Key series: LSU plays its third consecutive series against divisional foes this weekend when it visits the plains of Auburn.

- The Tigers are still after their first SEC series victory since sweeping Alabama last April in Tuscaloosa.
- The Tigers lost to the New Orleans Zephyrs in an exhibition game on Wednesday, 8-3, but have won their last two games over Mississippi St. on Saturday and New Orleans on Tuesday.
- The Tigers' 3-5 mark in SEC play is their poorest after eight games since being 3-5 in Skip Bertman's first season of 1984.
- Since the sweep of Alabama last year, LSU is 4-10 in league competition.
- After this weekend, the Tigers will play four of their next five series against the SEC East, beginning next weekend against Georgia. The Tigers' remaining Western series are at home against Arkansas (Apr. 26-28) and Alabama (May 17-19).

Scouting Auburn: Auburn is 23-8 overall and one game behind Alabama in the SEC West at 5-4.

- Auburn picked up a pair of midweek wins, beating Mercer 3-2 at home on Tuesday and winning 6-1 on Wednesday at South Alabama.
- Auburn is one of three SEC teams to make a regional in each of the previous five years, along with LSU and Mississippi St.
- The Tigers feature a pair of dangerous .400 hitters in catcher Bobby Huddleston (.437) and shortstop Jonathan Schuerholz (.411), the son of Atlanta Braves G.M. John Schuerholz.
- Pitcher Eric Brandon, who will start on Sunday, threw a nine-inning perfect game against Murray St. on Mar. 2.

About the Series: Auburn won two of three last year in Skip Bertman's final SEC series, but LSU still holds a 67-57 all-time edge.

- LSU won the opening game last year, 20-5, but fell 7-5 and 9-7 in the final two games, as Auburn won both games with late-inning rallies. Prior to last year, Auburn hadn't won a game in Baton Rouge since 1995.
- The visiting team has won the last two series, as LSU scored 18-11 and 12-10 victories in 2000 at Auburn, with the hosts claiming a 7-1 victory in the series' middle game.
- In five of the last six games at Auburn, the winning team has scored at least 11 runs.
- LSU coach Skip Bertman won his 700th career game in 1998 with an 11-8, 12-inning victory at Plainsman Park.
- LSU swept Auburn in 1999 at Baton Rouge and in 1994 at Auburn's old Plainsman Park.
- Auburn is the last SEC team to sweep LSU at Alex Box Stadium, doing so in 1988. The only other team to sweep in Baton Rouge since then is Houston in 2000.

Lane Mestepey's last appearance against Auburn wasn't so pleasant, as he took the loss in relief in Skip Bertman's final regular season home game. Mestepey moves back to the Friday night spot in the rotation and takes on Auburn junior right-hander Levale Speigner (6-2, 2.84)

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS

2002: 5-2 with a 3.60 ERA in 60.0 innings with two complete games.

- Did not allow a walk over a span of 33.0 innings from Feb. 23 to Mar. 23.
- Giving up an average of 1.35 walks per nine innings.
- Walked none in 6.1 innings to improve to 5-2 with win over Mississippi St. (Mar. 30).
- Picked up second complete game victory at Ole Miss (Mar. 23) despite walking a career-high five batters.

- Named the national Freshman of the Year by Collegiate Baseball and was a third team All-American by the same publication.
- Named the 2001 SEC Freshman of the Year and was a first team All-SEC selection.
- Allowed two or fewer earned runs in 11 of 19 starts.
- Yielded only 2.39 walks per nine innings.

Momentum to build on

For the first time in over three weeks, LSU enters a game riding a winning streak.

The Tigers come to Auburn after defeating Mississippi St. last Saturday and New Orleans on Tuesday, the first time LSU has won back-to-back games since a three-game sweep of Louisiana-Monroe March 8-10. Since that sweep, LSU has gone 5-7, including a three-game losing streak Mar. 16-19.

LSU has put together winning streaks five times this year, with the longest being a four-game stretch from Feb. 15-20 when the Tigers swept three games from Mercer, then defeated Centenary.

In 2001, LSU had three winning streaks of six or more games, including a 10-game stretch from Feb. 17 to Mar. 3.

Looking for first SEC series win

The Tigers' four-series SEC losing streak may have ended last weekend, but the Tigers' winless streak is now at five after the two-game split with Mississippi St.

