Enters senior season rated as one of the best running backs in the Southeastern Conference ... Powerful runner who also possesses breakaway speed ... Shows tremendous versatility out of the backfield with his pass-catching ability ... Has good vision and good hands ... Also considered the best blocker of LSU's stable of running backs ... All-purpose back who is LSU's "go to" back in third-down situations.

**JUNIOR SEASON (2004)**

All-purpose running back who ranked second on the squad in rushing and third on the team in receiving ... Played in all 12 games ... Rushed 101 times for 680 yards and 3 TDs and caught 26 passes for 294 yards and 4 scores ... The 4 receiving TDs were the most by an LSU running back since 1989 when Eddie Fuller caught 9 TD passes ... The 26 receptions and 294 receiving yards were the most for an LSU running back since Eddie Fuller had 38 receptions for 477 yards in 1989 ... Rushed for a career-best 109 yards, including a 53-yard run, in win over Ole Miss ... A week earlier, had 99 yards rushing and 1 TD in 26-10 victory over Alabama ... Rushed for 90 or more yards four times in 2004 ... Had 95 yards and 1 TD in win over Arkansas State and then added 93 yards in road victory against Florida ... Against Florida, rushed for 54 yards on 6 carries in the fourth quarter in the win over the Gators ... Scored game-winning TD with less than a minute remaining against Florida on a 10-yard catch-and-run ... Had a pair of receiving TDs in win over Arkansas ... Scored on a 35-yard reception against Alabama ... Had one rushing TD against Arkansas State, Troy and Alabama ... Rushed for 27 yards on 11 carries and had 4 receptions for 14 yards against Iowa in the Capital One Bowl.

**SOPHOMORE SEASON (2003)**

Played in 12 games with six starts ... Second on team with 521 yards on 112 carries ... Rushed for a pair of touchdowns ... Opened year as LSU's starting running back before an injury against Florida sidelined the sophomore for two games ... LSU's primary running back on third down situations ... Returned to action on a limited basis against Louisiana Tech ... Was back at full strength in a backup role to Justin Vincent for the final five games of season ... Looked to have regained early season form against Georgia in the SEC Championship Game, rushing for 60 yards on 8 carries ... Opened season with 81 yards on 15 attempts in 49-7 win over Louisiana-Monroe and followed that with 86 yards and 2 TDs in win over Arizona ... Has good hands out of backfield and he led all running backs with 12 catches for 74 yards and a TD ... Scored on a 17-yard TD reception from Matt Mauck in season-opener against Louisiana-Monroe.

**REDSHIRT FRESHMAN SEASON (2002)**

LSU's No. 3 tailback ... Played in 12 games with one start ... Started season-opener at fullback against Virginia Tech ... Ranked third on squad with 438 yards on 80 carries ... Rushed for 4 TDs, including a 63-yarder on the first play of the second half vs. Kentucky ... Averaged 5.5 yards per carry ... Rushed for 91 yards on 9 carries in win over Kentucky ... Had 98 yards and a pair of TDs in victory over Louisiana-Lafayette ... Scored LSU's only TD vs. Auburn ... Caught 6 passes for 81 yards ... Redshirted in 2001 as a true freshman.

**TRUE FRESHMAN SEASON (2001)**

Played in two games for the Tigers ... Finished season with 27 yards rushing on 8 carries ... Had 28 yards on 7 carries in season opener vs. Tulane ... Also had 1 carry for minus-1 yard vs. Kentucky ... Granted a medical redshirt.

**HIGH SCHOOL**

Named an All-American by both ESPN and FoxSports and was rated among the top 100 players in the nation by Rivals.com and by ESPN's Tom Lemming ... Member of the Houston Chronicle Top 100 ... First-Team 5A All-State in Texas as well as First-Team All-District and All-County ... Played quarterback in high school ... As a senior, completed 37-of-91 passes for 425 yards ... Rushed for 1,429 yards on 159 carries for an average of 8.9 yards per carry ... Rushed for 26 touchdowns and returned eight kickoffs for 380 yards for an average of 47.5 a return ... Clocked at 10.7 in the 100 meters and 22.1 in the 200 meters ... Coached in high school by Charles Perridon.

