Game 47: LSU at Tennessee—Friday, May 3, 7 p.m. EDT, Knoxville

Good to see you again: LSU visits Knoxville to take on Tennessee for the first time since 1999.

- Tonight's game begins a stretch of nine consecutive games in the SEC to close the regular season.
- LSU is 4-5 this year against the SEC East, sweeping Georgia but losing two of three to Vanderbilt and South Carolina.
- The Tigers remain 3 1/2 games behind SEC leader Alabama, but are just one-half game behind Ole Miss for second place in the SEC West.
- LSU completed a 14-3 April with its 13-0 victory at New Orleans on Tuesday.

Scouting the Vols: Tennessee is 23-23 just one year after finishing third at the College World Series.

- UT lost an exhibition game to the Double-A Tennessee Smokies 5-4 on Wednesday in Sevierville.
- The Vols shocked the SEC by taking two of three from Ole Miss in Oxford. Ole Miss had won 11 of 13 in the league before last weekend.
- Tennessee, which started 1-6 in the league, is just one game behind Auburn for the eighth and final slot in the SEC Tournament.
- Tennessee coach Rod Delmonico won his 500th game with the Vols earlier this year against UNC-Asheville.
- UT has been decimated by injuries this season, with the most prominent losses being right-handed pitcher Patrick Hicklen and catcher Javi Herrera.
- Tennessee pitcher Rob Fitzgerald is a New Orleans native who prepped at Newman, the alma mater of Peyton Manning.
- UT has two players remaining from the last series against LSU in 1999: right fielder Brandon Hopkins and catcher Hal Bibee Jr.
- Hopkins and Bibee are two of five UT regulars batting .315 or better: the Vols' leading hitter is shortstop Walter Sevilla at .339.

About the Series: LSU holds a 31-9 edge in the series that renews tonight after a two-year hiatus.

- The teams did not meet in 2000 and 2001 due to the SEC's schedule rotation in which teams avoid one team from the opposite division.
- The teams also did not meet in 1994 and 1995 due to the scheduling format in place at the time, and in 1987, an entire series in Knoxville was snowed out.
- The last series between the teams took place in 1999 at Knoxville, with LSU winning the opener 8-4, but UT recovering for 8-7 and 4-3 victories to take the series.
- Tennessee has won three of the last four series in Knoxville, winning two of three in 1991, 1993 and 1999. LSU's only series win on Rocky Top in the '90s was a sweep in 1997.
- The UT victories in 1999 broke a 12-game winning streak by LSU, which included three straight sweeps (1996-98) as well as victories in the 1996 and 1997 SEC Tournaments.
- Prior to the start of round robin play in 1986, the teams met just five times, as LSU won two games in 1907, then took two of three in 1973, with all games played in Baton Rouge.

Tonight's Starting Pitcher

#46 Soph. LH Lane Mestepey (6-0, 187, Zachary—Central Private)

Lane Mestepey is coming off the best outing of his LSU career, a four-hit shutout against Arkansas that gave him his sixth consecutive victory. Mestepey tonight wades into uncharted waters with his first career outing against Tennessee. The Volunteers will counter with sophomore left-hander Ben Riley (4-2, 5.06).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: Has won his last six starts to improve to 9-2 on the season, dropping his ERA to 2.99. Is now 20-5 in his brief career at LSU.

- Did not allow a walk over a span of 33.0 innings from Feb. 23 to Mar. 23.
- Was 4-0 with a 1.89 ERA in four starts in April, and has not lost since Mar. 16.
- Has thrown eight career complete games.
- Won his 20th game in spectacular fashion vs. Arkansas (4/26), throwing a complete game four-hit shutout for his first career shutout in 35 outings. Mestepey threw 80 of his 115 pitches for strikes and did not walk a batter and allowed just one batter to reach third base.
- Giving up a miniscule 1.25 walks per nine innings (13 in 93.1 IP).
- Gave up a career high 12 hits in 8.2 innings at South Carolina (4/19), but still earned the win.
- Pitched third complete game of the season and the seventh of his career to defeat Georgia (4/12). Gave up just two runs and struck out five.
- Earned third straight victory with 6.2 innings at Auburn (4/5), allowing just two earned runs and striking out four.
- Walked none in 6.1 innings to improve to 5-2 with win over Mississippi St. (3/30).
- Picked up second complete game victory at Ole Miss (3/23) despite walking a career-high five batters.
- Gave up five runs (four earned) on nine hits in last outing vs. Vanderbilt (3/16).
- Earned second consecutive LSWA Pitcher of the Week honor for effort vs. UL-Monroe (3/9), giving up one run in eight innings.
- Earned complete-game victory at Houston (2/23), giving up just one run on six hits in the final 7.0 innings.
- Followed up Houston game with brilliant 8.0 inning stint vs. Long Beach St. (3/2, Game 2), striking out a career-best eight to improve to 2-0 to earn LSWA Pitcher of the Week honors.
- Struck out six in 7.0-plus innings against Birmingham-Southern (2/9). Carried a shutout into the eighth inning.
- Has 11 quality starts (6.0+ IP, <4 ER) out of 13 this season.

