Third-Ranked Tigers Set For Battle With Eli and No. 15 Ole Miss in Oxford

LSU will put its No. 3 national ranking on the line on Saturday when the Tigers travel to face 15th-ranked Ole Miss at 2:30 p.m. in a game televised nationally by CBS. LSU, winners of four straight, stands at 9-1 overall and 5-1 in SEC action. LSU is off to its best start in 30 years when the Tigers won nine of their first 10 games in 1973. All four of LSU's victories during this 4-game stretch have come by at least 24 points, something that hasn't been done at LSU since 1911. Ole Miss, 8-2 overall and 6-0 in league play, has won six straight after opening 2-2. Saturday's game will mark the first time both teams enter the game ranked since 1970 when eighth-ranked LSU beat 16th-ranked Ole Miss, 61-17, in Baton Rouge in a nationally-televised game on ABC. This week's game will feature one of the nation's best defenses in LSU against one of the best passing attacks in the country in Eli Manning and Ole Miss. LSU enters the game allowing a national-best 8.9 points per game, while the Rebels are first in the SEC with 36.6 points per game. LSU is ranked fourth in the nation in total defense (259.7 yards per game), while the Rebels are first in the SEC with 459.6 yards of offense per game. The contest will also feature two of the league's top quarterbacks in Manning and LSU's Matt Mauck. Mauck leads the SEC in pass efficiency with a 154.1 rating, while Manning is second in the league with a 149.8 rating. Mauck has thrown for 2,175 yards and 21 TDs, while Manning leads the SEC in both categories with 2,881 yards and 23 TDs.

Tiger Defense Shuts Down Alabama, 27-3

Matt Mauck threw for 251 yards and 2 TDs and LSU's defense limited Alabama to only 65 yards rushing as the third-ranked Tigers dominated the Crimson Tide, 27-3. The Tigers jumped on Alabama early, taking a 10-0 lead on a 23-yard TD pass from Matt Mauck to Michael Clayton. The Tigers, who held the Crimson Tide without a first down in the first quarter, took a 17-0 lead late in the second quarter on a 3-yard TD pass from Mauck to Eric Edwards. The Tigers tacked on another score to run the margin to 24-0 on a 4-yard run by Alley Broussard midway through the third quarter. Chris Jackson added a 33-yard field goal for a 27-0 LSU lead before Alabama's Brian Bostick put the Crimson Tide's only points on the scoreboard with a 27-yard field goal with 6:39 left in the contest. For the game, LSU held Shaud Williams, the SEC's top rusher, to only 29 yards (85 yards below his season average of 114.0 per game). Michael Clayton led all LSU receivers with a career-best 12 catches for 130 yards and 1 score, while the Tigers got a balanced rushing attack with freshmen Justin Vincent rushing for 83 yards on 16 carries and Broussard 79 yards and 1 TD on 11 attempts.

Nick Saban

HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right leader to lead it. Entering his fourth year as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban is that leader.

Since taking over in Baton Rouge in 2000, Saban has transformed the LSU football program into one that wins championships, while graduating players at the same time.

Equipped with a plan that gives his players the best chance to be successful on the field as well as in the classroom, Saban's impact on the program has been immediate and it's been powerful.

In just three years as LSU's head coach, Saban's on-field success has been nothing short of remarkable, as he's guided the Tigers to 26 victories, a pair of bowl wins, including one in the Bowl Championship Series, and the 2001 Southeastern Conference title. The Tigers have also played in back-to-back New Year's Day bowls for the first time since the 1960s.

On top of LSU's success on the gridiron, the Tigers are being recognized for their efforts in the classroom. Currently, all 22 of the Tiger seniors from the 2002 team are on pace to graduate within the next 12 months, while Rodney Reed earned First Team Academic All-America honors and Bradie James was awarded an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship from the National Football Foundation last year.

Off the field, Saban and his players are active in the community, promoting goodwill by participating in such things as community service projects and visiting hospitals and schools in the Baton Rouge area on a regular basis. Saban has also worn the hat of fundraiser during his stay in Baton Rouge as he spearheaded an effort that raised more than \$15 million for a state-of-the-art academic center for student-athletes. The new Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is part of Saban's plan to give his players the best opportunity to be successful when they finish their football careers. The center, which spans 54,000 square feet, is the best of its kind and features 100 computers, a 1,000-seat auditorium, a library and a communications center for training student-athletes.

Saban became the 31st head coach of the LSU Tigers on November 30, 1999, after five years as head coach at Michigan State.

He didn't waste anytime making his impact felt as he guided a team coming off back-to-back losing seasons to an 8-4 mark and a win over 15th-ranked Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl in 2000 to rekindle the fire of a proud football tradition in Baton Rouge.

A year later in 2001, Saban guided the Tigers to their first outright SEC title since 1986 with a 31-20 win over second-ranked Tennessee in the SEC Championship game. LSU followed that with a 47-34 victory over Illinois in the Sugar Bowl to cap a 10-3 season for the Tigers.

Last year, Saban guided the Tigers to an 8-5 overall mark and a share of the SEC Western Division title. The Tigers also played in a New Year's Day bowl game for the second consecutive year, a first for LSU since the 1960's, with an appearance in the Cotton Bowl.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five seasons.

This Week

LSU returns to action on Saturday in Oxford, Miss., as the third-ranked Tigers travel to face 15th-ranked Ole Miss at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium. Kickoff for the contest is set for 2:30 p.m. and the game will be televised to a national audience by CBS. LSU enters the contest coming off a 27-3 road win over Alabama. At 9-1 overall, the Tigers are off to their best start in 30 years (LSU was 9-1 in 1973 after 10 games). In addition, LSU's 5-1 SEC mark is the best for the Tigers since winning five of their first six games in 1988. Ole Miss enters the game riding a 6-game winning streak as the Rebels stand at 8-2 overall and lead the SEC Western Division with a 6-0 mark.

In The Polls

The Tigers remained No. 3 in the nation in both the Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll on Sunday. The No. 3 ranking in consecutive weeks is the highest the Tigers have been ranked in back-to-back weeks since 1959 when LSU held down the No. 3 spot in the AP poll for the final three ranking periods. LSU is currently ranked among the top 10 in the AP poll for the ninth straight week, while they are in the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll top 10 for the 10th straight week. The Tigers remained No. 4 in the BCS standings for the second straight week. The Tigers were ranked No. 12 in the first BCS standings and they have spent the past two weeks ranked No. 7 in the BCS poll.

LSU-Ole Miss Square Off With Most On Line In Over 30 Years

There have been some great storylines between LSU and Ole Miss over the years. However, one could argue that this week's LSU-Ole Miss game is the biggest matchup between the teams since 1970 when then-No. 8 LSU beat No. 16 Ole Miss, 61-17, in a game that decided the SEC title. The LSU victory that year sent the Tigers to the Orange Bowl, while Ole Miss went on to the Gator Bowl. The following is a look at some of the more meaningful LSU-Ole Miss games:

Tigers Are 4-1 In Games When Ranked No. 3; Lone Loss To Ole Miss in '60

For the second straight week, LSU will play a game as the nation's No. 3 ranked team. In its history, LSU is 4-1 in games as the third-ranked team in the nation. The only loss during that 5-game span came to Ole Miss in the 1960 Sugar Bowl by a 21-0 count. The Tigers were 2-1 as the No. 3 ranked team in 1959 and they were 1-0 as the nation's third-ranked squad in 1958.

