LSU LOOKS TO KEEP SEC TITLE HOPES ALIVE VS. ARKANSAS

LSU will look to keep its chances for the SEC Western Division title alive Friday when the Tigers battle 24th-ranked Arkansas at 1:30 p.m. in Tiger Stadium on CBS. LSU, winners of two straight, is 6-3 overall and 3-3 in league play. Arkansas has won six straight games and stands at 7-3 overall and 4-3 in SEC action. LSU enters the final two weeks of play in control of its destiny as a pair of wins will land the Tigers in their first-ever SEC Championship game on Dec. 8 in Atlanta. Of the three teams from the Western Division still in contention for the SEC Championship, only LSU controls its fate. Friday's contest will also mark the sixth Battle of Boot.

DAVEY, REED SET LSU RECORDS IN 30-14 WIN OVER MTSU

Rohan Davey became LSU's single-season passing record holder as did Josh Reed in receiving yardage as the Tigers posted a 30-14 win over Middle Tennessee on Homecoming. Davey completed 26 of 37 passes for 318 yards and 1 TD to supplant Tommy Hodson as LSU's single-season passing yardage record holder. Davey broke the mark of 2,655 set by Hodson in 1989. Reed caught 9 passes for 120 yards to break the record of 1,244 set by Wendell Davis in 1986. Davey finished the contest with 2,659 yards passing, while Reed moved his season total to 1,311. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers scored touchdowns the first four times they touched the ball. LaBrandon Toefield scored two touchdowns, all in the first half, as the Tigers built a 27-7 halftime lead. With the win, LSU became bowl eligible for the 5th time in 7 years.

LSU FOOTBALL NOTEBOOK

LSU returns to action after an open date last weekend to face 24th-ranked Arkansas in Tiger Stadium ... The Tigers, who are bowl-eligible for the fifth time in seven years, are 3-2 at home this season after posting a 6-1 mark in Tiger Stadium last season ... LSU posted a 3-1 mark in road games this year, only the fourth time since 1990 that LSU has posted a winning mark away from home ... LSU is 14-1 under Nick Saban when scoring at least 20 points in game ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 0-6 under Saban when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 11-2 under Saban, including a 6-1 mark this year, when scoring first ... LSU is also 12-1 under Saban (6-1 in 2001) when leading at halftime and the Tigers are 11-1 under Saban (6-1 in 2001) when leading after three quarters ... Over his last 15 games (including the 2000 Peach Bowl), LSU QB Rohan Davey has thrown 27 TD passes compared to just six interceptions ... LSU hasn't been shutout since the Alabama game on Nov. 9, 1996 - a span of 59 games ... The Tigers are 2-0 this season, 5-0 under Saban, and 37-9 since 1990 when an LSU running back rushes for 100 yards in a game ... Overall, LSU has won seven straight games when having a 100-yard rusher ... LSU WR Josh Reed broke the LSU single-season record for receiving yards against Middle Tennessee as he ran his total to 1,311 yards, surpassing the previous mark of 1,244 held by Wendell Davis in 1986 ... QB Rohan Davey also the school-record for single-season passing yards against Middle Tennessee, running his total to 2,659 yards, four better than the 2,655 set by Tommy Hodson in 1989 ... Over their last two SEC games, the Tigers have forced six turnovers and they have responded with touchdowns on five of the six takeaways ... LSU is 0-2 vs. ranked opponents this year with losses to then-No. 7 Tennessee, 26-18 and to then-No. 2 Florida, 44-15.

TIGERS AND RAZORBACKS BATTLE FOR THE BOOT

Friday's game will mark the sixth year in which LSU and Arkansas will play for "The Boot", a 24-karat gold trophy in the shape of the states of Arkansas and Louisiana that resembles a boot. LSU has won the coveted trophy three times - 1996, 1999 and 1999 with Arkansas taking home the trophy in 1998 and again in 2000. "The Boot" will sit on the Arkansas sideline during the game and will be awarded to the winner of the contest after the game.

