LSU FACES AUBURN FOR SEC WESTERN DIVISION TITLE

LSU will look to clinch a berth in its first SEC Championship game on Saturday when the 22nd-ranked Tigers host 25th-ranked Auburn at 6:45 p.m. in Tiger Stadium. The game will be televised to a national audience on ESPN, the seventh time this year in which LSU will appear on national TV. The winner of Saturday's contest will represent the Western Division of the SEC in the league's championship game on December 8 in Atlanta. LSU enters the contest riding a three-game winning streak and stands at 7-3 overall and 4-3 in SEC action, while Auburn is 7-3 overall and 5-2 in league play. Saturday's game will mark the first time since 1973 in which LSU will play for the SEC title (divisional or overall) in Tiger Stadium. LSU lost to Alabama, 21-7, on Nov. 22, 1973 with the SEC title on the line. LSU claimed a share of the SEC West title in '96 and '97.

TOEFIELD RUNS AND DAVEY PASSES LSU PAST ARKANSAS

LaBrandon Toefield rushed for 173 yards and 3 TDs and Rohan Davey passed for 359 yards and three scores as the Tigers held off 24th-ranked Arkansas, 41-38, in Tiger Stadium. Toefield scored on a 62-yard run just four plays into the contest, however the Tigers kept the Razorbacks in the game with five turnovers, including three in the first half. Arkansas led 13-7 early in the second quarter before the Tigers came back to take a 20-19 lead at halftime. The Tigers stretched their lead to 41-25 with 8:21 to play on a 17-yard TD run by Toefield, the 18th of his career, which broke the LSU record for single-season rushing TDs. Arkansas scored a pair of TDs in the final 6:29 of the contest, the last with 2:27 to play, but the Razorbacks never got the ball back again.

LSU FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

LSU will play for a berth in the SEC Championship game on Saturday against 25th-ranked Auburn in Tiger Stadium ... LSU has won three straight and five of its last six after starting the season 2-2 ... The Tigers, who are bowl-eligible for the fifth time in seven years, are 4-2 at home this season after posting a 6-1 mark in Tiger Stadium last season ... LSU posted a 3-1 mark in road games this year, only the fourth time since 1990 that LSU has posted a winning mark away from home ... LSU is 15-1 under Nick Saban when scoring at least 20 points in game ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 0-6 under Saban when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 12-2 under Saban, including a 7-1 mark this year, when scoring first ... LSU is also 13-1 under Saban (7-1 in 2001) when leading at halftime and the Tigers are 12-1 under Saban (7-1 in 2001) when leading after three quarters ... Over his last 16 games (including the 2000 Peach Bowl), LSU QB Rohan Davey has thrown 30 TD passes compared to just 10 interceptions ... LSU hasn't been shutout since the Alabama game on Nov. 9, 1996 - a span of 60 games ... The Tigers are 6-0 under Saban (3-0 in 2001), and 38-9 since 1990 when an LSU running back rushes for 100 yards in a game ... Overall, LSU has won eight straight games when having a 100-yard rusher ... LSU WR Josh Reed broke the SEC single-season record for receiving yards against Arkansas with 7 catches for 183 yards to run his career total to 2,755 ... QB Rohan Davey also became the first 3,000-yard passer in school history as he threw for 359 yards vs. the Razorbacks to run his season total to 3,018 yards ... Over their last three SEC games, the Tigers have forced eight turnovers and they have responded with touchdowns on six of the eight takeaways.

LSU-AUBURN TIE

The LSU coaching staff has plenty of ties and familiarity with the Auburn football program. Current offensive coordinator Jimbo Fisher was quarterback coach for Auburn from 1993-98, working with such Auburn quarterbacks as Stan White, Patrick Nix and Dameyune Craig, three of the most successful signal callers in Auburn history. Current LSU defensive line coach Pete Jenkins coached the Auburn d-line from 1996-98, while current LSU linebackers coach Will Muschamp was a graduate assistant for Auburn from 1995-97 and worked on staffs with both Fisher and Jenkins. In addition, longtime administrative assistant Sam Nader was a quarterback for Auburn from 1963-68.

