No. 3 LSU Faces No. 5 Georgia For SEC Crown



LSU will go after its second SEC title in three years on Saturday as the third-ranked Tigers face fifth-ranked Georgia in the SEC Championship game. Kickoff for the game is set for 7 p.m. CST from the Georgia Dome in Atlanta. The game will be televised to a national audience by CBS. LSU will be making its second appearance in the SEC Championship Game, both of which have come under **Nick Saban**. LSU's other appearance in the title game came in 2001 as the Tigers posted a 31-20 win over then-No. 2 ranked Tennessee. LSU enters the game with an 11-1 overall mark and the Tigers finished their conference slate with a 7-1 record. The 11 wins by LSU ties the school-record set by the 1958 team that won the national title. The seven conference wins are the most ever by an LSU team. Georgia enters the game with a 10-2 record. Saturday's game will be a rematch from a late-September meeting between the teams as LSU posted a 17-10 win over Georgia in Baton Rouge. In that game, LSU QB **Matt Mauck** connected with **Skyler Green** on a 34-yard TD pass with just over a minute left to lift the Tigers to the victory. LSU enters the title game first in the nation in scoring defense (10.6 points per game), second in the country in total defense (260.4 yards per game) and third in the nation in rushing defense (69.7 yards per game). The Tigers also rank first in the conference in scoring offense (35.0 points per game) and third in total offense (425.1 yards per game). Mauck leads the SEC pass efficiency with a 153.9 rating as he's completed 202 of 314 passes for 2,550 yards and a school-record 27 TDs. LSU WR **Michael Clayton** is first in the SEC in both catches (69) and yards (960), while WR **Devery Henderson** is first in the league in TD receptions (11).

Tigers Clinch Berth in SEC Championship Game With 55-24 Win Over Arkansas

Justin Vincent rushed for 112 yards and a pair of touchdowns and **Matt Mauck** tied a school-record with 4 TD passes as third-ranked LSU clinched a berth in the SEC Championship game with a 55-24 win over Arkansas. The win was LSU's 11th of the season, tying the school-record set in 1958. The Tigers also won seven SEC games for the first time in school history. After spotting Arkansas an early 7-0 lead, the Tigers battled back, getting a 38-yard field goal from **Chris Jackson** and then taking a 10-7 lead on a 25-yard fumble return for a TD by **Eric Alexander**. The Razorbacks tied the game at 10-10 before LSU regained the lead at 17-10 on a 10-yard pass from Mauck to Clayton, which game him a school-record 20 TD receptions. The Hogs tied the game two plays later at 17-17 on a 20-yard run by Cedric Cobbs. From there, it was all LSU as the Tigers closed the half with a 17-0 run to take a 34-17 lead on a 22-yard pass from Mauck to **Devery Henderson**. The Tigers stretched the margin to 41-17 early in the third quarter on a 37-yard pass from Mauck to **David Jones** and then increased it once again to 48-17 on a 23-yard run by Vincent. The Tigers got their final points on a 2-yard run by Vincent to stretch the lead to 55-17 late in the third quarter. For the game, LSU piled up 436 yards of offense, including 250 on the ground. Mauck finished 12 of 19 for 186 yards with four TD passes, all going to different receivers.

Nick Saban

HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right leader to lead it. Entering his fourth year as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban is that leader.

Since taking over in Baton Rouge in 2000, Saban has transformed the LSU football program into one that wins championships, while graduating players at the same time.

Equipped with a plan that gives his players the best chance to be successful on the field as well as in the classroom, Saban's impact on the program has been immediate and it's been powerful.

In four years as LSU's head coach, Saban's on-field success has been nothing short of remarkable, as he's guided the Tigers to 37 victories, a pair of bowl wins, including one in the Bowl Championship Series, and the 2001 Southeastern Conference title. The Tigers have also played in back-to-back New Year's Day bowls for the first time since the 1960s.

On top of LSU's success on the gridiron, the Tigers are being recognized for their efforts in the classroom. For the second straight year, LSU had player be named a National Scholar-Athlete by the National Football Foundation. Offensive tackle, a two-time First Team Academic Honor Roll, earned was awarded the \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship, while Bradie James, now a member of the Dallas Cowboys, won the award last year.

Off the field, Saban and his players are active in the community, promoting goodwill by participating in such things as community service projects and visiting hospitals and schools in the Baton Rouge area on a regular basis. Saban has also worn the hat of fundraiser during his stay in Baton Rouge as he spearheaded an effort that raised more than \$15 million for a state-of-the-art academic center for student-athletes. The new Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is part of Saban's plan to give his players the best opportunity to be successful when they finish their football careers. The center, which spans 54,000 square feet, is the best of its kind and features 100 computers, a 1,000-seat auditorium, a library and a communications center for training student-athletes.

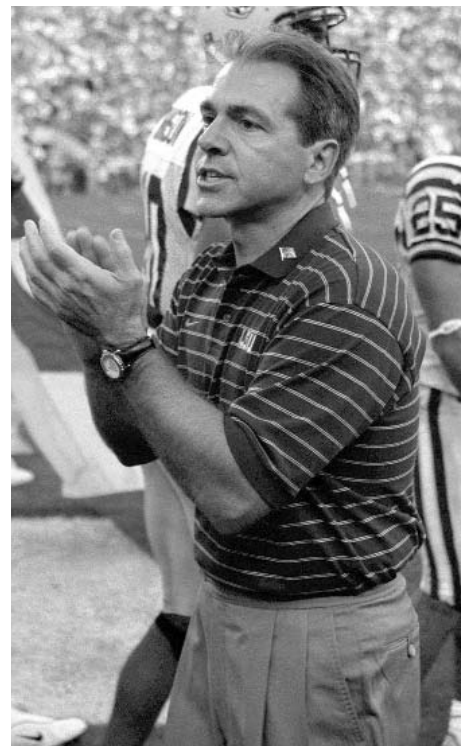
Saban became the 31st head coach of the LSU Tigers on November 30, 1999, after five years as head coach at Michigan State.

He didn't waste anytime making his impact felt as he guided a team coming off back-to-back losing seasons to an 8-4 mark and a win over 15th-ranked Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl in 2000 to rekindle the fire of a proud football tradition in Baton Rouge.

A year later in 2001, Saban guided the Tigers to their first outright SEC title since 1986 with a 31-20 win over second-ranked Tennessee in the SEC Championship game. LSU followed that with a 47-34 victory over Illinois in the Sugar Bowl to cap a 10-3 season for the Tigers.

Last year, Saban guided the Tigers to an 8-5 overall mark and a share of the SEC Western Division title. The Tigers also played in a New Year's Day bowl game for the second consecutive year, a first for LSU since the 1960's, with an appearance in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five seasons.

This Week

LSU will go after its ninth SEC title and the second in the last three years on Saturday as the third-ranked Tigers face fifth-ranked Georgia at 7 p.m. CST in the Georgia Dome in Atlanta in the SEC Championship Game. The game will be televised to a national primetime audience by CBS. The Tigers enter the contest with an 11-1 overall mark. LSU claimed a share of the Western Division title for the third straight year and fifth time overall with a 7-1 league mark. The 11 wins tie the school record for victories, matching the number of wins by LSU's national title team in 1958. The seven SEC wins are the most ever in league play for the Tigers. LSU will carry a 6-game winning streak into the contest. Georgia, winners of three straight, stands at 10-2 overall. Earlier this season, LSU posted a 17-10 win over the Bulldogs in Baton Rouge.

In The Polls

The Tigers remained No. 3 in the nation in both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll on Sunday. The Tigers have been ranked No. 3 in the nation for four straight weeks, the highest LSU has been ranked for four consecutive weeks since 1959 when the Tigers were ranked No. 1 for the seven weeks of the season before dropping to No. 3 in the AP poll for the final three ranking periods. LSU is currently ranked among the top 10 in the AP poll for the 11th straight week, while they are in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll top 10 for the 12th straight week. The Tigers are also No. 3 in the BCS standings for the second straight week.