Win One For JB

The LSU Athletic Department suffered a tremendous loss on Oct. 27 as longtime equipment manager **Jeff Boss** passed away after a 10-month battle with brain cancer. Boss, who was 54-years old, is survived by his wife, Karen, and a 13-year old daughter, B.J. Over 500 people attended the memorial service for Boss on Oct. 29, including former LSU football coaches Jerry Stovall, Bill Arnsparger and Mike Archer, along with current head coach Nick Saban. Boss had served as LSU's equipment manager since 1980. The LSU football team has dedicated the 2003 season to Boss. Several members of the team, along with coach Saban, presented coach Boss with a game ball from the Louisiana-Monroe game on Sept. 12 at his home. The ULM game was the first time in 24 years that coach Boss was not on the sidelines for an LSU contest. Then, on Sept. 29, LSU named its football locker room in Boss' honor with a formal ceremony that saw dozens of former Tiger football players, covering three decades, attend. The team has worn the letters "JB" on their helmets since the Georgia game. For the first time this year, the team wore letters "JB" on their jerseys against Louisiana Tech. The "JB" will remain on the helmets and the jerseys for the remainder of the season.

About Ole Miss

The Rebels enter with an 8-2 overall mark and a 6-0 league mark ... Ole Miss is coming off an open date ... Prior to that, Ole Miss beat Auburn, 24-20 ... The Rebels are coached by David Cutcliffe, who has a 38-21 mark during his career, all coming at Ole Miss ... The Rebels are led by QB Eli Manning, who has thrown for 2,881 yards and 23 TDs this year ... Tremaine Turner leads the Rebel running game with 579 yards and 3 TDs ... The Rebels lead the SEC in scoring (36.6 points per game) and total offense (459.6 yards per game).

The LSU Injury Report

The Tigers are expected to regain the services of OG **Nate Livings** (knee) on Saturday. Livings practiced all week without any prob-

lems. Livings has been out of action since the first half of the South Carolina contest. TE **Demetri Robinson** has missed LSU's last three games with a groin injury. Special teams contributor **Gino Giambelluca** (broken hand) has returned to practice and is available when needed.

Tigers Back On CBS

LSU will make its third appearance on CBS this year when they face Ole Miss on Saturday. The Tigers will make a fourth appearance on CBS next week when they host Arkansas in the regular season finale. LSU is 1-1 on CBS this year and the Tigers are 15-14-1 all-time on the network, which includes a 5-4 record under Nick Saban. Earlier this season, the Tigers beat Georgia, 17-10 on CBS followed by a 19-7 loss to Florida on the network. LSU has only faced Ole Miss one time on CBS, that coming in 1963 when the Rebels posted a 37-7 win over the Tigers in Baton Rouge.

LSU On The Road Under Saban

The Tigers are 4-0 this season on the road and they are 11-7 on the road in the Saban era. LSU was 2-3 in road games in 2000, followed by a 3-1 mark in 2001 and a 2-3 record last year. LSU will be after its first perfect road mark since the 1997 team posted a 4-0 mark on the road.

LSU's Mississippi Ties

The Tigers have four players on their roster who call Mississippi home. OG **Stephen Peterman** is from Waveland, while OL **Will Arnold** is from Centreville, DE **Sean Merrill** from D'Iberville and WR **Ty Barrett** from Bay St. Louis.

Taking Notes On The Tigers Under Saban

Here is a look at some notable LSU trends during its first 48 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 30-2 when leading at halftime and 28-2 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 33-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 32-0 when scoring 25 or more points ... On the other hand, LSU is 2-10 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 8-2 in games decided by 7 points or less and 3-1 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 22-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing and the Tigers are 15-0 when having a 100-yard rusher.

Odds and Ends About The Tiger Defense

Here's a few quick notes about the LSU defense, a unit that is ranked first in the nation in scoring and second against the run ... The defensive leader is DT **Chad Lavalais**, who spent a year serving as a guard in a prison before enrolling in school ... The team's best cover corner **Corey Webster** is a converted wide receiver ... SS **Jack Hunt** spent his first two years with the Tigers on the offensive side of the ball as a wide receiver ... DE **Marcus Spears** could have gone anywhere in the country to play basketball ... Spears also played his first season with the Tigers as a tight end before moving to defense on a full-time basis as a sophomore ... LB **Eric Alexander** played as a defensive back and a special teams player for the first three years of his college career ... CB **Travis Daniels** burnt his redshirt season after injuries forced him into the fourth quarter of the SEC Championship game in 2001 ... Daniels made the most of his chance, breaking up a pass in the endzone ... FS LaRon Landry is a true freshman and he leads the Tigers with 58 tackles.

LSU "D" Rated No. 1 In Nation in Scoring Defense And No. 2 vs. The Run

The Tiger defense continues to be not only one of the best in the SEC, but one of the top units in the nation. LSU enters the Ole Miss contest with the nation's No. 1 rated scoring defense (8.9 points per game) and the second-best unit against the run, allowing only 60.8 yards rushing per contest. In 10 games this season, the Tigers have allowed only one team to reach the 100-yard mark in rushing yards and that came against Louisiana Tech (121 yards on 25 carries). The Tigers also rank fourth in the nation in total defense, allowing 259.7 yards per game (60.8 rushing, 198.9 passing). LSU's defense has yielded only 10 touchdowns all season - 2 rushing, 8 passing. Through 10 games, of the 89 points scored against LSU, only 19 have come in the first half. In addition, LSU is the only team in the nation that has yet to allow 20 or more points in a game.

Mauck Has Tiger Offense Running On All Cylinders Over Last 4 Games

Since the loss to Florida, LSU QB **Matt Mauck** has had the Tiger offense clicking as the junior has completed 83 of 114 passes (72.8 percent) for 985 yards and 11 touchdowns. Mauck has only thrown 3 interceptions during that span as the Tigers are averaging 496.5 yards of offense and 35 points in wins over South Carolina, Auburn, Louisiana Tech and Alabama. The Tigers are also rushing for 230 yards over the 4-game stretch with **Justin Vincent** (334 yards, 3 TDs) and **Alley Broussard** (324 yards, 3 TDs) leading the way. Also during LSU's current 4-game winning streak, the Tigers have converted on 26 of 55 3rd-down opportunities.

Mauck Within 1 TD Pass Of Tying LSU's Single-Season Mark

LSU QB **Matt Mauck** needs one touchdown pass to tie **Tommy Hodson's** mark for TD passes in a single-season with 22. Through 10 games, Mauck has tossed 21 touchdown passes, including 9 in LSU's last four games. Mauck has thrown at least one TD pass in nine of LSU's 10 games this year. For his career, Mauck

has tossed 30 touchdown passes, which ranks as the fifth-best total in school history. In 16 games, Mauck has tossed at least 3 TD passes in a game 6 times, which includes 4 TD passes twice. Hodson holds the LSU career mark with 69 TD passes.

LSU's Won 4 Straight Games By At Least 24 Points; Longest Streak Since 1911

LSU won by 24 points or more for the fourth game in a row vs. Alabama. It marks the first time LSU has won by 24 points or more in four consecutive games since the Tigers won the first four games of the 1911 season by scores of 42-0 over Southwestern Louisiana, 46-0 over Louisiana Normal, 40-0 over Louisiana College and 40-0 over Meteor AC.

