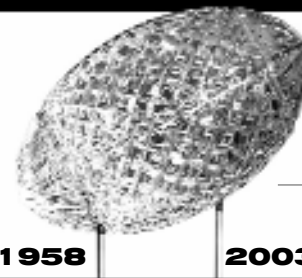

LSU Travels To Face Auburn In SEC Opener

Fourth-ranked LSU (2-0) hits the road for the first time in 2004 as the Tigers travel to Auburn for a 2:30 p.m. contest against the 15th-ranked Tigers that will be televised to a national audience by CBS. Last year, LSU posted a 31-7 win over Auburn in Baton Rouge. Saturday's contest will mark the conference opener for LSU, while Auburn opened its league slate with a 43-14 win over Mississippi State last week. LSU is coming off a 53-3 win over Arkansas State a week ago. LSU enters the Auburn contest riding a 10-game winning streak, which is the nation's third longest trailing Boise State (13) and Southern Cal (11). The 10-game winning streak is the longest at LSU since 1971-72 when the Tigers won 11 straight games. Saturday's contest will feature an LSU defense that is allowing only 69 yards rushing per game against an Auburn backfield that has two backs averaging over 100 yards rushing a game in Carnell Williams (112.5) and Ronnie Brown (101.0). Offensively, the Tigers have been lead on the ground by **Justin Vincent** (150 yards, 2 TDs) and **Joseph Addai** (108 yards, 1 TD), while quarterbacks **Marcus Randall** and **JaMarcus Russell** have shared time under center. Russell has thrown for 296 yards and 4 scores, while Randall has tossed for 125 yards and 1 TD. **Dwayne Bowe** leads LSU with 7 receptions for 159 yards and 3 TDs. Defensively, LSU is allowing 12 points per game and just 258 yards per contest. LB **Lionel Turner** leads the Tigers with 21 tackles.

Tigers Overpower Arkansas State, 53-3

Justin Vincent rushed for 102 yards and 2 TDs and three LSU quarterbacks combined to hit on 12 of 20 passes for 210 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers rolled to a 53-3 win over Arkansas State in Tiger Stadium. LSU wasted little time in establishing itself as the dominant team as the Tigers took the opening kickoff and marched 54 yards in 6 plays for a 7-0 lead following a 5-yard TD run by Vincent just two minutes into the contest. The Indians fumbled the ensuing kickoff and three plays later, **Marcus Randall** found **Corey Webster** for a 6-yard TD pass running the score to 13-0. From there, the route was on as the Tigers extended their lead to 23-0 after the first quarter and 37-0 at halftime. Arkansas State got on the board midway through the third quarter with a 34-yard field goal. LSU responded with a pair of touchdowns in a 3-minute span to stretch the lead to 50-3. **Ryan Gaudet** added a 33-yard field goal in the fourth quarter for the final margin.

For the game, the Tigers limited ASU to just 54 yards rushing and only 201 yards of offense. **JaMarcus Russell** led all LSU quarterbacks by connecting on 7 of 11 passes for 151 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall hit on 5 of 7 for 59 yards and one score. **Craig Davis** led the Tigers with 4 catches for 73 yards, while **Dwayne Bowe** caught a pair of TD passes.

The Series

LSU and Auburn meet for the 39th time on Saturday with LSU holding a 20-17-1 advantage in the series that dates back to 1901 ... The teams have split the last 10 meetings ... LSU has won two of the last three against Auburn with both wins coming in Baton Rouge ... LSU has lost two straight and three of its last four against Auburn in Jordan-Hare Stadium ... Auburn won the first meeting between the teams, 28-0, in Baton Rouge in 1901 ... After playing only seven times in the 1970s and 80s, the teams have met every year since 1992 ... Since 1992, Auburn has won seven of the 12 games between the teams ... Last year, LSU posted a 31-7 win in Baton Rouge ... That came following a 31-7 Auburn win in Jordan-Hare Stadium in 2002 ... LSU is 5-7 in games played at Auburn, which includes an 0-2 mark under Nick Saban ... In games between 1988 and 1997, the contest was decided by a touchdown or less seven times (in eight games) ... Since then, the winner has won by at least 12 points each time ... LSU coach Nick Saban is 2-2 vs. Auburn.

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right person to lead it. In four years as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban has proven to be that leader.

