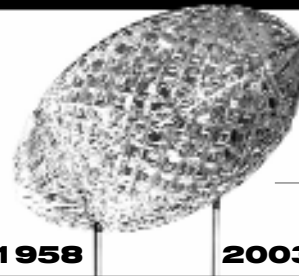

Tigers Look To Get Back On Track Against No. 12 Florida

LSU will look to get back on track tonight as the 24th-ranked Tigers travel to face 12th-ranked Florida in Gainesville. The game is the featured matchup on ESPN and will kickoff before a national audience at 6:52 p.m. CT. LSU enters the contest with a 3-2 overall mark and a 1-2 league record after last week's 45-16 setback to third-ranked Georgia in Athens. The Gators, 3-1 overall and 2-1 in conference play, are coming off a 45-30 home win over Arkansas in their last game. A year ago, Florida handed LSU its only loss of the season, a 19-7 defeat in Tiger Stadium in October. Following the loss to Florida, LSU reeled off eight straight wins on its way to the BCS National Title. The last time the teams played in Gainesville, LSU CB **Corey Webster** tied a school-record with 3 interceptions, returning one for a TD, in a 36-7 Tiger win. Saturday's contest will pit a high-powered Florida offense, featuring QB Chris Leak and RB Ciatrick Fason, against an LSU defense that has allowed only one rushing touchdown all season. Despite giving up 45 points to Georgia, LSU is still holding its opponents to just 15.8 points and only 275 yards per game. Offensively, the Tigers are averaging 30.2 points and 396.8 yards per game, which includes 232.6 through the air.

Greene Passes Georgia Past LSU, 45-16

David Greene threw 5 touchdown passes as third-ranked Georgia, behind a pair of first half LSU turnovers, raced out to a 24-0 lead midway through the second quarter and never looked back in a 45-16 win over the Tigers in Athens. Trailing 24-0, LSU mounted a rally that pulled the Tigers to within 24-10 at halftime. First, **JaMarcus Russell** guided the Tigers on a 7-play, 80-yard drive, capped with an 18-yard TD strike to **Dwayne Bowe** with 1:23 left before halftime. After holding Georgia to three plays and out on its next series, the Tigers quickly moved 24 yards in two plays setting up a 31-yard field goal by **Chris Jackson** as time expired in the first half pulling LSU to within 24-10. With an apparent momentum swing towards LSU, the Tigers got the ball to start the second half and moved all the way to the UGA 34-yard line before the drive stalled out. From there, LSU could muster little offense as the Bulldogs stretched their lead to 31-10 at the 5:12 mark on a Greene-to-Fred Gibson pass. LSU wouldn't get any closer the rest of the way. The Tigers did close the contest with an 8-play, 80-yard TD drive engineered by QB **Marcus Randall**. For the contest, LSU managed only 314 yards of offense, compared to 430 for the Bulldogs. Russell led LSU by hitting on 9 of 17 passes for 131 yards and 1 TD, while **Alley Broussard** rushed for 45 yards in his first career start.

For years outsiders viewed the LSU football program as an unpolished gem, a potential giant waiting to be reborn in the world of college football. With the wealth of resources LSU has to offer, its tradition and the available talent within the state of Louisiana, all the program needed was the right person to lead it. In four years as head coach of the Tigers, Nick Saban has proven to be that leader.

Since taking over a program that suffered through seven losing seasons in the 1990s, Saban has guided the Tigers to the pinnacle of college football - winning the 2003 BCS National Championship with a 21-14 victory over Oklahoma in the Nokia Sugar Bowl. The victory culminated a four-year ride under Saban that has been unmatched in the history of Tiger football. Since taking the reigns in 2000, Saban has guided the Tigers to a 42-15 overall mark, while claiming a pair of SEC titles in 2001 and 2003. LSU's 2003 BCS National Championship is just the second for the Tigers in football, and the first since 1958.

Saban's ability to successfully lead the Tigers comes from a management style that focuses on the entire program, one that puts his players in position to have success, both on the field and in the classroom. Armed with a plan that starts with recruiting quality people, outstanding football players and good students, Saban and his staff have transformed LSU into a team that is sure to be a fixture among the nation's elite programs for years to come.

On the field, Saban has developed a reputation as a defensive mastermind who is among the best in the game - professional or college - when it comes to game day coaching decisions. His defenses are physical, aggressive and deceptive, while offensively, the Tigers put up staggering numbers with a wealth of skill players leading the way. His teams play hard, make good decisions on the field and have proven that they are confident enough to overcome any type of adversity that is thrown in their direction.

It's a style and system that has proven to be successful, both for the team as well as the individual as six Tigers have earned First Team All-America honors in four years, while 18 of his LSU players have gone on to be selected in the NFL Draft, including six in the 2004 draft.

Off the field, Saban demands excellence from his players in both the classroom as well as the community. While the Tigers were marching to the 2003 national title on the field, the LSU football team combined for a 2.52 grade point average. A few months later, the squad bettered that mark with a 2.76 average for the spring semester as the Tigers had 50 players with a 3.0 or better during the spring and just six athletes that failed to reach a 2.0.

In addition to the honors the Tigers garnered on the field, LSU had 25 players earn a spot in the SEC Academic Honor Roll in 2003. Once again, numbers that show not only is Saban committed to academics, but his players are also dedicated to receiving an education as well. Since December of 2000, 51 football players who played under Saban at LSU have earned their degree, which includes 13 members of the 2003 national championship squad.

