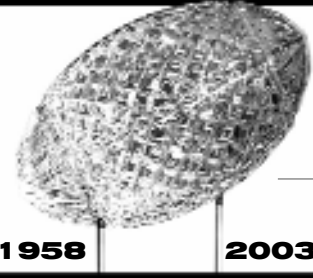

### Tigers Set To Battle Georgia in Rematch of 2003 SEC Title Game

LSU travels to Athens for the first time since 1999 as the 13th-ranked Tigers face third-ranked Georgia in a rematch of last year's Southeastern Conference Championship Game. Today's contest carries a 2:30 p.m. CT start and will be televised to a national audience by CBS. LSU enters the contest with a 3-1 overall mark and a 1-1 league record following last week's 51-0 win over Mississippi State. Georgia, who had an open date on last Saturday, is 3-0 overall and 1-0 in league play. Last year, LSU swept a pair of games from the Bulldogs, winning 17-10 in Baton Rouge in September and then 34-13 in the SEC title game in December in Atlanta. LSU enters the Georgia game ranked first in the SEC and No. 5 in the nation in total defense, allowing 236 yards per game, while the Tigers are tops in the league and 10th in the nation in rushing defense allowing only 77.6 yards per contest. LSU has scored two defensive TDs this year, and dating back to last season, the Tiger defense has scored in nine of their last 18 games. Offensively, the Tigers erupted for 51 points and 599 yards of total offense last week against Mississippi State. Through four games, LSU has surpassed the 50-point mark twice and they've done it with a balanced attack as the Tigers are averaging 417.5 yards per game (188.5 rushing, 229.0 passing). In addition, LSU has had 10 different players score offensive TDs this year, led by WR **Dwayne Bowe**, who has 4 receiving scores and RB **Alley Broussard**, who has 3 rushing scores.

### Tigers Score Early And Often In 51-0 Rout Of Mississippi State

**Alley Broussard** scored a career-best 3 TDs, all in the first 17 minutes of the game, as the Tigers racked up 599 yards of offense in rolling to a 51-0 win over Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium. LSU set the tone early in the contest going 74 yards on 7 plays, five of which were runs, for a 7-0 lead just three minutes into the game. Following a MSU fumble on its first possession, the Tigers need only 6 plays to go 18 yards for a 14-0 lead midway through the first quarter. From there, the route was on as the Tigers built a 27-0 lead early in the second quarter following a 35-yard interception return for a TD by **Marcus Spears**. LSU led 34-0 at halftime. In the second half, the Tigers stretched the margin to 41-0 on an 8-yard run by QB **JaMarcus Russell** and then 48-0 on a 67-yard TD reception by **Xavier Carter**. For the contest, LSU picked up 31 first downs, while limiting MSU to just 7. LSU also held MSU to only 130 yards of offense, while intercepting a season-high 4 passes. The 51-point margin of victory was the biggest by LSU in an SEC game since a 61-6 win over Mississippi State in 1969. It was also LSU's first shutout since a 42-0 win over Mississippi State in 2001.

### The Series

LSU and Georgia meet for the 25th time overall and the third time in the last 13 months ... LSU holds a 14-9-1 advantage in the series that dates back to a 13-12 Tiger win in Athens in 1928 ... Last year, LSU beat Georgia, 17-10, in Baton Rouge in September and then followed that with a 34-13 victory in December in the SEC title game ... Prior to last year's 17-10 LSU win, Georgia had posted three consecutive wins over the Tigers, including a 23-22 victory in Athens in 1999, the last time the teams played in Athens ... LSU holds a 6-5 advantage in games played in Athens ... LSU's last win in Athens came by a 26-23 count in 1987 ... At least one team has been ranked in the top 10 in the last four LSU-Georgia meetings ... Five of the last seven games between the teams have been decided by a combined 17 points, the exceptions are the 31-10 Georgia win in 1991 and the 34-13 LSU win in last year's SEC title game ... LSU coach Nick Saban is 2-0 vs. Georgia.

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right person to lead it. In four years as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban has proven to be that leader.

Since taking over a program that suffered through seven losing seasons in the 1990s, Saban has guided the Tigers to the pinnacle of college football - winning the 2003 BCS National Championship with a 21-14 victory over Oklahoma in the Nokia Sugar Bowl. The victory culminated a four-year ride under Saban that has been unmatched in the history of Tiger football. Since taking the reigns in 2000, Saban has guided the Tigers to a 42-14 overall mark, while claiming a pair of SEC titles in 2001 and 2003. LSU's 2003 BCS National Championship is just the second for the Tigers in football, and the first since 1958.

Saban's ability to successfully lead the Tigers comes from a management style that focuses on the entire program, one that puts his players in position to have success, both on the field and in the classroom. Armed with a plan that starts with recruiting quality people, outstanding football players and good students, Saban and his staff have transformed LSU into a team that is sure to be a fixture among the nation's elite programs for years to come.

On the field, Saban has developed a reputation as a defensive mastermind who is among the best in the game - professional or college - when it comes to game day coaching decisions. His defenses are physical, aggressive and deceptive, while offensively, the Tigers put up staggering numbers with a wealth of skill players leading the way. His teams play hard, make good decisions on the field and have proven that they are confident enough to overcome any type of adversity that is thrown in their direction.

