Tigers Face Tennessee in SEC Series at Knoxville

Seventh-ranked LSU (29-10, 8-7) returns to SEC action this weekend as the Tigers travel to Knoxville to face No. 10 Tennessee (30-9, 9-6) in a three-game SEC series at Lindsey Nelson Stadium.

First pitch for Game 1 of the LSU-Tennessee series is 6 p.m. CDT Friday, Game 2 is set for 6 p.m. CDT Saturday and Game 3 will be played at 1 p.m. CDT Sunday.

The games can be heard statewide on the LSU Sports Network (WDGL-FM 98.1 in Baton Rouge). All three games can also be heard on the internet at www.LSUsports.net.

Saturday's game will be televised by Cox Sports Television (Cable Ch. 37 in Baton Rouge), and Sunday's game will be televised by Jumbo Sports Network (Cable Ch. 13 in Baton Rouge). There is no live television coverage of the game on Friday.

LSU trails first-place Ole Miss (11-4) by three games in the SEC Western Division standings with 15 games remaining in the conference regular season.

Tennessee represents the fourth Top 25 team LSU will face this season in a three-game road series. The Tigers have posted series victories this season at No. 9 South Carolina, at No. 11 Auburn and at No. 23 Central Florida.

The Tigers won two of three games versus Georgia last weekend in Baton Rouge, as LSU has captured six of its last seven SEC series over the past two seasons.

Tennessee is in first place in the SEC Eastern Division, leading Florida (8-7) by one game. The Volunteers were swept last weekend by Ole Miss in Oxford.

LSU began this week with a 21-10 victory at Southern University, the Tigers' fifth win in their last six outings.

Tennessee posted a 10-1 win over Tennessee Tech Wednesday night in Cookeville, Tenn.

The LSU-Tennessee Series

LSU leads the all-time series with Tennessee, 36-10, and the Tigers have won the last five meetings between the schools. LSU won the final two games of the 2002 series in Knoxville, and the Tigers posted a three-game sweep over the Volunteers last season in Baton Rouge.

LSU holds a 10-8 edge over Tennessee in games played at Knoxville, though UT has won three of the five series played there since 1991.

Laval is 5-1 versus Tennessee during his three-year LSU career, while Delmonico is 8-26 against LSU during his 15 seasons at UT.

Determann To Start Friday's Series Opener Versus Tennessee

LSU coach Smoke Laval will send sophomore left-hander Jason Determann (2-2, 2.56 ERA) to the mound Friday. Determann made just his first career start last Friday in an SEC regular-season game, and he responded with an excellent outing against Georgia. Determann, who took the Medical College Admissions Test (MCAT) the next morning, worked 8.1 innings, limiting Georgia to five runs on eight hits with one walk and five strikeouts. The Tigers won the game in 10 innings, 6-5. Determann, a biological sciences major, expects to receive his MCAT results in 6-8 weeks.

LSU Begins Week With 21-10 Victory at Southern University

LSU's 21-10 win over Southern Tuesday marked the Tigers' highest run output since May 6, 2003, when they defeated Loyola-New Orleans, 21-6, in Alex Box Stadium. Center fielder J.C. Holt collected his 200th career hit with a first-inning single against the Jaguars. Holt, who later added another single, has a .348 (201-for-578) career batting average in three seasons at LSU.

Designated hitter Nick Stavinocha was 3-for-5 at the plate Tuesday with two doubles, one triple and five RBI, as he established career highs for hits and RBI. Shortstop Derek Hebert recorded career bests for hits and runs scored Tuesday as he singled and scored in four consecutive innings.

Left fielder Ryan Patterson extended his hitting streak to 11 games Tuesday, as he was 3-for-4 with a homer and five RBI, tying his career high. Patterson has homered three times in the last four games, increasing his season total to eight, which is second on the club. Patterson has also collected 14 RBI in his last five games, increasing his total to a team-best 45.

Tigers Win Four of Five Games Last Week, Including Series Victory vs. UGA

- LSU batted .343 (37-for-108) in the UGA series with three doubles, two triples and three homers, as the Tigers won two of three games over the Bulldogs.

