Tigers Face Florida in SEC Tournament Opening Game



LSU (41-15, 18-12) begins postseason play against Florida (38-18, 17-13) on Wednesday in the opening game of the 2004 SEC Tournament at the Hoover Met in Birmingham, Ala.

First pitch is scheduled for 10 a.m. with the winner advancing to face the winner of Game 2 between Vanderbilt and Georgia on Thursday at 5 p.m. The loser will face elimination on Thursday, looking to keep its tournament hopes

alive against the loser of Game 2, beginning at 10 a.m. Thursday.

The Tigers (No. 3 Baseball America, No. 11 Collegiate Baseball, No. 5 ESPN/Sports Weekly) enter the tournament as the No. 3 seed and finished in a second-place tie with Ole Miss in the SEC Western Division.

For the sixth time in 10 Southeastern Conference series, LSU rebounded to capture the final two games of a weekend set after dropping the opener as the Tigers pounded Ole Miss this past Saturday and Sunday by scores of 11-4 and 14-6.

The Gators (No. 21 Baseball America and ESPN/Sports Weekly, No. 25 Collegiate Baseball) dropped two of three from Tennessee this past weekend at Knoxville, enabling the Volunteers to sneak into the SEC Tournament as the eighth and final seed. Florida salvaged the series finale on Sunday with a 5-3 win.

LSU head coach Smoke Laval will send sophomore right-hander Justin Meier (5-2, 4.01) to the mound on Wednesday, while the Gators have yet to announce a starter.

Meier, a native of Windermere, Fla., will look to regain his early season form as he has struggled in his past two starts. After winning four out of his first five games, Meier has suffered one loss and nine no decisions in his last 10 appearances. In his last outing on May 15, he registered a no decision in four innings against Vanderbilt, allowing four runs (three earned) on nine hits.

The LSU-Florida Series

LSU holds a 45-24-1 (.650) advantage against the Gators, dating back to 1971. LSU head coach Smoke Laval is 4-1-1 all-time versus Florida, while Gators skipper Pat McMahon is 9-12-1 against the Tigers. The two teams did not meet during the 2004 regular season. LSU took two out of three in 2003, blanking the SEC Eastern Division foe 9-0 in Game 1 and taking Game 2 by a score of 3-2 after rallying from a 2-0 deficit. The two teams battled to an 8-8 tie in Game 3 as Florida knotted the contest with a three-run eighth. The game was shortened due to the Gators' travel plans.

LSU holds a slim 8-6 advantage against UF in postseason play with four of the wins coming against the Gators in the College World Series. In 1991, the Tigers swept two games from UF en route to their first national championship. In 1996, LSU took two more knocking off the Gators in back-to-back games before defeating Miami (Fla.) for their third national championship.

UF leads 7-4 in SEC Tournament games between the schools, but the Tigers have won the last two meetings in tournament play, including a 10-0 decision in 2001 and a 9-6 victory in the 2000 SEC Tournament championship game.

In the Polls

The Tigers moved up one spot to No. 3 in Baseball America after winning two of three from ninth-ranked Ole Miss last weekend. It marked the sixth time they have held the No. 3 ranking in the magazine's poll this season. LSU dropped to No. 11 in Collegiate Baseball, its second lowest ranking of the season in the respective poll. They held steady at No. 5 for the fourth consecutive week in the ESPN/Sports Weekly poll.

The Hoover Met

The 2004 SEC Tournament returns to Birmingham's Hoover Metropolitan Stadium for the seventh consecutive year and for the ninth time in the event's history. Last year, the tournament attracted 122,393 fans for the five-day, 13-game event. The total attendance was the second largest in tournament history, and the championship game attendance (11,705) between LSU and Alabama was the third highest among SEC Tournament title games. This will mark the seventh year the tournament has been contested under the "Omaha" format with the tournament champion earning the SEC's automatic berth to the 64-team NCAA Tournament field. Home of the Birmingham Barons, the Chicago White Sox Double-A affiliate, the Hoover Met enters its 17th season of use and has hosted the SEC Tournament in 1990, 1996 and 1998-2003.

Patterson Named SEC Player of the Week - May 24

Junior right-fielder **Ryan Patterson** was named SEC Player of the Week for his efforts against Ole Miss last weekend, the league office announced on Monday. Patterson, a junior from Rowlett, Texas, hit .467 (7-for-15) with one double, three homers, six RBI and four runs to lead LSU to a series victory over the Rebels. A 2003 first-team all-SEC selection, he collected 17 total bases against the Rebels for a 1.133 slugging percentage, and he posted a .500 on-base percentage. Patterson, who has a team-high 13 homers on the year, led the Tigers to a 14-6 Game 3 victory, as he was 4-for-5 at the plate with two homers, two runs and a career-best five RBI. The effort marked the first two-homer game of Patterson's LSU career.