Since taking over a program that suffered through seven losing seasons in the 1990s, Saban has guided the Tigers to the pinnacle of college football - winning the 2003 BCS National Championship with a 21-14 victory over Oklahoma in the Nokia Sugar Bowl. The victory culminated a four-year ride under Saban that has been unmatched in the history of Tiger football. Since taking the reigns in 2000, Saban has guided the Tigers to a 41-13 overall mark, while claiming a pair of SEC titles in 2001 and 2003. LSU's 2003 BCS National Championship is just the second for the Tigers in football, and the first since 1958.

Saban's ability to successfully lead the Tigers comes from a management style that focuses on the entire program, one that puts his players in position to have success, both on the field and in the classroom. Armed with a plan that starts with recruiting quality people, outstanding football players and good students, Saban and his staff have transformed LSU into a team that is sure to be a fixture among the nation's elite programs for years to come.

On the field, Saban has developed a reputation as a defensive mastermind who is among the best in the game - professional or college - when it comes to game day coaching decisions. His defenses are physical, aggressive and deceptive, while offensively, the Tigers put up staggering numbers with a wealth of skill players leading the way. His teams play hard, make good decisions on the field and have proven that they are confident enough to overcome any type of adversity that is thrown in their direction.

It's a style and system that has proven to be successful, both for the team as well as the individual as six Tigers have earned First Team All-America honors in four years, while 18 of his LSU players have gone on to be selected in the NFL Draft, including six in the 2004 draft.

Off the field, Saban demands excellence from his players in both the classroom as well as the community. While the Tigers were marching to the 2003 national title on the field, the LSU football team combined for a 2.52 grade point average. A few months later, the squad bettered that mark with a 2.76 average for the spring semester as the Tigers had 50 players with a 3.0 or better during the spring and just six athletes that failed to reach a 2.0.

In addition to the honors the Tigers garnered on the field, LSU had 25 players earn a spot in the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 2003. Once again, numbers that show not only is Saban committed to academics, but his players are also dedicated to receiving an education as well. Since December of 2000, 51 football players who played under Saban at LSU have earned their degree, which includes 13 members of the 2003 national championship squad.

A major part of enhancing and cultivating the education experience for the student-athletes at LSU has been the addition of the \$15 million state-of-the-art Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes. Saban spearheaded the fundraising for the center, which included donating \$50,000 of his own money to the cause. The center, the best of its kind in college athletics, features a 1,000-seat auditorium with over 100 computers in a 54,000-square foot facility that gives all of LSU's student-athletes the best chance to have success in the classroom.

Saban's mission statement for the LSU football program is simple. He wants his players to become better people for having been a part of the program. He also wants to develop his players so they can reach their full athletic potential, which will enable them to have the opportunity to win a championship. Finally, it's his plan to help each player graduate and launch their career so that when they leave LSU they can have the best opportunities to be successful in life.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five years.

This Week

LSU travels to Auburn for a 2:30 p.m. contest against the Tigers in a game that will be televised to a national audience by CBS. The game will serve as the SEC opener for LSU, while Auburn opened league play last week with a 43-14 victory over Mississippi State in Starkville. The game will mark the 16th time in the series in which at least one team is ranked entering the contest. It also marks the third time in four meetings that both squads are ranked in the AP Top 25 entering the contest. Last year, LSU entered the Auburn game ranked No. 9, while the Tigers of Auburn were No. 17 in the nation.

LSU Goes After 11th Straight Win Against Auburn

LSU will go for its 11th consecutive victory on Saturday when the Tigers travel to face Auburn. LSU's current 10-game winning streak, which dates back to week 7 in 2003, is the school's longest winning streak since 1971-72 when the Tigers won 11 straight games. LSU's current 10-game winning streak ranks as the third longest in the nation, trailing Boise State (13) and Southern Cal (11).

In The Polls

LSU remained at No. 4 in the nation in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll on Sunday following the 53-3 win over Arkansas State. LSU nudged ahead one spot in the AP poll, moving from No. 6 to No. 5 on Sunday. The Tigers moved past Florida State, who dropped a 16-10 overtime decision to Miami. LSU has now been ranked in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches top 10 for 18 consecutive periods and they've spent 16 straight weeks in the AP top 10. The 16 consecutive weeks in the AP top 10 is the longest streak for LSU since spending 19 straight weeks there during the 1986 and 1987 seasons.

