




• 2002 Freshmen All-SEC Team (SEC Coaches)

Talented runner who led the Tigers in rushing with 781 yards and 8 touchdowns ... Capped regular season ranked No. 8 in the SEC with 65.1 yards rushing per game ... Played in all 12 games with 11 starts ... Ranks sixth in LSU history with 2,447 career rushing yards ... Also ranked No. 5 in school history for receptions by a running back with 64 and is No. 9 in 100-yard games with 5 ... Slowed with an ankle injury for the final month of the season ... Opened year by rushing for 100 or more yards in 4 of LSU's first 6 games, including a career-best of 156 yards and 1 TD on 32 carries in win over Florida ... Carried a total of 8 times for 26 yards in LSU's next 3 games (7 yards, 1 TD on 3 carries vs. North Texas; 15 yards on 3 carries vs. Appalachian State; 4 yards on 2 carries vs. Alabama) ... Ankle injury came in first half of win over North Texas on Oct. 29 ... Returned to early season form against Ole Miss on Nov. 19, going for 70 yards and 1 TD on 14 carries in 40-7 victory over the Rebels ... Scored at least 1 TD in LSU's first 5 games ... Opened season with 109 yards and 1 TD in win over Arizona State ... Had 102 yards and a score in win over Vanderbilt and 105 yards on 24 carries in overtime victory over Auburn ... Led all LSU running backs in receptions with 18 for 175 yards, including a 43-yard catch-and-run vs. Arkansas.
