Back home in Omaha: LSU returns to the College World Series for the first time in three years.

- LSU is making its 12th trip to the College World Series since 1986, and its first under coach Smoke Laval.
- The Tigers have five national championships (1991, 1993, 1996, 1997, 2000), tied for the second most all-time with Arizona St. and Texas, trailing only the 11 won by Southern California.
- With its first win in the CWS, LSU will win its 30th game all-time in Omaha and its 100th game in the NCAA Tournament.
- LSU enters the CWS with a 99-34 all-time mark in the NCAA Tournament, and the Tigers' .739 winning percentage is first all-time.
- The Tigers have finished in the top four on nine of their 11 visits, missing out only in 1986 (1-2) and 1994 (0-2).

Up First: LSU takes on Cal St. Fullerton in its opening game on Friday.

- Cal St. Fullerton was ranked No. 1 for a stretch earlier this season, and is 5-1 in post-season play after defeating Arizona St. in three games at home in its super regional.
- The Titans and Tigers have met once in Omaha, with Fullerton taking a 20-6 win in an elimination game on June 5, 1994.
- LSU and Fullerton have split six all-time meetings, with the Tigers winning twice in the 1998 South II Regional in the last meeting between the schools.
- Fullerton is the only team other than LSU to win a regional championship in Baton Rouge, as the Titans defeated Ohio St. in 1992 and Rice in 1995.
- The Titans have hit just 34 home runs as a team, but are batting .333, led by a .372 mark from right fielder Shane Costa.
- Fullerton's 2.75 team ERA is among the nation's best, with junior Jason Windsor posting a 1.82 ERA to go along with his 10-2 record.

The rest of bracket one: Stanford and South Carolina play the other bracket one game.

- South Carolina and LSU are Southeastern Conference rivals, with the Tigers winning two of three (5-1, 5-8, 12-4) in April in Baton Rouge.
- LSU is 19-9-1 vs. South Carolina, with all meetings coming since the Gamecocks joined the SEC in 1992.
- LSU and Stanford have met four times, with all four games coming in Omaha, with LSU holding a 3-1 edge.
- The Cardinal won in the 1987 CWS, with Paul Carey's grand slam off of Ben McDonald lifting Stanford to a 6-5, 10-inning win.
- The Tigers have won the last three meetings with the Cardinal, winning 10-5 and 13-9 en route to the 1997 championship, then taking a 6-5 win in the 2000 national championship game.

The other half: Bracket two features familiar faces in Miami, Texas and Rice, and a newcomer in Southwest Missouri St.

- LSU and Miami have not met since the 1996 national championship game, when the Tigers took a 9-8 victory on Warren Morris' two-out, two-run home run in the bottom of the ninth.
- The Tigers own an 8-5 edge over the Hurricanes, including a 2-1 mark in Omaha.
- Rice swept LSU in the 2002 super regional at Houston by scores of 6-0 and 3-0, but the Tigers won in a first round game of the 1997 CWS, 5-4.
- LSU and Southwest Missouri St. have met once, with the Tigers winning 10-7 in 1984 at Baton Rouge.
- LSU and Texas have split two CWS meetings, with the Longhorns winning 12-7 in 1989 and the Tigers claiming a 13-5 victory in 2000.
- Texas has won six of nine regular season meetings since 1994, taking two of three in 1994 and 1998 at Austin and 1999 in Baton Rouge.

LSU is ranked #4 in Collegiate Baseball, #5 in Baseball America and #11 in ESPN/USA Today. For listings of where all eight CWS teams are ranked, please see the polls page in this notes package.

NCAA Tournament Record

LSU is 99-35 (.739), good for the highest winning percentage in NCAA tournament history. LSU is 29-13 (.690) in the CWS, with five national championships (1991, 1993, 1996, 1997 and 2000) and three other third-place finishes (1989, 1990, 1998). The Tigers finished fourth in 1987, tied for fifth in 1986 and tied for seventh in 1994.

Last time in the CWS

In 2000, LSU went 4-0 in winning its fifth national championship. The Tigers defeated Texas (13-5), USC (10-4) and Florida St. (6-3) in bracket play before defeating Stanford (6-5) in the one-game championship.

Coach Smoke Laval

Laval, the 2003 SEC Coach of the Year, is 89-42-1 in his second season at LSU and is 330-201-1 overall in nine years as a head coach, the first seven of which were spent at UL-Monroe. Laval is 11-10 in NCAA Tournament play, 2-6 at ULM and 9-4 at LSU.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2003: Named a second team All-SEC pitcher with a 11-3 record and a 3.97 ERA in 18 appearances (14 starts) over 104.1 innings.