Notables From Last Weekend's Ole Miss Series

- LSU concluded the regular season with a series victory at ninth-ranked Ole Miss, as the Tigers won their ninth SEC series in 10 weekends. LSU has also won 11 of its last 12 league series, dating back to last season. The Tigers completed the regular season in second place in the Western Division, just one game behind Arkansas (19-11) and Georgia (19-11) in the overall SEC race.
- The Tigers won all five of their SEC road series this season, including four against teams ranked at the time of the series -- South Carolina, Auburn, Tennessee and Ole Miss.
- The Tigers' 41-15 regular-season record is the best by an LSU team since the 1998 club also posted a 41-15 mark heading into the postseason. LSU reached the 40-win plateau for the 16th straight season, as the Tigers have recorded at least 40 wins each year since 1989.
- LSU batted a phenomenal .405 (49-for-121) in last weekend's series at Ole Miss with 12 doubles, six homers, a .450 on-base percentage and a .653 slugging percentage.
- LSU completed the regular season as the top offensive club in the SEC, batting .337 (694-for-2060) as a team with 130 doubles, 14 triples, 73 homers and 461 runs.
- Center fielder **J.C. Holt** hit .533 (8-for-15) in the Ole Miss series with one double, six RBI and two runs. Left fielder **Ryan Patterson** hit .467 (7-for-15) with one double, three homers, six RBI and four runs. Patterson, who has a team-high 13 homers on the year, led the Tigers to a 14-6 Game 3 victory, as he was 4-for-5 at the plate with two homers, two runs and a career-best five RBI. The effort marked the first two-homer game of Patterson's LSU career. Designated hitter **Nick Stavinoha** provided two doubles and two homers in the series, and third baseman **Clay Harris** drove in five runs with three doubles and a homer.
- Right-hander **Nate Bumstead** earned his team-best ninth win of the year in Game 2, limiting the Rebels to one earned run on six hits in 7.2 innings with three walks and six strikeouts.
- Though he was charged with the loss in Game 1, left-hander **Lane Mestepey** worked his first complete game in nearly two years. Mestepey, who missed last season due to shoulder surgery, pitched eight innings on Friday night, allowing six earned runs on 10 hits with one walk and five strikeouts. The outing was Mestepey's first complete game since June 1, 2002, when he went the distance versus UL-Lafayette in the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional.

LSU at the SEC Tournament Under Smoke Laval

Head coach **Smoke Laval** has guided the Tigers to a 5-3 record in SEC Tournament play in his first two seasons, including a championship game appearance in 2003. The 2003 Tigers, regular season champions, held on to defeat Arkansas 5-4 in the final game of day one. The contest, which started at 10:03 p.m., ended at 12:23 a.m. The following day, LSU blasted Mississippi State, 7-2, in the nightcap before defeating the Bulldogs again on Saturday, 17-5 in seven innings to reach the championship game. Right-hander **Nate Bumstead** hurled a complete game effort in Friday's contest, while righty **Bo Pettit** went the distance on Saturday. Alabama capitalized on three crucial Tiger errors to grab an early lead it would never relinquish in Sunday's championship game as the Crimson Tide defended their SEC Tournament championship with a 10-3 title game win.

Jon Zeringue Named to Golden Spikes Award Watch List

LSU outfielder **Jon Zeringue** is one of 30 players appearing on the 2004 Golden Spikes Award "Watch List." The Golden Spikes Award is presented annually by USA Baseball to the nation's outstanding amateur player. USA Baseball will announce its five finalists for the award in June. Former LSU pitcher **Ben McDonald** was the 1989 Golden Spikes Award recipient. Zeringue is also one of 30 semifinalists for the DickHowser Trophy, given to the top player in collegiate baseball by the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association and the St. Petersburg (Fla.) Area Chamber of Commerce. The 2004 winner will be announced on June 18 at the College World Series in Omaha, Neb. Former LSU first baseman **Eddy Furniss** received the Dick Howser Trophy in 1998. Zeringue, a junior from Thibodaux, La., is second in the Southeastern Conference in hitting with a .404 (88-for-218) batting average. He is ranked No. 4 in the SEC in on-base percentage (.460), No. 6 in slugging percentage (.661), No. 5 in total bases (144), No. 4 in hits (88), No. 7 in doubles (19), No. 11 in runs scored (52), and No. 12 in RBI (51). Zeringue is batting a remarkable .432 (51-for-118) in SEC games only with six doubles, one triple, seven homers, 26 RBI and 28 runs. LSU has had one Golden Spikes Award winner in his history -- right-handed pitcher Ben McDonald captured the award in 1989, the year he was the nation's No. 1 overall draft pick by the Baltimore Orioles.