A major part of enhancing and cultivating the education experience for the student-athletes at LSU has been the addition of the \$15 million state-of-the-art Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes. Saban spearheaded the fundraising for the center, which included donating \$50,000 of his own money to the cause. The center, the best of its kind in college athletics, features a 1,000-seat auditorium with over 100 computers in a 54,000-square foot facility that gives all of LSU's student-athletes the best chance to have success in the classroom.

Saban's mission statement for the LSU football program is simple. He wants his players to become better people for having been a part of the program. He also wants to develop his players so they can reach their full athletic potential, which will enable them to have the opportunity to win a championship. Finally, it's his plan to help each player graduate and launch their career so that when they leave LSU they can have the best opportunities to be successful in life.

Prior to LSU, Saban spent five years as the head coach at Michigan State, where he built the Spartans into a perennial Big Ten contender after going to four bowl games in five years.

The Game

The Tigers will play an SEC Eastern Division foe on the road for the second straight week as the Tigers travel to face 12th-ranked Florida in Gainesville. LSU enters the game with a 3-2 overall mark, which includes a 1-2 record in SEC play. The Tigers are 0-2 on the road this season after posting a 5-0 record in away games a year ago. Florida, winners of two straight, stands at 3-1 overall and 2-1 in league play following last week's 45-30 win over Arkansas.

Who's In And Who's Out For The Tigers

LSU enters tonight's game with CB **Corey Webster** being listed as questionable for the contest. Webster, who didn't practice thru Wednesday, strained a knee in last week's game against Georgia. Webster is expected to be a game-time decision for the Tigers. Other injuries for LSU include DB **Mario Stevenson** (foot), who is out for the game against the Gators. WR **Skyler Green** (ankle) returned to action against Georgia after missing three straight games with an ankle injury.

In The Polls

LSU dropped 11 spots in both polls this week, falling from No. 13 to No. 24 following the 45-16 loss to Georgia. LSU has been ranked for 25 consecutive ranking periods in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches poll and for 24 straight in the Associated Press poll.

About Florida

The Gators are 3-1 overall and 2-1 in league play ... Florida is ranked No. 12 in the nation in both polls ... Head coach Ron Zook is in his third year at Florida and has a record of 19-11 with the Gators ... He guided the Gators to back-to-back 8-5 records in 2002 and 2003 ... Sophomore QB Chris Leaks ranks first in the SEC in passing with 278.2 yards per game ... In 4 games, Leak has completed 86 of 137 passes for 1,113 yards and 10 TDs ... He's only thrown 4 interceptions ... Junior RB Ciatrick Fason ranks first in the SEC and 13th in the nation with 114.5 yards rushing per game ... He's also scored an SEC-best 5 rushing TDs this year ... The Gators are averaging 35.5 points per game, while allowing only 18.2 points per game ... Defensively, LB Channing Crowder is tops on the team with 39 tackles, including 3.5 for losses.

Sunshine State Tigers

LSU has 11 Tigers, including 3 starters, who call Florida home. Those players on the LSU roster who are from the Sunshine State include LB **E.J. Kuale** (Daytona Beach), CB **Travis Daniels** (Hollywood), WR **Amp Hill** (Jacksonville), TE **Demetri Robinson** (Lake City), WR **Xavier Carter** (Melbourne), LB **Ali Highsmith** (Miami), OG **Terrell McGill** (Miami), WR **Dwayne Bowe** (Miami), LB **Willie Demps** (Pensacola), OT **Brian Johnson** (Tallahassee), and DB **Keron Gordon** (Tampa). In addition, LSU TE coach **Leroy Ryals** is from Sarasota.

LSU-Florida Connections

While they aren't any members of the LSU staff with direct connections to Florida, the Gators have a couple coaches with ties to LSU and/or members of its staff. Florida associate head coach/linebackers coach Bill Miller served as the defensive coordinator for **Nick Saban** at Michigan State in 1999 and remained in that position when **Bobby Williams** took over in 2000. UF quarterbacks coach Ed Zaunbrecher served as LSU's offensive coordinator and QB coach from 1984-90 under head coaches Bill Arnsparger and Mike Archer.

Saban vs. Zook

LSU coach **Nick Saban** and Florida coach Ron Zook have met on the football field as more than just coaches. As a matter of fact, they faced each other in a college football game one time, Saban as a defensive back for Kent State and Zook as a DB for Miami (Ohio) in 1972. Saban's Kent State team went on to beat Miami, 21-10. As coaches, Saban has a 1-1 mark vs. Zook, beating him in Florida, 36-7, in 2002 and falling 19-7 last year in Baton Rouge.

Two Coaches On LSU Staff Have Wins Against Florida

LSU coach Nick Saban isn't the only coach on the Tiger staff who has a win against the Gators as a head coach. LSU assoc. head coach/wide receiver coach Bobby Williams beat Florida in his first game as head coach at Michigan State. Williams, who took over for Saban at Michigan State, posted a 37-34 win over Florida in the Citrus Bowl in Orlando on Jan. 1, 2000. Saban beat Florida, 36-7, in Gainesville in 2002.

LSU Against The SEC Eastern Division

The Florida contest will mark LSU's second game against an SEC Eastern Division opponent this year. Last week, the Tigers dropped a 45-16 decision to SEC East foe Georgia. Under **Nick Saban**, the Tigers are 9-5 against teams from the SEC East. Dating back to the start of the 2002 season, LSU is 6-2 against the SEC East with the only losses during that span coming against Florida in 2003 and Georgia last week. LSU posted a perfect 3-0 mark against the SEC East in 2002 and followed that with a 3-1 record a year ago. Since the league went to divisional format in 1992, LSU has a 15-22-1 mark against teams from the East. LSU's perfect seasons against the SEC East came in 1997 and 2002.