LSU Goes After Ninth SEC Title

LSU will attempt to win its ninth SEC title on Saturday against Georgia. The Tigers last won an SEC title in 2001 as LSU beat No. 2 Tennessee, 31-20, in its first and only appearance in the SEC Championship Game. The Tigers, charter member of the SEC, have won conference titles in 1935, 1936, 1958, 1961, 1970, 1986, 1988 and 2001. The Tigers have also claimed a share of the SEC Western Division title five times - 1996, 1997, 2001, 2002, and 2003 - since the league went to divisions in 1992.

Matt Mauck Named SEC Offensive Player of the Week

QB **Matt Mauck** earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors on Sunday, two days after leading the Tigers to a 55-24 win over Arkansas. The honor is the first of Mauck's career. Against Arkansas, Mauck completed 12 of 19 passes for 186 yards and a school-record tying 4 TDs. Mauck also rushed for 31 yards on 6 carries. For the year, Mauck has thrown an LSU record 27 TD passes. He's also 16-2 as LSU's starting quarterback. The SEC Player of the Week honor is the fourth of the year for the Tigers, but the first on the offensive side of the football. Other SEC honors for LSU this season include CB **Corey Webster** - SEC Defensive Player of the Week vs. Georgia; DT **Chad Lavalais** - SEC Defensive Player of the Week vs. Auburn and Ole Miss.

Win One For JB

The LSU Athletic Department suffered a tremendous loss on Oct. 27 as longtime equipment manager **Jeff Boss** passed away after a 10-month battle with brain cancer. Boss, who was 54-years old, is survived by his wife, Karen, and a 13-year old daughter, B.J. Over 500 people attended the memorial service for Boss on Oct. 29, including former LSU football coaches Jerry Stovall, Bill Arnsperger and Mike Archer, along with current head coach **Nick Saban**. Boss had served as LSU's equipment manager since 1980. The LSU football team has dedicated the 2003 season to Boss. Several members of the team, along with coach Saban, presented coach Boss with a game ball from the Louisiana-Monroe game on Sept. 12 at his home. The ULM game was the first time in 24 years that coach Boss was not on the sidelines for an LSU contest. Then, on Sept. 29, LSU named its football locker room in Boss' honor with a formal ceremony that saw dozens of former Tiger football players, covering three decades, attend. The team has worn the letters "JB" on their helmets since the Georgia game. For the first time this year, the team wore letters "JB" on their jerseys against Louisiana Tech. The "JB" will remain on the helmets and the jerseys for the remainder of the season.

LSU-Georgia Rematch A Rarity For The Tigers

The Georgia game will mark only the fifth time in modern day LSU football (since 1935) that the Tigers will face a team twice in the same season. LSU last did it in 2001 when the Tigers faced Tennessee twice, first in the regular season and then in the SEC Championship game. The following is a look at LSU's same season rematches for the Tigers since 1935:

Lavalais Is A Finalists For Both Outland and Nagurski Awards

DT **Chad Lavalais** is a finalists for two national awards as the senior from Marksville, La., is up for both the Outland Trophy and the Bronko Nagurski Award. Lavalais is one of three finalists for the Outland Trophy, which is presented annually to the nation's top interior lineman, while he's one of five finalists for the Nagurski Award, which goes to college football's top defensive player. Lavalais is the leader of an LSU defense that ranks first in the nation in scoring (10.4 points per game) and rushing yards (57.7 yards per game). The Tigers also rank third nationally in total defense, allowing only 256.7 yards per game. LSU is the only team in the nation that has yet to allow an opponent to score 20 points in a single-game this season. In 11 games this year, Lavalais has recorded 48 tackles with 14 of those going for losses. He also has six sacks to go with 21 quarterback hurries. He's also blocked one field goal and intercepted a pass for the third-ranked Tigers.

Lavalais Named First Team All-America By Football Writers

DT **Chad Lavalais** picked up his first national honor in 2003 as the Football Writer's Association of America named him First Team All-America. Lavalais is one of four SEC players on the 25-man squad. Top-ranked Oklahoma dominated the team with an unprecedented six players on the squad. Other SEC players on the team include Arkansas offensive tackle Shawn Andrews, Florida defensive back Keiwan Ratliff and Tennessee punter Duston Colquitt. Lavalais' honor marks the third straight year in which LSU has had a player named First Team All-America, joining Bradie James in 2002 and Josh Reed in 2001. Lavalais' honor becomes the 54th time that LSU has had a football player be named First Team All-America.

LSU Ties School Record With 11th Win; Sets Mark With 7th SEC Victory

With its 55-24 win over Arkansas, LSU tied the school mark for victories in a season with 11. The 11 wins by the 2003 teams ties the record set by LSU's national champion team in 1958. The 1958 team posted a perfect 11-0 mark. In addition, LSU's seven SEC wins are the most in league play by a Tiger team. LSU finished its 2003 conference slate with a 7-1 mark. LSU has won 10 games or more in a season seven times in its history.

Saban Joins Pepsodent Paul On Short List At LSU

By winning his 10th game of the season vs. Ole Miss, LSU coach **Nick Saban** joined former Tiger coach Paul Dietzel as the only two coaches in school history to produce more than one 10-win season. Saban has now done it twice, going 10-3 in 2001 and standing at 11-1 this season. Dietzel guided the Tigers to an 11-0 mark in 1958 and then followed that with a 10-1 record in 1961, his last season at LSU. Other 10-win coaches at LSU include Edgard Wingard (10-0 in 1908); Mike Archer (10-1-1 in 1987); and Gerry DiNardo (10-2 in 1996).

LSU's Won Eight Straight In Domed Stadiums

LSU will carry an 8-game winning streak in domed stadiums, which includes three consecutive wins in the Georgia Dome, into Saturday's game vs. Georgia. LSU is 3-0 in domed stadiums under **Nick Saban** as the Tigers beat Georgia Tech, 27-14, in the Georgia Dome in the 2000 Peach Bowl and followed that with a 31-20 win over Tennessee in the Georgia Dome in the SEC Championship Game and a 47-34 win over Illinois in the Louisiana Superdome in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. LSU is 3-0 all-time in the Georgia Dome. LSU's other wins during the 8-game streak have come against Tulane in the Louisiana Superdome - four times and against Clemson in the 1996 Peach Bowl in Atlanta. LSU's last loss in a domed stadium came in 1987 vs. Nebraska in the Sugar Bowl in the Louisiana Superdome.

Mauck Returns To Scene Of His First Shining Moment

QB **Matt Mauck** returns to the Georgia Dome for the first time since 2001 when he came off the bench to lead the Tigers to a 31-20 win over No. 2-ranked Tennessee in the SEC Championship Game. Mauck, who was named the MVP of the 2003 SEC title game, replaced an injured Rohan Davey just before halftime and rallied the Tigers to the victory. Mauck rushed for 43 yards and a pair of TDs and completed 5 of 15 passes for 67 yards in the victory.

Clayton Becomes School's All-Time TD Reception Leader; Ranks Second In Receptions

With his 10-yard TD reception vs. Arkansas, WR **Michael Clayton** became LSU's all-time leader in receiving touchdowns with 20. Clayton had been tied with Wendell Davis (1984-87) with 19 career TDs heading into the Arkansas game. Clayton, who leads the SEC with 69 catches for 960 yards, has 9 TDs this year. Clayton opened his career with 6 TDs in 2001 and then followed that with 5 last year. For his career, Clayton ranks second in LSU history in receptions with 173 and he's fourth in receiving yards with 2,463.

LSU Breaks Single-Season School Record For Points, TDs and First Downs

This year's LSU team has already set three school records - points, TDs and first downs in a single-season - with all three of those marks falling against Arkansas last week. For the year, LSU has scored 420 points, breaking the previous mark of 375 held by the 1977 team. The Tigers have also scored 56 TDs this season, bettering the previous high of 51 also set in 1977. LSU has also recorded 268 first downs this year, six more

than the 262 by the 2001 team. The Tigers are also currently on pace to set the single-season scoring average record. LSU is currently averaging 35.0 points per game, .1 better than the 34.9 average by the 1969 squad.

Webster Gets 2 More Picks, Runs Career Total To 13

CB **Corey Webster** added two more interceptions vs. Arkansas, running his career total to 13, which ranks as the second-highest total in school history. Webster, a converted wide receiver, ranks second in the SEC and 12th in the nation with 6 interceptions this year. Last year in his first season as a defensive back, Webster led the SEC with 7 interceptions. Webster's 13 career interceptions trails only Chris Williams (1977-80), who had 20 picks during his LSU career.

