The Tigers' second weekend series of 2002 finds LSU hosting Mercer.

- LSU will be looking to put a new winning streak together after a 4-3 loss Tuesday to Southeastern Louisiana.
 - The victory by the Lions was their first since April 23, 1991. LSU and SLU will meet again on Mar. 26 in Hammond.
 - LSU still hasn't started 4-0 in back-to-back seasons since 1996 and 1997, two of the Tigers' five national championship seasons.
- The Tigers lost their first in-state game in a season for the first time since losing to Nicholls St. in 1982.

Scouting the Bears: Mercer, located in Macon, Ga., is making its third visit to Alex Box Stadium, but its first in 13 years.

- Mercer will be playing its first game since losing 11-7 at Florida on Feb. 6.
 - The Bears will also play at Georgia and Auburn during the 2002 season.
- Mercer opened the season with a two-game sweep of Morris Brown College, but lost two of three to Florida A&M.
- The Bears finished 24-28 in 2001 and 8th in the Trans America Athletic Conference (as it was known at the time).
- Mercer was picked to finish 7th in the 11-team Atlantic Sun by Baseball America.

About the Series: LSU has won all six meetings in this series.

- Like this weekend's series, all six previous meetings were in February.
- LSU swept a three-game series in 1988 by scores of 15-6, 8-4 and 6-1, and did so again the next year by scores of 7-4, 8-7 and 12-7.
 - In the second and third games of the 1989 series, LSU set a school record by drawing 16 walks in each game. That record has been equaled only once since, against Florida in 1991.
- The Tigers are familiar with the Atlantic Sun Conference, as the Tigers defeated Central Florida in two games in 1999 at home and won two of three in a 2000 series at Orlando.
 - UCF is the only current Atlantic Sun team the Tigers have played since 1990. Southeastern Louisiana was a member of the league when it was known as the TAAC through the 1997 season.
 - LSU holds a 16-4 record against current Atlantic Sun members, going 9-2 vs. UCF, 6-0 vs. Mercer and 1-2 vs. Jacksonville.
- LSU hasn't played a school from Georgia other than UGA since its 29-13 victory over Georgia Tech in the final of the 1996 South II Regional.
 - LSU is 49-11-1 all-time against teams from Georgia.

Tonight's Starting Pitcher

#34 RH Bo Pettit (Jr.-1L, 6-0, 205, Houston–Sharpstown HS)

Bo Pettit takes the mound for his second start of the 2002 season. This marks the first time Pettit has made back-to-back weekend starts since he was injured in the 2000 season. If healthy, the Houston native could be the stabilizing influence on an inexperienced LSU pitching staff.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: No decisions so far with a 6.00 ERA in one start.

- Started season opener vs. Birmingham-Southern on Feb. 8 and struck out eight in 6.0 innings.

2001: Posted 4-0 mark with a 2.42 ERA, but only appeared in 7 games (4 starts) due to continuing shoulder ailments.

- Struck out five in two innings in his first appearance of 2001 vs. Nicholls St. on Feb. 27
- Earned his first win of the season against Southern on Mar. 13, going five innings and allowing two runs on two hits.
- Best outing of season came Mar. 23 at Mississippi St., as he allowed no earned runs in 6.1 innings to pick up the victory.
- Did not return to action again until May 1 at New Orleans, when he went three innings and allowed just one hit and no earned runs while striking out five.

2000: Went 5-3 with a 4.15 ERA in 16 games (7 starts), but season ended early due to tendonitis in his shoulder.

- Best effort came in Apr. 30 win at Ole Miss in first career SEC start. In that game, Pettit allowed one run on five hits and struck out a career-high 12 in seven innings.
- Earned his first career win in second game of doubleheader vs. Virginia on Feb. 12, starting and throwing six scoreless innings, striking out six and allowing just two hits.
- Threw two scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in relief stint vs. McNeese St. on Feb. 22.
- Hurlled four scoreless and hitless innings in start vs. New Orleans on Mar. 22, picking up victory with six strikeouts.
- Final outing of season came on May 6 at Kentucky, where he earned win with six strikeouts over 6.2 innings.

1999: Was granted a medical redshirt after pitching in only three early-season games.