Trio Produces Most Productive Outfield in the SEC

If statistics are indicative of the success of a team's performance, then the numbers tell the story when it comes to LSU's junior outfield trio of **Ryan Patterson, J.C. Holt** and **Jon Zeringue**. With all three carrying preseason All-American accolades by at least one publication, the trio has lived up to its billing registering the highest batting average (.385), most RBI (153) and most runs (179) among all outfielders in the SEC. All three share an overwhelming lead in RBI with the next-highest outfield (South Carolina) 25 RBI away. LSU holds an amazing 53-run advantage over Florida as the leader in runs. Patterson and Holt rank at the top of the conference in individual runs scored. Patterson, Holt and Zeringue also rank No. 2 in home runs (29) and No. 5 in stolen bases (27).

Dirks Named To Roger Clemens Award Watch List

Freshman left-hander **Clay Dirks'** name has been added to the "Watch List" for the 2004 Roger Clemens Award, which is given to the nation's outstanding collegiate pitcher. The "Cy Young Award" of college baseball, the Clemens Award ceremony will take place on July 15 in Houston. In a four-hit shutout of Tulane on March 2, Dirks allowed just two Green Wave runners to reach second base, and he retired 20 of the final 22 batters he faced. For that effort, Dirks was named the SEC Pitcher of the Week by the league office, and he earned National Pitcher of the Week recognition from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association. Dirks, a redshirt freshman from Hernando, Miss., allowed just one double and three singles against Tulane, and recorded one walk and seven strikeouts. Dirks, who was making just the third start of his collegiate career, missed the 2003 season after undergoing surgery on his elbow in the summer of 2002.

The LSU Injury Report

- **INF Bryan Harris** -- Harris, a transfer from Santa Ana (Calif.) College, was projected to be the Tigers' starter at third base; however, a hernia operation limited his participation during fall practice, and he underwent arthroscopic surgery in January to remove bone chips from his right knee. He is scheduled to receive a medical redshirt this season.

- **RHP Brandon Nall** -- LSU's closer at the beginning of 2003, he pitched in just six games last season before suffering a torn labrum in his shoulder, which required surgery. He could return to the mound at some point this season, depending upon the progress of his rehabilitation.

- **OF Quinn Stewart** -- A starter in 37 games last season, Stewart had the hamate bone in his left wrist removed in early March, and he will receive a redshirt this season. Even without the wrist injury, Stewart likely would have received a redshirt this year due to the tremendous depth LSU has in the outfield. With current starting outfielders Jon Zeringue, J.C. Holt and Ryan Patterson expected to be drafted this June, Stewart should be one of the outfield starters in 2005.

Patterson, Harris Earn Collegiate Baseball Pre-Season Recognition

LSU outfielder **Ryan Patterson** and first baseman **Clay Harris** were named to the 2004 Collegiate Baseball pre-season all-America team. Patterson, a junior from Rowlett, Texas, was voted to the first team. Harris, a junior from Slidell, La., was a third-team selection. Patterson earned first-team all-SEC honors last season as the Tigers' primary designated hitter, batting .350 (92-for-263) with 20 doubles, one triple, 16 homers and 51 RBI. He was voted to the NCAA Baton Rouge Regional all-tournament team, and he was named the state's Newcomer of the Year by the Louisiana Sportswriters Association. Harris, also a 2003 first-team all-SEC selection, tied Patterson for the team lead in home runs with 16. Harris hit .332 (70-for-211) with 16 doubles and 62 RBI, and he was voted second-team all-Louisiana by the LSWA.

Holt, Zeringue Receive Baseball America Pre-Season Accolades

LSU outfielders **Jon Zeringue** and **J.C. Holt** were named to the 2004 Baseball America pre-season all-America team. Zeringue, a junior from Thibodaux, La., was voted to the second team. Holt, a junior from Sieper, La., was a third-team selection. Zeringue earned second-team all-SEC honors last season as the Tigers' right fielder, batting .339 (77-for-227) with 15 doubles, 13 homers and 45 RBI. He was LSU's leading hitter during the second half of the season (34 games) with a .382 average. Holt, the 2003 NCAA Baton Rouge Regional Most Outstanding Player, hit .299 last season with 11 doubles, two triples, five homers, 36 RBI, 51 runs and 16 stolen bases. The Tigers' center fielder was also voted in August the MVP of the Cape Cod League, the wooden-bat summer league for the nation's top collegiate players. Holt batted a league-high .388 (52-for-134) in the CCBL with six doubles, one triple, one homer, 19 RBI, 25 runs and 13 steals.