LSU ON CBS

LSU will make its third appearance of the year on CBS on Friday. LSU is 1-1 this year in CBS games with a win over Alabama and a loss to Florida. LSU is 12-12-1 all-time on CBS, which includes a 4-2 mark vs. Arkansas. This game will mark the sixth straight year in which CBS has televised the LSU-Arkansas contest. LSU and Arkansas first met on CBS in the 1966 Cotton Bowl, a 14-7 Tiger victory.

JOSH REED NAMED ONE OF THREE FINALISTS FOR BILETNIKOFF AWARD

LSU's record-setting receiver Josh Reed has been named one of three finalist for the Biletnikoff Award, which annually recognizes college football's top receiver, the Tallahassee Quarterback Club announced last week. Reed joins Florida's Jabar Gaffney and Wisconsin's Lee Evans as the three finalist. In nine games, Reed has caught 73 passes for a school-record 1,311 yards and four touchdowns. Reed becomes the first LSU receiver to ever be named a finalist for the Biletnikoff Award. The winner of the Biletnikoff Award will be announced on Dec. 6 in Orlando, Fla. The award is sponsored by the Tallahassee Quarterback Club Foundation and it's named in honor of former Florida State and Oakland Raiders wide receiver Fred Biletnikoff. Past winners of the award include Antonio Bryant of Pittsburgh (2000), Troy Walters of Stanford (1999), Troy Edwards of Louisiana Tech (1998), Randy Moss of Marshall (1997), Marcus Harris of Wyoming (1996), Terry Glenn of Ohio State (1995) and Bobby Engram of Penn State (1994).

REED LEADS THE NATION IN RECEIVING YARDS PER GAME, RANKS IN NATIONS'S TOP 10 IN TWO OTHER CATEGORIES

LSU wide receiver Josh Reed continues to lead the nation in receiving yards per game as the junior from Rayne, La., is averaging 145.7 yards per contest. The 145.7 yards per game puts Reed on pace to break the SEC record of 132.9 set by Carlos Alvarez of Florida in 1969. Reed's per game average leads the SEC by over 35 yards - Jarab Gaffney of Florida is second in the SEC with 109.0 yards per game. Reed's 8.11 receptions per contest ranks first in the SEC and third nationally. Reed also ranks ninth in the nation (and second in the SEC) in all-purpose yards with 159.0 a game. Through nine games, Reed has caught 73 passes for 1,311 yards and 4 TDs.

TIGERS BECOME BOWL ELIGIBLE WITH VICTORY OVER MIDDLE TENNESSEE

With a 30-14 triumph over Middle Tennessee State on Nov. 10, the Tigers officially became bowl eligible with a 6-3 record with two games left on the schedule. The Tigers are now bowl-eligible for the fifth time in the last seven years. It also ensured LSU head coach Nick Saban of at least a .500 season for the eighth time in as many years as a collegiate head coach.

REED BREAKS LSU SINGLE SEASON YARDAGE RECORD, TARGETS SEC RECORD NEXT

On a 15-yard pass from Rohan Davey in the second quarter against Middle Tennessee, Josh Reed broke the LSU single season record for receiving yardage. Reed broke the 15-year-old record of 1,244 by Wendell Davis set by Wendell Davis in 1986, and accomplished the feat in only 9 games. The catch gave Reed 1,245 yards at the time. He finished the game with 1,311 yards for the season and is now only 47 yards shy of breaking the SEC single season record for yards in a season of 1,357 currently held by Travis McGriff of Florida in 1998.

REED SET TO BREAK LSU SINGLE-SEASON RECEPTIONS MARK

Josh Reed already owns the LSU single season record for receiving yards. The next target in site will be the LSU record for receptions in a season. Reed enters the Arkansas game with 73 receptions, just seven short of matching Wendell Davis' LSU record of 80, and eight shy of breaking it. With seven receptions, Reed can become only the sixth player in SEC history to catch 80 passes in a single season. With three receptions, Reed can move into the top 10 in single season receptions in SEC history with 76. Reed currently ranks 12th in SEC history for single-season receptions.