Another Ranked Opponent On The Road

Playing in the SEC, it's a given that the schedule, both home and road, is going to be tough. However, this year's LSU road schedule may be the toughest the Tigers have ever had to endure. Consider that so far this season, LSU has already dropped a 10-9 decision to then-No. 14 Auburn on the road and last week, the Tigers fell 45-16 to No. 3 ranked Georgia. This week, LSU travels to face 12th-ranked Florida in Gainesville.

Here's a few notes about LSU's road schedule to consider:

- The last time LSU played road games against ranked opponents in consecutive weeks came in 1998 when the Tigers played at No. 10 Notre Dame (lost 39-36) and No. 13 Arkansas (lost 41-14).
- The last time LSU played road games against ranked SEC opponents in consecutive weeks came in 1980 when the Tigers played at No. 6 Alabama (lost 28-7) and No. 19 Mississippi State (lost 55-31).
- The last time LSU played three road games against Top 25 teams came in 1999 when the Tigers faced No. 10 Georgia (lost 23-22), No. 12 Mississippi State (lost 17-16) and No. 12 Alabama (lost 23-17) all on the road.

Taking Note On The Tigers Under Saban

Here is a look at some notable trends for LSU during its first 57 games under **Nick Saban** ... LSU is 36-3 when leading at halftime and 34-3 when leading after three quarters ... The Tigers are 39-3 when scoring 20 or more points and 36-0 when scoring at least 25 points in a game ... On the other hand, the Tigers are 3-12 when failing to reach the 20-point mark ... LSU is 11-3 in games decided by 7 points or less and 5-2 in games decided by 3 points or less ... LSU is 28-1 when holding opponents to fewer than 100 team rushing yards and the Tigers are 20-0 when having a player rush for 100 yards.

Tiger Defense Takes A Hit; Still Rated Among The SEC's Best

Despite giving up 45 points and 430 yards to Georgia last week, LSU's defense is still rated among the best in the SEC. Through five games, LSU is allowing only 15.8 points per game (T4th in SEC), while yielding just 275.4 yards per contest (5th in SEC). LSU ranks second in the SEC in rushing defense, allowing just 106 yards per game. Last year, LSU led the nation in scoring defense (11.0 points) and total defense (252.0).

Russell and Randall Have Tigers Ranked Third In SEC In Passing

LSU QB tandem of **Marcus Randall** and **JaMarcus Russell** have the Tigers ranked third in the SEC in passing offense with an average of 232.6 yards per game. Through 5 games, Russell has completed 42 of 85 passes for 687 yards and 6 TDs, while Randall has connected on 33 of 54 attempts for 389 yards and 3 scores. Randall has started all 5 games for the Tigers this year.

Skyler's Back

LSU WR **Skyler Green** returned to action against Georgia, his first extensive playing time since the opener against Oregon State. Green, who has been slowed by an ankle sprain which he suffered in late August, responded with 3 receptions for 24 yards against Georgia. He also returned 1 punt for 16 yards against the Bulldogs. The 16-yard punt return marks the longest return of the year for the Tigers. Green also returned 1 kickoff for 20 yards for a total of 60 all-purpose yards against the Bulldogs. For the year, Green has caught 5 passes for 40 yards and he's returned 3 punts for 21 yards.

Tigers Have Kept Opponents To Less Than 20 Points 35 Times Under Saban

By holding Mississippi State scoreless in week 4, the Tigers have limited their opponents to less than 20 points in 35 of the 57 games they have played under **Nick Saban**. Under Saban, the Tigers are 31-4 when holding its opponents to fewer than 20 points. Prior to the Florida game in 2003, LSU had won 18 straight contests when holding its opponent to less than 20 points. That streak dated back to a 14-3 loss to Arkansas in Little Rock in 2000. Of the 35 times that LSU has held its opponent to under 20 points, 19 of those have been when the opponent scored 10 points or less. LSU has also posted five shutouts under Saban.

LSU Defense Finally Yields A Rushing TD

It took until the 20th quarter of the season, but LSU's defense finally allowed a rushing TD when Georgia's Thomas Brown scored on a 1-yard run last week. Through 5 games in 2004, LSU has allowed 10 touchdowns, only one of which has come on the ground. Dating back to last year's season-opener, LSU's defense has only allowed 8 rushing TDs, which covers a span of 19 games. Arkansas' Cedric Cobbs was the only player in the SEC to rush for a TD against the Tigers last year, and he did it with a 20-yard run in the final week of the regular-season.

Bringing The Heat On Defense

Nick Saban is known for a blitzing defense that gives opposing quarterbacks fits. Through 5 games, the Tigers are first in the SEC with 12 sacks. The 11 sacks have come from eight different players. Safety **LaRon Landry** leads the Tigers with 3 sacks, while LB **Lionel Turner** and LB **E.J. Kuale** each have a pair of sacks. Of LSU's 12 sacks, four have come from defensive backs, 6 have come from linebackers and 3 have come from defensive linemen.

LSU's Had At Least 1 Sack In 30 Straight Games

With 1 sack against Georgia, LSU ran its streak of games with at least one sack to 30 straight. The streak dates all the way back to the Miami (Ohio) game in 2002 when the Tigers sacked Ben Roethlisberger three times. Since then, LSU has had at least one sack in every game, which includes all 14 games in 2003. This year, through 5 games, the Tigers lead the SEC with 12 sacks, which have accounted for 90-yards in losses. LSU FS **LaRon Landry** ranks second in the SEC with 2.5 sacks through four games, while LB **Lionel Turner** is tied for fourth in the league with 2 sacks.