It's a style and system that has proven to be successful, both for the team as well as the individual as six Tigers have earned First Team All-America honors in four years, while 18 of his LSU players have gone on to be selected in the NFL Draft, including six in the 2004 draft.

Off the field, Saban demands excellence from his players in both the classroom as well as the community. While the Tigers were marching to the 2003 national title on the field, the LSU football team combined for a 2.52 grade point average. A few months later, the squad bettered that mark with a 2.76 average for the spring semester as the Tigers had 50 players with a 3.0 or better during the spring and just six athletes that failed to reach a 2.0.

In addition to the honors the Tigers garnered on the field, LSU had 25 players earn a spot in the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 2003. Once again, numbers that show not only is Saban committed to academics, but his players are also dedicated to receiving an education as well. Since December of 2000, 51 football players who played under Saban at LSU have earned their degree, which includes 13 members of the 2003 national championship squad.

A major part of enhancing and cultivating the education experience for the student-athletes at LSU has been the addition of the \$15 million state-of-the-art Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes. Saban spearheaded the fundraising for the center, which included donating \$50,000 of his own money to the cause. The center, the best of its kind in college athletics, features a 1,000-seat auditorium with over 100 computers in a 54,000-square foot facility that gives all of LSU's student-athletes the best chance to have success in the classroom.

Saban's mission statement for the LSU football program is simple. He wants his players to become better people for having been a part of the program. He also wants to develop his players so they can reach their full athletic potential, which will enable them to have the opportunity to win a championship. Finally, it's his plan to help each player graduate and launch their career so that when they leave LSU they can have the best opportunities to be successful in life.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five years.

## The Game

West meets East for a showdown between teams that have combined to win the last three SEC titles. LSU, winners of the 2001 and 2003 SEC title, along with the 2003 national title, travels to face Georgia, the champions of the SEC in 2002. The game will mark LSU's second road contest of the year, while also serving as the Tigers' first visit to Sanford Stadium since a thrilling 23-22 defeat in 1999. LSU, ranked No. 13 in the nation in both polls, enters the Georgia game with a 3-1 overall mark and a 1-1 league record following last week's 51-0 route of Mississippi State. Georgia, ranked No. 3 in both polls, stands at 3-0 overall and 1-0 in league play. The Bulldogs, who beat Marshall 13-3 in their last action, were off last week.

## Who's In and Who's Out For The Tigers

The Tigers head into today's game in good shape injury wise as WR/RS **Skylar Green** (ankle) is expected to be close to full strength for the game. Green, who has been slowed since late August with an ankle sprain, sat out last week's Mississippi State contest after playing sparingly in LSU's first two games. The Tigers continued to be without the services of DB **Mario Stevenson** (foot), who has a broken bone in his foot. Stevenson is expected to be out of action for at least 4 more weeks.

## In The Polls

LSU held steady at No. 13 in the nation in both the USA Today/ESPN Coaches poll and the Associated Press poll, which was released on Sunday. LSU has been ranked for 24 consecutive ranking periods in the coaches poll and for 23 straight in the AP poll.

## A Couple Of Changes For The Tigers

Just in case you missed it, LSU LB **E.J. Kuale** has switched numbers and will wear No. 51 for the remainder of the season. Kuale started the year wearing No. 2, but with the return to action of RB/KR **Shyrone Carey** last week (who also wears No. 2), Kuale made the number switch. In addition, **Brandon Washington** moved back to defense last week after playing on the offensive line for the first three weeks of the season. Washington, who also switched from No. 66 to No. 97, originally came to LSU as a defensive lineman before moving to offensive line last spring. Washington saw his first action of the year on defense against Mississippi State.

## About Georgia

The Bulldogs are 3-0 overall and 1-0 in league play ... Georgia is ranked No. 3 in the nation in both polls ... They are coached by Mark Richt, who is in his fourth year with Georgia ... Richt has a 35-8 overall head coaching record, all with Georgia ... Georgia, who was open last week, has wins over Georgia Southern, South Carolina and Marshall this year ... They are averaging 27 points per game, while allowing 15.7 per contest ... The Georgia offense revolves around senior QB David Greene, who has completed 45 of 82 passes this year for 583 yards and 3 TDs ... Defensively, senior DE David Pollack has 13 tackles and 2 sacks for the Bulldogs ... Georgia is 19-2 at home under Richt ... Georgia has won 16 straight home games.

## LSU's Georgia Ties

You don't have to look far to find LSU's connections to Georgia as four members of the LSU coaching staff have ties to the Bulldogs. Three members of the staff - defensive coordinator **Will Muschamp**, defensive line coach **Travis Jones**, and secondary coach **Kirby Smart** - all played at Georgia, while running backs coach/special teams coordinator **Derek Dooley** is the son of legendary Georgia coach and athletic director Vince Dooley. Derek, who earned his law degree from the University of Georgia, was on the sidelines when Georgia won its last national title in 1980. Muschamp earned four letters for the Bulldogs from 1991-94 and he served as co-captain of the Bulldog defense in 1994. Jones lettered at Georgia from 1990-94 and was a defensive captain in 1994. Jones' first game as a collegiate player came in Tiger Stadium in 1990 (an 18-13 LSU win). Smart lettered at Georgia from 1995-98 earning First Team All-SEC honors as a defensive back in 1998 and Second Team honors in 1997. He still ranks among Georgia's all-time leaders in interceptions with 13.