Tigers Are 6-1 In Games When Ranked No. 3; Lone Loss To Ole Miss in '60

For the fourth straight week, LSU will play a game as the nation's No. 3 ranked team. In its history, LSU is 6-1 in games as the third-ranked team in the nation. The only loss during that 6-game span came to Ole Miss in the 1960 Sugar Bowl by a 21-0 count. The Tigers were 2-1 as the No. 3 ranked team in 1959 and they were 1-0 as the nation's third-ranked squad in 1958.

The LSU Injury Report

The Tigers came out of the Arkansas game in good shape as no significant injuries were reported. The only injury of note is that of FS **LaRon Landry** (head). Landry sat out the second half of the Arkansas game after "getting his bell rung" on kickoff coverage for the Tigers. Landry is expected to return to action this week against Georgia in the SEC Championship Game.

Tigers Back On CBS

LSU will make its fifth appearance on CBS this year when they face Georgia on Saturday in the SEC title game. LSU is 3-1 on CBS this year and the Tigers are 17-14-1 all-time on the network, which includes a 7-4 record under **Nick Saban**. The Georgia game will also mark LSU's third straight appearance on CBS. LSU beat Ole Miss 17-14 on Nov. 22 and then followed that with a 55-24 win over Arkansas on Nov. 28. The appearance on CBS will also mark LSU's 10th national television showing this season.

Taking Notes On The Tigers Under Saban

Here is a look at some notable LSU trends during its first 50 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 32-2 when leading at halftime and 30-2 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 34-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 33-0 when scoring 25 or more points ... On the other hand, LSU is 3-10 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 9-2 in games decided by 7 points or less and 4-1 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 23-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing and the Tigers are 17-0 when having a 100-yard rusher.

Mauck Is 16-2 As LSU's Starting QB; Ties Herb Tyler For Best Start in LSU History By A QB

With the win over Arkansas, **Matt Mauck** ran his record to 16-2 as LSU's starting quarterback. The 16-2 start by Mauck as the Tiger signal-caller ties Herb Tyler (1995-98) for the best start in school history. Tyler won 16 of his first 18 starts for the Tigers and finished his career with a 27-11 mark. Mauck had a 10-game winning streak as a starter snapped vs. Florida, which was the first loss for the junior since his first career start against Virginia Tech to open the 2002 season. Mauck's 10-1 start was the best by an LSU QB since Tyler won 10 of his first 11, including his first eight, as a starter from 1995-96. In addition, Mauck has played in 21 games in his LSU career and the Tigers are 18-3 in those contests.

Vincent Continues Climb Up Freshman Rushing List At LSU

With 683 yards rushing through 12 games, RB **Justin Vincent** ranks 5th in school history in freshman rushing yards. Dalton Hilliard holds the school's freshman rushing record with 902 yards in 1982, while Kevin Faulk stands in second place with 852 yards in 1995. Vincent needs only 28 yards to move past Garry James (710 yards in 1982) into third place and he's just 18 yards shy of moving past Harvey Williams (700 yards in 1986) for fourth place. LSU sophomore **Joseph Addai** finished his rookie campaign with 438 yards, which ranked as the eighth-most in school history.

Odds and Ends About The Tiger Defense

Here's a few quick notes about the LSU defense, a unit that is ranked first in the nation in scoring and second against the run ... The defensive leader is DT **Chad Lavalais**, who spent a year serving as a guard in a prison before enrolling in school ... The team's best cover corner **Corey Webster** is a converted wide receiver ... SS **Jack Hunt** spent his first two years with the Tigers on the offensive side of the ball as a wide receiver ... DE **Marcus Spears** could have gone anywhere in the country to play basketball ... Spears also played his first season with the Tigers as a tight end before moving to defense on a full-time basis as a sophomore ... LB **Eric Alexander** played as a defensive back and a special teams player for the first three years of his college career ... CB **Travis Daniels** burnt his redshirt season after injuries forced him into the fourth quarter of the SEC

Championship game in 2001 ... Daniels made the most of his chance, breaking up a pass in the endzone ... FS **LaRon Landry** is a true freshman and he leads the Tigers with 71 tackles.

LSU "D" Rated No. 1 In Nation in Scoring Defense And No. 2 in Total Defense

The Tiger defense continues to be not only one of the best in the SEC, but one of the top units in the nation. LSU enters the Georgia game with the nation's No. 1 rated scoring defense (10.7 points per game). The Tigers are first in the SEC and second in the nation in total defense (260.4 yards per game) and they are first in the SEC and third in the nation in rushing defense (69.7 yards per game). In 12 games this season, the Tigers have allowed only 2 teams to reach the 100-yard mark in rushing yards - 201 by Arkansas and 121 by Louisiana Tech. LSU's defense has yielded only 14 touchdowns all season - 3 rushing, 11 passing. Through 12 games, of the 127 points scored against LSU, only 43 have come in the first half. LSU has allowed only one team to score more than 20 points in a game this year as Arkansas scored 24 points against the Tigers in the regular season finale. LSU's streak of 11 straight games of holding its opponent to less than 20 points tied the mark set by LSU teams in 1958, '60, '61 and '62.

Mauck Continues To Add To Single-Season TD Pass Mark; Record At 27 And Counting

With every TD pass that **Matt Mauck** throws for the rest of the year, he increases his single-season record for touchdown passes at LSU. Mauck's record currently sits at 27, which is five more than the previous mark of 22, which was originally set by Tommy Hodson in 1989. Mauck's 27 TD passes this year leads the SEC and ranks 10th in SEC history for a single-season. Mauck, who has thrown 15 TD passes over LSU's last 6 games, has thrown at least one TD pass in 11 of LSU's 12 games this year. For his career, Mauck has tossed 36 touchdown passes, which ranks as the third-best total in school history. In 18 games as LSU's starting quarterback, Mauck has tossed at least 3 TD passes in a game 7 times, which includes a school-record tying 4 TD passes three times. Hodson holds the LSU career mark with 69 TD passes.

Mauck Has Tiger Offense Running On All Cylinders Over Last 6 Games

Since the loss to Florida, LSU QB **Matt Mauck** has had the Tiger offense clicking as the junior has completed 111 of 162 passes (68.5 percent) for 1,360 yards and 17 touchdowns. The Tigers are also averaging 460.5 yards of offense and 35.3 points in wins over South Carolina, Auburn, Louisiana Tech, Alabama, Ole Miss, and Arkansas. The Tigers are also rushing for 220.3 yards over the 6-game stretch with Justin Vincent (551 yards, 5 TDs) and Alley Broussard (328 yards, 3 TDs) leading the way. Also during LSU's current 6-game winning streak, the Tigers have converted on 40 of 86 3rd-down opportunities.

Lavalais Leads Tigers With 6 Sacks and 15 TFLs; Tigers Lead SEC With 34 Sacks

DT **Chad Lavalais**, a two-time SEC Defensive Player of the Week this season, continues to lead LSU with 6 sacks and 15 tackles for losses. Lavalais' tackles behind the line have accounted for 81 yards in losses this season. Lavalais 6 sacks leads a Tiger defense that has recorded 34 sacks this season. Other Tigers with more than 2 sacks in 2003 include **Marcus Spears**, **Kyle Williams** and **Marquise Hill** with 4 each and **LaRon Landry**, **Eric Alexander**, and **Melvin Oliver** with 3 apiece.

Vincent Has Third 100-Yard Rushing Game

RB **Justin Vincent** recorded his third 100-yard rushing game vs. Arkansas as the rookie totaled 112 yards and 2 TDs in the win 55-24 win over the Razorbacks. For the season, Vincent has rushed for 683 yards and 7 TDs, both of which are tops among freshmen in the SEC.

LSU Starting Defense Finally Yields A Rushing TD

It took until the 12th game of the year, but LSU's starting defense finally allowed a rushing TD as Arkansas' Cedric Cobbs broke the streak with a second quarter rushing touchdown of 10 yards last week. Through 12 games, LSU has allowed only 3 rushing TDs. Prior to the Arkansas game, the only 2 rushing TDs allowed by the Tigers had come in the fourth quarter of wins over Louisiana-Monroe and Arizona, games in which the starting lineup had long left the field.

