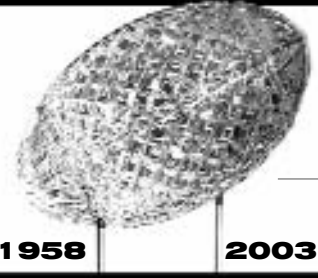

### Tigers Host Alabama In SEC Western Division Matchup

Two of the nation's best defenses will be on display on Saturday in Tiger Stadium when LSU hosts Alabama at 6:45 p.m. LSU, ranked No. 15 in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll and No. 17 in the Associated Press poll, will be playing the third game of its 4-game home stand against the Crimson Tide. The game will be televised to a national audience by ESPN. LSU, which is coming off its second open date in the last four weeks, is 6-2 overall and 3-2 in Southeastern Conference action. The Tigers have won 3 straight overall and 8 consecutive games in Tiger Stadium, which includes a 24-7 win over Vanderbilt in their last contest on Oct. 30. Alabama is coming off a 30-14 win over Mississippi State and the Crimson Tide stands at 6-3 overall and 3-3 in league play. Last year, LSU posted a 27-3 win over Alabama in Tuscaloosa. LSU's 8-game home winning streak is the longest for the Tigers since 2001-02 when the Tigers won 8 straight in Tiger Stadium before falling to Alabama on Nov. 16, 2002. Alabama brings the nation's No. 1 rated defense in terms of total yards into Tiger Stadium, while the Tigers are No. 4 in the country. Through 9 games, the Crimson Tide is allowing only 223.8 yards per game (116.3 rushing, 107.4 passing), while the Tigers are yielding 256.5 yards per game (102.1 rushing, 154.4 passing). Alabama also ranks among national leaders in scoring defense at 13.6 points per game, while the Tigers are allowing 15.9 points a game.

### Tiger Defense Comes Up Big in 24-7 Win Over Vanderbilt

Skyler Green returned a punt 65 yards for a touchdown and the LSU defense held Vanderbilt scoreless in the second half as the Tigers won their third straight with a 24-7 victory over the Commodores. Outside of a 13-play, 83-yard drive late in the second quarter, the Vanderbilt offense did very little against the Tigers as LSU held the Commodores to 289 yards of offense and just 15 first downs. The Tigers lead 3-0 after the first quarter on a 26-yard Ryan Gaudet field goal and then increased the margin to 10-0 on a 1-yard run by Alley Broussard in the second quarter. Vanderbilt cut the lead to 10-7 just before halftime on a 1-yard run by Jay Cutler. The Tigers stretched their lead to 17-7 by taking the second half kickoff and going 81-yards on 6-plays, capped with a Marcus Randall 34-yard TD pass to Craig Davis. Green capped the LSU scoring with a 65-yard punt return for a TD midway through the third quarter. For the game, Broussard led the Tigers with 80 yards rushing on 9 carries, while Joseph Addai added 77 yards on 14 attempts and Randall 68 yards on eight carries. Randall led the Tigers through the air by completing 4 of 6 passes for 78 yards and 1 TD, while JaMarcus Russell hit on 2 of 5 passes for 24 yards.

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right person to lead it. In four years as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban has proven to be that leader.

Since taking over a program that suffered through seven losing seasons in the 1990s, Saban has guided the Tigers to the pinnacle of college football - winning the 2003 BCS National Championship with a 21-14 victory over Oklahoma in the Nokia Sugar Bowl. The victory culminated a four-year ride under Saban that has been unmatched in the history of Tiger football. Since taking the reigns in 2000, Saban has guided the Tigers to a 45-15 overall mark, while claiming a pair of SEC titles in 2001 and 2003. LSU's 2003 BCS National Championship is just the second for the Tigers in football, and the first since 1958.

Saban's ability to successfully lead the Tigers comes from a management style that focuses on the entire program, one that puts his players in position to have success, both on the field and in the classroom. Armed with a plan that starts with recruiting quality people, outstanding football players and good students, Saban and his staff have transformed LSU into a team that is sure to be a fixture among the nation's elite programs for years to come.

On the field, Saban has developed a reputation as a defensive mastermind who is among the best in the game - professional or college - when it comes to game day coaching decisions. His defenses are physical, aggressive and deceptive, while offensively, the Tigers put up staggering numbers with a wealth of skill players leading the way. His teams play hard, make good decisions on the field and have proven that they are confident enough to overcome any type of adversity that is thrown in their direction.

It's a style and system that has proven to be successful, both for the team as well as the individual as six Tigers have earned First Team All-America honors in four years, while 18 of his LSU players have gone on to be selected in the NFL Draft, including six in the 2004 draft.

Off the field, Saban demands excellence from his players in both the classroom as well as the community. While the Tigers were marching to the 2003 national title on the field, the LSU football team combined for a 2.52 grade point average. A few months later, the squad bettered that mark with a 2.76 average for the spring semester as the Tigers had 50 players with a 3.0 or better during the spring and just six athletes that failed to reach a 2.0.

In addition to the honors the Tigers garnered on the field, LSU had 25 players earn a spot in the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 2003. Once again, numbers that show not only is Saban committed to academics, but his players are also dedicated to receiving an education as well. Since December of 2000, 51 football players who played under Saban at LSU have earned their degree, which includes 13 members of the 2003 national championship squad.

A major part of enhancing and cultivating the education experience for the student-athletes at LSU has been the addition of the \$15 million state-of-the-art Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes. Saban spearheaded the fundraising for the center, which included donating \$50,000 of his own money to the cause. The center, the best of its kind in college athletics, features a 1,000-seat auditorium with over 100 computers in a 54,000-square foot facility that gives all of LSU's student-athletes the best chance to have success in the classroom.

