the way back to 1993 to find a two-game span when the Tigers won SEC games despite failing to reach 20 points. That year, LSU beat Ole Miss, 19-17 and then followed with a 17-13 win over Alabama. LSU also beat Mississippi State 18-16 that year.

Another Defensive Gem For The Tigers

The LSU defense turned in another gem of a performance on Saturday holding the powerful Georgia offense to only 10 points and limiting quarterback David Greene to just 20 completions on 44 attempts. Greene did throw for 314 yards, but 93 came on a screen pass that went the distance late in the fourth quarter. Greene also threw two interceptions, his first of the season. In all, Georgia ventured inside the LSU 30-yard line five times during the game and all the Bulldogs came away with was three points. On one occasion, Marcus Spears both caused and recovered a fumble by Greene and the other three times resulted in missed field goals.

Tip Drill For The D-Line

It won't appear in the LSU record book because it's a stat that's never been recorded, but on Saturday the Tiger defensive line may have batted more David Greene passes than any team in school history. In all, the Tiger front four combined to tip seven of Greene's passes, one that was intercepted by LB **Lionel Turner** and another that was nearly picked off by DT **Chad Lavalais**. DE **Marcus Spears** led the Tigers with three tipped passes followed by DT **Bryce Wyatt** and Lavalais with two each. In all, the Tigers batted down or tipped 11 of Greene's passes. LBs **Eric Alexander** and **Lionel Turner** each had two tipped passes.

Tigers Keep Opponents To Less Than 20 Points For 23rd Time Under Saban By holding Georgia to only 10 points on Saturday, the Tigers have now limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 23 of the 41 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 21-2 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points, which includes riding a 17-game winning streak when the feat is accomplished. The only two times that the Tigers have surrendered less than 20 points and loss under Saban came in 2000 when UAB beat LSU, 13-10 and Arkansas posted a 14-3 victory in a driving rainstorm in Little Rock. Of the 23 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 11 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted four shutouts under Saban.

Clayton Nearly Unstoppable

While WR **Michael Clayton** may have caught only two passes for 23 yards on Saturday, he's been pretty much unstoppable this season. Through four games, Clayton has caught 25 passes for 446 yards and four TDs. Clayton caught a career-best 11 passes for a career-high 162 yards in LSU's win over Western Illinois. So far this year, he's gone over 100 yards three times. Clayton currently ranks second in the SEC and ninth in the nation by averaging 111.5 yards receiving a contest and his 6.25 catches per game is third in the league.

Comparing Clayton And Reed After Four Games

In 2001, Josh Reed became LSU's first Biletnikoff Award winner, which goes to the college football's top wide receiver. After four games, **Michael Clayton** is putting up similar numbers to Reed during his award winning and record-setting season. Through 4 games, Clayton has caught 25 passes for 446 yards and 4 TDs. In 2001, Reed had 24 receptions for 507 yards and 1 TD over the Tigers' first four games.

Mauck Ties LSU Record With 17 Straight Completions

Matt Mauck played perhaps the best game of his career in the Sept. 13 game vs. Western Illinois. Lost in his overall numbers was the fact that he tied an LSU record by completing 17 straight passes over a two game span. Mauck completed his final 10 passes in LSU's 59-13 win over Arizona on Sept. 6 and he followed that by completing 7 straight vs. Western Illinois. The 17 straight completions ties the mark set by Rohan Davey, who completed 6 straight vs. Arkansas to close the 1999 season and then opened the 2000 season by hitting 11 straight vs. Western Carolina.

Mauck Has Career Night In Win over Western Illinois

Matt Mauck put together a career night vs. Western Illinois as the junior from Jasper, Ind., posted career-highs for completions (23), yards (305) and TDs (4). For the contest, Mauck connected on his first seven passes and went on to complete 23 of 35 passes. He became LSU's first 300-yard passer since Rohan Davey tossed for 444 yards vs. Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. The four TD were the most by an LSU player since Josh Booty threw 4 TD passes in a win over Alabama in 2000. For the year, Mauck has connected on 60 of 100 passes for 788 yards and 9 touchdowns.

Double-Trouble At Running Back

LSU's running back tandem of **Joseph Addai** and **Shyrone Carey** have proven to be a nice tandem for the Tigers. Through four games, Addai has 56 carries for 261 yards and 2 TDs, while Carey has 52 rushes for 257 yards and 4 TDs. Against Georgia, Carey led the Tigers with 73 yards rushing on 18 carries. He scored LSU's only first half TD on a 21-yard run. Addai added 65 yards on 15 carries. Both running backs averaged over four yards per carry against the Bulldogs. Two weeks ago, Carey picked up the slack at running back and responded with a career-high 124 yards and a TD on 21 attempts. At 5-foot-6, Carey is the shortest LSU running back to ever rush for 100 yards in a game.