Smoke Laval

HEAD COACH • THIRD YEAR

Raymond "Smoke" Laval enhanced his reputation as one of the country's top college baseball coaches, as, in just his second season at the helm of the LSU program, he guided the 2003 Tigers to the Southeastern Conference title -- LSU's first since 1997 -- and a berth in the College World Series.

Laval, the 2003 SEC Coach of the Year, directed LSU to a 45-22-1 overall record and a 20-9-1 conference mark, as the Tigers finished No. 5 in the final Baseball America rankings.

The magnificent '03 campaign augmented the success Laval enjoyed in his inaugural season as LSU's coach, as he led the 2002 Tigers to a 44-22 overall mark, an appearance in the NCAA Super Regional and a No. 11 final national ranking.

Laval, who served seven seasons (1994-2000) as the head coach at the University of Louisiana-Monroe, assumed control of the LSU program from Bertman, who led the Tigers to five NCAA championships and 11 College World Series appearances during an 18-year (1984-2001) tenure. Laval worked as Bertman's top assistant coach for 10 seasons (1984-93), helping lead LSU to its first two NCAA titles in 1991 and 1993. During Laval's 10 years as assistant coach, LSU posted a 483-182-1 record, won five SEC titles, appeared in six College World Series and captured two national championships.

Laval was known at LSU as one of the nation's best recruiters and brightest assistant coaches, as the Tigers reached the College World Series in only the third season (1986) of the Bertman-Laval regime. LSU followed the '86 CWS appearance with Omaha berths in 1987, 1989 and 1990 before the Tigers claimed the school's first baseball national title in 1991. After LSU captured its second NCAA crown in 1993, Laval departed Baton Rouge to become the head coach at Northeast Louisiana (now Louisiana-Monroe).

During his assistant coaching tenure at LSU, Laval -- who worked as the Tigers' primary recruiter - tutored 24 players who would eventually reach the major leagues. Some of the major leaguers with whom Laval worked include all-stars Albert Belle and Paul Byrd and first-round pick Todd Walker.

Laval compiled a 241-159 (.603) mark as the head coach at ULM, guiding the Indians to NCAA Regional appearances in 1995, 1999 and 2000.

Laval began his coaching career in 1977 as an assistant at Jacksonville University before moving to Wolfson High School in Jacksonville as a baseball and football coach. He served as a graduate assistant at LSU in 1979 under former Tiger head coach Jack Lamabe before working two years as an assistant at Gulf Coast Community College in Panama City, Fla.

Laval served as an assistant coach at Florida for two seasons (1982-83) before returning to LSU to work under Bertman.

Laval holds a bachelor's degree (1977) from Jacksonville in physical education and a master's degree (1979) from LSU in administration. The McDonald, Pa., native played two seasons at Gulf Coast Community College, where he lettered as a catcher. He completed his playing career at Jacksonville, where he led the ninth-ranked Dolphins in hitting at the 1976 NCAA South Regional.

Laval and his wife, Pam, are the parents of two children, Brandon and Jamie.

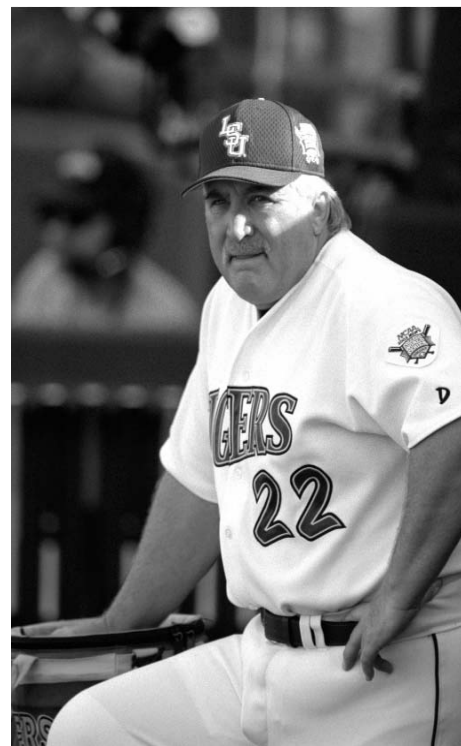