2001: Led the SEC in victories (11) and ERA (3.75), going 11-3 in 22 games (19 starts), pitching 139.1 innings.

- Named the national Freshman of the Year by Collegiate Baseball and was a third team All-American by the same publication.
- Named the 2001 SEC Freshman of the Year and was a first team All-SEC selection.
- Allowed two or fewer earned runs in 11 of 19 starts.
- Yielded only 2.39 walks per nine innings.
- Went 7.1 or more innings in his first eight SEC starts.
- Named SEC Pitcher of the Week on Apr. 16 for sterling Easter Sunday effort vs. Ole Miss. In complete-game victory, Mestepey walked none and scattered nine hits. Was 2-0 with a 1.20 ERA in two outings in 2001 against the Rebels.
- Four days before the Ole Miss victory, he allowed only one earned run over 7.2 innings against Tulane at Zephyr Field.
- Got victory in first career start vs. Kansas St. on Feb. 11, giving up six hits in 6.0 innings.
- Had superb effort in no-decision at Georgia on Mar. 10, giving up one earned run and striking out six in 7.2 innings.
- Fell just short of shutout on Mar. 24 at Mississippi St., allowing one run and no walks while fanning six over 8.1 innings.
- First complete-game came vs. Kentucky on Mar. 30, giving up one earned run and striking out five.
- Did not lose until Apr. 20 vs. Vanderbilt, and even in that loss, he threw a complete game.
- Turned in spectacular complete-game effort at Alabama on Apr. 27, giving up one earned run and fanning six to start LSU on its way to a three-game sweep in Tuscaloosa. He retired 18 of 19 batters faced in the fourth through eighth innings.
- Allowed no earned runs over 6.0 innings of victory vs. Ole Miss at SEC Tournament May 17.
- Made last effort of the year his best, going 10.0 innings and striking out six in Super Regional at Tulane, a game LSU won in 13 innings.

An April to remember

The calendar has changed from April to May, and thus begins the rush to the post-season for LSU and everyone else in college baseball. If May is anything like April was for the Tigers, it should mean LSU will also be playing well into June.

LSU entered April at just 17-12 and uncertain of its future. But the Tigers erased all doubts by going 14-3 during the month, the Tigers' best month since going 17-3 in March of 1997. The Tigers have traditionally been strong in April, as LSU is now 43-13 over the last three Aprils.

There wasn't an area in which LSU was deficient during the month. At the plate, the Tigers batted .338, scoring 147 runs and clubbing 24 home runs compile a .551 slugging percentage. On the mound, the Tigers' 2.70 ERA and posted three shutouts to close the month. Even the fielding percentage was on the increase, as LSU posted a solid .970 fielding percentage in April, committing 20 errors in 675 chances.

Compare April to the Tigers' maddening March, when they went 9-9 and batted just .278 while yielding a 4.14 ERA.

Shutout mania

LSU enters the Tennessee series on an unprecedented run, as the Tigers have blanked three of their last four opponents.

Unlike the two shutouts of Arkansas last weekend, Tuesday's 13-0 whitewash of UNO was a team effort, as Jake Tompkins (4.2 innings), Clay Harris (3.1) and Brad David (1.0) combined to hold the Privateers to six hits and allowed just one runner to reach third base.

The last time LSU has posted three shutouts in a four-game stretch came back in 1975, when the Tigers blanked Mississippi St. three times in a four-game series at Starkville. LSU has never posted four shutouts in five games in its 109 years of baseball.

In just five days, LSU has posted more shutouts than the Tigers had in all of 2001, when LSU posted two shutouts in 67 games. LSU now has four shutouts in 2002, with the other one coming 6-0 over Vanderbilt on Mar. 15.