- The Tigers' leader in wins at 11-3, and has walked just 26 batters in 104 1/3 innings.
- Will look to bounce back from loss in the super regional vs. Baylor (6/6), giving up four runs on nine hits in eight innings.
- Went 7 2/3 innings to pick up 11th win in second round of Baton Rouge regional vs. Tulane (5/31).
- Named to the Baton Rouge regional all-tournament team for his efforts vs. Tulane.
- Went 9-1 with a 3.36 ERA in games vs. SEC opponents, working at least seven innings in all nine of those wins.
- Turned in sterling performance at SEC Tournament vs. Mississippi St. (5/23), giving up just two runs on 11 hits in throwing complete game victory to win 10th game.
- Allowed just one earned run over eight innings to pick up victory in the Tigers' SEC clinching win at Arkansas (5/16).
- Suffered worst outing of the year vs. Auburn (5/11), when he gave up five runs on seven hits in just 2/3 of an inning.
- Has given up both of the Tigers' biggest innings this year—7 runs vs. Kansas (2/16, Game 2, 3rd inning) and vs. Auburn (5/11, 1st inning).
- Has made his way to the SEC starting rotation after spending most of the first month in the Tiger bullpen.
- Has pitched at least seven complete innings in seven of eight SEC starts this season.
- Looking to bounce back from worst outing of the year vs. Auburn (5/11), when he gave up five runs on seven hits in just 2/3 of an inning.
- Fell just one out shy of his second complete game of the year at Mississippi St. (5/4), nonetheless picking up the win by giving up just one run in 8 2/3 innings.
- Turned in yet another outstanding outing, as he gave up no earned runs in seven innings vs. Tennessee (4/27), striking out seven.
- Gave up two runs in seven-plus innings at Vanderbilt (4/20), salvaging the series finale with his fifth consecutive SEC win.
- Turned in outstanding performance vs. Ole Miss (4/13), giving up just two runs and three hits in eight innings while striking out a career high 10.
- Fired first career complete game vs. South Carolina (4/6), striking out seven and walking only one. Allowed four runs, but only one run through the first eight innings.
- Turned in masterful outing in first conference appearance at Georgia (3/23), striking out a career high eight over 8.0 innings to earn the win.
- Won second consecutive start at Alabama (3/30), lasting seven innings and settling down after throwing three wild pitches in the first inning.
- Made stellar LSU debut on short notice vs. Northwestern St. (2/9), allowing two runs in 7.0 innings and striking out four. Took shutout into the seventh inning.
- Had rough second start vs. Kansas (2/16, Game 2), giving up eight runs on nine hits in 2 2/3 innings.
- Rebounded from Kansas game to pitch two scoreless innings vs. UL-Monroe (2/18).
- Allowed one run in 2.2 innings at Long Beach St. (3/1)
- Pitched two perfect innings of relief vs. Winthrop in series opener (3/7).
- Struggled in relief stint at Tulane (3/11), walking in two runs with the bases loaded without retiring a batter.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2003: A 2003 Freshman All-American by Collegiate Baseball, Meier Is 8-3 with a 2.83 ERA in 16 appearances (14 starts) totaling 95.1 innings.

- Is 7-0 this year when the Tigers score five or more runs when he starts.
- Pitched second career complete game in super regional finale vs. Baylor (6/8).
- Lost two starts in April due to lack of run support, as Tigers scored just four runs in those games.
- Took loss in SEC Tournament championship game vs. Alabama (5/25), giving up no earned runs through the first six innings and one in 6 1/3 innings.
- Closed out the regular season with a sterling outing at Arkansas (5/18), hurling eight strikeout innings and giving up five hits. Forced Arkansas into 15 fly ball outs in the game.
- Overcame three Auburn home runs to defeat the Tigers of the Plains in a crucial SEC series opener (5/9), going seven innings and giving up four runs on seven hits.
- Took no decision at Mississippi St. (5/2), giving up one run through five-plus innings and walking a season high five batters.
- Broke two-game losing streak with win vs. Tennessee (4/25), getting plenty of run support despite giving up four runs in 7 2/3 innings.
- Went seven innings but took second straight loss at Vanderbilt (4/18), giving up four runs on 10 hits.
- Took his first loss vs. Ole Miss (4/11), giving up five runs on eight hits in 6 1/3 innings. Retired 15 of 16 batters through five innings, but could not overcome four-run sixth inning.
- Coming off a complete game victory over South Carolina in his first career SEC start (4/4), giving up one run and striking out a career high eight while walking none.
- Made impressive debut at Centenary (2/11), pitching five scoreless innings and allowing two hits. Worked out of bases-loaded jam in first inning and faced minimum number of batters in second through fifth innings.
- Went to 2-0 with another impressive outing vs. UL-Monroe (2/18), giving up just one run on three hits in five innings.
- Threw five shutout innings vs. Southeastern Louisiana (3/5), yielding three hits and striking out a five.
- Went a season long 5 2/3 innings at Tulane (3/11), giving up no earned runs and four hits while striking out five.
- Made first relief appearance and first SEC appearance vs. Florida (3/16) and gave up two runs on three hits in 1 2/3 innings.
- Threw longest outing at UNO (3/25), striking out a season high six batters and walking none over seven innings.
- Notched first career save in series finale at Alabama (3/30), retiring the final two batters after hitting one batter to allow Crimson Tide to cut LSU lead to 11-10.

Tigers make it an even dozen in Omaha

LSU makes its 12th appearance in the College World Series starting on Friday, and for the Tigers, the two-year drought was their longest since Skip Bertman took LSU to its first CWS in 1986.

LSU has now placed itself in the top 10 in all-time appearances in the CWS, as its 12th trip ties it with its first round opponent, Cal St. Fullerton, for 10th on the all-time list. Leading the way for most appearances is Texas, which is making its 30th appearance this year.

