# ARKANSAS STATE FOOTBALL NOTES

ASU Head Coach Steve Roberts - Now in his third season as coach of the Indians and his 11th overall. Since taking over the reins of the Tribe, Roberts has led the Indians to 11 total wins in consecutive seasons, the best such mark in two straight years since the 1987 and '88 seasons. The Indians have won six Division 1-A games in two-plus seasons under Roberts, nearing the nine won in the prior five years.

Roberts and his staff are credited with one of the most impressive turnarounds in the nation in 2002, taking ASU from 2-9 in 2001 to 6-7 and just 11 points from a trip to the New Orleans Bowl.

Roberts started his career with a bang at ASU, winning the most games (6) in his first season at ASU as head coach since Gene Harlow went 6-3 in his first season in 1955.

Among his many accolades, Roberts has been a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award while at Northwestern (La.) State and was named the Gulf South Conference's Coach of the Year while at Southern Arkansas.

His teams have always fared well in the classroom, not just on the field, as evidenced by ASU being awarded a plaque for the top grade point average among all football programs in the Sun Belt Conference for the 2002-03 academic year.

## The Series:

ASU and LSU have met twice on the grid-iron, both resulting in lopsided victories for the Tigers. The two first met in 1991, when ASU was in the last season of 1-AA status, a game that LSU won, 70-14. The other meeting was in 1998, a game that ended in a 42-6 final score. Like this season, LSU was a top-10 team in 1998. In that game, ASU started the third-string tailback and was held to five total first downs.

**LSU head coach Nick Saban** : In his fifth season as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban is coming off a dream season in which LSU won a share of the national title after defeating Oklahoma. Saban's record at LSU is 40-13, including last season's 13-1 record. Overall, Saban totes a career record of 83-39-1 in his 11th season of being a head coach. The Indians have never faced a team coached by Saban.

**Sun Belt Conference** - The fledgling Sun Belt Conference football league is entering the fourth season of existence, and already the league is making waves among the college football ranks. Claiming wins over teams in the Big 12, SEC, WAC, Conference-USA and the Mountain West, the conference is establishing itself as an up-and-comer in the 1-A pool. This season, the conference will feature nine football teams. ASU, Idaho, Louisiana-Lafayette, Louisiana-Monroe, Middle Tennessee, New Mexico State and Utah State return from 2003 and Troy University makes its debut in the conference this season. Next season, UI, NMSU and USU are moving to the Western Athletic Conference, leaving the door open for Florida Atlantic and Florida International to enter into the mix as SBC newcomers.

**Preseason Predictions** - The Indians were selected to finish seventh in the conference in the preseason media and coaches poll. Three-time champion North Texas is once again picked on top, while newcomer Troy makes a bold charge into second in its first season as a conference member. New Mexico State is third, followed by UL-Lafayette, Middle Tennessee, Utah State, ASU, UL-Monroe and Idaho.

Two seasons ago, the Indians were picked to finish last (seventh) in the Sun Belt Conference preseason poll. That was head coach Steve Roberts' first season at the helm. The Indians went 6-7 overall that season, 3-3 in conference play, and finished third in the standings. Amazingly enough, ASU was just 11 points away from going undefeated in conference play that season (2002).

# 2004 Indian Football ~ Game 2 vs. LSU

**Fresh Faces** - The Indians are very inexperienced for the 2004 season. On a roster that features 97 players, 77 of those players have lettered one year or less at ASU. That represents 79-percent of the total number of Indians on the roster for the 2004 season. The good news is that 54 of those players are sophomores or freshmen, meaning that the future of ASU looks bright.

**Tough Schedule** - ASU features one of the most challenging non-conference schedules in the nation in 2004. The combined winning percentage of ASU's non-conference foes (2003 numbers) is a whopping 75.5-percent to rank fourth nationally. Only Oregon State (82.9), Iowa State (78.9) and Cincinnati (76.9) non-conference opponents have a higher winning percentage. (Thanks for the numbers, Chris Burkhalter - Houston SID)

According to CollegeFootballNews.com, ASU's non-conference strength of schedule is third nationally, behind only Houston and Southern Miss. This season is the first since ASU returned to 1-A status in 1992 that the schedule has featured three consecutive bowl teams to start the season.

**Big Game Hunting** - It may or may not have ever been done before, but ASU's schedule starts off against the Tigers, Tigers and Tigers. That's right, the Indians faced the Missouri Tigers and still have the LSU Tigers and Memphis Tigers in straight weeks. Another common denominator of those three teams? All three were bowl participants last season and are picked preseason in the top-35 of the country again this season and are predicted to return to bowl games.

**(West) LA Story** - The Indian coaching staff has created a pipeline to West LA Community College in the most recent recruiting class. Quarterback Devin Hollins, DB James Johnson, WR Jeff Johnson and DB Josh Powell all came to ASU from West LA.

**Road Warriors Again** - ASU will have only four games this season in the state of Arkansas. That is the first time since 1994 that ASU has not played at least five games in the state. This season also marks the ninth consecutive year that ASU will open the season on the road. The other opponents during this streak? BYU, Georgia (twice), Minnesota, Illinois, North Carolina State, Virginia Tech and Texas A&M. The last time ASU opened the season at home was in 1995. That also happens to be the last time ASU posted a winning season.

**Little's Foot** - Punter Jarod Little, now a sophomore on scholarship, began his true freshman season last year at ASU in grand fashion, in front of 75,804 at Texas A&M. He went on to produce the single-best punting numbers by a freshman at ASU in school history, surpassing current NFL punter Kyle Richardson's freshman campaign. Little was twice named the Sun Belt Conference's Special Teams Player of the Week last year for his efforts.

