Gearing for the stretch run: LSU opens May with a critical SEC series at Mississippi State, looking to solidify its spot atop the league standings.

- LSU enters the weekend with a 2 1/2-game lead over Auburn and a 3-game lead over Mississippi St. in the overall SEC race.
- LSU has won its last six series vs. SEC West teams, last losing a division series to Ole Miss last year in Oxford.
- All three of LSU's SEC opponents in May—Mississippi St., Auburn and Arkansas—are currently ranked in at least one of the three polls.
- The Tigers have already played twice this week, losing to Tulane in the Superdome on Tuesday and defeating New Orleans on Wednesday.
- One win will give LSU its 19th consecutive winning season in SEC play, continuing the Tigers' record streak.

Scouting the Bulldogs: State got out to an 8-1 start in the league and bolted to the top of the standings, but a 4-7 April in conference play has the Bulldogs looking to bounce back.

- MSU coach Ron Polk has won 953 games in Starkville and 1,032 games at SEC schools, the only coach to reach the 1,000 mark in the conference.
- The Bulldogs have lost their last three SEC series, dropping two of three each weekend to Auburn at home and then to South Carolina and Florida on the road.
- State took two of three from Vanderbilt on the first weekend of SEC play, then rose to the top of the league by sweeping Arkansas and Ole Miss on the road.
- State has led the SEC in ERA throughout the season, and comes into the weekend with a conference leading mark of 3.27.
- The Bulldogs' starting rotation is headlined by junior left-hander Paul Maholm, who is 6-2 with a 2.34 ERA, but gave up eight runs on 10 hits in losing to Florida last Saturday.
- State's deep and talented bullpen is led by junior right-hander Jonathan Papelbon (6-1, 0.52, 6 saves) and redshirt freshman right-hander Jamie Gant (2-1, 0.30).
- At the plate, senior shortstop Matthew Maniscalco (.351) and junior first baseman Matthew Brinson (.337) lead an experienced lineup.

About the series: State holds a 185-149 all-time edge, but LSU has won the last two series in Starkville

- The teams split a two-game series last year in Baton Rouge, with MSU winning the first game, 15-4, and LSU the second, 7-3.
- LSU won two of three at Dudy Noble Field in both 1999 and 2001 when the Bulldogs were coached by Pat McMahon.
- The Tigers have won three series from Ron Polk-coached MSU teams in Starkville, in 1982, 1986 and 1993.
- Ron Polk is the only active SEC coach with more than one year of experience with a winning record vs. LSU, holding a 62-46 career mark vs. the Tigers, including 58-43 at MSU.
- The Tigers and Bulldogs have met 10 times in SEC Tournament play, splitting the meetings at five apiece. But State has won the last two SEC Tourney meetings, including a 4-1 in the 2001 championship game.
- Surprisingly, these two teams have met only once in NCAA Tournament play, with LSU winning 10-8 at the 1998 College World Series.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2003: Is 5-2 with a 2.85 ERA in 11 appearances (nine starts) totaling 60.0 innings

- True freshman who must now take over key role as part of the Tigers' SEC weekend pitching staff.
- Lost two starts in April due to lack of run support, as Tigers have scored just four runs in those games.
- Broke two-game losing streak with win vs. Tennessee (4/25), getting plenty of run support despite giving up four runs in 7 2/3 innings.
- Went seven innings but took second straight loss at Vanderbilt (4/18), giving up four runs on 10 hits.
- Took his first loss vs. Ole Miss (4/11), giving up five runs on eight hits in 6 1/3 innings. Retired 15 of 16 batters through five innings, but could not overcome four-run sixth inning.
- Coming off a complete game victory over South Carolina in his first career SEC start (4/4), giving up one run and striking out a career high eight while walking none.
- Made impressive debut at Centenary (2/11), pitching five scoreless innings and allowing two hits. Worked out of bases-loaded jam in first inning and faced minimum number of batters in second through fifth innings.
- Went to 2-0 with another impressive outing vs. UL-Monroe (2/18), giving up just one run on three hits in five innings.
- Threw five shutout innings vs. Southeastern Louisiana (3/5), yielding three hits and striking out a five.
- Went a season long 5 2/3 innings at Tulane (3/11), giving up no earned runs and four hits while striking out five.
- Made first relief appearance and first SEC appearance vs. Florida (3/16) and gave up two runs on three hits in 1 2/3 innings.
- Threw longest outing at UNO (3/25), striking out a season high six batters and walking none over seven innings.
- Notched first career save in series finale at Alabama (3/30), retiring the final two batters after hitting one batter to allow Crimson Tide to cut LSU lead to 11-10.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2003: Is 7-1 with a 4.64 ERA in 10 appearances (nine starts) totaling 66.0 innings

