**Third-Ranked Tigers Travel To Face Alabama As Regular Season Winds Down**

LSU, fresh off its second open date of the season, returns to action on Saturday at 6:45 p.m. when the Tigers travel to Tuscaloosa to face Alabama in a game televised to a national audience by ESPN. LSU enters the Alabama game ranked No. 3 in the nation in both national polls. The No. 3 ranking for LSU is its highest since the 1961 season when the Tigers were ranked No. 3 in the AP poll on Nov. 27. The Tigers are ranked No. 4 in the BCS standings. The Tigers are 8-1 overall and 4-1 in SEC action. The 8-1 mark after nine games is the best record for an LSU team since the 1973 squad won its first nine games. Alabama is coming off a 38-0 road win over Mississippi State. The Crimson Tide stands at 4-6 overall and 2-4 in league play. Alabama is not eligible for the league title this season. Last year, Alabama posted a 31-0 win over LSU in Tiger Stadium, the first shutout for the Tigers since a 26-0 loss to the Crimson Tide in 1996 (a span of 72 games). Saturday's game will feature the nation's top rushing defense in LSU (60.3 yards per game) against that of the SEC's top rusher in Alabama's Shaud Williams (114.0 yards per game). The Tigers also lead the nation in scoring defense (9.6 points per game) and they rank fourth in the country in total defense (264.2 yards per game). In all, LSU's defense leads the SEC in seven different categories, while the Tiger offense leads the league in pass efficiency and the special team is tops in the conference in both kickoff return and punt return average.

**LSU Dominates Louisiana Tech in 49-10 Homecoming Win**

LSU quarterback **Matt Mauck** completed his first 14 passes, four of which went for touchdowns, as the seventh-ranked Tigers dominated Louisiana Tech in every phase of the game in a 49-10 win over the Bulldogs. For the game, the Tigers racked up a season-high 653 yards of offense - 372 passing, 281 rushing, while holding Tech's high-powered passing attack to only 220 yards. The contest was never in doubt as LSU scored on five of its first six offensive possessions to take a 49-3 lead at halftime. The Tigers led 28-0 after 15 minutes and then tacked on another score just seconds into the second quarter for a 35-0 advantage. Josh Scobee finally got Tech on the board with a 29-yard field goal early in the second quarter. LSU followed that with scoring plays of 50 yards on a Mauck to **Devery Henderson** pass and then a 22-yard TD run by **Alley Broussard**. For the game, Mauck tied an LSU single-game record by completing 14 straight passes and he set the school-record for completion percentage as he connected on 18 of 20 passes for 311 yards. Broussard led the Tiger ground game with 106 yards and 1 TD on 16 carries, while **Barrington Edwards** added 66 yards on 11 attempts. **Skylar Green** led all LSU receivers with nine catches for 103 yards and 1 TD. Defensively, Tiger safety **Jack Hunt** scored on a 29-yard interception return.

# Nick Saban

HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right leader to lead it. Entering his fourth year as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban is that leader.

Since taking over in Baton Rouge in 2000, Saban has transformed the LSU football program into one that wins championships, while graduating players at the same time.

Equipped with a plan that gives his players the best chance to be successful on the field as well as in the classroom, Saban's impact on the program has been immediate and it's been powerful.

In just three years as LSU's head coach, Saban's on-field success has been nothing short of remarkable, as he's guided the Tigers to 26 victories, a pair of bowl wins, including one in the Bowl Championship Series, and the 2001 Southeastern Conference title. The Tigers have also played in back-to-back New Year's Day bowls for the first time since the 1960s.

On top of LSU's success on the gridiron, the Tigers are being recognized for their efforts in the classroom. Currently, all 22 of the Tiger seniors from the 2002 team are on pace to graduate within the next 12 months, while Rodney Reed earned First Team Academic All-America honors and Bradie James was awarded an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation last year.

Off the field, Saban and his players are active in the community, promoting goodwill by participating in such things as community service projects and visiting hospitals and schools in the Baton Rouge area on a regular basis. Saban has also worn the hat of fundraiser during his stay in Baton Rouge as he spearheaded an effort that raised more than \$15 million for a state-of-the-art academic center for student-athletes. The new Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is part of Saban's plan to give his players the best opportunity to be successful when they finish their football careers. The center, which spans 54,000 square feet, is the best of its kind and features 100 computers, a 1,000-seat auditorium, a library and a communications center for training student-athletes.

Saban became the 31st head coach of the LSU Tigers on November 30, 1999, after five years as head coach at Michigan State.

He didn't waste anytime making his impact felt as he guided a team coming off back-to-back losing seasons to an 8-4 mark and a win over 15th-ranked Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl in 2000 to rekindle the fire of a proud football tradition in Baton Rouge.

A year later in 2001, Saban guided the Tigers to their first outright SEC title since 1986 with a 31-20 win over second-ranked Tennessee in the SEC Championship game. LSU followed that with a 47-34 victory over Illinois in the Sugar Bowl to cap a 10-3 season for the Tigers.

Last year, Saban guided the Tigers to an 8-5 overall mark and a share of the SEC Western Division title. The Tigers also played in a New Year's Day bowl game for the second consecutive year, a first for LSU since the 1960's, with an appearance in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five seasons.

## This Week

LSU returns to action after last week's open date as the Tigers travel to face Alabama in Tuscaloosa. LSU enters the game ranked No. 3 in the nation in both the AP poll as well as the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll. It's the highest ranking for LSU since Nov. 27, 1961 when the Tigers moved up one spot to No. 3 in the nation in the AP poll following a 62-0 win over Tulane to close out the regular season. The Tigers are 8-1 overall and 4-1 in SEC action. The 8-1 mark is the record for LSU after nine games since the 1973 team won its first nine contests. The Tigers haven't been 5-1 in SEC action since 1988, when LSU finished its conference season with a 6-1 record. Alabama enters the game with a 4-6 overall mark and a 2-4 league record after last week's 38-0 win over Mississippi State.

## In The Polls

The Tigers climbed one spot, moving past Florida State, to No. 3 in the nation in both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll on Sunday. The No. 3 ranking is the highest for the Tigers since 1961 when LSU was ranked No. 3 in the nation in an AP poll released on Nov. 27. LSU has now been ranked in the top 10 for nine straight weeks in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll, while the Tigers are in their eight consecutive week in the top 10 in the AP poll. The eight straight weeks in the AP top 10 is the longest for LSU since the 1987 team spent all season ranked among the top 10 teams in the nation. The Tigers reached their highest BCS ranking ever on Monday, coming in at No. 4 this week. The Tigers were ranked No. 12 in the first BCS standings and they have spent the past two weeks ranked No. 7 in the BCS poll.

## Tigers To Play First Game As Nation's No.3-Ranked Team Since 1959 Season

On Saturday, LSU will play a game as the nation's No. 3-ranked team for the first time since the 1960 Sugar Bowl against Ole Miss. The Tigers lost that game to then-No. 2 Ole Miss, 21-0. In all, LSU is 3-1 all-time in games when they are ranked No. 3 in the nation. They were 2-1 as the No. 3 ranked team in 1959 and they were 1-0 as the nation's third-ranked squad in 1958. The Tigers were last ranked No. 3 in the nation in 1961, but the Tigers slipped to No. 4 a week following their No. 3 ranking without playing a game.