About Auburn

The Tigers are 2-0 overall and 1-0 in league play ... They are ranked No. 15 in the nation in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll ... In two games this year, Auburn has only allowed 14 points, all coming in the fourth quarter against Mississippi State ... Auburn's offense features to running backs who are averaging over 100 yards rushing per game in Carnell Williams (112.5) and Ronnie Brown (101.0). ... QB Jason Campbell has thrown for 249 yards and 5 TDs in two games ... Defensively, the Tigers are first in the SEC in scoring defense (7.0) and second in the league in total defense (255.0) and pass defense (144.5) ... Auburn coach Tommy Tuberville has a 5-4 career mark vs. LSU, which includes a 3-2 record at Auburn and a 2-2 mark at Ole Miss.

LSU's Auburn Ties

LSU's ties with Auburn are plenty as five members of the LSU coaching and support staff have either played or coached on the Plains. LSU offensive coordinator **Jimbo Fisher** coached quarterbacks at Auburn from 1993-98. LSU defensive coordinator **Will Mushchamp** served as a graduate assistant for the Tigers from 1995-97, while offensive line coach **Stacy Searels** was a first-team All-America and a 3-year starter for Auburn from 1984-87. Current LSU graduate assistant **Dameyune Craig** played quarterback at Auburn from 1994-97 helping the Tigers to three bowl games. In addition, **Sam Nader**, LSU's Director of Football Operations, lettered at quarterback for Auburn in 1967.

Expect The Unexpected When LSU And Auburn Meet

Since 1988, the LSU-Auburn series has become one of close calls and one in which the teams and the fans have come to expect the unexpected. The following is a listing of some of the notable happenings in the series since 1988:

1988: LSU's Tommy Hodson hit Eddie Fuller in the back of the endzone on fourth down with 1:41 left to lift the Tigers to a 7-6 win over fourth-ranked Auburn. The noise from the stadium crowd after the play registered on a seismograph across campus prompting the game to be titled "The Earthquake Game."

1994: Auburn intercepted five passes in the fourth quarter, returning three for TDs as the Tigers rally to post a 30-26 win over LSU in a game that become known as "The Interception Game."

1995: LSU donned white jerseys at home for the first time since the early 1980's and promptly went out and upset fifth-ranked Auburn, 12-6. LSU preserved the win with an interception in the endzone on the last play of the game. The contest was dubbed the "Bring Back the Magic" game.

1996: With the old Auburn Sports Arena burning to the ground a couple hundred yards away, LSU beat Auburn, 19-15, in a game titled "The Night the Barn Burned."

1997: Titled "The Comeback", Auburn QB Dameyune Craig engineered a 10-play, 80-yard drive late in the fourth quarter to spark the Tigers to a 31-28 upset of 10th-ranked LSU.

Tigers Back On CBS

LSU returns to CBS this week against Auburn for the first time since its 34-13 win over Georgia in last year's SEC Championship Game in Atlanta. LSU is 18-14-1 all-time on CBS, which includes an 8-4 mark under **Nick Saban**. The Auburn contest is the first of two CBS games currently listed on LSU's schedule this year. The Tigers close their regular season against Arkansas in Little Rock on CBS.

Taking Note On The Tigers Under Saban

Here is a look at some notable trends for LSU during its first 54 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 35-2 when leading at halftime and 33-2 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 38-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 35-0 when scoring at least 25 points in a game ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 3-10 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 11-2 in games decided by 7 points or less and 5-1 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 27-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 team rushing yards and the Tigers are 20-0 when having a player rush for 100 yards.

Looking For A 3-0 Start

LSU will be after a 3-0 start for the second consecutive year against Auburn. Last year, the Tigers opened with five straight victories before falling to Florida in week 6. LSU's 2-0 start marks the fourth time in five years under **Nick Saban** that the Tigers have won their first two games of the season.

Tigers Are 2-2 In SEC Openers Under Saban

LSU will carry a 2-2 record in SEC openers under **Nick Saban** into the Auburn contest. LSU has won its last two SEC openers, beating Georgia 17-10 to open the 2003 season and defeating Mississippi State, 31-13, in 2002. LSU is 0-2 in SEC openers under Saban on the road and 2-0 in games played in Tiger Stadium. LSU is opening its SEC slate against Auburn for the first time since 2000, when Auburn posted a 34-17 win over LSU.