Tiger Defense Continues To Be Stingy

Through 48 quarters this season, LSU's defense has held the opponent out of the endzone in 31 of those. Florida became the first team since Kentucky last year to score an offensive TD in the first quarter against the Tigers. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had allowed only 3 first half points all season, that being a field goal vs. Georgia in Week 4. In all, the Tigers held 11 of its 12 opponents this year to less than 20 points, something that hasn't been done at LSU since 1962 when the Tigers held all 11 of their opponents to less than 20 points. Arkansas is the only team in 2003 to break the 20-point barrier against the Tigers and they did it with 24 points in a 55-24 loss to LSU.

LSU's Rodney Reed Named National Scholar-Athlete

Rodney Reed, who is one of the most decorated student-athletes in LSU football history, added another honor to an already impressive resume as he was selected a National Scholar-Athlete by the National Football Foundation. The award is one of the top academic honors available to a college football player and it carries with it an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship. Reed is one of only 15 football players covering all NCAA divisions as well as NAIA to receive the award. He also becomes the second National Scholar-Athlete in as many years for LSU, joining Bradie James, who was honored last year. Past LSU recipients of the award include: offensive lineman Robert Dugas (1977), linebacker Nacho Albergamo (1987), quarterback Sol Graves (1990) and punter Chad Kessler (1997). "This is a tremendous honor and something that I am extremely proud of," Reed said. "It is quite an accomplishment that two student-athletes from the same school have won the award two years in a row. It's good to get recognized and it speaks well for the program. I think this also speaks highly for the academic center and the way Coach Saban stresses academics and not just football."

Reed First Team Academic All-America, Mauck On Second Team

LSU OT **Rodney Reed** became the only two-time First Team Academic All-America selection in school history as he was named to the squad this week. Reed, who earned Second Team Academic All-America honors in 2001, has now been a First Team Academic All-America pick in both 2002 and 2003. In addition, QB **Matt Mauck** earned Second Team All-America honors, marking the first time since 1982 that LSU had a player on both the first and second teams. Mauck, a pre-dentistry major, has a 3.72 grade point average. Reed graduated in May with a 3.9 grade point average in accounting. He is currently pursuing a Master's degree in accounting.

Clayton Named One Of 10 Semifinalists For Biletnikoff Award

WR **Michael Clayton** is one of 10 players from across the nation named as a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award. Clayton, a junior from Baton Rouge, is the only player from the Southeastern Conference on the list. Clayton currently leads the SEC with 69 receptions for 960 yards and 9 TDs. Clayton, who holds the LSU career mark for TD receptions with 20, is the only player in LSU history to have at least 700 yards receiving in three consecutive seasons. Clayton has also caught at least one pass in all 38 games of his collegiate career. Former LSU standout Josh Reed won the Biletnikoff Award in 2001.

Webster Named Semifinalists For Thorpe Award

CB **Corey Webster** has been named one of 12 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award, which goes annually to college football's best defensive back. Webster, a junior from Vacherie, La., has started all 12 games at cornerback for the Tigers and he's recorded 43 tackles, 6 interceptions and 22 passes defensed. He's also forced a fumble and had three quarterback hurries. Webster, a converted wide receiver, ranks second at LSU in career pass interceptions with 13.

Jones Named Named Semifinalists For Ray Guy Award

P **Donnie Jones** is one of 10 players from across the country named to the list of semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award, the Greater Augusta Sports Council announced. Jones, a Second Team All-Southeastern Conference pick in 2002, is currently averaging 42.9 yards on 52 punts. LSU's net punting average of 40.0 leads the SEC and ranks 10th in the nation. Of his 52 punts, Jones has had 17 downed inside the 20-yard line. Jones, a Baton Rouge native, currently holds the LSU career record for punts with 220 and punting yards with 9,270 and he ranks second in school history with a 42.1 punting average.

Tiger Defense Adds Another Score; Runs Total To 5 TDs This Year

Eric Alexander's 25-yard fumble return for a TD against Arkansas marked the fifth time this season that the Tiger defense has scored a touchdown in a game. This year, LSU has returned three interceptions for touchdowns - **Jack Hunt** vs. UL-Monroe and Louisiana Tech and **Travis Daniels** vs. Mississippi State and they have returned two fumbles for a score - **Jason LeDoux** vs. South Carolina and Alexander vs. Arkansas.

Tiger Defense Still Tough To Score On

In 12 games this year, LSU has yielded only 127 points to its opponents. The 127 points is the fewest by an LSU team since the 1970 squad held its 12 opponents to 114 points for the season.

Clayton, Henderson, and Green... LSU's Triple-Threat Receiving Corps

One thing is for certain and that is if defenses key too much on **Michael Clayton**, then **Devery Henderson** will make them pay. Focus on Henderson, then Clayton takes over. Concentrate on Henderson and Clayton and then **Skylar Green** will take over. At least that's how it's been over the first 12 games of the year. Clayton, Henderson and Green have combined for 159 catches for 2,205 yards and 25 TDs for the Tigers. Clayton has gone over 100-yards four times this year, while Henderson has done it three times and Green once. Clayton ranks first in the SEC in both receptions per game (5.75) and yards per game (80.0). Henderson is sixth in receptions with 3.9 a contest and Green eighth with 3.6 a game. Henderson's 65.8 yards per game ranks fifth in the league. Clayton leads the team with 69 receptions for 960 yards and 9 TDs, with Henderson second with 47 receptions for 790 yards and a SEC-best 11 scores and Green next with 43 catches for 485 yards and

5 TDs.

Vincent and Broussard Join Hilliard and James From '82 Tigers On Elite List

True freshmen **Justin Vincent** and **Alley Broussard** have each gone over 100-yards rushing in a game this year with Vincent doing it three times and Broussard twice. Vincent and Broussard are the first true freshman running backs at LSU to rush for 100 yards in a single-game in the same season since Dalton Hilliard and Garry James did it in 1982. Hilliard rushed for 100 yards five times as a true freshman in 1982, while James did it three times. In LSU's last 6 games, all starts by Vincent, he's rushed for 551 yards and 5 TDs on 90 carries. Vincent leads all Tigers in rushing with 683 yards and 7 TDs on 120 carries. Broussard has accounted for 336 yards and 4 TDs on 70 attempts, while LSU's third true freshman running back Barrington Edwards has 169 yards rushing on 41 attempts.

LSU's Held 10 of 12 Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards Rushing

Arkansas and Louisiana Tech are the only two teams this year to crack the 100-yard mark vs. LSU this season. Arkansas rushed for 201 yards against the Tigers, while the Bulldogs rushed for 121 yards against LSU on Nov. 1. Prior to that, LSU had held its first eight opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing, which included limiting Auburn to 50 yards rushing and holding South Carolina to zero rushing yards. Tech became the first team since Texas in last year's Cotton Bowl to rush for 100 yards in a game against LSU. In addition, Tech running back Ryan Moats had 124 yards rushing to become the first player since Arkansas' Fred Talley (118 yards) to rush for 100 yards in a game against LSU as he did it in Week 12 last year. Florida rushed for 81 yards against LSU on Oct. 11 to become the first team to beat LSU under **Nick Saban** despite gaining less than 100 yards rushing. The Tigers are 22-1 under Saban when holding their opponent to less than 100 yards rushing. Arkansas' Cedric Cobbs had 169 yards rushing against the Tigers, the most against LSU this season.

Tiger Defense Continues To Be Spectacular In All Phases

Whether it's against the pass or the run, the Tiger defense has been one of the best all-around units in the SEC. LSU is ranked either Nos. 1 or 2 in the SEC in eight of 11 categories, including leading the conference in seven categories. LSU leads the league and the nation in scoring defense (10.7 points per game). The Tigers also lead the SEC and rank second in the nation in total defense (260.4 yards per game) and the Tigers are first in the league and third in the nation in rushing defense (69.7 yards per game). LSU also ranks first in the SEC in pass efficiency defense (95.1 rating), sacks (34), opponent 1st downs (165), and opponents' 3rd-down conversion percentage (24.0).

Open Wide

QB **Matt Mauck** spent Monday, Oct. 6 taking the Dental Admissions Test. Mauck, who also considered pursuing a career in medicine, has now opted to becoming a dentist. Mauck, who carries a 3.8 grade point average, will graduate in December with a degree in kinesiology.