REED, 100-YARD GAMES ALMOST A GIVEN

With 120 yards receiving on nine catches against Middle Tennessee, Josh Reed posted the 15th 100-yard game of his LSU career, extending his school record. It marked the eighth time in nine games this season in which Reed has surpassed the 100-yard barrier. This year, LSU is 6-2 this year when Reed cracks the century mark, and overall, the Tigers are 11-4 when he has 100-yards or more receiving. Reed's 15 100-yard games

have come in only 23 career games at the position. He has had at least 100 yards in 65 percent of his games at the position. Since moving to wide receiver in week 9 of the 1999 season, Reed is averaging 6.3 receptions for 111.8 yards per game.

DAVEY BREAKS SINGLE SEASON PASSING, TOTAL OFFENSE RECORDS

With 318 yards passing against Middle Tennessee, Rohan Davey broke the LSU season passing record with 2,659 yards, eclipsing the mark of 2,655 set by Tommy Hodson in 1989. Davey also had 325 yards of total offense vs. Middle Tennessee to run his season total to 2,643, which broke the school-record of 2,604 set by Hodson in 1989. Davey is 341 yards shy of becoming the first 3,000-yard passer in LSU history and just the 18th in SEC history. Over LSU's last two games, Davey has broken or tied a total of five LSU and SEC records.

The following is a look at the records in which Davey has set or tied over LSU's last two games:

vs. Alabama:

528 yards passing - Single-game LSU record - breaks old mark of the 438 by Tommy Hodson against Tennessee in 1989. The total is only the fourth 500-yard passing game in SEC history and tied Kentucky's Jared Lorenzen for the second most single game yards in SEC history.

540 yards gained (528 passing, 12 rushing) - Ties SEC single-game record - Ties Archie Manning of Ole Miss in 1969 vs. Alabama for the most yards gained in a single-game in SEC history.

35 completions - Single-game LSU record - breaks old mark of 33 completions set by Jeff Wickersham vs. Mississippi State in 1983.

vs. Middle Tennessee:

2,659 season passing yards - Single-season LSU record - breaks old mark of 2,655 set by Tommy Hodson in 1989.

2,643 season total offense - Single-season LSU record - breaks old mark of 2,604 set by Tommy Hodson in 1989.

DAVEY POSTS FOURTH 300-YARD GAME OF THE SEASON

For the second straight week and the fifth time in his career, Davey passed for over 300 yards in the Tigers' victory over Middle Tennessee. Davey became the first LSU quarterback to pass for 300 yards in back-to-back games since Tommy Hodson recorded the only two 300-yard passing marks of his career in back-to-back games in 1989. Davey's effort also increased his school record for career 300-yard games to five. Prior to the 2001 season, LSU only had 11 300-yard passing games in 107 seasons. Davey has four this year. Davey has now accounted for 5 of LSU's 15 all-time 300-yard games.

TOEFIELD ON PACE TO BREAK ALEXANDER'S 24-YEAR OLD TD RECORD

LaBrandon Toefield has been unstoppable near the goal line in 2001. Toefield has 15 rushing touchdowns in nine games to lead the SEC in scoring (12 of which have come from seven yards or less). The total is the highest by a Tiger since Kevin Faulk posted 15 in 1997. Toefield is just two shy of the LSU record of 17 set by Charles Alexander in 1977 and he's only four shy of tying the SEC mark of 19 set by Garrison Hearst of Georgia in 1992 and Shaun Alexander of Alabama in 1999.

tied for the SEC lead in interceptions with 14. In all, LSU has had five different players intercept passes this season with all five having at least two interceptions.