Jones Punting to the Top

Donnie Jones, a senior punter, ranks in the top three of all three of LSU's career punting stats. The Baton Rouge native ranks second in punting average at 41.8 yards per kick, just 1.1 yard behind career leader Chad Kessler's 42.9. Jones ranks second in punting yardage with 7,615 in his career. Jones is also second in total punts with 180, just five away from moving past Kessler for first in school history.

Clayton on the Move

Michael Clayton, a junior wide receiver, is moving up the LSU career record books. The Baton Rouge native enters the Mississippi State game ranked tied for sixth in career receiving touchdowns with 15. Clayton also ranks sixth in career receptions with 129 and he's sixth in career receiving yards with 1,949. Clayton also ranks seventh in school history in career 100-yard games with six. Clayton needs just 74 yards to become only the fifth 2,000-yard receiver in LSU history.

100-150-300 vs. Western Illinois A Rarity For Tigers

LSU's trio of QB **Matt Mauck**, RB **Shyrone Carey** and WR **Michael Clayton** combined for a rarity vs. Western Illinois on Sept. 13. Carey rushed for 124 yards, Clayton caught passes netting 162 yards and Mauck threw for 305 yards as the trio became just the fourth group in school history to have 100-yards rushing, 150-yards receiving and 300-yard passing in the same game. The last time the Tigers had a 100-yard rusher, a 150-yard receiver and a 300-yard passer in the same contest came against Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. In that game, Domanick Davis rushed for 122 yards, Josh Reed had 239 yards receiving and Rohan Davey threw for 444 yards. The other two times came in 2001 as well as the Tigers did it against Kentucky (Toefield 129 rushing, Reed 160 receiving, Davey 383 passing) and then against vs. Arkansas (Toefield 173 rushing, Reed 183 receiving, Davey 359 passing).

100 On The Ground And 100 In The Air

Against Western Illinois, LSU had its first 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver in the same game since the Sugar Bowl in January of 2002. Against Western Illinois, **Shyrone Carey** rushed for 124 yards, while **Michael Clayton** caught 11 passes for 162 yards. It's the first time the Tigers have accomplished that feat since Domanick Davis rushed for 122 yards and Josh Reed had 239 receiving yards vs. Illinois. In addition, Clayton had 120 yards receiving in that Sugar Bowl contest vs. Illinois.

LSU's Offense On Fast Track; Ranks Second In SEC With 40.0 Points A Contest Despite scoring only 17 points in its win over Georgia, the Tigers offense is still averaging 40.0 points a game, which ranks second in the SEC and ninth in the nation. The Tigers are fourth in the SEC in total offense, averaging 424.2 yards per contest and they are third in the league in passing offense with 272.5 yards per contest.

Tiger "D" Keeps First Quarter Streak Alive

By holding Georgia out of the endzone in the first quarter, the LSU defense ran its streak TDless first quarters to eight straight dating back to last season. The last time an opposing offense scored a touchdown on the Tigers in the first quarter came against Kentucky in week 9 of last year. Texas scored a first quarter TD against the Tigers in the Cotton Bowl, but that was on a return of a **Marcus Randall** fumble. Dating back to last year's season-opener, the LSU defense has allowed only 4 first quarter touchdowns.

Tiger Defense Continues To Be Stingy

Through 16 quarters this season, LSU's defense has held the opponent out of the endzone in 11 of those. In week 1, Louisiana-Monroe didn't score until the fourth quarter and the same was true in week 2 as Arizona's offense didn't score until there was only four minutes left in the contest. For the first time this season, LSU allowed points prior to the fourth quarter as Western Illinois scored on its first second half possession. Georgia became the first team to score in the first half against the Tigers as the Bulldogs connected on a field goal in the first quarter.

Tigers Allowing Less Than A Point Per Game In The First Half

Georgia became the first team to score a first half point against LSU last week as the Bulldogs kicked a field goal midway through the first quarter. Through four games this season, LSU has outscored its opponent 79-3 in the first half or by an average of 19.75 to 0.75 per game. The three first half points allowed by the Tiger defense over the first four games is the fewest by an LSU team since 1960 when the Tigers allowed only 3 first half points to Georgia Tech in the first four weeks of the season.