## Win One For JB

The LSU Athletic Department suffered a tremendous loss on Oct. 27 as longtime equipment manager **Jeff Boss** passed away after a 10-month battle with brain cancer. Boss, who was 54-years old, is survived by his wife, Karen, and a 13-year old daughter, B.J. Over 500 people attended the memorial service for Boss on Oct. 29, including former LSU football coaches Jerry Stovall, Bill Arnsparger and Mike Archer, along with current head coach **Nick Saban**. Boss had served as LSU's equipment manager since 1980. The LSU football team has dedicated the 2003 season to Boss. Several members of the team, along with coach Saban, presented coach Boss with a game ball from the Louisiana-Monroe game on Sept. 12 at his home. The ULM game was the first time in 24 years that coach Boss was not on the sidelines for an LSU contest. Then, on Sept. 29, LSU named its football locker room in Boss' honor with a formal ceremony that saw dozens of former Tiger football players, covering three decades, attend. The team has worn the letters "JB" on their helmets since the Georgia game. For the first time this year, the team wore letters "JB" on their jerseys against Louisiana Tech. The "JB" will remain on the helmets and the jerseys for the remainder of the season.

QB Brodie Croyle has thrown for 1,722 yards and 13 TDs in nine games for the Crimson Tide ... Alabama ranks fourth in the SEC in total defense, allowing 328.5 yards per game (112.0 rushing, 216.5 passing).

## The LSU Injury Report

The Tigers used the open date to get RB **Shyrone Carey** (knee) healthy as the junior is expected to play for the first time since the Mississippi State game on Saturday vs. Alabama. The Tigers will still be without the services of OG **Nate Livings** as the sophomore is expected to miss 4-5 weeks with an MCL injury in his right knee, which he suffered against South Carolina. Livings had his knee scoped the week of the Auburn game. TE **Demetri Robinson**, who has missed LSU's last two games with a groin injury, is expected to return to action against Alabama.

## LSU After An Open Date

Under Nick Saban, the Tigers are 4-3 after an open date, which includes an 0-1 mark this season. LSU lost to Florida, 19-7, after the first open date this year. The Tigers were 2-0 in 2002 in games that immediately followed an open date. The Tigers were 1-1 in 2000 and 2001 following open dates. The Tigers changed around their practice routine last week, practicing Tuesday through Friday and then giving the players the weekend off. The routine changed from the first open date as LSU worked out on Tuesday through Thursday and then again on Saturday during their first open weekend.

## Tigers Back On ESPN

LSU meets Alabama on ESPN on Saturday, the second time this year the Tigers will appear on the all sports network. LSU beat Auburn, 31-7, on Oct. 26 in a game televised by ESPN. LSU is 22-19 all-time on ESPN, which includes a 5-3 mark under **Nick Saban**.

## A Familiar Face On The Other Sidelines

Former LSU coach **Charlie Harbison** will be on the Alabama sidelines, coaching the wide receivers for the Crimson Tide. Harbison spent the 2001-02 seasons as LSU's defensive backs coach. Prior to that, Harbison coached defensive backs at Alabama from 1998-2000. Other LSU-Alabama ties include current Tiger tight ends coach **Lance Thompson**, who coached the defensive line for the Crimson Tide from 1999-2000. LSU's roster contains five players who call Alabama home - LB **Kenneth Hollis** (Adamsville), QB **JaMarcus Russell** (Mobile), DT **Melvin Oliver** (Opelika), DT **Brandon Washington** (Tuscaloosa) and LB **Chris McCauley** (Homewood).

## Taking Notes On The Tigers Under Saban

Here is a look at some notable LSU trends during its first 47 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 29-2 when leading at halftime and 27-2 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 32-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 31-0 when scoring 25 or more points ... On the other hand, LSU is 2-10 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 8-2 in games decided by 7 points or less and 3-1 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 21-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing and the Tigers are 15-0 when having a 100-yard rusher.

## Odds and Ends About The Tiger Defense

Here's a few quick notes about the LSU defense, a unit that is ranked first in the nation in scoring and second against the run ... The defensive leader is DT **Chad Lavalais**, who spent a year serving as a guard in a prison before enrolling in school ... The team's best cover corner **Corey Webster** is a converted wide receiver ... SS **Jack Hunt** spent his first two years with the Tigers on the offensive side of the ball as a wide receiver ... DE **Marcus Spears** could have gone anywhere in the country to play basketball ... Spears also played his first season with the Tigers as a tight end before moving to defense on a full-time basis as a sophomore ... LB **Eric Alexander** played as a defensive back and a special teams player for the first three years of his college career ... CB **Travis Daniels** burnt his redshirt season after injuries forced him into the fourth quarter of the SEC Championship game in 2001 ... Daniels made the most of his chance, breaking up a pass in the endzone ... FS **LaRon Landry** is a true freshman and he leads the Tigers with 51 tackles.

## LSU "D" Continues Dominance, Tigers Rated No. 1 In Scoring Defense And No. 2 vs. The Run

The Tiger defense continues to be not only one of the best in the SEC, but one of the top units in the nation. LSU enters the Alabama contest with the nation's No. 1 rated scoring defense (9.6 points per game) and the second-best unit against the run, allowing only 60.3 yards rushing per contest. In nine games this season, the Tigers have allowed only one team to reach the 100-yard mark in rushing yards and that came against Louisiana Tech (121 yards on 25 carries). The Tigers also rank fourth in the nation in total defense, allowing 264.2 yards per game (60.3 rushing, 203.9 passing). LSU's defense has yielded only 10 touchdowns all season - 2 rushing, 8 passing. Through nine games, of the 86 points scored against LSU, only 19 have come in the first half.

## Mauck Has Tiger Offense Running On All Cylinders Over Last 3 Games

Since the loss to Florida, LSU QB **Matt Mauck** has had the Tiger offense clicking as the junior has completed 59 of 78 passes (75.6 percent) for 734 yards and 9 touchdowns. Mauck has only thrown 2 interceptions during that span as the Tigers are averaging 505.3 yards of offense and 37.7 points in wins over South Carolina, Auburn and Louisiana Tech. The Tigers are also rushing for 233.7 yards over the 3-game stretch with **Justin Vincent** (251 yards, 3 TDs) and **Alley Broussard** (245 yards, 2 TDs) leading the way. Also during LSU's current 3-game winning streak, the Tigers have converted on 22 of 43 3rd-down opportunities.

## Lavalais Leads Tigers With 6 Sacks and 11 TFLs

DT **Chad Lavalais**, the SEC Defensive Player of the Week after LSU's win over Auburn, leads the Tigers with 6 sacks and 11 tackles for losses this season. Lavalais, a former prison guard, has 37 tackles and 13 quarterback hurries this years. For his career, Lavalais has 10 sacks and 27 tackles for losses.

