NCAA Super Regional: LSU at Rice—June 7-9, Reckling Park, Houston

Two wins to go: LSU visits Rice in an NCAA Super Regional with a berth in the College World Series at stake.

- This marks the second straight year LSU is facing a team with 50 wins in a super regional. Tulane was 53-10 prior to last year's series.
- LSU is playing in its fourth super regional in as many years since the format was introduced, one of six schools to achieve the feat.
- The Tigers won three games in just over 24 hours to win the Baton Rouge regional after losing their second game to Louisiana-Lafayette.
- LSU has not won a regional or super regional on an enemy field since the 1989 Central Regional at Texas A&M.

Scouting the Owls: Rice has been at or near the top of the polls all season long, coming in with an impressive 50-12 mark.

- LSU and Rice have two common opponents this season, Houston and Louisiana-Lafayette. LSU was 1-2 vs. UH and Rice was 4-1 against the Cougars, while LSU was 2-3 vs. UL-Lafayette and Rice beat the Cajuns in the teams' only meeting.
- Rice went 3-1 in winning the Houston regional at Reckling Park, defeating Harvard, Texas Tech and Washington after losing the first championship game to the Huskies.
- Rice is in its third super regional in four years, but its first on campus. The Owls hosted UL-Lafayette in the Astrodome in 1999 and visited Nebraska last year.
- Rice has won seven consecutive conference championships—the last Southwest Conference crown in 1996 and six straight since entering the WAC in 1997.
- Rice did not appear in a regional until 1995, but they have made eight consecutive trips under coach Wayne Graham.
- The Owls feature three All-WAC pitchers, led by senior left-hander Justin Crowder, a transfer from TCU who is 9-2 with a 2.04 ERA.
- Rice's top hitter is WAC Player of the Year and National Freshman of the Year candidate Vincent Sinisi, who is batting .438 with 11 home runs and 78 RBI.

About the Series: LSU holds a 10-6 series edge over the Owls.

- LSU won the last meeting between the teams, a 5-4 victory in the opening round of the 1997 College World Series.
- The Owls' first regional visit came in 1995 in Baton Rouge, with Rice eliminating LSU by 15-7 and 16-9 scores. That Rice team featured future major leaguers Matt Anderson, Lance Berkman, Jose Cruz Jr. and Mark Quinn.
- The Tigers last played at Houston in 1990, splitting a two-game set with the Owls (11-12, 13-1).
- LSU and Rice opened the season in both 1971 and 1972, with the Owls winning two of three in Houston in '71 and LSU sweeping three in Baton Rouge the next year.

Super Regional history: LSU is in its fourth super regional, Rice its third.

- LSU is 3-4 super regionals, but 1-4 away from home.
- Rice is 3-2 super regionals, winning two of three from UL-Lafayette in 1999 at the Astrodome and being swept last year by Nebraska in Lincoln.

Tournament history

LSU is 94-32 in NCAA Tournament play and 3-4 in super regional play. The Tigers improved their regional mark to 62-15 last weekend and are 29-13 in the College World Series

Series History

LSU leads, 10-6 (since 1914), but the Tigers haven't played in Houston since splitting two games in 1990.

Last Year

LSU lost last year's super regional 2 games to 1 to Tulane at Zephyr Field. LSU won 4-3 in 13 innings in the opener but lost the next two games 9-4 and 7-1.

LSU has won 14 regional championships (1986-87-89-90-91-93-94-96-97-98-99-00-01-02), and has reached the CWS 11 times, winning national championships in 1991, 1993, 1996, 1997 and 2000.

The winner of the super regional advances to the College World Series and will take on the winner of the Houston-Texas super regional in Austin in a first-round CWS contest.

Game 1 Probable Starting Pitcher

#46 Soph. LH Lane Mestepey (6-0, 187, Zachary–Central Private)

Lane Mestepey pitched 10 strong innings in last year's super regional opener vs. Tulane at Zephyr Field, and looks to turn in another solid outing in the first game of the Super Regional at Rice. The Owls will start junior right-hander Stephen Herce (12-2, 3.07) in the opener.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: Is 11-4 with a 2.66 ERA. Third in the SEC in ERA and first in complete games (8) and innings pitched (135.1).