- Rated as No. 15 senior nationally by Baseball America.
- Is now one of 10 LSU pitchers with 25 or more career victories.
- Has won nine of his 25 career games in contests that immediately followed LSU defeats.
- Has struck out 10 or more batters four times in his career.
- Is the Tigers' leader in innings pitched with 66.0.
- Made impressive first start of season at Long Beach St. (3/2), giving up one run on five hits over six innings. Left eight Long Beach runners stranded in scoring position.
- Notched first career save in victory over Houston (2/23), throwing two scoreless innings of relief in first outing of season.
- Struck out nine over six strong innings vs. Winthrop (3/8), giving up just one run on five hits.
- Turned in first complete game of season and fifth of his career vs. Florida (3/15), walking none and striking out eight over nine innings to improve to 3-0.
- Won his fourth straight start at Georgia (3/22), striking out a season high 10 batters over eight innings.
- Walked a career high nine batters in 5 1/3 innings at Alabama (3/29), but still managed to hang on and improve to 5-0.
- Struggled in first loss of the season to South Carolina (4/5), giving up six runs on seven hits and five walks in five innings to fall to 0-4 in his career against the Gamecocks.
- Pitched 7 2/3 innings vs. Ole Miss to improve to team best 6-1 (4/12). After giving up six runs on seven hits through 2 1/3 innings, Pettit retired the next 14 batters he faced through the end of the seventh.
- Gave up four runs in first inning at Vanderbilt (4/19), but allowed just four hits over the final eight innings he pitched in taking a no decision.
- Was 10-2 in his last 12 starts prior to the no decision, his first since April 28 vs. Arkansas.
- Struggled early vs. Tennessee (4/26), giving up four runs in the first inning and six through the first 2 2/3, but recovered to shut out the Volunteers the rest of the way and picked up the win by going eight innings.
- The 13th-round selection of the Minnesota Twins in the 2002 draft.

2002: Finished 9-7 and ranked seventh in the SEC with a 3.35 ERA. Posted 121 strikeouts in 121.0 innings pitched.

- Struck out 10 or more batters three times during the season.
- Was healthy for a complete season for the first time in his LSU career and came of age.
- Gave up just two runs on seven hits in complete game regional victory vs. Tulane (6/1), saving the Tigers from elimination.
- Turned in a spectacular complete game in regular season finale vs. Alabama (5/19), striking out nine and giving up just one run on five hits.
- Turned in sterling 8.0 inning outing at Florida (5/12), giving up just four singles and one run to the SEC's top-hitting team. Allowed just two runners to reach third base over his final seven innings.
- Earned his first win in three weeks at Tennessee (5/5), striking out seven and allowing just two runs over 7.0 innings.
- Went 5.1 innings and gave up three runs but got no decision vs. Arkansas (4/28).
- Named the SEC Pitcher of the Week on Apr. 15. For that week, Pettit struck out 12 over 13.0 innings and fashioned a 2.08 ERA in defeating Tulane and Georgia.
- Took tough loss at South Carolina (Apr. 21), giving up four runs in 6.1 innings.
- Against Georgia (Apr. 14), Pettit overcame a slow start to strike out seven and walk just one over 7.0 innings to even his record and pick up first SEC win in a month.
- Pitched one of the best games of his career against Tulane in the Superdome (Apr. 10), giving up just one hit in 5.0 shutout innings. Pettit retired the first 12 batters he faced and did not allow a ball to be hit out of the infield in the first four innings.
- Had outstanding start in win over New Orleans (Apr. 2), pitching 4.0 shutout innings and giving up just two hits.
- Fired complete game, four-hit shutout vs. Vanderbilt (Mar. 15), tying a career high with 12 strikeouts.



- Tied a career high with 12 strikeouts in the Tigers' Feb. 15 victory over Mercer.
- Struck out 10 in 6.1 innings and got no decision vs. UL-Monroe (Mar. 8).
- Went a career high 7.2 innings in Mercer game, not yielding an earned run and carrying a shutout into the eighth inning.
- Started season opener vs. Birmingham-Southern on Feb. 8 and struck out eight in 6.0 innings.

2001: Posted 4-0 mark with a 2.42 ERA, but only appeared in 7 games (4 starts) due to continuing shoulder ailments.