TIGERS TOUGH TO BEAT WHEN SCORING 20+ POINTS

While the Tigers streak of consecutive games won when scoring 20+ points ended at 13 with a 35-24 loss against Ole Miss, LSU has still won 15 out of their last 16 times when reaching the mark. LSU is 14-1 under Nick Saban when reaching 20 points. Conversely, they are 0-6 under Saban when failing to reach 20 points.

CLAYTON AND REED ARE THE NATION'S NO. 1 RATED RECEIVING DUO

Statistically speaking, Michael Clayton and Josh Reed are the nation's best receiving duo. Clayton and Reed are averaging a combined 211.7 yards receiving a contest, eight yards better than Florida's duo of Jabar Gaffney and Reche Caldwell, who combine for 203.4 yards per contest. Through nine games, Clayton and Reed have combined for 109 receptions for 1,905 yards and 9 TDs.

DAVEY MOVES INTO SIXTH PLACE ON ALL-TIME LSU TOUCHDOWN LIST

With two first half touchdowns passes against Middle Tennessee, Rohan Davey moved his career total to 25, moving from an eighth place tie with Y.A. Tittle, past former teammate Josh Booty and into a sixth place tie with Jeff Wickersham. Davey needs three to match Bert Jones and move into the top five with 28.

DAVEY CLOSES IN ON SINGLE SEASON COMPLETION RECORD

Rohan Davey's 173 completions on the season currently rank sixth on the LSU single season completions list. Davey needs 37 completions over the final two games to break Jeff Wickersham's record of 209 set in 1985.

DAVEY TO ENTER ALL-TIME LSU COMPLETION PERCENTAGE LEADERS

With nine pass attempts, Rohan Davey will have 400 attempts for his career, making him eligible for the all-time LSU completion percentage leaders. Davey has completed 61.9 percent of his passes over his career. If Davey hits on six of his first nine attempts, he will match Alan Risher for highest completion percentage in LSU history at 62.0 percent.

CLAYTON PRODUCING MEMORABLE FRESHMAN SEASON

With six touchdowns (five receiving, one rushing) in his true freshman season, Michael Clayton is rapidly emerging as one of the top young receivers in the nation. Clayton's six touchdowns are the most by an LSU true freshman since Kevin Faulk scored six in 1995. The LSU record for touchdowns by a true freshmen is 11 by Dalton Hilliard in 1982. Clayton is second on the team with 36 receptions for 594 yards. His ability to get down field has provided the Tigers with the deep threat to compliment and free up Josh Reed.

TIGERS HEAD INTO FINAL TWO GAMES WITH CHANCE TO BREAK SEVERAL SCHOOL RECORDS ON OFFENSE

LSU has already seen its share of individual records fall this season, but as the Tigers head into the final two weeks of the season, there is a chance for a few team records to also be broken. LSU is 660 yards shy of breaking the school record for total offense which was set by the 1987 team (4,843 yards). In addition, the Tigers are averaging 464.9 yards per game, a number that is well ahead of the school-record of 440.3 set in 1987. LSU needs to complete 33 passes over the final two games to break the school record for completions set by the 1985 team (220 completions). In addition, LSU is just 15 yards from breaking the school record for passing yards set in 1989 (2,839 yards). LSU's per game passing average of 313.9 is well ahead of the school record of 258.1 yards per game set in 1989.

REED BECOMES SECOND PLAYER IN SEC HISTORY TO REACH 1,000 YARDS IN BACK-TO-BACK SEASONS

Josh Reed added another chapter to his record book against Alabama as he joined Joey Kent of Tennessee as the only players in SEC history to have back-to-back 1,000-yard receiving seasons. Actually, Reed and Kent are the only two players in the history of the league to have 1,000-yards receiving in more than one season. Period. Kent did it in 1995 and 1996. Since the Alabama game, Florida's Jabar Gaffney has joined Reed and Kent on the list.

