**DATE:** Saturday, November 22, 2003

**TIME:** 2:30 p.m.

**SITE:** Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field (60,580); Oxford, Miss.

**TV:** CBS (Verne Lundquist, play-by-play; Todd Blackledge, color analyst; Jill Arrington, sideline reporter).

**POLLS:** LSU is ranked No. 3 in both this week's **Associated Press** and **ESPN/USA Today Coaches** Top 25 polls. Ole Miss is No. 15 in both polls, up two spots from No. 17 in **The AP** Top 25 and up four places from No. 19 in the **Coaches** poll (*see National Rankings on page 8*).

**SERIES INFO:** Saturday's meeting will be the 92nd all-time between the Ole Miss Rebels and LSU Tigers dating back to 1894 ... LSU is Ole Miss' second-most played opponent besides Mississippi State, who the Rebels will play for the 100th time on Thanksgiving Night in Oxford ... LSU holds a 50-37-4 advantage in the series, however, the Rebels have won four of the last six meetings since 1997 ... LSU won last year's contest 14-13 at Tiger Stadium to snap a three-game Ole Miss winning streak at "Death Valley" ... Saturday's game will be the 11th meeting between the two schools in Oxford and the first since a 20-9 Tiger win in 2000 ... LSU holds a 5-4-1 advantage in games played in Oxford.

**WHAT TO WATCH FOR:** The SEC's No. 1 scoring offense and No. 1 scoring defense will meet Saturday. Ole Miss leads the SEC in scoring offense, averaging 36.6 points per game, while LSU is first in the SEC and No. 1 nationally in scoring defense, yielding only 8.9 points per game ... LSU is the highest-ranked opponent to visit Oxford since No. 1 Florida in 1994 ... Ole Miss can clinch its first-ever SEC Western Division championship with a win, while LSU can win the West with a win over the Rebels, and then a win over Arkansas or an Ole Miss loss to Mississippi State the following week.

**OLE MISS HEAD COACH DAVID CUTCLIFFE:** David Cutcliffe (Alabama, 1976) is in his fifth season as the Rebels' head coach. He is **38-21 (.644 winning pct.)** at Ole Miss and is the only coach in school history to lead the Rebels to at least seven wins in each of his first five seasons. Ole Miss is Cutcliffe's first career head coaching position. Cutcliffe is 2-2 versus LSU and 1-2 against Tiger head coach Nick Saban.

**LSU HEAD COACH NICK SABAN:** Nick Saban is in his fourth year as the head coach of the LSU Tigers. He is 35-13 (.729 winning pct.) with the Tigers and is 78-39-1 (.665 winning pct.) overall in his 10th year as a collegiate head coach. Saban has also served head coaching stints at Toledo (1990) and Michigan State (1995-1999). He guided the Rockets to a 9-2 mark in his only year at the school, and posted a five-year mark of 34-24-1 with the Spartans from 1995-1999. He has taken his teams to a total of six bowl appearances, including the 2000 Peach, 2002 Sugar and 2003 Cotton Bowls with LSU. Saban is 2-1 against Ole Miss and Rebel head coach David Cutcliffe.

**LSU SCOUTING REPORT:** LSU will enter Saturday's game having outscored the opposition 348-89. The Tigers rank first nationally in scoring defense, allowing an average of 8.9 points per game, and are second in the

SEC and fourth in the nation in total defense, allowing an average of 259.7 yards per game. Offensively, LSU is second in the SEC, behind Ole Miss, in scoring offense with an average of 34.8 points per game. The Tigers also average 432.4 yards per contest. Junior QB Matt Mauck leads the SEC with a 154.1 pass efficiency rating, having connected on 171-of-266 passes for 2,175 yards with 21 TDs and eight interceptions. His favorite target has been junior WR Michael Clayton, who has caught 57 passes for 835 yards and seven TDs. Senior Devery Henderson has caught 43 passes for 694 yards and nine TDs, and sophomore Skyler Green has 37 receptions for 437 yards and four scores. The Tigers are averaging 174.6 yards rushing per game and have four backs with 300 yards rushing. Freshman Justin Vincent has gained a team-high 466 yards on 80 carries with five TDs and sophomore Joseph Addai has added 400 yards on 89 attempts with two scores.

November 23, 2002 • Baton Rouge, La.

LSU 14, Ole Miss 13: QB Marcus Randall came off the bench to throw two TD passes, including a 27-yarder to Michael Clayton with 6:34 remaining the game to rally the No. 21 Tigers to a 14-13 win and snap the Rebels' three-game win streak at Tiger Stadium. (Complete recap of last year's meeting on page 18).

October 27, 2001 • Baton Rouge, La.

Ole Miss 35, LSU 24: Eli Manning threw two fourth-quarter TD passes to Doug Zeigler to rally Ole Miss to a 35-24 victory over LSU at Tiger Stadium. Trailing 24-21 in the fourth, Manning drove the Rebels 35 yards on three plays, hitting Zeigler with a 17-yard pass to make it 28-24. Ole Miss then recovered an LSU fumble with 5:05 left, and seven plays later, Manning connected with Zeigler on a four-yard TD pass to make it 35-24.

November 11, 2000 • Oxford, Miss.

LSU 20, Ole Miss 9: Senior QB Romaro Miller passed for 287 yards but the Rebels managed just three Les Binkley field goals as LSU ended a three-game losing streak to Ole Miss with a 20-9 win in front

of a then Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field record crowd of 52,476.

October 30, 1999 • Baton Rouge, La.

Ole Miss 42, LSU 23: Ole Miss rolled up 323 yards rushing and out-gained LSU 426-280 in a 42-23 win at Tiger Stadium. Deuce McAllister gained 140 yards on 25 carries with two TDs and Joe Gunn added 135 yards on 19 attempts and also had two scores. McAllister also accounted for 229 all-purpose yards.

October 30, 1998 • Oxford, Miss.

Ole Miss 37, LSU 31 (ot): Romaro Miller connected with Cory Peterson on a 25-yard TD pass on the Rebels' second play in overtime, and Ole Miss then stopped LSU on three plays from the four for a 37-31 overtime win. The Rebels entered the fourth quarter leading 31-10 before LSU scored 21 unanswered points, tying the game on a one-yard pass from Herb Tyler to Rondell Mealey with two seconds left in regulation.

- Holds 45 Ole Miss single-game, season and career records.
- Is fourth on the SEC's career list for the lowest percentage of interceptions thrown at 2.60 (1:38.5 attempts).
- Ranks fifth on the SEC's career list for passing yards (9,400), completions (772), TD passes (75) and total offense (9,286).
- Has a record of 22-12 (.647 winning pct.) as a starter, including 13-1 (.929 winning pct.) when not throwing an interception.
- Recorded seven career fourth-quarter wins (either tied or trailing in the fourth).

- Named one of seven finalists for the 2003 Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award for the nation's top senior quarterback.
- **One of 10 semifinalists for the 2003 Davey O'Brien Award, presented to the nation's top quarterback.**

- **Earned SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors in back-to-back weeks against South Carolina (11/1) and Auburn (11/8).**

- Named to the SEC Good Works Team.

- Is second in the SEC in completion percentage (62.8) and pass efficiency (149.8).

**SCHOOL RECORDS SET IN 2003**

- Recorded four games of at least 300 yards of total offense to eclipse his own school season record of three set last season.
- Has four 300-yard passing games this season to tie his own school season record set last year.
- Career leader in total offensive plays (1,390), breaking the previous mark of 1,275 set by **John Fourcade (1978-1981)**.
- Opened the year with six consecutive games of at least 250 yards passing to give him seven dating back to last year's Independence Bowl and breaking his own mark of six set during the 2001 campaign.
- Passed for a total of 1,054 yards in three games versus Memphis (9/6), Louisiana-Monroe (9/13) and Texas Tech (9/27) to break his own record for the most passing yards in a three-game span.
- With 411 yards of total offense against the Red Raiders, recorded his seventh career game of 300 yards of total offense to break the school record of six set by his



father, Archie Manning (1968-1970).

- Set new Ole Miss career standards for passing attempts, TDs responsible for and total offense during the Memphis (9/6) contest.
- Broke the school career record for completions set by **Kent Austin (1981-1985)** with 981 in the season opener at Vanderbilt (8/31).

- **Enters the LSU game with a career completion percentage of 60.8 (772x1,269), tying for first on the Ole Miss career list (min. 500 attempts) with Stewart Patridge (310x510).**
- His 149.83 pass efficiency rating in 2003 is currently first on the Ole Miss season list (min. 250 attempts), bettering his rating of 144.8 in 2001.
- **Career pass efficiency rating of 137.36 is first on the Ole Miss career list (min. 500 attempts).**
- **Average of 7.41 yards per pass attempt (1,269x9,400) is currently first on the school's career list (min. 500 attempts).**
- 218 completions this season is fourth on the Ole Miss single-season list and 61 shy of his own mark of 279 set last year.
- Needs 520 yards passing to tie his own school season record of 3,401 set in 2002.
- 23 TD passes is second on the Ole Miss season list and eight shy of his record of 31 set as a sophomore in 2001.
- Eight 250-yard passing games in 2003 is one shy of his own school record of eight set in 2001.

