Game 34: LSU at Tulane—Wednesday, April 10, 7 p.m., Louisiana Superdome

The rivalry goes indoors: LSU and Tulane play for the 270th time, but for the first time under the roof of the Superdome.

- LSU will be looking to win its fifth game in its last six outings after going 3-1 last week.
- The Tigers have won their last two midweek games after losing three straight to in-state rivals during the week. LSU is 6-4 this year against Louisiana foes.
- The Tigers are coming off their first SEC series victory of 2002 when they took two of three at Auburn over the weekend.
- LSU is still not ranked in any of the three polls, the first time the Tigers have not been ranked in back-to-back weeks since 1988.

Scouting Tulane: The Green Wave has already lost more games in 2002 than they did in their College World Series season of 2001, coming into tonight's game at 18-16.

- The Wave has recovered to win five of its last seven games, including 2-1 Conference USA series wins over Saint Louis and Memphis in the last two weekends.
- Tulane started 1-5 in defense of its C-USA crown, losing two of three at home to Charlotte and getting swept at Houston.
- James Jurries leads the Wave with a .386 batting average and is one of five Tulane players hitting .300 or better, but Tulane's team batting average is .294.

About the series: Tulane has won five of the last six meetings, but LSU still holds a 151-115-3 all-time edge in the oldest athletic rivalry for both schools.

- LSU's only win in the last six games against Tulane was a 4-3, 13-inning victory in the first game of last year's NCAA Super Regional at Zephyr Field.
- Of course, this marks the first time the rivalry will be played in the Superdome. LSU hasn't played the Wave in the Dome in football since 1984, and in basketball since 1980.
- The Green Wave won 6-5 on Mar. 5 at Alex Box Stadium, giving Tulane back-to-back wins in Baton Rouge for the first time since 1991-92.
- Only once since 1993 has there been a split in the regular season series, and that was in 1998.
- Tulane is 5-2 in games played at Zephyr Field, winning three of four last year at the Triple-A park.
- Tulane coach Rick Jones is 10-10 against LSU in his nine years with the Wave; Smoke Laval is 1-3 in his career against Tulane.
- The Tigers hold a 5-2 edge in NCAA Tournament games, winning in the regional in 1986 at home, 1987 (twice) at UNO and 1992 at home, while Tulane was 2-1 in last year's super regional at Zephyr Field.

Tonight's Starting Pitcher

#34 Jr. RHP Bo Pettit (6-0, 200, Houston—Sharpstown HS)

After Bo Pettit continues to struggle in the SEC, as he has walked 18 batters and given up 17 runs on 20 hits in his last 9.1 innings in league play. After throwing four shutout innings last week against UNO, the Tigers are hoping Pettit has another strong midweek outing in him, as he faces Tulane sophomore left-hander Kris Kline (1-1, 4.56).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: 3-5 with a 4.07 ERA. Leads team with 61 strikeouts in 55.1 innings.

- Will be making season-high 11th start tonight.
- Has struck out 10 or more three times this year.
- Had outstanding start in win over New Orleans (Apr. 2), pitching 4.0 shutout innings and giving up just two hits.
- Walked five in just 2.1 innings at Auburn (Apr. 6). The 2.1 innings mark the shortest start of Pettit's career.
- Went just 3.0 innings in loss to Mississippi St. (Mar. 29), giving up six runs (five earned) on eight hits
- Struggled in last start at Ole Miss (Mar. 22), giving up career highs in runs (eight) and walks (eight) t in 4.1 innings.
- Fired complete game, four-hit shutout vs. Vanderbilt (Mar. 15), tying a career high with 12 strikeouts.
 - Became the first LSU pitcher since Brian Tallet (Kentucky in 2000) to throw a nine-inning shutout.
- Tied a career high with 12 strikeouts in the Tigers' Feb. 15 victory over Mercer.
- Struck out 10 in 6.1 innings and got no decision vs. UL-Monroe (Mar. 8).
- Went a career high 7.2 innings in Mercer game, not yielding an earned run and carrying a shutout into the eighth inning.
- Started season opener vs. Birmingham-Southern on Feb. 8 and struck out eight in 6.0 innings.