Tiger Offense Slowed Against Georgia

Prior to last week's game against Georgia, LSU's offense was making a habit of getting off to a fast start in three straight games. Georgia held LSU scoreless for most of the first half before the Tigers scored 10 quick points over the final few minutes of the second quarter to bring the score to within 24-10 at halftime. Prior to the Georgia game, LSU's offense was quick out of the gate, scoring on its first two possessions in three straight games. Against Arkansas State, the Tigers scored on their first six possessions. A week later, QB **Marcus Randall** led the Tigers on a 14-play, 80-yard drive, capped with a 9-yard TD pass to **Dwayne Bowe** on LSU's first possession against Auburn. Tiger QB **JaMarcus Russell** followed that by leading LSU on an 8-play, 55-yard drive that culminated with a 42-yard **Chris Jackson** field goal on the second possession of the game against Auburn. Against Mississippi State, Randall opened at quarterback and guided LSU on a 7-play, 74-yard drive on its first possession that culminated with an 11-yard TD run by **Alley Broussard**. The Tigers then followed that with a 6-play, 18-yard drive on its second possession, capped with a 1-yard plunge by Broussard.

LSU's 11-9 On The Road Under Saban

LSU's record on the road under **Nick Saban** fell to 12-8 with last week's loss to Georgia. Since 2001, LSU has posted an 10-5 road record. Of LSU's eight road losses since 2000, six have come against teams ranked in the top 25 at the time of the game. LSU posted a 5-0 road record a year ago.

A Loaded Backfield

The return of RB **Shyrone Carey** from a 4-game suspension has only added to LSU's depth at the running back position. The Tigers have three running backs in its backfield that have a 100-yard game to his credit with sophomore **Justin Vincent** leading the way with 6 career 100-yard games. **Alley Broussard**, who had 73 yards and 3 TDs against Mississippi State, has 2 career 100-yard games, while Carey has done it once. LSU is also two yards away from having four players with 100-yard games as **Joseph Addai** has rushed for as many as 98 yards in a game, but he's never topped the 100-yard mark. LSU's four running backs of Vincent, Broussard, Addai and Carey have combined to rush for 3,485 yards and 33 TDs.

Alley Gets The Start At Tailback

After outrushing Auburn's Cadillac and Hummer and then scoring 3 TDs to go with 73 yards against Mississippi State, LSU's **Alley Broussard** was rewarded with his first career start against Georgia. Broussard responded by leading the Tigers with 45 yards on 12 carries to run his season total to 217 yards on 42 carries, an average of 5.2 yards per rush. Against Auburn, Broussard, a sophomore from Lafayette, rushed for 84 yards on 10 carries, including a 38-yard run in the second quarter. LSU's defense limited Williams to 75 yards and no TDs on 18 carries, while Brown had 67 yards on nine carries for Auburn. The 84 yards rushing for Broussard marked the third-highest total in a single-game in his career. Last year, Broussard rushed for 108 yards against South Carolina and then had 106 yards and a TD against Louisiana Tech. For his career, Broussard has rushed for 606 yards and 7 TDs on 114 attempts for an average of 4.8 yards per carry.

Corey Webster The Multi-Tasker

LSU CB/WR/RS **Corey Webster**, who graduated last month with a degree in general studies, has taken his time management skills to another area and that's the football field. In 5 games in 2004, Webster has played on both sides of the ball in three games as well as seeing action as LSU's punt returner against Arkansas State. In 5 games, Webster has 16 tackles, 1 interception and 5 PBUs on defense to go with one reception for a 6-yard TD on offense. Webster, who has seen action on 27 snaps of offense, has also returned 2 punts for 7 yards. Webster's 6-yard TD reception against Arkansas State was the first offensive TD of his career. He also scored on a 45-yard interception return against Florida in 2002. Webster is the first 3-way player at LSU since 2002 when Domanick Davis played on both sides of the football as well as returning punts and kickoffs.

12 Tigers Have Caught Passes In 2004

A trademark of a **Jimbo Fisher**-offense is that of spreading the ball around. Through 5 games, the Tigers have done a lot of spreading it around as 12 different players have been on the receiving end of passes. Of the 12 players who have caught passes, 7 are wide receivers, three are running backs and two are tight ends. **Dwayne Bowe** leads all receivers with 22 catches, **Joseph Addai** is tops among running backs with 8 catches and **David Jones** leads the tight ends with 3 receptions.

Randall Now 5-6 As LSU's Starting QB

LSU QB **Marcus Randall** has a 5-6 mark as LSU's starting quarterback, which includes a 3-2 record in 2004. Randall posted a 2-4 record as the Tiger signal caller in 2002.

Bowe Knows TDs

Dwayne Bowe ran his number of TD receptions to an SEC-best 5 on Saturday with an 18-yard scoring grab in the second quarter against Georgia. Bowe ranks second in the SEC in receptions per game with 4.4 a contest. He's also third in the league with 72.4 yards receiving a contest. Through 5 games, Bowe leads the Tigers with 22 receptions for 362 yards and 5 TDs. He's averaging 16.5 yards per catch. Bowe's also had two TD receptions called back due to penalties.