- Left fielder Ryan Patterson was superb in leading LSU to four wins in five games last week. He hit .500 (11-for-22) with two doubles, one triple, three homers, 11 RBI and five runs. Patterson posted a 1.091 slugging percentage, a .500 on-base percentage, and he recorded two stolen bases.

- In LSU's series victory over UGA, Patterson hit .462 (6-for-13) with one double, one triple, two homers, six RBI and three runs. Patterson, who is currently riding a 10-game hitting streak, is batting .339 (59-for-174) this season with seven homers and a team-high 40 RBI.

- Center fielder J.C. Holt batted .571 (8-for-14) in the UGA series with five runs and three RBI. Right fielder Jon Zeringue hit .545 (6-for-11) against the Bulldogs with one triple, one RBI and two runs.

- The Tigers hit .343 (61-for-178) for the entire five-game week with five doubles, three triples and five homers. Holt hit .545 (12-for-22) in the five games, while Zeringue batted .529 (9-for-17). Holt saw his cumulative average soar to .411 (65-for-168) with 12 doubles, two triples, four homers, 46 runs, nine steals and a .475 on-base percentage. Zeringue is now hitting .399 (57-for-143) on the year with 14 doubles, two triples, 33 RBI and a team-high 10 homers.

- Freshman left-hander Clay Dirks became the first SEC pitcher to record seven wins this season as he defeated Georgia on Saturday. Dirks worked eight innings against the Bulldogs, allowing just one run on seven hits with two walks and a career-high seven strikeouts. He earned his seventh win in seven decisions and improved to 3-0 in SEC games. On the year, Dirks has a 2.43 ERA in 59.1 innings with 10 walks, 54 strikeouts and a .199 opponents' batting average.

J.C. Holt Named to Golden Spikes Award Watch List

Junior center fielder J.C. Holt, a native of Sieper, La., is one of 30 players on the USA Baseball Watch List for the 2004 Golden Spikes Award. The award is presented annually to the nation's outstanding amateur baseball player. Holt, the 2003 MVP of the Cape Cod League, is LSU's leading hitter this season, batting .414 (67-for-162) with 12 doubles, two triples, four homers, 27 RBI, 50 runs and 11 stolen bases.

LSU has had one Golden Spikes Award winner in his history -- right-handed pitcher Ben McDonald captured the award in 1989, the year he was the nation's No. 1 overall draft pick by the Baltimore Orioles.

Clay Harris Named SEC Player of the Week April 5

LSU first baseman Clay Harris, who led LSU to a series victory at Auburn April 2-4, was named SEC Player of the Week by the league office on April 5.

Harris enjoyed a superb week, batting .467 (7-for-15) in four games with three homers, one double, eight RBI, six runs, a 1.133 slugging percentage and a .500 on-base percentage. Harris hit .455 (5-for-11) in the Auburn series with two homers, one double, seven RBI, three runs, a 1.091 slugging percentage and a .462 on-base percentage.

Harris, who led LSU in home runs last season with 16, entered the week with just one this season; however, he homered in three straight games to raise his total to four.

His solo shot at UNO on March 30 broke a 23-game drought without a homer. Harris hit a two-out, two-run blast in the top of the ninth inning April 2 at Auburn to send the game to extra innings, and his eighth-inning solo homer April 3 at Auburn tied the contest at 3-3 as LSU went on to a 5-3 win.

Harris broke a scoreless tie on April 4 at Auburn with a seventh-inning RBI single, sparking the Tigers to a 3-2 victory.

Matt Liuzza Named SEC Player of the Week on March 22

LSU catcher **Matt Liuzza**, a sophomore from Metairie, La., was named March 22 as the SEC Player of the Week after leading the Tigers to a series victory at South Carolina.

Liuzza hit three homers and one double in the series, collecting five RBI and posting a .933 slugging percentage. He hit two homers in Game 3 (a 12-7 victory), becoming the first LSU player to have a multi-homer game this season.

Liuzza's two homers came against USC ace Matt Campbell, who had not allowed run in 27.2 innings entering the game. Liuzza hit a solo shot in the second inning to tie the game at 1-1, and his three-run blast in the fourth gave the Tigers a 4-1 lead they would never relinquish.

