Home Again: LSU returns home this weekend to welcome Mississippi State in a three-game SEC West series.

- LSU is home for the first time since its series with Vanderbilt two weeks ago.
- LSU comes in at 2-4 in the SEC, its lowest conference mark at this point since 1984.
- The Tigers completed a five-game road trip with a 9-7 victory at Southeastern Louisiana on Tuesday, LSU's first midweek victory in over a month.
- LSU is 12-6 at home and 4-5 on the road. The Tigers' batting average is slightly higher on the road (.283 to .281), but the ERA is much lower at home (3.48 to 4.70).
- The Tigers' brief homestand concludes Tuesday night when they host New Orleans.

Scouting the Bulldogs: MSU comes in to Baton Rouge at 13-8-1 in its second tenure under legendary coach Ron Polk.

- The Bulldogs earned a split with UNO after a 7-1 victory on Wednesday. The Privateers took the opening game of the set 7-3 on Tuesday.
- Polk was 888-422 in 22 years with the Bulldogs from 1976-97, and his 980 wins at MSU and Georgia are the most in SEC history.
- Polk coached the last two seasons at Georgia, going 47-22 in 2001 to win the SEC championship and advance to the school's third College World Series berth.
- MSU features two of the SEC's best starting pitchers in sophomore left-hander Paul Maholm (4-1, 2.52) and senior right-hander Tanner Brock (3-1, 3.90).
- State is led at the plate by sophomore third baseman Steve Gendron, who is hitting .375 and is one of six Bulldogs batting .300 or better.

About the Series: LSU and MSU split four meetings last year to leave the Bulldogs with a 184-148-1 all-time edge in the 95-year old series.

- LSU won the first two meetings last year in Starkville, 9-1 and 7-1. MSU won the series finale on its home field, 13-0, then won the SEC Tournament championship game in Birmingham, 4-1.
- State won two of three on their last visit to Baton Rouge in 2000, and the 40 runs the Bulldogs scored are the most by any opponent in a three-game series at Alex Box Stadium.
- The visiting team has won the last three series, but the home team won the four series before that. From 1991 through 1998, LSU was 15-5 against MSU at Alex Box Stadium.
- The Tigers and Bulldogs have hooked up 333 times, as LSU has faced State more often than any other opponent.
- State is only one of two SEC teams to have an all-time winning record against LSU; the other is Alabama.
- Skip Bertman ended his 18-year tenure with LSU holding a slight 38-37 edge against MSU. Ron Polk is 61-45 against LSU, including a 57-42 mark during his first tenure at State.

Tonight's Starting Pitcher

#34 Jr. RHP Bo Pettit (6-0, 200, Houston–Sharpstown HS)

Bo Pettit is looking for a repeat performance against Mississippi State. Last year in Starkville, he gave up no earned runs in 6.1 innings in helping LSU to a 9-1 victory. Pettit will match up with the ace of MSU's staff, sophomore left-hander Paul Maholm (4-1, 2.52).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: Is 2-3 with a 3.69 ERA, posting 55 strikeouts in 46.1 innings this year.

- Has struck out 10 or more three times this year.
- Struggled in last start at Ole Miss (Mar. 22), walking a career-high eight in 4.1 innings.
- Fired complete game, four-hit shutout vs. Vanderbilt (Mar. 15), tying a career high with 12 strikeouts.
 - Became the first LSU pitcher since Brian Tallet (Kentucky in 2000) to throw a nine-inning shutout.
- Tied a career high with 12 strikeouts in the Tigers' Feb. 15 victory over Mercer.
- Struck out 10 in 6.1 innings and got no decision vs. UL-Monroe (Mar. 8).
- Went a career high 7.2 innings in Mercer game, not yielding an earned run and carrying a shutout into the eighth inning.
- Started season opener vs. Birmingham-Southern on Feb. 8 and struck out eight in 6.0 innings.

