Game 15: LSU vs. Tulane—Tuesday, Mar. 5, 6:30 p.m., Alex Box Stadium

The rivalry resumes: LSU and Tulane renew the oldest intercollegiate athletic rivalry for both schools tonight at Alex Box Stadium.

- The Tigers come into tonight's game on a two-game win streak, taking the final two games of their three-game series with Long Beach St.
 - LSU lost the opener of Saturday's double-header, 8-3, but recovered for a 10-2 victory in the second game Saturday before winning on Sunday, 5-4 in 11 innings.
- The Tigers are now 8-2 at home on the season as tonight's contest continues an 11-game homestand.

Scouting the Wave: Tulane enters tonight's game at 8-5 after losing two of three to UCLA at Turchin Stadium.

- The Green Wave won an NCAA-best 56 games in 2001 as Tulane made its first College World Series appearance.
- The Wave started 2002 slowly, giving up 47 runs in losing two of three to Pepperdine.
- Tulane swept Villanova in three games and took two of three from George Washington prior to last weekend.
- Tulane coach Rick Jones had to replace two assistant coaches on his staff for this year. Former associate head coach Jim Schlossnagle took the head coaching post at UNLV and named former Wave hitting coach Buddy Gouldsmith the Rebels' top assistant.

About the series: LSU holds a 151-114-3 edge over their rivals from the Big Easy.

- The two teams met in last year's NCAA super regional at Zephyr Field. LSU won the opener, 4-3 in 13 innings, but Tulane won the next two games 9-4 and 7-1 to earn the trip to Omaha.
- The two teams have now met six times in the post-season, with LSU holding a 4-2 edge. The Tigers won regional meetings in 1986, 1987 and 1992.
- Tulane won both regular season meetings last year, 13-3 at Alex Box Stadium on Mar. 7 and 7-6 at Zephyr Field on Apr. 11.
- Since 1990, LSU holds a slight 14-13 edge, but in the last three years, Tulane has won 6 of 9 meetings.
- The Tigers and Wave will meet again on Apr. 10 at the Superdome in New Orleans, a game where the NCAA single-game attendance record could be set.

BRRRR!

How cold was it for Sunday's LSU-Long Beach game? Game time temperature at Metro Airport was 31 degrees, with a north wind of 20 MPH, giving a wind-chill index of 19 degrees. It is believed to be the first time an LSU home baseball game began with the temperature below freezing. Even when the sun came out in the seventh inning, the thermometer never reached 40 degrees.

The hearty fans who stayed to end indeed got their money's worth, as Matt Heath's homer in the 11th gave the Tigers a 5-4 victory.

Back to the home front

It's hard to believe that through 14 games so far, the Tigers have only played two of those contests against in-state competition, losing to SLU on Feb. 12 and defeating Centenary on Feb. 20.

That all changes in the next seven days, as LSU will play five games against in-state rivals, starting with tonight's renewal of the Tulane series. The Tigers will host Louisiana-Monroe for a three-game set this weekend before welcoming Louisiana-Lafayette.

LSU will play a total of 15 games against in-state competition in 2002, including home-and-home series with Tulane, UNO, SLU, and UL-Lafayette, as well as a fourth game against UL-Monroe at Indian Field. The Tigers were 10-7 last year vs. Louisiana teams, but only 1-4 against tonight's opponent, as the Green Wave swept the regular season series before winning 2-1 in the super regional.

However, the Tigers' one win against the Wave in the super regional opener denied Tulane a perfect record against in-state foes. The Green Wave finished 14-1 against Louisiana competition, the second-highest winning percentage ever against in-state foes. LSU holds the record of 17-1 set in 1995.

Tigers still Golden

LSU continued its mastery of California schools with its series win over Long Beach St. this past weekend, as the Tigers have now won six of their last seven and 12 of their last 15 against schools from the nation's most populous state.

The visit by the 49ers was the first by a California school in the regular season, but LSU has won most of those games when it counts, and that's in the NCAA tournament. LSU is 18-7 in regional, super regional and CWS play vs. California teams, including a 9-5 mark in Omaha.

Prior to this past weekend, the only other time LSU had faced California teams in the regular season was at the 1988 Busch Challenge in the Superdome, where the Tigers lost to Cal St. Fullerton and beat USC and UCLA.