Gifted receiver who possesses great natural ability ... Perhaps the most talented player among LSU's receiving corps ... Big-bodied receiver with great hands ... Has tremendous wingspan ... Still relatively new at the game of football, having played the sport for the first time just four years ago (first year came as a junior in high school) ... At 6-3 has a tremendous stride that contributes to his breakaway speed.

**SOPHOMORE SEASON (2004)**

Ranked second on the squad in receiving ... Played in all 12 games with 10 starts ... Started first nine games of season and then in the Capital One Bowl against Iowa ... Caught 39 passes for 597 yards and a team-best 5 TDs ... Finished season with a bang, leading the Tigers with 8 receptions for 122 yards, both career-highs, against Iowa in the Capital One Bowl ... The 5 receiving touchdowns ranked among the top 10 in the SEC ... Opened season with 5 receptions for 103 yards and 1 score in overtime win over Oregon State ... His 38-yard TD reception vs. Oregon State came with just over a minute left in the fourth quarter and helped send the contest into overtime ... Followed that with 2 TD receptions vs. Arkansas State and then added another scoring reception against Auburn ... Scored fifth TD of season vs. Georgia ... Two-sport standout for the Tigers ... Tremendous talent on the track who capped his collegiate eligibility as the most decorated All-American in LSU track history ... Earned a total of 14 All-America honors in four years as a member of the LSU track and field team ... A five-time NCAA Champion on the oval ... Sees action at wide receiver and special teams on the football field for the Tigers ... On the track in 2005, was the national runner-up in the 400-meter hurdles for the second straight year, and the third time in his career, clocking a school record and personal best time of 47.67 ... In four years as a member of the LSU track and field team, has been a part of five national championship relay teams - indoor 4x400 in 2003, outdoor 4x400 in 2003 and 2005 and outdoor 4x100 in 2002 and 2003 ... Member of LSU's national champion outdoor track and field team in 2002 and LSU's national champion indoor team in 2004 ... Running back who combines speed and power ... Teams with senior Joseph Addai to give LSU one of the best 1-2 punches at running back around ... The biggest of LSU's running backs ... Shown that he can be effective running between the tackles or on the outside ... Thrives on short-yardage situations ... Also proven to have breakaway speed ... Called a "great back" by Arkansas coach Houston Nutt prior to LSU's game against the Razorbacks in 2004 ... Was quoted as saying, "that has to be a misprint!" after learning of his school-record 250 yards rushing against Ole Miss in 2004.

**SOPHOMORE SEASON (2004)**

LSU's starting running back for eight games ... Played in all 12 games with eight starts ... Led the team in rushing with 867 yards and 10 TDs on 142 carries ... Capped sophomore season with 109 yards rushing and 1 TD in loss to Iowa in the Capital One Bowl ... Scored on a 74-yard run just before halftime against Iowa ... Rushed for a school-record 250 yards and 3 TDs in win over Ole Miss on Nov. 20 ... Named SEC Offensive Player of the Week for his performance against Ole Miss ... ### HIGH SCHOOL

The state's top running back who capped off his career with 1,910 yards on 290 carries, including 27 touchdowns ... All-American by Riddell Football and SuperPrep ... Ranked as the nation's fourth-best running back prospect by Rivals.com ... Two-time First-Team 5A All-State in Louisiana ... Member of the Baton Rouge Advocate Super Dozen, the Shreveport Times Top 20, the New Orleans Times-Picayune's Top 25 Blue Chip list as well as the Orlando Sentinel All-South team ... Named to the Super Southern 100 by the Atlanta Journal-Constitution ... Ranked No. 8 by ESPN.com and No. 6 by College Football News ...