## Webster Named SEC Defensive Player of the Week

LSU CB **Corey Webster** earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week following his performance in last week's 51-0 win over Mississippi State. Webster, a senior from Vacherie, La., recorded two tackles, had an interception, forced a fumble and recovered a fumble in the Tiger shutout of the Bulldogs. Webster did most of his damage in the first quarter as he forced and recovered a fumble that led to LSU's second touchdown of the game. Three possessions later, Webster intercepted an Ommar Conner pass at the LSU 30-yard line. The Tigers scored seven plays later for a 20-0 lead. Webster's interception was his first of the season and 15th of his career, leaving him just five shy of tying Mike Williams for the school record of 20. The honor for Webster is the third time in his career that he's been recognized as the league's player of the week. Webster first won the award following a three interception game against Florida in 2002 and then again last year for his performance in LSU's 17-10 win over Georgia in September.

## Tigers Back On CBS

The last time LSU appeared on CBS, the Tigers were on their way to stamping a ticket for the BCS National Championship contest following a 34-13 victory over Georgia in the SEC title game. Now, 10 months later, the Tigers and Bulldogs square off again in another battle of nationally-ranked teams on CBS. Saturday's contest will mark the third straight meeting between LSU and Georgia to be televised by CBS. LSU also beat the Bulldogs, 17-10, last September in Tiger Stadium in a CBS game. Last year, the Tigers posted a 4-1 mark on CBS and since **Nick Saban's** arrival in 2000, LSU is 8-4 on the network. LSU is 18-14-1 all-time on CBS.

## A Top Five Foe

LSU's game against third-ranked Georgia will mark the highest-ranked team the Tigers have faced this year. Two weeks ago, LSU dropped a 10-9 decision to Auburn, who was ranked No. 14 at the time. LSU's hasn't faced a top five ranked team since beating No. 3 Oklahoma, 21-14 in the 2004 Sugar Bowl. The last time LSU faced a team ranked No. 3 or higher on the road came in 1996 when the Tigers dropped a 56-13 decision to No. 1-ranked Florida in Gainesville. LSU has never beaten a team ranked No. 3 or higher on the road. The highest-ranked team that LSU has beat on the road came in 1993 when the Tigers upset fifth-ranked Alabama, 17-13, in Tuscaloosa. LSU also beat No. 5-ranked Georgia Tech, 10-7, in Atlanta in 1962 in a game televised by CBS.

## Taking Note On The Tigers Under Saban

Here is a look at some notable trends for LSU during its first 56 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 36-3 when leading at halftime and 34-3 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 39-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 36-0 when scoring at least 25 points in a game ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 3-11 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 11-3 in games decided by 7 points or less and 5-2 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 28-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 team rushing yards and the Tigers are 20-0 when having a player rush for 100 yards.

## LSU Defense Ranked First In SEC In Yards Allowed And Rushing Yards

A year ago, LSU capped its season ranked first in the nation in scoring defense (11.0 points) and total defense (252.0). Through four games, the Tigers are back on track as LSU is first in the SEC and fifth in the nation in total defense (236.8) and first in the league and 10th in the country in rushing defense (77.2). In addition, LSU is second to Auburn in the SEC and fifth in the nation in scoring defense, allowing 8.5 points per game.

## Tigers Pitch 5th Shutout Under Saban

LSU's 51-0 win over Mississippi State last week marked the fifth time under **Nick Saban** that the Tigers have held a team scoreless. Last week's shutout was the first for the Tigers since a 48-0 win over Louisiana-Lafayette on Oct. 5, 2002. It was the first in league play since a 42-0 win over Mississippi State on Oct. 20, 2001. ## Tigers Have Kept Opponents To Less Than 20 Points 35 Times Under Saban

By holding Mississippi State scoreless last week, the Tigers have now limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 35 of the 56 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 31-4 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game in 2003, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 35 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 19 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted five shutouts under Saban.

## Still No Rushing TDs For The Opposition

LSU has now gone four games in 2004 without allowing a rushing TD. The Tigers have only allowed four touchdowns in the first three games, all four of which have come through the air. Dating back to last year's season-opener, LSU's defense has only allowed 7 rushing TDs, which covers a span of 18 games. Arkansas' Cedric Cobbs was the only player in the SEC to rush for a TD against the Tigers last year, and he did it with a 20-yard run in the final week of the regular-season.

## Bringing The Heat On Defense

**Nick Saban** is known for a blitzing defense that gives opposing quarterbacks fits. Through 4 games, the Tigers are first in the SEC with 11 sacks. The 11 sacks have come from eight different players. Safety **LaRon Landry** leads the Tigers with 3 sacks, while LB **Lionel Turner** and LB **E.J. Kuale** each have a pair of sacks. Of LSU's 11 sacks, four have come from defensive backs, 6 have come from linebackers and 2 have come from defensive linemen.

## LSU's Had At Least 1 Sack In 29 Straight Games

With 3 sacks against Mississippi State, LSU ran its streak of games with at least one sack to 29 straight. The streak dates all the way back to the Miami (Ohio) game in 2002 when the Tigers sacked Ben Roethlisberger three times. Since then, LSU has had at least one sack in every game, which includes all 14 games in 2003. This year, through four games, the Tigers lead the SEC with 11 sacks, which have accounted for 81-yards in losses. LSU S **LaRon Landry** leads the SEC with 2.5 sacks through four games, while LB **Lionel Turner** is tied for second in the league with 2 sacks.