Lavalais Leads Tigers With 6 Sacks and 12 TFLs

DT **Chad Lavalais**, the SEC Defensive Player of the Week after LSU's win over Auburn, leads the Tigers with 6 sacks and 12 tackles for losses this season. Lavalais, a former prison guard, has 43 tackles and 18 quarterback hurries this year. For his career, Lavalais has 10 sacks and 28 tackles for losses. Lavalais added his first career interception vs. Alabama as he picked off a Brodie Croyle pass that he batted into the air.

LSU Starting Defense Has Yet To Allow A Rushing TD

LSU's starting defense enters the Ole Miss game riding a streak of 10 straight games without allowing a rushing touchdown. LSU has allowed 2 rushing TDs this season, but those came in the fourth quarter of wins over Louisiana-Monroe and Arizona, games in which the starting lineup had long left the field.

Tiger Defense Continues To Be Stingy

Through 40 quarters this season, LSU's defense has held the opponent out of the endzone in 27 of those. Florida became the first team since Kentucky last year to score an offensive TD in the first quarter against the Tigers. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had allowed only 3 first half points all season, that being a field goal vs. Georgia in Week 4. In all, the Tigers have held all 10 of its opponents this year to less than 20 points, something that hasn't been done at LSU since 1962 when the Tigers held all 11 of their opponents to less than 20 points.

LSU's Rodney Reed Named National Scholar-Athlete

Rodney Reed, who is one of the most decorated student-athletes in LSU football history, added another honor to an already impressive resume as he was selected a National Scholar-Athlete by the National Football Foundation. The award is one of the top academic honors available to a college football player and it carries with it an \$18,000 post-graduate scholarship. Reed is one of only 15 football players covering all NCAA divisions as well as NAIA to receive the award. He also becomes the second National Scholar-Athlete in as many years for LSU, joining Bradie James, who was honored last year. Past LSU recipients of the award include: offensive lineman Robert Dugas (1977), linebacker Nacho Albergamo (1987), quarterback Sol Graves (1990) and punter Chad Kessler (1997). "This is a tremendous honor and something that I am extremely proud of," Reed said. "It is quite an accomplishment that two student-athletes from the same school have won the award two years in a row. It's good to get recognized and it speaks well for the program. I think this also speaks highly for the academic center and the way Coach Saban stresses academics and not just football."

Three Tigers Named To Academic District VI Team

LSU QB **Matt Mauck**, OT **Rodney Reed** and SS **Jack Hunt** have all been named to the First Team Academic District VI squad, the College Sports Information Directors of America announced. District VI is comprised of universities in the states of Louisiana, Texas, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Arkansas and Mississippi. To be eligible for the team, players must have at least a 3.2 overall grade point average. Mauck, a pre-dentistry major, has a 3.72 grade point average. Reed, a First Team Academic All-America in 2002, earned a spot on the all-district team for the third straight year. Reed graduated in May with a 3.9 grade point average in accounting. He is currently pursuing a Master's degree in accounting. Hunt carries a 3.39 grade point average in chemistry. All three Tigers are now eligible for the Academic All-America team, which will be announced later this month.

Clayton Named One Of 10 Semifinalists For Biletnikoff Award

LSU WR **Michael Clayton** is one of 10 players from across the nation named as a semifinalist for the Biletnikoff Award. Clayton, a junior from Baton Rouge, is the only player from the Southeastern Conference on the list. Clayton currently leads LSU and ranks among the national leaders with 57 receptions for 835 yards and 7 TDs. Clayton is the only player in LSU history to have at least 700 yards receiving in three consecutive seasons. Clayton has also caught at least one pass in all 36 games of his collegiate career. Former LSU standout Josh Reed won the Biletnikoff Award in 2001.

Webster Named Semifinalists For Thorpe Award

LSU CB **Corey Webster** has been named one of 12 semifinalists for the Jim Thorpe Award, which goes annually to college football's best defensive back. Webster, a junior from Vacherie, La., has started all 10 games at cornerback for the Tigers and he's recorded 39 tackles, three interceptions and 18 passes defended. He's also

forced a fumble and had three quarterback hurries. Webster, a converted wide receiver, ranks among LSU's all-time leaders with 10 career pass interceptions, which includes tying a school-record with three in one game last year against Florida.

Jones Named Named Semifinalists For Ray Guy Award

LSU P **Donnie Jones** is one of 10 players from across the country named to the list of semifinalists for the Ray Guy Award, the Greater Augusta Sports Council announced. Jones, a Second Team All-Southeastern Conference pick in 2002, is currently averaging 41.9 yards on 42 punts. LSU's net punting average of 39.6 ranks second in the SEC and 12th in the nation. Of his 42 punts, Jones has had 15 downed inside the 20-yard line. Jones, a Baton Rouge native, currently holds the LSU career record for punts with 210 and punting yards with 8,801 and he ranks second in school history with a 41.9 punting average.

Tiger Defense Has 4 Scores Of Its Own

In addition to being difficult to score on, the Tiger defense has also created points of their own this season, scoring four touchdowns in 2003. The Tigers have returned three interceptions for touchdowns - **Jack Hunt** vs. UL-Monroe and Louisiana Tech and **Travis Daniels** vs. Mississippi State and they have returned one fumble for a score - **Jason LeDoux** vs. South Carolina. The four defensive TDs are the most by an LSU team since the 1991 team scored four touchdowns.

LSU Starts 5-1 in SEC Action For First Time Since 1988

LSU's win over Alabama moved the Tigers to 5-1 in league play, marking the best start in conference action since 1988. LSU tied for the SEC title in 1988 with a 6-1 league mark.

Tigers Eye 10-Win Season And Best Start After 11 Games Since 1962

A win on Saturday against Ole Miss would give LSU a 10-1 record and it would mark the best start for the Tigers after 11 games since the 1962 squad posted a 10-1 overall mark. In addition, the Tigers will be after their sixth 10-win season in the history of the school. The Tigers last won 10 games in 2001 when **Nick Saban** guided the Tigers to a 10-3 overall mark. A 10th win would also make Saban, along with **Paul Dietzel**, the only two coaches in school history to have more than one 10-win seasons. Dietzel had 11 wins in LSU's National Championship season in 1958 followed by 10 victories in 1961.

Tiger Defense Still Tough To Score On

In 10 games this year, LSU has yielded only 89 points to its opponents. The 89 points is the fewest by an LSU team since the 1970 squad held its first 10 opponents to 79 points.

Vincent and Broussard Join Hilliard and James From '82 Tigers On Elite List

Against South Carolina, **Alley Broussard**, a true freshman from Lafayette, La., rushed for 108 yards in leading LSU to a 33-7 win over South Carolina. A week later, **Justin Vincent**, another true freshman, did the honors as he rushed for a career-best 127 yards on 14 carries for an average of 9.1 yard per rush in the win over Auburn. Broussard added another 100-yard game vs. Louisiana Tech, going for 106 yards on 16 carries. Vincent and Broussard are the first true freshman running backs at LSU to rush for 100 yards in a single-game in the same season since **Dalton Hilliard** and **Garry James** did it in 1982. Hilliard rushed for 100 yards five times as a true freshman in 1982, while James did it three times. In LSU' last 4 games, all starts by Vincent, he's rushed for 334 yards and 3 TDs on 50 carries. Vincent leads all Tigers in rushing with 466 yards and 5 TDs on 80 carries. Broussard has accounted for 332 yards and 4 TDs on 70 attempts, while LSU's third true freshman running back **Barrington Edwards** has 155 yards rushing on 32 attempts.