- Named the 34th head coach at The University of Mississippi on Dec. 2, 1998.
- Coached first game in the 1998 Independence Bowl and guided the Rebels to a 35-18 win over heavily-favored Texas Tech in what was possibly the bowl season's biggest upset.
- Is the only coach in school history win at least seven games in each of his first five seasons at Ole Miss, and joins legendary Rebel head coach John Vaught as the only coaches in school history to have five consecutive seven-win seasons at any time during their careers at Ole Miss.
- Has guided Ole Miss to its first 6-0 start in the SEC since 1962.
- Saturday's game will be the Rebels' fifth appearance on CBS under Cutcliffe and Ole Miss' 40th TV appearance overall since his first full season in 1999.
- The 43-28 win over Alabama on Oct. 18 made him just the second coach in school history to record at least two career wins over the Crimson Tide. Vaught was the other.
- Ole Miss has topped the 300-point mark in four straight seasons for the first time in school history.
- A total of 99 team or individual offensive records have been broken during Cutcliffe's four years.
- Has had two first team All-Americans in DB Ken Lucas (2000) and OL Terrence Metcalf (2001).
- Coached 20 players to All-SEC accolades.
- Produced eight NFL draft picks, including Deuce McAllister, a first-round draft choice of the New Orleans Saints in 2001.
- Coached a total of 15 players at Ole Miss that have made professional rosters in either the NFL, CFL or NFL Europe.
- Inducted into Independence Bowl Hall of Honor in 2003.

## PRIOR TO OLE MISS

- Spent 17 years as an assistant under Johnny Majors and Phillip Fulmer at Tennessee from 1982-1998 ... Helped the Volunteers compile a 154-46-7 record during his time in Knoxville, including winning five SEC championships and one national title in 1998.
- The Volunteers went to 16 bowl games in his 17 years on the UT staff.
- Was Tennessee's offensive coordinator from 1993-1998.
- Recipient of the 1998 Broyles Award, given annually to the nation's top assistant coach.
- Coached NFL quarterbacks Heath Shuler, Peyton Manning and Tee Martin.

**OLE MISS-LSU RIVALRY RETURNS TO THE NATIONAL STAGE:** Saturday's showdown between Ole Miss and LSU will mark a return to the national stage for one of the South's oldest and intense rivalries. Not since the famous 1959 Halloween game when Billy Cannon's 89-yard punt return helped the top-ranked Tigers edge the third-ranked Rebels 7-3 at Tiger Stadium has so much been on the line for both teams.

With a win Saturday, Ole Miss can claim its first-ever SEC Western Division Championship and punch its ticket for the Dec. 6 SEC Championship Game at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta. LSU will take control of its own destiny in the West with a win. The Tigers can then earn the SEC West's spot in the title game with either an Ole Miss loss to Mississippi State on Thanksgiving Night or a win over Arkansas the next day.

The following are some Ole Miss-LSU highlights during the 91 previous meetings, including match-ups when both teams entered the game ranked:

## September 24, 1938 - Ole Miss 20, at LSU 7

LSU had played in the Sugar Bowl three years in a row, while the Rebels had not scored a point versus the Tigers in four years. In his first game as head coach of Ole Miss, Harry Mehre, a Knute Rockne deciple who snapped the ball to the fabled Four Horsemen in 1922, unveiled a triple threat in TB Parker Hall. Hall, who would earn All-America honors, passed and ran the Rebels to victory and snapped a eight-game skid versus the Tigers.

## Nov. 1, 1947 — Ole Miss 20, at LSU 18

In a match-up between Ole Miss' Chunkin' Charlie Conerly and LSU's Y.A. Tittle, Conerly scored all of the Rebels' three TDs to lift Ole Miss to a 20-18 win. The game, though, may be best remember for a single play. Tittle had his pants stripped down around his knees after intercepting a Conerly pass. According to the game's play-by-play, Tittle intercepted pass at the LSU 17 and "holding up his pants with one had, ran back to the LSU 38." Tittle claimed he would have scored but stopped at about the Ole Miss 20 when his britches fell. "There's no way he would have scored," said Conerly, who later was a teammate of Tittle's on the New York Giants. "He was one of the few guys I could outrun." — excerpt from *One Hundred Years of Ole Miss Football*.

## Nov. 1, 1958 — at #1 LSU 14, #6 Ole Miss 0

Both teams entered the game unbeaten.

## Oct. 31, 1959 — at #1 LSU 7, #3 Ole Miss 3

No. 1 and No. 3 in the nation collided on Halloween night on a rain-slickened field at Tiger Stadium, and it was the top-ranked Tigers that got the best of the No. 3 Rebels. Cannon's now famous 89-yard punt return in the fourth quarter lifted the Tigers to the win. The 1959 Heisman Trophy winner had been ordered not to handle any ball inside the 15. However, when Jake Gibbs' punt bounced into his hands at the 11, Cannon took off running. It was one of the most significant runs in college football history and clinched the Heisman Trophy for Cannon.

## Jan. 1, 1960 — #2 Ole Miss 21, #3 LSU 0 (at New Orleans; Sugar Bowl)

The Rebels would get revenge on Cannon and the Tigers just two months after the 1959 Halloween game in the 1960 Sugar Bowl. Ole Miss held the Tigers to -15 yards rushing and QB Bobby Franklin completed 10-of-15 passes for 148 yards and two TDs to earn MVP honors.

**REBELS PICKED FIFTH IN THE SEC WEST:** Ole Miss was picked to finish fifth in the SEC West this season by a panel of 78 media members at this year's SEC Media Days. The Rebels garnered two first-place votes to win the West, and also tallied two votes to win the overall SEC Championship. Auburn was tabbed the preseason favorite to win the SEC West, while Georgia was picked as the team to beat in the SEC East. The following is the predicted order of finish in the SEC West and East from the voting at SEC Media Days:

## Nov. 4, 1961 — at #6 LSU 10, #2 Ole Miss 7

## Nov. 3, 1962 — #6 Ole Miss 15, at #4 LSU 7

## Dec. 5, 1970 — at #8 LSU 61, #16 Ole Miss 17

Current Ole Miss starting QB Eli Manning's father, Archie Manning was quarterback for the Rebels. Playing in a plastic sleeve to protect a broken left arm, Manning was 12-of-27 passing for 82 yards with a TD and two interceptions in his final regular-season game as a Rebel. **This Saturday's game in Oxford will mark the first time both teams have been ranked entering the game since the 1970 contest.**

## Nov. 4, 1972 — at LSU 17, Ole Miss 16

From *One Hundred Years of Ole Miss Football*: "This was the game that will always be remembered as the battle of the clock. From that night forward, Mississippians entering the state of Louisiana were advised to set their watch back four seconds. LSU ran four plays in 10 seconds to come from behind and beat Ole Miss 17-16. Officially, Bert Jones' pass was still in the air when time expired. TB Brad Davis caught the ball at the one and spun backwards over the goal to tie the score. Rusty Jackson's PAT attempt was perfect and LSU snatched victory from the jaws of defeat.

On the previous play Mickey Fratesi had knocked down a Jones pass with four seconds to play. The clock operator admitted years later he was slow on the trigger."

Ole Miss entered the current six-game stretch standing 4-2 overall and 2-0 in the SEC, almost exactly the same situation the Rebels found themselves in a year ago when they were 5-1 overall and 2-0 in the SEC. Facing five of the six same opponents Ole Miss is playing on the backhalf of its schedule this year, the Rebels lost five straight before defeating Mississippi State to close out the 2002 regular season with a 6-6 record. **REBELS ACHIEVE FIRST 6-0 SEC START SINCE 1962:** With the 24-20 win over Auburn, Ole Miss achieved a 6-0 record in the SEC for only the second time in school history. The 2003 Rebels join the 1962 squad that finished the year with a 6-0 conference mark. **A win over LSU Saturday or against Mississippi State in the regular-season finale Thanksgiving Night, would give Ole Miss seven SEC wins in the same season for the first time in school history.**

**REBEL RAMBLINGS:**

- Ole Miss' current six-game win streak is the Rebels' longest since winning seven straight in 1990.
- Ole Miss remains as the SEC's only unbeaten team in conference play entering Saturday's contest with LSU. Ole Miss was picked to finish fifth in the preseason SEC media poll (*see Preseason SEC Predictions on page 7*).
- Dating back to last year's 24-12 win over Mississippi State in the regular-season finale, the Rebels are 10-2 in the last 12 games.
- A win Saturday over LSU would give the Rebels a perfect 4-0 SEC home record for the first time since 1992.
- Auburn's 10-7 lead over Ole Miss with 3:36 left in the first quarter marked the first time the Rebels had trailed in a game since the fourth quarter of the Oct. 4 Florida game, a span of 252 minutes and 34 seconds.
- At 8-2, Ole Miss is bowl eligible for the seventh straight season. The Rebels became bowl eligible with the 19-7 win over Arkansas on Oct. 25. The Rebels have appeared in the postseason in five of the last six seasons.
- Ole Miss has won eight regular-season games for the first time since 1992 when the Rebels went 8-3 before capping the year with a Liberty Bowl win over Air Force to finish 9-3. **A win Saturday over LSU would give the Rebels nine wins in the regular season for the first time since 1990 when they went 9-2 and earned a Gator Bowl berth against Michigan.**
- The 43-40 win against South Carolina on Nov. 1 clinched the Rebels' seventh straight seven-win season, its longest such streak since recording 12 consecutive from 1952-1963.
- The Rebels are guaranteed of their seventh straight

winning streak since 1997, their longest run since recording seven consecutive from 1965-1971.

