Back to the East: LSU plays the SEC East for the first time in almost a month when the Tigers host Georgia this weekend.

- LSU enters on a roll, having won five of its last six contests, including a 9-5 victory Wednesday over Tulane in front of an NCAA-record crowd of 27,673.
- LSU will be playing its first home game since an 8-1 win over New Orleans on Apr. 2. The Tigers are 14-7 at Alex Box Stadium this year.
- The Tigers are coming off a big SEC road series win at Auburn, LSU's first of 2002. Prior to the Auburn series, LSU had lost its last four three-game conference series and split a two-game set Easter weekend with Mississippi St.
- LSU will be looking for its first SEC home series win since last April against Vanderbilt.

Scouting the Bulldogs: Georgia is the surprising leader of the SEC East with an 8-4 conference record, and is 18-11 overall after a midweek split with top-ranked Clemson.

- The Bulldogs played a pair of nail biters with the top-ranked Tigers of the ACC, winning 5-4 on Tuesday in Athens, then dropping a 6-5 decision Wednesday at Clemson.
- The Bulldogs are the defending SEC champions, going 22-8 in league play and 47-22 overall with the school's third berth in the College World Series.
- Georgia is looking to make the NCAA tournament in back-to-back years for the first time in school history
- The Bulldogs are led by rookie coach David Perno, who was promoted to replace Ron Polk in July.
- Perno was a player on Georgia's 1990 national championship team and served previously as an assistant to Steve Webber, Robert Sapp and Ron Polk at his alma mater.

About the Series: Georgia has won four of the last seven meetings, but LSU still holds a commanding 40-13-1 all-time lead.

- LSU and Georgia didn't meet for the first time until 1975, when the Tigers swept the Bulldogs in a best-of-three playoff for the SEC championship.
- The Bulldogs won two of three last year in Athens, with all three games lasting 11 innings in the first SEC series of the season.
- Georgia became the first SEC East team to win a series in Baton Rouge when it won two of three in 2000. Vanderbilt became the second East team to do so earlier this year.
- In the 1990s, LSU held an amazing 24-2-1 series edge, the most lopsided series of any two SEC rivals in the decade.
- At one point in the 1990s, LSU won 18 of 19 meetings in the series, with Georgia's only win in that stretch being a 9-1 victory in the 1992 Busch Challenge, a game that didn't count in the SEC standings.
- From 1986-1999, Georgia's lone series win was in 1987 at Athens.
- LSU has won 9 of 10 post-season meetings, with Georgia's lone win coming in the 1985 SEC Tournament.

Lane Mestepey hasn't been quite his dominant self, but it has been enough to win his last three starts. He goes for his fourth consecutive victory in the SEC tonight when he faces Georgia freshman left-hander Mickey Westphal (3-0, 6.29).

2002: Is 6-2 with a 3.51 ERA, giving up just 11 walks in 66.2 innings.

- Did not allow a walk over a span of 33.0 innings from Feb. 23 to Mar. 23.
- Giving up just 1.49 walks per nine innings pitched.
- Earned third straight victory with 6.2 innings at Auburn (Apr. 5), allowing just two earned runs and striking out four.

2001: Led the SEC in victories (11) and ERA (3.75), going 11-3 in 22 games (19 starts), pitching 139.1 innings.

- Named the national Freshman of the Year by Collegiate Baseball and was a third team All-American by the same publication.
- Named the 2001 SEC Freshman of the Year and was a first team All-SEC selection.
- Allowed two or fewer earned runs in 11 of 19 starts.
- Yielded only 2.39 walks per nine innings.

Barker wins LSWA honor

It wasn't announced in time for Wednesday's notes, but senior right fielder Sean Barker was named the Louisiana Sportswriters' Association Player of the Week for April 1-7 after batting .625 (10-for-16) in the Tigers' four games last week.

Barker, who is hitting .381 with a team high 31 RBI this year, hit his third home run and went 3-for-5 in the Tigers' 9-5 win over Tulane at the Superdome. Barker has at least three hits in four of LSU's last five contests.

Going for two straight

Last weekend, LSU was in dire need of a series win after not winning its previous five SEC series.

This weekend, that sense of dread is replaced by the positive thoughts of going for a second consecutive conference series win.

If LSU can win two games from Georgia this weekend, not only will the Tigers have back-to-back series wins, but they will find themselves at .500 in the league for the first time since being 1-1 during the Vanderbilt series. Of course, a series sweep puts the Tigers back over .500.

Unless LSU sweeps, it will have its poorest SEC record at the halfway point of a 30-game league schedule since the conference adopted the current format in 1996. The previous poor record at the halfway point was an 8-7 mark in 1999. Last year, LSU was 10-5 and on top of the overall SEC race at the halfway mark.

Tigers, Wave shatter attendance record

When Skip Bertman arrived at LSU in 1984, nobody could have dared to dream that someday LSU would be involved in a game that set the NCAA attendance record.