10 Different Tigers Have Scored On Offense in 2004

Last year, LSU had 12 different players score offensive touchdowns all year. This year, through 5 games, the Tigers have already had 10 players reach the endzone for a score on offense. Five different players have rushed for a score this year, while the Tigers have had five different receivers score. **Alley Broussard** leads the Tigers with 3 rushing TDs, while **Dwayne Bowe** is tops among receivers with 5 catches for scores. Of the 10 players who have scored offensive TDs for LSU, six are either freshmen or sophomores and only two are seniors. The following is list of LSU offensive players who've scored this year:

For his career, Vincent has tallied six games of 100 yards or better, including a career-best of 201 yards against Georgia in the SEC Championship game last year. Bowe leads the Tigers with 22 catches for 362 yards and 5 TDs, while Davis has 18 receptions for 311 yards.

Three True Freshmen Start Against Georgia

A week after starting 2 true freshmen against Mississippi State, the Tigers had 3 on the field to open the game against Georgia as RB **Jacob Hester**, DT **Glen Dorsey** and LB **Ali Highsmith** all started against the Bulldogs. A week earlier against MSU, Dorsey and Highsmith both started for the first time. Against Georgia, Hester rushed 2 times for 20 yards, while Dorsey and Highsmith each had 3 tackles.

12 True Freshmen Have Seen Action So Far

Twelve true freshmen have seen action for the Tigers in 2004 with four rookies having seen action in all 5 games. LB **Ali Highsmith**, FB **Jacob Hester**, WR **Early Doucet** and DT **Glen Dorsey** have played in all 4 games this year. Other true freshmen who have seen action this year include DB **Chevis Jackson**, WR **Xavier Carter**, OL **Brett Helms**, OL **Herman Johnson**, TE **Mit Cole**, DE **Charles Alexander**, DB **Craig Steltz** and HOLD **Joe Lawrence**.

LSU's Defense Scores Again

LSU's defense was back up to its old tricks against Mississippi State as the Tiger "D" scored a touchdown, the ninth for the Tigers since the start of the 2003 season. Dating back to the first game in 2003, LSU has now scored 9 defensive TDs in 19 games. Against Mississippi State, DE **Marcus Spears** intercepted a pass and returned it 35 yards for a TD, the second TD of his career. Against Arkansas State in week 2 of the season, LSU linebacker **Ali Highsmith** intercepted a Nick Noce pass at the ASU 11-yard line and returned it to the 1-yard line where he fumbled, which was picked up by cornerback **Travis Daniels**, who walked into the end-zone for the score. Last year, the Tigers scored a school-record 7 defensive TDs (5 interception returns, 2 fumble returns).

Seeing Double At Quarterback

LSU continued its two-quarterback system against Georgia with each QB leading the Tigers to points. **Marcus Randall** opened at quarterback for the fifth straight game and finished 10 of 13 for 116 yards and 1 TD. **JaMarcus Russell**, who spelled Randall in the first half, hit on 9 of 17 passes for 131 yards and 1 score. Russell engineered a pair of late second-quarter drives that pulled the Tigers to within 24-10 at halftime. Russell started the second half and played most of the final 30 minutes before Randall was inserted late in the fourth quarter, when he led the Tigers to their second TD of the game. Through 5 games, the QBs have combined to complete 75 of 139 passes for 1,076 yards and 9 TDs. They've only thrown 2 interceptions between them.

Jackson Handles All of LSU's Kicking Duties and He Can Hit Too

LSU specialist **Chris Jackson** continues to handle all of LSU's kicking duties, including serving as the Tigers' punter. In 5 games, Jackson is averaging 38.3 yards on 23 punts. He's 3-of-5 on field goals and 14 of 18 on extra-point attempts. Jackson also serves as LSU's kicker on kickoffs. Oh by the way, he's also expected to be a starting middle infielder for the LSU baseball team next spring. On the football field, Jackson is the first Tiger to handle placekicks and punting for LSU since 1985 when Matt DeFrank did both.

Webster Closing In On LSU Career Interception Mark

With an interception against Mississippi State, LSU senior CB **Corey Webster** moved a step closer to the school's career interception mark. For his career, Webster has 15 interceptions, just 5 shy of tying Mike Williams' school-record for interceptions at 20. Webster intercepted 7 passes in 2002 and 2003. He has 1 interception to his credit this year. Webster tied the school-record for interceptions in a single-game with 3 against Florida in 2002. Webster leads all active players in the SEC in both interceptions and pass deflections (45).

A Couple Of Changes For The Tigers

Just in case you missed it, LSU LB **E.J. Kuale** has switched numbers and will wear No. 51 for the remainder of the season. Kuale started the year wearing No. 2, but with the return to action of RB/KR **Shyrone Carey** (who also wears No. 2), Kuale made the number switch. In addition, **Brandon Washington** moved back to defense the week of the Mississippi State contest after playing on the offensive line for the first three weeks of the season. Washington, who also switched from No. 66 to No. 97, originally came to LSU as a defensive lineman before moving to offensive line last spring.

Russell In Elite Company

With a pair of TD passes in each of his first two games in an LSU uniform, **JaMarcus Russell** did something that hasn't been done at the school since at least 1970. As far as detailed records account, Russell is the first LSU quarterback to toss at least 2 touchdown passes in his first two games as a Tiger. The only player since 1970 that came close was Tommy Hodson, who threw for a pair of TDs in his debut against Texas A&M in 1986. Hodson didn't throw any TD passes the following week in a 21-12 loss to Miami (Ohio).