- Earned his first win of the season against Southern on Mar. 13, going five innings and allowing two runs on two hits.
- Best outing of season came Mar. 23 at Mississippi St., as he allowed no earned runs in 6.1 innings to pick up the victory.
- Did not return to action again until May 1 at New Orleans, when he went three innings and allowed just one hit and no earned runs while striking out five.
- Final outing came in five-inning stint at Arkansas (5/6), giving up three runs in five innings.

2000: Went 5-3 with a 4.15 ERA in 16 games (7 starts), but season ended early due to tendonitis in his shoulder.

- Best effort came at Ole Miss (4/30) in first career SEC start. In that game, Pettit allowed one run on five hits and struck out a career-high 12 in seven innings to pick up series-clinching win.
- Earned his first career win in second game of doubleheader vs. Virginia (2/12), starting and throwing six scoreless innings, striking out six and allowing just two hits.
- Final outing of season came at Kentucky (5/6), where he earned win with six strikeouts over 6.2 innings.

1999: Was granted a medical redshirt after pitching in only three early-season games.

LSU-MSU showdown back to May

For the first time since 1996, the LSU-Mississippi St. series has returned to May. The teams closed the regular season from 1992 through 1996 before the series moved to April from 1998 through 2000, and then to March in 2001 and 2002.

The move might bode well for LSU, as the Tigers won three of the five series contested in May in the 1990s. The series returns to early April in 2004 in Baton Rouge.

Tigers looking to continue success vs. West

LSU will play its final three series of the 2003 SEC season against the West division, as the Tigers look to complete their 11th winning season against their own division since the conference returned to division play in 1992.

The Tigers come to Starkville having won their last five series against the West, three last year over Auburn Arkansas and Alabama, plus series this year with Alabama and Ole Miss. The Rebels were the last SEC West team to win a series from LSU, taking two in March of 2002 at Oxford. LSU and Mississippi St. split a two-game series in 2002 at Baton Rouge, with the third game rained out.

LSU is 4-2 against the West this year after going 11-4 in the division in 2002. The Tigers' only losing record against the West came in 1995, when they were 9-11, counting games in the SEC West tournament, which at the time counted toward the league standings.

Pulling rank

This weekend's series in Starkville marks the first time LSU has faced a ranked SEC opponent since the first weekend of April when LSU hosted South Carolina. But the Mississippi St. series isn't the Tigers last against ranked teams.

In fact, all three of the Tigers' SEC opponents this month—MSU, Auburn and Arkansas—are currently ranked in at least one poll. Keep in mind that LSU has never faced three consecutive ranked opponents in the final three weekends of conference play. LSU twice came close this rare occurrence happening, first in 1997 when the Tigers had Auburn and Alabama in two of the final three weekends, but had a series with unranked Arkansas in between.

The other time was last year, when LSU closed the season with series against a pair of Top-10 teams in Florida and Alabama, the first time that has ever occurred in the Tigers' history. LSU went 5-1 in those games, winning two from the Gators in Gainesville and sweeping the Crimson Tide at home.

LSU is 6-2-1 vs. ranked SEC opponents this year, 2-0-1 vs. Florida and 2-1 vs. both Alabama and South Carolina.

Tigers need one win to continue winning ways

If LSU doesn't get swept this weekend in Starkville, the Tigers will clinch their 19th consecutive winning season in conference play, the longest such streak in SEC history.

The Tigers, who have won no fewer than 16 league games in every season since 1985 and 18 or more league games 14 times in that span, last failed to go above .500 in the league in 1984, when Skip Bertman's first team was 12-12 in the conference.

Since 1999, every other SEC team has gone .500 or below at least once in conference play, with South Carolina being the only other SEC team to have a winning SEC record in every year of the new millennium.



Dome game falls short of record, still ranks

The 2003 edition of LSU-Tulane in the Superdome didn't quite reach the NCAA record levels of attendance that the 2002 game did, but the paid crowd of 18,319 was still enough to carve a spot on the NCAA attendance charts.

Tuesday's attendance ranks fifth all-time for an NCAA regular season date. Of course, last year's LSU-Tulane game that drew 27,673 is the record, followed by a Texas-TCU doubleheader in 1996 at The Ballpark in Arlington that drew 21,043, a 2000 Nebraska-Creighton game at Rosenblatt Stadium that drew 18,758, and a 1979 UNLV-Hawaii game that got 18,349 at Aloha Stadium in Honolulu.

The game was the 10th LSU-Tulane game in the Big Easy to draw more than 10,000 fans, with the Green Wave now holding a 7-3 edge in those contests. Eight of those crowds of 10,000 or more came to Zephyr Field in Metairie, including more than 11,000 for each of the three games in the 2001 super regional won by Tulane.