Nobody leaves LSU without reaching Omaha

By reaching this year's edition of the College World Series, LSU was able to keep an important tradition alive, as no player who has stayed in the program at least three years since Skip Bertman's arrival in 1984 has failed to make at least one trip to the CWS.

One prominent member of the 2003 team was about to go his entire career without stepping on the field at Rosenblatt Stadium, and that was junior shortstop Aaron Hill, who will sign with the Toronto Blue Jays following the season after the club made him its first round draft choice.

The Green Team

This year's LSU team will be the first Tiger club to advance to the College World Series, other than the first LSU team to reach Omaha in 1986, without any players who have played previous in the CWS. Two players on LSU's 2003 roster, right-handed pitchers Bo Pettit and Chad Vaught, were squad members on the 2000 championship team, but neither was a member of the 25-man dress roster that took the title game over Stanford.

The only current member of LSU's team to have any Omaha experience is coach Smoke Laval, who was an assistant coach to Skip Bertman for six trips to the CWS from 1986 through 1993. But this is Laval's first visit in charge of the Tigers.

LSU won't be alone, though, in lacking CWS experience, as Southwest Missouri St. is in Omaha for the first time.

California dreaming

The last two seasons have marked the rare sight of LSU playing a school from California in the regular season, as the Tigers took on Long Beach St. in Baton Rouge in 2002 and at Blair Filed this year, the Tigers' first ever visit to California.

But playing a team from the Golden State in the CWS is not such a rare occurrence. In fact, counting the opener against Cal St. Fullerton, LSU will have played 7 of its last 11 games against teams from California—four vs. USC and three vs. Stanford. LSU could also play Stanford in the near future, as the Cardinal are in the Tigers' bracket along with Fullerton and South Carolina.

LSU is 9-6 all-time against teams from the Golden State in Omaha, and have played at least one game against a California team in nine of 11 previous CWS visits, missing only in 1990 and 1996. LSU is 3-1 vs. Stanford and Long Beach St., 2-2 vs. USC, 1-0 vs. Fresno St. and 0-1 vs. both Cal St. Fullerton and Loyola-Marymount, the opponent in the Tigers' first ever CWS game on May 30, 1986.

In all NCAA tournament games, the Tigers are 19-8 vs. the Golden State.

Tigers set new attendance marks

The super regional finale vs. Baylor was a testament to the greatest fans in all of college baseball, as Tiger fans banded together to set not one, but two attendance marks as LSU crushed the Bears.

The first was a new record for **actual** attendance at Alex Box Stadium, as a crowd of 7,492 jammed every inch of bleacher space and then some. The old actual attendance mark was 7,460, on hand for a doubleheader sweep by LSU over Mississippi St. on May 9, 1992.

The paid attendance of 7,739 brought the season total of tickets sold to 291,676, breaking the old mark of 286,874 set in 2000. However, the 7,478 average per game fell just short of the record of 7,532 set in 2002.

More than likely, LSU is in line to win its eighth consecutive NCAA attendance championship when the figures are released later this summer.

Tigers can hit two milestones with one win in Omaha

With one win in the College World Series, LSU will achieve two significant milestones in NCAA tournament play.

The first will be the Tigers' 30th win in CWS play, something only seven other schools have done: Arizona, Arizona St., Miami, Oklahoma St., Stanford, USC and Texas. LSU is currently 29-13 in the CWS, good for a .690 winning percentage.

That win will also give LSU its 100th NCAA tournament win, and put it in the company of Arizona St., Miami, Oklahoma St., Stanford, USC and Texas. LSU is 99-35 in NCAA play, with its .740 winning percentage ranking first all-time.



Tigers close home slate with 30 wins

The win over Baylor in the super regional finale not only gave LSU its 12th trip to the College World Series in the last 18 years, but it also marked the 12th time since 1985 that LSU has won 30 or more games in a season at Alex Box Stadium.

LSU closed out 2003 with a 30-8-1 record at home, and won 26 of 31 games in Baton Rouge following the three-game sweep by Kansas and a loss to Houston in February. Combined with a 28-8 home mark in 2002, the Tigers are a solid 58-16-1 (.780) under Smoke Laval at home after going 547-124-1 (.815) under Skip Bertman from 1984 through 2001.

Prior to this year, LSU had failed to win 30 games at home in an uncharacteristic four consecutive years. The Tigers' best stretch at home came from 1985 through 1987, when they were 99-13 (.882) at home. The period from 1996 through 1998 yielded an even 100 wins at The Box (100-14, .877).

In the last 20 years, LSU is 605-140-2 (.811) at home.

Backs to the wall? No problem

LSU's super regional victory over Baylor marks the sixth time since 1989 that LSU has needed two wins to avoid elimination from the NCAA tournament and has come through.

The previous five occurrences of this phenomenon occurred in regional play. The first came in 1989 at College Station when LSU upended top-ranked Texas A&M twice in the Central Regional final. It continued through to regional wins at home in 1990 (USC), 1997 (South Alabama), 1999 (East Carolina) and 2002 (UL-Lafayette).

