Still playing it close

For some reason, the Tigers just love one-run games. We're only 15 games into the 2002 season, and LSU has already played seven one-run games, which

That is how many one-run games the Tigers played in 69 games in their national championship season of 2000. Ironically, the 4-3 mark the Tigers now sport in one-run games is exactly the same as that 2000 season mark.

LSU has now played back-to-back one run games twice this season, something the Tigers did only once all of last year, losing the final two games of the series at Arkansas as the Razorbacks claimed a three-game sweep.

The Tigers haven't played three consecutive one-run games since 1997, when all three games of a series against South Carolina were decided by the smallest of margins.

LSU hasn't been able to hit in these close games, posting just a .270 batting average in the seven onerun games, negating a pitching staff that has posted a solid 3.80 ERA in the close ones.

Unearned runs bite again

In a related theme on the one-run games, 17 of the 46 runs LSU has allowed in one-run games have been of the unearned variety.

The problem cropped up again on Tuesday against Tulane, as the Tigers yielded a pair of unearned runs in the sixth inning, allowing the Green Wave to take the lead in a 6-5 victory

So far in 2002, the Tigers have yielded 26 unearned runs in 15 games, giving up at least one of those in seven games. The two unearned runs yielded on Tuesday are nowhere near the season high of eight, which Houston received on Feb. 24 to rally for a 12-11 victory.

Since 1984, the record for unearned runs in a season is 91 in 1994. At its current pace, LSU will break the single-season record by giving up 97 unearned runs in the regular season.

Of course, LSU is still the SEC leader in errors with 36, as two of those miscues were the culprit on Tuesday. Unfortunately, the Tigers are still on pace to set a school record for errors, which is currently 125 in 1993.

Harris racks up the Ks

LSU pitchers continue to rack up the career highs for strikeouts. Tuesday, it was Clay Harris' turn to write a personal record, as he fanned eight Tulane batters in 5.1 innings

Harris is the third LSU starting pitcher in a row to record eight strikeouts, as Lane Mestepey and Jake Tompkins both did so in the Tigers' series with Long Beach St.

In an unrelated note, Harris also is believed to be the first LSU pitcher to start a game and bat for himself since Skip Bertman took over in 1984. Harris, who remained in the game as the Tigers' designated hitter (allowed under NCAA rules) after being relieved, went 1-for-5 with an RBI double. Harris is 3-for-10 with 5 RBI as a batter this year.

Wiethorn gets big four

Eric Wiethorn hasn't played much this season in the Tigers' first base rotation, but after Tuesday's game, the California native might have found a regular spot in the LSU lineup.

Wiethorn went 4-for-5 in the Tigers' loss to Tulane, his second multi-hit game of the season, joining a 2-for-3 game at Houston on Feb. 23.

The only other four-hit games by LSU players this year are Sean Barker in the season opener vs. Birmingham-Southern and Blake Gill on Feb. 17 vs. Mercer.

In 30 at-bats this year, Wiethorn is batting .433 with 13 hits and has driven in seven runs. Tuesday's game marked Wiethorn's first start in the field, as his previous five starts came as the Tigers' designated hitter.

Pontiff Watch

Wally Pontiff continues to scorch, as his 3-for-5 game Tuesday raised his season average to .396 and his career mark to .352. Wally leads the team in batting average, on-base percentage (.522), slugging percentage (.585) and home runs (2). Pontiff has a team-high seven-game hitting streak, not bad considering he was at .200 prior to the streak.

In his last 10 games, Pontiff is batting .485 (16-for-33) with 10 RBI, and he is 12 for his last 20.

LSU coach Smoke Laval

Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.

Coming up next week

The season moves into its second phase next week, as the much-anticipated Southeastern Conference race begins.

Before the main course can be served, the Tigers will first have to devour a tough appetizer otherwise known as UL-Lafayette. The Cajuns appear to be back to the form that got them to Omaha in 2000, and as always, the LSU-UL-Lafayette series is an intense one. The Tigers won 12-7 last year at Zephyr Field in the only meeting between the clubs. The teams will not go long without seeing each other again, as the clubs face off on Mar. 19 at Moore Field.

Vanderbilt is LSU's first opponent on the 10-weekend SEC menu. Although LSU hasn't lost a series to the Commodores since 1988, Vandy has traditionally caused the Tigers headaches. Last year, coach Roy Mewbourne's club became the first team to beat Lane Mestepey, winning 7-5 in a game that saw LSU coach Skip Bertman get ejected for the third and final time of his career. LSU won the last two games last year 7-2 and 18-2. In a scheduling quirk, the Commodores will be making their second straight trip to Alex Box Stadium; LSU will visit Vandy's new Hawkins Field in 2003.