- A repeat first team All-SEC selection, joining Todd Walker as the only LSU players to be named first team All-SEC as a freshman and sophomore.
- A third team All-America selection by Collegiate Baseball for the second consecutive year.
- Is the only LSU pitcher to win 10 games as both a freshman and a sophomore.
- Did not allow a walk over a span of 33.0 innings from Feb. 23 to Mar. 23.
- Giving up a miniscule 1.13 walks per nine innings (17 in 135.1 IP).
- Has 12 career complete games, and his eight this year are more than 10 of the other 11 teams in the SEC.
- Took loss in regional vs. UL-Lafayette (6/1), as the Tigers were shut out by the Cajuns' Andy Gros.
- Mestepey has received just four runs of support in his four losses this year.
- Pitched Tigers to victory over Auburn in SEC Tournament (5/22) with a complete game six-hitter, allowing Auburn just one run.
- Threw five-hit shutout vs. Alabama (5/18, Game 1), giving up just five singles and allowing only two Crimson Tide runners to reach third base.
- Is now 2-0 with an 0.50 ERA with two complete games lifetime vs. the Crimson Tide.
- Won his 20th game in spectacular fashion vs. Arkansas (4/26), throwing a complete game four-hit shutout for his first career shutout in 35 outings. Took no-decision at Florida (5/10), giving up eight hits in three runs over 7.0+ innings.
- Despite losing to Tennessee (5/4, Game 1), Mestepey allowed just one hit through the first 7.2 innings and four hits for the game.
- Gave up a career high 12 hits in 8.2 innings at South Carolina (4/19), but still earned the win.
- Pitched third complete game of the season and the seventh of his career to defeat Georgia (4/12). Gave up just two runs and struck out five.
- Earned third straight victory with 6.2 innings at Auburn (4/5), allowing just two earned runs and striking out four.
- Walked none in 6.1 innings to improve to 5-2 with win over Mississippi St. (3/30).
- Picked up second complete game victory at Ole Miss (3/23) despite walking a career-high five batters.
- Gave up five runs (four earned) on nine hits in last outing vs. Vanderbilt (3/16).
- Earned second consecutive LSWA Pitcher of the Week honor for effort vs. UL-Monroe (3/9), giving up one run in eight innings.
- Earned complete-game victory at Houston (2/23), giving up just one run on six hits in the final 7.0 innings.
- Followed up Houston game with brilliant 8.0 inning stint vs. Long Beach St. (3/2, Game 2), striking out a career-best eight to improve to 2-0 to earn LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors.

2001: Led the SEC in victories (11) and ERA (3.75), going 11-3 in 22 games (19 starts), pitching 139.1 innings.

- Named the national Freshman of the Year by Collegiate Baseball and was a third team All-American by the same publication.
- Named the 2001 SEC Freshman of the Year and was a first team All-SEC selection.
- Allowed two or fewer earned runs in 11 of 19 starts.
- Yielded only 2.39 walks per nine innings.
- Went 7.1 or more innings in his first eight SEC starts.
- Named SEC Pitcher of the Week on Apr. 16 for sterling Easter Sunday effort vs. Ole Miss. In complete-game victory, Mestepey walked none and scattered nine hits. Was 2-0 with a 1.20 ERA in two outings in 2001 against the Rebels.
- Four days before the Ole Miss victory, he allowed only one earned run over 7.2 innings against Tulane at Zephyr Field.
- Fell just short of shutout on Mar. 24 at Mississippi St., allowing one run and no walks while fanning six over 8.1 innings.
- First complete-game came vs. Kentucky on Mar. 30, giving up one earned run and striking out five.
- Did not lose until Apr. 20 vs. Vanderbilt, and even in that loss, he threw a complete game.
- Turned in spectacular complete-game effort at Alabama on Apr. 27, giving up one earned run and fanning six to start LSU on its way to a three-game sweep in Tuscaloosa. He retired 18 of 19 batters faced in the fourth through eighth innings.
- Allowed no earned runs over 6.0 innings of victory vs. Ole Miss at SEC Tournament May 17.
- Made last effort of the year his best, going 10.0 innings and striking out six in Super Regional at Tulane, a game LSU won in 13 innings.

#38 Soph. RHP Brian Wilson (6-1, 205, Londonderry, N.H.—Londonderry HS)

After a so-so outing vs. Southern in the regional opener, Brian Wilson saved his best for the regional championship, throwing a complete game on one day's rest in the championship game vs. UL-Lafayette. He makes his first super regional start here against Rice.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: Is 10-4 with a 3.56 ERA, ranking 10th in the SEC in ERA.