- Made his first career appearance on Feb. 27 against Central Florida, going 1.1 innings and giving up two runs on four hits, walking one and striking out one.
- Pitched one scoreless inning vs. Ohio on Mar. 6, striking out two.
- Final appearance of the year came against USL on Mar. 16, as he gave up three runs (two earned) and only faced two batters.

Barker still on a tear

LSU's home run drought finally ended on Tuesday night after 38.1 innings and 186 plate appearances, but it wasn't enough to overcome SLU, who held on for a 4-3 victory.

Fittingly, it was Tiger right fielder Sean Barker who ended the drought with his solo shot in the ninth inning. Barker continues to be hotter than a Louisiana summer, as his batting average actually dropped all the way to .579 with his 2-for-4 effort on Tuesday. Barker is 11-of-19 and leads the Tigers with 9 RBI.

Barker continues to be the Tigers' best all-around threat, as he is 4-for-6 with runners in scoring position and 8-for-12 with runners on base.

LSU's batting average this season may be only .259, but if you take Barker out of the lineup, LSU is batting only .211 (27-for-128) and would have only four extra-base hits for an anemic slugging percentage of .242.

Barker won the SEC Player of the Week honors on Monday after going 9-for-15 last weekend against Birmingham-Southern.

Zeringue off to hot start

He may not be ready to catch just yet, but Jon Zeringue showed his bat is ready to contribute for LSU right now.

In his first career start, the Thibodaux native went 3-for-4, becoming the first Tiger this year other than Sean Barker to get three or more hits in a game.

Zeringue was the third round draft choice of the Chicago White Sox and is the highest draftee to ever enroll at LSU.

Tigers showing patience

One of the few bright spots to come out of the LSU offense so far in 2002 is the increased patience of Tiger hitters.

Tuesday night's loss to SLU marked the first time this season Tiger hitters recorded more strikeouts than walks, although there was only one more strikeout (6) than walk (5).

So far this year, LSU has drawn 28 walks while fanning only 17 times in 147 at-bats. Last year, LSU struck out 72 more times (402) than it walked (350).

Leading the walk-a-thon is leadoff hitter David Raymer, whose seven walks, while Wally Pontiff and Matt Heath each have bases on balls.

The single-season record for walks is 444 set in 1989. Ironically, the last time the Tigers played Mercer in 1989, the Bears issued 16 walks each in the second and third games of those series, tying the LSU school record.

Vaught looks sharp

The bullpen's inability to hold the lead on Tuesday night cost Chad Vaught the opportunity to earn his first career victory at LSU.

Instead, the Ferriday native was saddled with a no-decision despite an outstanding effort in his first start. The junior right-hander allowed five hits and one run and struck out eight in 6.0 innings of work. Vaught became the second LSU pitcher to strike out eight batters in a game this year, as Bo Pettit also turned the trick on opening night against Birmingham-Southern.

Like any young pitcher, Vaught was a little nervous early on, giving up a run on three hits and throwing 29 pitches. But he settled into his groove after that, giving up only two singles and allowing only one SLU runner to reach third base. He retired the side in order in the third and sixth innings.

Prior to Tuesday's outing, Vaught had made only one appearance in his Tiger career, throwing one inning in relief last Apr. 26 at UL-Monroe.

Updates on Tiger Position Players

#36 OF Sean Barker

Sr.-1L, 6-3, 225, Bakersfield, Calif. (Bakersfield CC)

Barker is off to a hot start, earning SEC Player of the Week honors after going 9-for-15 with 7 RBI in the Birmingham-Southern Series.

- > The Tigers' leading hitter at .579 (11-for-19).
- > Also leading LSU in RBI (9), slugging percentage (.789), on-base percentage (.591) and stolen bases (3-3).
- > Is 4-for-6 with runners in scoring position.
- > Went 4-for-6 in season opener vs. BSC (2/9), becoming first LSU player to get four hits in season opener since Justin Bowles in 1996.
 - > Two-run single in bottom of the ninth vs. BSC tied game, and LSU would win 10-9 on Wally Pontiff's base hit immediately following Barker's hit.
- > Followed up big opening night by going 3-for-5 on in Game 2 and 2-for-4 with 4 RBI in Game 3
- > Hit LSU's first home run of season on Tuesday night vs. SLU. Went 2-for-4 to give him 4 multi-hit games in 2002.