**REBELS VERSUS RANKED OPPONENTS:**

- Saturday's game versus No. 3 LSU will mark Ole Miss' third against a ranked opponent this season ... The Rebels defeated No. 24 Florida 20-17 in Gainesville on Oct. 4 and No. 20 Arkansas 19-7 in Oxford on Oct. 25.
- At No. 3, LSU is the highest-ranked opponent Ole Miss has faced since 1995 when the Rebels fell 28-10 at No. 3 Florida.**
- LSU is the highest-ranked opponent to visit Oxford since No. 1 Florida defeated Ole Miss 38-14 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium on Oct. 1, 1994.**
- The last time Ole Miss defeated a team ranked as high as No. 3 was Sept. 17, 1977 when the Rebels knocked off eventual national champion Notre Dame 20-13 in Jackson.
- Last year's 17-14 win over No. 6 Florida in Oxford was the Rebels' first win over a top 10 team in Oxford since Oct. 9, 1976, when Ole Miss defeated fourth-ranked Georgia 21-17.

**CUTCLIFFE AMONG REBEL COACHING ELITE:** Entering Saturday's game with LSU, Ole Miss head coach **David Cutcliffe** is one victory off the pace set by legendary Ole Miss head coach **John Vaught** (1947-1970; 1973) for the most wins by an Ole Miss coach through 59 games. Vaught had a 39-16-4 (.695 winning pct.) in his first 59 games with the Rebels, while Cutcliffe is 38-21 (.644 winning pct.), including his win in the 1998 Independence Bowl over Texas Tech during his Ole Miss coaching debut. Cutcliffe is also the only coach in school history to win at least seven games in each of his first five seasons with the Rebels, and joins Vaught as the only coaches to ever record five straight seven-win campaigns at any time during their tenure at the school. 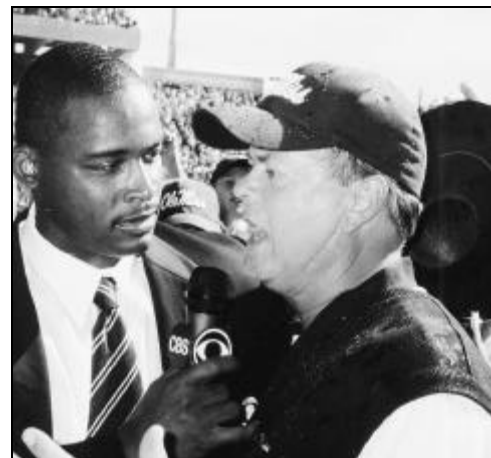

**INSIDE THE NUMBERS:** During Ole Miss' current six-game win streak, the Rebels have outscored the opposition 204-112 and have recorded an average of 438.0 yards of offense per game while holding opponents to an average of 336.2. Ole Miss is also converting on nearly 51-percent of its third-down opportunities (44-of-87) while limiting the opposition to a 31.6 percent (24-of-76) efficiency rate on third downs. **The Rebels converted on 10-of-18 third-down opportunities in the 24-20 win over Auburn, including a 3rd-and-11, a 3rd-and-5 and 3rd-and-1 on the game-winning 10-play, 80-yard TD drive in the fourth quarter.** The following chart takes a look at some key statistics during Ole Miss' six-game win streak:

- Senior WR Chris Collins (Gloster, Miss.) will carry a streak of 32 straight games with at least one reception into Saturday's game with LSU, the second-longest known streak in school history behind the 37-game streak by Willie Green (1986-1989).
- Ole Miss has scored 47.7-percent (62-of-130) of its offensive possessions this season (*see Drive Efficiency Chart on page 12*).
- Ole Miss has scored 40 or more points five times this season to break the school record for 40-point games in a season set by the 1959, 1961 and 1971 teams with four.
- The Rebels are 32 first downs shy of the school season of 273 set last year.
- Ole Miss is 67 yards of total offense shy of the school season record of 4,663 set last season in 13 games.
- The Rebels' average of 459.6 yards of total offense per game is also ahead of the school-record pace of 419.2 set by the 1961 squad.

**FAST STARTS:** Ole Miss will enter Saturday's game with LSU having scored on its first offensive series in eight straight games. The Rebels marched 44 yards in five plays capped by senior QB Eli Manning's (New Orleans, La.) two-yard TD pass to senior WR Chris Collins (Gloster, Miss.) on its first possession against Auburn on Nov. 8. During the eight-game streak, the Rebels have scored six touchdowns and two field goals. **REBEL NEARS SCHOOL SCORING RECORD, 400-POINT MARK:** Ole Miss will enter Saturday's game with LSU 25 points shy of tying the school season scoring record of 391 points set in 2001 (11 games). The Rebels' average of 36.6 points per game this season is also ahead of the 2001 team's school-record pace of 35.5. The 366 points by Ole Miss this season marks the fourth straight season the Rebels have scored over 300 points. **REBELS CONTINUE TO LEAD SEC IN PASSING, TOTAL AND SCORING OFFENSE:** Ole Miss will enter Saturday's contest with LSU leading the SEC in passing (299.9 ypg), scoring (36.6 ppg), and total offense (459.6 ypg). The Rebels are also 11th nationally in both passing and scoring offense, and 13th in total offense (see *Ole Miss Team Rankings in the SEC/NCAA Statistics on page 16*).

**COLLINS LEADS SEC IN RECEPTIONS:** Senior WR Chris Collins (Gloster, Miss.) is leading the SEC in receptions, averaging 5.8 per game. He is also fourth in the conference in receiving yards per game, averaging 72.2 (see *Individual Rebels in the SEC/NCAA Statistics on page 15*).

**COLLINS SETS SCHOOL SEASON RECEPTIONS MARK; CLOSERS IN ON SEASON YARDAGE RECORD:** Senior WR Chris Collins (Gloster, Miss.) recorded three receptions against Auburn to give him 58 for the season break the Ole Miss season receptions record of 56 set by LeMay Thomas (1992-1995) in 1995. Collins has recorded 50 or more receptions in three straight seasons, making him the first player in school history to do so. He also has 722 yards receiving this year, ranking fourth on the Ole Miss season list and 94 yards shy of Willie Green's (1986-1989) school record of 816 set in 1989 (see *the Rebel Record Book on pages 27-28*).

**COLLINS SETS OLE MISS CAREER RECEPTIONS AND RECEIVING YARDS MARKS IN 2003:** Senior WR Chris Collins (Gloster, Miss.) will enter Saturday's LSU game with 179 career receptions for 2,394 yards — both school records. He broke Grant Heard's (1996-2000) career receptions mark of 142 in the Sept. 27 game versus Texas Tech, and later passed the school career record for receiving yards set by Willie Green (1986-1989) in the 43-40 win over South Carolina on Nov. 1. Collins entered the 2003 season already the school's all-time leader in TD receptions (23) and 100-yard receiving games (10) (see *the Rebel Record Book on pages 27-28*).

**COLLINS SEC'S ACTIVE LEADER IN RECEIVING YARDS:** Senior WR Chris Collins (Gloster, Miss.) will enter Saturday's game as the SEC's active career leader in receiving yards with 2,394. He also ranks second among active SEC players in receptions (179) and tied for third in TDs scored (24). The following charts show the top five SEC active leaders in receiving yards, receptions and touchdowns scored:

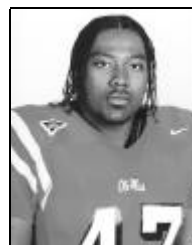

**RUSHING ATTACK KEY TO REBELS' IMPROVEMENT IN 2003:** Ole Miss is averaging 159.7 yards rushing per game this season, an improvement of 65.4 yards from

last year when the Rebels rushed for 1,226 yards in 13 games. Through 10 games this season, Ole Miss has netted 1,597 yards on the ground. The Rebels passed last season's total in the seventh game of the year against Alabama after recording their third 200-yard rushing game of the year with 216 yards against the Crimson Tide. Entering the season, Ole Miss had not topped 200 yards rushing in a game since the 2001 season versus Kentucky.

Senior RB Tremaine Turner (Springfield, Tenn.) has paced the Rebels' "Running-Back-Committee" this season. Turner has rushed for a team-high 597 yards on 127 carries to surpass last year's team-high total of 378 yards in 13 games by current senior Ronald McClendon (Ponchatoula, La.).