Mauck Is An Accountable Starting QB

Since taking over as LSU's starting quarterback at the beginning of last season, Matt Mauck has led the Tigers to an 9-1 mark. What Mauck has also done is be directly involved in 21 of LSU's 40 offensive touchdowns over that 10-game span. In 10 games as a starter, the Tigers have scored 40 offensive touchdowns (these numbers take in to account whether Mauck was in the game or not), and he's either passed or rushed for 21 of those. Of the 40 offensive TDs that LSU has scored in his 10 starts, Mauck has passed for 18 TDs and rushed for another three.

Mauck Moves To 9-1 As A Starter

Matt Mauck ran his record as LSU's starting quarterback to 9-1 with the Tiger win over Georgia. As a matter of fact, the win was the ninth straight for Mauck after opening his career with a loss last year at Virginia Tech. The 9-1 start by Mauck is the best by an LSU quarterback since Herb Tyler won 10 of his first 11, including his first eight, as a starter from 1995-96. In addition, Mauck has played in 13 games in his LSU career and the Tigers are 11-2 in those contests.

Webster Nabs 10th Career Interception

He was a basketball superstar in high school. He came to LSU as a wide receiver and played there for a year before moving to the secondary. Now, in just his second season as a starter at CB **Corey Webster** has already moved up to seventh place in school history in interceptions after recording the 10th career pick vs. Georgia. The interception, which made Webster look more like a magician, came with just over a minute left in the contest and sealed LSU's 17-10 win over Georgia. The pick was the third of the year for Webster, who now leads the SEC and ranks sixth nationally in the category. Webster began his career at LSU as a WR, catching seven passes for 74 yards in 12 games as a freshman. In 17 games on defense, Webster has 10 interceptions for 98 yards and 1 TD.

The Long Ball

For the first time this season, LSU's offense failed to have a scoring play of 40 yards or better in its game against Georgia. The Tigers came close as **Matt Mauck** hit **Sklyer Green** for a 34-yard TD late in the fourth quarter in what was the game winner for the Tigers. This year, LSU has thrown 11 TD passes with five of those going for at least 40 yards. Mauck has three TD passes of at least 40 yards this year, while backup QB **Marcus Randall** has accounted for the other two. Last year, the Tigers had just three touchdown passes from over 40 yards, with two of those coming in the Kentucky game.

Saban Gets Win No. 30 at LSU and No. 73 Overall

LSU coach **Nick Saban** moved past Mike Archer into sole possession of sixth place in school history in wins with his 28th victory in the Tigers' win over Arizona. Saban picked up win No. 30 last Saturday vs. Georgia, moving him to within two of tying Gerry DiNardo for fifth place at LSU. In just over three years with LSU, Saban has posted a 30-12 overall mark. Saban also has 73 career victories. In his 10th season overall, Saban has put together an overall record of 73-38-1. Charles McClendon holds the school-record with 137 victories in 19 years as LSU's head coach.

Saban Adds Another Notch To SEC Belt

With the win over Georgia, LSU coach **Nick Saban** has now recorded at least one win over all but one SEC team. The only team Saban has yet to beat in the only team he hasn't faced - Vanderbilt. In just over three years at LSU, Saban has recorded 16 SEC victories - 17 counting the SEC title game in 2001. Saban has three wins each over Kentucky and Mississippi State, two each against Alabama, Ole Miss and Tennessee and one over Georgia, Auburn, Florida, South Carolina, and Arkansas. Saban's current SEC mark, which includes regular-season games only, stands at 16-9.

That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach **Nick Saban** has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In his fourth season at LSU, Saban has put together a 20-4 mark at home, which includes a 10-3 record in SEC games. Under Saban, the Tigers are 5-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium. LSU's 18 wins over Saban's first three years in Baton Rouge is the most over a three-year period for LSU in Tiger Stadium since the Tigers won 18 homes games from 1972-74.

Tigers Are Now 13-3 In Non-Conference Games Under Saban

After Saturday's win over Western Illinois, LSU moved its non-conference record under **Nick Saban** to 13-3. The Tigers were 3-1 in non-league games in 2000, followed by a 4-0 mark in 2001 and a 3-2 record last year. Included in the 13 non-SEC wins over the last three-plus years for the Tigers are bowl victories over Georgia Tech and Illinois.