## LSU Starting Defense Has Yet To Allow A Rushing TD

LSU's starting defense enters the Alabama game riding a streak of nine straight games without allowing a rushing touchdown. LSU has allowed 2 rushing TDs this season, but those came in the fourth quarter of wins over Louisiana-Monroe and Arizona, games in which the starting lineup had long left the field.

## Tiger Defense Continues To Be Stingy

Through 36 quarters this season, LSU's defense has held the opponent out of the endzone in 23 of those. Florida became the first team since Kentucky last year to score an offensive TD in the first quarter against the Tigers. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had allowed only 3 first half points all season, that being a field goal vs. Georgia in Week 4. In all, the Tigers have held all nine of its opponents this year to less than 20 points, something that hasn't been done at LSU since 1967 when the Tigers held their first nine opponents to less than 20 points.

## LSU's Rodney Reed Named National Scholar-Athlete

**Rodney Reed**, who is one of the most decorated student-athletes in LSU football history, added another honor to an already impressive resume as he was selected as a National Scholar-Athlete by the National Football Foundation. The award is one of the top academic honors available to a college football player and it carries with it an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship. Reed is one of only 15 football players covering all NCAA divisions as well as NAIA to receive the award. He also becomes the second National Scholar-Athlete in as many years for LSU, joining Bradie James, who was honored last year. Past LSU recipients of the award include: offensive lineman Robert Dugas (1977), linebacker Nacho Albergamo (1987), quarterback Sol Graves (1990) and punter Chad Kessler (1997). "This is a tremendous honor and something that I am extremely proud of," Reed said. "It is quite an accomplishment that two student-athletes from the same school have won the award two years in a row. It's good to get recognized and it speaks well for the program. I think this also speaks highly for the academic center and the way Coach Saban stresses academics and not just football."

## Three Tigers Named To Academic District VI Team

LSU quarterback **Matt Mauck**, offensive tackle **Rodney Reed** and strong safety **Jack Hunt** have all been named to the First Team Academic District VI squad, the College Sports Information Directors of America announced this week. District VI is comprised of universities in the states of Louisiana, Texas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Arkansas and Mississippi. To be eligible for the team, players must have at least a 3.2 overall grade point average. Mauck, a pre-dentistry major, has a 3.72 grade point average. Reed, a First Team Academic All-America in 2002, earned a spot on the all-district team for the third straight year. Reed graduated in May with a 3.9 grade point average in accounting. He is currently pursuing a Master's degree in accounting. Hunt carries a 3.39 grade point average in chemistry. All three Tigers are now eligible for the Academic All-America team, which will be announced later this month.

## Clayton Named One Of 10 Semifinalist For Biletnikoff Award

LSU WR **Michael Clayton** is one of 10 players from across the nation named as a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award. Clayton, a junior from Baton Rouge, is the only player from the Southeastern Conference on the list. Other semifinalists include Pittsburgh's Larry Fitzgerald, Oklahoma State's Rashaun Woods, Southern Cal's Mike Williams, Washington's Reggie Williams, Texas' Roy Williams, Oklahoma's Mark Clayton, North Carolina State's Jerricho Cotchery and Florida State's Craphonso Thorpe. Clayton currently leads LSU and ranks among the national leaders with 45 receptions for 705 yards and six touchdowns. Clayton is the only player in LSU history to have at least 700 yards receiving in three consecutive seasons. Clayton has also caught at least one pass in all 35 games of his collegiate career. Former LSU standout Josh Reed won the Biletnikoff Award in 2001.

## Webster Named Semifinalists For Thorpe Award

LSU CB **Corey Webster** has been named one of 12 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award, which goes annually to college football's best defensive back. Webster, a junior from Vacherie, La., has started all nine games at cornerback for the Tigers and he's recorded 36 tackles, three interceptions and 17 passes defended. He's also forced a fumble and had three quarterback hurries. Webster, a converted wide receiver, ranks among LSU's all-time leaders with 10 career pass interceptions, which includes tying a school-record with three in one game last year against Florida. Other semifinalists for the Thorpe Award include: Jamaal Brimmer (UNLV), Josh Bullocks (Nebraska), James Butler (Georgia Tech), Jason David (Washington), DeAngelo Hall (Virginia Tech), Keiwan Ratliff (Florida), Stuart Schweigert (Purdue), Derrick Strait (Oklahoma), Sean Taylor (Miami-Fla.), Mark Walker (TCU), and Darrent Williams (Oklahoma State).

## Jones Named Named Semifinalists For Ray Guy Award

LSU P **Donnie Jones** is one of 10 players from across the country named to the list of semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award, the Greater Augusta Sports Council announced. Jones, a Second Team All-Southeastern Conference pick in 2002, is currently averaging 42.9 yards on 38 punts. LSU's net punting average of 40.3 ranks second in the SEC and 19th in the nation. Of his 38 punts, Jones has had 12 downed inside the 20-yard line. Jones, a Baton Rouge native, currently holds the LSU career record for punts with 206 and punting yards with 8,670 and he ranks second in school history with a 42.1 punting average. Other Ray Guy Semifinalists include: Kyle Basler (Washington State), Vinnie Burns (Virginia Tech), Duston Colquitt (Tennessee), Kyle Larson (Nebraska), Andy Lee (Pittsburgh), Tom Malone (Southern Cal), Adam Podlesh (Maryland), Matt Prater (Central Florida) and B.J. Sander (Ohio State).

## Tiger Defense Has 4 Scores Of Its Own

In addition to being difficult to score on, the Tiger defense has also created points of their own this season, scoring four touchdowns in 2003. The Tigers have returned three interceptions for touchdowns - **Jack Hunt** vs. UL-Monroe and Louisiana Tech and **Travis Daniels** vs. Mississippi State and they have returned one fumble for a score - **Jason LeDoux** vs. South Carolina. The four defensive TDs are the most by an LSU team since the 1991 team scored four touchdowns.

## LSU Starts 4-1 in SEC In Back-To-Back Seasons; Looks To Go 5-1 For First Time Since '88

LSU's win over Auburn moved the Tigers to 4-1 in league play, marking the second straight year in which LSU has won four of its first five conference games. The back-to-back 4-1 starts is something that hasn't been accomplished at LSU since the late 1980's when the Tigers won four of their first five league games from 1986-88. The last time the Tigers started 5-1 came in 1988 when LSU finished 6-1 on its way to a share of the SEC title.

## Tigers Look For Best Start After 10 Games Since 1973

A win on Saturday against Alabama would give LSU a 9-1 record and it would mark the best start for the Tigers after nine games since the 1973 team opened with a 9-1 mark. LSU went 9-3 in 1973.

## Tiger Defense Still Tough To Score On

In nine games this year, LSU has yielded only 86 points to its opponents. The 86 points is the fewest by an LSU team since the 1985 squad held its first nine opponents to 79 points. Last year, through nine games LSU had allowed 138 points.