LSU is now 29-12 (.707) all-time in NCAA tournament elimination games, not counting the CWS championship game. The Tigers are 5-5 in CWS elimination games, losing their last two, to USC in 1998 and Cal St. Fullerton in 1994. The Tigers went undefeated in winning the national championship in 1996, 1997 and 2000.

LSU perfect vs. SEC brethren in Omaha

With South Carolina in LSU's bracket at the CWS, a possible rematch between the conference rival Tigers and Gamecocks certainly appears to be a possibility.

For the Tigers, such a matchup might come as a relief, as LSU is a perfect 6-0 all-time vs. SEC foes at the CWS. Four of those wins are over Florida, two each in 1991 and 1996, plus one over Alabama in the 1997 championship game and one in 1998 over Mississippi St.

LSU is 7-0 against current members of the SEC in Omaha, but the Tigers' 1987 5-2 victory over Arkansas came while the Razorbacks were in the Southwest Conference.

There have been a total of 10 all-SEC matchups in the CWS, with the most recent coming in 2001 between Tennessee and Georgia. The others not involving LSU were two Alabama-Mississippi St. contests in 1997 and a Florida-MSU match in 1998.

Tigers time first extra inning win of '03 just right

When LSU's regional championship round game with UNC Wilmington went to extra innings, there was some cause for concern, given the fact that the Tigers had lost all four regular season games that had gone into extra innings.

This time, however, the script had a happy ending for the Tigers, as Jon Zeringue's one out home run in the bottom of the 11th inning sent LSU into the super regional round with a 9-8 victory over the Seahawks.

The win marked LSU's first extra inning win since last May 10 at Florida, and the first time LSU has won on a "walkoff" home run since Matt Heath's solo shot in the bottom of the 11th to beat Long Beach St. last March 3.

LSU is now 4-1 all-time in NCAA Tournament post-season games. Here's a look at those games:

Ten runs LSU's magic number in NCAA play

LSU took its habit of winning in the post-season when it scores 10 or more runs to an extreme in the super regional final against Baylor, scoring a 20-5 rout to return to the College World Series.

The win over the Bears improved the Tigers to 62-2 all-time in post-season play when scoring 10 or more runs, and 46-1 in NCAA Tournament games. LSU is 3-0 this season when hitting 10 or more runs in the NCAA tournament, defeating Northeastern and Tulane in the regional before Sunday's big win.

The only team to defeat LSU when the Tigers score 10 or more runs in an NCAA tournament game is East Carolina, which took an 11-10 win on May 29, 1999. The Tigers are a perfect 10-0 when scoring in double figures in the CWS, including wins over Texas and USC in LSU's last visit in 2000.

LSU is also 16-1 in the SEC Tournament when hitting double figures, with the lone setback a 12-11 loss to Kentucky on May 18, 1996.

Double vision still perfect for LSU in 2003

The super regional finale vs. Baylor improved LSU to 22-0 this season when scoring 10 or more runs in a game.

Since Smoke Laval came to LSU in 2002, the Tigers are 35-1 when scoring in double figures, with the only loss being a 12-11 setback at Houston on February 24, 2002. At home, LSU is 25-0 under Laval when reaching 10 runs.



Hill drafted by Blue Jays in first round

When Aaron Hill turned down a seventh-round offer from the Anaheim Angels to play for the Fighting Tigers in the summer of 2000, some wondered why the California native turned down such a lucrative offer.

Three years later, Hill is smiling all the way to the bank. And to be sure, the Toronto Blue Jays are, too, because the Jays chose Hill with the 13th overall selection in the 2003 Major League Baseball draft on June 3.

Hill, the SEC Player of the Year and a second team All-American, became the 12th LSU player to be selected in the first round since the draft began in 1965. He also becomes the fourth Tiger shortstop to go in the opening round, along with Mike Miley in 1974, Russ Johnson in 1994 and Brandon Larson in 1997.

Hill was the second SEC player selected, behind only Mississippi State left-handed pitcher Paul Maholm, who went eighth to Pittsburgh. He was also the third Louisiana college player to be drafted, behind Southern second baseman Rickie Weeks (2nd overall to Milwaukee) and Tulane first baseman Michael Aubrey (11th to Cleveland).

Hill named SEC Player of the Year

Many times, a rule of thumb is that the best player on the championship team will win a league's Most Valuable Player award, and such a path came true this year, as LSU shortstop Aaron Hill was named the SEC Position Player of the Year prior to the SEC Tournament.

Hill led the SEC in batting average in conference games at .398, while also posting a league high .483 on-base percentage in conference games in leading the Tigers to their first conference title since 1997.

Hill is the fourth LSU player to win SEC Player of the Year honors, joining Todd Walker (1993), Russ Johnson (1994) and Eddy Furniss (1996), all of whom also earned first team All-America honors during the seasons in which they won the SEC MVP award.

Hill named second team All-American

The awards keep rolling in for LSU shortstop Aaron Hill, who was named a second team All-American by both Collegiate Baseball and ESPN/USA Today Sports Weekly last week.