Tulane, on the other hand, is just 2-4 against teams from the Golden State in 2002, dropping two of three to Pepperdine and UCLA.



Playing it close...and to win
LSU has won a game on its final at-bat three times this year. That's exactly three more times than the Tigers accomplished that feat in 2001, and LSU's mettle as team that comes through in the clutch continues to shine.

The Tigers' latest hero was Matt Heath, as the senior left fielder ended Sunday's frigid affair with Long Beach St. with an 11th-inning home run for a 5-4 LSU victory. The win also improved the Tigers to 2-0 in extra inning games this year, the same number of overtime wins the Tigers had in all of 2000, when LSU was 2-3.

Unlike the Tigers' first two victories over Birmingham-Southern, this one broke a tie. The Tigers had to rally from deficits to defeat BSC on Feb. 8 and 9, winning the season opener on Wally Pontiff's hit in the bottom of the ninth, then needing Aaron Hill's two-run double to win the next day. LSU also overcame a ninth-inning deficit for a 7-6 victory at Centenary on Feb. 20, as David Raymer's two-run double on what could have been the final pitch of the game won it.

Heath's game-ending home run marked the first time in nearly two years LSU had won a game on a home run in the final at-bat. The last time it happened was in March of 2000, when Jeremy Witten's three-run shot in the bottom of the ninth defeated top-ranked South Carolina.

LSU is now 4-2 this year in one-run games, compared to a 5-7 mark in 2001.

Wilson big in close games

One common denominator in the Tigers' one-run victories this season has been the pitching of sophomore closer Brian Wilson.

The New Hampshire native has appeared in five games this year, all of them one-run contests, posting a 3-1 record with a 1.12 ERA. On Sunday, he turned in his best effort of the season against Long Beach St., giving up just two hits in three scoreless innings of relief. Wilson's victory yesterday makes him the only LSU pitcher with three wins in 2002.

Wilson's only loss this season wasn't entirely his fault, as the Tigers yielded four unearned runs over the final two innings of a 12-11 loss Feb. 24 at Houston. Wilson has given up just one earned run in eight innings of work this season.

No walking zone

Another big reason for LSU's success against Long Beach was the control of its pitching staff. Tiger hurlers walked only four 49er batters over 29 innings of work in the three-game series.

Jake Tompkins and Brian Wilson combined to yield no walks on Sunday, marking the first time this year the Tigers have gone an entire game without yielding a base on balls—and this was in an 11-inning contest! LSU had only two games out of 67 last year in which they did not walk a batter—on Mar. 24 at Mississippi St. and May 1 at New Orleans in a 7-inning contest.

LSU pitchers gave up only one walk over the final 22 innings of the series, and that was by Lukas Guidroz in the ninth inning of Saturday's second game with LSU holding a commanding 10-1 lead. Lane Mestepey did not give up a walk in his eight inning stint on Saturday, while Tompkins also went eight innings with no walks on Sunday. As a staff, Tiger hurlers are yielding just 2.62 walks per nine innings.

Mestepey, Tompkins get career highs

For a pair of LSU hurlers, eight was enough against Long Beach State for them to set new career highs for strikeouts.

Mestepey achieved his high-water mark in Saturday's 10-2 second game triumph. The south-paw's previous high was seven in a four-inning relief stint in last year's SEC Tournament championship game against Mississippi St.

Tompkins got his career-high mark on Sunday, breaking his previous high of seven in his first start against Birmingham-Southern on Feb. 10.

LSU pitchers have been quite proficient at racking up "Ks" this season, posting 112 in 130.2 innings pitched, or an average of 7.71 per nine innings. Tiger hurlers have recorded nine or more strikeouts in six of the first 14 contests of 2002. More importantly, Tiger pitchers are averaging 2.9 strikeouts for every walk issued.

Mestepey and Tompkins aren't the only LSU pitchers to set career highs for strikeouts this year, as Bo Pettit tied his career best for Ks with 12 on Feb. 15 against Mercer, which is also the Tigers' team high for the year.



Gorilla ball back?

Well, maybe not quite, but LSU seems to slowly but surely be breaking out of the power funk that affected the Tigers early in the season.

Saturday's second game against Long Beach marked the first time all year the Tigers hit three home runs in one game, as the last time it happened was when LSU hit four in a regional outing last year against VCU.