LSU's Been Good At Getting The Defense Off The Field On 3rd Down

One of the obvious keys to LSU's success has been their ability to get the defense off the field on third-down situations. Through 12 games, the Tigers lead the SEC with a 24.0 third-down conversion percentage by their defense. In 175 third-down attempts this season, LSU has allowed its opponent a first down on 42 of those tries. Florida is the only team to have a better third-down percentage than LSU in a game as the Gators converted 7 of 18 attempts, compared to just 3 of 12 for the Tigers. The Tigers are even better on third-down once the opponent crosses midfield as LSU has allowed only 10 of 52 third-down attempts this season for 19.2 percent.

Skyler Makes Most of Punt Returns; Leads Nation For 6th Week

For the sixth straight week, **Skyler Green** stands atop the nation in punt returns, averaging 21.2 yards on 19 returns. Green had 2 punt returns for 25 yards vs. Arkansas, running his season total to 403 yards on 19 returns. The 403 yards ranks as the fifth-highest single-season total in LSU history. To date, Green has returned two punts for TDs, including an 80-yarder against Florida. On the first punt return of his career against Arizona, Green raced 62 yards for a touchdown. Green is the first player since Todd Kinchen in 1991 to have two punt returns for TDs in the same season and he's one shy of tying the school mark of 3 set by Pinky Rohm in 1937.

Mauck Comes Out Firing vs. Louisiana Tech

Matt Mauck tied a school-record by completing his first 14 passes in LSU's 49-10 win over Louisiana Tech. The 14 straight completions tied the mark set by Chad Loup vs. Arkansas in 1993. In addition, Mauck finished the game 18 of 20 for 90.0 percent, which set the school-record for completion percentage in a single-game with a minimum of 20 passes. Mauck also set a career-best for passing yards with 311 and he tied a career-best with 4 TDs, all coming in the first half.

Clayton Joins The 2,000-Yard Club; Ranked In LSU Top 10 In 4 Categories

WR **Michael Clayton** is only the fifth player in school history to have at least 2,000-yards receiving in a career. He currently ranks second in school history with 173 receptions for 2,463 yards, the fourth-highest total in LSU history. Clayton is also seventh in school history in 100-yard games with seven. Clayton holds the school record with 20 receiving TDs for his career. With 69 catches for 960 yards this year, Clayton is the only player in LSU history with at least 700 yards receiving in three consecutive seasons. Clayton had 754 yards on 47 catches as a freshman and he followed that with 749 yards on 57 catches last year.

Henderson's Tied With Davis For Single-Season TD Catches

With a TD reception vs. Arkansas, WR **Devery Henderson** is now tied with Wendell Davis (1986) for receiving touchdowns in a season with 11. For his career, Henderson has 19 TDs, which ranks as the second-highest total in school history along with Davis (1984-87). Teammate **Michael Clayton** holds the mark with 20 career TDs. Henderson's 11 TD receptions this year leads the SEC.

Donnie Jones Adds His Name To Another LSU Punting Record

Donnie Jones now holds two of LSU's three career punting records as the Baton Rouge native holds the school mark in punting yards (9,270) and total punts (220). In four years with the Tigers, Jones has a total of 9,270 punting yards, which broke the mark of 7,976 held by Chad Kessler (1994-967). In LSU's game against Mississippi State, Jones broke Kessler's career punts mark. For his career, Jones has punted 220 times for an average of 42.1 yards per kick, a figure that ranks second to Kessler's 42.9 career average.

Throwing To The Tight Ends

LSU's tight ends aren't just for blocking as the rotation of **Eric Edwards**, **David Jones**, **Keith Zinger** and **Demetri Robinson** have caught their share of passes this season. The foursome have accounted for 29 receptions for 377 yards and 3 TDs. Edwards leads all LSU tight ends with 15 catches for 153 yards and 2 TDs. Jones had a big game vs. Arkansas, catching two passes for 57 yards, including a 37-yard TD pass, the first of his career. Against South Carolina, LSU tight ends caught nine passes, that's the most in a single-game for that position in LSU history. Edwards led the way with 5 receptions for 37 yards and 1 TD. The 5 receptions by Edwards was the most by an LSU tight end since Robert Royal caught 5 passes for 72 yards against Utah State in 2001.

Mauck Starts Another TD Streak

After having his streak of consecutive games with a TD pass snapped at nine against Florida, QB **Matt Mauck** got started on another streak, throwing for 2 TDs vs. South Carolina, 3 vs. Auburn, 4 vs. Louisiana Tech, 2 vs. Auburn, 2 vs. Ole Miss and 4 vs. Arkansas. In 18 career starts, Mauck has thrown at least one TD pass in 15 games. The nine straight games with at least one TD pass was the longest streak by a Tiger since Herb Tyler did it in 12 straight games covering the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

TD-Less First Half Streak Comes To An End Against Florida

LSU's streak of keeping its opponent out of the endzone in the first half came to an end against Florida as the Gators became the first team this year to score a first half touchdown against the Tigers. Florida's first quarter TD marked the first time LSU had given up an offensive TD since last year's Cotton Bowl when Texas scored a pair of second quarter touchdowns against the Tigers. Through 12 games, LSU has allowed only 43 first half points for an average of 3.6 points per game. Dating back to last year, LSU has had its opponents scoreless in the first half in nine of its last 14 games.

LSU Buckles Down In The Redzone

The Tiger defense is holding its opponents to a staggering 52.2 percent scoring success rate when they get inside the LSU redzone. Against Florida, the Gators had one redzone opportunity stopped at the 1-yard line when **Brandon Washington** forced a fumble that was recovered by **Adrian Mayes**. The Tigers also held the Gators to a field goal on another redzone chance in the second quarter. LSU also held Georgia to just three points despite three trips inside the redzone against the Tigers in a 17-10 win over the Bulldogs on Sept. 20. So far this season, in 23 redzone chances for its opponent, LSU has allowed only 12 scores - 8 touchdowns and 4 field goals.

Tigers Lead SEC In Scoring

After scoring 55 points vs. Arkansas, LSU regained the SEC scoring lead as the Tigers are now averaging 35.0 points per game. In 12 games, LSU has scored a school record 420 points. LSU's 35.0 scoring average is also on pace to break the school record of 34.9, which was set by the 1969 team.

How About Those Special Teams

A quick check of the special teams categories in the SEC shows that LSU leads the league and rank fifth in the nation in punt returns (15.2). The Tigers are first in the SEC and 10th in the nation in net punting (40.0) and they are second in the league in kickoff coverage (17.2) and fourth in kickoff returns (23.0).

Go Figure

Between 1997 and Nov. 16, 2002, LSU failed to reach 20 points in an SEC contest 15 times. The Tigers lost all 15 of those games. Dating back to last year's Ole Miss game on Nov. 23, LSU has now won three of its last five SEC games when failing to reach the 20-point mark, which includes a 17-10 win over Georgia earlier this season. Prior to last year's win over Ole Miss, LSU had not won an SEC game when scoring less than 20 points since a 7-6 victory over Vanderbilt in 1997. You have to go all the way back to 1993 to find a two-game span when the Tigers won SEC games despite failing to reach 20 points. That year, LSU beat Ole Miss, 19-17 and then followed with a 17-13 win over Alabama. LSU also beat Mississippi State 18-16 that year.

Saban Knows Pass Efficiency

One thing that LSU coach **Nick Saban** did over the summer was research pass efficiency and how a quarterback's efficiency related to wins and losses. Saban said the research proved that the quarterback with the better pass efficiency in a game usually leads his team to a victory. So far that has proven to be true, as the Tigers have won all 10 games in which their quarterback pass efficiency was better than its opponent. LSU is 1-1 in games in which the opponent had a better pass efficiency - losing to Florida and Chris Leak and beating Ole Miss and Eli Manning. Currently, LSU ranks first in the league and 10th in the nation in pass efficiency with a 154.0 rating. Matt Mauck is first in the SEC and 13th in the nation with a 153.9 QB rating.

