Not since 1958 had an LSU football team put together the type of season that fans witnessed in 2003. Trace the Tigers' steps from the SEC Championship game win over Georgia all the way to their meeting with President Bush at the White House as LSU claimed the school's first national title in football in 45 years.

Nick Saban

LSU coach Nick Saban etched his name alongside some of the greatest to have ever coached college football in 2003, leading the Tigers to the national title, while being named national coach of the year by three organizations. In four years, Saban has led LSU to a national title, a pair of SEC championships and to four bowl games.