LSU VS. AUBURN - A SERIES OF CLOSE CALLS

Since 1988, the LSU-Auburn series has become one of close calls and one in which the teams and the fans have come to expect the unexpected. The following is a listing of some of the notable happenings in the series since 1988:

1988: LSU's Tommy Hods on hit Eddie Fuller in the back of the endzone on fourth down with 1:41 left to lift the Tigers to a 7-6 win over fourth-ranked Auburn. The noise from the stadium crowd after the play registered on a seismograph across campus prompting the game to be titled *"The Earthquake Game."*

1994: Auburn intercepted five passes in the fourth quarter, returning three for TDs as the Tigers rally to post a 30-26 win over LSU in a game that became known as *"The Interception Game."*

1995: LSU donned white jerseys at home for the first time since the early 1980's and promptly went out and upset fifth-ranked Auburn, 12-6. LSU preserved the win with an interception in the endzone on the last play of the game. The contest was dubbed the *"Bring Back the Magic"* game.

1996: With the old Auburn Sports Arena burning to the ground a couple hundred yards away, LSU beat Auburn, 19-15, in a game titled *"The Night the Barn Burned."*

1997: Titled *"The Comeback"*, Auburn QB Dameyune Craig engineered a 10-play, 80-yard drive late in the fourth quarter to spark the Tigers to a 31-28 upset of 10th-ranked LSU.

JOSH REED SETS SEC SINGLE-SEASON RECEIVING YARDS RECORD

Josh Reed continued to rewrite both the LSU and SEC history books as the junior had 183 receiving yards vs. Arkansas to break the conference mark for single-season receiving yards. Thru 10 games, Reed has caught 80 passes for an SEC record 1,494 yards, breaking the SEC mark of 1,357 held by Travis McGriff of Florida (1998). Reed also broke the LSU career receiving yard mark vs. Arkansas as he bettered the previous record of 2,708 held by Wendell Davis (1984-87). Reed has 2,755 career receiving yards, fifth most in SEC history. Reed is just 210 yards shy of breaking the all-time SEC mark of 2,964 held by Boo Mitchell of Vanderbilt (1985-88). With seven receptions against Arkansas, Reed also tied Davis' LSU single season record for receptions with 80.

JOSH REED NAMED ONE OF THREE FINALISTS FOR BILETNIKOFF AWARD

LSU's record-setting receiver Josh Reed has been named one of three finalists for the Biletnikoff Award, which annually recognizes college football's top receiver, the Tallahassee Quarterback Club announced. Reed joins Florida's Jabar Gaffney and Wisconsin's Lee Evans as the three finalists. Reed becomes the first LSU receiver to ever be named a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award. The winner of the Biletnikoff Award will be announced on Dec. 6 in Orlando, Fla. The award is sponsored by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation and it is named in honor of former Florida State and Oakland Raiders wide receiver Fred Biletnikoff. Past winners of the award include Antonio Bryant of Pittsburgh (2000), Troy Walters of Stanford (1999), Troy Edwards of Louisiana Tech (1998), Randy Moss of Marshall (1997), Marcus Harris of Wyoming (1996), Terry Glenn of Ohio State (1995) and Bobby Engram of Penn State (1994).

REED CONTINUES TO LEAD THE NATION IN RECEIVING YARDS PER GAME, RANKS IN NATION'S TOP 10 IN TWO OTHER CATEGORIES

LSU wide receiver Josh Reed continues to lead the nation in receiving yards per game as the junior from Rayne, La., is averaging 149.4 yards per contest, just over seven yards better than Kevin Curtis of Utah State. Reed leads the SEC in receiving yards per contest by just over 40 yards - Florida's Jabbar Gaffney ranks second in the SEC with 109.0 yards per game. Reed's 8.0 catches a contest leads the SEC and ranks third nationally. In addition, Reed leads the SEC in all-purpose yards with 161.4 yards per game, just ahead of Kentucky's Derek Abney (159.5 per game). Reed ranks 10th in the nation in all-purpose yards. Reed and Florida's Rex Grossman are the only players in the SEC to lead the league in three different categories.

REED MOVES INTO TOP FIVE CAREER RECEIVING YARDS IN SEC HISTORY

With 183 yards receiving on seven catches against Arkansas last Friday, Josh Reed not only broke the LSU career receiving yardage record, but moved into the top five in SEC history in receiving yards. With 2,755 career yards receiving, Reed moved past former Tiger great Wendell Davis and into fifth place in SEC history. Reed would need a huge effort to break the SEC record of 2,964 by Boo Mitchell of Vanderbilt (1985-88) this season. Reed enters the Auburn game 210 yards shy of breaking the SEC's all-time receiving yardage mark. In addition, with 153 career receptions, Reed moved into 14th place on the career SEC receptions list.