## Just How Loud Is Tiger Stadium?

Two students from LSU's Department of Astronomy and Physics were on the field for the Auburn game. The students registered a reading of 117 decibels, which matched the highest reading ever recorded in Tiger Stadium. A reading of 117 decibels was first recorded in LSU's game against Alabama in 1996. The reading of 117 decibels vs. Auburn matched that of the 1996 reading and can be compared to that of a rock concert. It is believed that LSU's game against Auburn in 1988 had a higher decibel reading, the only official reading from that game came on the seismograph machine across campus in the Geology Department. ## Vincent and Broussard Are First True Frosh Tandem To Rush For 100 Yards in Same Season Since Hilliard and James

Against South Carolina, **Alley Broussard**, a true freshman from Lafayette, La., rushed for 108 yards in leading LSU to a 33-7 win over South Carolina. A week later, **Justin Vincent**, another true freshman, did the honors as he rushed for a career-best 127 yards on 14 carries for an average of 9.1 yard per rush in the win over Auburn. Broussard added another 100-yard game vs. Louisiana Tech, going for 106 yards on 16 carries. Vincent and Broussard are the first true freshman running backs at LSU to rush for 100 yards in a single-game in the same season since Dalton Hilliard and Garry James did it in 1982. Hilliard rushed for 100 yards five times as a true freshman in 1982, while James did it three times. In LSU's last three games, both of which Vincent has started, he's rushed for 251 yards and 3 TDs on 34 carries. Vincent leads all Tigers in rushing with 383 yards and 5 TDs on 64 carries. Broussard has accounted for 253 yards and 3 TDs on 59 attempts, while LSU's third true freshman running back Barrington Edwards has 155 yards rushing on 32 attempts.

## That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach **Nick Saban** has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In his fourth season at LSU, Saban has put together a 22-5 mark at home, which includes an 11-4 record in SEC games. Under Saban, the Tigers are 6-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium. LSU's 18 wins over Saban's first three years in Baton Rouge is the most over a three-year period for LSU in Tiger Stadium since the Tigers won 18 homes games from 1972-74.

## LSU's Held 8 of 9 Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards Rushing

Louisiana Tech became the first team this year to crack the 100-yard mark vs. LSU this season as the Bulldogs rushed for 121 yards against LSU on Nov. 1. Prior to that, LSU had held its first eight opponents to

fewer than 100 yards rushing, which included limiting Auburn to 50 yards rushing and holding South Carolina to zero rushing yards. Tech became the first team since Texas in last year's Cotton Bowl to rush for 100 yards in a game against LSU. In addition, Tech running back Ryan Moats had 124 yards rushing to become the first player since Arkansas' Fred Talley (118 yards) to rush for 100 yards in a game against LSU as he did it in Week 12 last year. Florida rushed for 81 yards against LSU on Oct. 11 to become the first team to beat LSU under **Nick Saban** despite gaining less than 100 yards rushing. The Tigers are 21-1 under Saban when holding their opponent to less than 100 yards rushing. LSU's current stretch of holding eight of its first nine opponents to under 100 yards rushing is the best stretch by an LSU defense since the 1970 squad held 10 of its 11 regular-season opponents to less than 100 yards. The only team during the regular-season that gained 100 or more yards against the Tigers in 1970 was Baylor, who had 104 yards in Week three. The 1970 LSU team still holds the school record for rushing defense (52.2) and rushing yards allowed for a season (574). To date, LSU has allowed 543 yards on 255 carries.

## Tiger Defense Continues To Be Spectacular In All Phases

Whether it's against the pass or the run, the Tiger defense has been one of the best all-around units in the SEC. LSU is ranked either Nos. 1 or 2 in the SEC in eight of 11 categories, including leading the conference in seven categories. LSU leads the league and the nation in scoring defense (9.6 points per game), the Tigers are first in the SEC and second in the nation in rush defense (60.3 yards per game), and they are first in the SEC in pass efficiency defense (96.7 rating), sacks (28), opponent 1st downs (131), opponents' 3rd-down conversion percentage (25.2) and red zone defense (47.1 percent).

## Open Wide

QB **Matt Mauck** spent Monday, Oct. 6 taking the Dental Admissions Test. Mauck, who also considered pursuing a career in medicine, has now opted to becoming a dentist. Mauck, who carries a 3.8 grade point average, will graduate in December with a degree in kinesiology.

## LSU's Been Good At Getting The Defense Off The Field On 3rd Down

One of the obvious keys to LSU's success has been their ability to get the defense off the field on third-down situations. Through nine games, the Tigers lead the SEC with a 25.2 third-down conversion percentage by their defense. In 135 third-down attempts this season, LSU has allowed its opponent a first down on 34 of those tries. Florida is the only team to have a better third-down percentage than LSU in a game as the Gators converted 7 of 18 attempts, compared to just 3 of 12 for the Tigers. The Tigers are even better on third-down once the opponent crosses midfield as LSU has allowed only 7 of 39 third-down attempts this season for 17.9 percent.

## Skyler Makes Most of Punt Returns; Leads Nation In Punt Return Average

**Skyler Green** finally has enough punt returns to qualify for the individual rankings both in the SEC and in the NCAA statistics and to no surprise, the sophomore is ranked first in both with a 26.1 average. On 11 punt returns this year, Green has 287 return yards. Against Auburn, Green opened with a 44-yard returned that setup LSU's third first-quarter TD. For the game, he finished with 87 yards on five punt returns. To date, Green has returned two punts for TDs, including an 80-yarder against Florida. On the first punt return of his career against Arizona, Green raced 62 yards for a touchdown. Green is the first player since Todd Kinchen in 1991 to have two punt returns for TDs in the same season and he's one shy of tying the school mark of 3 set by Pinky Rohm in 1937. Louisiana Tech kicked all seven of its punts away from Green.

## Mauck Tosses 3 TDs In Game For 6th Time; Ranks 8th In School History

In just 15 games as LSU's starting quarterback, **Matt Mauck** has already tossed at least 3 touchdowns in a game six times after throwing 4 TDs vs. Louisiana Tech. For his career, Mauck has 28 TD passes, which ties Bert Jones for sixth place in school history. This year, Mauck has thrown 19 TD passes, which ties for the second-highest total with Tommy Hodson in school history. Tommy Hodson holds the school mark in both categories with 69 for his career and 22 in a season.

## Mauck Comes Out Firing Vs. Louisiana Tech

**Matt Mauck** tied a school-record by completing his first 14 passes in LSU's 49-10 win over Louisiana Tech. The 14 straight completions tied the mark set by Chad Loup vs. Arkansas in 1993. In addition, Mauck finished the game 18 of 20 for 90.0 percent, which set the school-record for completion percentage in a single-game with a minimum of 20 passes. Mauck also set a career-best for passing yards with 311 and he tied a career-best with 4 TDs, all coming in the first half.

## Clayton Joins The 2,000-Yard Club

WR **Michael Clayton**, a junior, became only the fifth player in LSU history to record 2,000 receiving yards in a career as he went over the mark against Florida. Clayton currently ranks fourth in school history with 2,208 receiving yards. He is also fourth in LSU history in receptions with 149, third in receiving TDs with 17 and seventh in career 100-yard receiving games with six. With 45 catches for 705 this year, Clayton is the first player in LSU history with at least 700 yards receiving in three consecutive seasons. Clayton had 754 yards on



47 catches as a freshman and he followed that with 749 yards on 57 catches last year.

