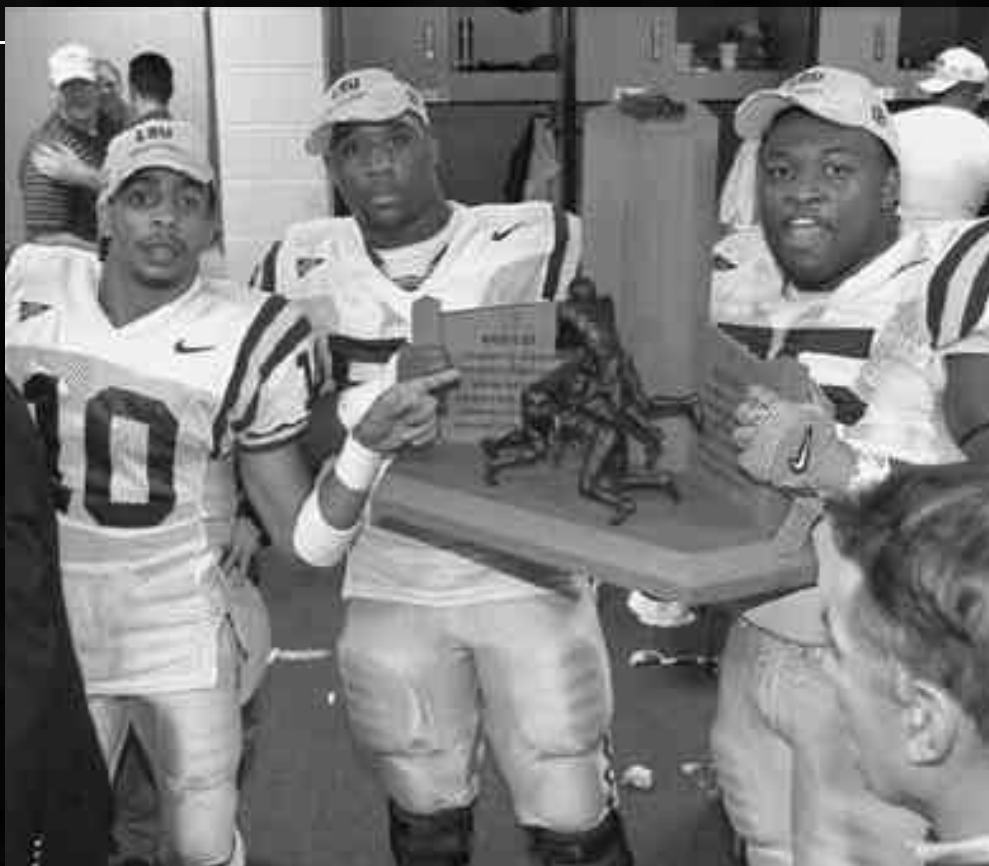

Bradie James and LaBrandon Toefield are back to lead the 2002 Tigers as LSU looks to defend its Southeastern Conference title. LSU returns 14 starters from last year's team that posted a 10-3 overall mark and beat No. 7 Illinois 47-34 in the Sugar Bowl.

James, considered by many to be one of the top defenders in the nation this season, registered 113 tackles in earning First-Team All-SEC honors last year. Toefield, also a First-Team All-SEC pick in 2001, rushed for 992 yards and tied an SEC mark with 19 rushing TDs for the Tigers.

In two years as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban has guided LSU to an 18-7 overall mark and to the 2001 SEC title. Now in his third year with the Tigers, Saban has his sights on making the Tigers a fixture among the nation's elite.

A freezing downpour outside the Louisiana Superdome opened the scoring floodgates on the turf for the Tigers. LSU, led by the passing of Rohan Davey, the receiving of All-American Josh Reed and the tenacity of Domanick Davis, steamrolled No. 7 Illinois for the school's first Sugar Bowl victory since 1968.

Head Coach Nick Saban led LSU to the school's first outright SEC title since 1986.