That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach **Nick Saban** has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In his fourth season at LSU, Saban has put together a 22-5 mark at home, which includes an 11-4 record in SEC games. Under Saban, the Tigers are 6-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium. LSU's 18 wins over Saban's first three years in Baton Rouge is the most over a three-year period for LSU in Tiger Stadium since the Tigers won 18 homes games from 1972-74.

LSU's Held 9 of 10 Opponents To Less Than 100 Yards Rushing

Louisiana Tech became the first team this year to crack the 100-yard mark vs. LSU this season as the Bulldogs rushed for 121 yards against LSU on Nov. 1. Prior to that, LSU had held its first eight opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing, which included limiting Auburn to 50 yards rushing and holding South Carolina to zero rushing yards. Tech became the first team since Texas in last year's Cotton Bowl to rush for 100 yards in a game against LSU. In addition, Tech running back Ryan Moats had 124 yards rushing to become the first player since Arkansas' Fred Talley (118 yards) to rush for 100 yards in a game against LSU as he did it in Week 12 last year. Florida rushed for 81 yards against LSU on Oct. 11 to become the first team to beat LSU under Nick Saban despite gaining less than 100 yards rushing. The Tigers are 21-1 under Saban when holding their opponent to less than 100 yards rushing. LSU's current stretch of holding 9 of its first 10 opponents

to under 100 yards rushing is the best stretch by an LSU defense since the 1970 squad held 10 of its 11 regular-season opponents to less than 100 yards. The only team during the regular-season that gained 100 or more yards against the Tigers in 1970 was Baylor, who had 104 yards in Week three. The 1970 LSU team still holds the school record for rushing defense (52.2) and rushing yards allowed for a season (574). To date, LSU has allowed 608 yards on 281 carries.

Tiger Defense Continues To Be Spectacular In All Phases

Whether it's against the pass or the run, the Tiger defense has been one of the best all-around units in the SEC. LSU is ranked either Nos. 1 or 2 in the SEC in eight of 11 categories, including leading the conference in five categories. LSU leads the league and the nation in scoring defense (8.9 points per game), the Tigers are first in the SEC and second in the nation in rush defense (60.8 yards per game), and they are first in the SEC in pass efficiency defense (94.2 rating), sacks (30), opponent 1st downs (141), and opponents' 3rd-down conversion percentage (23.8).

Open Wide

QB **Matt Mauck** spent Monday, Oct. 6 taking the Dental Admissions Test. Mauck, who also considered pursuing a career in medicine, has now opted to becoming a dentist. Mauck, who carries a 3.8 grade point average, will graduate in December with a degree in kinesiology.

LSU's Been Good At Getting The Defense Off The Field On 3rd Down

One of the obvious keys to LSU's success has been their ability to get the defense off the field on third-down situations. Through 10 games, the Tigers lead the SEC with a 23.8 third-down conversion percentage by their defense. In 151 third-down attempts this season, LSU has allowed its opponent a first down on 36 of those tries. Florida is the only team to have a better third-down percentage than LSU in a game as the Gators converted 7 of 18 attempts, compared to just 3 of 12 for the Tigers. The Tigers are even better on third-down once the opponent crosses midfield as LSU has allowed only 7 of 45 third-down attempts this season for 15.5 percent.

Skyler Makes Most of Punt Returns; Leads Nation For 4th Week

For the fourth week, **Skyler Green** stands atop the nation in punt returns, averaging 23.7 yards on 15 returns. Green returned 4 punts for 69 yards against Alabama, including returns of 34 and 26 yards in the first quarter. For the season, Green has returned 15 punts for 356 yards. The 356 yards ranks as the seventh-highest single-season total in LSU history. To date, Green has returned two punts for TDs, including an 80-yarder against Florida. On the first punt return of his career against Arizona, Green raced 62 yards for a touchdown. Green is the first player since **Todd Kinchen** in 1991 to have two punt returns for TDs in the same season and he's one shy of tying the school mark of 3 set by **Pinky Rohm** in 1937.

Mauck Comes Out Firing Vs. Louisiana Tech

Matt Mauck tied a school-record by completing his first 14 passes in LSU's 49-10 win over Louisiana Tech. The 14 straight completions tied the mark set by **Chad Loup** vs. Arkansas in 1993. In addition, Mauck finished the game 18 of 20 for 90.0 percent, which set the school-record for completion percentage in a single-game with a minimum of 20 passes. Mauck also set a career-best for passing yards with 311 and he tied a career-best with 4 TDs, all coming in the first half.

Clayton Joins The 2,000-Yard Club

WR **Michael Clayton**, a junior, became only the fifth player in LSU history to record 2,000 receiving yards in a career as he went over the mark against Florida. Clayton currently ranks fourth in school history with 2,338 receiving yards. He is third in LSU history in receptions with 161, tied for second in receiving TDs with 18 and seventh in career 100-yard receiving games with seven. With 57 catches for 835 this year, Clayton is the first player in LSU history with at least 700 yards receiving in three consecutive seasons. Clayton had 754 yards on 47 catches as a freshman and he followed that with 749 yards on 57 catches last year.

Henderson Closing In On Single-Season Receiving TD Record

LSU WR **Devery Henderson** is within 2 TDs of tying the school-record for receiving touchdowns in a season. Currently, Henderson has 9 TD receptions this year, two shy of the mark of 11 held by **Wendell Davis** in 1986. For his career, Henderson has 17 TDs, which ranks as the fourth-highest total in school history. Davis holds the mark with 19 from 1984-87. Henderson is currently tied with Mississippi State's Justin Jenkins for the SEC lead in TD receptions with 9.

Donnie Jones Adds His Name To Another LSU Punting Record

Donnie Jones now holds two of LSU's three career punting records as the Baton Rouge native holds the school mark in punting yards (8,801) and total punts (210). In four years with the Tigers, Jones has a total of 8,801 punting yards, which broke the mark of 7,976 held by **Chad Kessler** (1994-967). In LSU's game against Mississippi State, Jones broke Kessler's career punts mark. For his career, Jones has punted 210 times for

an average of 41.9 yards per kick, a figure that ranks second to Kessler's 42.9 career average.

Throwing To The Tight Ends

LSU's tight ends aren't just for blocking as the rotation of **Eric Edwards**, **David Jones**, **Keith Zinger** and **Demetri Robinson** have caught their share of passes this season. The foursome have accounted for 26 receptions for 308 yards and 2 TDs. Edwards leads all LSU tight ends with 14 catches for 141 yards and 2 TDs. Against South Carolina, LSU tight ends caught nine passes, that's the most in a single-game for that position in LSU history. Edwards led the way with 5 receptions for 37 yards and 1 TD. The 5 receptions by Edwards was the most by an LSU tight end since **Robert Royal** caught 5 passes for 72 yards against Utah State in 2001.

Mauck Starts Another TD Streak

After having his streak of consecutive games with a TD pass snapped at nine against Florida, QB **Matt Mauck** got started on another streak, throwing for 2 TDs vs. South Carolina, 3 vs. Auburn, 4 vs. Louisiana Tech and 2 vs. Auburn. In 16 career starts, Mauck has thrown at least one TD pass in 13 games. The nine straight games with at least one TD pass was the longest streak by a Tiger since **Herb Tyler** did it in 12 straight games covering the 1997 and 1998 seasons.