2001: Posted 4-0 mark with a 2.42 ERA, but only appeared in 7 games (4 starts) due to continuing shoulder ailments.

- Struck out five in two innings in his first appearance of 2001 vs. Nicholls St. on Feb. 27
- Earned his first win of the season against Southern on Mar. 13, going five innings and allowing two runs on two hits.
- Best outing of season came Mar. 23 at Mississippi St., as he allowed no earned runs in 6.1 innings to pick up the victory.
- Did not return to action again until May 1 at New Orleans, when he went three innings and allowed just one hit and no earned runs while striking out five.

2000: Went 5-3 with a 4.15 ERA in 16 games (7 starts), but season ended early due to tendonitis in his shoulder.

- Best effort came in Apr. 30 win at Ole Miss in first career SEC start. In that game, Pettit allowed one run on five hits and struck out a career-high 12 in seven innings.
- Earned his first career win in second game of doubleheader vs. Virginia on Feb. 12, starting and throwing six scoreless innings, striking out six and allowing just two hits.
- Threw two scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in relief stint vs. McNeese St. on Feb. 22.
- Hurlled four scoreless and hitless innings in start vs. New Orleans on Mar. 22, picking up victory with six strikeouts.
- Final outing of season came on May 6 at Kentucky, where he earned win with six strikeouts over 6.2 innings.

1999: Was granted a medical redshirt after pitching in only three early-season games.

- Made his first career appearance on Feb. 27 against Central Florida, going 1.1 innings and giving up two runs on four hits, walking one and striking out one.

Tigers go indoors

For the first time since defeating Ole Miss in the final game of the 1999 Winn-Dixie Showdown, LSU will play a baseball game that won't be affected by the weather.

LSU has an all-time mark of 28-14 indoors, with a 25-14 mark at the Superdome in 13 Busch Challenges/Winn-Dixie Showdowns (1987-99) and a 3-0 mark at the Metrodome in Minneapolis, sweeping Florida St., Michigan and Minnesota at the 1995 Hormel Foods Classic.

Going for attendance records

When LSU and Tulane announced that their April game that was originally scheduled for Zephyr Field would move to the Superdome, it was done due to an expected large demand for tickets.

Indeed, the game has been a smash hit at the box office, as more than 21,100 tickets had been sold as of the close of business Friday.

That number alone will allow this game to break the single-game regular-season NCAA attendance record, which currently stands at 21,043 for a 1996 doubleheader between Texas and TCU at The Ballpark in Arlington (Texas).

The record for any date is 24,859 set in 1999 for a two-game College World Series session that saw Miami defeat Alabama and Rice top Oklahoma State. The largest crowd to see LSU play in Omaha is the 24,401 that watched the Tigers beat Alabama for the 1997 CWS title.

Last year, LSU and Tulane drew more than 35,000 fans to Zephyr Field for the three-game NCAA Super Regional, with 11,870 attending the final, that also turned out to be Skip Bertman's final game as LSU's coach.

The Superdome record for a single date is 13,695 for a 1996 session of the Winn-Dixie Showdown. In 1981, a Tulane-UNO game at the Superdome drew more than 12,000, but an exact figure for that game is not available.

Pettit to get start for LSU

For the second consecutive week, LSU will send weekend starter Bo Pettit to the hill for a midweek start to try to get some confidence.

Pettit started last Tuesday against New Orleans and pitched 4.0 shutout innings in an 8-1 LSU victory. However, it did not carry over to the weekend, as he walked five over 2.1 innings as Auburn went on to an 11-3 victory.

After shutting out Vanderbilt 6-0 on Mar. 15 to open SEC play, Pettit has struggled in conference games, walking 18 and giving up 18 runs on 20 hits in 9.1 innings over his last three SEC starts, which have been losses to Ole Miss, Mississippi St. and Auburn.



Tompkins thrives as closer

Former LSU coach Skip Bertman was known as a master strategist, especially when it came to juggling a pitching staff. Now, first-year coach Smoke Laval has made a move that Bertman would most definitely be proud of.

Since moving from the starting rotation to the bullpen nearly two weeks ago, Tiger right-hander Jake Tompkins has been nothing short of dominant.