- Is believed to be the first LSU athlete to hail from New Hampshire; is the first LSU baseball player from the Granite State.
- Second on the team with 22 appearances.
- One of two LSU pitchers with 10 wins.
- Turned in remarkable complete game in regional championship vs. UL-Lafayette (6/2, Game 2), going the distance and giving up just two runs on eight hits. Threw 126 pitches on one day rest after throwing 87 vs. Southern in the regional opener.
- Lasted only 4.0 innings in regional opener vs. Southern (5/31), giving up nine hits and two runs.
- Went 7.0 innings to earn victory vs. South Carolina in SEC Tournament (5/23), giving up just two earned runs despite yielding 11 hits.
- Earned victory vs. Alabama (5/18, Game 2), giving up four runs over 5.1 innings and striking out five.
- Gave up six runs on eight hits in taking loss at Florida (5/11), striking out just one and walking four in 6.1 innings.
- Fanned a career high 11 batters over 8.0 innings to improve to 7-3 at Tennessee (5/4). Did not allow a run over his final seven innings after spotting the Vols a 4-0 lead.
- Named the SEC Pitcher of the Week for his three-hit shutout against Arkansas (4/27)
- In the shutout of the Razorbacks, he did not allow a runner to reach third base and tied a career high with eight strikeouts. Prior to that game, his previous high for innings pitched was 7.0, done twice.
- Struck out a career high eight despite losing at South Carolina (4/20).
- Made first start of 2002 a smashing success, going 7.0 innings and giving up no earned runs against Georgia (4/13).
- Has been victimized by LSU defense, as he has yielded 12 unearned runs this year.
- Pitched superb in relief at Auburn (4/7), striking out five and walking none over 4.2 innings to earn victory.
 - In game at Auburn, retired 14 of 15 batters he faced in the second through sixth innings.
- Earned victory in season opener against Birmingham-Southern (2/8), giving up no earned runs in 1.2 innings.
- Worked 1.2 scoreless innings of relief to earn second victory at Centenary (2/20).
- Took tough loss at Houston (2/24), as three ninth-inning errors led to three Cougar runs.
- Hurlled 3.0 scoreless innings of relief to earn victory in 11-inning triumph over Long Beach St. (3/3).
 - Marked the third time in his career Wilson has thrown three scoreless innings.
- Earned two saves in series against UL-Monroe (3/8, 3/10). Threw scoreless ninth inning in 4-3 win in opener against ULM.
- Took another hard loss against Vanderbilt (3/17), giving up three unearned runs in the ninth inning. LSU had taken a 7-5 lead, but Wilson could not convert the save.
- Yielded one earned run in 3.0 innings at UL-Lafayette (3/19).
- Gave up game-winning grand slam to Ole Miss' Josh Christian in 10-7 Tiger setback (3/24).
- Struck out six in 4.0 innings of relief vs. Mississippi St. (3/29).

2001: Was 3-2 with a 5.67 ERA and 3 saves in 20 appearances.

- Came of age in opener of NCAA super regional against Tulane (June 1). In front of more than 11,000 at Zephyr Field, he threw three scoreless innings in the 11th, 12th and 13th to help LSU to a 4-3 victory.
- Gave up just two earned runs in 7.0 innings in the NCAA Tournament.
- Earned first career save by throwing scoreless ninth inning at Alabama (Apr. 28).
- Pitched 1.1 innings of relief to earn save in regional opener vs. Minnesota (May 25).
- Picked up regional-clinching save with 2.2 strong innings vs. VCU (May 27).
- Gave up two runs and failed to retire a batter in his first career outing vs. Kansas St. in the season opener (Feb. 10).
- Made his first career start on Mar. 6 against Southern, giving up four runs (three earned) in 4.2 innings.
- Got first LSU victory vs. UNO (Apr. 3), allowing just two runs in 7.0 innings.
- Took loss in first career SEC start at South Carolina (Apr. 8), going 4.2 innings and giving up four runs on three hits.
- Got second win at UL-Monroe (Apr. 26), throwing three scoreless innings and allowing just one hit.

Bo Pettit's complete game vs. Tulane in the regional kept the Tigers alive. This weekend, he returns home to Houston for the second time this year to face Rice in the super regional in what will hopefully be the Tigers' springboard to the College World Series.

2002: Is 9-7 with a 3.35 ERA with 121 strikeouts in 121.0 innings pitched.

- A 13th-round draft choice by the Minnesota Twins.
- Is healthy for the first time in his career and has been part of starting rotation the entire season.

The "Super Six" stays intact

Going into last weekend, there were six teams who had participated in all three NCAA super regional tournaments when the format was introduced in 1999. Now, heading into super regional weekend, the "super six" have all returned.

LSU, Clemson, Miami, Florida State, Stanford and USC are back in super regional play for the fourth consecutive year. Of this group, Stanford is the only one to advance to Omaha in each of the three years. USC, FSU and Miami have been two of the last three years to Omaha, while LSU and Clemson both made it in 2000.

Of the six teams who have played in every super regional, only Stanford has hosted every year. LSU and USC have been on the road in three of the four super regionals, while Miami and Clemson have hosted twice and Florida State has hosted in three of four years.