The primary logo (left), designed by Phoenix Design Works in New York, focuses on the three letters L-S-U. 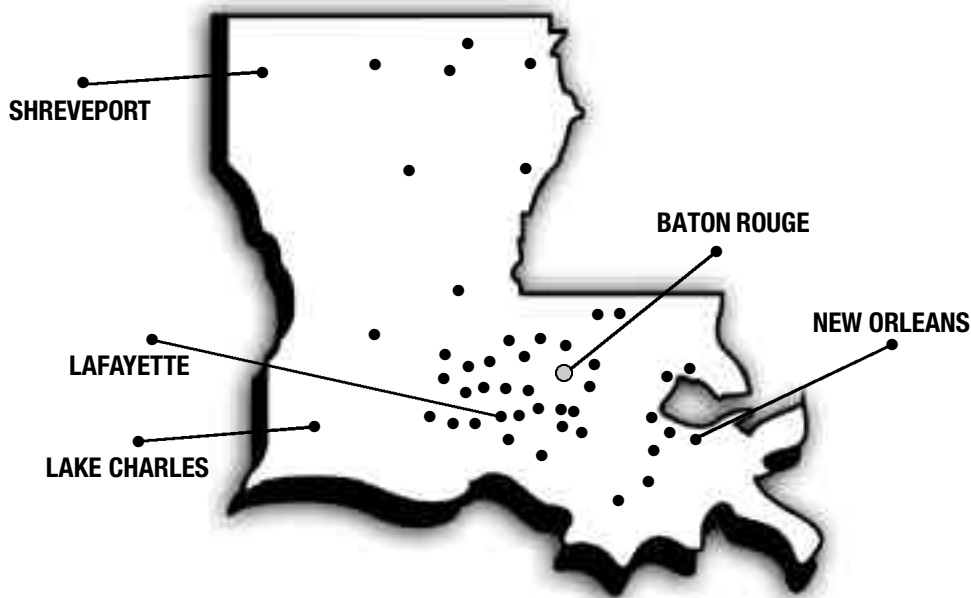

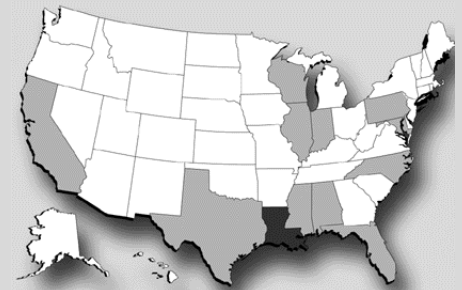

# 2002

TIGERS

Senior linebacker Bradie James and junior running back LaBrandon Toefield return to lead the Tigers as LSU looks to defend its Southeastern Conference title in 2002.

Last year, James earned First Team All-SEC honors after racking up 113 tackles during the regular season, while Toefield, also a First Team All-SEC pick, rushed for 992 yards and an SEC-record tying 19 TDs before going down with a season-ending knee injury in the league title game. Now, with Toefield completely healed going into fall camp, the Tigers look to pick up where the 2001 season left off as LSU heads into the 2002 campaign riding a six-game winning streak.

The Tigers returned to glory last year with a remarkable late season run that saw LSU knock off four straight ranked opponents, including No. 2 Tennessee in the SEC Championship game, on its way to a 10-3 overall mark.

As LSU heads into year three of the Nick Saban era, the foundation has been laid as the Tigers look to remain among the nation's elite.

### SPECIAL Teams

With its entire unit in place, LSU should be among the best in the nation in the area of special teams. Placekicker **John Corbello** returns for his senior season with 33 career field goals, while **Donnie Jones** is among the best punters in the nation with a career average of over 40 yards a kick. A pair of deep snappers in senior **Wendell York** and sophomore **Ben Wilkerson** is back to go along with holders **Blain Bech** and **Michael Clayton**. Throw in return specialists **Domanick Davis** and the Tigers have the making of what could be an outstanding season for the special teams.

#### Kick/Punt Returner Domanick Davis

5-10, 211, Sr.

One of the nation's top return specialist ... Doubles as LSU's backup running back ... Enters senior season ranked second in LSU history with 1,608 career kickoff return yards and fifth in school history with 627 career punt return yards ... Also had 1,125 career rushing yards ... Led SEC in punt returns in 2001 with 13.8 yards per return.