Prior to Saturday's second game, LSU had gone four consecutive games without a home run, failing to hit one in the Houston series and the first game against Long Beach, marking just the second time since 1996 that has happened. The Tigers went four games in 2000 (one vs. McNeese St., three vs. Houston) without a home run.

LSU has 11 home runs in 14 games this year, well off their average of 1.93 per game from 1996-2001.

Raymer comes up big

David Raymer entered Saturday's second contest struggling, with his batting average very close to .200.

The senior center fielder may not have raised his average to .300 in one weekend, but with a pair of home runs in the Long Beach series, Raymer probably has his confidence back.

Raymer hit his first home run of the season on Saturday in the eighth inning of LSU's 10-2 victory, then came back with a big home run on Sunday to start the seventh inning, as it tied the game at 4-4, and LSU would win 5-4 in 11 innings.

Raymer's overall average may be just .243, but where he's been big is in the clutch. Raymer is hitting .400 (6-for-15) with runners in scoring position, and is 3-for-7 with a pair of doubles with two-out RBI opportunities.

Pontiff still scorching

LSU fans, rest easy. The real Wally Pontiff is back and maybe better than ever.

The Tigers' junior third baseman and team captain continues to hit the cover off the old horsehide, leading LSU with a .545 batting average (6-for-11) in the Long Beach series. In his last five games, Pontiff is batting a torrid .579 (11-for-10) with 9 RBI and a .642 on-base percentage. Following a day off against Centenary on Feb. 20, the Metairie native has hit safely in his last six outings, with at least two hits in five of those games.

Pontiff, who was struggling at or below .200 prior to taking a seat in Shreveport, is now the team leader in four different categories—batting average (.375), slugging percentage (.583), on-base percentage (.516) and walks (15).

Gill still rising

Yes, LSU infielder Blake Gill really was once 0-for-16. Only now, it seems like that cold streak is a really distant memory.

Gill continues to be one of the hottest Tigers at the plate, batting .476 (10-for-21) in his last five games and is now 15-for-33 (.455) since the cold spell. The Florida native now has a .306 batting average on the season, although he will be entering tonight's contest against Tulane southpaw Michael Aubrey looking for his first hit this year against left-handed pitching, as the left-handed hitting Gill is 0-for-10 this year against lefties.

One-quarter pole passed

The time certainly has flown, as LSU is now one-quarter of the way through its 56-game regular-season schedule. The Tigers have two fewer wins at this point than they did in 2001, but it should be noted that the Tigers would go 0-3-1 in their next four games after starting 12-2, with a 13-3 loss at home to Tulane included in that stretch.

However, if you're already eliminating the Tigers from having any shot of making it to Omaha, it's way too early. Three of the last five Tiger teams to advance to college baseball's Mecca have been worse than this year's 10-4 mark, including the 2000 national championship team that had an 8-6 record at this point.

The 1997 team was 14-0 at this point on its way to a 19-0 start, while the 1988 and 1996 squads were 13-1.

LSU coach Smoke Laval
 Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.

- Six SEC Teams Ranked; Houston blasts off, Long Beach out
- LSU is one of six SEC teams ranked in this week's three polls, and in one poll, the Fighting Tigers have once again assumed the mantle as the highest-ranked team from the conference.
- The Tigers moved up to the sixth spot in both the ESPN/Baseball Weekly coaches' poll and the Baseball America poll, while remaining eighth in Collegiate Baseball's poll. South Carolina is still ranked higher in two of the polls (fourth in CB, fifth by BW), but the Tigers are now the high man on the totem poll by Baseball America, as the Gamecocks slid to seventh after losing two to in-state rival Clemson.
- Joining LSU and South Carolina in the surveys are Florida, Ole Miss, Alabama and Mississippi St.
- The biggest movement has come among some of LSU's non-conference foes. Houston, which swept Cal St. Fullerton, USC and Miami at the Kia Baseball Bash at Fullerton, moved up 15 spots in the Baseball America poll to 10th, and is now ranked 16th and 18th by Collegiate Baseball and Baseball Weekly, respectively. Meanwhile, a 1-3 week has dropped Long Beach St. out of the two polls in which they were ranked last week. Tulane remains ranked in all three polls, while UL-Lafayette is 27th in the Collegiate Baseball poll and hosts Houston this weekend at Moore Field.
