## Marquise Hill

### 1982-2007

LSU Football suffered a tragic loss on Memorial Day weekend when former Tiger defensive end Marquise Hill died in a watercraft accident on Lake Ponchartrain in New Orleans.

Hill, a member of the NFL's New England Patriots for the past three seasons, was a three-year (2001-03) letterman at LSU, and he was instrumental in the Tigers' rise to prominence that culminated with the BCS national championship in 2003. An explosive player with a tremendous wingspan, Hill had five sacks in the final seven games of the '03 season, including one in the national championship game victory over Oklahoma.

Hill was the Patriots' second-round draft choice in 2004, and he had developed into one of the most promising players in the organization. During the off-seasons, Hill came back to his hometown of New Orleans, where he helped his family members rebuild their homes after the devastation caused by Hurricane Katrina. He also worked out frequently at LSU's football complex, where he was greatly respected and admired by the current Tiger players.

Marquise Hill was 24 years old.

## Mike V

### 1989-2007



The reign of Mike V will be remembered as one of the most glorious periods in the history of LSU athletics. He served as the official mascot of LSU Athletics from 1990 until his death on May 18, 2007. The royal Bengal tiger was born on Oct. 18, 1989, and first moved into his home across from Tiger Stadium on April 30, 1990.

Mike V attended his first LSU event on February 21, 1990, when he was introduced to a roaring crowd at the Pete Maravich Assembly Center for a men's basketball game. The Tigers beat Alabama that day, 75-69, in Shaquille O'Neal's freshman year.

Mike V was a noble mascot who was loved by Tiger fans young and old, and he represented all that is proud and dignified about LSU. During his tenure, Mike V reigned over a football

national championship, five baseball national championships and a remarkable 23 track and field championships. He saw LSU sports teams win 37 Southeastern Conference titles from 1990 to 2007.

## Paul Manasseh

### Press Box

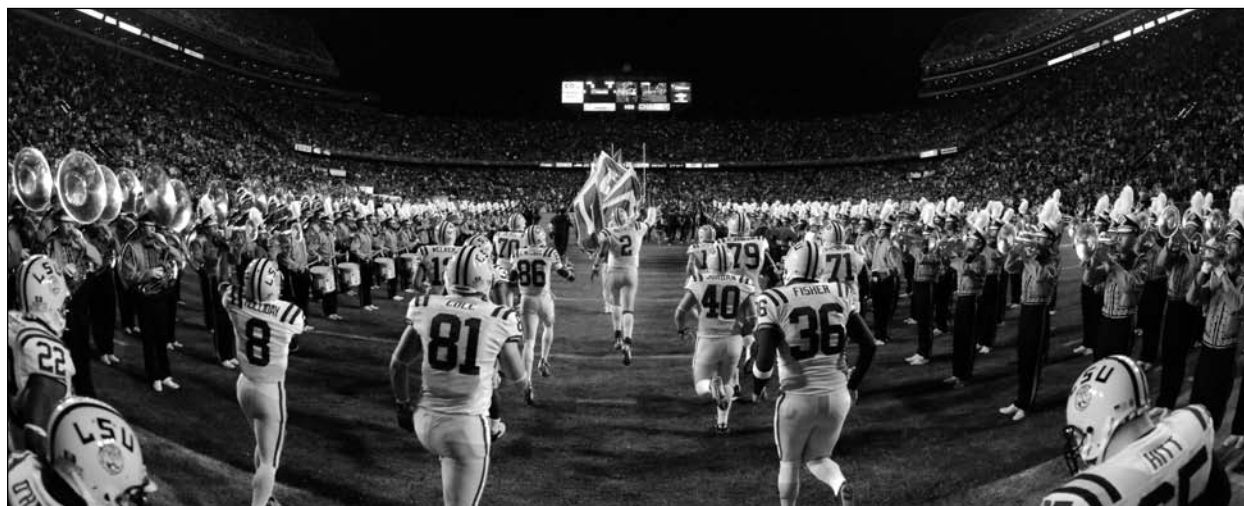
The new press box at Tiger Stadium was named in honor of former LSU sports information director Paul Manasseh in November of 2006.

Family, friends, associates and many of his former student workers attended the dedication prior to the LSU-Alabama game reflecting on the career and many memories of the long-time sports information director.

LSU's SID from 1971 to 1983, Mr. Manasseh was a pacesetter in the field of sports media relations, and was considered a master of promoting athletes for all-star honors. With his numerous media contacts among print and broadcast outlets he helped build LSU's stature as one of the country's elite college football programs. A 1978 inductee into the College Sports Information Directors of America Hall of Fame, Mr. Manasseh was also known for tutoring numerous students who went on to successful careers in sports journalism, media relations and athletic administration.