## Henderson Closing In On Single-Season Receiving TD Record

LSU WR **Devery Henderson** is within 2 TDs of tying the school-record for receiving touchdowns in a season. Currently, Henderson has 9 TD receptions this year, two shy of the mark of 11 held by Wendell Davis in 1986. For his career, Henderson has 17 TDs, which ties fellow Tiger **Michael Clayton** as the third-highest total in school history. Wendell Davis holds the mark with 19 from 1984-87.

## Donnie Jones Adds His Name To Another LSU Punting Record

**Donnie Jones** now holds two of LSU's three career punting records as the Baton Rouge native holds the school mark in punting yards (8,670) and total punts (206). In four years with the Tigers, Jones has a total of 8,670 punting yards, which broke the mark of 7,976 held by Chad Kessler (1994-967). In LSU's game against Mississippi State, Jones broke Kessler's career punts mark. For his career, Jones has punted 206 times for an average of 42.1 yards per kick, a figure that ranks second to Kessler's 42.9 career average.

## Throwing To The Tight Ends

LSU's tight ends aren't just for blocking as the rotation of **Eric Edwards**, **David Jones**, **Keith Zinger** and **Demetri Robinson** have caught their share of passes this season. The foursome have accounted for 25 receptions for 305 yards and 1 TD. Edwards leads all LSU tight ends with 13 catches for 138 yards and 1 TD. Against South Carolina, LSU tight ends caught nine passes, that's the most in a single-game for that position in LSU history. Edwards led the way with 5 receptions for 37 yards and 1 TD. The 5 receptions by Edwards was the most by an LSU tight end since Robert Royal caught 5 passes for 72 yards against Utah State in 2001.

## Mauck Starts Another TD Streak

After having his streak of consecutive games with a TD pass snapped at nine against Florida, QB **Matt Mauck** got started on another streak, throwing for 2 TDs vs. South Carolina, 3 vs. Auburn and 4 vs. Louisiana Tech. In 15 career starts, Mauck has thrown at least one TD pass in 12 games. The nine straight games with at least one TD pass was the longest streak by a Tiger since Herb Tyler did it in 12 straight games covering the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

## TD-Less First Half Streak Comes To An End Against Florida

LSU's streak of keeping its opponent out of the endzone in the first half came to an end against Florida as the Gators became the first team this year to score a first half touchdown against the Tigers. Florida's first quarter TD marked the first time LSU had given up an offensive TD since last year's Cotton Bowl when Texas scored a pair of second quarter touchdowns against the Tigers. Through nine games, LSU has allowed only 19 first half points for an average of 2.1 points per game. Dating back to last year, LSU has had its opponents scoreless in the first half in eight of its last 11 games.

## LSU Buckles Down In The Redzone

The Tiger defense is holding its opponents to a staggering 47.1 percent scoring success rate when they get inside the LSU redzone. Against Florida, the Gators had one redzone opportunity stopped at the 1-yard line when **Brandon Washington** forced a fumble that was recovered by **Adrian Mayes**. The Tigers also held the Gators to a field goal on another redzone chance in the second quarter. LSU also held Georgia to just three points despite three trips inside the redzone against the Tigers in a 17-10 win over the Bulldogs on Sept. 20. So far this season, in 17 redzone chances for its opponent, LSU has allowed only 8 scores - 5 touchdowns and 3 field goals.

## Tigers Still Rank No. 2 In SEC In Scoring

LSU still ranks second in the SEC in scoring as the Tigers are averaging 35.7 points a contest as they have scored 321 points through the first nine games of the season. The 321 points is the most by an LSU team in the modern history of Tiger football. The 1977 team holds the school record for most points in a season with 375.

## How About Those Special Teams

A quick check of the special teams categories in the SEC shows that LSU leads the league in punt returns (15.7), kickoff returns (25.8), and they are second in kickoff coverage (17.4), and net punting (40.3). LSU ranks fourth in the nation in punt returns and kickoff returns and they are 19th in net punting.

## Go Figure

Between 1997 and Nov. 16, 2002, LSU failed to reach 20 points in an SEC contest 15 times. The Tigers lost all 15 of those games. Dating back to last year's Ole Miss game on Nov. 23, LSU has now won two of its last four SEC games when failing to reach the 20-point mark. Last year, LSU beat Ole Miss 14-13 for its final SEC victory and the Tigers opened up conference play this year with a 17-10 victory over Georgia. Prior to last

year's win over Ole Miss, LSU had not won an SEC game when scoring less than 20 points since a 7-6 victory over Vanderbilt in 1997. You have to go all the way back to 1993 to find a two-game span when the Tigers won SEC games despite failing to reach 20 points. That year, LSU beat Ole Miss, 19-17 and then followed with a 17-13 win over Alabama. LSU also beat Mississippi State 18-16 that year.

## Saban Knows Pass Efficiency

One thing that LSU coach **Nick Saban** did over the summer was research pass efficiency and how a quarterback's efficiency related to wins and losses. Saban said the research proved that the quarterback with the better pass efficiency in a game usually leads his team to a victory. So far that has proven to be true as the Tigers have won all eight games in which their quarterback pass efficiency was better than its opponent. The one time that the opponent had the better efficiency (Florida), the Tigers lost. Currently, LSU ranks first in the league and seventh in the nation in pass efficiency with a 157.0 rating. **Matt Mauck** is first in the SEC and 12th in the nation with a 156.7 QB rating.

## Tigers Have Experience on the O-Line

The LSU offensive line has been touted as one of the best in the nation. The Tiger offensive line may be one of the most experienced as the LSU front five have 136 career starts between them. **Rodney Reed** leads the way with 43, followed by **Stephen Peterman** with 34, **Ben Wilkerson** with 28 and **Andrew Whitworth** 22. **Rudy Niswanger** got his first career start vs. Auburn, replacing the injured **Nate Livings** at left guard. Niswanger started again vs. Louisiana Tech. Livings had started LSU's first 7 games before suffering a knee injury vs. South Carolina. LSU is 22-5 when Reed, Peterman and Wilkerson start on the offensive line together (8-0 in 2001, 6-4 in 2002, 8-1 in 2003).

## Tigers Keep Opponents To Less Than 20 Points For 25th Time Under Saban

By holding Louisiana Tech to only 10 points, the Tigers have now limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 28 of the 46 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 25-3 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 28 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 15 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted four shutouts under Saban.

## Clayton, Henderson, and Green... LSU's Triple-Threat Receiving Corps

One thing is for certain and that is if defenses key too much on **Michael Clayton**, then **Devery Henderson** will make them pay. Focus on Henderson, then Clayton takes over. Concentrate on Henderson and Clayton and then **Skyler Green** will take over. At least that's how it's been over the first nine games of the year. Clayton, Henderson and Green have combined for 101 catches for 1,443 yards and 15 TDs for the Tigers. Clayton and Henderson have each gone over 100 yards three times this year, while Green has done it once. Clayton ranks third in the league in receptions per game (5.0), while Henderson is seventh with 4.22 a contest. Clayton is third in the SEC in yards per game (78.3) and Henderson is fifth at 69.6 yard a contest. Clayton leads the team with 45 receptions for 705 yards and 6 TDs, with Henderson second with 38 receptions for 626 yards and 9 scores and Green next with 33 catches for 396 yards and 4 TDs.