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Auburn's touchdown on its opening possession marked just the second time in 10 games this season that the opposition has scored against the Ole Miss defense on its first offensive series. Memphis also scored on its first offensive series versus Ole Miss, taking advantage of a Rebel turnover to go 26 yards for a touchdown back on Sept. 6 (see the *Drive Efficiency Chart* on page 12).
- True freshman DB Charles Clark (Green Cove Springs, Fla.) recorded his first career sack against Auburn to extend the Rebels' streak to 26 straight games with at least one sack. Ole Miss has also registered at least one sack in 43 of its last 44 games.
- The defense has not recorded a takeaway in the last two games versus South Carolina and Auburn. The South Carolina contest snapped a string of 21 straight games with at least one takeaway dating back to the 2001 season finale versus Vanderbilt.
- Junior DB Eric Oliver (Jasper, Ala.) needs 18 tackles to reach 100 stops for the second year in a row. Last season, Oliver led the Rebels with 129 hits, the highest total since LB Abdul Jackson (1991-1994) tallied 139 stops in 1994.
- Ole Miss' rushing defense ranks fourth in the SEC and 14th nationally, allowing an average of 96.9 yards per game (see *Ole Miss Team Rankings in the SEC/NCAA Statistics* on page 16).
- The Rebels' 3.1 yards allowed per rushing attempt is also the fourth-lowest in the SEC.

**REBELS' AIR DEFENSE TIGHTENS:** Since Texas Tech's B.J. Symons passed for 661 yards against the Rebels on Sept. 27, Ole Miss has tightened up its pass defense. In the six games since Texas Tech, Ole Miss is allowing an average of 224.5 yards passing per game and has held three opponents to under 50-percent passing. Only South Carolina during that stretch has passed for over 250 yards against Ole Miss. The following chart shows the play of the Rebels' pass defense since the Texas Tech game on Sept. 27:

**NORTHCUTT WEARS CHUCKY MULLINS' NO. 38 IN 2003:** Senior LB Jamii Northcutt (Tulahoma, Tenn.) is this year's recipient of the Chucky Mullins Courage Award and as a result is wearing the late Mullins' No. 38. Prior to the honor, Northcutt wore No. 54.

## SPECIALTY NOTES

- Junior P Cody Ridgeway (Jackson, Tenn.) had three punts of over 50 yards against Auburn to extend his streak to six straight games with at least one punt of over 50 yards. Ten of Ridgeway's 13 punts of 50 yards or more this season have come in the last six games.
- Ridgeway is averaging 46.8 yards per punt on 26 attempts in the last six games.
- Junior PK Jonathan Nichols (Greenwood, Miss.) has made three field goals of over 50 yards this season, making him the only kicker in school history to have three goals of over 50 yards in the same season. He is 3-of-4 from over 50 yards this season,

and is 4-of-5 on his career as he is also the only kicker in Ole Miss history to have made four kicks of at least 50 yards.

- Nichols carries a streak of 88 consecutive PATs made into Saturday's game with LSU. He eclipsed the school record of 59 consecutive PATs made, held by Steve Lavinghouse (1973-1975), back on Sept. 13 versus UL-Monroe (see the *Rebel Record Book* on pages 27-28).

## NICHOLS CONTINUES TO LEAD SEC IN SCORING:

Junior PK Jonathan Nichols (Greenwood, Miss.) continues to lead the SEC in scoring with an average of 10.8 points per game, which also ranks fifth nationally. For the season, he has scored 108 points, making 23-of-24 field goal attempts and all 39 PAT tries (see *Individual Rebels in the SEC/NCAA Statistics* on the left).

## NICHOLS STILL LEADS SEC, NATION IN FIELD GOALS:

Junior PK Jonathan Nichols (Greenwood, Miss.) ranks first in the SEC and in the nation in field goals made, averaging 2.30 per game (see *Individual Rebels in the SEC/NCAA Statistics* on the left).

## NICHOLS SETS OLE MISS CAREER SCORING MARK; TIES FIELD GOAL MARK VERSUS AUBURN:

Junior PK Jonathan Nichols (Greenwood, Miss.) scored six points in the 24-20 win at Auburn, making all three PAT attempts and connecting on a 42-yard field goal to become Ole Miss' career scoring leader and tie the school career record for field goals made. Nichols broke Deuce McAllister's (1997-2000) school career scoring record of 246 points on the 42-yard field goal to tie the game at 17-17 with 14:40 remaining. The field goal was the 41st of his career to tie the Ole Miss career mark set by Brian Lee (1989-1992) (see the *Rebel Record Book* on pages 27-28).

**MANNING EARNS BACK-TO-BACK SEC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK AWARDS:** Senior QB Eli Manning (New Orleans, La.) earned back-to-back SEC

Offensive Player of the Week honors for his performance in wins over South Carolina (11/1) and Auburn (11/8). In the Rebels' 43-40 win over South Carolina, Manning connected on 30-of-42 passes for 391 yards with three TDs and one interception. The following week at Auburn, he passed for 218 yards on 19-of-30 passing with two TDs, and engineered a game-winning, 10-

play, 80-yard drive in the fourth quarter to lead the Rebels to a 24-20 win at Jordan-Hare Stadium. Manning is the first player to earn back-to-back SEC Offensive Player of the Week honors since Alabama's Shaun Alexander pulled the feat in the first two games of the 1999 season.

**GAME #10 - OLE MISS 24, AUBURN 20**  
(see complete game recap on page 29)

- Sophomore RB **Brandon Jacobs** (Long Beach, Miss.) capped off a 10-play, 80-yard drive with a one-yard TD run to lift Ole Miss to a 24-20 win.
- Senior QB **Eli Manning** (New Orleans, La.) was 4-of-5 passing for 72 yards on the game-winning TD drive, including connecting with junior WR **Bill Flowers** (Pelham, Ala.) on a 16-yard pass on a 3rd-and-11 and with junior FB **Lorenzo Townsend** (Monticello, Miss.) for a 48-yard reception on a 3rd-and-5 to the Auburn 12 ... Manning also had a two-yard QB sneak to convert a 3rd-and-1 and set-up Jacobs' TD run.
- Ole Miss had to stop Auburn on four plays from the 10 yard line in the game's final minute. Junior FS **Eric Oliver** (Jasper, Ala.) broke-up a fourth-down pass in the end zone to seal the win.
- With the win, the Rebels improved to 6-0 in the SEC for the first time since 1962 ... The win was also Ole Miss' sixth consecutive to post its longest win streak since winning seven-in-a-row in 1990.

**GAME #9 - OLE MISS 43, SOUTH CAROLINA 40**  
(see complete game recap on page 30)

- Ole Miss withstood a furious South Carolina rally to hold on for a 43-40 win and match its longest winning streak since 2001 at five games.
- The victory also gave the Rebels their first 5-0 SEC start since 1963.
- Senior QB **Eli Manning** (New Orleans, La.) passed for 391 yards and three TDs, including going 20-of-26 for 260 yards and three TDs in the first half as the Rebels built a 30-14 halftime advantage.
- Senior WR **Chris Collins** (Gloster, Miss.) caught 10 passes for 125 yards to become Ole Miss' career leader in receiving yards, breaking the mark of 2,274 set by **Willie Green** (1986-1989).
- With the win, Ole Miss also recorded its first three-game sweep of its SEC East opponents since the conference started divisional play in 1992.

**MANNING NAMED NATIONAL FOOTBALL FOUNDATION SCHOLAR-ATHLETE:** Senior QB **Eli Manning** (New Orleans, La.) has been selected as one of 15 student-athletes to receive an \$18,000 postgraduate scholarship from all NCAA Divisions and the NAIA by the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame. The scholar-athletes will be recognized at the National Football Foundation and College Hall of Fame's 46th Annual Awards Dinner on Dec. 9 at the Waldorf-Astoria in New York City. Manning is now a finalist for the Draddy Trophy presented to the nation's top scholar-athlete, and the winner will have their scholarship increased to \$25,000.

At the Dec. 9 awards dinner, the 2003 College Football Hall of Fame class will also be honored and current Ole Miss Chancellor Robert Khayat will receive the Foundation's Distinguished American Award.

**NICHOLS EARNS MIDSEASON ALL-AMERICA HONORS FROM THE SPORTING NEWS; HONORABLE MENTION FROM SI.COM:** Junior PK **Jonathan Nichols** (Greenwood, Miss.) was selected as a Midseason All-American by **The Sporting News** and was an honorable mention Midseason All-America selection by **SI.com** (see 2003 Honors on page 8).

**GAME #8 - OLE MISS 19, ARKANSAS 7**  
(see complete game recap on page 31)

- With the 19-7 win, the Rebels won their fourth straight game and notched their first 4-0 SEC start since 1970.
- Ole Miss limited Arkansas' powerful rushing attack to 82 yards on 32 carries, 143 yards below the Razorbacks' average of 225 yards entering the game.
- Junior PK **Jonathan Nichols** (Greenwood, Miss.) scored 13 points to break his own school season record for points by a kicker, set last year with 85.

**GAME #7 - OLE MISS 43, ALABAMA 28**  
(see complete game recap on page 32)

- Ole Miss recorded its first 3-0 SEC start since **Archie Manning's** senior year at quarterback with a 43-28 win over Alabama in Oxford.
- The win was the second in three years of the Crimson Tide since snapping a 10-game on-the-field losing streak to Alabama in 2001.
- The Rebels scored 24 first-quarter points to lead 24-0 after the first and 31-10 at halftime.
- Ole Miss rushed for 216 yards on 50 carries after being held to four yards on 28 attempts in last year's 42-7 loss at Tuscaloosa.
- The blocked punt by Alabama in the third quarter marked the first time in 51 games, since Sept. 25, 1999 at Auburn, that Ole Miss had a punt blocked.