**New Look To Football Facility** - Longtime Northeast Arkansas philanthropists Boe and Myrna Adams contributed \$250,000 to help upgrade the Arkansas State football strength and conditioning room this spring. The facility has been named the Boe and Myrna Adams Strength and Conditioning Complex in honor of the generous gift.

**Honoring Larry Lacewell** - An all-star gala designed to honor former ASU head football coach Larry Lacewell was a huge success this May. Lacewell, who also served as Athletic Director during his tenure and as an assistant coach before that, was on hand as the new locker room at the Football Complex was dedicated in his honor. Lacewell is currently serving in an administrative capacity for the Dallas Cowboys organization. In attendance at the event were Cowboys' owner Jerry Jones, former Heisman Trophy winner Billy Sims, Barry Switzer, former Indian and current Cowboy offensive coordinator Maurice Carthon and current Auburn head coach and former ASU assistant coach Tommy Tuberville. More than \$60,000 was raised at the event to help with renovation projects, and then in a surprising move, Jones and the Cowboys matched the funds.

**Warren First Indian Honored** - In his first collegiate game as a kick returner, running back Antonio Warren was named the Sun Belt Conference's Special Teams Player of the Week (on 9-6) for his five return, 128-yard effort. The yardage total ranks fifth all-time at ASU for a single game and he helped the Indians to 210 total kick return yards, the third-best total in school history. Warren becomes the first Indians to be picked by the SBC voters for a weekly honor.



**Stand On 20** - The Indians are an impressive 10-2 under Steve Roberts when scoring at least 20 points in a game. The only two losses were against New Mexico State in 2002, a 26-21 defeat, and the season-opening loss this season to Missouri, 52-20.

**LA Guns** - The rock group Guns-N-Roses (originally named LA Guns) had a popular song, "Welcome to the Jungle", more than a decade ago. ASU's quarterbacks has given that song (and band name) to a new level this season. The two lead a rejuvenated Indian passing game that showed promise at the first jungle against the Tigers of Missouri. Combined, Nick Noce and Devin Hollins threw for 350-yards in the opener, the fourth-best team total in school history. Both quarterbacks hail from the Los Angeles area, Noce from Ben Lomond and Hollins from Los Angeles, ironically.

**...And They Taketh Away** - ASU's defense enters the 2004 season on a bit of a roll in the turnover department. The Tribe "D" has forced at least one turnover in each of the last 20 games.

**Glad To Have Them** - Two members of the ASU athletic staff were honored in New Orleans this summer at the All-American Football Foundation's 62nd Banquet of Champions. Recognized were current head athletic trainer Ron Carroll and former equipment supervisor and now Assistant AD for Facilities and Event Management Randy Knowles. Carroll, now in his 29th season at ASU as head athletic trainer, received the Outstanding Trainer Award, while Knowles received the award as the Outstanding Football Equipment Manager.

**Searching For Rare Gems** - The last time ASU won a non-conference road game was in 1998, when the Indians downed the Rainbow Warriors at Hawai'i. In fact the Indians have won just two non-conference road games since returning to 1-A in 1992. The other win was at Louisiana-Lafayette (then Southwestern Louisiana) in 1992. The Indians did manage to tie at Mississippi State in 1993.

**Vote For Me!** - For the second straight season, head coach Steve Roberts will be a voting member of the ESPN/USA Today Coaches Poll. A total of 63 coaches participate in the voting process. Roberts was asked to participate last season, as well.

## Smoke Signals

Freshman quarterback Travis Hewitt's father is the equipment supervisor for the St. Louis Rams.

Quarterback Brian Hicks was drafted out of high school by the Minnesota Twins organization and played baseball before coming to ASU.

Receiver Jerome Stegall has 61 career receptions, placing him 12th in school history for career grabs and needs just seven more to move into tenth. Teammate Chuck Walker is just one reception behind Stegall, at 60.

Running back Antonio Warren needs just 57-yards rushing to reach the 1,000-yard mark in his career.

Star running back Chris Easley will miss most if not all of the 2004 season after suffering a knee injury during spring drills.

Placekicker Eric Neihouse has hit 19 consecutive PAT's dating back to the 2003 season. He had a streak of 34 consecutive makes end against Memphis last season when the Tigers blocked his second attempt of the day. Overall, Neihouse has been remarkably reliable at PAT's, hitting 64 of his 65 attempts.

Cornerback Chris Jones returned this season after suffering a horrific knee injury in 2002 against Middle Tennessee on a non-contact play. Jones needed all of 2003 to rehab his shredded knee and returned in the

Offensive lineman Steven Gibbs doubles as a weight thrower on the track and field team. He threw the shot, discus and hammer throw in the Sun Belt Conference indoor and outdoor championships.

A total of 14 of ASU's 22 players listed on the defensive depth chart saw their first action as 1-A football players. Of those, six started their first collegiate game. The offensive side of the ball started three first-timers as well. In all, 15 players on the defensive side of the ball saw their first game action and eight on offense.

A new record could occur for the Indians by the time all fans take their seats at Baton Rouge. The current record for the largest crowd to ever see ASU play is 86,520 when the Tribe faced Georgia in 2001. Tiger Stadium holds 91,600, a number that could very easily be reached this Saturday.

ASU's game against LSU will be televised live over the internet as a pay-per-view event. The internet broadcast is limited to fans in the states of Louisiana and Arkansas and costs \$14.95.