Other shutout tidbits:

- Tuesday's shutout is the first for LSU on the road since winning 9-0 at Kentucky on May 5, 2000.
- The 13-0 shutout is LSU's largest margin of victory in a shutout since a 21-0 win over UL-Monroe in the 2000 regional.
- LSU shut out UNO for just the second time in 69 meetings; the other was a 3-0 triumph in the 1987 South II Regional at Privateer Park.



Tompkins terminates UNO

Jake Tompkins wasn't scheduled to start Tuesday against New Orleans, but the Tigers' closer was in need of some work, so coach Smoke Laval handed the junior from California the starting assignment at Zephyr Field.

The move paid off brilliantly, as Tompkins fanned 10 in just 4 2/3 innings of work to help the Tigers to an easy 13-0 victory, although it was only 1-0 when Tompkins was relieved by Clay Harris with two out in the fifth.

Tompkins earned the win despite not going the requisite five innings, as he was on a pitch count, which he actually exceeded by throwing 70 pitches in his first start since Mar. 24 at Ole Miss.

Of course, the 10 strikeouts are a career high, breaking Tompkins' previous high of eight on Mar. 3 against Long Beach St. Only one other pitcher has reached double figures in strikeouts this year, and that's Bo Pettit, who did it on Feb. 15 against Mercer (12), Mar. 8 against UL-Monroe (10) and Mar. 15 against Vanderbilt (12).

Harris came in and struck out five in 3.1 innings, while Brad David struck out the game's final batter, giving LSU a team season high of 16 strikeouts, the first time LSU has fanned more than 12 in a game since last Feb. 27 when they posted 18 Ks against Nicholls St.

Tompkins also is the first LSU pitcher to win consecutive games for the Tigers since Doug Thompson beat Cal St. Fullerton in the 1998 South II Regional championship, then defeated USC in the opener of the College World Series.

Harris institutes no walking zone

Jake Tompkins' 10 strikeouts may have stolen the show at UNO, but Clay Harris quietly came in and pitched 3.1 strong innings of relief, and kept a personal streak of his own alive.

Harris, like Tompkins before him and Brad David after him, did not issue a walk, as the freshman from Slidell now has not walked a batter in his last 18.1 innings pitched, with his last walk coming on Apr. 6 at Auburn. In that stretch, Harris has given up just three runs to shave more than a run and a half off of his ERA, from 6.17 to 4.54.

Non-conference finished

LSU completed its non-conference schedule with a 19-7 mark outside the league, including a 10-4 slate against in-state foes. LSU won its final six games outside the league, outscoring its foes 54-17 in those contests.

Pontiff nearing top 10 in hits

With his next base hit, LSU captain Wally Pontiff will etch his name in yet another Tiger record, as he will tie Trey McClure for 10th place on the career hits list with 234.

Pontiff already has his name on two LSU top 10 lists, as his .355 batting average (233-for-656) ranks him sixth, and his 46 doubles rank him eighth. If he stays for his senior season, Pontiff could likely break into the top 10 in RBI, as he stands 20 out of the top 10.

Pontiff wasn't the Tigers' leading hitter in April, but his .375 average and .481 on-base percentage certainly didn't hurt. Pontiff struck out just one time in 81 April plate appearances, and for the year, he has fanned just 14 times in 215 trips to the plate, with his last strikeout coming on Apr. 2 against UNO at home.

Pontiff enters Tennessee leading the Tigers in batting average (.380), doubles (17), walks (41) and on-base percentage (.495). He is hitting an incredible .435 with two out, collecting 19 of his 34 RBI this year when facing the end of the inning.

The hits keep coming

Two days after rapping out a season high 19 hits against Arkansas, LSU didn't stop hitting against UNO, collecting 15 hits to give the Tigers double figures in hits 16 of their last 20 games.

LSU now has collected 15 or more hits in back-to-back games since last year when they had 16 and 24 in the first two games of the series with Duquesne.

By hitting .338 in April, LSU raised its batting average by 20 points from .285 at the beginning of the month to .305 heading into the Tennessee series.

A perfect 10

LSU continues to play tight defense, as the Tigers played their third errorless game in five outings on Tuesday against UNO. LSU is now 10-0 this year when they do not commit an error.

Strangely enough, UNO also did not boot a ball, the first time an error has not been committed in an LSU game since Mar. 15 against Vanderbilt.