CLAYTON AND REED ARE THE NATION'S NO. 1 RATED RECEIVING DUO

Statistically speaking, Michael Clayton and Josh Reed are the nation's best receiving duo. Clayton and Reed are averaging a combined 217.1 yards receiving a contest, 14 yards better than Florida's duo of Jabar Gaffney and Reche Caldwell, who combine for 203.0 yards per contest. Through 10 games, Clayton and Reed have combined for 120 receptions for 2,171 yards and 12 TDs.

TIGERS IN REACH OF BREAKING SEVERAL SCHOOL RECORDS ON OFFENSE

LSU has already seen its share of individual records fall this season, but as the Tigers head into the final game of the season, there is a chance for a few team records to also be broken. LSU is just 142 yards shy of breaking the school record for total offense which was set by the 1987 team (4,843 yards). In addition, the Tigers are averaging 470.2 yards per game, a number that is well ahead of the school-record of 440.3 set in 1987. LSU needs to complete 14 passes against Auburn to break the school record for completions set by the 1985 team (220 completions). LSU has already reset the school's record for team passing yard with 3,184 (old mark of 2,839 set in 1989). LSU's per game passing yard average of 318.4 yards is well ahead of the school record of 258.1 set in 1989. As a matter of fact LSU can not pass for a single yard against Auburn and still break the school-record for passing yards per game.

REED, 100-YARD GAMES GO HAND IN HAND

Call it an experiment that worked. Josh Reed, a seldom used running back, moved to receiver in the 10th game of the 1999 season after then-quarterback Josh Booty urged then-head coach Gerry DiNardo to give it a shot. The results have been nothing short of remarkable. Reed caught five passes for 100 yards in his second game at the position and has never looked back since. In 24 games at the position, Reed has reached the century mark a school-record 16 times, including nine this year. The Tigers are 12-4 when Reed reaches the century mark.

DAVEY FIRST TIGER QB TO REACH 3,000 YARDS IN A SINGLE-SEASON

Rohan Davey continues to rewrite the LSU passing record book and added one more chapter to his phenomenal senior season. Last Friday he became the first LSU quarterback to reach 3,000 yards in a single season. On his final completion of the day, Davey moved to 3,018 yards for the season. In the Tigers' previous outing he broke Tommy Hodson's 12-year-old school single season record of 2,655 yards passing. His total is the 17th highest in SEC history.

DAVEY POSTS FIFTH 300-YARD GAME OF THE SEASON

Rohan Davey overcame four interceptions against Arkansas to become the first Tiger to post three consecutive 300-yard passing games by virtue of his 359-yard passing effort against the Razorbacks. It marked the fifth time in 10 games this year that Davey surpassed 300 yards and the sixth time in his career, extending his own LSU record. Davey now has twice as many 300-yard games as the next closest quarterback in LSU history and has six of LSU's 16 all-time 300-yard games. Davey owns the LSU single game passing record with 528 yards earlier this year against Alabama and now has four of the top eight passing days in LSU history. DAVEY PASSES FORMER TEAMMATE BOOTY TO MOVE INTO SIXTH ON PASSING YARDAGE LIST

Rohan Davey moved past former teammate Josh Booty and into sixth place on the all-time LSU passing yardage list on his 60-yard strike to Michael Clayton in the third quarter of LSU's victory over Arkansas. The pass gave him 3,957 career yards at the time. Booty threw for 3,951 yards from 1999-2000. Davey moved past 4,000 career yards on his 38-yard touchdown pass to Josh Reed in the fourth quarter. He currently stands at 4,086.

TIGERS BECOME BOWL ELIGIBLE WITH VICTORY OVER MIDDLE TENNESSEE

With a 30-14 triumph over Middle Tennessee State on Nov. 10, the Tigers officially became bowl eligible. The Tigers are now bowl-eligible for the fifth time in the last seven years. It also ensured LSU head coach Nick Saban of at least a .500 season for the eighth time in as many years as a collegiate head coach.