TD-Less First Half Streak Comes To An End Against Florida

LSU's streak of keeping its opponent out of the endzone in the first half came to an end against Florida as the Gators became the first team this year to score a first half touchdown against the Tigers. Florida's first quarter TD marked the first time LSU had given up an offensive TD since last year's Cotton Bowl when Texas scored a pair of second quarter touchdowns against the Tigers. Through 10 games, LSU has allowed only 19 first half points for an average of 1.9 points per game. Dating back to last year, LSU has had its opponents scoreless in the first half in nine of its last 12 games.

LSU Buckles Down In The Redzone

The Tiger defense is holding its opponents to a staggering 47.4 percent scoring success rate when they get inside the LSU redzone. Against Florida, the Gators had one redzone opportunity stopped at the 1-yard line when **Brandon Washington** forced a fumble that was recovered by **Adrian Mayes**. The Tigers also held the Gators to a field goal on another redzone chance in the second quarter. LSU also held Georgia to just three points despite three trips inside the redzone against the Tigers in a 17-10 win over the Bulldogs on Sept. 20. So far this season, in 19 redzone chances for its opponent, LSU has allowed only 9 scores - 5 touchdowns and 4 field goals.

Tigers Still Rank No. 2 In SEC In Scoring

LSU still ranks second in the SEC in scoring as the Tigers are averaging 34.8 points a contest as they have scored 348 points through the first 10 games of the season. The 348 points is the most by an LSU team in the modern history of Tiger football. The 1977 team holds the school record for most points in a season with 375.

How About Those Special Teams

A quick check of the special teams categories in the SEC shows that LSU leads the league and rank second in the nation in punt returns (15.9). The Tigers are second in the SEC and 12th in the nation in net punting (39.6) and they are third in the league in kickoff coverage (18.0) and fourth in kickoff returns (23.6).

Go Figure

Between 1997 and Nov. 16, 2002, LSU failed to reach 20 points in an SEC contest 15 times. The Tigers lost all 15 of those games. Dating back to last year's Ole Miss game on Nov. 23, LSU has now won two of its last four SEC games when failing to reach the 20-point mark. Last year, LSU beat Ole Miss 14-13 for its final SEC victory and the Tigers opened up conference play this year with a 17-10 victory over Georgia. Prior to last year's win over Ole Miss, LSU had not won an SEC game when scoring less than 20 points since a 7-6 victory over Vanderbilt in 1997. You have to go all the way back to 1993 to find a two-game span when the Tigers won SEC games despite failing to reach 20 points. That year, LSU beat Ole Miss, 19-17 and then followed with a 17-13 win over Alabama. LSU also beat Mississippi State 18-16 that year.

Saban Knows Pass Efficiency

One thing that LSU coach **Nick Saban** did over the summer was research pass efficiency and how a quarterback's efficiency related to wins and losses. Saban said the research proved that the quarterback with the better pass efficiency in a game usually leads his team to a victory. So far that has proven to be true, as the Tigers have won all 9 games in which their quarterback pass efficiency was better than its opponent. The one time that the opponent had the better efficiency (Florida), the Tigers lost. Currently, LSU ranks first in the league and ninth in the nation in pass efficiency with a 154.7 rating. **Matt Mauck** is first in the SEC and 12th in the nation with a 154.1 QB rating.

Tigers Have Experience on the O-Line

The LSU offensive line has been touted as one of the best in the nation. The Tiger offensive line may be one of the most experienced as the LSU front five have 141 career starts between them. **Rodney Reed** leads the way with 44, followed by **Stephen Peterman** with 35, **Ben Wilkerson** with 29 and **Andrew Whitworth** 23. **Rudy Niswanger** got his first career start vs. Auburn, replacing the injured **Nate Livings** at left guard. Niswanger has now started three straight games for the Tigers. Livings had started LSU's first 7 games before suffering a knee injury vs. South Carolina. LSU is 23-5 when Reed, Peterman and Wilkerson start on the offensive line together (8-0 in 2001, 6-4 in 2002, 9-1 in 2003).

Tigers Keep Opponents To Less Than 20 Points For 25th Time Under Saban

By holding Alabama to only 3 points, the Tigers have now limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 29 of the 47 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 26-3 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 29 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 16 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted four shutouts under Saban.

Clayton, Henderson, and Green... LSU's Triple-Threat Receiving Corps

One thing is for certain and that is if defenses key too much on **Michael Clayton**, then **Devery Henderson** will make them pay. Focus on Henderson, then Clayton takes over. Concentrate on Henderson and Clayton and then **Skyler Green** will take over. At least that's how it's been over the first 10 games of the year. Clayton, Henderson and Green have combined for 122 catches for 1,682 yards and 16 TDs for the Tigers. Clayton has gone over 100-yards four times this year, while Henderson has done it three times and Green once. Clayton ranks second in the league in receptions per game (5.7), while Henderson is sixth with 4.3 a contest and Green eighth with 3.7 a game. Clayton is second in the SEC in yards per game (83.5) and Henderson is fifth at 69.4 yards a contest. Clayton leads the team with 57 receptions for 835 yards and 7 TDs, with Henderson second with 43 receptions for 694 yards and 9 scores and Green next with 37 catches for 437 yards and 4 TDs.

Mauck Ties Career High For Completions Against Alabama

For the third time this year, **Matt Mauck** either reset or tied his career highs for completions, this time hitting on 24 passes vs. Alabama. The 24 completions tied his previous mark of 24 set against South Carolina earlier this year. Mauck also broke his career-best for attempts with 36 against Alabama.

Mauck Has Completion Strings of 17 and 16 This Year

QB **Matt Mauck** has recorded completion streaks of 17 and 16 this year for the Tigers. The 17 straight tied a school-mark and were over a 2-game span. Mauck completed his final 10 passes in LSU's 59-13 win over Arizona on Sept. 6 and he followed that by completing 7 straight vs. Western Illinois. The 17 straight completions ties the mark set by **Rohan Davey**, who completed 6 straight vs. Arkansas to close the 1999 season and then opened the 2000 season by hitting 11 straight vs. Western Carolina. Mauck's 16 straight completions covered games against Auburn (last 2 passes) and Louisiana Tech (first 14 passes).

Run Skyler Run

In 10 games this year, **Skyler Green** has touched the ball in a variety of ways. He's rushed twice for 24 yards, he's caught 37 passes for 437 yards, he's returned 15 punts for 356 yards and he's returned 5 kickoffs for 104 yards. In all, Green has touched the ball 59 times and he's accounted for 921 yards for an average of 15.6 yards every time he gets his hands on the ball. Green has also accounted for 6 TDs, including the game-winner vs. Georgia. Green puts the ball in the endzone every 9.8 times he touches the ball. To date, he's recorded 4 receiving TDs and he's returned 2 punts for touchdowns.

100-150-300 vs. Western Illinois A Rarity For Tigers

LSU's trio of QB **Matt Mauck**, RB **Shyrone Carey** and WR **Michael Clayton** combined for a rarity vs. Western Illinois on Sept. 13. Carey rushed for 124 yards, Clayton caught passes netting 162 yards and Mauck threw for 305 yards as the trio became just the fourth group in school history to have 100-yards rushing, 150-yards receiving and 300-yard passing in the same game. The last time the Tigers had a 100-yard rusher, a 150-yard receiver and a 300-yard passer in the same contest came against Illinois in the 2002 Sugar Bowl. In that game, **Domanick Davis** rushed for 122 yards, **Josh Reed** had 239 yards receiving and **Rohan Davey** threw for 444 yards. The other two times came in 2001 as well as the Tigers did it against Kentucky (Toefield 129 rushing, Reed 160 receiving, Davey 383 passing) and then against vs. Arkansas (Toefield 173 rushing, Reed 183 receiving, Davey 359 passing).