## Defense Responds To Saban's Challenge

Midway through last week, LSU coach **Nick Saban** challenged the Tiger defense to come up with the big plays that seemed so frequent a year ago, but had escaped the team in their first three games. The defense responded as they picked off four MSU passes, returning one 35 yards for a TD early in the second quarter. Prior to that, LSU forced a State fumble on its second play from scrimmage. Six plays later, LSU led 14-0. In all, the Tigers turned State's five turnovers into three touchdowns and one field goal. For the game, LSU held MSU to only seven first downs and just 130 yards of offense, including only 40 yards rushing.

## LSU Offense Gets Off To Quick Start In Last 3 Games

LSU's offense has been quick out of the gate in its last 3 games as the Tigers scored on their first two possessions against Arkansas State, Auburn and Mississippi State. Against Arkansas State, the Tigers scored on their first six possessions. A week later, QB **Marcus Randall** led the Tigers on a 14-play, 80-yard drive, capped with a 9-yard TD pass to **Dwayne Bowe** on LSU's first possession against Auburn. Tiger QB **JaMarcus Russell** followed that by leading LSU on an 8-play, 55-yard drive that culminated with a 42-yard **Chris Jackson** field goal on the second possession of the game against Auburn. Last week against Mississippi State, Randall opened at quarterback and guided LSU on a 7-play, 74-yard drive on its first possession that culminated with an 11-yard TD run by **Alley Broussard**. The Tigers then followed that with a 6-play, 18-yard drive on its second possession, capped with a 1-yard plunge by Broussard.

## LSU's Been Good On The Road Under Saban

Despite its 10-9 loss to Auburn two weeks ago, LSU has had quite a bit of success on the road under **Nick Saban**. As a matter of fact, LSU will bring a 12-7 road record under Saban into the Georgia game. Since 2001, LSU has posted a 11-4 road record. Of LSU's seven road losses since 2000, five have come against team ranked in the top 25 at the time of the game. LSU posted a 5-0 road record a year ago. Dating back to last year, LSU has allowed a combined total of 53 points in its last six road games for an average of 8.8 points per game.

## A Loaded Backfield

The return of RB **Shyrone Carey** from a 4-game suspension has only added to LSU's depth at the running back position. The Tigers have three running backs in its backfield that have a 100-yard game to his credit with sophomore **Justin Vincent** leading the way with 6 career 100-yard games. **Alley Broussard**, who is coming off a 73-yard, 3-TD performance against Mississippi State, has 2 career 100-yard games, while Carey has done it once. LSU is also two yards away from having four players with 100-yard games as **Joseph Addai** has rushed for as many as 98 yards in a game, but he's never topped the 100-yard mark. LSU's four running backs of Vincent, Broussard, Addai and Carey have combined to rush for 3,394 yards and 33 TDs.

## A 3 TD Game For Alley

A week after outrushing Auburn's Cadillac and Hummer, LSU's **Alley Broussard** continued his solid play with a 73-yard, 3-touchdown performance against Mississippi State. Broussard's three rushing TDs came in the first 17 minutes of the contest. Through four games, Broussard has rushed for 172 yards and three scores on 30 carries. He's averaging 5.7 yards per carry. Against Auburn, Broussard, a sophomore from Lafayette, rushed for 84 yards on 10 carries, including a 38-yard run in the second quarter. LSU's defense limited Williams to 75 yards and no TDs on 18 carries, while Brown had 67 yards on nine carries for Auburn. The 84 yards rushing for Broussard marked the third-highest total in a single-game in his career. Last year, Broussard rushed for 108 yards against South Carolina and then had 106 yards and a TD against Louisiana Tech. For his career, Broussard has rushed for 561 yards and 7 TDs on 102 attempts for an average of 4.9 yards per carry.

## Corey Webster The Multi-Tasker

LSU CB/WR/RS **Corey Webster**, who graduated last month with a degree in general studies, has taken his time management skills to another area and that's the football field. In 4 games in 2004, Webster has played on both sides of the ball in three games as well as seeing action as LSU's punt returner against Arkansas State. In 4 games, Webster has 14 tackles, 1 interception and 3 PBUs on defense to go with one reception for a 6-yard TD on offense. Webster, who has seen action on 27 snaps of offense, has also returned 2 punts for 7 yards. Webster's 6-yard TD reception against Arkansas State was the first offensive TD of his career. He also scored on a 45-yard interception return against Florida in 2002. Webster is the first 3-way player at LSU since 2002 when Domanick Davis played on both sides of the football as well as returning punts and kickoffs.