TOEFIELD POSTS FIFTH MULTIPLE-TD GAME

With three touchdowns against Arkansas, LaBrandon Tofield posted his fifth multiple-touchdown game of the season, the most by a Tiger since Kevin Faulk in 1998. The mark matches the LSU record for most multiple touchdown games in a season, accomplished seven times previously - three times by Faulk, twice by Dalton Hilliard and twice by Charles Alexander. LSU is 5-0 this year when Tofield rushes for more than one TD.

DAVEY MOVES UP TOUCHDOWN PASS LIST

With three touchdown passes against Arkansas, Davey moved his career total to 28, tying him with former Tiger great Bert Jones for fifth place on the LSU career TD pass list. Davey needs three to tie Alan Risher and move into fourth place.

In addition, Davey now has 17 touchdown passes on the season, tying him with Risher and former teammate Josh Booty for fourth on the LSU single season TD pass list. Davey needs one to match Herb Tyler's 1998 total and two to match Tommy Hodson's 1986 total of 19, the second highest mark in school history. Hodson owns the LSU record with 22 in 1989.

REED ONE CATCH FROM BREAKING LSU RECEPTION MARK

DAVEY EYES SINGLE SEASON COMPLETION MARK

Rohan Davey enters the Auburn game with 192 completions this season, the third highest total in LSU history. He needs one to tie for second and 18 to break Jeff Wickersham's 1985 total of 209. Davey broke the LSU single game record earlier this year with 35 completions against Alabama.

TOEFIELD BREAKS 24-YEAR-OLD LSU TOUCHDOWN AND SCORING MARKS

LaBrandon Tofield's 17-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter against Arkansas was his third of the game and 18th of the season breaking Charles Alexander's 24-year-old LSU record of 17 set in 1977. It marked the fifth multiple-TD game of the season for

the sophomore. His 18 touchdowns tie him with Herschel Walker of Georgia (1981) for second highest total in SEC history. He is one short of the SEC record of 19, held by Garrison Hearst of Georgia and Shaun Alexander of Alabama.

In addition, Toefield broke the all-time LSU single season scoring mark and now has 108 points. He bested the previous mark of 104 by Charles Alexander, also in 1977. His total moves him into a tied for eighth place on the SEC all-time single season scoring list. One touchdown against Auburn would move him into the top five.

TIGERS GO TO TOEFIELD EARLY

When LaBrandon Toefield busted loose for a 62-yard touchdown on the Tigers' opening possession last Friday, it marked the fifth time in 10 games this season that the Tigers scored on their opening possession. All five scores have come on rushing touchdowns by LaBrandon Toefield. The Tigers are 5-0 in those games.

LSU 5-0 ALL-TIME WHEN TOEFIELD REACHES THE CENTURY MARK

The Tigers got tremendous offensive balance in dropping 41 points on Arkansas, getting over 300 yards passing from Rohan Davey, over 100 yards receiving from Josh Reed and over 100 yards from running back LaBrandon Toefield. It marked the fifth time in his two-year career that Toefield reached the century mark and the third time this season. LSU is 5-0 when Toefield runs for better than 100 yards.

CLAYTON CONTINUES REMARKABLE FRESHMAN SEASON

When LSU announced that Reggie Robinson would miss the entire 2001 season, everyone wondered how the Tigers' receiving corps would fare with Josh Reed receiving a majority of the attention on double teams. True freshman Michael Clayton has provided the perfect compliment to Reed and has developed into the deep threat to help Reed remain open on the underneath routes. Clayton hauled in a 60-yard touchdown pass from Rohan Davey in the third quarter against Arkansas, his sixth touchdown reception of the year and his seventh touchdown overall. Clayton's seven TDs are the most by a Tiger true freshman since Dalton Hilliard posted 16 in 1982 - 11 rushing and five receiving. His six receiving touchdowns are the most ever by an LSU true freshman and the most by a first-year LSU receiver since Carlos Carson had 10 in 1977. Through 10 games, Clayton has caught 40 passes for 677 yards. The 40 receptions rank eighth in the SEC, while the 677 yards is the ninth highest total in the league.

20 POINTS THE MAGIC NUMBER FOR LSU

With 41 points in their victory over Arkansas, LSU improved to 15-1 under Nick Saban when scoring 20+ points with the only loss coming this year against Ole Miss. LSU has won 16 of 17 overall when scoring 20+ points dating back to the 1999 season. Nick Saban is 15-7 as head coach at LSU and has never won when failing to reach 20 points. In LSU's seven wins this season they've averaged 36.6 points. In their three losses they've scored a combined total of 57 points, or 19 points a game.