Today, that dream is a reality, as LSU and Tulane drew an NCAA record crowd of 27,673 to the Louisiana Superdome on Wednesday as the Fighting Tigers claimed a 9-5 victory. The bigger winner, though, was college baseball, especially in Louisiana.

Prior to Wednesday, the largest crowd to watch an NCAA baseball game was 24,859 that watched a 1999 College World Series doubleheader that saw Miami defeat Alabama and Rice down Oklahoma State. The previous record for a regular season game was the 21,043 that viewed a 1996 doubleheader between Texas and TCU in the last year of the old Southwest Conference.

The paid figure of 27,673 will go on the books, but even the actual turnstile count of 25,101 broke all of the old records.

Just how far has college baseball come in Louisiana? The crowd Wednesday surpassed the crowds for any of the three sessions of the first and second rounds of the 2001 NCAA men's basketball tournament at the Dome, and was just 5,000 short of the crowd at the last LSU-Tulane football game at the Superdome in 1994.

Return of the apes?

No, one big game does not signal the return of "Gorilla Ball" (or, more properly for Louisiana, "Geauxrilla Ball"). But it certainly was fun to see the display of power put on by LSU Wednesday night in the Superdome.

The Tigers hit a season-high four home runs in the 9-5 win over Tulane in front of an NCAA record crowd of 27,673. The four home runs are the most by LSU since clubbing four in last year's regional championship game against VCU.

The barrage started with Aaron Hill's two-run jack in the third, his fourth of the season (tying Wally Pontiff for the team lead), and fourth in the last six games for LSU. Hill hit five home runs in 46 games in 2001.

The Tigers tacked on three more in the fifth inning, as Sean Barker, Jason Columbus and Chris Phillips smacked solo home runs. The home run for Columbus was the first of his LSU career, as he came in batting just .217, while Barker and Phillips each collected their third round-tripper.

Prior to the big fifth inning, LSU had hit three home runs in a game just once this year, and that came in a 10-2 win over Long Beach St. in the second game of a Mar. 2 doubleheader. In fact, that inning marked the first time LSU had multiple home runs in one inning since last year's regional final.

Three home runs in an inning? You have to go back a long way to find the last time that happened. It came at the 1998 College World Series against Mississippi St., when Brad Cresse, Clint Earnhart and Wes Davis homered in succession en route to a 10-8 LSU victory.

The hit parade

The biggest reason why LSU has won seven of its last 10 games is certainly the Tigers' improvement at the plate.

LSU has collected at least 10 hits in its last eight games, while the Tigers failed to get double digit hits in 15 of their first 26 games of the year. The streak of 10-hit games is just one shy of the 2001 season high of nine, done between Feb. 18 through Mar. 4.

During this stretch, LSU has raised its season batting average by 12 points to .294, the highest it's been since LSU's average stood at .297 on Mar. 10.

In three of the last four games, the Tigers have collected at least 14 hits (all victories). I

Pettit shines in front of record crowd

Many pitchers might shrink at the thought of playing in front of a record crowd. Instead, LSU hurler Bo Pettit shined for the 27,673 in attendance at the Superdome on Wednesday.

Pettit worked 5.0 innings against Tulane, giving up just one hit and one walk and striking out five. Pettit retired the first 12 batters he faced, getting eight to ground out and striking out the other four. He ended up facing just one batter over the minimum in improving to 4-5 on the year, lowering his ERA by a third of a run from 4.07 to 3.73.

Pettit continues to thrive in non-conference games, as he hasn't allowed a run in his last 13.1 innings to non-SEC foes. He also threw 4.0 shutout innings in a win over New Orleans on Apr. 2.

Now comes the hard part—sustaining that superb effort in SEC games, as he gets the start on Sunday against Georgia. In his last three SEC starts—losses to Ole Miss, Mississippi St. and Auburn—Pettit has given up 18 runs on 17 hits and walked 18 in just 9.1 innings for a 9.64 ERA. Pettit has proven he can be effective in league play, though; he threw a complete game, four-hit shutout in a 6-0 triumph over Vanderbilt on Mar. 15.

Hill still hot

Aaron Hill watched his nine-game hitting streak end on Sunday at Auburn, so Hill did what any good hitter would do, and that's start a new streak.

Hill went 3-for-4 with a two-run home run and a two-run single in Wednesday's 9-5 win over Tulane, giving Hill his fifth three-hit game since returning from a separated shoulder he suffered early in the season.

Hill has now hit a home run in four of his last six games, tying him for the team lead with Wally Pontiff. The sophomore shortstop is now also just one homer shy of his season total from 2001 of five.

In the Tigers' last 10 games, Hill has been out of this world, batting .535 (23-for-43) with four home runs, 19 RBI, a .592 on-base percentage and an amazing 1.023 slugging percentage. Hill's season batting average is now tops on the Tigers at .383, two points ahead of Sean Barker (.381). Hill is now batting an even .400 (14-for-35) with runners in scoring position, and leads LSU with a .457 average in SEC games.