Tigers Reach 50-Point Mark Again

For the fourth time in the last two seasons, LSU reached the 50-point mark with a 51-0 win over Mississippi State. The 51 points came just two weeks after the Tigers racked up 53 points in a 53-3 victory over Arkansas State. Last year, the Tigers beat Arizona, 53-13, and Arkansas, 55-24. In all, the Tigers have scored 50 points in a game five times under **Nick Saban**. The first time came in Saban's debut at LSU as the Tigers rolled to a 58-0 win over Western Carolina to open the 2000 season.

Margin Of Victory

LSU's 51-point margin of victory was the biggest in an SEC game for the Tigers since 1969 when LSU posted a 61-6 win over Mississippi State. It marked the largest margin of victory under **Nick Saban** since the first game of the Saban era when the Tigers beat Western Carolina, 58-0.

Russell Shined In Debut

LSU QB **JaMarcus Russell** shined in his much anticipated debut as the redshirt freshman started the second half and rallied the Tigers to an overtime win over Oregon State. Russell led the Tigers on two second half scoring drives, which included tossing a 38-yard TD pass to **Dwayne Bowe** with just over a minute left in the contest to pull the Tigers to within 15-13. Russell then tied the game with a two-point conversion that sent the game into overtime. In overtime, Russell suffered cramps to his legs and was forced out of the contest midway through LSU's possession. For the game, Russell completed 9 of 26 passes for 145 yards and 2 TDs.

Webster and Buckles Are Cap and Gown Tigers

LSU senior CB **Corey Webster** is not only an accomplished athlete on the field, but he's also done quite well in the classroom as he recently graduated with a degree in general studies. Webster is joined on the Tiger squad by LB **Dorsett Buckels**, who finished up his course work over the summer earning a degree in general studies.

Another Fourth-Quarter Comeback

LSU's comeback from a 15-7 fourth quarter deficit against Oregon State represents the sixth time under **Nick Saban** that the Tigers have rallied to win a game despite trailing in the final quarter. The last time the Tigers rallied to win in the fourth quarter came against Kentucky in 2002 when **Marcus Randall** connected with Devery Henderson on a 75-yard TD pass as time expired for a 33-30 LSU win. Over the six fourth-quarter comeback wins for the Tigers since 2000, Randall has been involved in three as he threw the game winning TD against Kentucky and Ole Miss in 2002 and then ran for the game-winning score against Oregon State in overtime. The following is a look at LSU's other fourth quarter comebacks under Saban that resulted in a victory for the Tigers:

Georgia Halts LSU's Streak Of Outrushing Opponents At 12 Straight

With 221 yards rushing against LSU, Georgia became the first team to outrush the Tigers since Florida did it on Oct. 11, 2003. Prior to the Georgia game, LSU had outrushed its opponent in 12 consecutive games.

Spears Adds Sack To Run Career Total To 11; Oliver Still At 10

LSU senior DE **Marcus Spears** ran his career sack total to 11 against Oregon State. Spears, who also forced a fumble, recovered a fumble and broke up a pass against the Beavers, finished with 5 tackles against the Beavers. Spears is now just four sacks shy of tying Corey White for 10th place on LSU's career sack list with 15. DT **Melvin Oliver** has 10 career sacks to his credit. Rydell Melancon holds the school mark with 25 career sacks from 1980-83.

Green's Caught At Least 1 Pass In 19 Straight Games

LSU junior WR **Skyler Green** ran his streak of games with at least one reception to 19 straight games in which he has played on offense with 3 catches against Georgia. Green, who did not play on offense in LSU's 3 previous games, returned to action against Georgia. As a matter of fact, Green caught at least 2 passes in 15 straight games, including all 14 of LSU's games in 2003. Green's career high for receptions came against Louisiana Tech with 9 receptions. For his career, Green has 60 receptions for 682 yards and 7 TDs.

Green Moves Into 9th Place On LSU Career Punt Return List

With a 16-yard punt return against Georgia, **Skyler Green** moved into 9th-place in LSU career punt return yards. For his career, Green has returned 28 punts for 483 yards and 2 TDs. Last year, Green led the nation in punt returns with 462 yards on 25 returns. Domanick Davis holds the school record with 1,126 yards on 94 returns from 1999-2002.

Defensive Line Shuffle

One of the philosophies of LSU coach **Nick Saban** is keeping players fresh by rotating players throughout the game. The Tigers have played the first 5 games by rotating players on the defensive line. The starters in last week's game against Georgia were **Marcus Spears** and **Melvin Oliver** at DE and **Kyle Williams** and **Glen Dorsey** at DT. Those four are spelled by DT **Claude Wroten**, DT **Ryan Willis**, DE **Kirston Pittman** and DE **Brian West**. Pittman is also on the field for LSU in third down situations.

LSU Ranks Ninth In Active NFL Players

With 33 former Tigers on active NFL rosters, LSU ranks ninth among all schools with former players currently in the NFL. Miami tops the list with 43 followed by Florida State with 39. Notre Dame and Tennessee are next with 38, followed by Florida, Georgia and Ohio State with 36 each. Michigan is next with 35, then LSU at 33.

Webster Named SEC Defensive Player of the Week

LSU CB **Corey Webster** earned SEC Defensive Player of the Week following his performance in the 51-0 win over Mississippi State. Webster, a senior from Vacherie, La., recorded two tackles, had an interception, forced a fumble and recovered a fumble in the Tiger shutout of the Bulldogs. Webster did most of his damage in the first quarter as he forced and recovered a fumble that led to LSU's second touchdown of the game. Three possessions later, Webster intercepted an Ommar Conner pass at the LSU 30-yard line. The Tigers scored seven plays later for a 20-0 lead. Webster's interception was his first of the season and 15th of his career, leaving him just five shy of tying Mike Williams for the school record of 20. The honor for Webster is the third time in his career that he's been recognized as the league's player of the week. Webster first won the award following a three interception game against Florida in 2002 and then again last year for his performance in LSU's 17-10 win over Georgia in September.

