Tigers Continue Five-Game Road Swing At Nicholls State

Sixth-ranked LSU (21-8) continues its five-game road stretch Tuesday as the Tigers travel to Thibodaux, La. to face Nicholls State. First pitch at Raymond Didier Field is set for 6:30 p.m. The LSU-Nicholls State game can be heard on the LSU Sports Network (98.1 FM in Baton Rouge) and on the Internet at www.LSUsports.net.

The Tigers began their road swing last weekend at Alabama, as LSU dropped two of three games to the Crimson Tide. LSU lost a series to Alabama for the first time since 1999, when the Crimson Tide defeated the Tigers in an NCAA Super Regional in Tuscaloosa.

LSU plays Rice at 7 p.m. Wednesday at Zephyr Field in Metairie, La., before returning home Friday to begin a three-game SEC series with South Carolina in Alex Box Stadium.

Tuesday's game marks LSU's first trip to Thibodaux since the 1994 season, when Nicholls State defeated the Tigers, 3-2. Since that '94 contest, the Tigers have won the last 14 meetings with the Colonels, including three wins earlier this season (Feb. 11-13) in Baton Rouge by scores of 12-1, 19-2 and 6-3.

LSU coach Smoke Laval is expected to send senior right-hander Brandon Nall (1-1, 6.43 ERA) to the mound on Tuesday. Nall, who will be making just his second career collegiate start, earned a relief victory last Tuesday over UNO. He worked three innings against the Privateers, allowing one earned run on two hits with three walks and no strikeouts. Nicholls State coach B.D. Parker will counter with freshman left-hander Justin Breaux (0-2, 7.71 ERA).

LSU outfielder Ryan Patterson enjoyed another superb week in the Tigers' four games versus UNO and Alabama, batting .389 (7-for-18) with two doubles, one triple, two homers, 10 RBI and six runs. Patterson launched his first career grand slam last Tuesday against the Privateers, and his three-run homer at Alabama on Saturday broke and 2-2 tie and propelled the Tigers to an 11-2 victory. Patterson has homered 11 times in LSU's last 13 games, and in his last 10 games, Patterson is batting .442 (19-for-43) with four doubles, one triple, six homers and 16 RBI. On the season, Patterson is hitting .425 (48-for-113) with 11 doubles, one triple, 13 homers, 33 RBI and 42 runs.

Infielder Blake Gill was LSU's leading hitter in the Alabama series, batting .417 (5-for-12) with one homer, three RBI and two runs. Left-hander Clay Dirks earned his SEC-leading seventh win on Saturday at Alabama, as he worked five innings, limiting the Tide to two runs on two hits with four walks and four strikeouts. Dirks is 7-0 this season with a 3.02 ERA and one save with 44.2 innings of work.

Right-hander Edgar Ramirez turned in his most impressive performances of the season with two sterling relief outings at Alabama. Ramirez worked 4.1 scoreless innings in two appearances, allowing just two hits with two walks and five strikeouts.

Smoke Laval

HEAD COACH • FOURTH YEAR

Raymond "Smoke" Laval continues to enhance his reputation as one of the country's top college baseball coaches, as, in three seasons at the helm of the LSU program, he has guided the Tigers to two College World Series berths, two NCAA Super Regional titles, three NCAA Regional championships, one SEC title and Top 10 finishes in each of the past two seasons.

Laval, the 2003 SEC Coach of the Year, was named in 2004 the Louisiana Sportswriters Association Coach of the Year for the third straight season.

Laval has directed LSU to the best SEC regular-season record in the past three seasons, posting a 57-31-1 (.646) mark. South Carolina has the second-best SEC record (57-32, .640), and Florida is third (50-39-1, .561). LSU earned its second consecutive final Top 10 ranking in 2004, as the Tigers finished No. 7 in the Baseball America poll and No. 8 in the Collegiate Baseball poll. The final rankings culminated a magnificent 2004 season that also featured record-breaking marks for academic achievements and attendance figures.

The 2004 Tigers advanced to the College World Series for the second straight season, recording a 46-19 overall record, LSU's best mark since the 2000 club finished 52-17.

LSU played host to an NCAA Regional for the 15th straight season, winning the tournament with consecutive victories over Army, Southern Mississippi and College of Charleston. The Tigers then played host to an NCAA Super Regional for the third time in five years, defeating Texas A&M in a best two-of-three series to earn a berth in the CWS.

The 2004 Tigers had the best offensive club in the SEC, completing the year with a .333 team batting average, the second-highest in school history. The Tigers were led by two first-team all-SEC players - right fielder Jon Zeringue, the 2004 SEC Co-Player of the Year and a first-team all-America selection, and center fielder J.C. Holt, a third-team all-America choice. Zeringue was selected in the second round of the 2004 draft by the Arizona Diamondbacks, and Holt was the third-round pick of the Atlanta Braves.

LSU placed 12 players on the 2004 SEC Academic Honor Roll, the highest total in the program's history, and the Tigers' 2004 total home attendance with 36 playing dates was 284,328, the third-largest figure in school history. The average paid attendance in 2004 was 7,898, which is the highest average in LSU annals.

Laval guided the 2003 Tigers to the Southeastern Conference title -- LSU's first since 1997 -- and a berth in the College World Series. He was voted the 2003 SEC Coach of the Year, directing LSU to a 45-22-1 overall record and a 20-9-1 conference mark, as the Tigers finished No. 5 in the final Baseball America rankings.

LSU played host to an NCAA Regional tournament for the 14th straight season and captured its eighth consecutive regional title. The Tigers entertained Baylor in an NCAA Super Regional series, defeating the Bears in two of three games to earn LSU's first CWS berth since 2000.

LSU also set an NCAA total attendance record in 2003, drawing 291,676 patrons to Alex Box Stadium.

The Tigers' shortstop, Aaron Hill, was named 2003 SEC Player of the Year and a first-team all-American. Hill was the first-round draft selection (13th pick overall) by the Toronto Blue Jays.

The magnificent '03 campaign augmented the success Laval enjoyed in his inaugural season as LSU's coach, as he led the 2002 Tigers to a 44-22 overall mark, an appearance in the NCAA Super Regional and a No. 11 final national ranking. 