Return to Space City

The opponent may be different, but for the third time in as many super regional trips, LSU is playing in a city it visited during the same regular season.

The Tigers were in Houston back in February to battle Houston in a three-game series at Cougar Field, with the Cougars winning two of three (3-11, 8-4, 11-12). Now, the Tigers get their shot at Houston's other college baseball power, Rice, this weekend at Reckling Park.

Last year, LSU played Tulane at Zephyr Field in the super regional after playing there three times in the regular season, and in 1999, the Tigers played Alabama in a super regional after facing the Crimson Tide in a three-game SEC series in Tuscaloosa.

LSU is 11-13 all-time in Houston—5-4 against Rice and 6-9 against Houston.

Enemy Turf

For the third time in four super regionals, LSU finds itself on enemy turf, something the Tigers haven't managed well in super regionals.

LSU is 1-4 as the visiting team in super regionals, going 0-2 at Alabama in 1999 and 1-2 at Tulane last year. In all NCAA Tournament games, LSU is 5-4 on an opponents' field, winning twice in 1987 at the University of New Orleans and twice in 1989 at Texas A&M.



Texas-sized memories

This weekend marks the Tigers' third post-season foray into the state of Texas, and LSU and Rice will be hard-pressed to duplicate the drama that was involved in LSU's last post-season trip to the Lone Star State.

It came back in 1989 at the Central Regional in College Station. LSU was the number two seed, but shadow cast by number one seed Texas A&M was imposing, as the Aggies entered the regional at 55-5 and ranked first for most of the season.

LSU fought through the loser's bracket to reach the final, then defeated the Aggies 13-5 to set up a second championship game, which LSU won 5-4 in 12 innings on a double by seldom-used reserve Pat Garrity.

The 1989 Tigers, led by Golden Spikes winner Ben McDonald and future Ole Miss coach Mike Bianco, would finish third at Omaha behind Texas and national champion Wichita State.

LSU's first visit to Texas for post-season play wasn't as pleasant. In 1985, Skip Bertman made his first regional appearance and the Tigers' first since 1975, but it proved to be short, as Houston and Lamar eliminated the Tigers in Austin.

You can go home again

Earlier this season, LSU pitcher Bo Pettit made his first appearance in Houston since his high school days at Sharpstown High. Unfortunately for Pettit, things didn't go so well, as he gave up five runs on 10 hits in an 11-3 Houston victory at Cougar Field.

Fast-forward to this weekend, where Pettit enters the super regional at Rice brimming with confidence and eager to help the Tigers reach their 12th College World Series.

Pettit has pitched three consecutive complete games heading into the super regional, including a seven-hitter last Saturday against Tulane to keep the Tigers alive in the regional. In the win over the Green Wave, Pettit threw 145 pitches and struck out 11, just one shy of his career high of 12 done on February 15 vs. Mercer and again on March 15 vs. Vanderbilt.

In his last five starts, Pettit is 4-1 with a 2.20 ERA and three complete games, leaving him 9-7 with a 3.35 ERA on the year.

Battle of the Top 10

Texans like to say everything is bigger and better in the Lone Star State, and this weekend, that's certainly true on the college baseball diamond.

LSU and Rice will be involved in one of only two best-of-three series that features a collision of two top-10 teams. The Owls are second in all three polls, while the Tigers are eighth in the Baseball America poll and ninth in the Collegiate Baseball survey. The ESPN/Baseball Weekly poll had LSU ranked 14th heading into the regional, but a new poll will not be taken until after the College World Series.

Meanwhile, just 160 miles to the west in Austin, third-ranked Texas welcomes sixth-ranked Houston in a showdown of former Southwest Conference rivals.

If you look at the pseudo-RPIs provided by Boyd Nation on his web site (www.boydsworld.com), the LSU-Rice and UH-Texas matchups are the only two with a pair of top-10 RPIs, as the Tigers come in seventh and the Owls 10th. Houston is sixth in this week's unofficial RPI while Texas is eighth.

Tigers facing another 50-win team

For the second straight year, LSU has the unenviable task of trying to defeat a 50-win team on the road in a super regional.

The Tigers face 50-12 Rice this weekend in Houston just one year after facing a 53-10 Tulane team at Zephyr Field. The Wave won two of three to advance its first College World Series.

LSU hosted a UCLA team in 2000 that was just 38-24 in the super regional, while facing an Alabama team that was 49-14 in 1999 at Tuscaloosa.



Smoke the rookie

Even if LSU falls short of its 12th College World Series berth since 1986, first-year coach Smoke Laval can take pride in the fact he is the charter member of an exclusive fraternity that currently includes one member—himself.