Skyler Has Memorable Debut As Punt Returner

Skyler Green's first career punt return will go down as one that will be hard to forget. Green returned his first career punt 62 yards for a touchdown in LSU's win over Arizona. The 62-yard return is the longest by a Tiger since Domanick Davis had a 78-yard punt return for a TD vs. Mississippi State last season.

Taking Notes On The Tigers Under Saban

Here's a look at some notable LSU trends during its first 42 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 25-2 when leading at halftime and 23-2 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 28-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 27-0 when scoring 25 or more points ... On the other hand, LSU is 2-9 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 8-2 in games decided by 7 points or less and 3-1 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 11-4 in September under Saban ... LSU is 18-0 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing and the Tigers are 12-0 when having a 100-yard rusher.

Jimbo Keeps Spreading It Around In The Passing Game

LSU offensive coordinator **Jimbo Fisher** has done a good job keeping opposing defenses off balance when it comes to the passing game. Through 4 games this year, LSU has had at 12 players catch at least one pass. In the opener vs. UL-Monroe, LSU had seven players catch at least one pass. A week later vs. Arizona, eight Tigers caught passes. In four games, LSU has completed 74 passes with the wide receivers accounting for 58 of those receptions, while the tight ends and running backs have each caught nine passes.

Clayton Runs Streak To 30 Straight Games; Has Sixth Career 100-Yard Game LSU wideout Michael Clayton ran his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 30 after recording 2 catches vs. Georgia. Clayton has caught at least one pass in every game in which he has played during his career. With a career-best 162 yards receiving against Western Illinois, Clayton now has recorded six 100-yard games during his career, three of which have come in 2003. In four games, Clayton has caught 25 passes for 449 yards and 4 TDs.

Tigers Have Block Party vs. Western Illinois

LSU recorded both a blocked field goal and as well as a blocked punt against Western Illinois. **Travis Daniels** blocked the punt, which was the first for the Tigers since the 1999 game against Mississippi State, while **Chad Lavalais** blocked the field goal attempt. The blocked field goal was the first for LSU since 1998 when Arnold Miller blocked a kick against Notre Dame.

True Freshmen On The Field

Through four games, LSU has now played 14 true freshmen. LSU opened the season by playing 11 true freshmen against UL-Monroe and then 12 played against Arizona. The following is a listing of the true freshmen who have played this season and the number of games they have seen action in: DB Jessie Daniels (4 games), S LaRon Landry (4), CB Nick Child (4), DB Daniel Francis (4), DT Carnell Stewart (2), DE Kirston Pittman (3), RB Alley Broussard (4), RB Justin Vincent (4), WR Dwayne Bowe (4), TE Keith Zinger (4), PK Chris Jackson (4), RB Barrington Edwards (3), WR Craig Davis (2) and DE Brian West (2).

Tigers Have Experience on the O-Line

The LSU offensive line has been touted as one of the best in the nation. The Tiger offensive line may be one of the most experienced as the LSU front five have 111 career starts between them. **Rodney Reed** leads the way with 38, followed by **Stephen Peterman** with 29, **Ben Wilkerson** with 23 and **Andrew Whitworth** 17. **Nate Livings** has started all four games this season. LSU is 18-4 when Reed, Peterman and Wilkerson start on the offensive line together (8-0 in 2001, 6-4 in 2002, 4-0 in 2003).

Reed Among Nation's Elite In Starts on Offensive Line

Senior OT **Rodney Reed** started his 38th straight game last week against Georgia. Reed's 38 career starts ranks as the seventh-highest total among active Division I players. Marshall's Nate McPeek leads the way with 43 career starts.

Pancakes Are Breakfast of Choice For LSU O-Line

A new wrinkle to this year's offensive grade sheet is the tracking of both pancakes and knockdowns for the LSU offensive line. Through four games **Andrew Whitworth** leads the Tigers with 9 pancakes. Offensive guard **Stephen Peterman** is tops among the Tigers with 49 knockdowns after recording 14 vs.Georgia.

Carey Fills In Nicely For Domanick

A concern for LSU heading into the season was how to replace the departed Domanick Davis, the school's all-time leader in both punt return and kickoff return yards. **Shyrone Carey** has put some of that concern to rest as he's averaging 12.7 yards on 13 punt returns this season. Against Arizona, Carey returned returned five punts for 58 yards, including a 35-yard return that setup LSU's first quarter field goal that put the lead at 10-0. In all, LSU is averaging 13.9 yards on 17 punt returns, a figure that ranks second in the SEC and 19th nationally.