LSU's Won 6 Straight Against SEC Opponents

LSU will carry a 6-game winning streak against SEC opponents into the Auburn contest LSU's 6-game SEC winning streak includes victories in its last five regular season contests in 2003 followed by its win over Georgia in the SEC title game. The 6-game winning streak against SEC foes is the longest for LSU since winning 7 straight over the 2001-02 seasons.

Vincent Has 6th 100-Yard Rushing Game

LSU sophomore **Justin Vincent** recorded his sixth 100-yard rushing game last week against Arkansas State with 102 yards and 2 TDs on 13 carries. Vincent averaged 7.8 yards per carry against Arkansas State. For his career, Vincent has tallied six games of 100 yards or better, including a career-best of 201 yards against Georgia in the SEC Championship game last year. Vincent's first 100-yard rushing game came in last year's 31-7 win over Auburn in Baton Rouge. LSU is 6-0 when Vincent goes over 100 yards. The following is a look at Vincent's 100-yard games:

Bowe Knows TDs And First Downs

LSU WR **Dwayne Bowe** knows touchdowns as he currently leads the SEC with three TD receptions over the first two weeks of the season. As a matter of fact, Bowe is averaging a TD every 2.3 catches. This year, Bowe has caught 7 passes for 159 yards and 3 scores. He's averaging 22.7 yards per catch. In addition, of Bowe's 7 receptions, six have statistically resulted in a first down (3 of those being TDs.)

Seeing Double At Quarterback

LSU continued to have success platooning quarterbacks **Marcus Randall** and **JaMarcus Russell**. Through two games, the duo has combined to connect on 28 of 62 passes for 421 yards and 5 TDs. They have only one interception between them. Russell has hit on 16 of 37 passes for 296 yards and 4 TDs, while Randall, the starter in LSU's first two games, is 12 of 25 for 125 yards and one score.

Russell In Elite Company

With a pair of TD passes in each of his first two games in an LSU uniform, **JaMarcus Russell** has done something that hasn't been done at the school since at least 1970. As far as detailed records account, Russell is the first LSU quarterback to toss at least 2 touchdown passes in his first two games as a Tiger. The only player since 1970 that's come close is **Tommy Hodson**, who threw for a pair of TDs in his debut against Texas A&M in 1986. Hodson didn't throw any TD passes the following week in a 21-12 loss to Miami (Ohio).

Corey Webster The Multi-Tasker

LSU CB/WR/RS **Corey Webster**, who graduated last month with a degree in general studies, has taken his time management skills to another area and that's the football field. In two games in 2004, Webster has played on both sides of the ball as well as seeing action as LSU's punt returner against Arkansas State. In two games, Webster has 9 tackles and 2 PBUs on defense to go with one reception for a 6-yard TD on offense. Webster, who has seen action on 14 snaps of offense, has also returned one punt for 7 yards. Webster's 6-yard TD reception against Arkansas State was the first offensive TD of his career. He also scored on a 45-yard interception return against Florida in 2002. Webster is the first 3-way player at LSU since 2002 when Domanick Davis played on both sides of the football as well as returning punts and kickoffs.

LSU's Defense Scores Again

LSU's defense was back up to its old tricks against Arkansas State as the Tiger "D" scored for the eighth time in the last 16 games with a combination of interception-fumble return in the third quarter against the Indians. LSU linebacker **Ali Highsmith** intercepted a Nick Noce pass at the ASU 11-yard line and returned it to the 1-yard line where he fumble, which was picked up by cornerback **Travis Daniels**, who walked into the endzone for the score. The defensive touchdown was the first of the year for the Tigers, who scored a school-record seven defensive TDs in 2003 (5 interception returns, 2 fumble returns). The touchdown was the second of Daniels' career as he returned an interception 45-yards for a score last year against Mississippi State.

Tigers Have Kept Opponents To Less Than 20 Points 33 Times Under Saban

By holding Arkansas State to only 3 points, the Tigers have now limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 33 of the 53 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 30-3 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 33 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 17 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted four shutouts under Saban.

Tigers Reach 50-Point Mark Again

For the third time in the last two seasons, LSU reached the 50-point mark with a 53-3 win over Arkansas State. The 50 points were the most for LSU since scoring 55 against Arkansas last November. LSU also did it in a 59-13 win over Arizona last September. In all, the Tigers have scored 50 points in a game four times under **Nick Saban**. The first time came in Saban's debut at LSU as the Tigers rolled to a 58-0 win over Western Carolina to open the 2000 season.