Tigers Have Had 100 On The Ground and 100 Through The Air 3 In 2003

For the third time this season, the Tigers had a 100-yard rusher and a 100-yard receiver in the same game as LSU accomplished the feat against Louisiana Tech. Against the Bulldogs, **Alley Broussard** rushed for 106

yards, while **Skylar Green** had 103 yards receiving. What's impressive about the feat this year is that all three games have featured a different player rush for 100 yards and a different 100-yard receiver. The following is a look at LSU's 100-yard rusher/100-yard receiver games in 2003:

Mauck Win Streak Snapped At 10 Straight, Now 14-2 As LSU's Starting QB

Matt Mauck's winning streak as LSU's starter quarterback came to an end at 10 straight with the loss to Florida. Mauck, who is 14-2 as LSU's starting quarterback, had not lost a game since his first start vs. Virginia Tech in last year's season-opener. Mauck's 10-1 start was the best by an LSU QB since Herb Tyler won 10 of his first 11, including his first eight, as a starter from 1995-96. In addition, Mauck has played in 19 games in his LSU career and the Tigers are 16-3 in those contests.

Webster Has 10 Career Interceptions

He was a basketball superstar in high school. He came to LSU as a wide receiver and played there for a year before moving to the secondary. Now, in just his second season as a starter at CB **Corey Webster** has already moved up to seventh place in school history in interceptions after recording the 10th career pick vs. Georgia. The interception, which made Webster look more like a magician, came with just over a minute left in the contest and sealed LSU's 17-10 win over Georgia. Webster began his career at LSU as a WR, catching seven passes for 74 yards in 12 games as a freshman. In 23 games on defense, Webster has 10 interceptions for 98 yards and 1 TD.

The Long Ball

LSU has scored on plays of 40 yards or longer in five games this year, which includes two scoring plays or better than 40 yards vs. Louisiana Tech. The Tigers also scored on a 64-yard TD pass from **Matt Mauck** to **Devery Henderson** on their first possession vs. Auburn. This year, LSU has thrown 23 TD passes with eight of those going for at least 40 yards. Mauck has 6 TD passes of at least 40 yards this year, while backup QB **Marcus Randall** has accounted for the other two. Last year, the Tigers had just three touchdown passes from over 40 yards, with two of those coming in the Kentucky game.

Saban Gets Win No. 35 at LSU and No. 78 Overall

Nick Saban continues his climb up the school charts for victories as he recorded his 35th win at LSU against Alabama. Saban's 35 victories at LSU ties **Gaynell Tinsley** for fourth place in school history. In his fourth year with the Tigers, Saban has posted a 35-13 overall mark. Saban also has 78 career victories. In his 10th season overall, Saban has put together an overall record of 78-39-1. **Charles McClendon** holds the school-record with 137 victories in 19 years as LSU's head coach.

Saban Adds Another Notch To SEC Belt

With the win over Georgia on Sept. 20, LSU coach **Nick Saban** has now recorded at least one win over all but one SEC team. The only team Saban has yet to beat in the only team he hasn't faced - Vanderbilt. In just over three years at LSU, Saban has recorded 20 SEC victories - 21 counting the SEC title game in 2001. Saban has four wins over Mississippi State, three over Kentucky and Alabama, and two each against Auburn, Ole Miss, South Carolina and Tennessee and one over Georgia, Florida, and Arkansas. Saban's current SEC mark, which includes regular-season games only, stands at 20-10.

Jimbo Keeps Spreading It Around In The Passing Game

LSU offensive coordinator **Jimbo Fisher** has done a good job keeping opposing defenses off balance when it comes to the passing game. Through 10 games this year, LSU has had at 15 players catch at least one pass. Against South Carolina, nine different Tigers caught at least one pass and of the 26 LSU completions, 12 went to wide receivers, 9 went to tight ends and 5 went to running backs.

Clayton Runs Streak To 36 Straight Games

LSU WR **Michael Clayton** ran his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 36 after record-

Tigers Rebound Again Under Saban After A Loss

One thing is certain and that is LSU does a good job of bouncing back after a loss under **Nick Saban**. After the 33-7 win over South Carolina, LSU is now 10-3 under Saban after a loss. LSU has lost back-to-back games under Saban only three times. LSU is 4-0 under Saban when the game following a loss comes on the road - LSU beat Georgia Tech in the Peach Bowl following a loss to Arkansas in 2000; LSU beat Alabama in Tuscaloosa following a home loss to Ole Miss in 2001; the Tigers beat Kentucky in Lexington following a loss to Auburn in 2002; LSU beat South Carolina in Columbia following a loss to Florida in 2003.

LSU Secures Second Straight Winning Season vs. SEC Eastern Division

LSU's win over South Carolina gave the Tigers a winning record vs. the SEC Eastern Division for the second straight year and the third time in four years under **Nick Saban**. The Tigers were 2-1 vs. the East this year. LSU had won six straight against the East before Florida snapped the streak on Saturday. The last time LSU had a winning record against the SEC East in back-to-back seasons came in 1996-97. In all, Saban has a 9-4 mark vs. the SEC East, which includes a 31-20 win over Tennessee in the SEC Championship game in 2001. Prior to Saban's arrival and since the SEC went to divisions in 1992, LSU posted a 6-17-1 vs. the East from 1992 to 1999.

True Freshmen On The Field

Through 10 games, LSU has played 15 true freshmen. LSU opened the season by playing 11 true freshmen against UL-Monroe and then 12 played against Arizona. Reed Among Nation's Elite In Starts on Offensive Line

Senior OT **Rodney Reed** started his 44th straight game vs. Alabama. Reed's 44 career starts ranks as the 7th highest total among active Division I players. Marshall's Nate McPeck leads the way with 49 career starts.

Pancakes Are Breakfast of Choice For LSU O-Line

A new wrinkle to this year's offensive grade sheet is the tracking of both pancakes and knockdowns for the LSU offensive line. Through 10 games **Andrew Whitworth** leads the Tigers with 15 pancakes. Offensive guard **Stephen Peterman** is tops among the Tigers with 93 knockdowns.

Cap and Gown Tigers

LSU has two players on this year's roster who have already earned their bachelor's degree - OT **Rodney Reed** and C **Jimmy Courtenay**. Reed and Courtenay both graduated last May. Reed, who earned First Team Academic All-America honors last year, graduated with a 3.9 grade point average in accounting. He is currently pursuing his Master's in accounting.

Peterman's Pulling Double-Duty

As of Tuesday, Aug. 26, senior offensive lineman **Stephen Peterman** began pulling double-duty as well, only his is as a player and daddy. Peterman's wife Colleen gave birth to a 6-pound, 10-ounce baby boy in Metairie, La. Peterman missed two days of practice to be with his wife during the birth, but he returned to the squad on Thursday and started on Saturday against UL-Monroe. The newest Peterman, Stephen Frederick, Jr., checked in at some 318 pounds lighter than his daddy.

Just How Loud Is Tiger Stadium?

