

Bowl Championship Series











Following the 2002 college football regular season,the Bowl Championship Series will determine the National Championship.

The BCS consists of the FedEx Orange, Nokia Sugar, Rose and Tostitos Fiesta Bowls. The conferences with automatic berths include the Atlantic Coast, Big East, Big Ten, Big 12, Pac-10 and Southeastern Conferences.

ABC-TV will televise the four Bowl Championship Series games.

The Bowl Championship Series guarantees a matchup between college football's top two teams in a true national championship game.

Last season, Miami (Fla.) defeated Nebraska,37-14,in the Rose Bowl presented by AT&T to capture the National Championship

At the conclusion of the 2002 regular season, the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl will host the National Championship contest. The game will be played on Jan.3 at 8 p.m.ET in Tempe, Arizona. The Fiesta Bowl shall select the top two teams ranked in the BCS final regular season standings.

The BCS uses regional consideration regarding team selection. Specifically, as a member of the BCS, the Rose Bowl will host the Big Ten and Pac-10 champions in those years in which either the Rose Bowl does not have the national championship game or the Bi Ten and Pac-10 champion is not ranke No.1 or No.2. Other "regional consic eration" tie-ins include the SEC champion in the Sugar Bowl, the ACC or Big East champion in the Orange Bowl and the Big 12 cham-

There will be several occasions whe the regional consideration tie-ins will 1 be kept. Criteria for moving host team another bowl include: (1) whether the same team will be hosting the same BCS Bowl for two consecutive years; (2) whether two teams that played against one another in the most recently completed college football season will be for two