Margin Of Victory

The 50-point win over Arkansas State was the largest for an LSU team since the first game of the **Nick Saban** era when the Tigers beat Western Carolina, 58-0.

Still No Rushing TDs For The Opposition

LSU has now gone two games without allowing a rushing TD. The Tigers have only allowed three touchdowns in the first two games, all three of which were through the air. Dating back to last year's season-opener, LSU's defense has only allowed 7 rushing TDs, which covers a span of 16 games. Arkansas' Cedric Cobbs was the only player in the SEC to rush for a TD against the Tigers last year, and he did it with a 20-yard run in the final week of the regular-season.

Another Fourth-Quarter Comeback

LSU's comeback from a 15-7 fourth quarter deficit against Oregon State represents the sixth time under **Nick Saban** that the Tigers have rallied to win a game despite trailing in the final quarter. The last time the Tigers rallied to win in the fourth quarter came against Kentucky in 2002 when **Marcus Randall** connected with Devery Henderson on a 75-yard TD pass as time expired for a 33-30 LSU win. Over the six fourth-quarter comeback wins for the Tigers since 2000, Randall has been involved in three as he threw the game winning TD against Kentucky and Ole Miss in 2002 and then ran for the game-winning score against Oregon State in overtime. The following is a look at LSU's other fourth quarter comebacks under Saban that resulted in a victory for the Tigers:

That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach **Nick Saban** has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In 4-plus seasons at LSU, Saban has put together a 25-5 mark at home, which includes a 12-4 record in SEC games. LSU finished its 2003 season with a 6-1 at home after going 6-1 in Tiger Stadium in 2002. Under Saban, the Tigers are 6-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium.

Another Sellout In Tiger Stadium

The Arkansas State game, with a crowd of 91,611, marked the seventh straight sellout in Tiger Stadium dating back to the Georgia game last September. In all, LSU played five of its seven home games in 2003 in front of crowds of 91,000 or better. The Oregon State contest marked the first sellout for a season-opener at home for the Tigers since drawing 91,782 for the Tulane game in 2001. It also marked the largest season-opening crowd in Tiger Stadium in school history with 91,828 fans in attendance. The following is a list of the top 10 crowds in Tiger Stadium history

LSU's Won 11 Straight Non-Conference Games In Tiger Stadium

LSU won its 11th straight non-conference game in Tiger Stadium with a 53-3 win over Arkansas State on Sept. 11. LSU hasn't lost a home non-conference game since dropping a last-second 13-10 decision to UAB in 2000.

LSU's 17-3 Against Non-SEC Foes Under Saban

The Tigers ran their non-conference record to 17-3 under **Nick Saban** following the 53-3 win over Arkansas State. The Tigers, who were 5-0 against non-SEC teams in 2003, haven't lost a non-conference game since dropping a 35-20 decision to Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl. LSU hasn't lost a regular season non-conference game since falling to Virginia Tech, 26-8, to open the 2002 season.

Randall Now 4-4 As LSU's Starting QB

LSU QB **Marcus Randall** evened his record to 4-4 as LSU's starting quarterback following the Tigers win over Arkansas State. Randall is 2-0 this year after posting a 2-4 mark as the Tiger signal caller in 2002.

Russell Shined In Debut

LSU QB **JaMarcus Russell** shined in his much anticipated debut as the redshirt freshman started the second half and rallied the Tigers to an overtime win over Oregon State. Russell led the Tigers on two second half scoring drives, which included tossing a 38-yard TD pass to **Dwayne Bowe** with just over a minute left in the contest to pull the Tigers to within 15-13. Russell then tied the game with a two-point conversion that sent the game into overtime. In overtime, Russell suffered cramps to his legs and was forced out of the contest midway through LSU's possession. For the game, Russell completed 9 of 26 passes for 145 yards and 2 TDs.

Randall and Russell Each Have Hand In TDs for Tigers In First 2 Games

LSU's quarterback duo of **JaMarcus Russell** and **Marcus Randall** have been responsible for touchdowns in the Tigers' first two games. Russell has accounted for four TDs (all passing), while Randall has thrown for a score and run for another. It's the first time LSU has had two quarterbacks be responsible for touchdowns in back-to-back games since the first two games of the 2003 season when Randall and Matt Mauck each accounted for scores against Louisiana-Monroe and Arizona.