Hill, a junior from Visalia, Calif., has been the glue of the Tigers' team through this injury-plagued campaign, batting a team high .366 entering the CWS, and leading the SEC with a .475 on-base percentage. Hill also leads the Tigers in runs scored (67), RBI (67), doubles (27) and walks (47), while striking out 21 times in 317 plate appearances.

Hill is tied for second for doubles in a season with 27, and needs just six hits to become just the 10th player to collect 100 hits in a single season.

Hill has also been the Tigers' most dangerous clutch hitter, batting .405 with runners in scoring position and hitting .406 with 21 RBI with two out.

Hill is the only LSU player to start all 63 games during the regular season, and was a standout on the 2002 United States national team that won the silver medal in the inaugural World University Games in Italy.

The Tigers did not have a first- or second-team selection in either 2001 or 2002 in any of the three major publications. Baseball America, the third major publication, will not release its All-America team until the College World Series gets underway later this month.

Hill continues in the long line of LSU shortstops to earn All-America honors, joining Brandon Larson (1997), Jason Williams (1996) and Russ Johnson (1994) to earn such distinction in the last decade.

Hill closes out Alex Box career in style

With the Tigers on their way to Omaha, some LSU fans at Alex Box Stadium also felt a sense of loss, as it would be the last time they would see shortstop Aaron Hill perform in an LSU uniform.

With a chance to make a lasting impression in the ninth inning, Hill did just that, lining an RBI single into center field for LSU's final run at home of the 2003 season. The crowd responded with a long standing ovation for Hill, who will finally get his chance to perform on college baseball's biggest stage starting this weekend.

Hill, who hit a home run in the second game of the super regional to give LSU a 3-0 lead, was 3-for-5 with three RBI in his Alex Box finale, drove in five runs and was 5-for-15 in the three-game series with the Bears.

Hill was named to the all-tournament teams at the SEC Tournament and the regional, and in 10 post-season games, he is batting .357 (15-for-42) with 12 runs scored, 10 RBI and a .500 on-base percentage, while batting .579 with runners in scoring position in the last 10 contests.



Seeing double in a single inning

LSU's 11-run sixth inning against Baylor in the super regional finale was the Tigers' third inning of exactly 11 runs this season. The Tigers also scored 11 runs in the fourth inning on April 27 against Tennessee and on May 10 in the third inning vs. Auburn.

The three 11-run innings are more double figure innings than LSU had in 2001 AND 2002 combined. Prior to the uprising against Tennessee, LSU hadn't hit double figures in an inning since scoring 14 runs in the third inning of a regional contest vs. UL-Monroe on May 27, 2000.

Of course, the record for runs in a single inning for the Tigers was 18 in the seventh inning of the 1996 South II Regional championship game vs. Georgia Tech. Here's a list of 10-run innings for LSU in the NCAA Tournament:

Tigers get 20-20 vision

While 10-run games for LSU are commonplace in the post-season, 20-run games are not that common. In fact, Sunday's game with Baylor was only the Tigers' third game of 20 or more runs in its long and illustrious post-season history.

The other two games were the 29-13 win over Georgia Tech in 1996 and a 21-0 win over UL-Monroe in 2000.

LSU has scored 20 or more runs twice this year, with the other time in addition to Sunday coming in a 20-3 win over Auburn on May 10.

The 80s are back at LSU

Well, at least in terms of home run hitting, that is. With three home runs in the super regional finale vs. Baylor, the Tigers moved their home run total to 82 for the year, marking the 10th time in the last 11 years and the 13th time since 1986 that LSU has hit 80 or more home runs.

Last year, LSU hit just 65 home runs in 66 games, an average of just under one per game, the first time since 1990 that LSU had failed to average at least one home run per game. This year, the Tigers are averaging 1.24 home runs per game (82 in 66 contests), a respectable number, but far off the record pace of 1997, when LSU hit 188 in 70 games, or 2.69 per game.

With only one other team still alive (South Carolina) in the SEC, LSU will win its first season home run title since smacking 157 in 1998, the last of three consecutive home run crowns for the Bayou Bombers.

Zeringue makes most of first hit in super regional

Coming into his first at-bat in the super regional finale, LSU right fielder Jon Zeringue was 0-for-7 in the first two games against Baylor.

That all changed with one swing of the bat in the finale, as his three-run home run in the second inning that tied the game at 3-3. By time Baylor scored again, LSU had 17 runs on the board, and the Tigers' ticket to Omaha had been punched.

Zeringue finished the game by setting a pair of career highs by scoring four runs and driving in four runs, his second four-RBI game of the year, along with the April 12 outing against Ole Miss.

Over the Tigers' last 33 games, Zeringue continues to hold his own as LSU's top hitter, batting .378 with 36 runs scored, 26 RBI and a solid .583 slugging percentage. Entering the CWS, Zeringue, who was batting .204 when he was re-inserted into the starting lineup on March 22 at Georgia, is batting .333 with 13 home runs and 44 RBI.

Tigers win the close ones under Smoke

The second game of the super regional against Baylor was yet another one-run win for LSU, improving the Tigers to 3-0 in one-run games during the 2003 post-season and 9-4 overall for the year.

The Tigers have been tough under coach Smoke Laval in the close games, posting a solid 21-12 mark in one-run games since the start of the 2002 season.