TIGERS TOUGH WHEN SCORING FIRST

Against Arkansas, the Tigers scored first for the seventh time in 10 games this season. LSU improved to 6-1 when scoring first with the only exception coming against Tennessee in September. LSU is 1-2 when failing to score first with their only victory coming against Utah State. LSU has scored first in each of its last three games, all wins.

THE RESULTS HAVE BEEN GOOD WHEN TIGERS LEAD AT HALFTIME

LSU has led at the half in eight of its 10 games this season and the Tigers have gone on to win seven of those contests, with the lone exception being the Tennessee game when they led 7-6 at the half before falling 26-18. The only two games in which LSU has trailed at halftime this year are Florida (down 27-9 and lost 44-15) and Ole Miss (down 21-10 and lost 35-24). LSU is 13-1 under Nick Saban when leading at the half.

DAMIEN JAMES LEADS SEC IN INTERCEPTIONS

Damien James continues to lead the SEC in interceptions with five for an average of .50 per game. That figure ranks 14th nationally. As a defensive unit, the Tigers are second in the SEC in interceptions with 16. In all, LSU has had six different players intercept passes this season with all five of the players having at least two interceptions.

REED BECOMES SECOND PLAYER IN SEC HISTORY TO REACH 1,000 YARDS IN BACK-TO-BACK SEASONS

Josh Reed added another chapter to his record book against Alabama as he joined Joey Kent of Tennessee as the only players in SEC history to have back-to-back 1,000-yard receiving seasons. Actually, Reed and Kent are the only two players in the history of the league to have 1,000-yards receiving in more than one season. Period. Kent did it in 1995 and 1996. Since the Alabama game, Florida's Jabar Gaffney has joined Reed and Kent on the list.

LSU FINISHES WITH WINNING ROAD RECORD FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 1997

One of Nick Saban's top priorities heading into the 2001 season was for his Tigers to take care of business on the road after managing only a 1-3 record away from Baton Rouge in his first season at LSU. The Tigers answered his call, taking a 35-21 decision at Alabama on Nov. 3 to finish 3-1 on the road during the 2001 season. The Tigers finished with a winning record on the road for the first time since 1997 when they went a perfect 4-0. It marked only the fourth time since 1990 that the Tigers had a winning record away from Baton Rouge. From 1998 to 2000, the Tigers were 2-11 on the road.

LSU STREAKS TO NOTE

Josh Reed has caught a pass in 24 straight games ... Jerel Myers has caught a pass in 11 straight games, while Michael Clayton has done it in 10 consecutive games ... Myers has at least one pass in 32 of 33 career games with the lone exception being the Tigers' 20-9 victory at Ole Miss in 2000 ... Ryan Clark has started 33 straight games at free safety, while Trev Faulk has 30 straight starts.

LSU'S FINALLY TAKING ADVANTAGE OF OPPONENTS TURNOVERS

LSU has finally started taking advantage of the turnovers that it forces as the Tigers have scored touchdowns on six of their last eight takeaways dating back to the Mississippi State contest. Against Miss. State, LSU turned four MSU turnovers into 28 points and then against Ole Miss, the Tigers turned an Eli Manning interception into a TD. six plays later. Prior to the Mississippi State contest, LSU had only scored 17 points all season off of its 13 takeaways. The Tigers also went a span of three games - Tennessee, Florida, and Kentucky - of not scoring off a turnover. Over that three-game span, LSU had six takeaways that resulted in no points.

TIGERS SPREAD THE WEALTH IN PASSING GAME

One thing is for sure, LSU can never be accused of focusing on one receiver in its passing game as 14 different players - six split ends, four tight ends, three tailbacks and one fullback - have caught passes for the Tigers this season. Spreading the football around has become a trademark of the Jimbo Fisher offense as last year, 13 Tigers caught passes during the regular-season. The Tigers have five players - three wide receivers, one tight end and one running back - with at least 10 receptions this year.

REED'S BIG PLAYS CONTINUE

Josh Reed continues to pile up huge chunks of yardage every time he gets his hands on the ball. Reed has at least one 30-yard reception in nine of LSU's 10 games,

and for the season, he has 18 receptions of 30 yards or better, including four against Arkansas.