LSU has played two straight errorless games just once this year, Mar. 8-9 against UL-Monroe.



Tigers eating up RBI opportunities

Coming into April, LSU was hitting a meager .266 with runners in scoring position and ranked next to last in the SEC in the category.

One month later, the Tigers' ills with RBI opportunities seem to be cured, as evidenced by 147 runs and a .356 batting average with RISP in going 14-3 in April. The Tigers ended April with a bang, as they went 8-for-14 against Arkansas on Sunday and 7-for-17 on Tuesday against UNO in their best two-game performance in those situations.

No, the RISP average is nowhere near the incredible .355 of 2000, or even the .327 posted last year, but for the first time this season, the Tigers are above the .300 mark in RBI situations, batting .301 in all games and .328 in SEC games.

Aaron Hill continues to lead the way for the Tigers in this category, batting .529 in April with RISP to raise his season average to a team best .426.

Tigers move up SEC ladder in ERA

Three shutouts in four games is a sure way to lower your ERA, and thanks to a 2.70 ERA in April, the Tigers have climbed the SEC ladder in ERA to within one rung of the top perch.

LSU has a 3.64 team ERA entering the Tennessee series, which has moved them from seventh at the beginning of the month to second behind league leader Alabama, which has a 3.30 ERA. LSU and Alabama are the only two SEC teams to have an ERA under four in league play, as the Tigers are at 3.91 and the Tide at 3.48.

LSU's ERA stood at 4.18 after the Mississippi St. series at the end of March, as the Tigers have shaved more than half a run off the ERA, including 0.28 during the current five-game winning streak.

Two Tigers also find themselves on the SEC leaderboard in ERA, as Jake Tompkins is fifth at 2.77 and Lane Mestepey is sixth at 2.99. Brian Wilson has a 2.72 ERA, but will not have the requisite number of innings pitched (1 per game) until he pitches 2.2 innings on Saturday to give him 49 through 49 games at the end of the weekend.

The Tigers have led the SEC in ERA four times in the last 15 years (1987, 1989, 1996 and 1998), and have had six individual ERA champions, the most recent being Brett Laxton in 1993.

Society of no homers

LSU pitchers are the stingiest in the SEC in an important category, as Tiger hurlers have allowed just 23 home runs in 412.2 innings, the lowest home run total allowed in the conference. The 23 home runs are a marked improvement from 2001, when the Tigers yielded 51 home runs in 67 games.

During its 14-3 run in April, LSU yielded just eight home runs, with only two of those eight homers coming with a runner aboard. The Tigers had a six-game stretch from Apr. 7-16 without yielding a single round-tripper.

The Tigers have given up more than one home run just four times this year, and more than two only once, and that was a three-homer game by South Carolina on Apr. 19.

In fact, LSU leads the league in fewest extra base hits allowed, as the Tigers have given up just 98 extra base hits (73 doubles, 2 triples, 23 home runs), and have allowed the fewest triples and the fourth fewest doubles. This despite the fact LSU has yielded more hits (452) than any other staff in the SEC.

Tiger relievers leave them stranded

Another improved facet of the Tigers' pitching has been the ability of LSU relievers to leave inherited runners the way they found them—on base, not in the dugout.

In April, the Tigers allowed just four of 17 inherited runners to score, and three of those came in one game (on Apr. 6 at Auburn). After the Auburn series through the end of the month, LSU did not allow any of the 10 runners it inherited to score.

For the year, LSU has allowed 25 of 70 (35.7%) inherited runners to score, a slightly lower percentage than the 39.1 percent permitted (61 of 163) in 2001.

Tigers tops in twin killings

Another big reason for the Tigers' improvement in ERA and fielding percentage is the fact LSU is tops in the SEC in double plays turned with 51. Twenty-two of those twin killings were turned in the month of April, including a school record five on Apr. 13 against Georgia.

Despite the slow start to this year, LSU is just a game and a half off of last year's win pace (32-13-1) and two off the pace of 2000 (33-13).



Holt still hot

He didn't start Tuesday's game against UNO, but it didn't prevent LSU second baseman J.C. Holt from collecting his third multi-hit game in his last five outings.

Holt went 2-for-2 by collecting hits in the eighth and ninth innings of the 13-0 victory, giving him six hits in his last eight at-bats and raising Holt's season average to .344. In another surprise, Holt is now over the .500 mark in slugging percentage at .504, joining Aaron Hill (.628), Wally Pontiff (.572), Jason Columbus (.556) and Chirrs Phillips (.516) with a .500 or better slugging percentage.