Saban's mission statement for the LSU football program is simple. He wants his players to become better people for having been a part of the program. He also wants to develop his players so they can reach their full athletic potential, which will enable them to have the opportunity to win a championship. Finally, it's his plan to help each player graduate and launch their career so that when they leave LSU they can have the best opportunities to be successful in life.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five years.

## The Game

The Tigers return to action on Saturday against Alabama following their second open date of the season. The Tigers enter the Alabama contest riding a 3-game winning streak following wins over Florida (24-21), Troy State (24-20) and Vanderbilt (24-7). LSU is 6-2 overall and 3-2 in conference play. Alabama, 30-14 winners over Mississippi State last week, is bowl-eligible at 6-3 overall. They are 3-3 in league play.

## Who's In And Who's Out For The Tigers

LSU enters Alabama week with four players out of action. Senior C **Ben Wilkerson** ruptured the patella tendon in his left knee against Vanderbilt and is out for the remainder of the season. Wilkerson underwent successful surgery to repair the tendon on Nov. 1. In addition to Wilkerson's injury, freshman WR **Xavier Carter** fractured his clavicle following a kickoff return and will miss 4 to 6 weeks of action. Other injuries for the Tigers include WLB **Dorsett Buckels**, who tore the ACL in his knee in the opening kickoff against Florida and will be sidelined for the remainder of the year. In addition, DB **Mario Stevenson** (foot) has been out since the first week of the season after suffering a broken bone in his foot. Stevenson's timetable for a return is still uncertain at this time.

## In The Polls

The Tigers moved up two spots to No. 15 in this week's USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll. LSU remained No. 17 in the Associated Press poll for the second straight week. LSU has been ranked for 30 consecutive ranking periods in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll and for 29 straight in the Associated Press poll.

## About Alabama

Alabama is 6-3 overall and 3-3 in SEC action ... The Crimson Tide has won 3 of their last 4 games ... Alabama leads the nation in total defense (223.8 yards per game) and passing defense (107.4 yards per game) and the Crimson Tide is sixth in the nation in scoring defense (13.6 points per game) ... The most points scored against Alabama this year is 27 by Arkansas in a 27-10 Razorback win ... RB Kenneth Darby leads the team and ranks second in the SEC in rushing at 103.7 yards per game ... Darby has rushed for 933 yards and 7 TDs in 9 games ... QB Spencer Pennington has completed 36 of 71 passes for 391 yards and 2 TDs since taking over for injured Brodie Croyle ... Mike Shula is in his second season as head coach at Alabama with a 10-12 overall mark.

## Alabama Tigers

LSU has 5 players on its roster who call Alabama home. Among the Alabama natives on the LSU roster include junior linebacker **Kenneth Hollis** (Adamsville), freshman defensive back **Chevis Jackson** (Mobile), freshman quarterback **JaMarcus Russell** (Mobile), junior defensive end **Melvin Oliver** (Opelika) and junior defensive tackle **Brandon Washington** (Tuscaloosa). LSU equipment manager **Greg Stringfellow** (Mobile) is also a native of Alabama.

## Spears Makes Semifinalist Cut For Three National Awards

LSU DE **Marcus Spears** has made the list of semifinalist for three national awards - the Lombardi Award, the Bednarik Award and the Lott Trophy. Spears is one of 12 semifinalists for the Lombardi Award, which goes to college football's top lineman, offensive or defensive, who, in addition to displaying outstanding performance and ability, best exemplifies the character of Vince Lombardi. Spears is one of 12 semifinalists for the Bednarik Award, which goes to college football's outstanding defensive player. He's one of 7 semifinalists for the Lott Trophy, which is given to college football's defensive IMPACT player of the year, which is someone who has had the biggest impact on his squad both on and off the field. IMPACT stands for integrity, maturity, performance, academics, community and tenacity, all characteristics exhibited by Lott during his playing career. Through 8 games, Spears has 27 tackles to his credit and he ranks fifth in the SEC with 10 tackles for losses. Spears also has 15 quarterback hurries, 3 quarterback sacks and he's returned an interception 35 yards for a touchdown.

## LSU Runs Tiger Stadium Winning Streak To 8 Straight

LSU's 24-7 win over Vanderbilt ran the Tigers' home field winning streak to 8 straight, a streak that covers all 5 games in 2004 and the final three home games in 2003. The last time LSU lost at home came on Oct. 11, 2003 when Florida posted a 19-7 win over the Tigers. Since then, LSU has outscored its opponents 309-92 at home for an average of 38.6-11.5 in those 8 games. The 8-game home winning streak is the longest for LSU since the Tigers won 8 consecutive home games over the span of the 2001-2002 seasons. That streak was snapped by Alabama on Nov. 16, 2002 by a 31-0 count. Prior to the current 8-game streak and the 8-game streak in 2001-02, the longest home winning streak for LSU came from 1971-73 when the Tigers won 15 consecutive game before Alabama snapped the streak with a 21-7 win over LSU in 1973.

## After An Open Date

The Tigers are 6-3 in games following an open date under **Nick Saban**. LSU was 1-1 following open dates in 2000, 2001 and 2003 and 2-0 following the open dates in 2002. The Tigers are 1-0 this year following a 24-20 win over Troy, which came after LSU's first open date of the season.

## LSU On A Nice Run - Tigers 19-3 Over Last 22 Games

Dating back to the start of the 2003 season, LSU has won 19 of its last 22 games. The 19-3 record is the best by an LSU team since the early 1970's when the Tigers were 19-2-1 over a 22-game span that covered the last game of the 1971 season, all 12 games in 1972 and the first 9 games in 1973. Including the last 4 games of the 1971 season, LSU actually went 22-2-1 over a 25-game span from 1971-73.