More big crowds on the way?

With the Tigers invading Starkville this weekend, crowds at Mississippi State usually turn out in big numbers to see the SEC's two premier baseball programs battle it out, and with both teams locked in a title chase, this year should be no exception.

Interestingly enough, only one LSU-MSU game in Starkville has drawn more than 10,000 fans, and that was a 1988 doubleheader that drew a crowd of 14,378, which ranks as the second highest on campus attendance in NCAA history. The record is 14,991 that saw a State doubleheader with Florida in 1989.

Two other LSU-MSU games in Starkville have gone over the 9,000 mark, including the second game of the 2001 series that drew an announced crowd of 9,264.

All four LSU-MSU games played in the Winn-Dixie Showdown in the Superdome in New Orleans drew paid crowds of 10,000 or more, but that was for a tripleheader that also featured games with local schools UNO and Tulane.

SEC-TV is back yet again

For the third consecutive time, the second game of an LSU-MSU series in Starkville has been picked as the SEC-TV Game of the Week. Once again, Dave Neal and Larry Conley will be on hand to call the action of Saturday's 3 p. m. game. SEC-TV also televised the second game of the 1999 and 2001 series at Dudy Noble Field, as well as the second game of the 1998 series in Baton Rouge and SEC Tournament games between the schools in 1998 and 2001. The SEC-TV cameras haven't been kind to LSU, as MSU holds a 4-1 edge in those TV games.

Tigers close strong April on winning note

LSU's win over UNO on Wednesday wrapped up a very successful April for the Tigers, as they went 13-5 in the month and 8-4 in the SEC to rise to the top of the conference race.

The Tigers have enjoyed April very much under coach Smoke Laval, going 27-8 in the month in Laval's two years following the 18-year tenure of Hall of Fame coach Skip Bertman. LSU was 14-3 in April of 2002.

The Tigers were generally solid in all phases of the game, especially at the plate, where LSU hit .328 and scored 154 runs, smacking 21 home runs. Ryan Patterson and Jon Zeringue each batted .400 to lead the way in the month, as five Tigers hit .350 or better in April.

LSU's 3.98 ERA was solid if not spectacular, although Jason Determann (3-0, 2.25) and Nate Bumstead (4-0, 2.32) both enjoyed outstanding months.

And although the defense faltered late in the month, the Tigers' string of five errorless games and eight in a nine-game stretch contributed to the Tigers' .979 fielding percentage in the month.

The midweek win over UNO moved the Tigers to 5-1 in midweek games in April this year and 20-4 in April midweek games since 2000.

Vaught, six former Tigers named to honor roll

Fifth-year senior pitcher Chad Vaught was one of seven LSU baseball players named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll, which was released by the league office on Thursday.

Vaught, a native of Ferriday, was the only member of the 2003 team to be named to the honor roll, which was based upon grade point averages from the 2001-2002 academic year. Vaught, a biology major, was also named to the team in 2001 and 2002.

One of the six former players named to the honor roll was Wally Pontiff, the Tigers' two-time All-SEC third baseman who died tragically last July 24 due to a heart abnormality. Pontiff, who had a 3.25 GPA in biological sciences at the time of his passing, was named to the academic all-district team in 2002 and was on the SEC honor roll in both 2001 and 2002 as well.

Three former Tigers who earned their degrees were named to the honor roll—pitchers Weylin Guidry (marketing), David Miller (civil engineering) and Justin Hill (general studies). Also earning recognition were pitcher Lukas Guidroz and infielder Rocky Scelfo, both of whom were general studies majors.

A total of 120 players were named to the honor roll throughout the league, led, surprisingly, by 22 players from Arkansas.



Determann closes outstanding April

With the SEC Tournament and NCAA play coming up in May, LSU's depleted pitching staff is looking for pitchers to step up and answer the challenge. From the looks of things in April, Jason Determann is more than ready.

The redshirt freshman left-hander from Baton Rouge's Catholic High turned in the best performance of his young career on Wednesday against UNO, giving up just one earned run (two overall) on eight hits in eight innings while striking out six and walking none. The win improved Determann to 4-0 on the year with a stellar 2.23 ERA.

Determann was one of the Tigers' most consistent arms throughout April, going 3-0 in the month with a 2.25 ERA, walking only one batter out of the 95 he faced in the month, striking out 23 in 24 innings while allowing opponents to hit just .231 against him in the month. Determann's only rough spot in April came when he gave up four runs on five hits in the sixth inning on April 23 vs. Southeastern Louisiana.