Tigers Have Experience on the O-Line

The LSU offensive line has been touted as one of the best in the nation. The Tiger offensive line may be one of the most experienced as the LSU front five have 151 career starts between them. **Rodney Reed** leads the way with 46, followed by **Stephen Peterman** with 37, **Ben Wilkerson** with 31 and **Andrew Whitworth** 25. **Nate Livings** returned to the starting lineup vs. Arkansas after missing 4 games with an injury. Livings had started LSU's first 7 games before suffering a knee injury vs. South Carolina. **Rudy Niswanger** then started 4 games in Livings place before his return to the lineup last week. LSU is 25-5 when Reed, Peterman and Wilkerson start on the offensive line together (8-0 in 2001, 6-4 in 2002, 11-1 in 2003).

Tigers Keep Opponents To Less Than 20 Points For 25th Time Under Saban

By holding Ole Miss to 14 points, the Tigers have now limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 30 of the 48 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 27-3 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 30 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 16 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted four shutouts under Saban.

Mauck Ties Career High For Completions Against Alabama

For the third time this year, **Matt Mauck** either reset or tied his career highs for completions, this time hitting on 24 passes vs. Alabama. The 24 completions tied his previous mark of 24 set against South Carolina earlier this year. Mauck also broke his career-best for attempts with 36 against Alabama.

Mauck Has Completion Strings of 17 and 16 This Year

QB **Matt Mauck** has recorded completion streaks of 17 and 16 this year for the Tigers. The 17 straight tied a school-mark and were over a 2-game span. Mauck completed his final 10 passes in LSU's 59-13 win over Arizona on Sept. 6 and he followed that by completing 7 straight vs. Western Illinois. The 17 straight completions ties the mark set by Rohan Davey, who completed 6 straight vs. Arkansas to close the 1999 season and then opened the 2000 season by hitting 11 straight vs. Western Carolina. Mauck's 16 straight completions covered games against Auburn (last 2 passes) and Louisiana Tech (first 14 passes).

LSU On The Road Under Saban

The Tigers are 5-0 this season on the road and they are 12-7 on the road in the **Nick Saban** era. LSU was 2-3 in road games in 2000, followed by a 3-1 mark in 2001 and a 2-3 record last year. LSU posted a perfect road mark for the first time since the 1997 squad won all four of its road games.

Run Skyler Run

In 12 games this year, Skyler Green has touched the ball in a variety of ways. He's rushed 5 times for 68 yards, he's caught 43 passes for 485 yards, he's returned 19 punts for 403 yards and he's returned 6 kick-offs for 133 yards. In all, Green has touched the ball 73 times and he's accounted for 1,089 yards for an average of 14.9 yards every time he gets his hands on the ball. Green has also accounted for 7 TDs, including the game-winner vs. Georgia. To date, he's recorded 5 receiving TDs and he's returned 2 punts for touchdowns.

100-150-300 vs. Western Illinois A Rarity For Tigers

LSU's trio of QB **Matt Mauck**, RB **Shyrone Carey** and WR **Michael Clayton** combined for a rarity vs. Western Illinois on Sept. 13. Carey rushed for 124 yards, Clayton caught passes netting 162 yards and Mauck threw for 305 yards as the trio became just the fourth group in school history to have 100-yards rushing, 150-yards receiving and 300-yard passing in the same game. The last time the Tigers had a 100-yard rusher, a 150-yard receiver and a 300-yard passer in the same contest came against Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. In that game, Domanick Davis rushed for 122 yards, Josh Reed had 239 yards receiving and Rohan Davey threw for 444 yards. The other two times came in 2001 as well as the Tigers did it against Kentucky (Toefield 129 rushing, Reed 160 receiving, Davey 383 passing) and then against vs. Arkansas (Toefield 173 rushing, Reed 183 receiving, Davey 359 passing).

Tigers Have Had 100 On The Ground and 100 Through The Air 3 Times In 2003

For the third time this season, the Tigers had a 100-yard rusher and a 100-yard receiver in the same game as LSU accomplished the feat against Louisiana Tech. Against the Bulldogs, **Alley Broussard** rushed for 106 yards, while **Skyler Green** had 103 yards receiving. What's impressive about the feat this year is that all three games have featured a different player rush for 100 yards and a different 100-yard receiver. Last year, the Tigers had just three touchdown passes from over 40 yards, with two of those coming in the Kentucky game. Saban Gets Win No. 37 at LSU and No. 80 Overall

Nick Saban continues his climb up the school charts for victories as he recorded his 36th win at LSU against Ole Miss, moving into sole possession of fourth place in school history. Saban had been tied with Gaynell Tinsley for fourth place in school history. In his fourth year with the Tigers, Saban has posted a 37-13 overall mark. Saban also has 80 career victories. In his 10th season overall, Saban has put together an overall record of 80-39-1. Charles McClendon holds the school-record with 137 victories in 19 years as LSU's head coach.

Saban Adds Another Notch To SEC Belt

With the win over Georgia on Sept. 20, LSU coach **Nick Saban** has now recorded at least one win over all but one SEC team. The only team Saban has yet to beat in the only team he hasn't faced - Vanderbilt. In four years at LSU, Saban has recorded 22 SEC victories - 23 counting the SEC title game in 2001. Saban has four wins over Mississippi State, three over Kentucky, Ole Miss, and Alabama, and two each against Auburn, Arkansas, South Carolina and Tennessee and one over Georgia and Florida. Saban's current SEC mark, which includes regular-season games only, stands at 22-10.

Jimbo Keeps Spreading It Around In The Passing Game

LSU offensive coordinator **Jimbo Fisher** has done a good job keeping opposing defenses off balance when it comes to the passing game. Through 12 games this year, LSU has had at 15 players catch at least one pass.

Clayton Runs Streak To 38 Straight Games

LSU WR Michael Clayton ran his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 38 after recording 3 catches for 42 yards vs. Arkansas. Clayton has caught at least one pass in every game in which he has played during his career.

Tigers Rebound Again Under Saban After A Loss

One thing is certain and that is LSU does a good job of bouncing back after a loss under **Nick Saban**. After the 33-7 win over South Carolina, LSU is now 10-3 under Saban after a loss. LSU has lost back-to-back games under Saban only three times. LSU is 4-0 under Saban when the game following a loss comes on the road - LSU beat Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl following a loss to Arkansas in 2000; LSU beat Alabama in Tuscaloosa following a home loss to Ole Miss in 2001; the Tigers beat Kentucky in Lexington following a loss to Auburn in 2002; LSU beat South Carolina in Columbia following a loss to Florida in 2003.

LSU Secures Second Straight Winning Season vs. SEC Eastern Division

LSU's win over South Carolina gave the Tigers a winning record vs. the SEC Eastern Division for the second straight year and the third time in four years under **Nick Saban**. The Tigers were 2-1 vs. the East this year. LSU had won six straight against the East before Florida snapped the streak on Saturday. The last time LSU had a winning record against the SEC East in back-to-back seasons came in 1996-97. In all, Saban has a 9-4 mark vs. the SEC East, which includes a 31-20 win over Tennessee in the SEC Championship game in 2001. Prior to Saban's arrival and since the SEC went to divisions in 1992, LSU posted a 6-17-1 vs. the East from 1992 to 1999.

True Freshmen On The Field

Through 12 games, LSU has played 15 true freshmen. LSU opened the season by playing 11 true freshmen against UL-Monroe and then 12 played against Arizona. Reed Among Nation's Elite In Starts on Offensive Line

Senior OT **Rodney Reed** started his 46th straight game vs. Arkansas. Reed's 46 career starts ranks as the 7th highest total among active Division I players. Marshall's Nate McPeck leads the way with 49 career starts.

Pancakes Are Breakfast of Choice For LSU O-Line

A new wrinkle to this year's offensive grade sheet is the tracking of both pancakes and knockdowns for the LSU offensive line. Through 12 games **Andrew Whitworth** leads the Tigers with 17 pancakes. Offensive guard **Stephen Peterman** is tops among the Tigers with 118 knockdowns.

Cap and Gown Tigers

LSU has two players on this year's roster who have already earned their bachelor's degree - OT **Rodney Reed** and C **Jimmy Courtenay**. Reed and Courtenay both graduated last May. Reed, who earned First Team Academic All-America honors last year, graduated with a 3.9 grade point average in accounting. He is currently pursuing his Master's in accounting.

