Had QB sack at Ole Miss ... Saw action in 203 defensive plays from scrimmage ... Also saw special teams action with punt return and PAT/FG block teams ... 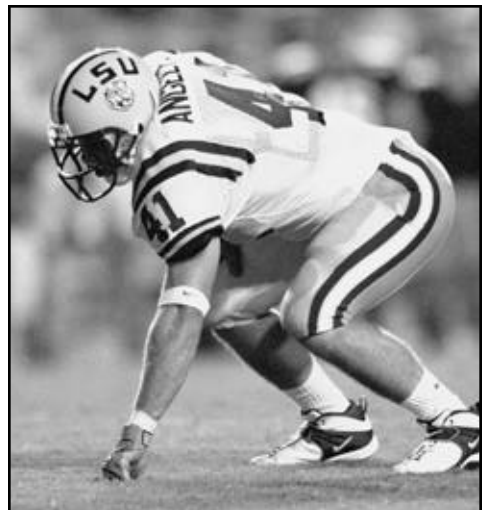