This marks the longest LSU has gone without winning an SEC series since 1981, when the Tigers didn't win one until the next to last series of the year with a 2-1 win over Ole Miss. That was LSU's only SEC series win in a 23-30 campaign.

From 1982-2001, LSU won its opening SEC series 16 times, and in the years they did not win it, they won their second SEC series.

The only team with a longer SEC series drought is Kentucky, who has lost their last seven conference series dating to last year. The other ten conference teams have won at least one series in either the final two sets of 2001 or the first three of this year.

First time for everything

This weekend's series marks the first time LSU coach Smoke Laval will face Auburn. The Tigers of the Plains were the only SEC West team Laval did not face in his seven-year tenure at UL-Monroe.



Hill earns LSWA honor, homers again
Tuesday was quite a day for LSU shortstop Aaron Hill. In the morning, he was named the Louisiana Sportswriters' Association Player of the Week, as he went 9-for-13 with 8 RBI in the Tigers' three games the previous week, highlighted by a 3-for-4 effort at SLU last Tuesday and a 4-for-5 game against Mississippi St. on Saturday.

Hill is the second LSU player to win LSWA honors this year. Lane Mestepey was named Pitcher of the Week after his outings against Long Beach St. and UL-Monroe in March.

On Tuesday night, his six-game hitting streak was about to go by the wayside against UNO, but Hill took a page from Wally Pontiff's book to keep it alive.

Hill extended his streak to seven games with a two-run home run in the eighth inning of LSU's 8-1 victory. Hill is now batting .552 (16-for-29) with 12 RBI during the streak, leaving his season average at .368, just six points behind Pontiff's team leading total of .374. Hill enters the Auburn series as the second-leading hitter in conference games with a .485 average.

After waiting 30 games between his last home run last year and his first home run of 2002, Hill has now hit home runs in back-to-back games for the first time in his career. Six of Hill's hits during the streak have been for extra bases (four doubles and two home runs).

Steady Sean

Aaron Hill may be the hottest hitter for the Tigers right now, but Sean Barker has been consistent throughout the year in giving the Tigers an offensive spark.

The senior right fielder was at it again on Tuesday, going 3-for-3 with 3 RBI in the win over UNO, collecting a two-run double in the first and an infield hit in the third that gave LSU all the runs it would need. The game was Barker's fifth three-hit game of 2002, but his first since Mar. 15 against Vanderbilt.

Barker currently is third on the Tigers with a .355 batting average, but his season mark hasn't fallen below .333 all year.

Now, Barker looks to increase his run production on the road. Barker is hitting a solid .325 away from Baton Rouge, but he has collected only 4 of his 28 RBI on the road.

Shuffling the deck

LSU will reshuffle its pitching rotation this weekend, moving Lane Mestepey from his usual Saturday slot to Friday, moving Bo Pettit from Friday to Sunday and moving freshman left-hander Jason Vargas to Saturday. Jake Tompkins, who had been the Tigers' normal Sunday starter, will likely remain in the bullpen.

Ironically, it wasn't until the fourth SEC series of 2001 that Mestepey was moved to the Friday night slot, and when he was moved there, he responded by throwing a complete game in defeating Kentucky.

Pettit gets confidence, new role

Giving up 14 runs in 7.1 innings over two outings will shatter any pitcher's confidence.

Instead of shrinking at the opportunity to start on Tuesday against UNO, Bo Pettit instead took the opportunity to regain lost confidence.

The Houston native needed just 55 pitches to work 4.0 scoreless innings, yielding just two hits as the Tigers went on to an 8-1 victory.

Like most pitchers, Pettit has been two different people when he wins and loses. In his three wins this year, Pettit has given up a total of zero earned runs and has struck out 26 in 20.2 innings. In his four losses, Pettit has yielded 32 hits and 25 runs (17 earned) in 20.1 innings for a 7.52 ERA, giving up 17 walks and striking out only 14.

As mentioned above, Pettit will move from Friday to Sunday in the starting rotation this weekend against Auburn.