## LSU's Been Nearly Unbeatable In November Under Saban

LSU will play a game in November for the first time this year when they face Alabama on Saturday. The Tigers are currently riding 4-game winning streak in games played in November, all coming last year. Since 2000, the Tigers are 11-3 in November in Saban. In addition, in November games played in Tiger Stadium, the Tigers are 6-1. The Tigers were 2-1 in November in 2000, 3-0 in 2001, 2-2 in 2002 and 4-0 in 2003. Alabama is the only team to beat LSU in Tiger Stadium in November under Saban. The Crimson Tide posted a 31-0 win over LSU in Baton Rouge on Nov. 16, 2002.

## Tigers To Go Without Wilkerson

LSU C Ben Wilkerson had his season (and collegiate career) come to an abrupt halt against Vanderbilt as he ruptured the patella tendon in his left knee against the Commodores. Wilkerson started 41 games at center during his career with LSU going 33-8 in those games. Dating back to the 2001 season (Wilkerson's first with the Tigers), he had started 41 of LSU's last 44 games with the Tigers going 33-8 over that span. Rudy Niswanger, a junior with a 4.0 grade point average, is expected to start in Wilkerson's place against Alabama.

## Back On ESPN

The Tigers will play on ESPN for the third time this year on Saturday against Alabama. The Tigers are 2-0 this year on the all sports network with wins over Oregon State (22-21 OT) and Florida (24-21). LSU is 25-19 all-time on ESPN, which includes an 8-3 mark under Nick Saban. LSU has won four straight games that have been televised by ESPN.

## This Day vs. Night Thing In Tiger Stadium

Myth has it that LSU plays better at night in Tiger Stadium than they do during the day. The facts show that since 1960, LSU is 191-62-4 (.751) at night under the lights compared to a 17-21-3 (.451) mark in Tiger Stadium during the day. Since taking over in 2000, LSU coach Nick Saban has guided the Tigers to a 28-5 mark at home. LSU is 22-3 (.880) at night in Tiger Stadium under Saban and they are 6-2 (.750) at home during the day since 2000. Prior to Saban's arrival, LSU had only won 11 games at home during the day in 33 tries. From 1960 to 1999, LSU posted an 11-19-3 (.379) record at home during the day.

## That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach Nick Saban has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In 4-plus seasons at LSU, Saban has put together a 28-5 mark at home, which includes a 14-4 record in SEC games. LSU finished its 2003 season 6-1 at home after going 6-1 in Tiger Stadium in 2002. Under Saban, the Tigers are 6-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium.

## Taking Note On The Tigers Under Saban

Here is a look at some notable trends for LSU during its first 60 games under Nick Saban ... LSU is 38-3 when leading at halftime and 35-3 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 42-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 36-0 when scoring at least 25 points in a game ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 3-12 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 13-3 in games decided by 7 points or less and 6-2 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 30-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 team rushing yards and the Tigers are 20-0 when having a player rush for 100 yards.

## Tigers Are Bowl-Eligible

LSU's win over Vanderbilt gave the Tigers their sixth win of the season. In the process, the Tigers are now bowl-eligible for the fifth straight year, which is the longest streak for the school since going to 5 consecutive bowl games from 1984-88.

## Tigers Have Kept Opponents To Less Than 20 Points 35 Times Under Saban

By holding Vanderbilt to just 7 points in week 8, the Tigers have limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 36 of the 60 games they have played under Nick Saban. Under Saban, the Tigers are 32-4 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game in 2003, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 36 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 20 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted five shutouts under Saban, which is the most by any SEC team since 2000.

## Skyler Ties LSU Record For Punt Returns For TDs

With a 65-yard punt return for a TD against Vanderbilt, Skyler Green tied Pinky Rohm and Tommy Casanova for the career mark at LSU with 3. Green returned 2 punts for TDs in 2003 and then tied the record with his punt return for a TD against Vanderbilt on Oct. 30. For his career, Green has returned 38 punts for 591 yards and 3 scores. The 591 yards ranks seventh in LSU history. Domanick Davis holds the LSU career punt return yardage record with 1,126 yards on 94 returns.

## Davis Finally Gets A TD

Craig Davis, LSU's leading receiver, scored the first TD of his career vs. Vanderbilt with a 34-yard scoring reception from Marcus Randall. Through 8 games, Davis has 32 receptions for 504 yards and 1 score. Davis ranks seventh in the SEC in receptions per game (4.0) and he's fourth in receiving yards per game (63.0).

## Another Fourth-Quarter Comeback

LSU's comeback from a 20-17 deficit late in the fourth quarter to beat Troy represents the eighth time, including three in 2004, that LSU has rallied to win games under Nick Saban despite trailing in the final quarter. Earlier this year, LSU rallied from a 15-7 fourth quarter deficit to force overtime against Oregon State before eventually beating the Beavers, 22-21. In consecutive games, LSU came from 21-17 down to beat Florida, 24-21 and then the Tigers rallied from a 20-17 deficit to beat Troy. Prior to Oregon State win, the last time the Tigers rallied to win in the fourth quarter came against Kentucky in 2002 when Marcus Randall connected with Devery Henderson on a 75-yard TD pass as time expired for a 33-30 LSU win. Over the 8 fourth-quarter comeback wins for the Tigers since 2000, Randall has been involved in 5 as he threw the game winning TD against Kentucky and Ole Miss in 2002 and then ran for the game-winning score against Oregon State in overtime. The following is a look at LSU's other fourth quarter comebacks under Saban that resulted in a victory for the Tigers:

## Wroten Comes Up Big Against Vanderbilt

LSU DT Claude Wroten played his best game in an LSU uniform against Vanderbilt with 6 tackles, including 3 resulting in 9-yards in losses against the Commodores. Wroten also added a pair of sacks, forced a fumble and had 4 quarterback hurries for the Tigers. Of Wroten's 6 tackles, 5 were solo stops. For his effort, Wroten earned SEC Defensive Lineman of the Week honors. In 8 games this year, Wroten has 29 tackles, 6 tackles for losses and 2 sacks.