Determann is the stingiest LSU pitcher when it comes to putting runners on base, allowing an average of just 1.05 baserunners per inning, yielding 31 hits, five hits and two hit batters in 36 1/3 innings on the year.

Smith toughs it out, goes career long

Jason Determann isn't the only LSU left-hander coming off of a solid performance in the midweek, as freshman left-hander Greg Smith not only saved the Tigers' bullpen some wear and tear on Tuesday night against Tulane while gaining some confidence heading into the stretch run.

Smith relieved Jake Tompkins and went on to complete the game, throwing a career high 4 1/3 innings, giving up just three hits and one earned run. Smith's previous long outing came on April 5, when he went the final four innings of an 8-5 loss to South Carolina.

Once again, the Alexandria native proved his value in sticky situations by leaving two Tulane runners stranded when he entered the game, as Smith has not allowed any of his 10 inherited runners to come across the plate, a big reason why LSU has allowed just 11 of 51 inherited runners to score.

Smith, however, hasn't been luckiest pitcher. Ten of the 16 runs he has allowed have been unearned, including two more unearned runs against Tulane on Tuesday.

No inheritances honored

A key to the Tigers' strong April was the bullpen's ability to leave inherited runners on base. LSU pitchers allowed only three of 19 inherited runners in the month to come home, including three against Tennessee on Friday and two on Tuesday vs. Tulane. For the year, only 11 of 51 inherited runners (21.6%) have scored against the Tigers.

Sadler stretches scoreless streak

Billy Sadler continued his about-face from the near-disaster in Alabama on Wednesday, firing a scoreless ninth inning to run his streak of consecutive scoreless innings to 7 2/3. Sadler has not allowed a run since the third inning of his only starting assignment of the year, which came on April 9 at Northwestern St.

In five appearances in March, Sadler gave up nine runs (eight earned) in 10 innings. In April, Sadler threw 10 1/3 innings and gave up just the one run to Northwestern St, good for a 0.87 ERA. Sadler also struck out 12 batters in that time and notched two saves, both in SEC games vs. Ole Miss (April 12) and Vanderbilt (April 20).

For the year, Sadler leads the Tigers with 18 appearances, 17 out of the bullpen, and has lowered his ERA to 2.76. He has fanned 42 batters in 32 2/3 innings, or 11.57 per nine innings.

Bumstead looks for lucky seven on Sunday

The only thing more certain than LSU pitcher Nate Bumstead winning on Sundays in the SEC so far this year have been, well, death and taxes.

Should Bumstead take the mound on Sunday at Mississippi St., he will be shooting for his seventh consecutive win in SEC competition. Bumstead is already the first LSU pitcher to win his first six conference starts of his career (without any no decisions factored in) in the history of the program, breaking the old mark of five that was done most recently by Brett Laxton in 1993.

Bumstead is 6-0 with a 3.13 ERA in the league, walking only 11 batters and striking out 45 in 46 innings, and he has not failed to pitch seven complete innings in any SEC start this year. The success in the SEC has allowed Bumstead to lower his season ERA from 6.06 to 3.90, while staying tied for the team lead in wins with Bo Pettit at seven.

Pettit struggles early, dominates late

If LSU's Bo Pettit could only duplicate his late game success early in a game, the Tigers would be double dangerous.

In the first inning this year, Pettit has given up 13 earned runs on 11 hits for a 13.00 ERA, including four runs in the first in each of his last two starts against Vanderbilt and Tennessee.

But get him deep into a game, and he's nearly unbeatable. From the fifth inning through the ninth, Pettit has a 1.50 ERA, giving up just five runs in 30 combined innings.

Nonetheless, Pettit is tied with Nate Bumstead for the team lead with a 7-1 record, and Pettit last Saturday became the 10th LSU pitcher to win 25 career games by defeating Tennessee.



Patterson not cooling off

LSU outfielder Ryan Patterson was named SEC Player of the Week on Monday after batting .632 in the Tigers' four games last week, but the Texan certainly isn't letting any of that success go to his head.

Patterson has been consistent as always, launching a two-run home run on Tuesday against Tulane in the Superdome, and adding a base hit and a sacrifice fly on Wednesday vs. UNO to give him an eight-game hitting streak, the longest of his career. Patterson had three streaks of six games at various times this year, but could never extend the streak past that until now.

In the Tigers' last 10 games, Patterson is batting .452 (19-for-42) with three home runs, 15 RBI, 13 runs scored and an .810 slugging percentage. He finished April tied with Jon Zeringue as the Tigers' leading hitter in the month at .400, and for the year, Patterson stands at .358, just behind Clay Harris (.384) and Aaron Hill (.365). Patterson is also among the league's top hitters in SEC games, batting .393 with five home runs.