2001: Posted 4-0 mark with a 2.42 ERA, but only appeared in 7 games (4 starts) due to continuing shoulder ailments.

- Struck out five in two innings in his first appearance of 2001 vs. Nicholls St. on Feb. 27
- Earned his first win of the season against Southern on Mar. 13, going five innings and allowing two runs on two hits.
- Best outing of season came Mar. 23 at Mississippi St., as he allowed no earned runs in 6.1 innings to pick up the victory.
- Did not return to action again until May 1 at New Orleans, when he went three innings and allowed just one hit and no earned runs while striking out five.

2000: Went 5-3 with a 4.15 ERA in 16 games (7 starts), but season ended early due to tendonitis in his shoulder.

- Best effort came in Apr. 30 win at Ole Miss in first career SEC start. In that game, Pettit allowed one run on five hits and struck out a career-high 12 in seven innings.
- Earned his first career win in second game of doubleheader vs. Virginia on Feb. 12, starting and throwing six scoreless innings, striking out six and allowing just two hits.
- Threw two scoreless innings and allowed just one hit in relief stint vs. McNeese St. on Feb. 22.
- Hurlled four scoreless and hitless innings in start vs. New Orleans on Mar. 22, picking up victory with six strikeouts.
- Final outing of season came on May 6 at Kentucky, where he earned win with six strikeouts over 6.2 innings.

1999: Was granted a medical redshirt after pitching in only three early-season games.

- Made his first career appearance on Feb. 27 against Central Florida, going 1.1 innings and giving up two runs on four hits, walking one and striking out one.

Tigers looking to avoid history
 LSU is looking to avoid a fate that hasn't befallen the Tigers since 1977, and that's to lose five consecutive SEC series.

The Tigers enter the weekend with Mississippi State having lost their last four SEC weekends, as 2-1 series losses to Vanderbilt and Ole Miss have extended a streak that started last May when LSU was swept at Arkansas and dropped two to Auburn.

The 1977 streak saw the Tigers lose home and away series to Ole Miss, a home series to Alabama and at Auburn and Mississippi St. as LSU went 4-12 in the SEC, the fewest wins in league play since 1956.

LSU hasn't lost three consecutive SEC series in a single season since 1995, when it dropped two of three to Alabama, Auburn and Mississippi St.

The Tigers, who are 2-4 in the SEC for the first time since Skip Bertman's first year of 1984, will be under .500 for the first time after nine SEC games since 1987 if they do not sweep MSU this weekend.

Tigers bust loose to win in midweek
 The Tigers' win at Southeastern Louisiana on Tuesday was not only important to get the Tigers on the right track for this weekend, but marked LSU's first win during the midweek since Feb. 20 at Centenary.

Prior to the win at Hammond, LSU was 1-4 in midweek games this year and 0-3 in those games in March. In those five previous midweek contests, LSU had scored more than five runs only once, and that was in the Centenary game, a 7-6 victory. LSU scored a total of six runs in the three previous midweek games this month, including a 7-0 shut-out loss at UL-Lafayette on Mar. 19.

Still, the Tigers are hitting just .252 in the six midweek games this season, although Wally Pontiff has used the games to keep his batting average near .400 by going 13-for-30 (.433) in midweek.

LSU improved to 5-4 this year against Louisiana foes, and has four games remaining against in-state teams, a home-and-home with New Orleans, the game with Tulane in the Superdome and a home date with cross-town rival Southern.



Hill back in form

It appears the eight games Aaron Hill missed with a separated shoulder have allowed the LSU shortstop to regain his batting stroke.

Hill collected his second straight three-hit game on Tuesday at SLU by going 3-for-4 and driving in three runs. Hill had doubles in the first two innings, making him the first Tiger to have two doubles in one game since Ryan Theriot last May 5 at Arkansas.