#39 1B Jason Columbus

Jr.-JC, 6-5, 235, Alamogordo, N.M. (New Mexico JC)

Columbus has started the last two games at first base. He won the NJCAA home run title in 2001 and brings power to the Tiger lineup.

- > Batting .286 (2-for-7) with 1 RBI on the year.
- > Collected first hit in 12th inning of Feb. 9 game with Birmingham-Southern.
- > Had RBI single in first inning of Feb. 10 victory that completed sweep of BSC.

#3 1B Blake Gill

Fr.-RS, 5-11, 195, Bradenton, Fla. (Manatee HS)

Gill started the first two games against Birmingham-Southern at first base and will start there against right-handed pitchers.

- > Still looking for first career LSU hit.

#7 OF Dustin Hahn

Fr.-HS, 6-0, 220, Reno, Nev. (Galena HS)

Hahn has seen time in three games this year. The son of former New York Met Don Hahn, he will likely see action against right-handed pitchers.

- > Got first career LSU hit with a double in Feb. 9 victory over Birmingham-Southern.

#6 OF Matt Heath

Sr.-1L, 6-0, 200, Fernandina Beach, Fla. (Univ. of Florida)

The converted catcher has started all four games in left field.

- > 3-for-7 this year with runners on base.
- > Drew three walks in season-opening win over Birmingham-Southern.
- > Hit safely in all three games of the BSC series.
- > Has walked five times and struck out only once in 21 plate appearances.

#5 SS Aaron Hill
So.-1L, 5-11, 196, Visalia, Calif. (Redwood HS)

The 2001 Freshman all-America had a game-winning two-run double in the 13th inning of the Tigers' Feb. 9 victory over Birmingham-Southern.

- All four of hits this season have come off left-handed pitching.
- LSU was 0-for-17 in Feb. 9 game before his game-winning double in the 13th.
- Second on the team with 6 RBI.
- Collected 4 RBI on Feb. 9, as he had an RBI single and a sacrifice fly to go along with the two-run double.

#1 2B J.C. Holt
Fr.-HS, 5-8, 163, Sieper (Oak Hill HS)

Holt will be the Tigers' starting second baseman against right-handed pitchers.

- Described by LSU coach Smoke Laval as the Tiger's fastest player.
- Scored game-tying run as pinch runner in season-opening win vs. BSC.

#13 OF Jay Mattox
Fr.-HS, 6-3, 210, Conway, Ark. (Conway HS)

Mattox has appeared in two games as a pinch runner and is still waiting his first plate appearance in an LSU uniform. Mattox turned down a sizable offer after being drafted in the fourth round by the Chicago White Sox to enroll at LSU.

#8 C Chris Phillips
Sr.-1L, 6-0, 217, Shreveport (Northwestern St.)

Phillips appeared to be out of the mix before the season, but he got the start against SLU on Tuesday night. He served the 2001 season as the backup to Matt Heath.

#31 3B Wally Pontiff
Jr.-2L, 6-0, 200, Metairie (Jesuit HS)

The Tigers' team captain is struggling with a .176 average right now, but once the season gets rolling, Pontiff should start clicking. He had the game-winning hit in the Tigers' season-opening victory over Birmingham-Southern.

- A career .344 hitter with runners in scoring position, he batted .404 (40-for-99) to finish second on the Tigers with RISP in 2001.
- Went 2-for-4 with 2 walks in the season opener.

#2 OF David Raymer
Sr.-1L, 5-10, 190, Apex, N.C. (Sacramento City CC)

Raymer has been able to get on base and be an effective leadoff hitter despite his .182 batting average.

- Team leader with 5 sacrifice bunts, nearly halfway to single-season record of 11. Also leads the team with seven walks.
- Second on the Tigers with a .571 on-base percentage
- Tied school record for sacrifice bunts in a game with 2 vs. Birmingham-Southern on Feb. 9. It marked the third time in his career Raymer has laid down two sacrifices in one game.

#4 2B Rocky Scelfo
Fr.-RS, 6-2, 195, Youngsville (St. Thomas More HS)

Scelfo wasn't as touted as many of the Tiger freshman upon his arrival at LSU, but after a redshirt year, "The Rock" is proving that he is ready for the highest level of college competition.