Cap and Gown Tigers

LSU has two players on this year's roster who have already earned their bachelor's degree - OT **Rodney Reed** and C **Jimmy Courtenay**. Reed and Courtenay both graduated last May. Reed, who earned First Team Academic All-America honors last year, graduated with a 3.9 grade point average in accounting. He is currently pursuing his Master's in accounting.

Clayton Has Teams Seeing Double (Triple, really)

Michael Clayton finally had his much-anticipated debut on defense vs. Arizona as the two-way player saw action on three plays at safety. Clayton did not record any statistics on defense, however he did make a tack-le from his wide receiver position after an intercepted pass on offense. Clayton is actually playing three ways for the Tigers as he also serves as the Tiger holder on all placekicks as well as being on the kickoff coverage team. The Arizona contest marked the second time in Clayton's career that he has seen action on both sides of the ball. He did it for the first time last year vs. Texas in the Cotton Bowl. Clayton did not see any action on defense for the Tigers vs. Western Illinois or against Georgia.

Peterman's Pulling Double-Duty Too

As of Tuesday, Aug. 26, senior offensive lineman **Stephen Peterman** began pulling double-duty as well, only his is as a player and daddy. Peterman's wife Colleen gave birth to a 6-pound, 10-ounce baby boy in Metairie, La. Peterman missed two days of practice to be with his wife during the birth, but he returned to the squad on Thursday and started on Saturday against UL-Monroe. The newest Peterman, Stephen Frederick, Jr., checked in at some 318 pounds lighter than his daddy.

Gaudet Joins Elite List With 47-Yard FG

Ryan Gaudet added his name to a very short list of LSU kickers with his 47-yard field goal against Arizona. Gaudet's 47-yard field goal marked the first of his career and it marked the third-longest at LSU for a kicker on his first career make. Juan Roca holds the record as he connected on a 52-yard field goal vs. Wisconsin for his career make, while Wade Richey's first career make was a 48-yarder vs. Michigan State in 1995. Gaudet added another 47-yarder against Georgia. Gaudet is now 2 of 5 on field goals this season with both of his makes coming from 47-yards.

Wilkerson Named to Rimington Watch List

Junior center Ben Wilkerson is one of 38 players named to the watch list for the Rimington Trophy. The award, established in 2000, is named for Nebraska's Dave Rimington, one of college football's most decorated offensive linemen. This is the second straight season Wilkerson has made the preseason watch list for the award. Wilkerson has started 20 games in his career and LSU is 15-5 in those games.

Webster on Thorpe and Nagurski Watch List

Junior CB **Corey Webster**, who led the Southeastern Conference last season with seven interceptions, has been named to the Jim Thorpe Award and the Bronko Nagurski watch lists. The Thorpe award, presented annually to the nation's top defensive back, is named after history's greatest all-around athlete who excelled on both defense and offense during his football career. The Nagurski award is presented to the nation's top all-around defensive player.

Peterman on Lombardi Watch List

Senior OG **Stephen Peterman**, a 2002 first-team All-SEC selection, has been named to the preliminary watch list for the Rotary Lombardi Award. Peterman is one of 41 players on the list for the award that is presented annually to the nation's top offensive or defensive lineman.

Turner on Butkus Watch List

Junior LB **Lionel Turner** has been named to the preseason Butkus Award watch list. The Walker, La., native finished third on the team is tackles last season with 71 and recorded three sacks. The award is presented annually to the nation's top linebacker.

Davis gave the Tigers a 7-0 lead on his punt return just two minutes into the game. MSU responded with a field goal and a TD to take a 10-7 advantage early in the second quarter. Davis hit paydirt with a 5-yard plunge to give the Tigers a 14-10 lead at halftime. The second half belonged to LSU as the Tigers stretched the lead to 21-10 on a 39-yard TD pass from Matt Mauck to Devery Henderson. Mauck capped the scoring for LSU with a 2-yard run midway through the fourth quarter. For the game, Davis finished with 286 all-purpose yards, which included 128 yards on punt returns. The Tigers piled up 256 yard rushing, while limiting MSU to only 88 yards on the ground and 249 total yards.