When the Tigers beat Louisiana-Lafayette twice on Sunday to qualify for its fourth straight super regional, Laval became the first coach to pilot a team to a super regional in his first season at the school. Laval is one of five first-time coaches in this year's super regional (Arkansas, Notre Dame, Florida Atlantic and Richmond are all in the super regionals for the first time), but the only one to be in his first year at his current school.

If LSU can defeat Rice twice in Houston this weekend, Laval would become the first coach to lead a school to Omaha in his first year since Pat McMahon took Mississippi State to the CWS in 1998 after succeeding Ron Polk.

Laval is only two wins away from becoming the most successful first-year coach in SEC history. McMahon went 46-18 at Florida this year, but the Gators' season was ended by Miami this past weekend in Gainesville. Laval and McMahon (who was 42-23 in his first year at MSU in '98) moved ahead of the previous record holder, former Florida coach Joe Arnold, who was 43-16-1 in his first year in Gainesville in 1984.

Tompkins takes two, regional MVP honors

Jake Tompkins showed why he was named second team All-SEC last weekend in the Baton Rouge regional, turning in two performances that earned him Most Outstanding Player honors.

It started on Friday against Southern, when he relieved Brian Wilson and limited the Jaguars to two runs over five innings, getting out of a bases loaded jam in the fifth and eventually earning the win when the Tigers scored the winning run in the bottom of the ninth.

Less than 48 hours later, Tompkins found himself starting the first championship round game against UL-Lafayette, and he did not allow the Cajuns an earned run over 6.1 innings to pick up his second win of the weekend. In the regional, Tompkins was 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA and 13 strikeouts, lowering his season ERA to 2.71 and raising his record to 7-1. He has also allowed just one hit in 13 bases-loaded situations and has left 18 of 20 inherited runners stranded on base. Tompkins, who did not pitch at Houston in February due to an injury, is 7-1 with a 2.71 ERA on the year.

Tigers pull rug from under ULL

When the sun came up Sunday morning, LSU knew the task ahead was daunting: trying to defeat a UL-Lafayette team that had held the Tigers to one run in 27 innings not once, but twice, in one day.

Not only did LSU overcome that barrier, they blew it down with the force of a category five hurricane.

After collecting a single run on 21 hits in three losses to the Cajuns during the season, LSU exploded for 24 runs on 30 hits in sweeping ULL into the post-season.

In another big turnaround, LSU limited the Cajuns to just four runs after giving up 14 in the first three games.

This reversal of fortune may be a great omen. The last time LSU lost to a team three or more times without a win was to Florida in 1996, when the Gators went 4-0 against LSU (one win in the SEC Tournament, three in Gainesville in the regular season), but the Tigers reversed fortune in Omaha by winning twice at the CWS en route to their third national championship.

Familiarity still breeds winning

As was proven again this past weekend, if LSU sees an opponent in the regional it already saw in the regular season, more often than not it equals victory for the Bayou Bengals.

LSU is now 30-5 all-time in NCAA Tournament play when the Tigers face an opponent it already played in the regular season, including a 4-1 mark this weekend. Other than last Saturday's setback to UL-Lafayette, the other four losses were in super regional play—two to Alabama in 1999 and two last year to Tulane.

Tigers face rare WAC foe

This weekend marks the first time LSU has taken on a team from the Western Athletic Conference since—well, the meeting with Rice in the 1997 College World Series, which LSU won 5-4.

Rice, Louisiana Tech and Fresno State are the only current WAC schools LSU has played in baseball, although the Tigers haven't played Tech since 1998 and Fresno State just twice, in the 1991 College World Series and the 1994 regional at Baton Rouge. LSU also played SMU twice in 1967, although the Mustangs dropped the sport in 1981 when they were in the SWC.



Wilson guts it out

LSU right-hander Brian Wilson was looking for redemption after struggling in the regional opener vs. Southern, as he was pulled in the fifth inning after giving up two runs on nine hits.

He didn't have to wait long for that chance. The sophomore from New Hampshire got the start in the decisive game against UL-Lafayette and turned in maybe the most courageous pitching performance in LSU's storied history.

Working on about 49 hours' rest, Wilson went the distance and threw 126 pitches in the 12-2 triumph over the Ragin' Cajuns, striking out seven and scattering eight hits to pick up his 10th victory of the season. Not bad for a converted reliever that twice gave up late-inning leads on consecutive Sundays to Vanderbilt and Ole Miss in March.

For the regional, Wilson threw 213 pitches, including 87 against Southern. His previous high for pitches was 125 on April 27 in a complete game shutout of Arkansas.