Not surprisingly, the California native is the Tigers' leading hitter in the last 10 games, batting .371 (13-for-35) with nine runs scored, four doubles and five RBI. Hill's hot streak has moved him up to third on the team with a .328 batting average, behind only Wally Pontiff (.389) and Sean Barker (.351).

Pontiff going for 20-game streak

Eight straight games with only one hit, but for Wally Pontiff, eight straight is eight straight, and his hitting streak going into this weekend stands at 19 games. A hit in tonight's game with Mississippi St. gives Pontiff LSU's first 20-game hitting streak since Cedrick Harris hit in 21 straight games

Pontiff made it dramatic on Tuesday night, as his sixth inning home run extended the streak and gave him his team-leading fourth home run of the year. That home run was LSU's first since Matt Heath hit one on Mar. 17 against Vanderbilt.

Pontiff enters tonight's game with a .354 career batting average and 207 hits, 27 shy of Trey McClure for 10th place on the LSU career list.

Pontiff leads the team in batting (.389), slugging (.579) and on-base percentage (.516), and has struck out 12 times in 125 plate appearances.

Lineup Watch

LSU shuffled its lineup for Tuesday's game at SLU, but only slightly from the starting group used all three games at Ole Miss. The only changes were the addition of Dustin Hahn to the batting order at DH (for Clay Harris, who started Tuesday on the mound instead of at first base), and Blake Gill moving from DH to first base, but remaining in the sixth spot in the order.

LSU has now used 25 lineups in the 27 games so far this year, and Sean Barker in right field has been the only constant among those different lineups.

Vargas does the job

One week after giving up four runs in just three innings in front of a hostile crowd at UL-Lafayette, maybe you wouldn't want to put a freshman in with two runners on and LSU clinging to a 6-5 edge.

But Jason Vargas rose to the occasion, holding the lead for LSU and going on to pitch five strong innings of relief to earn his first LSU victory, giving up just two hits and two runs in the eighth inning.

Vargas worked 1-2-3 innings in the sixth and ninth as he became the first Tiger reliever to earn a victory since Brad David got wins against UL-Monroe on Mar. 8 and 10.

It appears that Vargas' move to the mound might be permanent, as he has batted just once since Mar. 9, when he grounded into a game-ending double play on Mar. 17 against Vanderbilt.

Hill, Vaught throw in bullpen

Some of the most significant action for the LSU pitching staff did not take place on the field Tuesday night, but rather in the bullpen.

That's because right-handers Justin Hill and Chad Vaught both threw in the Tiger bullpen at SLU, although neither was needed. If both are healthy, this could give the Tigers some sorely needed depth on the mound.

Hill, a senior from West Monroe, suffered an arm injury late last year and made his last appearance last Apr. 22 against Vanderbilt. Hill went 1-1 with a 6.16 ERA in 19 appearances in 2001. Hill will not dress this weekend and is probably one or two weeks away from being ready to take the mound.

Vaught, a junior from Ferriday, pitched in one game this year, striking out eight in 6.0 innings on Feb. 12 against SLU in Baton Rouge. Vaught was scheduled to start LSU's first road game of the year at Centenary eight days later, but he came up with a sore shoulder and has not dressed since.

The Tigers' bullpen has been lacking depth as freshman southpaw Jason Determann is out for the year after undergoing Tommy John surgery to repair a torn ligament in his elbow.



Two-out blues

Teams that win get the key hit with two out. Teams that win can get that final out in key situations. Unfortunately, LSU has been unable to do either with much consistency this year.

At the plate, the Tigers are hitting just .245 with two out, but that number drops even further to .237 with runners on base and two out, and with runners in scoring position (RISP) and two out, the Tigers are batting all of .204. Last year, LSU batted .301 with two-out RBI opportunities.

The bug has affected even the Tigers' best hitters, as Matt Heath has an overall average of just .322, but he's just 1-for-12 with a two-out RBI opportunity and is 3-for-22 in all situations with two out.