## Tigers Second-Best In SEC Over Last 5 Years

Since 2000, LSU has won 45 football games, a number that ranks second to Georgia's 48 among teams in the SEC. LSU is 45-15 since 2000, all coming under Nick Saban. Georgia ranks first during that time span with a 48-13 mark. The following is a look at how teams in the SEC rank by wins over the last 5 years:

## Randall Now 6-6 As LSU's Starting QB; 3-0 As A Reliever

Marcus Randall ran his record as a relief quarterback to 3-0 as he came off the bench to lead the Tigers to a 24-7 win over Vanderbilt. This year, Randall has come off the bench to lead the Tigers to wins over Florida and Vanderbilt. His other relief victory came against Ole Miss in 2002. As a starter, Randall is 6-6, which includes a 4-2 mark in 2004 and a 2-4 record in 2002.

## 5 Turnovers + 19 Yards = 31 Points

It may look like bad math, but that's what 5 of LSU's turnovers resulted in against Florida and Troy. Florida and Troy took 5 LSU turnovers, drove a total of 19 yards on offense and still wound up with 31 points off of those turnovers. Florida had TD drives of 5 and 3 yards against LSU and then Troy followed that with TD drives of 10 and 2 yards. Troy also drove minus 1-yards and still managed to kick a second quarter field goal following an LSU interception that the Trojans returned to the LSU 7-yard line.

## LSU's Scoring Defense Average Misleading

While the Tigers are allowing 15.9 points per game, that number is not truly indicative of the type of defense that LSU has put on the field this season. Consider that of the 16 touchdowns LSU has allowed in 2004, 8 have come on drives of 40 yards or less, including 6 of 25 yards or less and 4 of 10 yards or less (5 and 3 yard vs. Florida; 10 and 2 yards vs. Troy). On the other hand, LSU's defense has only yielded one scoring drive of 80-yards or more and that came against Vanderbilt (83 yards) in week 8 of the season. Prior to Vanderbilt's 83-yard scoring drive, the longest against LSU this year was a 71-yard drive by Georgia.

## Tigers Have Surrendered Only 10 Second Half Points Over Last 6 Quarters

More proof that LSU's defense tends to get stronger as the game wears on, LSU has only surrendered 10 second half points over the last 6 quarters, all of those coming by Troy State. In a 24-21 win over Florida in Gainesville, LSU shutout the Gators in the second half. Troy State scored 10 points (7 in the third quarter, 3 in the fourth quarter) a week later. The Tigers then followed that with a second half shutout of Vanderbilt a week later.

## Tigers 4th In Nation In Total Defense

The Tigers continue to stake their claim as one of the nation's best overall defenses as LSU is ranked No. 4 in the country in total defense, allowing 256.5 yards per game. The Tigers are also fourth in the nation (second in the SEC) in pass defense, allowing 154.4 yards per game. LSU is second in the SEC and 15th nationally in rushing defense, giving up 102.1 yards per game. Through 8 games, the Tigers are allowing only 15.9 points per game, a figure that ranks fourth in the SEC and 15th nationally. Last year, LSU ranked first in the nation in scoring defense (11.0 points per game), and total defense (252.0 yards per game).

## Turnovers Haven't Been Kind To LSU

Turnovers have been a problem for LSU through 8 games as the Tigers have turned the ball over 21 times, compared to just 14 takeaways by the Tiger defense. Of LSU's 21 turnovers, 13 have been fumbles, with the other 8 being interceptions. In addition, of LSU's 21 turnovers, 13 have come on the short side of the field and 7 have resulted in eventual touchdowns for the opponent. Florida and Georgia each scored 14 points off of LSU's turnovers, while Troy scored 17 of its 20 points off of turnovers.

## LSU's Kick Coverage Units Have Been Tremendous

LSU's coverage on both punts and kickoffs have been outstanding this year as the Tigers rank first in the SEC in punt coverage with a 1.4 average and their second in the league in kickoff coverage, allowing only 16.1 yards per return. The longest punt return against LSU this year has been 13 yards and the longest kickoff return against the Tigers has been 34 yards.

## LSU's Sack Streak At 33 Straight Games

With 5 sacks against Vanderbilt, LSU ran its streak of games with at least one sack to 33 straight. The streak dates all the way back to the Miami (Ohio) game in 2002 when the Tigers sacked Ben Roethlisberger three times. Since then, LSU has had at least one sack in every game, which includes all 14 games in 2003. This year, through 8 games, the Tigers have 22 sacks that have accounted for 168-yards in losses. **Kyle Williams** leads the Tigers with 4 sacks, while **LaRon Landry** and **Marcus Spears** each have 3 sacks to their credit.

## A Loaded Backfield

One thing is certain about the LSU offense and that's the Tigers have a loaded backfield that includes juniors **Joseph Addai** and **Shyrone Carey** along with sophomores **Alley Broussard** and **Justin Vincent**. The Tigers have 3 running backs in its backfield that have a 100-yard game to their credit with Vincent leading the way with 6 career 100-yard games. Broussard has 2 career 100-yard games, while Carey has done it once. LSU is also two yards away from having four players with 100-yard games as Addai has rushed for as many as 98 yards in a game, but he's never topped the 100-yard mark. LSU's four running backs of Vincent, Broussard, Addai and Carey have combined to rush for 3,876 yards and 37 TDs.