He continued that dominance on Sunday at Auburn, as he worked out of jams in the seventh and eighth innings with double play ground balls, then finished the game off for his second save in a 9-5 LSU victory.

This outing came on the heels of 2.1 scoreless innings on Friday, when Tompkins struck out three to preserve a 9-4 LSU triumph, although Tompkins did not get credit for a save.

In four relief outings this year, Tompkins has not allowed a run, giving up just five hits in 9.0 innings and striking out 12. For the year, Tompkins' ERA is back under three at 2.92, and he has struck out 52 batters in 49.1 innings while walking only 15.

Wilson comes through for LSU

This year has been one wild roller coaster ride for LSU reliever Brian Wilson. Unfortunately, most Tiger fans know him as the pitcher who gave away late-inning leads in Sunday losses to Houston, Vanderbilt and Ole Miss.

But last Sunday at Auburn, Wilson showed the brilliance that made him such a highly-touted recruit when he came south from New Hampshire.

Wilson came into the game in the second inning with the score tied at 3-3 and two Auburn runners on base, and the sophomore right-hander got out of the jam and then proceeded to retire the next 12 batters he faced in the third through sixth innings. He struck out five over 4.2 innings in a 9-5 LSU victory, improving his record to 4-2 on the year.

The 4.2 inning stint was Wilson's longest of the year and the first time he had gone more than three innings since starting and going 4.2 innings last Apr. 8 at South Carolina. Wilson, who may move to the starting rotation this weekend against Georgia, went 7.0 innings in his first career victory last Apr. 3 against UNO.

Barker continues to hit

Sean Barker's steady hitting continues to be a key for the Tiger offense, and he came through in a big way last week, going 10-for-16 (.625) to help the Tigers win three of four games.

Barker led the Tigers at the plate in the three games at Auburn, going 7-for-13 (.538) with a pair of doubles and three runs scored. Barker collected three hits in each of the Tigers' victories last week and has seven games this year with at least three hits and 10 other two-hit games.

The big week moved Barker back into second place on the Tigers in batting average at .373, just five points behind team leader Wally Pontiff at .378. Barker leads LSU with 29 RBI and has stolen a team high 14 bases in 17 attempts. Barker's average has not fallen below .333 at any point this year.

Driving them home

LSU entered Auburn hitting just .268 with runners in scoring position. Sure, one weekend wasn't going to raise that average to where it was in 2000 and 2001, but the series on the Plains proved LSU is definitely moving in the right direction.

In the three games at Auburn, LSU hit .379 (11-for-29) with RISP, leading to 20 runs and 40 hits in the series. In the Tigers' two wins, LSU went 5-for-9 on Friday and 4-for-13 on Saturday with RBI opportunities.

In winning four of its last five games, LSU is 20-for-62 (.323) with RISP, allowing the Tigers to score 35 runs in those games. The Auburn series allowed LSU to raise its season average in RBI situations to .276. Aaron Hill continues to lead LSU with a .382 RISP average, with Sean Barker (.341) and J.C. Holt (.318) also thriving in those key situations.

Jumbo Win

Sunday's win over Auburn was the Tigers' first victory on live television in 2002, as LSU had lost to Houston, UL-Lafayette and Ole Miss on the Jumbo Sports Network earlier this year, a streak that began in the last two games of last year's super regional against Tulane. Tonight's game marks LSU's fifth of 10 live TV appearances for 2002.



Raymer steps up

With Auburn starting three right-handed pitchers, LSU senior center fielder David Raymer took advantage with his best weekend of the season.

Raymer went 5-for-11 in the Tigers' series at Auburn, with his biggest hit being a two-run home run in Sunday's victory. It was the first home run for Raymer since hitting two in the Tigers' series against Long Beach St. in early March.

By collecting two hits in the second and third games at Auburn, Raymer has back-to-back multi-hit games for the first time since last year against UL-Monroe and Alabama. The weekend helped Raymer raise his batting average by 31 points from .190 to .221. Raymer has also been good in clutch situations, posting a solid .308 average (8-for-26) with runners in scoring position.

Hill's streak over, but still hot

Sunday's only dim spot was the end of Aaron Hill's hitting streak, as the LSU shortstop was 0-for-4 to end the string at nine games. But Hill would gladly trade in the streak for an SEC series victory, especially one on the road.