LSU's Rolls Past UL-Monroe, 49-7

Matt Mauck threw three touchdown passes, Joseph Addai rushed for 81 yards and Michael Clayton caught six passes for 152 yards and a pair of TD passes as LSU rolled to a 49-7 win over Louisiana-Monroe in the season-opener for both teams. The game was only four minutes old when a thunderstorm rolled into Baton Rouge and caused a 39-minute delay because of lightning. After a scoreless first quarter, Mauck then threw three TD passes over the final seven minutes of the second quarter to put the Tigers up 21-0 at halftime. Shyrone Carey added a 1-yard run midway through the third quarter to give LSU a 28-0 advantage and the Tigers stretched the margin to 35-0 with a 31-yard interception return just 16 seconds later. Louisiana-Monroe scored its only points of the contest on a 12yard run by Kevin Payne with 14:10 left in the fourth quarter. Freshman Alley Broussard capped the scoring for the Tigers with a 1-yard run with 10:39 left in the contest. For the game, the Tigers racked up 474 yards of offense (306 passing, 168 rushing) compared to just 240 yard for the Indians (59 rushing, 181 passing).

LSU Storms Past Arizona, 59-13, In The Desert

LSU scored on its first seven possessions, including a 15-play, 80-yard drive to open the contest, as the Tigers had little trouble with Arizona, posting a 59-13 win over the Wildcats in Tucson, Ariz. Quarterbacks Matt Mauck and Marcus Randall combined to connect on 19 of 25 passes for 299 yards and two TDs and Joseph Addai rushed for 86 yards and a pair of scores to lead the Tigers. Michael Clayton led all receivers with six catches for 109 yards and a 48-yard TD reception. Addai opened the scoring for LSU with a 1-yard run midway through the first quarter. Ryan Gaudet nailed a 47-yard field goal three minutes later and then Addai added an 8-yard TD run less than a minute after Gaudet's field goal to give the Tigers a 17-0 lead. LSU stretched the advantage to 38-0 at halftime, as the Tigers were never threatened in the contest. In all the Tigers, had five rushing TDs, two passing TDs and Skyler Green returned a punt 65 yards for a TD. Arizona scored its first points with 10 minutes left in the contest on a 1-yard fumble return. Defensively, LSU limited the Wildcats to only 182 yards of offense.

Mauck Passes Tigers Past Western Illinois, 35-7

LSU QB Matt Mauck connected on 23 of 32 passes for a career-best 305 yards and four TDs as the Tigers overcame a slow start to post a 35-7 win over Western Illinois last Saturday in Tiger Stadium. Shyrone Carey rushed for a career-best 124 yards and a TD to lead the Tiger ground attack, while Michael Clayton hauled in 11 receptions for 162 yards and a score. Defensively, Corey Webster intercepted two passes for the Tigers. On its first possession, LSU marched 58 yards on 10 plays and took a 6-0 lead on a 10-yard pass from Mauck to Clayton. The Tigers, who fumbled twice inside the Western Illinois 15-yard line in the first quarter, led 13-0 at halftime after a 1-yard TD run by Carey. After an on-side kick to start the second half, the Leathernecks cut the deficit to 13-7 on a 3-yard TD pass from Russ Michna to Terrence Hall at the 10:08 mark in the third quarter. It was all LSU from there as Mauck threw TD passes of 8 and 40 yards to Skyler Green to stretch the advantage to 28-7. The Tigers added a final score on a 16-yard TD pass from Mauck to Devery Henderson midway through the fourth quarter.

Mauck-To-Green Leads LSU Past No. 7 Georgia, 17-10 Matt Mauck connected with Skyler Green for a 34-yard touchdown pass with 1:22 left in the contest as 10th-ranked LSU knocked off seventh-ranked Georgia, 17-10, before a record crowd of 92,251 in Tiger Stadium. The win lifted LSU to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC action and it marked the first Tiger victory over a top 10 team in Tiger Stadium since a 28-21 win over No. 1 Florida in 1997. The Tigers led 7-3 at halftime thanks in part to an outstanding defensive effort by LSU over the first 30 minutes. In the first half alone, Georgia got inside the LSU 30-yard line five times and came up with only three points. Trailing 3-0, the Tigers took a 7-3 lead on a 21-yard run by Shyrone Carey with 3:10 left in the first half. The Tigers extended their margin to 10-3 on a 47-yard field goal by Ryan Gaudet at the 6:23 mark in the third quarter. LSU appeared to have the game in hand, but a fumble by Mauck at the Georgia 15-yard line with less than 5 minutes left gave the Bulldogs another chance. Two players later Georgia's David Greene hit Tyson Browning on a screen pass, which he took 93 yards for a touchdown to tie the score at 10-10. Devery Henderson returned the ensuing kickoff 48 yards to the LSU 49-yard line to setup the game-winning touchdown for the Tigers. Georgia got into LSU territory in the final minute, but an interception by Corey Webster at the 22-yard line sealed the Tiger victory.