Leading off on the right foot

One of the keys to scoring runs is getting the leadoff man on base. LSU has had trouble with that part much of the season, but as of late, that's turned itself around.

In the last five games,, the Tigers have gotten the leadoff runner on in 23 of 44 innings (52.3 percent), and it's no surprise the Tigers have scored 38 runs in winning four of their last five outings.

LSU's on-base percentage for leadoff hitters is still just .379, but the batting average leading off an inning has risen to .289. The Tigers also have seven leadoff home runs on the year, including a blast by Sean Barker in the fifth inning on Wednesday against Tulane that was one of three home runs in the inning.

Looking good in the first

Another key to good offensive baseball is the ability to take an early lead, something the Tigers have taken to heart lately.

LSU has scored in the opening inning in eight of its last 10 games, including a three-run outburst in the Tigers' victory at Auburn on Sunday. The Tigers have won seven of their last 10 games and have scored in the opening inning in six of those seven victories, with the lone exception coming on Mar. 26 at Southeastern Louisiana.

The Tigers' best inning at the plate has been the first, as LSU has a .352 batting average in the opening frame, scoring 39 runs.

The problem for LSU has been hitting in later innings. The Tigers' batting average drops precipitously from .352 to .238 from the first to the second inning, while LSU is hitting just .246 combined in the fourth and fifth innings, scoring just a total of 29 runs in those two frames.

Midweek turnaround

After losing three straight midweek games in March, the Tigers have won their last three midweek contest, scoring 27 runs and pounding out 35 hits in defeating Southeastern Louisiana, New Orleans and Tulane.

During the earlier losing streak to Tulane and UL-Lafayette (twice), LSU could muster just six runs and 26 hits in three games. LSU is now hitting .275 in mid-week games and is fashioning a solid 3.30 ERA in those same games.

Smacking around southpaws

One rap against LSU all year has been the Tigers' inability to consistently hit left-handed pitching.

However, the Tigers showed they can have success against southpaws on Wednesday against Tulane. LSU collected 12 of its 14 hits off of left-handed pitching, including five off of starter Kris Kline and three more off of Beau Richardson and Joey Charron, the Wave's ace reliever. The Wave threw four lefties at LSU, and the Tigers scored seven of their nine runs off of southpaws.

In fact, LSU has been showing slow, but steady, improvement against lefties this year, as the Tigers are hitting a solid .323 (22-for-68) in the last six contests against left-handed pitching, including a 12-for-29 effort against the Green Wave.

Sean Barker leads LSU with a .458 average against lefties, followed by Eric Wiethorn at .369. Third on the team against lefties is a left-handed hitter, as Wally Pontiff has a .364 mark against southpaws. Chris Phillips (.358) and Aaron Hill (.333) have also thrived against the port-siders.

Taking a lead (and keeping it)

Early in the season, LSU needed several comebacks to snatch victory from the jaws of defeat. Lately, however, that hasn't been the case.

In the Tigers' last eight victories, LSU has trailed in a total of ONE inning, falling behind 3-2 to Southeastern Louisiana on Mar. 26 in the second before taking the lead for good in the third in a 9-7 triumph. Auburn briefly tied LSU at 3-3 after two on Sunday, but LSU again took the lead for good in the third.

LSU hasn't needed a late-inning comeback to win since Mar. 8, when it rallied from a 3-0 deficit with four runs in the eighth inning to defeat UL-Monroe.

Indoor Warriors

Wednesday's win over Tulane improved LSU to 29-14 all-time in domed stadiums, as the Tigers have now won 15 of its last indoor games dating back to 1995. LSU is now 26-14 all-time at the Superdome and 3-0 in the Minneapolis Metrodome, where it won the 1995 Hormel Foods Classic.

LSU coach Smoke Laval

Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.

On deck for next week

The calendar is getting shorter, and LSU looks to build momentum as it heads into the final month of the season. Building that momentum, though, will be tough given the opponents on the agenda.

First up is the renewal of the cross-town rivalry for Southern. Normally, this would be an easy win for LSU, but the Jaguars broke a 35-game losing streak to the southsiders with a 11-6 victory last year. LSU recovered for a 13-6 win a week later, but the Jaguars are far from a pushover. Coach Roger Cador's club is breezing toward another SWAC championship behind the hot hitting of U.S. national team member Rickie Weeks, who has been hovering close to .500 most of the year.

The weekend finds the Tigers making the 12-hour trek to South Carolina for a three-game series against the powerful Gamecocks. LSU has never lost a series to Carolina since it joined the league in 1992, but the Gamecocks may be the most talented team in the SEC. Last year, LSU won the first two games of the series in Columbia, but Carolina recovered for a 4-2 victory in the series finale. LSU indoctrinated the Gamecocks to the SEC by sweeping three games in Columbia in 1992, and in 1993, the teams played to a 9-9, 10-inning tie after the Gamecocks walked off the Alex Box Stadium field to catch their flight home. That game led to a change in SEC travel rules on Sundays.