TIGERS TURN REVERSAL OF FORTUNES IN THE THIRD QUARTER

After being outscored 37-7 in the third quarter in their first five games of the season, the Tigers have outscored their opponents 59-17 in the third quarter of their last five games. LSU's third quarter turnaround started against Mississippi State as the Tigers put up 21 points against the Bulldogs. LSU followed that with 14 points against Ole Miss that gave them a 24-21 lead heading into the final quarter.

LSU'S SPECIAL TEAMS COVERAGE HAS BEEN OUTSTANDING

LSU's special teams coverage continues to be outstanding as the Tigers are allowing an SEC-best 14.6 yards per kickoff return and only 2.8 yards per punt return. On 43 kickoff returns this season, the Tigers have allowed only 20 yards or more just 13 times. LSU has kicked off 51 times this year and its opponent has started outside the 20-yard line only 20 times.

LSU CONTINUES TO BE THE BEST IN THE LEAGUE ON THIRD DOWN

LSU continues to be the best in the SEC when it comes to third down situations as the Tigers have converted on 72 of their 138 third down opportunities this year for 52.2 percent. Ole Miss is a distant second in the league at 47.8 percent.

TIGER STADIUM ON RECORD ATTENDANCE PACE

LSU is on pace to average over 90,000 fans for the first time in school history. LSU currently ranks fifth in the nation in attendance with an average of 90,216 spectators per contest. The Tigers have drawn over 91,000 fans on three occasions this season - Tulane, Ole Miss and a stadium record 92,010 against Florida. LSU has had the three highest single game attendance figures in school history this season, while all six of the 2001 home games ran in the top 10 in school history.

HEAD COACH NICK SABAN

In his second year with the Tigers and eighth overall ... Has an overall mark of 58-33-1, which includes a 15-7 record at LSU ... Coached one season at Toledo (1990) and then spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State (1995-99) ... In first season as a head coach in 1990, led Toledo to a 9-2 mark and a share of the MAC title ... Spent the 1991-94 seasons as defensive coordinator of the Cleveland Browns ... LSU gave 24th ranked Auburn all it could handle for three quarters until eventually wearing down and falling 34-17 on the plains.

LSU jumped out to a 10-0 lead after Josh Booty hit Josh Reed on a 75-yard scoring strike followed by a 22-yard field goal from John Corbello. Auburn rallied behind the physical running of Rudi Johnson, who carried the ball 36 times for 139 yards, and the pin-point passing of Ben Leard, who finished 21-for-30 for 225 yards and a pair of TD passes.

With a 13-point second quarter, Auburn carried a 13-10 lead at the half. After Auburn increased the lead to 20-10, LSU rallied with a 45-yard strike from Booty to Reed to cut the lead to three, but a 100-yard TD run by Tim Carter on the ensuing kickoff was the back-breaker for LSU.

DAVEY, REED SET RECORDS AS LSU BEATS MTSU, 30-14

Rohan Davey became LSU's single-season passing record holder, while Josh Reed did the same in receiving yardage as the Tigers posted a 30-14 win over Middle Tennessee on Homecoming. Davey completed 26 of 37 passes for 318 yards and 1 TD to surpass Tommy Hodson as LSU's single-season passing yardage record holder. Davey broke the mark of 2,655 set by Hodson in 1989. TOEFIELD RUNS AND DAVEY PASSES LSU PAST HOGS

LaBrandon Toefield rushed for 173 yards and 3 TDs and Rohan Davey passed for 359 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers held off 24th-ranked Arkansas, 41-38, in Tiger Stadium. Toefield scored on a 62-yard run just four plays into the contest, however the Tigers kept the Razorbacks in the game with five turnovers, including three in the first half. Arkansas led 13-7 early in the second quarter before the Tigers came back to take a 20-19 lead at halftime. The Tigers stretched their lead to 41-25 with 8:21 to play on a 17-yard TD run by Toefield, the 18th of his career, which broke the LSU record for single-season rushing TDs. Arkansas scored a pair of TDs in the final 6:29 of the contest, the last with 2:27 to play, but the Razorbacks never got the ball back again. Josh Reed broke the SEC single-season receiving record in the game as he caught seven passes for 183 yards to run his total for the year to 1,494 yards.