Dating back to the 2000 post-season, LSU has won seven consecutive one-run games in post-season play, last losing to East Carolina in the 1999 regional by an 11-10 count.

The Tigers are 5-4 all-time in one-run games in the College World Series, but two of those wins came in the championship game, 9-8 over Miami in 1996 and 6-5 over Stanford in 2000.

Stewart makes most of final home game of '03

For Quinn Stewart, his post-season almost ended before it began, as the sophomore designated hitter sprained his left ankle in warm-ups prior to the first game of the regional vs. Northeastern on May 30, and did not play in the three-game sweep of the regional and the first two games of the super regional.

Stewart made the most of his lone appearances against Baylor in the super regional finale, as he doubled home a run and eventually scored in the ninth inning, and was given a standing ovation by the record crowd at Alex Box Stadium. Stewart's other pinch hit this year was a home run on May 10 vs. Auburn.

Contributions from all

The super regional finale vs. Baylor marked the third time in the NCAA tournament that every LSU starter has collected at least one hit. The Tigers also achieved the feat in regional wins over Northeastern and UNC Wilmington.



Sadler, Wilson both drafted by San Francisco
Former LSU All-America pitcher Kurt Ainsworth is already a part of the San Francisco Giants' rotation, and before long, he may not be alone as a former Tiger pitcher on the hill for the Giants.

San Francisco used two of its selections in the Major League draft earlier this week to take a pair of LSU right-handed pitchers, selecting reliever Billy Sadler in the sixth round and then taking starter Brian Wilson in the 24th round.

Sadler, who leads the Tigers with 25 appearances this year, 24 in relief, is 1-1 with a 3.92 ERA and four saves on the year, but he did not pitch in the Baton Rouge regional last week.

Wilson was selected despite the fact his season ended on March 28 at Alabama, as he underwent Tommy John surgery to repair a damaged ligament in his right elbow on April 16 in Birmingham in a procedure performed by Dr. James Andrews.

Sadler and Wilson are the third and fourth players to be picked by the Giants since 1999. In addition to Ainsworth, San Francisco took outfielder Todd Linden in the first round of the 2001 draft.

Pettit taken again by Minnesota, hits milestones

Following the 2002 season, Bo Pettit had to make a decision: either give up his final season at LSU to sign with the Minnesota Twins as the team's 13th round draft pick, or come back for another year with the Tigers, and face a possibly uncertain future.

For the Twins and for Pettit, everything has come full circle. Pettit was drafted in the 29th round on Wednesday by Minnesota, and will report to the Twins' minor league camp for assignment following the 2003 season.

Before Pettit makes his pro debut, he hopes to get at least one more start for the Tigers in the College World Series. Pettit, along with fellow fifth-year senior Chad Vaught, were part of the Tigers' 2000 national championship team, but neither Pettit nor Vaught were part of the 25-man roster that played in Omaha.

Pettit made his final appearance at Alex Box Stadium in game two of the super regional vs. Baylor and hit two personal milestones, reaching 300 career strikeouts and 300 career innings pitched. Pettit will leave the Tigers as one of only nine pitchers to strike out 300 batters in his career, and his 300 innings pitched are a testament to his endurance despite going through several arm injuries that cost him the first three years of his career.

Pettit worked six innings against Baylor despite a painful blister on his middle finger of his right hand.

Determann earns Freshman All-America honors

On the Thursday prior to the super regional, Tiger left-hander Jason Determann was one of two LSU pitchers to earn Freshman All-America honors from Collegiate Baseball, along with right-hander Justin Meier.

Determann then showed just why he was worthy of such honors in the second game of the super regional against Baylor, pitching three scoreless innings to pick up his seventh win of the year against no losses. Actually, Determann blew his first save opportunity of the season by giving up two hits in the seventh that gave Baylor the lead, but the Tigers took the lead back in the top of the eighth, and Determann retired the final five batters to end the game.

Determann is 3-0 with a 3.45 ERA in four post-season games, allowing just one walk and 16 hits in 15 2/3 innings. The Baton Rouge native has not walked a single batter in 8 1/3 innings in the NCAA tournament, posting a 2-0 record with a 2.16 ERA.

Meier goes the distance to pitch LSU to Omaha

Justin Meier just missed his second complete game of the year on the final day of the regular season at Arkansas, but with the opportunity to go the route in the super regional finale, the LSU coaching staff didn't even bother to warm anyone up.

Meier finished what he started in defeating Baylor, notching his second complete game of the year. The Florida native also went the distance on April 4 against South Carolina, a team Meier could well face again in Omaha.

With the win over Baylor, Meier becomes the first LSU pitcher ever to throw a complete game in a contest that clinched a trip to the CWS.

Meier, who is now 8-3 with a 2.83 ERA on the year, was named a Freshman All-American by Collegiate Baseball after going 7-2 with a 2.70 ERA in the regular season. Meier and teammate Jason Determann are the fourth and fifth pitchers to be named Freshman All-American since the 2001 season. Clay Harris (now a full-time first baseman) and Jason Vargas (since departed) earned the honor in 2002, while Lane Mestepey was the newspaper's Freshman of the Year in 2001.