REED MOVES INTO SIXTH ON ALL-TIME LSU TOUCHDOWN LIST

With a 25-yard touchdown reception in the third quarter against Alabama, Josh Reed moved into a sixth place tie on the all-time LSU receiving touchdowns list with 14, tying Carlos Carson and Eric Martin. Reed needs one more to match Eddie Fuller for fifth place with 15. Wendell Davis owns the LSU record with 19.

TOEFIELD POSTS FOURTH MULTIPLE-TD GAME OF THE SEASON

With two touchdowns against Middle Tennessee, LaBrandon Toefield became the first Tiger since Kevin Faulk in 1998 to post four multiple-touchdown games. Toefield opened the season with three TDs against Tulane, added four the following week against Utah State, scored three against Alabama on Nov. 3 and two against Middle Tennessee.

TIGERS GO TO TOEFIELD EARLY

Against Middle Tennessee, the Tigers scored on their opening possession for the second straight week and the fourth time this season. All four opening drive scores have come on rushing touchdowns by LaBrandon Toefield.

JARVIS GREEN MOVES UP CAREER SACK LIST AT LSU

With a pair of sacks vs. Alabama, defensive end Jarvis Green moved from sixth place to fourth place on LSU's career sack list with 19 to his credit. The 19 career sacks ties Green with current NFL standout Chuck Wiley.

LSU FINISHES WITH WINNING ROAD RECORD FOR FIRST TIME SINCE 1997

One of Nick Saban's top priorities heading into the 2001 season was for his Tigers to take care of business on the road after managing only a 1-3 record away from Baton Rouge in his first season at LSU. The Tigers answered his call, taking a 35-21 decision at Alabama on Nov. 3 to finish 3-1 on the road during the 2001 season. The Tigers finished with a winning record on the road for the first time since 1997 when they went a perfect 4-0. It marked only the fourth time since 1990 that the Tigers had a winning record away from Baton Rouge. From 1998 to 2000, the Tigers were 2-11 on the road.

STREAKS EXTENDED

With a 10-yard reception in the first quarter of the Middle Tennessee game Josh Reed extended his team-leading streak of consecutive games with a catch to 23, dating back to the Alabama game in 1999, his first as a receiver. In addition, Jerel Myers extended his streak of consecutive games with a catch to 10, the second longest streak on the Tigers. Myers has now caught at least one pass in 31 of 32 career games with the lone exception being the Tigers' 20-9 victory at Ole Miss in 2000.

MORE STREAKS

Free safety Ryan Clark had his 32nd consecutive start against Middle Tennessee, a streak dating back to the 1999 season opener against San Jose State. Trev Faulk made his 29th consecutive start dating back to the Georgia game in the fourth week of his freshman season. Jerel Myers made his 31st start in 32 career games with the only exception being the 1999 season finale against Arkansas when the Tigers opened in a three tight end alignment.

LSU'S FINALLY TAKING ADVANTAGE OF OPPONENTS TURNOVERS

LSU has finally started taking advantage of the turnovers that it forces as the Tigers have scored touchdowns on five of their last six takeaways. Against Miss. State, LSU turned four MSU turnovers into 28 points and then against Ole Miss, the Tigers turned an Eli Manning interception into a TD, six plays later. Prior to the Mississippi State contest, LSU had only scored 17 points all season off of its 13 takeaways. The Tigers also went a span of three games - Tennessee, Florida, and Kentucky - of not scoring off a turnover. Over that three-game span, LSU had six takeaways that resulted in no points.

TIGERS SPREAD THE WEALTH IN PASSING GAME

One thing is for sure, LSU can never be accused of focusing on one receiver in its passing game as 14 different players - six split ends, four tight ends, three tailbacks and one fullback - have caught passes for the Tigers this season. Spreading the football around has become a trademark of the Jimbo Fisher offense as last year, 13 Tigers caught passes during the regular-season. The Tigers have five players - three wide receivers, one tight end and one running back - with at least 10 receptions this year.