Liuzza was 6-for-15 (.353) at the plate in LSU's four games from March 16-21 -- including a 14-0 victory over UNO -- with one double, four homers, seven RBI and five runs.

Liuzza compiled a 14-game streak -- the longest of his career -- from Feb. 14-March 12, exceeding the 12-game streak he compiled during the 2003 season. During the 2004 streak, Liuzza batted .407 (22-for-54) with five doubles, two homers, 13 RBI and 10 runs.

Liuzza's name appears on the first Johnny Bench Award "Watch List" released in early March. The Johnny Bench Award is given annually to the nation's outstanding collegiate catcher. Former LSU Brad Cresse was the first recipient of the award in 2000.

The 2004 Johnny Bench Award ceremony will take place on June 30, in Wichita, Kan.

Dirks Named To Roger Clemens Award Watch List

Freshman left-hander **Clay Dirks'** name has been added to the "Watch List" for the 2004 Roger Clemens Award, which is given to the nation's outstanding collegiate pitcher. The "Cy Young Award" of college baseball, the Clemens Award ceremony will take place on July 15 in Houston.

In a four-hit shutout of Tulane on March 2, Dirks allowed just two Green Wave runners to reach second base, and he retired 20 of the final 22 batters he faced. For that effort, Dirks was named the SEC Pitcher of the Week by the league office, and he earned National Pitcher of the Week recognition from the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association.

Dirks, a redshirt freshman from Hernando, Miss., allowed just one double and three singles against Tulane, and recorded one walk and seven strikeouts. Dirks, who was making just the third start of his collegiate career, missed the 2003 season after undergoing surgery on his elbow in the summer of 2002.

LSU-TU Seek to Re-Claim Attendance Mark

Two years ago, the state of Louisiana laid claim to the college baseball single game attendance record when an April 2002 game between Tulane and LSU drew a crowd of 27,673 in the Louisiana Superdome.

But on March 11, 2004, a crowd of 40,106 fans packed San Diego's brand new Petco Park to watch a college game between San Diego State and Houston, breaking the mark set at that Tulane-LSU contest and threatening the attendance dominance of Louisiana college baseball fans.

The LSU-Tulane game on April 27, 2004 provides an opportunity for Louisiana to restake its claim as the nation's best as LSU and Tulane, once again ranked among the Top 20 teams in the country, will meet for the third time this season in a 7 p.m. contest in the Superdome.

Tickets for the game are currently on sale and can be purchased by calling the Tulane Ticket Office at (504) 861-WAVE, the LSU Ticket Office at 225-LSU-2184 or 1-800-960-8587, online at www.ticketmaster.com or by visiting any Ticketmaster Outlet.

Ticket prices are \$15 and \$12 for adult reserved seats and \$8 for youth reserved sections. General admission tickets are \$6 for adults and \$4 for youth.

The LSU Injury Report

INF Bryan Harris -- Harris, a transfer from Santa Ana (Calif.) College, was projected to be the Tigers' starter at third base; however, a hernia operation limited his participation during fall practice, and he underwent arthroscopic surgery in January to remove bone chips from his right knee. He is scheduled to receive a medical redshirt this season.

INF Matt Horwath -- Horwath, a medical redshirt in 2003 after undergoing right shoulder surgery, started LSU's first seven games at shortstop this season before experiencing soreness in the shoulder. An MRI was performed on the shoulder on March 2, and the results showed no new injuries. Horwath has been cleared to play as long as he does not experience continued soreness in the shoulder.

RHP Brandon Nall -- LSU's closer at the beginning of 2003, he pitched in just six games last season before suffering a torn labrum in his shoulder, which required surgery. He could return to the mound at some point this season, depending upon the progress of his rehabilitation.

OF Quinn Stewart -- A starter in 37 games last season, Stewart had the hamate bone in his left wrist removed in early March, and he will receive a redshirt this season. Even without the wrist injury, Stewart likely would have received a redshirt this year due to the tremendous depth LSU has in the outfield. With current starting outfielders Jon Zeringue, J.C. Holt and Ryan Patterson expected to be drafted this June, Stewart should be one of the outfield starters in 2005.