## Mauck Picks Apart South Carolina Defense

**Matt Mauck** reset his career high for completions for the second time this year, connecting on 24 of 30 attempts vs. South Carolina. The 24 completions bettered his previous high of 23 set against Western Illinois in the Week 3 this year. Against South Carolina, Mauck connected on his first five and 11 of his first 12 passes. Mauck was 14 of 17 at halftime and 20 of 25 at the end of the third quarter.

## Mauck Has Completion Strings of 17 and 16 This Year

QB **Matt Mauck** has recorded completion streaks of 17 and 16 this year for the Tigers. The 17 straight tied a school-mark and were over a 2-game span. Mauck completed his final 10 passes in LSU's 59-13 win over Arizona on Sept. 6 and he followed that by completing 7 straight vs. Western Illinois. The 17 straight completions ties the mark set by Rohan Davey, who completed 6 straight vs. Arkansas to close the 1999 season and then opened the 2000 season by hitting 11 straight vs. Western Carolina. Mauck's 16 straight completions covered games against Auburn (last 2 passes) and Louisiana Tech (first 14 passes).

## Run Skyler Run

In nine games this year, **Skyler Green** has touched the ball in a variety of ways. He's rushed twice for 24 yards, he's caught 33 passes for 396 yards, he's returned 11 punts for 287 yards and he's returned four kick-offs for 89 yards. In all, Green has touched the ball 50 times and he's accounted for 796 yards for an average of 15.9 yards every time he gets his hands on the ball. Green has also accounted for 6 TDs, including the game-winner vs. Georgia. Green puts the ball in the endzone every 8.3 times he touches the ball. To date, he's recorded 4 receiving TDs and he's returned 2 punts for touchdowns.

## 100-150-300 vs. Western Illinois A Rarity For Tigers

LSU's trio of QB **Matt Mauck**, RB **Shyrone Carey** and WR **Michael Clayton** combined for a rarity vs. Western Illinois on Sept. 13. Carey rushed for 124 yards, Clayton caught passes netting 162 yards and Mauck threw for 305 yards as the trio became just the fourth group in school history to have 100-yards rushing, 150-yards receiving and 300-yard passing in the same game. The last time the Tigers had a 100-yard rusher, a 150-yard receiver and a 300-yard passer in the same contest came against Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. In that game, Domanick Davis rushed for 122 yards, Josh Reed had 239 yards receiving and Rohan Davey threw for 444 yards. The other two times came in 2001 as well as the Tigers did it against Kentucky (Toefield 129 rushing, Reed 160 receiving, Davey 383 passing) and then against vs. Arkansas (Toefield 173 rushing, Reed 183 receiving, Davey 359 passing).

## Tigers Have Had 100 On The Ground and 100 Through The Air 3 In 2003

For the third time this season, the Tigers had a 100-yard rusher and a 100-yard receiver in the same game as LSU accomplished the feat against Louisiana Tech. Against the Bulldogs, **Alley Broussard** rushed for 106 yards, while **Skyler Green** had 103 yards receiving. What's impressive about the feat this year is that all three games have featured a different player rush for 100 yards and a different 100-yard receiver. ## Mauck Win Streak Snapped At 10 Straight

**Matt Mauck's** winning streak as LSU's starter quarterback came to an end at 10 straight with the loss to Florida. Mauck, who is 13-2 as LSU's starting quarterback, had not lost a game since his first start vs. Virginia Tech in last year's season-opener. Mauck's 10-1 start was the best by an LSU QB since Herb Tyler won 10 of his first 11, including his first eight, as a starter from 1995-96. In addition, Mauck has played in 18 games in his LSU career and the Tigers are 15-3 in those contests.

## Webster Has 10 Career Interceptions

He was a basketball superstar in high school. He came to LSU as a wide receiver and played there for a year before moving to the secondary. Now, in just his second season as a starter at CB **Corey Webster** has already moved up to seventh place in school history in interceptions after recording the 10th career pick vs. Georgia. The interception, which made Webster look more like a magician, came with just over a minute left in the contest and sealed LSU's 17-10 win over Georgia. The pick was the third of the year for Webster, who ranks second in the SEC and 20th nationally in the category. Webster began his career at LSU as a WR, catching seven passes for 74 yards in 12 games as a freshman. In 22 games on defense, Webster has 10 interceptions for 98 yards and 1 TD.

## The Long Ball

LSU has scored on plays of 40 yards or longer in five games this year, which includes two scoring plays or better than 40 yards vs. Louisiana Tech. The Tigers also scored on a 64-yard TD pass from **Matt Mauck** to **Devery Henderson** on their first possession vs. Auburn. This year, LSU has thrown 21 TD passes with eight of those going for at least 40 yards. Mauck has 6 TD passes of at least 40 yards this year, while backup QB **Marcus Randall** has accounted for the other two. Last year, the Tigers had just three touchdown passes from over 40 yards, with two of those coming in the Kentucky game.

LSU coach **Nick Saban** moved past Mike Archer into sole possession of sixth place in school history in wins with his 28th victory in the Tigers' win over Arizona. Saban picked up win No. 33 vs. Auburn, moving past Gerry DiNardo into sole possession of fifth place at LSU. In just over three years with LSU, Saban has posted a 34-13 overall mark. Saban also has 77 career victories. In his 10th season overall, Saban has put together an overall record of 77-39-1. Charles McClendon holds the school-record with 137 victories in 19 years as LSU's head coach.

## Saban Adds Another Notch To SEC Belt

With the win over Georgia on Sept. 20, LSU coach **Nick Saban** has now recorded at least one win over all but one SEC team. The only team Saban has yet to beat in the only team he hasn't faced - Vanderbilt. In just over three years at LSU, Saban has recorded 18 SEC victories - 19 counting the SEC title game in 2001. Saban has four wins over Mississippi State, three over Kentucky, and two each against Auburn, Alabama, Ole Miss, South Carolina and Tennessee and one over Georgia, Florida, and Arkansas. Saban's current SEC mark, which includes regular-season games only, stands at 19-10.

## Jimbo Keeps Spreading It Around In The Passing Game

LSU offensive coordinator **Jimbo Fisher** has done a good job keeping opposing defenses off balance when it comes to the passing game. Through 9 games this year, LSU has had at 15 players catch at least one pass. Against South Carolina, nine different Tigers caught at least one pass and of the 26 LSU completions, 12 went to wide receivers, 9 went to tight ends and 5 went to running backs.

## Clayton Runs Streak To 35 Straight Games

LSU WR **Michael Clayton** ran his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 35 after recording 4 catches vs. Auburn. Clayton has caught at least one pass in every game in which he has played during his career.