Relief not needed

LSU relief pitchers have not been called upon much in the NCAA tournament, as the Tigers have called on the bullpen a total of seven times in six games, with three of those appearances coming from Jason Determann. Only once in the post-season has LSU used more than one reliever in a game, and that was on May 30 in the regional opener vs. Northeastern.

For the year, LSU has called on its bullpen 85 times in 66 games, an average of 1.29 appearances per game, down from the 97 appearances by the bullpen in 66 games in the 2002 season. Only six times in 66 games has LSU needed three or more relievers, and none since May 6 vs. Loyola.



Harris slams the door on Baylor, trip to Omaha

Entering his at-bat in the sixth inning of the super regional finale vs. Baylor, LSU first baseman Clay Harris was a solid 3-for-9 this year with the bases loaded.

But the sophomore from Slidell would gladly trade his three previous hits for what was to follow next, as Harris launched a grand slam that gave LSU a 10-3 lead and propelled the Tigers to the College World Series.

Harris' grand slam was LSU's first after the Tigers' 80 previous home runs of 2003 were hit with at least one base empty. The Tigers' last grand slam came on April 14, 2002, when Blake Gill hit a pinch-hit slam against Georgia.

For Harris, it was his second career grand slam, joining a pinch-hit slam on February 17, 2002 against Mercer in his first career plate appearance in an LSU uniform.

Prior to Harris' home run, the Tigers' last grand slam in the post-season was by the late Wally Pontiff in the 2000 SEC Tournament championship game against Florida. The last grand slam for LSU in the NCAA Tournament was by Brad Cresse in the South II Regional title game against Cal St. Fullerton on May 24, 1998.

Harris is just 7-for-26 (.269) in the NCAA tournament, but four of those hits are home runs. The biggest of those four home runs actually came in the second game of the super regional, when he led off the eighth inning with a home run that tied the game at 5-5. Harris is now tied with Ryan Patterson for the team lead with 15 home runs.

Liuzza enjoys super series

One of the characteristics of LSU's potent offense is the ability for any one player to step it up his game at any given time and pick up his teammates. Such was the role of freshman catcher Matt Liuzza in the super regional.

While the hitters in front (Jon Zeringue) and after (Bruce Sprowl) him were 0-for-14 in the first two games, Liuzza was going 5-for-8, including his first career three-hit game in the super regional opener. In the finale of the Baylor series, Liuzza was 3-for-5, giving him two three-hit games in a three-day span after failing to collect three hits in any of the previous 52 games in which he played.

Liuzza is batting an even .500 (12-for-24) in six NCAA tournament games, raising his season batting average from .284 following the SEC Tournament to a cool .312 entering the CWS.

Sprowl makes up for lost series in finale

Like teammate Jon Zeringue, Bruce Sprowl overcame a slow start to the super regional with a great finale, as the Tigers' left fielder was 3-for-5 in the last game of the Baylor series after going 0-for-7 in the first two games. It marked Sprowl's sixth three-hit game of the year and second of the post-season, joining a 3-for-5 effort on May 24 vs. Mississippi St. in the SEC Tournament.

Tigers ready for prime time players

LSU will open the College World Series in a familiar position, as the Tigers' game with Cal St. Fullerton is the second game scheduled for Friday.

This marks the sixth time in LSU's 12 appearances at Omaha that the Tigers' first game is the second game on Friday. LSU played the second game on Friday in 1987 and 1994 vs. Florida St., 1991 vs. Florida, 1993 vs. Long Beach St. and 1997 vs. Rice.

Only once in LSU's 12 CWS appearances have the Tigers played the first game of the series, and that was in 1986, when LSU played its first-ever game in Omaha against Loyola-Marymount.

LSU has opened the CWS on Saturday five times, opening in the afternoon in 1990 and 1998 at night in 1989, 1996 and 2000. The Tigers are 8-3 in opening round games, winning their last four openers since a loss to Florida St. in 1994.

Highest seed left standing

For the second time in five years, LSU finds itself in the College World Series as the highest remaining national seed. The Tigers were the No. 2 national seed entering the tournament, and now LSU is the top seeded team left, as No. 1 Florida St. was ousted in the super regional round by Texas.

In 2000, top-seeded South Carolina was ousted in the super regional round by UL-Lafayette, and No. 2 LSU went through the open door to its fifth national championship.

This is the second straight year that a top-seeded Florida St. team has been ousted prior to the CWS. Last year, No. 2 Clemson was the highest remaining seed entering Omaha, but was ousted by in-state rival South Carolina prior to the final.

SEC title not required, but it helps

LSU enters the CWS as Southeastern Conference regular season champion for the first time since 1997. Although winning an SEC championship doesn't guarantee a national championship, it doesn't hurt, either.

In four of the Tigers' five national championship seasons, LSU won the SEC championship. The Tigers won the regular season crown in 1991, 1996 and 1997, and in 1993, won the West Division tournament, which counted in the league standings and eventually gave LSU the highest winning percentage in the league.

The only exception to the rule was 2000, when LSU finished second in the overall standings to South Carolina, but won the SEC Tournament as part of a 1-3-0 post-season run.