Tiger Defense Tough Against the Run

LSU held Oregon State to 84 net rushing yards in the season opener and then followed that by allowing only 54 yards against Arkansas State to run its streak of holding opponents under 100 yards rushing to 4 straight games and 6 of the last 7 dating back to last season. A year ago, the Tigers ranked third in the nation in rushing defense, allowing only 67 yards per game. The Tigers allowed only two opponents in 2003 to gain over 100 yards on the ground (Louisiana Tech and Arkansas).

Tigers Have Rushed For More Than Opponent In 10 Straight Games

For the 10th consecutive game, LSU had more rushing yards than its opponent as the Tigers put together 251 yards on the ground compared to just 54 for Arkansas State last week. The last time a team gained more yards on the ground than LSU was Florida on Oct. 11, 2003, which happens to be the last time the Tigers have lost a football game. In that game, Florida had 81 yards on the ground compared to just 56 for the Tigers.

Jackson Handles All of LSU's Kicking Duties and He Can Hit Too

LSU specialist **Chris Jackson** continues to handle all of LSU's kicking duties, including serving as the Tigers' punter. In two games, Jackson is averaging 39.1 yards on eight punts. He's 1-3 on field goals and 7 of 9 on extra-point attempts. Jackson also serves as LSU's kicker on kickoffs. Oh by the way, he's also expected to be a starting middle infielder for the LSU baseball team next spring. On the football field, Jackson is the first Tiger to handle placekicks and punting for LSU since 1985 when Matt DeFrank did both.

Webster Closing In On LSU Career Interception Mark

LSU senior CB **Corey Webster** enters the Auburn game needing only six interceptions to tie Mike Williams' school-record for interceptions at 20. Webster has 14 career interceptions to his credit after picking off seven passes in each of the last two seasons. Webster tied the school-record for interceptions in a single-game with 3 against Florida in 2002. Webster leads all active players in the SEC in both interceptions and pass deflections (44).

Spears Adds Sack To Run Career Total To 11; Oliver Still At 10

LSU senior DE **Marcus Spears** ran his career sack total to 11 against Oregon State. Spears, who also forced a fumble, recovered a fumble and broke up a pass against the Beavers, finished with 5 tackles against the Beavers. Spears is now just four sacks shy of tying Corey White for 10th place on LSU's career sack list with 15. DT Melvin Oliver has 10 career sacks to his credit. Rydell Melancon holds the school mark with 25 career sacks from 1980-83.

Green's Caught At Least 1 Pass In 18 Straight Games

LSU junior WR **Skyler Green** ran his streak of games with at least one reception to 18 straight games with two catches against Oregon State. Green, who did not play against Arkansas State, is expected to return to action against Auburn. As a matter of fact, Green caught at least 2 passes in 15 straight games, including all 14 of LSU's games in 2003. Green's career high for receptions came against Louisiana Tech with 9 receptions. For his career, Green has 57 passes for 658 yards and 7 TDs.

Green Moves Into 10th Place On LSU Career Punt Return List

Skyler Green moved into 10th-place in career punt return yards in LSU with against Oregon State. Green finished with only one return for nine yards against the Beavers, but it was good enough to move past Chris Williams for the 10th spot. Green now has 471 punt return yards. Domanick Davis holds the school record with 1,126 yards on 94 returns from 1999-2002.

Defensive Line Shuffle

One of the philosophies of LSU coach **Nick Saban** is keeping players fresh by rotating players throughout the game. The Tigers opened the season by rotating eight different players on the defensive line. The four players who started the contest were **Marcus Spears**, **Kyle Williams**, **Claude Wroten** and **Melvin Oliver**. I'd been warned prior to my first visit to Baton Rouge that the legendary Death Valley mystique was a myth. That assessment couldn't have been more wrong. Tiger Stadium was as loud as any I've ever heard during the dramatic fourth quarter of Saturday's Georgia game, the festivities surrounding it as advertised.

The streets were lined with purple and gold. Smoke emanated from the grills in the parking lot. Shouts of "Go Tigers" and "Tiger Bait" echoed from the stadium deep into the heart of campus.

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 81st year in the venerable stadium on SATURDAY NIGHT.

• Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 25-5 HOME RECORD, including a 6-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 11-4 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 19-3 since Saban took over.