That's not to say Hill has cooled off any. The Californian is still the Tigers' leading hitter in SEC games, batting .457 (21-for-46) with 10 RBI and a .761 slugging percentage. Hill was 5-for-13 with a double, two triples, a home run and 3 RBI in the three games at Auburn. Over the Tigers' last 10 games, he is batting an even .500 (21-for-42) with three homers and 15 RBI.

Hill hit home runs in last Tuesday's win over UNO and on Friday at Auburn, giving him home runs in back-to-back contests for the first time in his career.

Lineup stabilizes at Auburn

With Auburn throwing three right-handed pitchers, LSU coach Smoke Laval stayed with almost the exact same lineup for each of the three games on the Plains. The only deviation happened on Friday, when he started Jason Vargas at designated hitter, then went to Dustin Hahn on Saturday and Sunday.

In 33 games this year, LSU has started the same lineup in back-to-back games just twice: all three games at Ole Miss, and the last two games at Auburn.

Tigers turn in two-out hits

Another problem for LSU at the plate this year was the inability to get the two-out hit that would keep a rally alive. This weekend at Auburn, however, the Tigers showed signs of pulling out of that slump, too.

LSU batted a solid .364 (17-for-44) with two outs in the three-game series against the Tigers of the Plains. The best effort came on Sunday, when LSU got eight of its 15 hits with two out, leading to six of the Tigers' nine runs. In the three games at Auburn, LSU raised its season average with two outs by 11 points to .259.

Not surprisingly, the Tigers' top two hitters overall are also the best with two out. Wally Pontiff, who is hitting .378 overall, is batting a torrid .426 (20-for-47) with 14 RBI with two out, while Sean Barker is batting .373 overall, but .385 (15-for-39) with 7 RBI with two out.

Tigers looking for midweek consistency

LSU will be going for its third consecutive midweek victory, something the Tigers haven't done since last year when it beat Southern, UNO and UL-Lafayette in succession, although those games were played over the span of four weeks.

The biggest lack for LSU in those games has been hitting, as the Tigers are batting just .262 with a .344 on-base percentage in the seven midweek games so far this year, where the Tigers are 3-4 despite a solid 3.19 ERA.

In LSU's last two midweek games, victories over SLU and UNO, the Tigers have collected 17 runs and 21 hits, compared to just six runs and 26 hits in three straight losses to Tulane and UL-Lafayette (twice). LSU's other midweek win came on Feb. 20 at Centenary.

Holt goes deep

You wouldn't think a left-handed hitter that stands 5-foot-8 and weighs 155 pounds could hit the ball over the 30-foot left-field wall at Auburn's Plainsman Park.

But that's just what LSU second baseman J.C. Holt did on Sunday, giving him his first career home run. Holt became the 11th different LSU player to hit a home run this year, as the Tigers enter tonight's game with 26 homers.

Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.

The first half of the SEC comes to an end this weekend, and the races are wide open as usual. With Georgia visiting LSU, here's a look at the rest of the SEC series:

Auburn at Ole Miss—By far the best series this weekend. Rebels on a roll after big comeback to gain sweep of Vanderbilt; Tigers of the Plains reeling after losing four of last six in league play. Auburn needs series to keep Alabama in view.

Arkansas at Mississippi St.—Razorbacks took two from South Carolina before third game was rained out, while State got two from Georgia. Both teams need series to solidify SEC Tournament hopes, with Arkansas a half-game behind LSU for final spot.

Alabama at Kentucky—On paper, this one should be ugly, as top team in league plays 12th place team. Friday pitching matchup between Lance Cormier and Joseph Blanton could match a pair of All-America candidates.

Florida at Tennessee—Gators swept at Alabama and looking to get healthy; Vols playing well despite dropping series finale to Kentucky. Tough place for Tennessee to continue upward momentum, but winning two would do it. Florida must win series to remain in East race.

South Carolina at Vanderbilt—Two teams that won zero games between them and are looking to get well. Gamecocks now a game and a half behind Georgia; Commodores looking to get back in position for first SEC Tournament berth since 1996.
