Tigers Travel to Face Kentucky at Cliff Hagan Stadium

Fifth-ranked LSU (34-12, 12-9) returns to SEC action this weekend as the Tigers travel to Lexington to face Kentucky (20-23, 5-16) in a three-game SEC series at Cliff Hagan Stadium.

First pitch for Game 1 of the LSU-Kentucky series is 5:30 p.m. CDT Friday, Game 2 is set for 1 p.m. CDT Saturday and Game 3 will be played at Noon CDT Sunday.

The games can be heard statewide on the LSU Sports Network (WDGL-FM 98.1 in Baton Rouge). All three games can also be heard on the internet at www.LSUsports.net.

Sunday's game will be televised by Jumbo Sports Network (Cable Ch. 13 in Baton Rouge). There is no live television coverage of the games on Friday and Saturday.

LSU trails first-place Arkansas (15-6) by three games in the SEC Western Division standings with nine games remaining in the conference regular season.

The Tigers won two of three games versus Alabama last weekend in Baton Rouge, as LSU has captured eight of its last nine SEC series over the past two seasons.

For the second straight week, LSU posted a series win over the team with the league's best ERA. The Tigers won two of three at Tennessee (April 23-25) when the Volunteers had the SEC's top ERA, and LSU defeated Alabama, which was No. 1 in the league in ERA entering last weekend's play.

Kentucky is in sixth place in the SEC Eastern Division, and the Wildcats have lost four straight games, including a 9-6 decision versus Louisville Wednesday night. Kentucky was swept last weekend by Georgia in a three-game SEC series at Athens.

The LSU-Kentucky Series

LSU leads the all-time series with Kentucky, 29-13, and this weekend's series marks the teams' first meeting since 2001, when the Tigers won two of three games in Baton Rouge.

LSU has won its last five series (1995, '98, '99, 2000, '01) versus Kentucky, posting a 12-3 mark against the Wildcats during that span.

The Tigers have won five of their last six games played in Lexington, as LSU swept UK in 1998 and won two of three games in 2000.

UK last won a series over LSU in 1994, as the Wildcats won the first two games of the series in Lexington before Game 3 was rained out.

LSU coach Smoke Laval faces Kentucky this weekend for the first time in his 10-year head coaching career, while first-year UK coach John Cohen, the head coach at Northwestern (La.) State from 1998-2001, has a 2-3 career mark against LSU.

Highlights of LSU's Series Victory Over Alabama Last Weekend

- LSU won two of three games over Alabama last weekend in Baton Rouge, marking the Tigers' fifth straight series victory over the Crimson Tide. Alabama last defeated LSU in an SEC series in 1999 in Tuscaloosa.

- The Tigers' win marked their ninth victory in their last 10 SEC series, dating back to the 2003 season. The only series loss in that span came to Arkansas earlier this season (April 9-11).

- Sophomore right-hander Justin Meier, LSU's scheduled starter on Saturday at Kentucky, returned to the Tigers' weekend rotation last weekend after a two-week absence, and he responded with a strong outing against Alabama in the Game 2 victory. Meier worked 7.2 innings, allowing just one run on eight hits with one walk and three strikeouts.

- Designated hitter Nick Stavinoha helped lead LSU to wins in Games 2 and 3 against Alabama, batting .429 (3-for-7) with one double, one sacrifice fly and three RBI. Stavinoha's two-out RBI single in the bottom of the eighth inning lifted the Tigers to a 2-1 victory in Game 2 of the series.

- Blake Gill, starting at shortstop for LSU for the first time in two weeks, sparked the Tigers to the Game 3 win over Bama, as he went 2-for-3 with a home run, his second this season. Gill, who has been bothered recently by a fractured finger on his glove hand, was perfect in the field over the weekend, posting seven assists and two put-outs without an error.

Tigers Post Win Over No. 13 Tulane in the Superdome Before 21,343 Fans

LSU posted a 9-5 victory over No. 13 Tulane on April 27 in the Louisiana Superdome. The game was played before a paid crowd of 21,343, the fourth-largest regular-season attendance figure in NCAA baseball history.

The Tigers are now 10-5 this season when facing a ranked team. LSU has won two of three games against five teams that have appeared in at least one of the Top 25 polls -- Central Florida, South Carolina, Auburn, Tennessee and Tulane.

LSU center fielder J.C. Holt launched a three-run homer that highlighted a five-run fourth inning, and left fielder Ryan Patterson doubled and scored three runs.

Junior left-hander Lane Mestephey turned in his longest outing of the season to earn the win over Tulane, scattering 11 hits over 7.1 innings. Right-hander Jordan Faircloth earned his third save of the year, worked 1.2 shutout innings with three strikeouts. Faircloth, who inherited a one-out, bases-loaded jam in the eighth, recorded a strikeout and a groundout to end the threat.