Two students from LSU's Department of Astronomy and Physics were on the field for the Auburn game. The students registered a reading of 117 decibels, which matched the highest reading ever recorded in Tiger Stadium. A reading of 117 decibels was first recorded in LSU's game against Alabama in 1996. The reading of 117 decibels vs. Auburn matched that of the 1996 reading and can be compared to that of a rock concert. It is believed that LSU's game against Auburn in 1988 had a higher decibel reading, the only official reading from that game came on the seismograph machine across campus in the Geology Department.

I'd been warned prior to my first visit to Baton Rouge that the legendary Death Valley mystique was a myth. That assessment couldn't have been more wrong. Tiger Stadium was as loud as any I've ever heard during the dramatic fourth quarter of Saturday's Georgia game, the festivities surrounding it as advertised.

The streets were lined with purple and gold. Smoke emanated from the grills in the parking lot. Shouts of "Go Tigers" and "Tiger Bait" echoed from the stadium deep into the heart of campus.

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 80th year in the venerable stadium on SATURDAY NIGHT.

• Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 22-5 HOME RECORD, including a 6-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 10-4 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 17-3 since Saban took over.

• LSU has won NINE OF ITS LAST 10 games at home, including an eight-game win streak during the stretch. That was the longest home streak for the Tigers since winning eight straight from 1995-96.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 26 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 17 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP FIVE IN THE NATION, including the last three.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 186-62-4 (.745) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 15-21-3 (.434) at home during the day in that span.

• Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 91,600 fans.

Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

Randall Rallies LSU Past Ole Miss

Marcus Randall rallied LSU past Ole Miss, 14-13. Trailing by six with less than 10 minutes left, Randall guided the Tigers on a 10-play, 74-yard drive that culminated with a 27-yard TD pass to Michael Clayton. The Tigers then kept the Rebels from crossing midfield in three possessions down the stretch. Corey Webster intercepted an Eli Manning pass at the LSU 22-yard line with less than two minutes left to end all Rebel hopes. The play of the game for the Tigers came early in the fourth quarter when Demetrius Hookfin intercepted a Manning pass at the 3-yard line to thwart a Rebel scoring opportunity. LSU held Ole Miss to only 279 yards of offense overall and just three second-half points. LSU cut the Rebel lead to 10-7 just before the half when Randall hit Devery Henderson for a 19-yard score with two seconds left.

LSU's Rolls Past UL-Monroe, 49-7

Matt Mauck threw three touchdown passes, Joseph Addai rushed for 81 yards and Michael Clayton caught six passes for 152 yards and a pair of TD passes as LSU rolled to a 49-7 win over Louisiana-Monroe in the season-opener for both teams. The game was only four minutes old when a thunderstorm rolled into Baton Rouge and caused a 39-minute delay because of lightning. After a scoreless first quarter, Mauck then threw three TD passes over the final seven minutes of the second quarter to put the Tigers up 21-0 at halftime. Shyrone Carey added a 1-yard run midway through the third quarter to give LSU a 28-0 advantage and the Tigers stretched the margin to 35-0 with a 31-yard interception return just 16 seconds later. Louisiana-Monroe scored its only points of the contest on a 12-yard run by Kevin Payne with 14:10 left in the fourth quarter. Freshman Alley Broussard capped the scoring for the Tigers with a 1-yard run with 10:39 left in the contest. For the game, the Tigers racked up 474 yards of offense (306 passing, 168 rushing) compared to just 240 yard for the Indians (59 rushing, 181 passing).

LSU Storms Past Arizona, 59-13, In The Desert

LSU scored on its first seven possessions, including a 15-play, 80-yard drive to open the contest, as the Tigers had little trouble with Arizona, posting a 59-13 win over the Wildcats in Tucson, Ariz. Quarterbacks Matt Mauck and Marcus Randall combined to connect on 19 of 25 passes for 299 yards and two TDs and Joseph Addai rushed for 86 yards and a pair of scores to lead the Tigers. Mauck Passes Tigers Past Western Illinois, 35-7

LSU QB Matt Mauck connected on 23 of 32 passes for a career-best 305 yards and four TDs as the Tigers overcame a slow start to post a 35-7 win over Western Illinois last Saturday in Tiger Stadium. Shyrone Carey rushed for a career-best 124 yards and a TD to lead the Tiger ground attack, while Michael Clayton hauled in 11 receptions for 162 yards and a score. Defensively, Corey Webster intercepted two passes for the Tigers. On its first possession, LSU marched 58 yards on 10 plays and took a 6-0 lead on a 10-yard pass from Mauck to Clayton. The Tigers, who fumbled twice inside the Western Illinois 15-yard line in the first quarter, led 13-0 at halftime after a 1-yard TD run by Carey. After an on-side kick to start the second half, the Leathernecks cut the deficit to 13-7 on a 3-yard TD pass from Russ Michna to Terrence Hall at the 10:08 mark in the third quarter. It was all LSU from there as Mauck threw TD passes of 8 and 40 yards to Skyler Green to stretch the advantage to 28-7. The Tigers added a final score on a 16-yard TD pass from Mauck to Devery Henderson midway through the fourth quarter.

Mauck-To-Green Leads LSU Past No. 7 Georgia, 17-10

Matt Mauck connected with Skyler Green for a 34-yard touchdown pass with 1:22 left in the contest as 10th-ranked LSU knocked off seventh-ranked Georgia, 17-10, before a record crowd of 92,251 in Tiger Stadium. The win lifted LSU to 4-0 overall and 1-0 in SEC action and it marked the first Tiger victory over a top 10 team in Tiger Stadium since a 28-21 win over No. 1 Florida in 1997. The Tigers led 7-3 at halftime thanks in part to an outstanding defensive effort by LSU over the first 30 minutes. In the first half alone, Georgia got inside the LSU 30-yard line five times and came up with only three points. Trailing 3-0, the Tigers took a 7-3 lead on a 21-yard run by Shyrone Carey with 3:10 left in the first half. The Tigers extended their margin to 10-3 on a 47-yard field goal by Ryan Gaudet at the 6:23 mark in the third quarter. LSU appeared to have the game in hand, but a fumble by Mauck at the Georgia 15-yard line with less than 5 minutes left gave the Bulldogs another chance. Two players later Georgia's David Greene hit Tyson Browning on a screen pass, which he took 93 yards for a touchdown to tie the score at 10-10. Devery Henderson returned the ensuing kickoff 48 yards to the LSU 49-yard line to setup the game-winning touchdown for the Tigers. Georgia got into LSU territory in the final minute, but an interception by Corey Webster at the 22-yard line sealed the Tiger victory.

Opportunistic Tigers Feast on Mississippi State, 41-6

LSU turned three Mississippi State turnovers into 21 points and the Tiger defense limited the Bulldogs to only 31 yards rushing as LSU rolled to a 41-6 win in Starkville. After a slow start, LSU took a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by Shyrone Carey. Leading 10-0 after a Ryan Gaudet field goal, the Tigers stretched the margin to 17-0 midway through the second quarter on another 1-yard run by Carey. Carey's second TD was setup by an interception by Jack Hunt, who returned the pick to the MSU 1-yard line. The Tigers led 24-0 at half-time after Travis Daniels returned an interception 48-yards for a TD with less than a minute remaining in the first half. MSU then fumbled on its third play of the second half and the Tigers struck again one play later, this time Matt Mauck connected with Devery Henderson for a 36-yard TD pass to stretch the lead to 31-0. LSU led 34-0 before MSU finally scored with just over 10 minutes left in the contest. For the game, Mauck completed 12 of 19 passes for 171 yards and 1 TD, while Justin Vincent led the Tigers with 58 yards rushing and 1 TD on six carries. Carey added 50 yards rushing and 2 TDs on 13 carries. Henderson led all receivers with a career-best seven receptions for 114 yards and a score. Defensively, the Tigers sacked MSU quarterback Kevin Fant five times and limited the Bulldogs to only 239 yards of offense.