LSU's greatest moments in the CWS

June 17, 2000—LSU overcomes a 5-2 deficit against Stanford in the eighth inning as a solo home run by Jeremy Witten and a two-run home run by Blair Barber in the eighth inning off of All-American Justin Wayne ties the game at 5-5. The Tigers win their fifth national championship in the ninth when Brad Cresse singles home Ryan Theriot with the game-winning run.

May 30, 1998—LSU hits a College World Series record eight home runs in a 12-10 victory over Southern California. Seven different LSU players hit home runs, but it is a two-run single by Trey McClure in the eighth inning that is the difference.

May 30, 1997—Brandon Larson hits a towering two-run home run off of Rice All-American Matt Anderson in the seventh inning to tie the game at 4-4. Jeremy Witten's sacrifice fly one inning later is the difference in a 5-4 victory.

June 8, 1996—Warren Morris hits his only home run of the 1996 season—a two-out, two-run blast in the bottom of the ninth inning to lift LSU to a 9-8 victory over Miami in the national championship game, giving the Tigers their third title since 1991.

June 11, 1993—Todd Walker's RBI single in the bottom of the ninth inning scores Armando Rios with the game-winning run as LSU rallies from a 5-3 deficit to take a 6-5 win over Long Beach St. to advance to the championship game.

June 8, 1991—LSU wins its first national championship with a 6-3 victory over Wichita St.

May 6, 1989—Mike Bianco's three-run home run lifts LSU to a 6-3 victory over Miami in an elimination game.

June 1, 1986—LSU's Jeff Yurtin collects four hits as the Tigers win their first CWS game with an 8-4 victory over Maine.

LSU Coach Smoke Laval

LSU coach Smoke Laval followed up a successful rookie campaign at LSU by leading the Tigers to the 2003 SEC Championship and earning SEC Coach of the Year laurels, becoming the sixth LSU coach to earn that distinction.

Now, Laval has LSU back in the College World Series for the first time since the Tigers' 2000 national championship run, and any doubts as to whether the 47-year old Pittsburgh native could coach at the highest level of college baseball are once and for all dispelled.

Laval was named Skip Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, and spent the 2001 season as the LSU administrative assistant. From 1994-2000, Laval coached for seven years at Louisiana-Monroe, guiding the Indians to three NCAA regional berths (1995, 1999, 2000) and a 241-159 mark. Among Laval's pupils at ULM was Ben Sheets, a 2000 member of the United States Olympic gold medal team and a 2001 major league all-star with the Milwaukee Brewers.

Laval was Bertman's top assistant at LSU from 1984-1993, helping the Tigers reach the College World series six times and win the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval was also a graduate assistant at LSU under Jack Lamabe in 1979 and an assistant at Florida in 1982 and 1983.

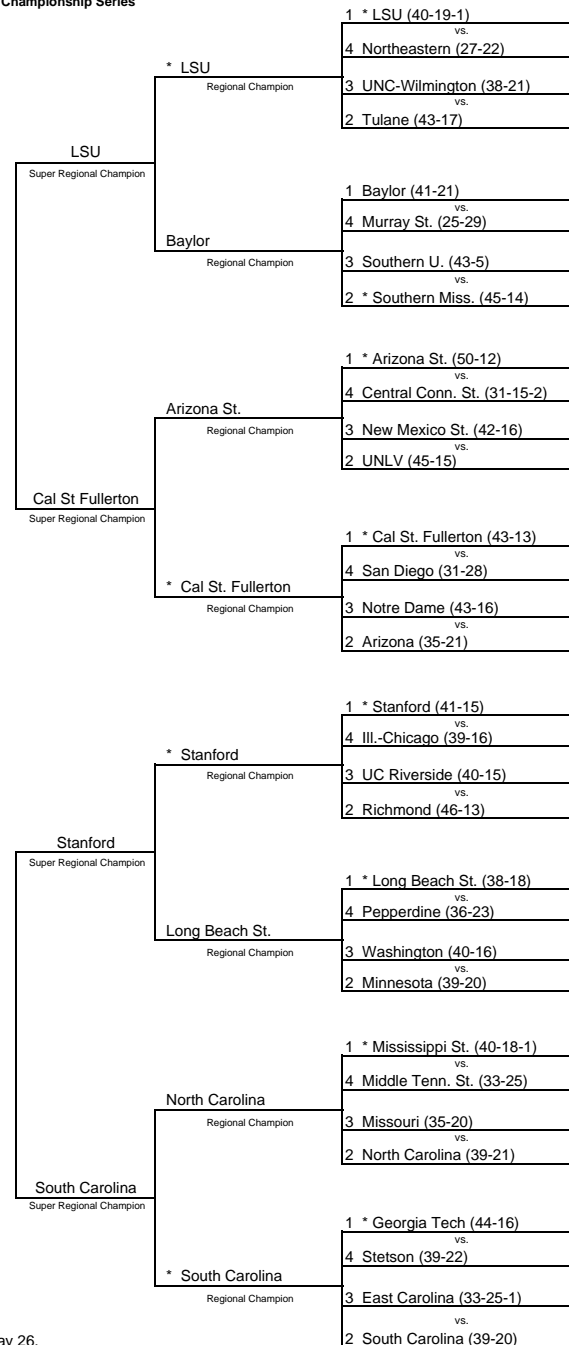