Not surprisingly, LSU's leading hitter with two out is Wally Pontiff, who is hitting .425 (17-for-40) facing the final out of an inning, and is a respectable .304 with RISP and two out.

Opponents are having less trouble getting the key two-out hit, batting an even .300 with RISP and two out, and .303 in all situations with runners on and two out.

Leading off on the wrong foot

Two-out hitting may be one of LSU's woes, but another problem has been starting off on the right foot as well.

LSU leadoff batters are hitting just .243 and have collected just nine extra-base hits in 210 at-bats. Although batting average isn't as big a factor for leadoff hitters, the combined .338 on-base percentage for Tiger leadoff men is about 60 to 70 points lower than where it should be.

The most telling sign of trouble is the fact that J.C. Holt, who has hit first in five of the Tigers' last six games, is just 2-for-18 (.111) when leading off.

Frozen Tigers

LSU hitters have been called out on strikes 65 times through the first 27 games this year, as 37.7 percent of the Tigers' 172 strikeouts have been punch-outs.

J.C. Holt has been punched out more than any Tiger, as 10 of his 15 strikeouts have been of the called variety. Wally Pontiff, on the other hand, has been called out only three times in 125 plate appearances.

Barker a constant in up-and-down offense
Wally Pontiff has the hitting streak, Aaron Hill is hot at the moment and Matt Heath leads the team in hitting in conference games, but nobody has noticed the steady play year-round of Sean Barker.

It's fitting that the only player to start every game would be so steady. Barker started the season on fire, and has been a consistent offensive threat, as his .351 batting average leaves him second on the Tigers behind Pontiff's .389.

Barker has also been consistent in the clutch, batting a team-best .377 with runners on base and a solid .306 (38 points higher than the team average) with runners in scoring position. In 17 RBI opportunities with less than two out, he has picked up the RBI 14 times.

Barker's longest hitting streak may only be seven games, but he's been much more consistent, hitting safely in 20 of 27 games this year and getting two hits in 14 of those games. Barker leads the Tigers with 25 RBI and has seven games with two or more RBI.

Halfway home

Hard to believe, but tonight's game brings the Tigers to the 1/2 pole of the 56-game regular season.

The Tigers' best record ever after 28 regular-season games was the 25-3 mark posted in 1997, which ended with LSU's fourth national championship. Last year, the Tigers were 20-7-1 at the midway mark of the regular season after going 19-9 in the first half of 1999 and 2000, which was the Tigers' fifth national championship season.

No matter what happens tonight, LSU will have its worst 28-game record since Skip Bertman's first team in 1984, which was 17-11 after 28 contests in a 32-23 season.

Then again, starting out hot doesn't guarantee success. The 1995 Tigers started out 24-4, but stumbled to a 23-14 mark the rest of the way and ended 47-18 and out of the CWS.

The Tigers have played 56 games in the regular season every year since 1992.

LSU coach Smoke Laval
 Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.

- LSU looks to extend its winning streak over New Orleans to nine straight when the Privateers visit Tuesday. UNO last beat the Tigers 11-8 in 1997, when the Privateers swept the season series. The two teams will meet again on April 30 at Zephyr Field.
- Speaking of Zephyr Field, the Tigers make an appearance on Wednesday for an exhibition game against the defending Pacific Coast League champion New Orleans Zephyrs, who won last year's meeting 4-2. The Z's will be using the game to tune up for its season opener on Thursday night in Iowa, while LSU will get the chance to play in the Big Easy in a relaxed atmosphere.
- The Tigers return to SEC play over the weekend at Auburn. Last year, the Tigers of the Plains ruined the Skip Bertman tribute weekend by winning two of three to sneak into the SEC Tournament and end the season of blood rival Alabama. This series has been an unusual one to say the least, as the road team has won 10 of the last 15 sets dating back to 1987, including LSU's 2-1 series win at Auburn in 2000.