Peterman's Pulling Double-Duty

As of Tuesday, Aug. 26, senior offensive lineman **Stephen Peterman** began pulling double-duty as well, only his is as a player and daddy. Peterman's wife Colleen gave birth to a 6-pound, 10-ounce baby boy in Metairie, La. Peterman missed two days of practice to be with his wife during the birth, but he returned to the squad on Thursday and started on Saturday against UL-Monroe. The newest Peterman, Stephen Frederick, Jr., checked in at some 318 pounds lighter than his daddy.

That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach **Nick Saban** has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In his fourth season at LSU, Saban has put together a 23-5 mark at home, which includes an 12-4 record in SEC games. LSU finished its 2003 season with a 6-1 at home after going 6-1 in Tiger Stadium last season. Under Saban, the Tigers are 6-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium. LSU's 18 wins over Saban's first three years in Baton Rouge is the most over a three-year period for LSU in Tiger Stadium since the Tigers won 18 home games from 1972-74.

LSU Won 4 Straight Games By At Least 24 Points; Longest Streak Since 1911

LSU won by 24 points or more for the fourth game in a row vs. Alabama. It marks the first time LSU has won by 24 points or more in four consecutive games since the Tigers won the first four games of the 1911 season by scores of 42-0 over Southwestern Louisiana, 46-0 over Louisiana Normal, 40-0 over Louisiana College and 40-0 over Meteor AC.

I'd been warned prior to my first visit to Baton Rouge that the legendary Death Valley mystique was a myth. That assessment couldn't have been more wrong. Tiger Stadium was as loud as any I've ever heard during the dramatic fourth quarter of Saturday's Georgia game, the festivities surrounding it as advertised.

The streets were lined with purple and gold. Smoke emanated from the grills in the parking lot. Shouts of "Go Tigers" and "Tiger Bait" echoed from the stadium deep into the heart of campus.

And that was just Friday night. -- Stewart Mandel, SI.com (Sept. 21, 2003)

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 80th year in the venerable stadium on SATURDAY NIGHT.

• Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 23-5 HOME RECORD, including a 6-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 11-4 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 17-3 since Saban took over.

• LSU has won NINE OF ITS LAST 10 games at home, including an eight-game win streak during the stretch. That was the longest home streak for the Tigers since winning eight straight from 1995-96.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 27 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 18 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP FIVE IN THE NATION, including the last three.

Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

LSU Defeats No. 2 Vols for SEC Title

Matt Mauck filled in for an injured Rohan Davey and rushed for a pair of touchdowns as the Tigers upset second-ranked Tennessee in the SEC Championship Game, 31-20, at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta. Mauck entered in the first quarter and staked the Tigers to a 7-0 lead on a 4-yard run. The Tigers rallied from a 17-10 halftime deficit, outscoring the Vols 21-3 in the second half. Mauck's 13-yard touchdown run less than a minute into the fourth quarter gave the Tigers a 24-17 lead they would not surrender. After the Vols cut the lead to 24-20, Domanick Davis, filling in for an injured LaBrandon Toefield, put an exclamation point on the victory with a 1-yard touchdown plunge on fourth down to provide the final score. Davis accumulated 149 all-purpose yards on the evening. Bradie James led the Tigers' defense with 10 tackles. Mauck was named the MVP of the game for his effort, as the Tigers claimed their first outright SEC title since 1986.

LSU's Rolls Past UL-Monroe, 49-7

Matt Mauck threw three touchdown passes, Joseph Addai rushed for 81 yards and Michael Clayton caught six passes for 152 yards and a pair of TD passes as LSU rolled to a 49-7 win over Louisiana-Monroe in the season-opener for both teams. The game was only four minutes old when a thunderstorm rolled into Baton Rouge and caused a 39-minute delay because of lightning. After a scoreless first quarter, Mauck then threw three TD passes over the final seven minutes of the second quarter to put the Tigers up 21-0 at halftime. Shyrone Carey added a 1-yard run midway through the third quarter to give LSU a 28-0 advantage and the Tigers stretched the margin to 35-0 with a 31-yard interception return just 16 seconds later. Louisiana-Monroe scored its only points of the contest on a 12-yard run by Kevin Payne with 14:10 left in the fourth quarter. Freshman Alley Broussard capped the scoring for the Tigers with a 1-yard run with 10:39 left in the contest. For the game, the Tigers racked up 474 yards of offense (306 passing, 168 rushing) compared to just 240 yard for the Indians (59 rushing, 181 passing).

LSU Storms Past Arizona, 59-13, In The Desert

LSU scored on its first seven possessions, including a 15-play, 80-yard drive to open the contest, as the Tigers had little trouble with Arizona, posting a 59-13 win over the Wildcats in Tucson, Ariz. Quarterbacks Matt Mauck and Marcus Randall combined to connect on 19 of 25 passes for 299 yards and two TDs and Joseph Addai rushed for 86 yards and a pair of scores to lead the Tigers. Michael Clayton led all receivers with six catches for 109 yards and a 48-yard TD reception. Addai opened the scoring for LSU with a 1-yard run midway through the first quarter. Ryan Gaudet nailed a 47-yard field goal three minutes later and then Addai added an 8-yard TD run less than a minute after Gaudet's field goal to give the Tigers a 17-0 lead. LSU stretched the advantage to 38-0 at halftime, as the Tigers were never threatened in the contest. In all the Tigers, had five rushing TDs, two passing TDs and Skyler Green returned a punt 65 yards for a TD. Arizona scored its first points with 10 minutes left in the contest on a 1-yard fumble return. Defensively, LSU limited the Wildcats to only 182 yards of offense.

LSU QB Matt Mauck connected on 23 of 32 passes for a career-best 305 yards and four TDs as the Tigers overcame a slow start to post a 35-7 win over Western Illinois last Saturday in Tiger Stadium. Shyrone Carey rushed for a career-best 124 yards and a TD to lead the Tiger ground attack, while Michael Clayton hauled in 11 receptions for 162 yards and a score. Mauck-To-Green Leads LSU Past No. 7 Georgia, 17-10

Matt Mauck connected with Skyler Green for a 34-yard touchdown pass with 1:22 left in the contest as 10th-ranked LSU knocked off seventh-ranked Georgia, 17-10, before a record crowd of 92,251 in Tiger Stadium. The win lifted LSU to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC action and it marked the first Tiger victory over a top 10 team in Tiger Stadium since a 28-21 win over No. 1 Florida in 1997. The Tigers led 7-3 at halftime thanks in part to an outstanding defensive effort by LSU over the first 30 minutes. In the first half alone, Georgia got inside the LSU 30-yard line five times and came up with only three points. Trailing 3-0, the Tigers took a 7-3 lead on a 21-yard run by Shyrone Carey with 3:10 left in the first half. The Tigers extended their margin to 10-3 on a 47-yard field goal by Ryan Gaudet at the 6:23 mark in the third quarter. LSU appeared to have the game in hand, but a fumble by Mauck at the Georgia 15-yard line with less than 5 minutes left gave the Bulldogs another chance. Two players later Georgia's David Greene hit Tyson Browning on a screen pass, which he took 93 yards for a touchdown to tie the score at 10-10. Devery Henderson returned the ensuing kickoff 48 yards to the LSU 49-yard line to setup the game-winning touchdown for the Tigers. Georgia got into LSU territory in the final minute, but an interception by Corey Webster at the 22-yard line sealed the Tiger victory.