TIGERS TURN REVERSAL OF FORTUNES IN THE THIRD QUARTER

After being outscored 37-7 in the third quarter in their first five games of the season, the Tigers have outscored their opponents 52-11 in the third quarter of their four games. LSU's third quarter turnaround started four weeks ago against Mississippi State as the Tigers put up 21 points against the Bulldogs. LSU followed that with 14 points against Ole Miss that gave them a 24-21 lead heading into the final quarter.

LSU'S SPECIAL TEAMS COVERAGE HAS BEEN OUTSTANDING

LSU's special teams coverage continues to be outstanding as the Tigers are allowing an SEC-best 13.2 yards per kickoff return and only 2.4 yards per punt return. On 43 kickoff returns this season, the Tigers have allowed only 20 yards or more just 13 times. LSU has kicked off 51 times this year and its opponent has started outside the 20-yard line only 20 times.

LSU CONTINUES TO BE THE BEST IN THE LEAGUE ON THIRD DOWN

LSU continues to be the best in the SEC when it comes to third down situations as the Tigers have converted on 62 of their 127 third down opportunities this year for 52.0 percent. Ole Miss is a distant second in the league at 47.9 percent.

TIGER STADIUM ON RECORD ATTENDANCE PACE

LSU is on pace to average over 90,000 fans for the first time in school history. LSU currently ranks fifth in the nation in attendance with 90,348 spectators per game. The Tigers have drawn over 91,000 fans on three occasions this season - Tulane, Ole Miss and a school record 92,010 against Florida. LSU has had the three highest single game attendance figures in school history during the 2001 season. All five of its 2001 home games rank in the top 10 in school history.

HEAD COACH NICK SABAN

In his second year with the Tigers and eighth overall ... Has an overall mark of 57-33-1, which includes a 14-7 record at LSU ... Coached one season at Toledo (1990) and then spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State (1995-99) ... In first season as a head coach in 1990, led Toledo to a 9-2 mark and a share of the MAC title ... Spent the 1991-94 seasons as defensive coordinator of the Cleveland Browns ... In seven years as a collegiate head coach, has never had a losing record ... Guided Michigan State to a 9-2 overall mark and a second place finish in the Big 10 in 1999 ... In seven years, has led teams to five bowl games.

LAST MINUTE HEROICS LIFTS LSU PAST UK, 29-25

Rohan Davey fired a 6-yard touchdown pass to true freshman Michael Clayton with just 13 seconds remaining as the LSU Tigers rallied for a dramatic 29-25 win over Kentucky in Lexington. Davey threw for a career-high 383 yards - the third best performance in LSU history - while Clayton caught a career-high nine passes for 105 yards and two touchdowns. Josh Reed caught eight balls for 160 yards and on the ground, LaBrandon Toefield piled up 129 yards. With LSU leading 22-10 in the third quarter, Kentucky brought in back-up quarterback Jared Lorenzen who rallied the Cats to back-to-back touchdowns, giving Kentucky a 25-22 lead with just under nine minutes remaining before LSU rallied.

DAVEY, REED SET RECORDS AS LSU BEATS MTSU, 30-14

Rohan Davey became LSU's single-season passing record holder, while Josh Reed did the same in receiving yardage as the Tigers posted a 30-14 win over Middle Tennessee on Homecoming. Davey completed 26 of 37 passes for 318 yards and 1 TD to surpass Tommy Hodson as LSU's single-season passing yardage record holder. Davey broke the mark of 2,655 set by Hodson in 1989. Reed caught 9 passes for 120 yards to break the record of 1,244 set by Wendell Davis in 1986. Davey finished the contest with 2,659 yards passing, while Reed moved his season total to 1,311. LSU never trailed in the contest as the Tigers scored touchdowns the first four times they touched the ball. LaBrandon Toefield scored three touchdowns, all in the first half, as the Tigers built a 27-7 halftime lead. John Corbello added a 42-yard field goal in the second half to complete the scoring for the Tigers.