The central Louisiana native was a big reason for LSU's 14-3 April, as he was second on the club with a .432 batting average, collecting three home runs, a pair of triples and 9 RBI.

Barker gets to rest

LSU has finally stabilized its lineups after juggling them more than clowns in a circus early this season, but one constant throughout the turmoil was always right fielder Sean Barker.

IN fact, Barker had not rested at all during the 2002 season, playing all 411 innings of the season in right field...until the ninth inning on Tuesday.

With LSU holding a 13-0 lead over UNO, coach Smoke Laval gave Barker his first inning of rest this year, allowing redshirt freshman Rhett Buteau to get his first at-bat and make his first putout in the bottom of the ninth.

Barker is only one of two players who has played in every game this year; the other is outfielder Matt Heath, who did not start Mar. 15 against Mercer.

Barker heads into this weekend tied with Wes Grisham for fourth on the career batting average list at .362. The senior from California continues to lead the Tigers with 44 RBI.

Tigers win without the longball

LSU's win on Tuesday at UNO marked the first time since Mar. 23 at Ole Miss that LSU had won without hitting a home run, a span of 15 wins and 21 games overall. Hitting a home run has generally been a good thing, as LSU has hit 39 home runs in its 31 wins this year, compared to six in its 15 losses. LSU had six multi-homer games in April, all wins.

Double crazy

LSU may never break the school record for doubles of 194 in 2000, but the Tigers certainly have had double vision as of late.

The Tigers have now collected at least one two-base hit in their last 22 games dating back to Mar. 23 against Ole Miss. The Tigers now have 92 doubles on the year after collecting only 36 doubles in their first 24 games. During the current streak of games with a double, LSU has had two or more doubles in 18 of the 22 outings.

Four Tigers have at least 10 doubles, led by 17 from Wally Pontiff. Aaron Hill (14), Matt Heath (11) and Sean Barker (10) also are in double figures in two-baggers.

Triple Threats

The triple is often called baseball's most exciting play, and LSU has been providing its fans with a quite a bit of excitement lately.

In their last three games, the Tigers have collected five triples, bringing the season total to 16, which is second in the SEC behind Florida's 23. The Tigers have now collected triples in three consecutive games for the second time this year, joining the three-game series at Auburn Apr. 5-7.

The 16 triples are six more than LSU collected in the entire 2001 season. The Tigers still have a way to come close to the school record of 37 in 1993. The Tigers have two triples in four games this year after failing to have a game with more than one in 2001.

J.C. Holt and Matt Heath each have four triples to tie for the team lead, and are in a logjam for second in the league behind Arkansas' Kirk McConnell, who leads the loop with five.

On Tuesday, the most unlikely Tiger collected his first career three-bagger, as 6-foot-5, 235-pound Jason Columbus led off the seventh with a long drive that just missed going out for a home run. Columbus is the eighth different Tiger to triple in 2002.

Tigers working more efficiently

Although LSU's last two games have gone more than three hours, the Tigers have played just 12 three-hour games out of 46 in 2001, compared to 43 of 67 last year. Prior to Sunday, LSU played 16 straight games in under three hours, including last Friday's tilt with Arkansas that took an economical one hour and 51 minutes.

LSU coach Smoke Laval

Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.

On deck for next week

The Tigers are finished with midweek games after Tuesday's contest against New Orleans, so LSU's next action comes a week from Friday when the Tigers invade Gainesville for a key three-game series with Florida.

The Tigers won all four meetings from the Gators in 2001, outscoring Florida 42-20 in the process and putting up 10 or more runs three times. LSU swept three games in Baton Rouge 18-10, 4-3 and 10-7, then won 10-0 in the opening round of the SEC Tournament in Birmingham.

LSU has won 9 of the last 10 meetings in Baton Rouge, but Florida has won six of the last nine meetings in Gainesville, although the Tigers won two of three en route to the national championship in 2000. This marks the return of LSU coach Smoke Laval to the school where he was an assistant under Jay Bergman in the early 1980s. It also marks the first time the Tigers will face Florida under Pat McMahon, as McMahon was 8-7 against LSU in his four years at Mississippi St.

The Tigers hold a 4-0 edge over Florida on college baseball's grand stage, defeating the Gators twice in the College World Series in both 1991 and 1996.