## Bowe and Davis A Nice 1-2 Sophomore Punch At Receiver

LSU sophomores **Dwayne Bowe** and **Craig Davis** have teamed to give the Tigers a nice 1-2 punch at wide-out. Through 8 games, the duo has combined to catch 60 passes for 926 yards and 6 TDs. Davis leads the Tigers with 32 receptions for 504 yards and 1 TD, while Bowe has 28 catches for 422 yards and a team-best 5 TDs.

## 15 Tigers Have Caught Passes In 2004

A trademark of a Jimbo Fisher-offense is that of spreading the ball around. Through 8 games, the Tigers have done a lot of spreading it around as 15 different players have been on the receiving end of passes. Of the 15 players who have caught passes, 7 are wide receivers, 4 are running backs and 4 are tight ends. **Craig Davis** leads all receivers with 32 catches, **Joseph Addai** is tops among running backs with 15 catches and **David Jones** leads the tight ends with 6 receptions, including the game-winner against Troy.

## 11 Different Tigers Have Scored On Offense in 2004

Last year, LSU had 12 different players score offensive touchdowns all year. This year, through 8 games, the Tigers have had 12 players reach the endzone for a score on offense. ## Green's Caught At Least 1 Pass In 22 Straight Games

LSU junior WR **Skyler Green** ran his streak of games with at least one reception to 22 straight games in which he has played on offense with 6 catches for 72 yards against Troy. Green, who did not play on offense in 3 of LSU's first 4 games this year, returned to action against Georgia. Green had 1 catch for 11 yards vs. Vanderbilt, which snapped his streak of games with at least 2 receptions at 18 straight. Green's career high for receptions came against Louisiana Tech with 9 receptions. For his career, Green has 72 receptions for 809 yards and 7 TDs. This year, Green has 17 catches for 167 yards and 1 TD.

## Spears Dominating Against Troy

LSU DE **Marcus Spears** had one of the best games for a Tiger defender in a decade as the senior had 9 tackles (8 solo), including 6 tackles for losses and a pair of sacks in the 24-20 win over Troy. Spears' 6 tackles behind the line of scrimmage totaled 34 yards in losses, while his 2 sacks went for 22-yards in losses. Spears also batted down a pass and added a pair of quarterback hurries. For the year, Spears has 23 tackles, 8 tackles for losses and 3 sacks. He's also returned an interception 35 yards for a TD, that coming against Mississippi State.

## Gaudet Takes Over PATs And Short-Range Field Goals For Tigers

**Ryan Gaudet** has taken away part of the kicking chores away from **Chris Jackson** as he serves as LSU's kicker for PATs and short-range field goals. Since taking over the PAT duties against Florida, Gaudet has made all 8 of his point-after kicks. For the year, Gaudet is 4 of 4 on field goals and he's 9 of 10 on PATs. Last year, Gaudet was 36 of 38 on PATs for the Tigers and 7 of 12 on field goals.

## Randall Has Career Night Against Troy

LSU QB **Marcus Randall** set career-highs for completions (24) and passing yards (328) in the 24-20 win over Troy. The 24 completions bettered his previous career-high of 19 set against Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl, while the 328 yards passing surpassed the 264 yards he passed for against Kentucky in 2002. The 328 yards also marked the 14th-highest passing game in LSU history and it was the most by a Tiger quarterback since **Rohan Davey** threw for 444 yards against Illinois in the Sugar Bowl on Jan. 1, 2002.

## Randall Leads Tigers To Another Fourth Quarter Comeback

**Marcus Randall** has already etched his name into Tiger football lore as the quarterback who was on the throwing end of the "Bluegrass Miracle", the 75-yard TD pass to **Devery Henderson** as time expired to beat Kentucky, 33-30, in 2002. In consecutive games in 2004, Randall led the Tigers to back-to-back fourth quarter comebacks. He did it against Florida on Oct. 9, leading the Tigers from a 14-0 first quarter deficit to a 24-21 win. Against the Gators, Randall guided the Tigers on a 6-play, 50-yard drive, culminating with a 10-yard TD pass to **Joseph Addai** for the winning points with only 27 seconds left. Then, against Troy on Oct. 23, Randall led the Tigers on a 4-play, 54-yard drive with just over 2 minutes left in the game for a 24-20 win over Troy. It marks the 4th fourth quarter comeback that Randall has directed during his career with the Tigers. The other came against Ole Miss in 2002 when Randall led LSU to a 14-13 win over the Rebels in Tiger Stadium.

## Webster Closing In On LSU Career Interception Mark

With an interception against Mississippi State, LSU senior CB **Corey Webster** moved a step closer to the school's career interception mark. For his career, Webster has 15 interceptions, just 5 shy of tying **Mike Williams'** school-record for interceptions at 20. Webster intercepted 7 passes in 2002 and 2003. He has 1 interception to his credit this year. Webster tied the school-record for interceptions in a single-game with 3 against Florida in 2002. Webster leads all active players in the SEC in both interceptions and pass deflections (45).