## Tigers Rebound Again Under Saban After A Loss

One thing is certain and that is LSU does a good job of bouncing back after a loss under **Nick Saban**. After the 33-7 win over South Carolina, LSU is now 10-3 under Saban after a loss. LSU has lost back-to-back games under Saban only three times. LSU is 4-0 under Saban when the game following a loss comes on the road - LSU beat Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl following a loss to Arkansas in 2000; LSU beat Alabama in Tuscaloosa following a home loss to Ole Miss in 2001; the Tigers beat Kentucky in Lexington following a loss to Auburn in 2002; LSU beat South Carolina in Columbia following a loss to Florida in 2003.

## LSU Secures Second Straight Winning Season vs. SEC Eastern Division

LSU's win over South Carolina gave the Tigers a winning record vs. the SEC Eastern Division for the second straight year and the third time in four years under **Nick Saban**. The Tigers were 2-1 vs. the East this year. LSU had won six straight against the East before Florida snapped the streak on Saturday. The last time LSU had a winning record against the SEC East in back-to-back seasons came in 1996-97. In all, Saban has a 9-4 mark vs. the SEC East, which includes a 31-20 win over Tennessee in the SEC Championship game in 2001. Prior to Saban's arrival and since the SEC went to divisions in 1992, LSU posted a 6-17-1 vs. the East from 1992 to 1999.

## True Freshmen On The Field

Through 9 games, LSU has played 14 true freshmen. LSU opened the season by playing 11 true freshmen against UL-Monroe and then 12 played against Arizona. A new wrinkle to this year's offensive grade sheet is the tracking of both pancakes and knockdowns for the LSU offensive line. Through 9 games **Andrew Whitworth** leads the Tigers with 13 pancakes. Offensive guard **Stephen Peterman** is tops among the Tigers with 85 knockdowns.

## Cap and Gown Tigers

LSU has two players on this year's roster who have already earned their bachelor's degree - OT **Rodney Reed** and C **Jimmy Courtenay**. Reed and Courtenay both graduated last May. Reed, who earned First Team Academic All-America honors last year, graduated with a 3.9 grade point average in accounting. He is currently pursuing his Master's in accounting.

## Peterman's Pulling Double-Duty

As of Tuesday, Aug. 26, senior offensive lineman **Stephen Peterman** began pulling double-duty as well, only his is as a player and daddy. Peterman's wife Colleen gave birth to a 6-pound, 10-ounce baby boy in Metairie, La. Peterman missed two days of practice to be with his wife during the birth, but he returned to the squad on Thursday and started on Saturday against UL-Monroe. The newest Peterman, Stephen Frederick, Jr., checked in at some 318 pounds lighter than his daddy.

I'd been warned prior to my first visit to Baton Rouge that the legendary Death Valley mystique was a myth. That assessment couldn't have been more wrong. Tiger Stadium was as loud as any I've ever heard during the dramatic fourth quarter of Saturday's Georgia game, the festivities surrounding it as advertised.

The streets were lined with purple and gold. Smoke emanated from the grills in the parking lot. Shouts of "Go Tigers" and "Tiger Bait" echoed from the stadium deep into the heart of campus.

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 80th year in the venerable stadium on SATURDAY NIGHT.

• Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 22-5 HOME RECORD, including a 6-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 10-4 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 17-3 since Saban took over.

• LSU has won NINE OF ITS LAST 10 games at home, including an eight-game win streak during the stretch. That was the longest home streak for the Tigers since winning eight straight from 1995-96.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 26 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 17 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP FIVE IN THE NATION, including the last three.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 186-62-4 (.745) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 15-21-3 (.434) at home during the day in that span.

• Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 91,600 fans.

### Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

### Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

## Alabama Runs Past LSU in Shutout

Shaud Williams and Santonio Beard each accounted for over 100 rushing yards as No. 10 Alabama ran for 300 yards en route to a 31-0 win over No. 14 LSU. The shutout marked the first time since 1996 in which the Tigers have been held scoreless in a game, a streak of 72 games. The Crimson Tide got on the board first with a 6-yard run by Beard at the 3:52 mark in the second quarter. LSU pinned the Tide on their 4-yard line just before halftime, but Alabama went 96 yards on none plays over the final 1:41 of the half to take a 14-0 lead on a 2-yard run by Tyler Watts. LSU never did recover managing a season-low 196 yards of offense, while allowing a season-high of 477 yards. One bright spot for the Tigers was the return of running back LaBrandon Toefield, who rushed for 22 yards on 5 carries. LSU had just 65 yards passing in the loss.

## LSU's Rolls Past UL-Monroe, 49-7

Matt Mauck threw three touchdown passes, Joseph Addai rushed for 81 yards and Michael Clayton caught six passes for 152 yards and a pair of TD passes as LSU rolled to a 49-7 win over Louisiana-Monroe in the season-opener for both teams. The game was only four minutes old when a thunderstorm rolled into Baton Rouge and caused a 39-minute delay because of lightning. After a scoreless first quarter, Mauck then threw three TD passes over the final seven minutes of the second quarter to put the Tigers up 21-0 at halftime. Shyrone Carey added a 1-yard run midway through the third quarter to give LSU a 28-0 advantage and the Tigers stretched the margin to 35-0 with a 31-yard interception return just 16 seconds later. Louisiana-Monroe scored its only points of the contest on a 12-yard run by Kevin Payne with 14:10 left in the fourth quarter. Freshman Alley Broussard capped the scoring for the Tigers with a 1-yard run with 10:39 left in the contest. For the game, the Tigers racked up 474 yards of offense (306 passing, 168 rushing) compared to just 240 yard for the Indians (59 rushing, 181 passing).

LSU Storms Past Arizona, 59-13, In The Desert

LSU scored on its first seven possessions, including a 15-play, 80-yard drive to open the contest, as the Tigers had little trouble with Arizona, posting a 59-13 win over the Wildcats in Tucson, Ariz. Quarterbacks Matt Mauck and Marcus Randall combined to connect on 19 of 25 passes for 299 yards and two TDs and Joseph Addai rushed for 86 yards and a pair of scores to lead the Tigers. Michael Clayton led all receivers with six catches for 109 yards and a 48-yard TD reception. Addai opened the scoring for LSU with a 1-yard run midway through the first quarter. LSU QB Matt Mauck connected on 23 of 32 passes for a career-best 305 yards and four TDs as the Tigers overcame a slow start to post a 35-7 win over Western Illinois last Saturday in Tiger Stadium. **Mauck-To-Green Leads LSU Past No. 7 Georgia, 17-10**

Matt Mauck connected with Skyler Green for a 34-yard touchdown pass with 1:22 left in the contest as 10th-ranked LSU knocked off seventh-ranked Georgia, 17-10, before a record crowd of 92,251 in Tiger Stadium. The win lifted LSU to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC action and it marked the first Tiger victory over a top 10 team in Tiger Stadium since a 28-21 win over No. 1 Florida in 1997. The Tigers led 7-3 at halftime thanks in part to an outstanding defensive effort by LSU over the first 30 minutes. In the first half alone, Georgia got inside the LSU 30-yard line five times and came up with only three points. Trailing 3-0, the Tigers took a 7-3 lead on a 21-yard run by Shyrone Carey with 3:10 left in the first half. The Tigers extended their margin to 10-3 on a 47-yard field goal by Ryan Gaudet at the 6:23 mark in the third quarter. LSU appeared to have the game in hand, but a fumble by Mauck at the Georgia 15-yard line with less than 5 minutes left gave the Bulldogs another chance. Two players later Georgia's David Greene hit Tyson Browning on a screen pass, which he took 93 yards for a touchdown to tie the score at 10-10. Devery Henderson returned the ensuing kickoff 48 yards to the LSU 49-yard line to setup the game-winning touchdown for the Tigers. Georgia got into LSU territory in the final minute, but an interception by Corey Webster at the 22-yard line sealed the Tiger victory.