Opportunistic Tigers Feast on Mississippi State, 41-6

LSU turned three Mississippi State turnovers into 21 points and the Tiger defense limited the Bulldogs to only 31 yards rushing as LSU rolled to a 41-6 win in Starkville. After a slow start, LSU took a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by Shyrone Carey. Leading 10-0 after a Ryan Gaudet field goal, the Tigers stretched the margin to 17-0 midway through the second quarter on another 1-yard run by Carey. Carey's second TD was setup by an interception by Jack Hunt, who returned the pick to the MSU 1-yard line. The Tigers led 24-0 at half-time after Travis Daniels returned an interception 48-yards for a TD with less than a minute remaining in the first half. MSU then fumbled on its third play of the second half and the Tigers struck again one play later, this time Matt Mauck connected with Devery Henderson for a 36-yard TD pass to stretch the lead to 31-0. LSU led 34-0 before MSU finally scored with just over 10 minutes left in the contest. For the game, Mauck completed 12 of 19 passes for 171 yards and 1 TD, while Justin Vincent led the Tigers with 58 yards rushing and 1 TD on six carries. The Gators took the lead for good at 10-7 on a 29-yard field goal by Matt Leach at the 3:17 mark in the first quarter. The Gators led 13-7 at halftime after another field goal by Leach. Florida extended its lead to 19-7 on a 35-yard pass from Leak to Ciatric Fason with 5:21 left in the third quarter. The Tigers had a couple of chances to get back in the game negated, one by a penalty and another on a fumble. A penalty wiped out a 42-yard pass from Matt Mauck to Michael Clayton in the third quarter that would have given the Tigers the ball at the Florida 28-yard line. Then late in the fourth quarter with the game still in doubt, Mauck hit Devery Henderson in stride with a pass to the Florida 31-yard line, which he then fumbled away at the UF 14-yard line. For the game, the Tigers sacked Leak six times and forced another Florida turnover on the LSU 1-yard line. Mauck completed 19 of 33 passes for 231 yards and a pair of interceptions, while Leak led Florida with 18 of 30 passing for 229 yards and 2 TDs.

Tigers Ride Freshman Running Backs to 33-7 Win Over South Carolina

True freshman running backs Justin Vincent, Alley Broussard and Barrington Edwards combined to rush for 222 yards and 2 TDs and quarterback Matt Mauck connected on 24 of 30 passes for 199 yards and 2 scores as 10th-ranked LSU rolled past South Carolina, 33-7, in Columbia. Playing without its two starting running backs in Joseph Addai and Shyrone Carey, who were both out with knee injuries, the Tigers rushed for a season-high 263 yards on 52 carries. LSU finished with 482 yards off offense, while holding South Carolina to only 254 yards of offense, including zero rushing yards. LSU jumped out to a 19-0 first half lead and never looked back in cruising to the victory. LSU had first half drives of 21-plays and 97 yards and 14-plays and 91 yards that both culminated in touchdowns, the second of which gave LSU a 19-0 lead on a 1-yard run by Vincent just before halftime. South Carolina pulled to within 19-7 after a 77-yard TD early in the third quarter before LSU linebacker Jason LeDoux put the game out of reach with a 15-yard fumble return for a touchdown later in the quarter. Vincent added another 1-yard run midway through the fourth quarter for LSU's final point. Broussard led LSU with 108 yards rushing on 19 attempts, while Vincent had 77 yards and 2 TDs rushing and added another 46 yards receiving on four receptions.

LSU Shuts Down Cadillac, Auburn in 31-7 Win

In a game that featured the nation's top rushing defense in LSU against one of the best at running the football in Auburn, LSU came out on top, limiting Auburn to 50 yards rushing in a 31-7 win in Tiger Stadium. LSU struck early and often in the game as the Tigers rolled up 21 first half points and never looked back in posting its biggest win over Auburn since a 35-7 victory in 1972. Matt Mauck connected with Devery Henderson on a 64-yard scoring pass on the sixth play of the game for a 7-0 LSU lead. After the LSU defense stopped Auburn on a fourth-and-one at the 48-yard line, the Tigers needed only six more plays for take a 14-0 advantage as Mauck found Michael Clayton for an 18-yard TD. Alley Broussard capped the first quarter scoring with a 5-yard run for a 21-0 LSU lead, which is where the game stood at halftime. Ryan Gaudet kicked a 33-yard field goal and then Mauck hit Henderson for another TD pass to give the Tigers a 31-0 lead in the third quarter. Auburn, who was held to only 193 yards of offense, scored its only points late in the fourth quarter. For the game, Justin Vincent led the Tigers with 127 yards rushing, while Mauck completed 17 of 28 passes for 224 yards and 3 TDs. Henderson caught 6 passes for 101 yards and 2 TDs, while Clayton had 6 catches for 59 yards and 1 score. The LSU defense limited Cadillac Williams, who was considered a Heisman Trophy Candidate, to 61 yards on 20 carries.

LSU Dominates Louisiana Tech in 49-10 Homecoming Win

LSU quarterback Matt Mauck completed his first 14 passes, four of which went for touchdowns, as the seventh-ranked Tigers dominated Louisiana Tech in every phase of the game in a 49-10 win over the Bulldogs. For the game, the Tigers racked up a season-high 653 yards of offense - 372 passing, 281 rushing, while holds Tech's high-powered passing attack to only 220 yards. The contest was never in doubt as LSU scored on five of its first six offensive possessions to take a 49-3 lead at halftime. The Tigers led 28-0 after 15 minutes and then tacked on another score just seconds into the second quarter for a 35-0 advantage. Josh Scobee finally got Tech on the board with a 29-yard field goal early in the second quarter. LSU followed that with scoring plays of 50 yards on a Mauck to Devery Henderson pass and then a 22-yard TD run by Alley Broussard. For the game, Mauck tied an LSU single-game record by completing 14 straight passes and he set the school-record for completion percentage as he connected on 18 of 20 passes for 311 yards. Broussard led the Tiger ground game with 106 yards and 1 TD on 16 carries, while Barrington Edwards added 66 yards on 11 attempts. Skler Green led all LSU receivers with nine catches for 103 yards and 1 TD. Defensively, Tiger safety Jack Hunt scored on a 29-yard interception return.

The Tigers tacked on another score to run the margin to 24-0 on a 4-yard run by Alley Broussard mid-way through the third quarter. Chris Jackson added a 33-yard field goal for a 27-0 LSU lead before Alabama's Brian Bostick put the Crimson Tide's only points on the scoreboard with a 27-yard field goal with 6:39 left in the contest. Shuts Down Ole Miss and Eli in 17-14 Win

LSU's defense lived up to its billing as one of the nation's best as the Tigers shut-down Eli Manning and Ole Miss in a 17-14 win over the 15th-ranked Rebels in Oxford. For the game, the Tigers held the Rebels to only 227 yards of offense and 22 points below their season average. Ole Miss' defense struck first in the contest, picking off a Matt Mauck pass on LSU's first play from scrimmage and returning it 6-yards for a TD and a 7-0 lead just one minute into the contest. LSU pulled to within 7-3 on a 45-yard field goal by Chris Jackson midway through the first quarter and then took the lead for good on a 9-yard pass from Mauck to Michael Clayton just before halftime. The Tigers stretched the lead to 17-7 early in the fourth quarter on a 53-yard TD pass from Mauck to Devery Henderson. Manning then directed the Rebels on a 9-play, 76-yard scoring drive culminating on a 10-yard TD pass from Brandon Jacobs to pull to within 17-14 with 10:51 left. After Ole Miss missed a 36-yard field goal that would have tied the game with 4:15 left, the Tigers went three-and-out on their next possession, turning the ball back over to Rebels. The Tiger defense came up big again, forcing three incomplete passes by Manning before a blitz tripped up the Rebel quarterback on fourth-and-10, turning the ball back over to the Tigers with 1:50 to go. The Tigers ran the clock down to nine seconds before giving Ole Miss one more shot. Manning's desperation pass was knocked down at midfield as time expired.

Berth in SEC Title Game With 55-24 Win Hogs

Justin Vincent rushed for 112 yards and a pair of touchdowns and Matt Mauck tied a school-record with 4 TD passes as third-ranked LSU clinched a berth in the SEC Championship game with a 55-24 win over Arkansas. The win was LSU's 11th of the season, tying the school-record set in 1958. After spotting Arkansas an early 7-0 lead, the Tigers battled back, getting a 38-yard field goal from Chris Jackson and then taking a 10-7 lead on a 25-yard fumble return for a TD by Eric Alexander. The Razorbacks tied the game at 10-10 before LSU regained the lead at 17-10 on a 10-yard pass from Mauck to Clayton, which game him a school-record 20 TD receptions. The Hogs tied the game two plays later at 17-17 on a 20-yard run by Cedric Cobbs. From there, it was all LSU as the Tigers closed the half with a 17-0 run to take a 34-17 lead on a 22-yard pass from Mauck to Devery Henderson. The Tigers stretched the margin to 41-17 early in the third quarter on a 37-yard pass from Mauck to David Jones and then increased it once again to 48-17 on a 23-yard run by Vincent. The Tigers got their final points on a 2-yard run by Vincent to stretch the lead to 55-17 late in the third quarter.