Tigers Pitch 5th Shutout Under Saban

LSU's 51-0 win over Mississippi State marked the fifth time under **Nick Saban** that the Tigers have held a team scoreless. Last week's shutout was the first for the Tigers since a 48-0 win over Louisiana-Lafayette on Oct. 5, 2002. It was the first in league play since a 42-0 win over Mississippi State on Oct. 20, 2001. I'd been warned prior to my first visit to Baton Rouge that the legendary Death Valley mystique was a myth. That assessment couldn't have been more wrong. Tiger Stadium was as loud as any I've ever heard during the dramatic fourth quarter of Saturday's Georgia game, the festivities surrounding it as advertised.

The streets were lined with purple and gold. Smoke emanated from the grills in the parking lot. Shouts of "Go Tigers" and "Tiger Bait" echoed from the stadium deep into the heart of campus.

• LSU began playing football in Tiger Stadium in 1924 and is currently in its 81st year in the venerable stadium on SATURDAY NIGHT.

• Under Nick Saban, the Tigers have posted a 26-5 HOME RECORD, including a 6-2 mark against ranked opponents. Against conference foes, Saban is 12-4 in Death Valley. In home games at night, LSU is 19-3 since Saban took over.

• LSU has won 14 OF ITS LAST 16 games at home, including a current six-game winning streak.

• More than 85,000 FANS have attended each of LSU's last 30 home games. In that span, the Tigers have eclipsed the 90,000 mark 21 times, including a school-record 92,251 for the Sept. 20, 2003 game that pitted No. 10 LSU against No. 7 Georgia. The Tigers won the game 17-10.

• Since national attendance figures began being kept in 1957, LSU has ranked in the top 20 all 45 seasons. Earthquake Game

October 8, 1988. Tommy Hodson connected with Eddie Fuller on 4-and-10 with 1:41 to play for the game-winning touchdown as LSU upset No. 4 Auburn. The play caused such a thunderous explosion from the crowd of 79,341 that the tremor caused by the vibrations measured on the seismograph across campus.

Halloween Night

October 31, 1959. No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss, 3-0, late in the fourth quarter when Billy Cannon fielded a punt off the bounce at the 11-yard line. He raced 89 yards, careening off seven Rebel defenders, to paydirt to give the Tigers victory and all but clinch the 1959 Heisman Trophy.

Flat Tigers Fall to Florida, 19-7

A flat LSU football team couldn't overcome a series of penalties and a key injury to starting running back Joseph Addai as the Tigers dropped their first game of the season to Florida, 19-7, in Tiger Stadium. The Tigers actually scored the first points of the game as Skyler Green, subbing for an injured Shyrone Carey, returned a first quarter punt 80-yards for a touchdown and a 7-0 LSU lead. Florida responded with a 13-play drive to tie the game at 7-7 on a 22-yard pass from Chris Leak to Ran Carthon. The Gators took the lead for good at 10-7 on a 29-yard field goal by Matt Leach at the 3:17 mark in the first quarter. The Gators led 13-7 at halftime after another field goal by Leach. Florida extended its lead to 19-7 on a 35-yard pass from Leak to Ciatrick Fason with 5:21 left in the third quarter. The Tigers had a couple of chances to get back in the game negated, one by a penalty and another on a fumble. A penalty wiped out a 42-yard pass from Matt Mauck to Michael Clayton in the third quarter that would have given the Tigers the ball at the Florida 28-yard line. Then late in the fourth quarter with the game still in doubt, Mauck hit Devery Henderson in stride with a pass to the Florida 31-yard line, which he then fumbled away at the UF 14-yard line. For the game, the Tigers sacked Leak six times and forced another Florida turnover on the LSU 1-yard line. Mauck completed 19 of 33 passes for 231 yards and a pair of interceptions, while Leak led Florida with 18 of 30 passing for 229 yards and 2 TDs.

Pair of QBs Lead LSU To 22-21 OT Win Over Oregon State

JaMarcus Russell started the comeback and then Marcus Randall finished it as the Tigers rallied from an 8-point deficit with less than two minutes remaining to force overtime and eventually beat Oregon State, 22-21, in Tiger Stadium in the season-opener for both teams. Trailing 9-0 at halftime, Russell replaced an ineffective Randall and pulled the Tigers to within 9-7 late in the third quarter on a 16-yard TD pass to Skyler Green. OSU answered with a 9-play, 65-yard drive to extend its margin to 15-7. The score remained that way until Russell rallied the Tigers on a 4-play, 64-yard drive capped with a 38-yard TD strike to Dwayne Bowe. Russell then converted the two-point conversion to tie the score at 15-15 with just over a minute left. In overtime and with Russell out with cramps, Randall returned to the field and scored on a 5-yard run to give LSU its first lead at 22-15. OSU followed with a TD of its own, however the extra-point attempt sailed wide right, the third missed PAT for the Beavers, and the Tigers escaped with a 22-21 win. For the game, Russell completed 9 of 26 passes for 145 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall was 7 of 18 for 66 yards and 1 interception. Vincent led the Tigers with 48 yards rushing, while Bowe caught 5 passes for 103 yards and a score.