Flat Tigers Fall to Florida, 19-7

A flat LSU football team couldn't overcome a series of penalties and a key injury to starting running back Joseph Addai as the Tigers dropped their first game of the season to Florida, 19-7, in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers actually scored the first points of the game as Skyler Green, subbing for an injured Shyrone Carey, returned a first quarter punt 80-yards for a touchdown and a 7-0 LSU lead. Florida responded with a 13-play drive to tie the game at 7-7 on a 22-yard pass from Chris Leak to Ran Carthon. The Gators took the lead for good at 10-7 on a 29-yard field goal by Matt Leach at the 3:17 mark in the first quarter. The Gators led 13-7 at halftime after another field goal by Leach. Florida extended its lead to 19-7 on a 35-yard pass from Leak to Ciatric Fason with 5:21 left in the third quarter. The Tigers had a couple of chances to get back in the game negated, one by a penalty and another on a fumble. A penalty wiped out a 42-yard pass from Matt Mauck to Michael Clayton in the third quarter that would have given the Tigers the ball at the Florida 28-yard line. Then late in the fourth quarter with the game still in doubt, Mauck hit Devery Henderson in stride with a pass to the Florida 31-yard line, which he then fumbled away at the UF 14-yard line. For the game, the Tigers sacked Leak six times and forced another Florida turnover on the LSU 1-yard line. Mauck completed 19 of 33 passes for 231 yards and a pair of interceptions, while Leak led Florida with 18 of 30 passing for 229 yards and 2 TDs.

Tigers Ride Freshman Running Backs to 33-7 Win Over South Carolina

True freshman running backs Justin Vincent, Alley Broussard and Barrington Edwards combined to rush for 222 yards and 2 TDs and quarterback Matt Mauck connected on 24 of 30 passes for 199 yards and 2 scores as 10th-ranked LSU rolled past South Carolina, 33-7, in Columbia. Playing without its two starting running backs in Joseph Addai and Shyrone Carey, who were both out with knee injuries, the Tigers rushed for a season-high 263 yards on 52 carries. LSU finished with 482 yards off offense, while holding South Carolina to only 254 yards of offense, including zero rushing yards. LSU jumped out to a 19-0 first half lead and never looked back in cruising to the victory. LSU had first half drives of 21-plays and 97 yards and 14-plays and 91 yards that both culminated in touchdowns, the second of which gave LSU a 19-0 lead on a 1-yard run by Vincent just before halftime. South Carolina pulled to within 19-7 after a 77-yard TD early in the third quarter before LSU linebacker Jason LeDoux put the game out of reach with a 15-yard fumble return for a touchdown later in the quarter. Vincent added another 1-yard run midway through the fourth quarter for LSU's final point. Broussard led LSU with 108 yards rushing on 19 attempts, while Vincent had 77 yards and 2 TDs rushing and added another 46 yards receiving on four receptions.

LSU Shuts Down Cadillac, Auburn in 31-7 Win

In a game that featured the nation's top rushing defense in LSU against one of the best at running the football in Auburn, LSU came out on top, limiting Auburn to 50 yards rushing in a 31-7 win in Tiger Stadium. LSU struck early and often in the game as the Tigers rolled up 21 first half points and never looked back in posting its biggest win over Auburn since a 35-7 victory in 1972. Matt Mauck connected with Devery Henderson on a 64-yard scoring pass on the sixth play of the game for a 7-0 LSU lead. After the LSU defense stopped Auburn on a fourth-and-one at the 48-yard line, the Tigers needed only six more plays for take a 14-0 advantage as Mauck found Michael Clayton for an 18-yard TD. Alley Broussard capped the first quarter scoring with a 5-yard run for a 21-0 LSU lead, which is where the game stood at halftime. Ryan Gaudet kicked a 33-yard field goal and then Mauck hit Henderson for another TD pass to give the Tigers a 31-0 lead in the third quarter. Auburn, who was held to only 193 yards of offense, scored its only points late in the fourth quarter. For the game, Justin Vincent led the Tigers with 127 yards rushing, while Mauck completed 17 of 28 passes for 224 yards and 3 TDs. Henderson caught 6 passes for 101 yards and 2 TDs, while Clayton had 6 catches for 59 yards and 1 score. The LSU defense limited Cadillac Williams, who was considered a Heisman Trophy Candidate, to 61 yards on 20 carries.

LSU Dominates Louisiana Tech in 49-10 Homecoming Win

LSU quarterback Matt Mauck completed his first 14 passes, four of which went for touchdowns, as the seventh-ranked Tigers dominated Louisiana Tech in every phase of the game in a 49-10 win over the Bulldogs. For the game, the Tigers racked up a season-high 653 yards of offense - 372 passing, 281 rushing, while holds Tech's high-powered passing attack to only 220 yards. The contest was never in doubt as LSU scored on five of its first six offensive possessions to take a 49-3 lead at halftime. The Tigers led 28-0 after 15 minutes and then tacked on another score just seconds into the second quarter for a 35-0 advantage. Josh Scobee finally got Tech on the board with a 29-yard field goal early in the second quarter. LSU followed that with scoring plays of 50 yards on a Mauck to Devery Henderson pass and then a 22-yard TD run by Alley Broussard. For the game, Mauck tied an LSU single-game record by completing 14 straight passes and he set the school-record for completion percentage as he connected on 18 of 20 passes for 311 yards. Broussard led the Tiger ground game with 106 yards and 1 TD on 16 carries, while Barrington Edwards added 66 yards on 11 attempts. Skler Green led all LSU receivers with nine catches for 103 yards and 1 TD. Defensively, Tiger safety Jack Hunt scored on a 29-yard interception return.

Tiger Defense Shuts Down Alabama, 27-3

Matt Mauck threw for 251 yards and 2 TDs and LSU's defense limited Alabama to only 65 yards rushing as the third-ranked Tigers dominated the Crimson Tide, 27-3. The Tigers jumped on Alabama early, taking a 10-0 lead on a 23-yard TD pass from Matt Mauck to Michael Clayton. The Tigers, who held the Crimson Tide without a first down in the first quarter, took a 17-0 lead late in the second quarter on a 3-yard TD pass from Mauck to Eric Edwards. The Tigers tacked on another score to run the margin to 24-0 on a 4-yard run by Alley Broussard mid-way through the third quarter. Chris Jackson added a 33-yard field goal for a 27-0 LSU lead before Alabama's Brian Bostick put the Crimson Tide's only points on the scoreboard with a 27-yard field goal with 6:39 left in the contest. For the game, LSU held Shaud Williams, the SEC's top rusher, to only 29 yards (85 yards below his season average of 114.0 per game). Michael Clayton led all LSU receivers with a career-best 12 catches for 130 yards and 1 score, while the Tigers got a balanced rushing attack with freshmen Justin Vincent rushing for 83 yards on 16 carries and Broussard 79 yards and 1 TD on 11 attempts.