• LSU has won 13 OF ITS LAST 15 games at home, including a current five-game winning streak.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 29 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 20 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP FIVE IN THE NATION, including the last three.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 189-62-4 (.749) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 16-21-3 (.438) at home during the day in that span.

Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

LSU Shuts Down Cadillac, Auburn in 31-7 Win

In a game that featured the nation's top rushing defense in LSU against one of the best at running the football in Auburn, LSU came out on top, limiting Auburn to 50 yards rushing in a 31-7 win in Tiger Stadium. LSU struck early and often in the game as the Tigers rolled up 21 first half points and never looked back in posting its biggest win over Auburn since a 35-7 victory in 1972. Matt Mauck connected with Devery Henderson on a 64-yard scoring pass on the sixth play of the game for a 7-0 LSU lead. After the LSU defense stopped Auburn on a fourth-and-one at the 48-yard line, the Tigers needed only six more plays for take a 14-0 advantage as Mauck found Michael Clayton for an 18-yard TD. **Alley Broussard** capped the first quarter scoring with a 5-yard run for a 21-0 LSU lead, which is where the game stood at halftime. **Ryan Gaudet** kicked a 33-yard field goal and then Mauck hit Henderson for another TD pass to give the Tigers a 31-0 lead in the third quarter. Auburn, who was held to only 193 yards of offense, scored its only points late in the fourth quarter. For the game, **Justin Vincent** led the Tigers with 127 yards rushing, while Mauck completed 17 of 28 passes for 224 yards and 3 TDs. Henderson caught 6 passes for 101 yards and 2 TDs, while Clayton had 6 catches for 59 yards and 1 score. The LSU defense limited Cadillac Williams, who was considered a Heisman Trophy Candidate, to 61 yards on 20 carries.

Pair of QBs Lead LSU To 22-21 OT Win Over Oregon State

JaMarcus Russell started the comeback and then Marcus Randall finished it as the Tigers rallied from an 8-point deficit with less than two minutes remaining to force overtime and eventually beat Oregon State, 22-21, in Tiger Stadium in the season-opener for both teams. Trailing 9-0 at halftime, Russell replaced an ineffective Randall and pulled the Tigers to within 9-7 late in the third quarter on a 16-yard TD pass to Skyler Green. OSU answered with a 9-play, 65-yard drive to extend its margin to 15-7. The score remained that way until Russell rallied the Tigers on a 4-play, 64-yard drive capped with a 38-yard TD strike to Dwayne Bowe. Russell then converted the two-point conversion to tie the score at 15-15 with just over a minute left. In overtime and with Russell out with cramps, Randall returned to the field and scored on a 5-yard run to give LSU its first lead at 22-15. OSU followed with a TD of its own, however the extra-point attempt sailed wide right, the third missed PAT for the Beavers, and the Tigers escaped with a 22-21 win. For the game, Russell completed 9 of 26 passes for 145 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall was 7 of 18 for 66 yards and 1 interception. Vincent led the Tigers with 48 yards rushing, while Bowe caught 5 passes for 103 yards and a score.

Tigers Overpower Arkansas State, 53-3

Justin Vincent rushed for 102 yards and 2 TDs and three LSU quarterbacks combined to hit on 12 of 20 passes for 210 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers rolled to a 53-3 win over Arkansas State in Tiger Stadium. LSU wasted little time in establishing itself as the dominant team as the Tigers took the opening kickoff and marched 54 yards in 6 plays for a 7-0 lead following a 5-yard TD run by Vincent just two minutes into the contest. The Indians fumbled the ensuing kickoff and three plays later, Marcus Randall found Corey Webster for a 6-yard TD pass running the score to 13-0. From there, the route was on as the Tigers extended their lead to 23-0 after the first quarter and 37-0 at halftime. Arkansas State got on the board midway through the third quarter with a 34-yard field goal. LSU responded with a pair of touchdowns in a 3-minute span to stretch the lead to 50-3. Ryan Gaudet added a 33-yard field goal in the fourth quarter for the final margin. For the game, the Tigers limited ASU to just 54 yards rushing and only 201 yards of offense. JaMarcus Russell led all LSU quarterbacks by connecting on 7 of 11 passes for 151 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall hit on 5 of 7 for 59 yards and one score. Craig Davis led the Tigers with 4 catches for 73 yards, while Dwayne Bowe caught a pair of TD passes.