- Went 5-for-12 (.417) in Tigers' three-game sweep of Birmingham-Southern.
- Laid down bunt single in ninth inning of season opener that helped LSU rally to score three runs and win the game.

#9 C Dustin Weaver
So.-TR, 5-11, 180, St. Amant (SLU)

Weaver and Darren Welch are splitting time behind the plate early this season. The local product is still searching for his first career hit as a Tiger.

#14 C Darren Welch
Sr.-TR, 6-1, 210, Laurel, Miss. (Southern Miss)

Welch transferred from Southern Miss and could provide the Tigers with some needed power behind the plate.

- Collected his first career LSU hit, a two-run single, in the first inning of the season opener Feb. 8 vs. Birmingham-Southern.

#47 DH/1B Eric Wiethorn
Jr.-1L, 6-2, 205, Newport Beach, Calif. (Orange County JC)

The California native has been one of the Tigers' more consistent hitters in limited opportunities this year.

- Got a hit in all three games of the Birmingham-Southern series, one of five Tigers to do so.
- Had a two-run single in the seven-run first inning against BSC on Feb. 10

#16 C Jon Zeringue
Fr.-HS, 6-1, 215, Thibodaux (E.D. White HS)

Zeringue was one of the most highly anticipated members of this year's crop of newcomers, and he showed why by going 3-for-4 on Tuesday night against SLU.

- Should become the Tigers' regular catcher once he heals from off-season surgery.
- Drafted in the third round after his senior year by the Chicago White Sox, but became the highest draftee to ever enroll at LSU.

#30 LH Brad David
Jr.-2L, 6-0, 187, Baton Rouge (Catholic HS)

David is one of the returning pitchers from last year's bullpen corps, but has struggled at times this year.

- Pitched scoreless 7th inning in season opener vs. Birmingham-Southern.
- Took loss in relief on Tuesday vs. SLU.

#33 LH Jason Determann
Fr.-HS, 5-10, 168, Baton Rouge (Catholic HS)

Determann will be one of the key relievers for the Tigers this season. He has already shown his mettle by getting the win on Feb. 9 vs. Birmingham Southern, allowing one run on two hits in four innings.

#44 RH Weylin Guidry
Sr.-3L, 6-0, 205, Luling (Hahnville HS)

Guidry is a veteran of the Tigers' mound staff, and the hope is he will return to the form that saw him notch seven saves for the 2000 national champion Tigers.

> Pitched 1.1 scoreless innings of relief in Feb. 10 win over Birmingham-Southern.

#21 RH Clay Harris
Fr.-HS, 6-4, 228, Slidell (Slidell HS)

Big things are expected of this imposing right-hander. Harris' younger brother, Will, has signed for the 2003 season.

> Walked in a pinch hitting appearance on Feb. 9 vs. Birmingham-Southern.

> Struck out 3 in 1.2 innings of hitless relief vs. SLU on Tuesday.

#46 LH Lane Mestepey
So.-1L, 6-0, 187, Zachary (Central Private)

Hoping to avoid the "sophomore slump", Mestepey should be the ace of the Tiger staff this season. Anything close to his 2001 seasons, when he was the SEC and national Freshman of the Year, will be a boost to LSU's inexperienced staff.

> Threw seven shutout innings in debut on Feb. 9 vs. Birmingham-Southern, and ended with 6 Ks and giving up two runs on six hits.

#12 RH Jake Tompkins
Jr.-JC, 5-11, 197, Auburn, Calif. (Sacramento City College)

Tompkins struck out seven in 6.2 innings on Feb. 10 vs. Birmingham-Southern to earn his first LSU victory. Tompkins is the Sunday starter and will try to hold that position through the non-conference series.

#25 LH Jason Vargas
Fr.-HS, 5-11, 203, Apple Valley, Calif. (Apple Valley HS)

Vargas hasn't pitched yet, but he did draw a walk in a pinch hitting role in the season opener vs. Birmingham Southern.

#38 RH Brian Wilson
So.-1L, 6-1, 205, Londonderry, N.H. (Londonderry HS)

Wilson is expected to be the Tigers' closer in 2002, and with his blazing fastball, a lot of opposing batters might be a bit intimidated.