Since March 30, Wilson is 7-2 with a 3.48 ERA with 50 strikeouts as LSU has gone 28-8 in that stretch.

Phillips goes out in style

Four months ago, few, if any, could have envisioned LSU catcher Chris Phillips going out the way he did in his final home game of the regional on Sunday night.

The senior from Shreveport drove in a run in his final Alex Box Stadium at-bat, drawing a standing ovation from the capacity crowd. Phillips then tipped his batting helmet in grateful appreciation.

Phillips was 3-for-5 in the decisive game and a combined 5-for-9 on Sunday, giving him a .421 batting average for the regional (8-for-19) to earn a spot on the all-tournament team. More importantly, Phillips was a perfect 4-for-4 in the regional with runners in scoring position, leaving his season average at a remarkable .455, sensational for a hitter who has been eighth or ninth in the lineup virtually all season.

Phillips, whose season average stands at .349 heading into the super regional, is the Tigers' leading hitter in the post-season, batting .419 overall and an amazing .857 (6-for-7) with RISP. Since March 30, Phillips is hitting a cool .388 and has collected 35 of his 44 RBI on the season in helping the Tigers go 28-8 during that stretch.

Holt collects a pair of four-hit games

J.C. Holt recovered from a 3-for-16 SEC Tournament in most emphatic fashion last weekend in the regional, leading the Tigers in hitting with an even .500 mark (11-for-22), including a pair of triples as the true freshman second baseman earned all-tournament team honors.

Holt opened and closed the regional in most emphatic fashion, going 4-for-5 in the opening-round win over Southern, including the triple that led to his game-winning run, then going 4-for-6 in the decisive triumph over UL-Lafayette. Holt now has a team-high four games of four hits, joining a 4-for-5 effort on April 13 vs. Georgia and a 4-for-6 ledger on April 28 vs. Arkansas. Holt tied a career high with three runs scored, which he also did in the aforementioned Arkansas game.

Holt's .358 batting average leaves him second behind Sean Barker (.383), and he has now taken over the team lead in triples with six. Since March 30, Holt is batting .409 with a .463 on-base percentage and a surprising .600 slugging mark.

Scelfo earns stripes

The most surprising LSU selection to the all-regional team had to have been Rocky Scelfo, who was chosen as the first baseman on the team.

The Lafayette native certainly earned the honor, batting .357 in the five regional games, including a 3-for-4 effort in the Tigers' loss to UL-Lafayette last Saturday. The three-hit game was Scelfo's second, joining a 3-for-5 effort on April 14 vs. Georgia.

But it was Scelfo's versatility that saved the day for LSU. Scelfo was forced to start at shortstop in Sunday's second game after Aaron Hill was suspended for the final tilt after flinging his bat into the ULL dugout. Scelfo handled all three chances flawlessly and contributed an RBI single that gave LSU a 5-1 lead in the fourth inning.

Welch goes deep for first time as a Tiger

When reserve catcher Darren Welch stepped to the plate on Sunday in the ninth inning of the first game against UL-Lafayette, he was 3-for-33 on the year and hadn't had a hit since March 10.

Welch, a senior transfer from Southern Miss, made his fourth hit of the year special with a three-run home run. It was Welch's first RBI since February 9 against Birmingham-Southern in the season's second game.



Mestepey earns third team All-America honors
The awards keep rolling in for LSU ace left-hander Lane Mestepey, as the sophomore from Zachary was named a third team All-America by Collegiate Baseball newspaper for the second consecutive year, with more All-America honors likely to keep pouring in.

Mestepey, who was that publication's National Freshman of the Year in 2001, enters the super regional at 11-4 with a 2.66 ERA and eight complete games. He has allowed two walks or fewer in all but one of his 18 outings this year, and that was a five-walk outing on March 23 at Ole Miss. Mestepey is yielding just 1.21 walks per nine innings (17 in 135.1 IP) and leads the SEC in complete games and innings.

Mestepey was named first team All-SEC prior to the conference tournament, making him only the second LSU player, along with current Cincinnati Reds second baseman Todd Walker, to earn first team All-SEC as a freshman and a sophomore. With a 22-7 career mark, he is also the only LSU pitcher to win 10 or more games as a freshman and sophomore.

Mestepey will be looking to avoid back-to-back losses this weekend, something he's only experienced once in his career, and that was this March when he dropped games to UL-Lafayette (in relief) and Vanderbilt in a five-day stretch.

Raymer goes with a flourish

There might not be anyone on this LSU team hungrier for a shot at another national title than senior center fielder David Raymer. Raymer was the starting center fielder as the 2000 season began, but a broken collarbone in an early-season game against Arizona State forced him to redshirt and miss the rest of the Tiger's national championship run.