J.C. Holt Named to Golden Spikes Award Watch List

Junior center fielder J.C. Holt, a native of Sieper, La., is one of 30 players on the USA Baseball Watch List for the 2004 Golden Spikes Award. The award is presented annually to the nation's outstanding amateur baseball player.

Holt, the 2003 MVP of the Cape Cod League, is LSU's second-leading hitter this season, batting .401 (77-for-192) with 15 doubles, three triples, five homers, 34 RBI, 58 runs and 14 stolen bases. Holt leads the SEC in hits and runs scored, and he is No. 3 in batting average.

LSU has had one Golden Spikes Award winner in his history -- right-handed pitcher Ben McDonald captured the award in 1989, the year he was the nation's No. 1 overall draft pick by the Baltimore Orioles.

Clay Harris Named SEC Player of the Week April 5

LSU first baseman Clay Harris, who led LSU to a series victory at Auburn April 2-4, was named SEC Player of the Week by the league office on April 5.

Harris enjoyed a superb week, batting .467 (7-for-15) in four games with three homers, one double, eight RBI, six runs, a 1.133 slugging percentage and a .500 on-base percentage. Harris hit .455 (5-for-11) in the Auburn series with two homers, one double, seven RBI, three runs, a 1.091 slugging percentage and a .462 on-base percentage.

Harris, who led LSU in home runs last season with 16, entered the week with just one this season; however, he homered in three straight games to raise his total to four.

His solo shot at UNO on March 30 broke a 23-game drought without a homer. Harris hit a two-out, two-run blast in the top of the ninth inning April 2 at Auburn to send the game to extra innings, and his eighth-inning solo homer April 3 at Auburn tied the contest at 3-3 as LSU went on to a 5-3 win.

Harris broke a scoreless tie on April 4 at Auburn with a seventh-inning RBI single, sparking the Tigers to a 3-2 victory.

Matt Liuzza Named to Johnny Bench Award Watch List

LSU catcher **Matt Liuzza**, a sophomore from Metairie, La., was named March 22 as the SEC Player of the Week after leading the Tigers to a series victory at South Carolina.

Liuzza hit three homers and one double in the series, collecting five RBI and posting a .933 slugging percentage. He hit two homers in Game 3 (a 12-7 victory), becoming the first LSU player to have a multi-homer game this season.

Liuzza's two homers came against USC ace Matt Campbell, who had not allowed run in 27.2 innings entering the game. Liuzza hit a solo shot in the second inning to tie the game at 1-1, and his three-run blast in the fourth gave the Tigers a 4-1 lead they would never relinquish.

Liuzza was 6-for-15 (.353) at the plate in LSU's four games from March 16-21 -- including a 14-0 victory over UNO -- with one double, four homers, seven RBI and five runs.

Liuzza compiled a 14-game streak -- the longest of his career -- from Feb. 14-March 12, exceeding the 12-game streak he compiled during the 2003 season. During the 2004 streak, Liuzza batted .407 (22-for-54) with five doubles, two homers, 13 RBI and 10 runs.

Liuzza's name appears on the Johnny Bench Award "Watch List" released in early March. The Johnny Bench Award is given annually to the nation's outstanding collegiate catcher. Former LSU Brad Cresse was the first recipient of the award in 2000.

The 2004 Johnny Bench Award ceremony will take place on June 30, in Wichita, Kan.

Dirks Named To Roger Clemens Award Watch List

Freshman left-hander **Clay Dirks'** name has been added to the "Watch List" for the 2004 Roger Clemens Award, which is given to the nation's outstanding collegiate pitcher. The "Cy Young Award" of college baseball, the Clemens Award ceremony will take place on July 15 in Houston.

In a four-hit shutout of Tulane on March 2, Dirks allowed just two Green Wave runners to reach second base, and he retired 20 of the final 22 batters he faced. For that effort, Dirks was named the SEC Pitcher of the Week by the league office, and he earned National Pitcher of the Week recognition from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Dirks, a redshirt freshman from Hernando, Miss., allowed just one double and three singles against Tulane, and recorded one walk and seven strikeouts. Dirks, who was making just the third start of his collegiate career, missed the 2003 season after undergoing surgery on his elbow in the summer of 2002.

The LSU Injury Report

INF Bryan Harris -- Harris, a transfer from Santa Ana (Calif.) College, was projected to be the Tigers' starter at third base; however, a hernia operation limited his participation during fall practice, and he underwent arthroscopic surgery in January to remove bone chips from his right knee. He is scheduled to receive a medical redshirt this season.

INF Matt Horwath -- Horwath, a medical redshirt in 2003 after undergoing right shoulder surgery, started LSU's first seven games at shortstop this season before experiencing soreness in the shoulder. An MRI was performed on the shoulder on March 2, and the results showed no new injuries. Horwath has been cleared to play as long as he does not experience continued soreness in the shoulder.