The first public relations director for the Denver Broncos of the AFL and a veteran of the U.S. Army, Mr. Manasseh had a dramatic impact on sports in the state of Louisiana, serving in various capacities with LSU, Louisiana Tech, the Sugar Bowl and the Independence Bowl, as well as several state newspapers, radio stations and professional sports teams. Manasseh died in 2000 at the age of 80.

With 15 returning starters, including college football's preseason defensive player of the year in defensive tackle **Glenn Dorsey**, and a roster that includes 24 seniors, LSU brings a great deal of momentum into the 2007 campaign. A year ago, the Tigers closed their season by reeling off seven-straight victories, capped with a 41-14 dismantling of 11th-ranked Notre Dame in the Sugar Bowl, to put an exclamation point on one of the best two-year stretches of football in school history. Gone from last year's roster are four players who were selected in the first round of the 2007 NFL Draft, including No. 1 overall pick in quarterback JaMarcus Russell, the sixth pick in safety LaRon Landry and one of the most prolific receivers in LSU history in Dwayne Bowe. Now, after waiting their turn, players like quarterback **Matt Flynn**, wide receiver **Early Doucet** and safety **Craig Steltz**, are ready to emerge as the leaders for the 2007 Tigers.

### Three Members of LSU Coaching Staff Have Wins As Division I Head Coaches

LSU is one of the few schools in the country that can lay claim to having three coaches on its staff who have picked up wins as a head coach at the Division I level. Head coach **Les Miles** has combined to win 50 games at LSU and Oklahoma State, offensive coordinator **Gary Crowton** has a combined 47 victories after stints at Louisiana Tech and BYU and defensive coordinator **Bo Pelini** won his only game as the interim head coach at Nebraska during the 2003 season.

### What's New for LSU in 2007

The Tigers have three new assistant coaches on the staff, including offensive coordinator **Gary Crowton**, who is considered one of the most innovative minds in football. Other newcomers to the staff include offensive line coach **Greg Studrawa** and receivers coach **D.J. McCarthy**.

### Arnold Returns To Give O-Line A Lift

Senior **Will Arnold** returns to the offensive line this year after missing most of last season with ankle and knee injuries. Arnold, who earned second-team All-SEC honors in 2006 even though he played in only five games, has been listed as a preseason All-America selection heading into 2007. Joining Arnold on the offensive line will be returning starters in **Ciron Black** (LT), **Herman Johnson** (LG) and **Brett Helms** (C). **Lyle Hitt** (RG) and **Carnell Stewart** (RT) are expected to team with Arnold to hold down the right side of the LSU offensive line in 2007.

### Doucet Ready To Emerge As LSU's "Go-To" Guy

Senior WR **Early Doucet** takes over as LSU's "go to" guy at wide receiver due to the departure of Dwayne Bowe and Craig Davis. A year ago, Doucet established himself as one of the best in the SEC, catching 59 balls for 772 yards and eight TDs. Doucet capped his

LSU brings a 13-game home-winning streak into the 2007 season after posting a perfect 8-0 mark in Tiger Stadium a year ago. The 13-game home-winning streak ranks as the fourth-longest in the nation and stands as the fourth longest in the history of Tiger Stadium. Southern Cal currently has the nation's longest home field winning streak at 33 straight.

The seven-game streak ties with Florida as the nation's fifth-longest, trailing Boise State (13), BYU (10), Wisconsin (9) and TCU (8).

# Dorsey In Line For Special Season

Last spring defensive tackle **Glenn Dorsey** opted to return to LSU for his senior season, turning down what would have surely been a first round pick in the NFL Draft. As a result, Dorsey is now in line to get his college degree, while also being put in a position to contend for some of college football's most prestigious awards. ESPN's Kirk Herbstreit has already called Dorsey, "the best player in college football," heading into 2007. Dorsey has been listed on every preseason All-America team and has been rated as the best defensive tackle in the nation by several publications. Last year, Dorsey earned first-team All-America honors after anchoring an LSU defense that ranked among the top five in the nation in yards allowed and scoring. LSU has won four straight and five of the last six against the Hogs, including last year's thrilling 31-26 win in Little Rock ... LSU is 8-11 all-time vs. Arkansas in Baton Rouge ... LSU has won six straight against the Hogs in Tiger Stadium ... Arkansas' only win in Tiger Stadium came in 1993 by a 42-24 count ... The teams play annually for the Boot, which is a 24-karat trophy molded into the shape of Louisiana and Arkansas ... LSU has held control of the boot since a 55-24 win in Baton Rouge in 2003 ... LSU coach Les Miles is 2-0 vs. Arkansas.