Now, having been reinstated as a full-time starter, Raymer appears ready to help the Tigers get back to Omaha.

The North Carolina native earned all-regional team honors by batting .400 (8-for-20) in the regional, including a 3-for-5 effort in the finale vs. UL-Lafayette. He drove in a run with a base hit in the eighth inning, then tipped his helmet to a crowd that gave Raymer a one-minute standing ovation.

Raymer is hitting .324 this post-season despite suffering a hip pointer in the SEC Tournament making a diving catch vs. South Carolina. Since March 30, Raymer is hitting a solid .320 to raise his season average from below .200 to .269.

RISP reversal on Sunday

Heading into championship Sunday of the regional, LSU had collected 33 hits in three games. That was the good news.

The bad news was the fact that just four of those 33 hits had come with runners in scoring position, leaving the Tigers with a .190 average (4-for-21) in RBI situations.

That all changed on Sunday, when LSU collected 11 hits in 26 tries (.423) with RBI opportunities en route to outscoring UL-Lafayette 24-4 in the two-game sweep.

The Tigers are hitting .329 in the post-season with RISP opportunities, 25 points higher than their season average of .304 and 28 points higher than their .301 post-season mark last year.

Going the distance

LSU starting pitchers continue to shoulder the load for the Tigers, as three more complete games in the regional brings LSU's season total to 14, the most since the Tigers notched 15 CGs in 1993 and four more than the 10 combined (4 in 2000, 6 in 2001) over the last two years. LSU won't break the school single-season record of 25 done in both 1968 and 1979, but it's a far cry from the record-low done two years ago.

In fact, Lane Mestepey has two more complete games (8) this year than LSU had as a team in all of 2001 and has more CGs this year than 10 of the other 11 SEC schools as an entire staff (Alabama is second with 11 complete games, but its season is over).

For the year, LSU starters are 32-13 with a 3.22 ERA.

Low-dose relief

No, the LSU bullpen is not on hiatus, but with the way LSU starting pitchers have been shouldering the load, the relievers might start to feel a little like the Maytag repair man.

LSU relievers have been called on 95 times in 64 games this year, or an average of just 1.48 appearances per game. Compare that to 155 bullpen calls in 67 games last year (2.55 per game). Only once in the last 26 games has LSU used more than three pitchers in a game, and that was four on May 18 against Alabama.



Barker hits the century mark, drafted by Rockies
LSU right fielder Sean Barker has been a model of consistency all year long, and now he will get to show that consistency on the next level after he ends his LSU career this month.

On Tuesday, Barker was selected in the sixth round of the baseball amateur draft by the Colorado Rockies, making him the first Tiger to be drafted this year. Barker improved his draft stock 41 rounds in just one year after being drafted in the 47th round in 2001 by the Toronto Blue Jays.

And certainly the Rockies are taking a risk well worth taking. This past weekend in the regional, Barker became just the eighth different LSU player and the 11th overall to record 100 hits in a single season. Barker enters the regional at 100-for-261, good for a team best .383 average, which would rank 10th for a single season if the slate ended after the regional.

Should LSU reach the College World Series, Barker is within hailing distance of the single-season LSU record for hits, which is 110 done by Brandon Larson in 1997.

Barker's career batting average stands at .372 (127-for-341) leaving him in second place on the LSU career batting average chart behind Todd Walker's .396 mark.

In the regional, Barker batted .400 (8-for-20) to earn all-tournament team honors, and he is batting .351 (13-for-37) with three home runs in all nine post-season contests.

Pontiff moves up hit charts

Wally Pontiff earned all-tournament team honors at the regional, but just as importantly, continued his ascent up the Tigers' career lists.

Pontiff moved past Chad Cooley into ninth place this weekend in career hits, collecting his 252nd career hit. Pontiff now is just three behind eighth-place Ryan Theriot, and should he return for next year, the school record of 352 held by Eddy Furniss is within striking distance. Pontiff maintains his spot on the career lists for doubles (7th with 49) and batting average (10th at .345) heading into the super regional.

Pontiff enters the weekend with 21 games of NCAA tournament experience under his belt and a career .349 batting average in the NCAAs. His home run in the regional opener vs. Southern was his first NCAA home run since hitting two in the 2000 regional opener vs. Jackson State.

SEC on to none

The Southeastern Conference continues its tradition of excellence by being the only conference to put at least three teams in every super regional round since the current format started in 1999.

Arkansas, LSU and South Carolina are the SEC's representatives to the field of 16 this year, and the league has now had eight of 12 schools reach the super regionals, with only Florida, Ole Miss, Kentucky and Vanderbilt failing to do so.