Patterson also continues to be the man the Tigers want up in the clutch, as Patterson leads the Tigers with a .467 average with runners in scoring position, a number that jumps to .520 in SEC games.

Holt showing patience, picking up the pace

Earlier this year, it appeared as if J.C. Holt was on pace to set a new record, as the LSU center fielder seemed ready to break the school record of 77 strikeouts in a season set by Gary Hymel in 1991. Hymel, the 1991 College World Series Most Outstanding Player, achieved that feat in 73 games as the Tigers won their first national championship; Holt looked like he would do it in only 50 games.

But as the calendar turns to May, Holt has shown the patience and stroke that made him a freshman All-American in 2002.

Holt collected three hits in Wednesday's win over UNO, his first three-hit game since he had back-to-back three hit outings vs. Centenary and Kansas in February. Holt is 8-for-16 in the Tigers' last five games, raising his season average by 28 points to .274. The speedy sophomore also leads LSU with 10 stolen bases, and has been caught only twice. Holt fanned just eight times in April after striking out 32 times in February and March.

That speed has been used well in the outfield, as he has accepted all 65 chances hit at him without an error this year, one of eight SEC players with a perfect fielding percentage.

Holt has been playing exclusively vs. right-handed pitchers for the last month, but given his speed, he may see more regular action in the lineup, as was the case during the 2002 stretch run.

Patterson, Zeringue go back-to-back

One bright spot for LSU in the Superdome came in the fifth inning when Ryan Patterson and Jon Zeringue showed their home run strokes by hitting back-to-back shots to pull the Tigers to within 6-4.

For Patterson, his two-run blast was his 10th of the year, tying him with Clay Harris for the team lead and giving the Tigers two players in double figures for home run, something LSU didn't have in 2002, when Matt Heath led the team with 10 home runs.

Zeringue immediately followed Patterson by launching a frozen rope into the left-center field seats for his ninth home run of the year, but his first since April 12 vs. Ole Miss.

The back-to-back home runs were the Tigers' second such occurrence this year, and fittingly, Patterson was also involved in the first incidence, teaming up with Matt Liuzza to launch consecutive home runs in the fourth inning at Georgia on March 21.

Last year, Jason Columbus and Chris Phillips hit back-to-back shots in the Superdome as part of a three-homer inning in LSU's 9-5 triumph.

Zeringue caps best month of career

If anybody was a betting man put money on Jon Zeringue having the kind of turnaround he's had in the last month and a half, that person would probably be rich, because the odds were against the LSU sophomore outfielder.

But Zeringue finished April with an even .400 average, scoring 15 runs and driving in 12, as he heads into the Mississippi St. series with a solid .324 season average.

Since his return to the lineup on March 22, Zeringue is batting .385 (37-for-96) with eight home runs and 21 RBI, as he has raised his average by 120 points from where it was before his reinstatement, a low .204.

Zeringue has been even hotter in his last 12 games, batting .415 (22-for-53) and collecting hits in 11 of those games, including a four-hit game and a pair of three-hit games.

Hill looks to pull out of slight slump

Every good hitter will have his valleys along with the peaks, and LSU shortstop Aaron Hill is right now stuck in one of those valleys, but given his history, the valley is not deep.

In the Tigers' last five games, Hill is batting just .217 (5-for-23), but during his last slump, when he was 4-for-27, he pulled out of it by going 5-for-5 and hitting for the cycle, launching an eight-game hitting streak during which Hill batted .594 (19-for-32). Hill is batting .415 in SEC games, tied for tops on the team with Clay Harris.

Gill's streak reaches an even dozen

LSU second baseman Blake Gill continues to show his consistency, and has been rewarded with a 12-game hitting streak heading into this weekend's series at Mississippi St.

Gill kept the streak alive in the fifth inning on Wednesday with a laser beam that UNO third baseman Austin Wasserman couldn't handle, contributing to a four-run uprising that broke open a 2-2 tie.

Gill is hitting .388 (19-for-49) during the streak, and although he has collected just one hit in each of the last five games, he has five two-hit games and a three-hit game during the streak, giving him a team high 19 multi-hit games on the year.

During the streak, Gill has raised his season batting average by 31 points from .283 to .314, the highest it has been since mid-February.

Gill finished April with a solid .357 average, driving in 15 runs and scoring 13 times. The Florida native continues to be one of the best two-out run producers in the SEC, collecting a team high 20 RBI with two outs on the year.