### THE Defense

LSU made its mark in the mid-to-late 80's as one of the stingiest defenses around. This year's LSU defense could be cut out of the same mold as the Tigers return six starters, including one of the nation's top all-around defenders in linebackers **Bradie James**. James, who has been named by several publications as a pre-season All-American, is expected to make a run at the Butkus Award this year as the nation's top linebacker.

James isn't alone on defense as the Tigers return a pair of starters up front in junior defensive tackle **Chad Lavalais** and senior defensive end **Kenderick Allen**. They will be joined in the lineup by senior defensive tackle **Byron Dawson**.

Sophomore **Marquise Hill** and **Marcus Spears** will also see plenty of action up front for the Tigers.

The linebacking corps, considered one of the nation's top units a year ago, returns a pair of starters in James and **Jeremy Lawrence**. With James moving to the Mike linebacker spot, sophomore **Lionel Turner** is expected to hold down the Will linebacker position.

The Tiger secondary may be the most experienced unit on defense for the Tigers as four players with starting experience return. Free safety **Damien James** and strong safety **Norman LeJeune** head the list of starters. Junior **Randall Gay** and senior **Demetrius Hookfin** give the Tigers a pair of experienced play makers on the corners.

#### Linebacker Bradie James

6-3, 238, Sr.

Enters final season with the Tigers as one of the nation's top defenders ... Named First Team All-SEC last year after registering 113 tackles and three sacks for the Tigers ... One of the leading candidates for the Butkus Award ... Has 264 career tackles and 11 sacks to his credit.



#### Defensive Tackle Chad Lavalais

6-3, 270, Jr.

Outstanding defensive lineman who combines speed and strength ... Has the ability to run down quarterbacks ... Pre-season All-SEC pick by several publications ... Started 12 of 13 games last year and finished with 53 tackles and one sack ... Has 75 career tackles, eight of those going for losses.



#### Free Safety Damien James

5-11, 191, Sr.

Talented free safety that can also play cornerback ... Led SEC with five interceptions last year ... Has a knack for coming up with the big play on defense ... Enters senior season with 100 career tackle and seven interceptions.

#### Punter Donnie Jones

6-3, 217, Jr.

Left-footed kicker who continues to improve ... Averaged 43.7 yards per punt last year ... Has tremendous hang time on kicks, one of the key reasons LSU ranked third in the SEC last year in net punting with a 39.6 average.

#### Place Kicker John Corbello

5-11, 220, Sr.

Strong-legged kicker who drilled 14 of 23 field goals last year ... Capped 2001 season by making three field goals of 45-yards or better in the SEC Championship game vs. Tennessee ... Made five of last seven field goals in 2001 ... Has converted 33 of 53 career field goals, 11 of which have come from at least 40-yards out.

## THE OFFENSE

Gone from last year's squad is SEC career receiving record holder Josh Reed along with record-setting quarterback Rohan Davey. However, the Tigers return six starters from last year's offense, including four from the offensive line, which averaged over 450 yards and nearly 33 points a contest.

Sophomore **Matt Mauck** heads into fall camp as LSU's starting quarterback. Mauck, who led LSU to the SEC title a year ago after taking over for an injured Davey in the second half against Tennessee, gives the Tigers a strong-armed quarterback with enough quickness to outrun defenders. Sophomore quarterback **Marcus Randall** injured his knee in the Spring Game last April and is expected to be back during the early portion of the schedule.

Game-breaker **Michael Clayton** returns for his sophomore season after catching 47 passes for 754 yards and six TDs last season, while seniors **Jerel Myers** (39 rec., 461 yards) and **Reggie Robinson** (31 rec., 391 yards in 2000) return to give the Tigers one of the nation's top receiving corps.

In the backfield, senior **Domanick Davis**, who set a Sugar Bowl record with four rushing TDs a year ago, will join **LaBrandon Toefield**. Redshirt freshman **Joseph Addai** is coming off an outstanding spring and will be counted on as well this year.

In the trenches, Freshman All-America center **Ben Wilkerson** will anchor an LSU offense line that also returns starters in guards **Stephen Peterman** and **Rob Sale** along with tackle **Rodney Reed**. Junior **Eric Edwards** will replace the departed Robert Royal at tight end, while **Kade Comeaux** and **Brad Smalling** head into fall camp battling for the final starting position on the offensive line.