**Opportunistic Tigers Feast on Mississippi State, 41-6**

LSU turned three Mississippi State turnovers into 21 points and the Tiger defense limited the Bulldogs to only 31 yards rushing as LSU rolled to a 41-6 win in Starkville. After a slow start, LSU took a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by Shyrone Carey. Leading 10-0 after a Ryan Gaudet field goal, the Tigers stretched the margin to 17-0 midway through the second quarter on another 1-yard run by Carey. Carey's second TD was setup by an interception by Jack Hunt, who returned the pick to the MSU 1-yard line. The Tigers led 24-0 at half-time after Travis Daniels returned an interception 48-yards for a TD with less than a minute remaining in the first half. Defensively, the Tigers sacked MSU quarterback Kevin Fant five times and limited the Bulldogs to only 239 yards of offense.

A flat LSU football team couldn't overcome a series of penalties and a key injury to starting running back Joseph Addai as the Tigers dropped their first game of the season to Florida, 19-7, in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers actually scored the first points of the game as Skyler Green, subbing for an injured Shyrone Carey, returned a first quarter punt 80-yards for a touchdown and a 7-0 LSU lead. Florida responded with a 13-play drive to tie the game at 7-7 on a 22-yard pass from Chris Leak to Ran Carthon. The Gators took the lead for good at 10-7 on a 29-yard field goal by Matt Leach at the 3:17 mark in the first quarter. The Gators led 13-7 at halftime after another field goal by Leach. Florida extended its lead to 19-7 on a 35-yard pass from Leak to Ciatric Fason with 5:21 left in the third quarter. The Tigers had a couple of chances to get back in the game negated, one by a penalty and another on a fumble. A penalty wiped out a 42-yard pass from Matt Mauck to Michael Clayton in the third quarter that would have given the Tigers the ball at the Florida 28-yard line. Then late in the fourth quarter with the game still in doubt, Mauck hit Devery Henderson in stride with a pass to the Florida 31-yard line, which he then fumbled away at the UF 14-yard line. For the game, the Tigers sacked Leak six times and forced another Florida turnover on the LSU 1-yard line. Mauck completed 19 of 33 passes for 231 yards and a pair of interceptions, while Leak led Florida with 18 of 30 passing for 229 yards and 2 TDs.

### Tigers Ride Freshman Running Backs to 33-7 Win Over South Carolina

True freshman running backs Justin Vincent, Alley Broussard and Barrington Edwards combined to rush for 222 yards and 2 TDs and quarterback Matt Mauck connected on 24 of 30 passes for 199 yards and 2 scores as 10th-ranked LSU rolled past South Carolina, 33-7, in Columbia. Playing without its two starting running backs in Joseph Addai and Shyrone Carey, who were both out with knee injuries, the Tigers rushed for a season-high 263 yards on 52 carries. LSU finished with 482 yards off offense, while holding South Carolina to only 254 yards of offense, including zero rushing yards. LSU jumped out to a 19-0 first half lead and never looked back in cruising to the victory. LSU had first half drives of 21-plays and 97 yards and 14-plays and 91 yards that both culminated in touchdowns, the second of which gave LSU a 19-0 lead on a 1-yard run by Vincent just before halftime. South Carolina pulled to within 19-7 after a 77-yard TD early in the third quarter before LSU linebacker Jason LeDoux put the game out of reach with a 15-yard fumble return for a touchdown later in the quarter. Vincent added another 1-yard run midway through the fourth quarter for LSU's final point. Broussard led LSU with 108 yards rushing on 19 attempts, while Vincent had 77 yards and 2 TDs rushing and added another 46 yards receiving on four receptions.

**LSU Shuts Down Cadillac, Auburn in 31-7 Win**

In a game that featured the nation's top rushing defense in LSU against one of the best at running the football in Auburn, LSU came out on top, limiting Auburn to 50 yards rushing in a 31-7 win in Tiger Stadium. LSU struck early and often in the game as the Tigers rolled up 21 first half points and never looked back in posting its biggest win over Auburn since a 35-7 victory in 1972. Matt Mauck connected with Devery Henderson on a 64-yard scoring pass on the sixth play of the game for a 7-0 LSU lead. After the LSU defense stopped Auburn on a fourth-and-one at the 48-yard line, the Tigers needed only six more plays for take a 14-0 advantage as Mauck found Michael Clayton for an 18-yard TD. Alley Broussard capped the first quarter scoring with a 5-yard run for a 21-0 LSU lead, which is where the game stood at halftime. Ryan Gaudet kicked a 33-yard field goal and then Mauck hit Henderson for another TD pass to give the Tigers a 31-0 lead in the third quarter. Auburn, who was held to only 193 yards of offense, scored its only points late in the fourth quarter. For the game, Justin Vincent led the Tigers with 127 yards rushing, while Mauck completed 17 of 28 passes for 224 yards and 3 TDs. Henderson caught 6 passes for 101 yards and 2 TDs, while Clayton had 6 catches for 59 yards and 1 score. The LSU defense limited Cadillac Williams, who was considered a Heisman Trophy Candidate, to 61 yards on 20 carries.

**LSU Dominates Louisiana Tech in 49-10 Homecoming Win**

LSU quarterback Matt Mauck completed his first 14 passes, four of which went for touchdowns, as the seventh-ranked Tigers dominated Louisiana Tech in every phase of the game in a 49-10 win over the Bulldogs. For the game, the Tigers racked up a season-high 653 yards of offense - 372 passing, 281 rushing, while holds Tech's high-powered passing attack to only 220 yards. The contest was never in doubt as LSU scored on five of its first six offensive possessions to take a 49-3 lead at halftime. The Tigers led 28-0 after 15 minutes and then tacked on another score just seconds into the second quarter for a 35-0 advantage. Josh Scobee finally got Tech on the board with a 29-yard field goal early in the second quarter. LSU followed that with scoring plays of 50 yards on a Mauck to Devery Henderson pass and then a 22-yard TD run by Alley Broussard. For the game, Mauck tied an LSU single-game record by completing 14 straight passes and he set the school-record for completion percentage as he connected on 18 of 20 passes for 311 yards. Broussard led the Tiger ground game with 106 yards and 1 TD on 16 carries, while Barrington Edwards added 66 yards on 11 attempts. Skler Green led all LSU receivers with nine catches for 103 yards and 1 TD. Defensively, Tiger safety Jack Hunt scored on a 29-yard interception return.