Smoke Laval

HEAD COACH • THIRD YEAR

Raymond "Smoke" Laval enhanced his reputation as one of the country's top college baseball coaches, as, in just his second season at the helm of the LSU program, he guided the 2003 Tigers to the Southeastern Conference title -- LSU's first since 1997 -- and a berth in the College World Series.

Laval, the 2003 SEC Coach of the Year, directed LSU to a 45-22-1 overall record and a 20-9-1 conference mark, as the Tigers finished No. 5 in the final Baseball America rankings.

The magnificent '03 campaign augmented the success Laval enjoyed in his inaugural season as LSU's coach, as he led the 2002 Tigers to a 44-22 overall mark, an appearance in the NCAA Super Regional and a No. 11 final national ranking.

Laval, who served seven seasons (1994-2000) as the head coach at the University of Louisiana-Monroe, assumed control of the LSU program from Bertman, who led the Tigers to five NCAA championships and 11 College World Series appearances during an 18-year (1984-2001) tenure. Laval worked as Bertman's top assistant coach for 10 seasons (1984-93), helping lead LSU to its first two NCAA titles in 1991 and 1993. During Laval's 10 years as assistant coach, LSU posted a 483-182-1 record, won five SEC titles, appeared in six College World Series and captured two national championships.

Laval was known at LSU as one of the nation's best recruiters and brightest assistant coaches, as the Tigers reached the College World Series in only the third season (1986) of the Bertman-Laval regime. LSU followed the '86 CWS appearance with Omaha berths in 1987, 1989 and 1990 before the Tigers claimed the school's first baseball national title in 1991. After LSU captured its second NCAA crown in 1993, Laval departed Baton Rouge to become the head coach at Northeast Louisiana (now Louisiana-Monroe).

During his assistant coaching tenure at LSU, Laval -- who worked as the Tigers' primary recruiter - tutored 24 players who would eventually reach the major leagues. Some of the major leaguers with whom Laval worked include all-stars Albert Belle and Paul Byrd and first-round pick Todd Walker.

Laval compiled a 241-159 (.603) mark as the head coach at ULM, guiding the Indians to NCAA Regional appearances in 1995, 1999 and 2000.

Laval began his coaching career in 1977 as an assistant at Jacksonville University before moving to Wolfson High School in Jacksonville as a baseball and football coach. He served as a graduate assistant at LSU in 1979 under former Tiger head coach Jack Lamabe before working two years as an assistant at Gulf Coast Community College in Panama City, Fla.

Laval served as an assistant coach at Florida for two seasons (1982-83) before returning to LSU to work under Bertman.

Laval holds a bachelor's degree (1977) from Jacksonville in physical education and a master's degree (1979) from LSU in administration. The McDonald, Pa., native played two seasons at Gulf Coast Community College, where he lettered as a catcher. He completed his playing career at Jacksonville, where he led the ninth-ranked Dolphins in hitting at the 1976 NCAA South Regional.

Laval and his wife, Pam, are the parents of two children, Brandon and Jamie.

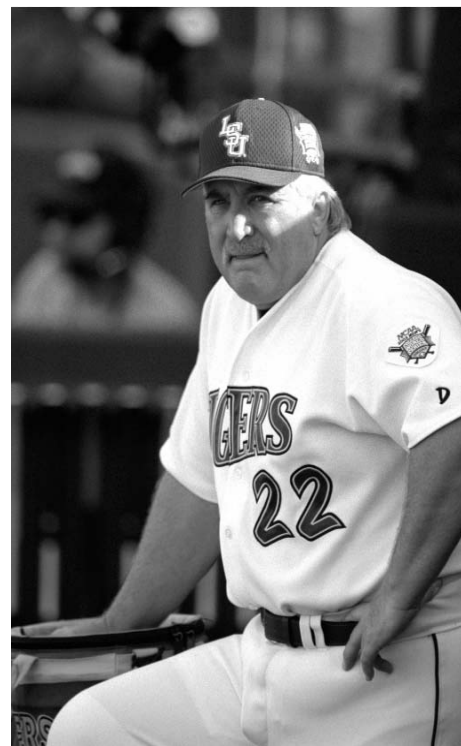