RHP Brandon Nall -- LSU's closer at the beginning of 2003, he pitched in just six games last season before suffering a torn labrum in his shoulder, which required surgery. He could return to the mound at some point this season, depending upon the progress of his rehabilitation.

OF Quinn Stewart -- A starter in 37 games last season, Stewart had the hamate bone in his left wrist removed in early March, and he will receive a redshirt this season. Even without the wrist injury, Stewart likely would have received a redshirt this year due to the tremendous depth LSU has in the outfield. With current starting outfielders Jon Zeringue, J.C. Holt and Ryan Patterson expected to be drafted this June, Stewart should be one of the outfield starters in 2005.

Smoke Laval

HEAD COACH • THIRD YEAR

Raymond "Smoke" Laval enhanced his reputation as one of the country's top college baseball coaches, as, in just his second season at the helm of the LSU program, he guided the 2003 Tigers to the Southeastern Conference title -- LSU's first since 1997 -- and a berth in the College World Series.

Laval, the 2003 SEC Coach of the Year, directed LSU to a 45-22-1 overall record and a 20-9-1 conference mark, as the Tigers finished No. 5 in the final Baseball America rankings.

The magnificent '03 campaign augmented the success Laval enjoyed in his inaugural season as LSU's coach, as he led the 2002 Tigers to a 44-22 overall mark, an appearance in the NCAA Super Regional and a No. 11 final national ranking.

Laval, who served seven seasons (1994-2000) as the head coach at the University of Louisiana-Monroe, assumed control of the LSU program from Bertman, who led the Tigers to five NCAA championships and 11 College World Series appearances during an 18-year (1984-2001) tenure. Laval worked as Bertman's top assistant coach for 10 seasons (1984-93), helping lead LSU to its first two NCAA titles in 1991 and 1993. During Laval's 10 years as assistant coach, LSU posted a 483-182-1 record, won five SEC titles, appeared in six College World Series and captured two national championships.

Laval was known at LSU as one of the nation's best recruiters and brightest assistant coaches, as the Tigers reached the College World Series in only the third season (1986) of the Bertman-Laval regime. LSU followed the '86 CWS appearance with Omaha berths in 1987, 1989 and 1990 before the Tigers claimed the school's first baseball national title in 1991. After LSU captured its second NCAA crown in 1993, Laval departed Baton Rouge to become the head coach at Northeast Louisiana (now Louisiana-Monroe).

During his assistant coaching tenure at LSU, Laval -- who worked as the Tigers' primary recruiter - tutored 24 players who would eventually reach the major leagues. Some of the major leaguers with whom Laval worked include all-stars Albert Belle and Paul Byrd and first-round pick Todd Walker.

Laval compiled a 241-159 (.603) mark as the head coach at ULM, guiding the Indians to NCAA Regional appearances in 1995, 1999 and 2000.

Laval began his coaching career in 1977 as an assistant at Jacksonville University before moving to Wolfson High School in Jacksonville as a baseball and football coach. He served as a graduate assistant at LSU in 1979 under former Tiger head coach Jack Lamabe before working two years as an assistant at Gulf Coast Community College in Panama City, Fla.

Laval served as an assistant coach at Florida for two seasons (1982-83) before returning to LSU to work under Bertman.

Laval holds a bachelor's degree (1977) from Jacksonville in physical education and a master's degree (1979) from LSU in administration. The McDonald, Pa., native played two seasons at Gulf Coast Community College, where he lettered as a catcher. He completed his playing career at Jacksonville, where he led the ninth-ranked Dolphins in hitting at the 1976 NCAA South Regional.

Laval and his wife, Pam, are the parents of two children, Brandon and Jamie.

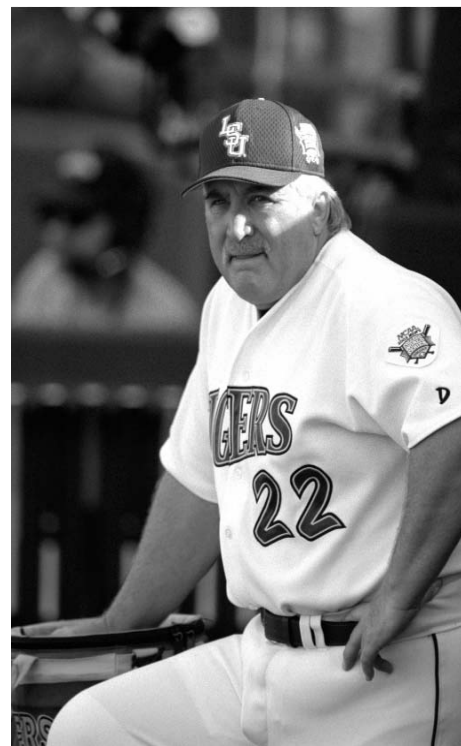