## LSU's Defense Scores Again

LSU's defense was back up to its old tricks against Mississippi State as the Tiger "D" scored a touchdown, the ninth for the Tigers since the start of the 2003 season. Dating back to the first game in 2003, LSU has now scored 9 defensive TDs in 20 games. Against Mississippi State, DE **Marcus Spears** intercepted a pass and returned it 35 yards for a TD, the second TD of his career. Against Arkansas State in week 2 of the season, LSU linebacker **Ali Highsmith** intercepted a Nick Noce pass at the ASU 11-yard line and returned it to the 1-yard line where he fumbled, which was picked up by cornerback Travis Daniels, who walked into the endzone for the score. Last year, the Tigers scored a school-record 7 defensive TDs (5 interception returns, 2 fumble returns).

## Russell In Elite Company

With a pair of TD passes in each of his first two games in an LSU uniform, **JaMarcus Russell** did something that hasn't been done at the school since at least 1970. As far as detailed records account, Russell is the first LSU quarterback to toss at least 2 touchdown passes in his first two games as a Tiger. The only player since 1970 that came close was **Tommy Hodson**, who threw for a pair of TDs in his debut against Texas A&M in 1986. Hodson didn't throw any TD passes the following week in a 21-12 loss to Miami (Ohio).

## Tigers Reach 50-Point Mark Again

For the fourth time in the last two seasons, LSU reached the 50-point mark with a 51-0 win over Mississippi State. The 51 points came just two weeks after the Tigers racked up 53 points in a 53-3 victory over Arkansas State. Last year, the Tigers beat Arizona, 53-13, and Arkansas, 55-24. In all, the Tigers have scored 50 points in a game five times under **Nick Saban**. The first time came in Saban's debut at LSU as the Tigers rolled to a 58-0 win over Western Carolina to open the 2000 season.

## Russell Shined In Debut

LSU QB **JaMarcus Russell** shined in his much anticipated debut as the redshirt freshman started the second half and rallied the Tigers to an overtime win over Oregon State. Russell led the Tigers on two second half scoring drives, which included tossing a 38-yard TD pass to **Dwayne Bowe** with just over a minute left in the contest to pull the Tigers to within 15-13. Russell then tied the game with a two-point conversion that sent the game into overtime. In overtime, Russell suffered cramps to his legs and was forced out of the contest midway through LSU's possession. For the game, Russell completed 9 of 26 passes for 145 yards and 2 TDs.

## LSU Ranks Ninth In Active NFL Players

With 33 former Tigers on active NFL rosters, LSU ranks ninth among all schools with former players currently in the NFL. Miami tops the list with 43 followed by Florida State with 39. Notre Dame and Tennessee are next with 38, followed by Florida, Georgia and Ohio State with 36 each. Michigan is next with 35, then LSU at 33.

## Randall Named SEC Player of the Week For Performance Against Florida

LSU senior quarterback **Marcus Randall** earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 11 after leading the Tigers to a 24-21 fourth-quarter comeback win over 12th-ranked Florida. For the game, Randall connected on 18 of 27 passes for 198 yards and two touchdowns, including the game-winner with 27 seconds left. Randall also rushed for 46 yards on 10 carries in the game. The 18 completions were one shy of tying his career best of 19 set against Texas in the Cotton Bowl. With the Tigers trailing 21-17 late in the fourth quarter, Randall, who has also engineered fourth quarter comeback wins over Ole Miss and Kentucky during his career, guided the Tigers on a 6-play, 50-yard drive during the final two minutes of the contest to beat the Gators. Randall clinched the comeback with a 10-yard TD pass to **Joseph Addai** with only 27 seconds left in the contest. The SEC Player of the Week honor is the second of Randall's career. He was named SEC Player of the Week in 2002 after leading the Tigers to a 14-13 win over Ole Miss on Nov. 23.

## Webster Named SEC Defensive Player of the Week Following Win Over Miss. State

LSU CB **Corey Webster** earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week following his performance in the 51-0 win over Mississippi State. Webster, a senior from Vacherie, La., recorded two tackles, had an interception, forced a fumble and recovered a fumble in the Tiger shutout of the Bulldogs. Webster did most of his damage in the first quarter as he forced and recovered a fumble that led to LSU's second touchdown of the game. Three possessions later, Webster intercepted an Omarr Conner pass at the LSU 30-yard line. The Tigers scored seven plays later for a 20-0 lead. Webster's interception was his first of the season and 15th of his career, leaving him just five shy of tying Mike Williams for the school record of 20. The honor for Webster is the third time in his career that he's been recognized as the league's player of the week. Webster first won the award following a three interception game against Florida in 2002 and then again last year for his performance in LSU's 17-10 win over Georgia in September.

I'd been warned prior to my first visit to Baton Rouge that the legendary Death Valley mystique was a myth. That assessment couldn't have been more wrong. Tiger Stadium was as loud as any I've ever heard during the dramatic fourth quarter of Saturday's Georgia game, the festivities surrounding it as advertised.

- LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 81st year in the venerable stadium on SATURDAY NIGHT.

- Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 28-5 HOME RECORD, including a 6-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 13-4 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 20-3 since Saban took over.

- LSU has won 16 OF ITS LAST 18 games at home, including a current eight-game winning streak.

- More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 32 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 22 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

- Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP FIVE IN THE NATION, including the last three.

- Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 191-62-4 (.749) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 17-21-3 (.451) at home during the day in that span.

- Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 91,600 fans.

### Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

### Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

## Tiger Defense Shuts Down Alabama, 27-3

Matt Mauck threw for 251 yards and 2 TDs and LSU's defense limited Alabama to only 65 yards rushing as the third-ranked Tigers dominated the Crimson Tide, 27-3. The Tigers jumped on Alabama early, taking a 10-0 lead on a 23-yard TD pass from Matt Mauck to Michael Clayton. The Tigers, who held the Crimson Tide without a first down in the first quarter, took a 17-0 lead late in the second quarter on a 3-yard TD pass from Mauck to Eric Edwards. The Tigers tacked on another score to run the margin to 24-0 on a 4-yard run by Alley Broussard midway through the third quarter. Chris Jackson added a 33-yard field goal for a 27-0 LSU lead before Alabama's Brian Bostick put the Crimson Tide's only points on the scoreboard with a 27-yard field goal with 6:39 left in the contest. For the game, LSU held Shaud Williams, the SEC's top rusher, to only 29 yards (85 yards below his season average of 114.0 per game). Michael Clayton led all LSU receivers with a career-best 12 catches for 130 yards and 1 score, while the Tigers got a balanced rushing attack with freshmen Justin Vincent rushing for 83 yards on 16 carries and Broussard 79 yards and 1 TD on 11 attempts.

**Pair of QBs Lead LSU To 22-21 OT Win Over Oregon State**

JaMarcus Russell started the comeback and then Marcus Randall finished it as the Tigers rallied from an 8-point deficit with less than two minutes remaining to force overtime and eventually beat Oregon State, 22-21, in Tiger Stadium in the season-opener for both teams. Trailing 9-0 at halftime, Russell replaced an ineffective Randall and pulled the Tigers to within 9-7 late in the third quarter on a 16-yard TD pass to Skyler Green. OSU answered with a 9-play, 65-yard drive to extend its margin to 15-7. The score remained that way until Russell rallied the Tigers on a 4-play, 64-yard drive capped with a 38-yard TD strike to Dwayne Bowe. Russell then converted the two-point conversion to tie the score at 15-15 with just over a minute left. In overtime and with Russell out with cramps, Randall returned to the field and scored on a 5-yard run to give LSU its first lead at 22-15. OSU followed with a TD of its own, however the extra-point attempt sailed wide right, the third missed PAT for the Beavers, and the Tigers escaped with a 22-21 win. For the game, Russell completed 9 of 26 passes for 145 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall was 7 of 18 for 66 yards and 1 interception. Vincent led the Tigers with 48 yards rushing, while Bowe caught 5 passes for 103 yards and a score.

**Tigers Overpower Arkansas State, 53-3**

Justin Vincent rushed for 102 yards and 2 TDs and three LSU quarterbacks combined to hit on 12 of 20 passes for 210 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers rolled to a 53-3 win over Arkansas State in Tiger Stadium. LSU wasted little time in establishing itself as the dominant team as the Tigers took the opening kickoff and marched 54 yards in 6 plays for a 7-0 lead following a 5-yard TD run by Vincent just two minutes into the contest. The Indians fumbled the ensuing kickoff and three plays later, Marcus Randall found Corey Webster for a 6-yard TD pass running the score to 13-0. From there, the route was on as the Tigers extended their lead to 23-0 after the first quarter and 37-0 at halftime. Arkansas State got on the board midway through the third quarter with a 34-yard field goal. LSU responded with a pair of touchdowns in a 3-minute span to stretch the lead to 50-3. Ryan Gaudet added a 33-yard field goal in the fourth quarter for the final margin. For the game, the Tigers limited ASU to just 54 yards rushing and only 201 yards of offense. JaMarcus Russell led all LSU quarterbacks by connecting on 7 of 11 passes for 151 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall hit on 5 of 7 for 59 yards and one score. Craig Davis led the Tigers with 4 catches for 73 yards, while Dwayne Bowe caught a pair of TD passes.

Auburn Scores Late To Hand LSU A 10-9 Defeat

Jason Campbell connected with Courtney Taylor on a 16-yard TD pass with just over a minute left to lift 14th-ranked Auburn to a 10-9 win over No. 4 LSU. The victory by Auburn snapped LSU's 10-game winning streak, one that dated back to a 33-7 win over South Carolina last October. The Auburn TD capped a contest that saw the LSU defense hold Auburn in check, limiting the Tigers to just 301 yards of offense, including only 131 yards on the ground. The LSU defense held Auburn's running back tandem of Carnell Williams (75 yards) and Ronnie Brown (67 yards) to 142 combined yards, 70 yards below their season average. LSU appeared to be in good shape early in the contest, taking the opening kickoff and marching 80 yards on 14 plays for a 6-0 lead following a Marcus Randall 9-yard TD pass to Dwayne Bowe. LSU's Ryan Gaudet pushed the PAT wide right, a point that would come back to haunt LSU. Auburn responded with a 14-play drive of its own that ended with a field goal. LSU, with JaMarcus Russell at QB, answered right back, going 55 yards on eight plays, capped with a 42-yard Chris Jackson field goal. That's all the scoring either team would get until the final minutes of the contest. LSU did have its chances in the second half, getting inside the Auburn 35-yard line twice, but the Tigers failed to capitalize on the opportunity. Alley Broussard led all running back with 84 yards on 10 carries, while Randall and Russell combined to hit on 12 of 28 passes for 168 yards and a TD.

**Tigers Score Early And Often In 51-0 Rout Of Mississippi State**

Alley Broussard scored a career-best 3 TDs, all in the first 17 minutes of the game, as the Tigers racked up 599 yards of offense in rolling to a 51-0 win over Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium. LSU set the tone early in the contest going 74 yards on 7 plays, five of which were runs, for a 7-0 lead just three minutes into the game. Following a MSU fumble on its first possession, the Tigers need only 6 plays to go 18 yards for a 14-0 lead midway through the first quarter. From there, the route was on as the Tigers built a 27-0 lead early in the second quarter following a 35-yard interception return for a TD by Marcus Spears. LSU led 34-0 at halftime. In the second half, the Tigers stretched the margin to 41-0 on an 8-yard run by QB JaMarcus Russell and then 48-0 on a 67-yard TD reception by Xavier Carter. For the contest, LSU picked up 31 first downs, while limiting MSU to just 7. LSU also held MSU to only 130 yards of offense, while intercepting a season-high 4 passes. The 51-point margin of victory was the biggest by LSU in an SEC game since a 61-6 win over Mississippi State in 1969. It was also LSU's first shutout since a 42-0 win over Mississippi State in 2001.