Sprowl setting the table quite well

Sophomore outfielder Bruce Sprowl continues to be the rock of stability at the top of the LSU lineup, carrying a .314 batting average and a nine-game hitting streak into the weekend in Starkville.

Sprowl has picked up his game in particularly the last three games, collecting six hits in 11 at-bats and driving in a pair of runs. Sprowl also hit his first home run in and LSU uniform in the first inning of the opener of the Tennessee series last Friday.

Sprowl, who also had a nine-game hitting streak earlier in the season, is batting .342 (13-for-38) during the current streak. The Knoxville native has also been a pleasant surprise vs. left-handed pitchers, batting .314 vs. southpaws, the highest mark among LSU left-handed hitters on the year.

Naccarata collects RBI in bunches

Ivan Naccarata continued to show his value against right-handed pitchers on Wednesday with his two-run triple vs. UNO that broke open the game. Naccarata is batting a solid .376 vs. right-handers this year, compared to .200 vs. left-handers.

There is one surprising statistics Naccarata leads LSU in, and that's multiple-RBI games. The Canadian has seven games with two RBI and five games with three RBI, accounting for 29 of his 37 RBI on the year. Naccarata is one of five LSU players with 10 multi-RBI games on the year.

Tigers look to stay on SEC scoring binge

LSU enters this weekend's series at Mississippi St. on a scoring binge, having tallied 10 or more runs in all three games of the Tennessee series, marking the third time in the program's 110-year history LSU has scored in double figures in all three games of a conference series, joining series vs. Georgia in 1996 and Arkansas in 2000.

The record for consecutive 10-run games in SEC play is five, done by the 2000 team—one at Auburn, three vs. Arkansas and one at Florida.

In 21 SEC games this year, LSU has scored 10 or more runs 10 times, including back-to-back jobs against Georgia, Alabama and Ole Miss, in addition to the Tennessee binge. LSU is just two games shy of tying the school record for most 10-run games in an SEC season, which was 12 by the 2000 national championship team.

Continuing the streak of 10-run games will be tough, though, as Mississippi St. boasts the SEC's number one ERA at 3.27, although the Bulldogs allowed games of 14 and 13 runs to Florida this past weekend in Gainesville.

Tigers look to keep hot in the clutch

LSU put on a clinic in clutch hitting in last weekend's series against Tennessee, both with runners in scoring position and with two out.

In the three-game sweep of the Volunteers, LSU batted a remarkable .490 (24-for-49) in RISP situations, with 24 of the Tigers' 47 hits in the series coming with RBI opportunities. Ryan Patterson (6-for-8) and Clay Harris (4-for-5), both of whom are batting over .500 with RISP in SEC games, were leaders of an offensive that seemed to deliver every key hit whenever it was needed.

In SEC games this year, LSU is batting .341 with RISP situations, second only to Florida's .352 mark with RBI opportunities, and for the year, LSU stands at a solid .317, about where the Tigers ended the 2002 season (.313).

With two out, LSU was even deadlier, batting .386 (17-for-44) against the Volunteers and driving in an incredible 25 runs with the end of an inning looming. The Tigers scored a total of 28 of their 42 runs, or two out of every three, with two out. Harris (6) and Patterson (5) were again the big culprits, although six other Tigers had at least a pair of two-out RBI.

LSU's two-out prowess in the SEC is staggering, batting .327 and driving in 77 runs with two out. The staggering part is that no other team is batting above .287 in conference games with two out, while no other team is within 21 two-out RBI of the Tigers. For the full season, LSU has collected 127 two-out RBI despite batting .293 in those situations.

LSU also is the top hitting team in SEC games with runners in scoring position (.341), with two out (.326) and two-out RBI (77), and has advanced runners more often (51.3%) than any other team in the conference.

Tigers look to avoid top 10 letdown

LSU is hoping that this weekend's series at Mississippi St. won't be a repeat of what happened the last time LSU had ascended to the top 10 of the Baseball America rankings.

That came two weeks ago, when LSU moved up to No. 8 in the magazine's poll, only to lose two at Vanderbilt and tumble all the way to 13th. LSU was back in the top 10 after going 4-0 last week, winning a midweek game with Southeastern Louisiana before sweeping Tennessee.

The Tigers were ranked eighth by Baseball America on February 10, but suffered a three-game sweep to Kansas to fall to 14th, and the Tigers didn't return for nearly two months.

Speaking of Baseball America, the magazine's senior writer for college baseball, John Manuel, was in attendance at the Superdome, marking Manuel's first appearance at an LSU regular season game. Manuel was also part of the pre-game show on College Sports Television from the floor of the Superdome.