**PITTMAN LOST FOR SEASON; UNDERGOES SURGERY:** Ole Miss lost redshirt freshman RB **Jamal**

**Pittman** (Columbia, Miss.) for the season after he sustained significant tear to the ACL and a moderate sprain of the MCL in his left knee during the fourth quarter of the Oct. 11 game with Arkansas State. He underwent successful reconstruction surgery of the left knee on Oct. 25 at the Oxford Surgery Center.

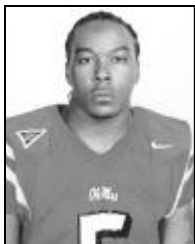
Pittman suffered the injury at the end of a 15-yard run in the fourth quarter versus the Indians. In five games this season, Pittman rushed for 214 yards on 42 carries with one TD in five games.

**GAME #6 - OLE MISS 55, ARKANSAS STATE 0**

- Ole Miss recorded its first shutout since 1999 with a 55-0 win over Arkansas State in the 2003 Homecoming game.
- The 55-point win was the Rebels' largest margin of victory since a 59-3 win over Southern Illinois in 1994, and the largest in a shutout since blanking Chattanooga 58-0 in 1959.
- Junior PK **Jonathan Nichols** (Greenwood, Miss.) scored 13 points to break the Ole Miss career record for points by a kicker, previously held by **Brian Lee** (1989-1992) with 207.
- Senior QB **Eli Manning** (New Orleans, La.) recorded his third 300-yard passing game of the season with a 306-yard effort, and senior WR **Chris Collins** (Gloster, Miss.) recorded his second 100-yard receiving game of the year with eight catches for 146 yards and a TD.
- The Rebels totaled over 500 yards of offense for the third time in four games, recording 582 yards which ranks as the eighth-highest single-game total in school history.

**GAME #5 - OLE MISS 20, (#24) FLORIDA 17***(see complete game recap on page 34)*

- Ole Miss upset Florida for the second straight year as sophomore RB **Vashon Pearson (Ripley, Miss.)** scored on a one-yard run with 1:10 remaining in the game to lift the Rebels to a 20-17 win over the No. 24 Gators.
- The Rebels drove 50 yards on eight plays in 4:02 for the game-winning TD. Senior QB **Eli Manning (New Orleans, La.)** was 2-of-2 passing for 30 yards on the drive. He hit senior WR **Chris Collins (Gloster, Miss.)** for 18 yards to the Gator 16, and following a five-yard delay of game penalty, he connected with Collins again for 12 yards to the Florida 9.
- The win was the Rebels' first over a ranked opponent on the road since a 36-21 win at No. 8 LSU in 1997.
- Senior RB **Ronald McClendon (Ponchatoula, La.)** recorded his first career 100-yard rushing game with 107 yards on eight carries, including a career-long 52-yard TD run in the second quarter to pull Ole Miss within 14-10.
- Ole Miss intercepted Florida QB Chris Leak three times in the fourth quarter.

**HUTCHINS EARNS SEC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK ACCOLADES:**

**(Natchez, Miss.)** was honored as the SEC's Defensive Player of the Week after recording six tackles (two solo), including one QB sack (-8 yards) and one interception in the Rebels' 20-17 upset of No. 24 Florida in Gainesville. He is the first Rebel to earn SEC Defensive Player of the Week honors since **Matt Grier** was honored after last year's 17-14 upset of the sixth-ranked Gators in Oxford.

**GAME #4 - TEXAS TECH 49, OLE MISS 45***(see complete game recap on page 35)*

- Texas Tech scored on a nine-yard TD pass from B.J. Symons to Carlos Francis with 1:04 left to rally for a 49-45 win.
- The Red Raiders scored two touchdowns in the final five minutes to rally from a 45-34 deficit.
- The two teams combined for 1,291 yards of total offense, including 1,070 through the air. Texas Tech QB B.J. Symons passed for 661 yards on 44-of-64 passing with six TDs and one interception. Rebel QB **Eli Manning (New Orleans, La.)** was 29-of-49 passing for 409 yards with three TDs and two interceptions.
- The 94 combined points was tied for the second-highest scoring game in school history since 1933, behind only the 58-56 seven-overtime loss to Arkansas in 2001.

**NICHOLS HAS RECORD DAY VERSUS TEXAS TECH:**

Junior PK **Jonathan Nichols (Greenwood, Miss.)** set Ole Miss single-game records for points by a kicker (21), field goals made (6) and field goals attempted (6) during the Sept. 27 game with Texas Tech. The previous single-game record for points by a kicker was 16 by **Brian Lee (1989-1992)** against Tulane in 1991 and **Walter Grant (1993-1994)** versus UT-Chattanooga in 1993. Lee also held the school single-game record for field goals made with five in that 1991 contest with the Green Wave. **Nichols' six field goals versus the Red Raiders also tied the SEC single-game mark set five times previously, most recently by Georgia's Billy Bennett against Georgia Tech in 2001.**

**GAME #3 - OLE MISS 59, LOUISIANA-MONROE 14***(see complete game recap on page 36)*

- Ole Miss won the first game on its new AstroPlay surface at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium/Hollingsworth Field, 59-14 over Louisiana-Monroe.
- After the Indians tied the game at 7-7 with 5:30 left in the first quarter, Ole Miss scored the game's next 45 points.
- The Rebels finished with 612 yards of total offense, the second highest single-game total in school history and 11 yards shy of the record of 623 set against Auburn in 1951. It also marked the first time Ole Miss has totaled over 600 yards of offense in a game since 1971 against Chattanooga (601).

**GAME #2 - MEMPHIS 44, OLE MISS 34***(see complete game recap on page 37)*

- Memphis scored the game's final 23 points to earn a 44-34 win at the Liberty Bowl on September 6.
- The Tigers took the lead with 6:12 left in the game when QB Danny Wimprine connected with Tavarious Davis on a 92-yard TD reception to put Memphis up 38-34 ... Memphis would later add two Stephen Gostkowski field goals.
- Memphis out-gained Ole Miss 258-76 in the fourth quarter.
- The two teams combined for 914 yards of total offense, including 681 in the air, with Memphis holding a 506-408 advantage.
- Senior QB **Eli Manning (New Orleans, La.)** completed 26-of-48 passes for 292 yards with four TDs and two interceptions en route to become the Ole Miss career leader for passing attempts, TDs responsible for and total offense.

**GAME #1 - OLE MISS 24, VANDERBILT 21***(see complete game recap on page 38)*

- Junior PK **Jonathan Nichols (Greenwood, Miss.)** made a 54-yard FG with 3:52 left in the game to break a 21-21 tie and lift the Rebels to a 24-21 season-opening win over the Commodores.
- Ole Miss scored the game's final 10 points to rally from a 21-14 deficit in the fourth quarter.
- Senior QB **Eli Manning (New Orleans)** finished the afternoon 22-of-33 passing for 275 yards and a TD to break **Kent Austin's (1981-1985)** school career completion record of 566 ... Manning connected with sophomore WR **Mike Espy (Madison, Miss.)** on a 23-yard scoring strike with 9:24 left in the game to tie the game at 21-21.
- Ole Miss held Vanderbilt to 22 yards rushing on 23 carries after the first quarter.

**NICHOLS RECORDS A FIRST AGAINST THE COM-**

**MODORES:** Junior PK **Jonathan Nichols (Greenwood, Miss.)** became the first kicker in school history to make two field goals of over 50 yards in the same game during the 24-21 win at Vanderbilt on August 30. Nichols made a 51-yarder on his first attempt in the second quarter to break his career long of 50 set last season against Arkansas State. He then bettered that with a 54-yard effort with to break a 21-21 tie with 3:52 remaining in the game and lift the Rebels to a 24-21 win. The 54-yarder is tied for the fourth longest in Ole Miss history.

**NICHOLS NAMED SEC SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF**

**THE WEEK:** Junior PK **Jonathan Nichols (Greenwood, Miss.)** was named the Southeastern Conference's Special Teams Player of the Week for the week of August 30, after connecting on a game-winning, career-best 54-yard field goal to lift the Rebels to a 24-21 win at Vanderbilt. Nichols hit the game-winning kick with 3:52 remaining to break a 21-21 tie. He also made kicks of 51

and 20 yards, and converted on his lone PAT attempt, as Nichols became the first kicker in school history to make two field goals of over 50 yards in the same game. It was the second time in Nichols' career that he has earned SEC Special Teams Player of the Week honors. The Lou Groza Award candidate also earned the accolade after last year's contest against the Commodores, when he made three field goals and four PATs to account for 13 points.

**2003 CAPTAINS:** Senior DE **Charlie Anderson (Jackson, Miss.)**, senior WR **Chris Collins (Gloster, Miss.)**, senior QB **Eli Manning (New Orleans, La.)**, and senior DL **Jesse Mitchell (Moss Point, Miss.)** are serving as team captains for the 2003 season.

**ELI IS APPEARING IN NCAA COMMERCIALS:**

While the Ole Miss football team has seen its fair share of TV appearances over the last few seasons, senior QB **Eli Manning (New Orleans, La.)** is receiving a little extra air time this season. Manning is one of the featured athletes in the NCAA's "Stay in School" commercials this season. The spots are shown during televised NCAA events.