## 10 Different Tigers Have Scored On Offense in 2004

Last year, LSU had 12 different players score offensive touchdowns all year. This year, through four games, the Tigers have already had 10 players reach the endzone for a score on offense. Five different players have rushed for a score this year, while the Tigers have had five different receivers score. **Alley Broussard** leads the Tigers with 3 rushing TDs, while **Dwayne Bowe** is tops among receivers with 4 catches for scores. Of the 10 players who have scored offensive TDs for LSU, six are either freshmen or sophomores and only two are seniors. The following is list of LSU offensive players who've scored this year:

A trademark of a Jimbo Fisher-offense is that of spreading the ball around. Through four games, the Tigers have done a lot of spreading it around as 12 different players have been on the receiving end of passes. Of the 12 players who have caught passes, 7 are wide receivers, three are running backs and two are tight ends. **Dwayne Bowe** leads all receivers with 16 catches, **Joseph Addai** is tops among running backs with 5 catches and **David Jones** leads the tight ends with 3 receptions.

## Vincent Has 6 100-Yard Rushing Games

LSU sophomore **Justin Vincent** recorded his sixth 100-yard rushing game against Arkansas State with 102 yards and 2 TDs on 13 carries. Vincent averaged 7.8 yards per carry against Arkansas State. For his career, Vincent has tallied six games of 100 yards or better, including a career-best of 201 yards against Georgia in the SEC Championship game last year. Vincent's first 100-yard rushing game came in last year's 31-7 win over Auburn in Baton Rouge. LSU is 6-0 when Vincent goes over 100 yards. The following is a look at Vincent's 100-yard games:

## Bowe Knows TDs

For the first time this year, LSU WR **Dwayne Bowe** did not catch a TD pass in a game. However, he did haul in 6 passes for 99 yards against Mississippi State, a career-best for receptions for the sophomore. Through 4 games, Bowe leads the Tigers with 16 receptions for 284 yards. His 4 TD receptions are tied for league-high honors with Troy Williamson of South Carolina. Bowe also ranks second in the SEC in yards per game with 71 per contest. He's averaging 4 catches per game and a whopping 17.8 yards per receptions. Bowe's also had two TD receptions called back due to penalties.

## Seeing Double At Quarterback

LSU continued its two-quarterback system against Mississippi State with each QB leading the Tigers to points. **Marcus Randall** opened at quarterback for the fourth straight game and promptly directed the Tigers scores on three of their first four possession. Randall finished the game by completing all seven of his passes attempts for 103 yards. He also rushed for 6 yards. **JaMarcus Russell** spelled Randall in the second quarter and finished 9 of 12 for 137 yards and 1 TD. Russell also rushed for 26 yards and a TD. Through four games, the duo has combined to connect on 56 of 109 passes for 829 yards, 7 TDs and just 2 interceptions.

## Russell In Elite Company

With a pair of TD passes in each of his first two games in an LSU uniform, **JaMarcus Russell** did something that hasn't been done at the school since at least 1970. As far as detailed records account, Russell is the first LSU quarterback to toss at least 2 touchdown passes in his first two games as a Tiger. The only player since 1970 that came close was Tommy Hodson, who threw for a pair of TDs in his debut against Texas A&M in 1986. Hodson didn't throw any TD passes the following week in a 21-12 loss to Miami (Ohio).

## Two True Freshmen Start Against Mississippi State

For the first time under **Nick Saban**, LSU put two true freshmen on the field to start a game as DT **Glen Dorsey** and LB **Ali Highsmith** each started against Mississippi State. Dorsey responded with 5 tackles, including one for a 3-yard loss, to go with 1 quarterback hurry against the Bulldogs. Highsmith started at sam linebacker and was credited with a team-best 6 tackles, including a sack for an 11-yard loss and one quarterback hurry. Through 4 games, Dorsey has 9 tackles and 1 hurry to his credit, while Highsmith has 11 tackles, 1 sack, 1 interception and 1 fumble recovery to his credit.

## Tigers Reach 50-Point Mark Again

For the fourth time in the last two seasons, LSU reached the 50-point mark with a 51-0 win over Mississippi State. The 51 points came just two weeks after the Tigers racked up 53 points in a 53-3 victory over Arkansas State. Last year, the Tigers beat Arizona, 53-13, and Arkansas, 55-24. In all, the Tigers have scored 50 points in a game five times under **Nick Saban**. The first time came in Saban's debut at LSU as the Tigers rolled to a 58-0 win over Western Carolina to open the 2000 season.

## LSU's Defense Scores Again

LSU's defense was back up to its old tricks against Mississippi State as the Tiger "D" scored a touchdown, the ninth for the Tigers since the start of the 2003 season. Dating back to the first game in 2003, LSU has now scored 9 defensive TDs in 18 games. Against Mississippi State, DE **Marcus Spears** intercepted a pass and returned it 35 yards for a TD, the second TD of his career. Against Arkansas State in week 2 of the season, LSU linebacker **Ali Highsmith** intercepted a Nick Noce pass at the ASU 11-yard line and returned it to the 1-yard line where he fumbled, which was picked up by cornerback **Travis Daniels**, who walked into the end-zone for the score. Last year, the Tigers scored a school-record 7 defensive TDs (5 interception returns, 2 fumble returns).

## Margin Of Victory

LSU's 51-point margin of victory was the biggest in an SEC game for the Tigers since 1969 when LSU posted a 61-6 win over Mississippi State. It marked the largest margin of victory under **Nick Saban** since the first game of the Saban era when the Tigers beat Western Carolina, 58-0.