Tigers Overpower Arkansas State, 53-3

Justin Vincent rushed for 102 yards and 2 TDs and three LSU quarterbacks combined to hit on 12 of 20 passes for 210 yards and 3 scores as the Tigers rolled to a 53-3 win over Arkansas State in Tiger Stadium. LSU wasted little time in establishing itself as the dominant team as the Tigers took the opening kickoff and marched 54 yards in 6 plays for a 7-0 lead following a 5-yard TD run by Vincent just two minutes into the contest. The Indians fumbled the ensuing kickoff and three plays later, Marcus Randall found Corey Webster for a 6-yard TD pass running the score to 13-0. From there, the route was on as the Tigers extended their lead to 23-0 after the first quarter and 37-0 at halftime. Arkansas State got on the board midway through the third quarter with a 34-yard field goal. LSU responded with a pair of touchdowns in a 3-minute span to stretch the lead to 50-3. Ryan Gaudet added a 33-yard field goal in the fourth quarter for the final margin. For the game, the Tigers limited ASU to just 54 yards rushing and only 201 yards of offense. JaMarcus Russell led all LSU quarterbacks by connecting on 7 of 11 passes for 151 yards and 2 TDs, while Randall hit on 5 of 7 for 59 yards and one score. Craig Davis led the Tigers with 4 catches for 73 yards, while Dwayne Bowe caught a pair of TD passes.

Auburn Scores Late To Hand LSU A 10-9 Defeat

Jason Campbell connected with Courtney Taylor on a 16-yard TD pass with just over a minute left to lift 14th-ranked Auburn to a 10-9 win over No. 4 LSU. The victory by Auburn snapped LSU's 10-game winning streak, one that dated back to a 33-7 win over South Carolina last October. The Auburn TD capped a contest that saw the LSU defense hold Auburn in check, limiting the Tigers to just 301 yards of offense, including only 131 yards on the ground. The LSU defense held Auburn's running back tandem of Carnell Williams (75 yards) and Ronnie Brown (67 yards) to 142 combined yards, 70 yards below their season average. LSU appeared to be in good shape early in the contest, taking the opening kickoff and marching 80 yards on 14 plays for a 6-0 lead following a Marcus Randall 9-yard TD pass to Dwayne Bowe. LSU's Ryan Gaudet pushed the PAT wide right, a point that would come back to haunt LSU. Auburn responded with a 14-play drive of its own that ended with a field goal. LSU, with JaMarcus Russell at QB, answered right back, going 55 yards on eight plays, capped with a 42-yard Chris Jackson field goal. That's all the scoring either team would get until the final minutes of the contest. LSU did have its chances in the second half, getting inside the Auburn 35-yard line twice, but the Tigers failed to capitalize on the opportunity. Alley Broussard led all running back with 84 yards on 10 carries, while Randall and Russell combined to hit on 12 of 28 passes for 168 yards and a TD.

Tigers Score Early And Often In 51-0 Rout Of Mississippi State

Alley Broussard scored a career-best 3 TDs, all in the first 17 minutes of the game, as the Tigers racked up 599 yards of offense in rolling to a 51-0 win over Mississippi State in Tiger Stadium. LSU set the tone early in the contest going 74 yards on 7 plays, five of which were runs, for a 7-0 lead just three minutes into the game. Following a MSU fumble on its first possession, the Tigers need only 6 plays to go 18 yards for a 14-0 lead midway through the first quarter. From there, the route was on as the Tigers built a 27-0 lead early in the second quarter following a 35-yard interception return for a TD by Marcus Spears. LSU led 34-0 at halftime. In the second half, the Tigers stretched the margin to 41-0 on an 8-yard run by QB JaMarcus Russell and then 48-0 on a 67-yard TD reception by Xavier Carter. For the contest, LSU picked up 31 first downs, while limiting MSU to just 7. LSU also held MSU to only 130 yards of offense, while intercepting a season-high 4 passes. The 51-point margin of victory was the biggest by LSU in an SEC game since a 61-6 win over Mississippi State in 1969. It was also LSU's first shutout since a 42-0 win over Mississippi State in 2001.

Greene Passes Georgia Past LSU, 45-16

David Greene threw 5 touchdown passes as third-ranked Georgia, behind a pair of first half LSU turnovers, raced out to a 24-0 lead midway through the second quarter and never looked back in a 45-16 win over the Tigers in Athens. Trailing 24-0, LSU mounted a rally that pulled the Tigers to within 24-10 at half-time. First, JaMarcus Russell guided the Tigers on a 7-play, 80-yard drive, capped with an 18-yard TD strike to Dwayne Bow with 1:23 left before halftime. After holding Georgia to three plays and out on its next series, the Tigers quickly moved 24 yards in two plays setting up a 31-yard field goal by Chris Jackson as time expired in the first half pulling LSU to within 24-10. With an apparent momentum swing towards LSU, the Tigers got the ball to start the second half and moved all the way to the UGA 34-yard line before the drive stalled out. From there, LSU could muster little offense as the Bulldogs stretched their lead to 31-10 at the 5:12 mark on a Greene-to-Fred Gibson pass. LSU wouldn't get any closer the rest of the way. The Tigers did close the contest with an 8-play, 80-yard TD drive engineered by QB Marcus Randall. For the contest, LSU managed only 314 yards of offense, compared to 430 for the Bulldogs. Russell led LSU by hitting on 9 of 17 passes for 131 yards and 1 TD, while Alley Broussard rushed for 45 yards in his first career start.