Greene Passes Georgia Past LSU, 45-16

David Greene threw 5 touchdown passes as third-ranked Georgia, behind a pair of first half LSU turnovers, raced out to a 24-0 lead midway through the second quarter and never looked back in a 45-16 win over the Tigers in Athens. Trailing 24-0, LSU mounted a rally that pulled the Tigers to within 24-10 at half-time. First, JaMarcus Russell guided the Tigers on a 7-play, 80-yard drive, capped with an 18-yard TD strike to Dwayne Bow with 1:23 left before halftime. After holding Georgia to three plays and out on its next series, the Tigers quickly moved 24 yards in two plays setting up a 31-yard field goal by Chris Jackson as time expired in the first half pulling LSU to within 24-10. With an apparent momentum swing towards LSU, the Tigers got the ball to start the second half and moved all the way to the UGA 34-yard line before the drive stalled out. From there, LSU could muster little offense as the Bulldogs stretched their lead to 31-10 at the 5:12 mark on a Greene-to-Fred Gibson pass. LSU wouldn't get any closer the rest of the way. The Tigers did close the contest with an 8-play, 80-yard TD drive engineered by QB Marcus Randall. For the contest, LSU managed only 314 yards of offense, compared to 430 for the Bulldogs. Russell led LSU by hitting on 9 of 17 passes for 131 yards and 1 TD, while Alley Broussard rushed for 45 yards in his first career start.

Randall, Addai Lead Tigers Past Florida, 24-21

Marcus Randall came off the bench to rally LSU from a 14-0 first quarter deficit to beat 12th-ranked Florida, 24-21, in Gainesville. Down 21-17 with just over two minutes left in the contest, Randall guided the Tigers on a 6-play, 50-yard drive, capped with a 10-yard scoring pass to Joseph Addai, for the come-from-behind win for the Tigers. Trailing 14-0 following a pair of first quarter interceptions that led to Florida scoring drives of 5 and 3-yards, Randall took over for an injured JaMarcus Russell. Randall pulled the Tigers to within 21-14 at half-time after engineering a pair of 80-yard scoring drives. Alley Broussard got the Tigers to within 14-7 on a 1-yard plunge early in the second quarter. Florida extended its lead to 21-7 with just over a minute left in the first half, before Randall engineered a 7-play, 80-yard drive, capped with a 15-yard TD pass to Early Doucet with 12 seconds left in the first half. Chris Jackson kicked a 47-yard field goal in the third quarter to get the Tigers to within 21-17 before a fourth quarter defensive struggle paved the way for LSU's last-minute comeback against the Gators. For the game, Randall connected on 18 of 27 passes for 198 and 2 TDs, while Addai led the Tigers with 93 yards rushing. Addai also caught 4 passes for 26 yards, including the game-winner. Offensively, the Tigers put up 464 yards (210 rushing, 254 passing) compared to just 236 (94 rushing, 142 passing) for the Gators.

**Randall's Fourth Quarter Heroics Lifts LSU Past Troy, 24-20**

Marcus Randall hit David Jones with a 30-yard TD pass with just over two minutes left, lifting LSU to a 24-20 come-from-behind win over Troy in Tiger Stadium. The Randall-to-Jones TD marked the third time this year that LSU has come from behind in the fourth quarter to win a game. The game-winning TD came less than two minutes after Troy had taken a 20-17 lead on a 24-yard FG by Greg Whibbs. LSU's Xavier Carter setup the Tigers' game-winning scoring drive with a 37-yard kickoff return to the LSU 47-yard line. LSU appeared to have picked up where they left off against Florida, taking the opening kickoff and going 79-yards on 9 plays for the game's first points, a 1-yard run by **Alley Broussard**. However, three first half turnovers by the Tigers kept Troy in the game as the Trojans had to only go 20 yards for their first TD and then went backwards a yard for a FG following another LSU turnover. Despite the first half miscues, LSU led 17-10 at halftime. Troy tied the game at 17-17 midway through the third quarter after another LSU turnover resulted in a just a 2-play, 2-yard scoring drive for the Trojans. The scored remained that way until Whibbs' go-ahead field goal late in the fourth quarter. Randall led the Tigers by connecting on 24 of 37 passes for a career-best 328 yards and 1 TD. Defensively, **Marcus Spears** had 9 tackles, including 6 for losses and a pair of sacks as LSU limited Troy to only 150 yards of offense.

## Tiger Defense Comes Up Big in 24-7 Win Over Vanderbilt

Skyler Green returned a punt 65 yards for a touchdown and the LSU defense held Vanderbilt scoreless in the second half as the Tigers won their third straight with a 24-7 victory over the Commodores. Outside of a 13-play, 83-yard drive late in the second quarter, the Vanderbilt offense did very little against the Tigers as LSU held the Commodores to 289 yards of offense and just 15 first downs. The Tigers lead 3-0 after the first quarter on a 26-yard Ryan Gaudet field goal and then increased the margin to 10-0 on a 1-yard run by Alley Broussard in the second quarter. Vanderbilt cut the lead to 10-7 just before half-time on a 1-yard run by Jay Cutler. Randall led the Tigers through the air by completing 4 of 6 passes for 78 yards and 1 TD, while JaMarcus Russell hit on 2 of 5 passes for 24 yards.