## Another Fourth-Quarter Comeback

LSU's comeback from a 15-7 fourth quarter deficit against Oregon State represents the sixth time under **Nick Saban** that the Tigers have rallied to win a game despite trailing in the final quarter. The last time the Tigers rallied to win in the fourth quarter came against Kentucky in 2002 when **Marcus Randall** connected with Devery Henderson on a 75-yard TD pass as time expired for a 33-30 LSU win. Over the six fourth-quarter comeback wins for the Tigers since 2000, Randall has been involved in three as he threw the game winning TD against Kentucky and Ole Miss in 2002 and then ran for the game-winning score against Oregon State in overtime. ## Randall Now 5-5 As LSU's Starting QB

LSU QB **Marcus Randall** has a 5-5 mark as LSU's starting quarterback, which includes a 3-1 record in 2004. Randall posted a 2-4 record as the Tiger signal caller in 2002.

## Russell Shined In Debut

LSU QB **JaMarcus Russell** shined in his much anticipated debut as the redshirt freshman started the second half and rallied the Tigers to an overtime win over Oregon State. Russell led the Tigers on two second half scoring drives, which included tossing a 38-yard TD pass to **Dwayne Bowe** with just over a minute left in the contest to pull the Tigers to within 15-13. Russell then tied the game with a two-point conversion that sent the game into overtime. In overtime, Russell suffered cramps to his legs and was forced out of the contest midway through LSU's possession. For the game, Russell completed 9 of 26 passes for 145 yards and 2 TDs.

## Webster and Buckles Are Cap and Gown Tigers

LSU senior CB **Corey Webster** is not only an accomplished athlete on the field, but he's also done quite well in the classroom as he recently graduated with a degree in general studies. Webster is joined on the Tiger squad by LB **Dorsett Buckles**, who finished up his course work over the summer earning a degree in general studies.



## Tigers Have Rushed For More Than Opponent In 12 Straight Games

For the 12th consecutive game, LSU had more rushing yards than its opponent as the Tigers put together 272 yards on the ground compared to 40 for Mississippi State last week. The last time a team gained more yards on the ground than LSU was Florida on Oct. 11, 2003. In that game, Florida had 81 yards on the ground compared to just 56 for the Tigers.

## Jackson Handles All of LSU's Kicking Duties and He Can Hit Too

LSU specialist **Chris Jackson** continues to handle all of LSU's kicking duties, including serving as the Tigers' punter. In 4 games, Jackson is averaging 38.6 yards on 14 punts. He's 2-4 on field goals and 13 of 16 on extra-point attempts. Jackson also serves as LSU's kicker on kickoffs. Oh by the way, he's also expected to be a starting middle infielder for the LSU baseball team next spring. On the football field, Jackson is the first Tiger to handle placekicks and punting for LSU since 1985 when Matt DeFrank did both.

## Webster Closing In On LSU Career Interception Mark

With an interception against Mississippi State, LSU senior CB **Corey Webster** moved a step closer to the school's career interception mark. For his career, Webster has 15 interceptions, just 5 shy of tying Mike Williams' school-record for interceptions at 20. Webster intercepted 7 passes in 2002 and 2003. He has 1 interception to his credit this year. Webster tied the school-record for interceptions in a single-game with 3 against Florida in 2002. Webster leads all active players in the SEC in both interceptions and pass deflections (45).

## Spears Adds Sack To Run Career Total To 11; Oliver Still At 10

LSU senior DE **Marcus Spears** ran his career sack total to 11 against Oregon State. Spears, who also forced a fumble, recovered a fumble and broke up a pass against the Beavers, finished with 5 tackles against the Beavers. Spears is now just four sacks shy of tying Corey White for 10th place on LSU's career sack list with 15. DT **Melvin Oliver** has 10 career sacks to his credit. Rydell Melancon holds the school mark with 25 career sacks from 1980-83.

## Green's Caught At Least 1 Pass In 18 Straight Games

LSU junior WR **Skylar Green** ran his streak of games with at least one reception to 18 straight games with two catches against Oregon State. Green, who did not play on offense in LSU's last 3 games, is expected to return to action this week against Georgia. As a matter of fact, Green caught at least 2 passes in 15 straight games, including all 14 of LSU's games in 2003. Green's career high for receptions came against Louisiana Tech with 9 receptions. For his career, Green has 57 passes for 658 yards and 7 TDs.

## Green Moves Into 10th Place On LSU Career Punt Return List

**Skylar Green** moved into 10th-place in career punt return yards in LSU with against Oregon State. Green finished with only one return for nine yards against the Beavers, but it was good enough to move past Chris Williams for the 10th spot. Green now has 471 punt return yards. Domanick Davis holds the school record with 1,126 yards on 94 returns from 1999-2002.

## Defensive Line Shuffle

One of the philosophies of LSU coach **Nick Saban** is keeping players fresh by rotating players throughout the game. The Tigers have played the first four games by rotating players on the defensive line. The starters in last week's game against Mississippi State were **Marcus Spears** and **Melvin Oliver** at DE and **Kyle Williams** and **Glen Dorsey** at DT. Those four are spelled by DT **Claude Wroten**, DT **Ryan Willis**, DE **Kirston Pittman** and DE **Brian West**. Pittman is also on the field for LSU in third down situations.