LSU enters the weekend ranked sixth by Collegiate Baseball, matching the Tigers' highest ranking in the newspaper's poll. LSU was sixth in the pre-season through February 10 before falling to 14th after the Kansas series. The Tigers are also 12th in the ESPN/USA Today coaches' poll.

Mississippi St. enters the weekend ranked 16th by Baseball America, 18th by ESPN/USA Today and 19th by Collegiate Baseball.

Tigers looking to avoid DP syndrome

Unfortunately, there is one negative statistic LSU leads the SEC in, as the Tigers have grounded into 45 double plays this season and hit into a total of 51 in 46 games. The Tigers grounded into 49 double plays and hit into a total of 60 in 66 games in the 2002 season.

LSU, meanwhile, has turned only 42 double plays this year, way down from the SEC leading 73 turned in 2002. Below is a breakdown of how those double plays have been turned this year:

May 2 in LSU baseball history

2000—LSU wastes a strong starting outing by Hunter Gomez, as McNeese St. wins with an 11th-inning single by Nolan Parker for a 4-3 victory in Lake Charles. Gomez gives up just two runs (one earned) and strikes out eight in seven-plus innings, but give up three runs in the eighth and ninth innings to tie the game.

1999—Brad Cresse smacks two home runs and drives in five runs in the sixth and seventh innings as the Tigers complete a three-game sweep of Auburn at home with an 11-2 victory. Cresse is named SEC Player of the Week for his efforts in the Auburn series.

1998—Eddy Furniss' grand slam in the bottom of the ninth lifts LSU to a 15-12 win over Tennessee in a crazy game that saw the Volunteers scored eight runs in the eighth inning to overcome a 10-3 deficit. The grand slam is the only bases-loaded home run of the SEC career leading 80 Furniss hit in four years at LSU.

1997—LSU falls behind Arkansas 6-1 through three innings, but the Tigers rally and eventually storm back for six runs in the eighth inning to go on to a 13-8 win in Fayetteville.

1995—In what will be the Tigers' last game in a stretch of eight games in eight days, LSU defeats Nicholls St. 9-1 in Baton Rouge.

LSU Coach Smoke Laval

Smoke Laval had a very successful first year as LSU's coach, leading the Tigers to the NCAA Super Regional round for the fourth consecutive year and posting a 44-22 record. For his efforts, Laval was named the Louisiana Sportswriters' Association Louisiana coach of the year.

Laval was named Skip Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, and spent the 2001 season as the LSU administrative assistant. From 1994-2000, Laval coached for seven years at Louisiana-Monroe, guiding the Indians to three NCAA regional berths (1995, 1999, 2000) and a 241-159 mark. Among Laval's pupils at ULM was Ben Sheets, a 2000 member of the United States Olympic gold medal team and a 2001 major league all-star with the Milwaukee Brewers.

Laval was Bertman's top assistant at LSU from 1984-1993, helping the Tigers reach the College World series six times and win the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval was also a graduate assistant at LSU under Jack Lamabe in 1979 and an assistant at Florida in 1982 and 1983.

On deck for next week

The Tigers continue their grueling run toward an SEC championship and play their final midweek game of 2003 as May heats up.

The midweek game wasn't originally on the Tigers' schedule, but LSU coach Smoke Laval scheduled Tuesday's contest with Loyola of New Orleans as a make-up game for the March 18 game at Southern that got rained out in the middle of the fifth inning, three outs before it could become official. The game, which is not part of the Tigers' season ticket plan, has been designated as "Fan Appreciation Night", with \$3 general admission tickets and numerous giveaways.

Loyola is an NAIA school, so the game will not count towards the computation of LSU's RPI for the NCAA Tournament. It will likely be a game where several reserves will get significant playing time, and where any kinks can be ironed out before the post-season.

Then again, the Tigers will need to be ready next weekend for an invasion by the Auburn Tigers in what could be the series that determines the SEC champion. The LSU-Auburn series has been quirky in that the road team has usually had success, as the visiting team has won the last three series, including the Tigers' 2-1 series win at Plainsman Park last year.

In 2001, Auburn came to The Box for Skip Bertman's final regular season series and got pounded in the first game, 20-5. But Auburn rallied to take the final two games of the series, 7-5 and 9-7, to claim the final spot in the SEC Tournament over archrival Alabama.

The finale of the Auburn game is also the regular season home finale. Senior Day is sure to be bittersweet for those seniors leaving the Tiger program, as the one player who meant so much to the LSU program who would have been a senior in 2003, Wally Pontiff, is sadly no longer with us.