**MANNING NAMED TO SEC GOOD WORKS TEAM:**

Senior QB **Eli Manning (New Orleans, La.)** was named to the 2003 SEC Good Works Team and was a halftime feature in **Jefferson Pilot's** telecast of the August 30 game at Vanderbilt. During his time at Ole Miss, Manning has been probably in the greatest demand for community service by any student-athlete in school history. Among his many community service projects, Manning serves as a mentor to kids at the Oxford Learning Center as well as with the Lafayette County Juvenile Justice Program. He also participated at the "Christians With Cancer Camp" at Camp Hopewell and is the "Honorary Fall Round Up" Chairman for the 2003 Yocona Area Council Boy Scout Membership Drive. Last season, Manning was named to the 2002 **American Football Coaches Association (AFCA)** Good Works Team.

**NORTHCUTT NAMED TO AFCA GOOD WORKS**

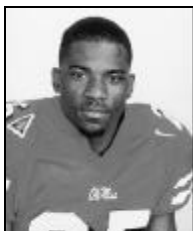
**TEAM:** Senior LB **Jamil Northcutt (Tullahoma, Tenn.)** was named to the 2003 **American Football Coaches Association (AFCA)** Good Works Team. He is the fifth Rebel to be named to the AFCA Good Works team in the last seven years, joining LB **Walker Jones (1997)**, RB **Deuce McAllister (1999)**, QB **Romaro Miller (2000)** and QB **Eli Manning (2002)**. Northcutt, who serves as a mentor for Oxford High School Fellowship of Christian Athletes, is a motivational speaker for FCA. He helps out at the North Mississippi Regional Center and has played a key role in the Reading With The Rebels program at local city, county and private schools. **SMITH EARNS SILVER MEDAL AT PAN AM GAMES:**

Sophomore QB **Seth Smith (Terry, Miss.)** missed the first part of fall drills as he was playing for the USA National Baseball Team in the 2003 Pan American Games in Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic. Team USA went 5-2 at the Pan Am Games, earning the silver medal. Smith started all seven games in right field at the competition, hitting .261 (6x23) and recording a .393 on-base average. Overall for the summer, Smith finished second on the team in hitting with a .322 average (28x87). He also had four home runs and nine RBIs to help Team USA finish its summer tour with a 27-2 record.

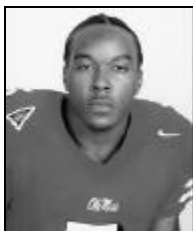

Marcus Randall, who stepped in for injured Matt Mauck five games ago, came off the bench and threw two touchdown passes as No. 21 LSU rallied to beat Ole Miss 14-13 in Baton Rouge.

Rick Clausen started the game in place of Randall. Clausen, a left-handed red-shirt freshman who had not played with a game on the line since high school, completed 2-of-6 passes for 9 yards. He was intercepted once and fumbled twice. He recovered both but lost 17 yards.

Randall started the second quarter and completed 13-of-20 passes for 179 yards and two touchdowns. His 27-yard TD pass to Michael Clayton with 6:34 remaining in the game erased a six-point deficit and put the Tigers ahead for good.

LSU outgained Ole Miss 322-279 but fumbled five times and lost three. The Tigers held the football 32:58 to Ole Miss' 27:02, but converted only 6-of-17 third downs.

While the LSU offense struggled, the Tigers' defense was tough. They limited Ole Miss to 61 yards rushing, sacked Eli Manning twice, intercepted him twice and held them to 5-of-16 third-down conver-

sions. Manning completed 19-of-38 passes for 218 yards and a touchdown.

Ole Miss was driving when LSU cornerback Corey Webster intercepted Manning's pass at the LSU 22 with 1:51 left in the game, ending the Rebels' hopes of winning the game.

Jonathan Nichols' 36-yard field goal gave Ole Miss a 3-0 lead in the first quarter. Manning added to the lead as he drove the Rebels 43 yards on four plays, capping the drive with a 20-yard touchdown pass to Mike Espy to make it 10-0.

The Tigers came back on a 76-yard drive. Randall hit Devery Henderson for a 19-yard touchdown to cut the Ole Miss lead to 10-7 at the half.

Travis Johnson recovered a fumble by Domanick Davis to set up a 39-yard field goal by Nichols that made it 13-7 in third quarter.

LeBrandon Toefield fumbled on LSU's first possession of the fourth quarter, giving Ole Miss the ball at the LSU 31. Ole Miss drove to the LSU 8, then Manning's pass bounced off Tremaine Turner's helmet and into the hands of Demetrius Hookfin. Hookfin returned the ball to the LSU 48, but LSU could not advance past midfield.

The breaks finally turned Ole Miss' way. After two possible TD passes were dropped that could have helped the Rebels win in their early-season losses to Memphis and Texas Tech, Auburn's Ben Obomanu dropped the possible game-winning TD pass in the end zone on third-and-goal.

Then on fourth-and-goal, junior Eric Oliver broke-up Jason Campbell's pass, and Eli Manning was able to take one snap from center and run out the clock to lift Ole Miss to a 24-20 win over Auburn in a key SEC Western Division game that was televised nationally by CBS.

The victory was the Rebels' (8-2) sixth straight and gave them their first 6-0 start in the SEC since 1962.

Ole Miss tied the game at 17 early in the fourth quarter when Jonathan Nichols capped a 10-play march with a 42-yard field goal. The field goal was the 41st of his career to tie the Ole Miss career record set by Brian Lee and it also moved him past Deuce McAllister and into first place on the school's career scoring list with 248 points.

The Tigers would answer on their ensuing possession, moving 56 yards in 10 plays to take a 20-17 lead on Philip Yost's 30-yard field goal.

After holding Ole Miss to three-and-out, Auburn (6-4, 4-2 SEC) took possession at the Rebel 40 with a chance to take control of the game. Ronnie Brown's 10-yard run gave the Tigers a first down at the 16 before the Rebel defense would stiffen.

Auburn managed just one yard on its next three plays and

Yost's 32-yard field goal sailed wide right with 7:20 remaining.

Senior QB Eli Manning, who had been held in check for most of the day, then took charge. Working with a makeshift offensive line due to injuries, Manning engineered a 10-play, 80-yard scoring march that took 4:41 off the clock.

Three times on the drive, Manning was forced to convert on third down, and all three times he did to extend the drive. Facing a 3rd-and-11 from the Ole Miss 19, Bill Flowers made a leaping catch of a Manning pass for 16 yards to the Rebel 35.

After two Brandon Jacobs' runs for five yards, Manning and the Rebels faced a 3rd-and-5 from the Ole Miss 40. On the third down, Manning hit FB Lorenzo Townsend in full stride and the junior rumbled down to the Auburn 12.

Manning then connected with FB Rick Razzano for a nine-yard gain to the three. After Auburn held on 2nd-and-1, Manning called his own number and gained two yards on a QB sneak to set-up first-and-goal at the one.

Following a timeout, Jacobs ran in from one yard out and Nichols tacked on the PAT to give Ole Miss a 24-20 lead with 2:39 remaining.

The Tigers would make one last drive deep into Rebel territory. After taking over on its own 19, Campbell passes of 11 and nine yards moved Auburn to the Tiger 39.

On the next play, Campbell hit Obomanu on a screen pass and he worked his way all the way to the Rebel 10.

On first-and-goal, Campbell hit Jeris McIntyre for a five-yard gain to the five and Carnell Williams then rushed for two yards to the three before Auburn stopped the clock with 45 seconds remaining.

On third-and-goal, Campbell rolled out to his right and found Obomanu wide open in the end zone. However, Obomanu wasn't able to haul in the pass and the Rebels were given new life.

Following Auburn's last time out, Campbell again rolled right and lofted a pass in the end zone towards McIntyre, but

Oliver was able to get a hand on it to knock the pass incomplete.

Manning overcame constant pressure from the Auburn defense, that resulted in four sacks, to finish 19-of-30 for 218 yards with two TDs and no interceptions. He was 4-of-5 for 72 yards on the game-winning drive.

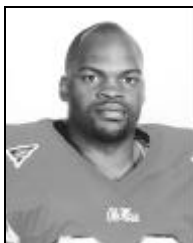

The Ole Miss offense is playing championship caliber football. The defense still needs work if the Rebels hope to win the SEC West for the first time.

Eli Manning threw for 391 yards and three first-half touchdowns and No. 20 Ole Miss withstood a late 28-point outburst to beat South Carolina 43-40 Saturday.

The Rebels (7-2) remained in first place in the West and improved to 5-0 in the Southeastern Conference for the first time since 1963 - the last time Ole Miss took the league title.

The Rebels' next two games are against Auburn and LSU, their two closest competitors in the West. They know three quarters of good football won't be enough against the Tigers - either of them.

The Rebels took a 43-14 lead in the third quarter before South Carolina (5-4, 2-4) scored touchdowns on four straight possessions.

Dondrial Pinkins led South Carolina, going 14-for-32 for a career-high 298 yards with four touchdowns and no interceptions.

Pinkins, from his own end zone, went deep down the right sideline to a wide-open Matthew Thomas for a 98-yard touchdown pass that made it 43-33 with 6:08 left in the game.