## 12 True Freshmen Have Seen Action So Far

Twelve true freshmen have seen action for the Tigers in 2004 with four rookies having seen action in all 4 games. LB **Ali Highsmith**, FB **Jacob Hester**, WR **Early Doucet** and DT **Glen Dorsey** have played in all 4 games this year. Other true freshmen who have seen action this year include DB **Chevis Jackson**, WR **Xavier Carter**, OL **Brett Helms**, OL **Herman Johnson**, TE **Mit Cole**, DE **Charles Alexander**, DB **Craig Steltz** and HOLD **Joe Lawrence**.

## Wilkerson and Whitworth Are The Rocks On O-Line

LSU senior C **Ben Wilkerson** and junior OT **Andrew Whitworth** have combined to start 67 games on the offensive line for the Tigers over the last 2-plus years. Whitworth has started every game over the last two years, while Wilkerson started all 13 games a year ago. Dating back to the 2001 season, Wilkerson has started 37 of LSU's last 40 games and the Tigers are 30-7 in those games.

### LSU's Won 11 Straight Non-Conference Games In Tiger Stadium

LSU won its 11th straight non-conference game in Tiger Stadium with a 53-3 win over Arkansas State on Sept. 11. LSU hasn't lost a home non-conference game since dropping a last-second 13-10 decision to UAB in 2000.

### LSU's 17-3 Against Non-SEC Foes Under Saban

The Tigers ran their non-conference record to 17-3 under **Nick Saban** following the 53-3 win over Arkansas State. The Tigers, who were 5-0 against non-SEC teams in 2003, haven't lost a non-conference game since dropping a 35-20 decision to Texas in the 2003 Cotton Bowl. LSU hasn't lost a regular season non-conference game since falling to Virginia Tech, 26-8, to open the 2002 season.

### That Tiger Stadium Mystique Is Back Under Saban

LSU coach **Nick Saban** has restored the mystique that has made Tiger Stadium one of the toughest places for opposing teams to play. In 4-plus seasons at LSU, Saban has put together a 26-5 mark at home, which includes a 13-4 record in SEC games. LSU finished its 2003 season with a 6-1 at home after going 6-1 in Tiger Stadium in 2002. Under Saban, the Tigers are 6-2 vs. Top 25 teams in Tiger Stadium.

### LSU's Won Six Straight In Tiger Stadium

With the win over Mississippi State, LSU has now won 6 straight home games. The Tigers are 3-0 this year at home after winning its final three games in Tiger Stadium last year. The last time LSU lost at home came on Oct. 11, 2003 when Florida posted a 19-7 win over the Tigers. Since then, LSU has outscored its opponents 261-65 at home for an average of 43.5-10.8 in those five games.

Lawrence, who is officially listed as a true freshman, is less than two-years younger than LSU defensive backs coach **Kirby Smart**. Lawrence spent eight years in pro baseball, while Gill spent time in the U.S. Armed Services.

### LSU Ranks Ninth In Active NFL Players

With 33 former Tigers on active NFL rosters, LSU ranks ninth among all schools with former players currently in the NFL. Miami tops the list with 43 followed by Florida State with 39. Notre Dame and Tennessee are next with 38, followed by Florida, Georgia and Ohio State with 36 each. Michigan is next with 35, then LSU with 33 and Penn State with 32.

The streets were lined with purple and gold. Smoke emanated from the grills in the parking lot. Shouts of "Go Tigers" and "Tiger Bait" echoed from the stadium deep into the heart of campus.

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 81st year in the venerable stadium on SATURDAY NIGHT.

• Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 26-5 HOME RECORD, including a 6-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 12-4 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 19-3 since Saban took over.

• LSU has won 14 OF ITS LAST 16 games at home, including a current six-game winning streak.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 30 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 21 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. The Tigers have been in the top 15 for 43 of the 45 years and in the top 10 on 37 occasions, including 32 straight from 1957-88. Fourteen times, LSU has ranked in the TOP FIVE IN THE NATION, including the last three.

• Since 1960, LSU owns a stellar 189-62-4 (.749) record in traditional Tiger Stadium night games. On the other hand, the Tigers are just 17-21-3 (.451) at home during the day in that span.

• Death Valley is the SIXTH LARGEST on-campus stadium in the nation holding 91,600 fans.

### Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

### Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

## LSU Overwhelms Georgia to Claim SEC Title

Freshman Justin Vincent rushed for an SEC Championship game record 201 yards and two TDs and the LSU defense dominated fifth-ranked Georgia in every phase of the game in a 34-13 win over the Bulldogs. Vincent opened the scoring for the Tigers with an 87-yard run, the longest in SEC title game history, late in the first quarter for a 6-0 LSU lead. The Tigers tackled Georgia's punter in the endzone less than two minutes later for a safety and an 8-0 LSU lead. LSU stretched the margin to 14-0 on a 43-yard TD pass from Matt Mauck to Michael Clayton and then extended the lead to 17-0 on a 35-yard field goal by Ryan Gaudet. The Tigers led 17-3 at halftime.

Georgia pulled to within 17-6 midway through the third quarter before LSU's Lionel Turner picked off a David Greene pass and returned it 18 yards for a TD and a 24-6 Tiger lead. Vincent added a 3-yard TD run and Gaudet a field goal for the final margin of victory. For the game, LSU's offense racked up 444 yards, including a whopping 293 on the ground. The Tigers held the Dogs to 249 yards of offense and only 50 rushing yards.