The record for schools from one conference in a super regional is five by the SEC last year, when Georgia and Tennessee advanced to the CWS, with LSU, South Carolina and Mississippi State also reach the Sweet 16 of baseball.

LSU has been to all four super regionals, South Carolina to three, Mississippi State to two, and Alabama, Auburn, Arkansas, Georgia and Tennessee to one each.

Homers hard to come by for opposition

Despite giving up two home runs to UL-Lafayette in Saturday's regional loss, LSU pitchers continue to be the stingiest in the SEC when it comes to giving up the dingers, as the Tigers have yielded just 32 in 64 games this year, or a meager one-half per game. Last year, LSU gave up 51 home runs in 67 games, or 0.76 per game.

The Tigers also continue to lead the SEC in fewest extra base hits allowed with 138, eight fewer than Mississippi State, which gave up 146 in 59 games. After being near the bottom of the league in opponents' batting average for most of the year, LSU now stands a respectable sixth in the SEC with a .270 opponents' BA.

Tigers prove toughest of the tough

LSU is the only one of the 16 super regional teams who got here the hard way—by winning two games in the championship round on Sunday.

Of the other 15 teams in the super regional, ten went 3-0 (Florida State, Notre Dame, USC, Stanford, Houston, Texas, Clemson, Arkansas Nebraska and Georgia Tech), while Rice, Richmond, Florida Atlantic, South Carolina and Miami got victories in the second game after blowing their first opportunities.

LSU has now reached two of its four super regionals with two championship round wins, defeating East Carolina twice in 1999.



LSU rises to the top of SEC in ERA
Barring a total collapse this weekend at Rice (or in Omaha), LSU will win its second SEC ERA crown in the last five years under the tutelage of pitching coach Dan Canevari.

Canevari's charges have moved to the front of the league in ERA at 3.46, passing Alabama, who had led throughout the year but finishes the season at 3.59, .13 behind LSU. The Tigers and Crimson Tide are the only two league schools with ERAs below four, with the league's other two super regional participants, South Carolina (4.01) and Arkansas (4.28) holding down third and fourth, respectively.

Not surprisingly, LSU is the only league school currently with four pitchers in the top 10 in the league in ERA. Leading the way is Lane Mestephey in third place at 2.64, followed by Jake Tompkins in fourth at 2.71, then down to Bo Pettit (eighth, 3.35) and Brian Wilson (10th, 3.56). Alabama has three hurlers in the top 10, while Florida, Arkansas and Mississippi State have one each.

LSU last led the SEC in ERA in 1998, but that staff posted a 4.39 ERA. LSU's last season ERA under four was a 3.38 mark in 1996.

Tigers disinherit runners

LSU continues to be stingy with inherited runners, as only 28 of 86 (32.5%) have scored on the year, and since March 30, that number lowers to a meager 7 of 36 (19.4%).

The Tigers' three primary relievers in the second half of the year—Jake Tompkins, Clay Harris and Jason Vargas—have been the key behind this miserly nature. The three have combined to allow 3 of 35 inherited runners to score between them, as Tompkins has stranded 18 of 20, Vargas 5 of 6 and Harris 9 of 9. Tompkins and Harris combined to strand all four inherited runners LSU had in the regional.

Last year, LSU allowed 61 of 163 (39.1%) of inherited runners to come across.

LSU looking to avoid missing Omaha again

Since LSU's first trip to Omaha in 1986, the Tigers have never felled to reach the CWS in consecutive years, missing only in 1988, 1992, 1995, 1999 and 2001 since that first visit. The Tigers made three straight trips from 1989-91 and again from 1996-98.

Tigers move on up

The Tigers moved up in both of the polls that took new surveys this week, going to eighth in Baseball America and ninth in Collegiate Baseball, while the ESPN/Baseball Weekly poll will not change until after the completion of the College World Series. A look at the Tigers week-by-week:

Tigers complete another successful home season
LSU finished the home portion of its schedule in 2002 at 28-8 (.778), giving the Tigers a winning percentage of .700 or better at home for the 19th consecutive year. LSU is now 575-132-1 (.813) at home since Skip Bertman came to Baton Rouge in 1984. LSU won 16 of its final 17 home games, with the only setback coming last Saturday to UL-Lafayette in the regional.

LSU drew 271,159 fans through the turnstiles at The Box, setting a record for per-game attendance (7,532) and finishing fourth all-time in total attendance. LSU will draw its 3 millionth fan since Bertman's arrival during the 2003 regular season, as 2,858,628 have seen "Baseball at The Box" since 1984.

LSU coach Smoke Laval
 Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.