Then Pinkins found Noah Whiteside in the back of the end zone for a 20-yard TD pass to make it 43-40 with 1:40 left.

Finally, Ole Miss ran the clock out before the Gamecocks could get another chance.

After a terrible start, the Ole Miss defense made great

strides during October. The Rebels allowed 52 points while going 4-0.

The first game of November looked a lot like September for a defense that came in ranked 116th against the pass.

Manning finished 30-for-42 with an interception. Chris Collins had 10 catches for 125 yards and two first-quarter touchdowns.

Turner ran for a career-high 117 yards on 25 carries in his busiest game of the season.

His 10-yard TD around the left side with 7:40 left in the third quarter, made it 36-14.

And when Brandon Jacobs ran in from 7 yards out three minutes later, the Rebels appeared to be cruising.

But Pinkins and the Gamecocks made Ole Miss sweat out its fifth straight victory.

Not until Manning sneaked for a first down on third-and-inches with about a minute left could the Rebels finally celebrate.

The Gamecocks kept up with the SEC's highest scoring offense early on as Pinkins matched Manning TD pass for TD pass. They each threw two in the first quarter.

The Rebels were credited with a safety when Pinkins was called for intentional grounding in the end zone early in the second quarter.

The play gave the Rebels a 23-14 Rebels lead.

Manning capped a 260-yard first half with a 29-yard touchdown pass to Kerry Johnson, who ran over a defender to get into the end zone and make it 30-14 right before the break.

Junior FS Eric Oliver led the Rebels on defense with 10 tackles (7 solo). The Ole Miss defense recorded five TFL's, including three sacks.

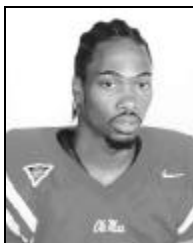

Eli Manning threw for 230 yards and three touchdowns and ran for another score as Mississippi scored the first 24 points of the game and went on to beat Alabama 43-28 on Saturday.

Ole Miss (5-2) is 3-0 in the Southeastern Conference for the first time since 1970, when Manning's father, Archie, was leading the Rebels.



Brodie Croyle threw two touchdown passes in the final five minutes for Alabama, but the Crimson Tide (3-5, 1-3) still lost for the fourth time in the last five games.

Eli Manning got lots of help from the rest of the Rebels in this one.

Ole Miss ran for 216 yards with Tremaine Turner getting 81 on 17 carries and Ronald McClendon adding 79 on 12. The Rebels' defense forced three turnovers, held the Crimson Tide to 116 yards rushing and finished the scoring with a safety.

Croyle returned to the lineup for Alabama after sitting out last week with a separated nonthrowing shoulder. He was 21-for-29 for 248 yards with two interceptions, including one on his first pass of the game that setup the Rebels' first touchdown. He played the entire game, despite a 25-point deficit in the fourth quarter and took several hard shots.

Ole Miss had lost 10 straight to Alabama before Manning led a come-from-behind victory against the

Crimson Tide two years ago.

This time the Rebels jumped out fast and never let the Crimson Tide get close.

Manning came out firing and Ole Miss went up 24-0 when Brandon Jacobs scored on an 10-yard run with 11 seconds left in the first quarter.

Manning was 7-for-9 for 121 yards in the first quarter, going up top for TD passes of 23 and 55 yards to Taye Biddle.

After Alabama cut the lead to 24-10 in the second quarter, Manning made his play of the game.

The senior eluded pressure up the middle, rolled to his right and on the move launched a deep pass that land right in Kerry Johnson's stomach for a 41-yard score to make it 31-10 just before halftime.

Manning flashed a little more mobility later, scrambling through defenders and diving into the end zone for a 3-yard touchdown to cap a long scoring drive and make it 38-10 with 8:55 left in the third.

Manning, who came in as the SEC's highest rated passer, finished 14-for-22 with no interceptions.

The Rebels were held defensively by junior FS Eric Oliver's nine hits (eight solo). He also had one TFL (-1 yard) and recovered one fumble. Junior LB Ken Bourmes collected six stops (four solo), and had 1.5 sacks (-13 yards). Ole Miss had a total of three sacks on the night.

Eli Manning was 23-for-36 for 306 yards and three touchdowns as Mississippi routed Arkansas State 55-0 on Saturday.

Manning, who played just three quarters, moved ahead of Florida's Rex Grossman for eighth place on the Southeastern Conference's career completion list with 692. He also moved up to No. 7 in career total offense with 8,309 yards.

Ole Miss (4-2) recorded its first shutout since it defeated Memphis 3-0 in 1999.

The Rebels, who entered the game ranked last in pass defense, gave up only 235 total yards and allowed Arkansas State to cross midfield only four times.

The Rebels, ranked fifth in the nation in total offense, gained 582 against the Indians (3-3).

Ole Miss has not lost to the Indians in the past 20 meetings, dating to 1915.

The Rebels led 14-0 in the first quarter before Arkansas State managed a first down.

Manning started 8-of-8 for 84 yards, opening with a 40-yard strike to Chris Collins on the first series that set up a 1-

yard touchdown run by Vashon Pearson.

Tremaine Turner capped the second possession, a 60-yard drive, with a 33-yard touchdown run.

An interception by linebacker Justin Wade set up the first of two field goals by Jonathan Nichols to bring the score to 20-0 at the half.

Arkansas State seriously threatened only once, coming midway through the second period. Quarterback Elliot Jacobs completed consecutive passes of 17, 28 and 23 yards to carry the Indians to the Ole Miss 4.

But Eric Neihouse bounced a 21-yard field-goal attempt off the left upright to end the threat.

Ole Miss opened the second half with scoring drives of 79, 83 and 65 yards, capped by Manning's three touchdown passes.

Reserve quarterback Michael Spurlock led the Rebels to a pair of touchdown drives in the final period.

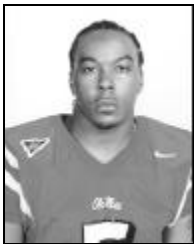

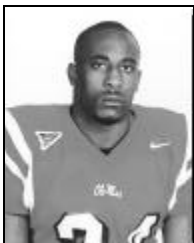

The great Ron Zook experiment at Florida endured another harsh blow, this time from Ole Miss and Eli Manning, who finally got his family into the win column at The Swamp.

Manning directed a late 50-yard touchdown drive to lift the Rebels to a 20-17 victory over the 24th-ranked Gators. It gave the Manning family the win at Florida that Eli's older brother, Peyton, could never get, while dropping Zook to 11-8 since he replaced Steve Spurrier as Florida's coach at the start of last season.

With his father, former Ole Miss quarterback Archie Manning, watching from the stands, Eli finished 17-for-29 for 262 yards.

The Gators (3-3, 1-2 Southeastern Conference) lost consecutive games at The Swamp for the first time since 1988-89, and a once storied program was shut out in the second half for the second straight year by Ole Miss (3-2, 2-0).

The Rebels, who beat Florida 17-14 last season in Oxford, came into this game with the nation's worst pass defense. But it was good enough to beat Florida, which fell to .500 at the latest point in the season since finishing 6-6 in 1987.

Barring a highly unlikely meeting in the SEC title game this year, Eli will finish his college career 2-0 against the Gators.

While Eli Manning was efficient, it was the Ole Miss running backs and defenders who really stole the show.

Vashon Pearson nudged over from 1 yard with 1:10 left to give the Rebels the winning score. Pearson finished with 48 yards, Ronald McClendon had 107, including a 52-yard touchdown, and Ole Miss ran for 223 total yards against a Florida defense that was missing its best linebacker, freshman Channing Crowder.

Florida's final drive was halted when Eric Oliver intercepted Chris Leak. It was the freshman quarterback's third pick of the game — all in the fourth quarter.

It figured the Gators would try to go after an Ole Miss pass defense that allowed 661 yards last week against Texas Tech. But the attacks came only sporadically. Leak finished 14-for-27 for 234 yards, and while the Gators did look downfield more than they had earlier this season, they also seemed determined to run and win with defense. Carthon led Florida with 108 yards rushing.

The close-to-the-vest plan helped Florida to a 17-13 lead to start the fourth quarter. Its first two drives of the quarter ended with interceptions, one by Von Hutchins and another by Travis Blanchard. After each pick, plus another Florida drive that went three-and-out, Ole Miss got the ball back at midfield.

The tiring Florida defense held the first two times, but finally, Ole Miss came through. Manning was patient and precise — managing the clock, hitting Chris Collins for gains of 8 and 12 yards, and handing off to Pearson a whole bunch. The result was an 8-play, 50-yard touchdown drive that ate up four minutes.

The Rebels sure are loving it. They're tied for first in the SEC West. After a Homecoming game against Arkansas State, they have three straight conference games at home, against Alabama, Arkansas and South Carolina.

Oliver and senior LB Justin Wade led the defense with eight tackles each. Hutchins, in addition to his interception, had six stops (two solo), one QB sack (-8 yards) and two pass deflections.

Despite more than 400 yards of passing from senior quarterback Eli Manning, and scoring on seven of eight drives, the Ole Miss Rebels were unable to hold off a late rally from visiting Texas Tech, as the Red Raiders downed the Rebels 49-45 in Oxford.