**Pair of QBs Lead LSU To 22-21 OT Win Over Oregon State**

JaMarcus Russell started the comeback and then Marcus Randall finished it as the Tigers rallied from an 8-point deficit with less than two minutes remaining to force overtime and eventually beat Oregon State, 22-21, in Tiger Stadium in the season-opener for both teams. Trailing 9-0 at halftime, Russell replaced an ineffective Randall and pulled the Tigers to within 9-7 late in the third quarter on a 16-yard TD pass to Skyler Green. OSU answered with a 9-play, 65-yard drive to extend its margin to 15-7. The score remained that way until Russell rallied the Tigers on a 4-play, 64-yard drive capped with a 38-yard TD strike to Dwayne Bowe. Russell then converted the two-point conversion to tie the score at 15-15 with just over a minute left. In overtime and with Russell out with cramps, Randall returned to the field and scored on a 5-yard run to give LSU its first lead at 22-15. OSU followed with a TD of its own, however the extra-point attempt sailed wide right, the third missed PAT for the Beavers, and the Tigers escaped with a 22-21 win. For the game, Russell completed 9 of 26 passes for 145 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall was 7 of 18 for 66 yards and 1 interception. Vincent led the Tigers with 48 yards rushing, while Bowe caught 5 passes for 103 yards and a score.

**Tigers Overpower Arkansas State, 53-3**

Justin Vincent rushed for 102 yards and 2 TDs and three LSU quarterbacks combined to hit on 12 of 20 passes for 210 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers rolled to a 53-3 win over Arkansas State in Tiger Stadium. LSU wasted little time in establishing itself as the dominant team as the Tigers took the opening kickoff and marched 54 yards in 6 plays for a 7-0 lead following a 5-yard TD run by Vincent just two minutes into the contest. The Indians fumbled the ensuing kickoff and three plays later, Marcus Randall found Corey Webster for a 6-yard TD pass running the score to 13-0. From there, the route was on as the Tigers extended their lead to 23-0 after the first quarter and 37-0 at halftime. Arkansas State got on the board midway through the third quarter with a 34-yard field goal. LSU responded with a pair of touchdowns in a 3-minute span to stretch the lead to 50-3. Ryan Gaudet added a 33-yard field goal in the fourth quarter for the final margin. For the game, the Tigers limited ASU to just 54 yards rushing and only 201 yards of offense. JaMarcus Russell led all LSU quarterbacks by connecting on 7 of 11 passes for 151 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall hit on 5 of 7 for 59 yards and one score. Craig Davis led the Tigers with 4 catches for 73 yards, while Dwayne Bowe caught a pair of TD passes.

Auburn Scores Late To Hand LSU A 10-9 Defeat

Jason Campbell connected with Courtney Taylor on a 16-yard TD pass with just over a minute left to lift 14th-ranked Auburn to a 10-9 win over No. 4 LSU. The victory by Auburn snapped LSU's 10-game winning streak, one that dated back to a 33-7 win over South Carolina last October. The Auburn TD capped a contest that saw the LSU defense hold Auburn in check, limiting the Tigers to just 301 yards of offense, including only 131 yards on the ground. The LSU defense held Auburn's running back tandem of Carnell Williams (75 yards) and Ronnie Brown (67 yards) to 142 combined yards, 70 yards below their season average. LSU appeared to be in good shape early in the contest, taking the opening kickoff and marching 80 yards on 14 plays for a 6-0 lead following a Marcus Randall 9-yard TD pass to Dwayne Bowe. LSU's Ryan Gaudet pushed the PAT wide right, a point that would come back to haunt LSU. Auburn responded with a 14-play drive of its own that ended with a field goal. LSU, with JaMarcus Russell at QB, answered right back, going 55 yards on eight plays, capped with a 42-yard Chris Jackson field goal. That's all the scoring either team would get until the final minutes of the contest. LSU did have its chances in the second half, getting inside the Auburn 35-yard line twice, but the Tigers failed to capitalize on the opportunity. Alley Broussard led all running back with 84 yards on 10 carries, while Randall and Russell combined to hit on 12 of 28 passes for 168 yards and a TD.

**Tigers Score Early And Often In 51-0 Route Of Mississippi State**

Alley Broussard scored a career-best 3 TDs, all in the first 17 minutes of the game, as the Tigers racked up 599 yards of offense in rolling to a 51-0 win over Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium. LSU set the tone early in the contest going 74 yards on 7 plays, five of which were runs, for a 7-0 lead just three minutes into the game. Following a MSU fumble on its first possession, the Tigers need only 6 plays to go 18 yards for a 14-0 lead midway through the first quarter. From there, the route was on as the Tigers built a 27-0 lead early in the second quarter following a 35-yard interception return for a TD by Marcus Spears. LSU led 34-0 at halftime. In the second half, the Tigers stretched the margin to 41-0 on an 8-yard run by QB JaMarcus Russell and then 48-0 on a 67-yard TD reception by Xavier Carter. For the contest, LSU picked up 31 first downs, while limiting MSU to just 7. LSU also held MSU to only 130 yards of offense, while intercepting a season-high 4 passes. The 51-point margin of victory was the biggest by LSU in an SEC game since a 61-6 win over Mississippi State in 1969. It was also LSU's first shutout since a 42-0 win over Mississippi State in 2001.