Ole Miss led the game 45-34 with 8:01 to go in the game, and seemingly had the game in hand, when Texas Tech quarterback B.J. Symons orchestrated two drives, capped with a 9-yard touchdown pass to Carlos Francis with 1:04 left in the game to put the Red Raiders on top for the win.

Ole Miss would drive the length of the field in an attempt to reclaim the lead and the win, but Manning's pass to Mike Espy was picked off by Ryan Aycock at the Texas Tech 11, sealing the win for the Red Raiders.

Manning finished the day 29-of-49 for 409 yards on the day with two interceptions. His first interception came at the hands of Vincent Meeks in the endzone in the second quarter, thwarting a Rebel scoring attempt.

Ole Miss struck quickly out of the gates, taking the opening kick and driving 77 yards in a little more than three minutes to go up 7-0.

The Red Raiders responded, using 1:28 to take the ensuing kick and driving 71 yards to tie the game up at 7-7

off a 9-yard pass from Symons to Henderson.

Ole Miss regained the lead off of a 39-yard field goal from Jonathan Nichols on the next drive to close out the first half up 10-7. Nichols set a new school record for scoring in a single game by a kicker with six field goals to go along with three PAT conversions. Nichols tallied 21 points on the evening.

Texas Tech notched two more scores quickly, taking a 21-10 lead off of a 15-yard pass from Symons to Wes Welker at the 12:19 mark of the second quarter, and a 70-yard touchdown pass to Carlos Francis.

Ole Miss chipped back into the lead with a Nichols field goal at the 5:18 mark of the second quarter, cutting the lead to 21-13. The Rebel defense stepped up on the ensuing drive by Texas Tech, as Kelvin Robinson intercepted a Symons pass at the Ole Miss 20 and returned it 80 yards for a touchdown to pull the Rebels within two at 21-19. The two-point conversion to tie the game failed.

Ole Miss would regain the lead right before halftime as Nichols kicked his third field goal of the night with :48 left in the half to cap a 7-play drive set up when Justin Wade forced a Texas Tech fumble on the Red Raider 36.

The Rebels came out strong in the second half, forcing a fumble on the opening kick and extending the lead to 39-27 by scoring on the first three possessions of the half, while holding the Red Raiders to only one score.

Texas Tech would continue to attack through the air, pulling within five again when Symons connected with Henderson on a 21-yard pass with 2:10 left in the third quarter.

Ole Miss would get into the redzone two more times, but come away with only field goals to take a 45-34 lead

before Texas Tech would mount its rally over the final 8:01 of the game for the win.

Senior WS Travis Blanchard led Ole Miss with 10 tackles. He was also credited with one TFL, one forced fumble and three pass deflections. The Rebels forced four fumbles on the night, recovering three as Eric Oliver, Kelvin Robinson and Iroko Ayodele all fell on loose balls for Ole Miss. Robinson also notched the only interception for the Rebel defense with his 80-yard interception return for a touchdown.

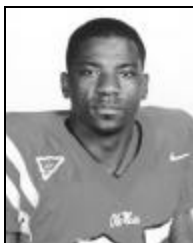

Eli Manning was 22-of-26 for 353 yards and three touchdowns and Ole Miss scored 45 straight points to beat Louisiana-Monroe 59-14 at Vaught-Hemingway Stadium.

Playing less than three quarters, Manning also ran for a touchdown to help the Rebels (2-1) become the 30th school in NCAA history to reach 575 victories.

Louisiana-Monroe (0-3) lost for the second time on the road to a Southeastern Conference Western Division team. LSU beat the Indians 49-7 in their season opener.

The Rebels set the tone on the game's first play as cornerback Von Hutchins intercepted a flea flicker pass by running back Kevin Payne. Seven plays later, Manning hit Chris Collins with an 18-yard touchdown pass.

Louisiana-Monroe answered with Steven Jyles connecting on a 24-yard scoring pass with Mack Vincent.

Jyles was 14-of-21 for 160 yards in the first half, but turnovers and two sacks prevented the Indians from mounting another serious scoring threat.

Ole Miss scored 45 straight points, including 17 in the second quarter, with Manning capping a 91-yard, 14-play drive with a three-yard run.

The Rebels covered 66 yards on their next touchdown drive, with Vashon Pearson scoring on a 1-yard run.

Linebacker Justin Wade set up the final points of the opening half, recovering a fumble as Charlie Anderson sacked reserve quarterback Daniel DaPrato.

The Rebels moved 64 yards in 46 seconds before Jonathan Nichols kicked a 30-yard field goal on the last play of the half.

Ole Miss finished the half with 342 yards of total offense. Manning was 15-of-19 for 238 yards in the half.

The Rebels scored on four consecutive possessions in the second half, with Manning throwing two touchdown passes.

Collins pulled in his second touchdown catch from 5 yards and finished with 10 catches for 121 yards, tying the school record in career receptions with 142.

Travis Johnson, returning to the starting lineup at cornerback after a two-game suspension, scored on a 45-yard interception return.

On Ole Miss' next series, Manning connected with Taye Biddle on a 49-yard touchdown pass. Manning was 7-of-7 for 115 yards in his only two series of the second half.

Reserve quarterback Micheal Spurlock connected with Lorenzo Townsend on a one-yard touchdown pass with 14:56 remaining to finish the 45-point outburst by the Rebels.

The Indians broke the Ole Miss scoring streak with a 20-yard touchdown pass from DaPrato to Floyd Smith. The Rebels finished the scoring on a 1-yard run from Jamal Pittman, who accounted for the entire nine-play, 69-yard drive.

Ole Miss finished with 612 yards of total offense, just short of the school record of 623 set against Auburn in 1951.

FS Eric Oliver led the Rebel defense with 11 tackles (9 solo) and one TFL. Johnson finished with six tackles (5 solo), one TFL and one interception.

Danny Wimprine threw for 355 yards and three touchdowns as Memphis beat Ole Miss 44-34 at the Liberty Bowl.

Wimprine threw a 19-yard touchdown pass to DeAngelo Williams for one score and Williams, who had 135 yards rushing, also scored on runs of a 19 and 20 yards.

But it was a 92-yard touchdown pass from Wimprine to Tavarious Davis with just over six minutes to play that put Memphis (2-0) ahead for good. Under pressure and off balance in his own end zone, Wimprine hit Davis near midfield, and Davis outran the defense to give the Tigers a 38-34

lead. Wimprine finished 18-of-33.

It marked the first Memphis win over the Rebels (1-1) since 1994, and the most points ever scored by Memphis in the 53-game series.

The Tigers overcame four touchdown passes by Ole Miss quarterback Eli Manning and Rebel scores on six successive possessions.

Manning, who was 26-of-48 for 292 yards, threw two interceptions in the fourth quarter, thwarting any potential comeback. Memphis converted one interception into a 17-

yard field goal by Stephen Gostkowski to seal the victory.

The Rebels got off to a slow start, spotting Memphis a 14-0 lead and trailing 21-17 at the half. But in the third quarter, Ole Miss capitalized on Memphis miscues for two one-play drives and a field goal.

First, Memphis returner Cole Hoppe tried to field a Rebel punt at his 5. Iroko Ayodele stripped him, and Chris Collins recovered for Ole Miss. On the next play, Manning hit Lorenzo Townsend for a 5-yard score.

After a short Memphis punt to the Tiger 40, Manning connected with Bill Flowers for a 40-yard touchdown.

Jonathan Nichols would later kick his second field goal of the day from 25 yards to give the Rebels a 34-21 lead heading into the fourth period.

But the Tigers, who appeared tired in the third, controlled the final quarter by scoring 23 points.

Junior FS Eric Oliver collected a team-high 12 stops (eight solo) for the Rebels, and was also credited with two pass deflections. Senior NT Jesse Mitchell had eight hits (six solo), including two TFLs (-8 yards).

He also had field goals of 51 and 20 yards in the second quarter as Ole Miss beat Vandy for the 10th time in the last 11 games.

The Commodores have lost 18 straight Southeastern

Conference games dating back to November 2000. They had one last chance in the final minute, but Rebel DE Charlie Anderson hit Jay Cutler twice, and Cutler threw the ball away under pressure on fourth down.

Eli Manning threw for one touchdown and a 2-point conversion for the Rebels. He was 22-of-33 for 275 yards. Manning also passed Kent Austin as Ole Miss' career com-

pletions leader. He needed only 12 coming into the game, and now has 576 for his career.

Vanderbilt outgained Ole Miss in total offense with 399-370, but the Rebels came through when it mattered.

The Commodores last led 21-14 at the beginning of the fourth quarter on Cutler's 2-yard TD pass to Brandon Smith.

That is when Manning took over. He led the Rebels on a 75-yard drive that he capped with a 23-yard TD pass to Mike Espy to tie the game at 21. Then he completed three passes on the final drive to set up Nichols' winning field goal.

The Commodores led 7-6 at halftime and could have had a bigger lead if not for two turnovers deep in Ole Miss territory, including an interception in the end zone.

Senior NT Jesse Mitchell had 10 hits (four solo), including one sack (-7 yards), and was credited with two QB pressures and one fumble recovery.