Lineup Watch

LSU has now used 28 different lineups in 30 games this season. However, there are signs of stability, as four of the nine spots in the order have remained unchanged over the last seven games, with Aaron Hill batting second, Wally Pontiff third, Sean Barker fourth and Chris Phillips eighth. With Auburn throwing three right-handed pitchers this weekend, there is a possibility Smoke Laval will stick with a single lineup for all three games as he did at Ole Miss two weeks ago.



Vargas moves into rotation

When he hit his pinch-hit grand slam back in February to defeat Mercer, it was thought Jason Vargas' freshman year would be spent mostly at the plate rather than on the mound.

After two superb relief performances, however, Vargas will find himself thrust into the spotlight when he takes the hill on Saturday at Auburn.

The California native continued his superior mound work on Tuesday against UNO, shutting off a Privateer rally and going on to throw 2.2 hitless innings in an 8-1 LSU win. He could have qualified for the save, but the Tigers opted instead to give Jake Tompkins an inning of work in a one-sided game.

Vargas picked up his first win of his career on Mar. 26 at Southeastern Louisiana, working 5.0 innings and giving up two runs on two hits in a 9-7 triumph. For the year, Vargas is 1-1 with a 3.07 ERA in seven appearances totaling 14.2 innings.

Tigers find positives in loss to Zephyrs

The scoreboard may have read New Orleans Zephyrs 8, LSU 3 after Wednesday's exhibition game before 10,042 at Zephyr Field, but the Tigers can take several positives out of the game with the 2001 Pacific Coast League champions despite committing six errors. Here are a few who stood out:

Matt Heath—The Tigers' senior outfielder is hitting just .175 (7-for-40) against left-handed pitching, but on Wednesday, Heath was 3-for-4, with all three hits coming from the right side.

David Shank—Shank took the loss, but considering he was facing Triple-A hitting after throwing a total of 1.2 innings in his career, giving up one earned run on three hits in 3.0 innings is pretty good. Shank retired the final seven batters he faced after a slow start.

Lukas Guidroz—Guidroz has struggled most of the year, but threw two shutout innings and yielded just two singles.

Justin Hill—Hill hasn't pitched in nearly a calendar year, but threw a 1-2-3 eighth inning.

Billy Brian—Brian, like Hill, hasn't pitched all year, but he pitched the sixth inning and gave up a pair of unearned runs.

Tigers in search of RISP groove

As has been the case every weekend, LSU will be looking for something it hasn't been able to find much of in 2002, and that's a key hit with runners in scoring position.

LSU is still hitting just .268 with RISP this year, including a 5-for-18 effort with RBI opportunities in Tuesday's win over New Orleans. In the eight SEC games LSU has played this year, the average with RISP drops to .259.

Last year, LSU hit .327 with RISP, which is 59 points higher than this year's average but still 27 points lower than the 2000 team's .355 mark, which was a large component of the Tigers' fifth national championship team.

Looking for a guy to hit with RISP? Look no further than the Tigers' hottest hitter, Aaron Hill. Hill is the Tigers' leading batter with RISP at .375 (12-for-32), and he's hitting .462 (6-for-13) with RBI opportunities in SEC games. Sean Barker is second overall in this category at .317, but in SEC games, he's just 1-for-11, so he along with the rest of the Tigers will be looking to crank it up a notch on the plains.

LSU leads the way with 11 big-leaguers. LSU's legacy of excellence continues in major league baseball, as 11 former protégés of legendary coach Skip Bertman began 2002 on big league rosters, the most of any SEC school.

Leading the way on opening day was Cincinnati Reds second baseman Todd Walker, as the three-time LSU All-American (1992-94) went 3-for-4 with a double and a home run in the Reds' 5-4 victory over the Cubs. Walker

The other former Tigers on big league rosters in addition to Walker are LHP Mark Guthrie (Mets), LHP Randy Keisler (Yankees), RHP Curtis Leskanic (Brewers), RHP Kurt Ainsworth (Giants), RHP Paul Byrd (Royals), IF Russ Johnson (Devil Rays), OF Armando Rios (Pirates), 2B Warren Morris (Twins), IF Jeff Reboulet (Dodgers) and C Keith Osik (Pirates).

In all, a total of 39 players representing all 11 of the 12 SEC schools (Georgia was the only exception) were on opening-day rosters.

OF Jay Mattox—Mattox, a true freshman from Arkansas, suffered a torn ligament in his wrist after sliding during practice in February. Like Determann, he opted for season-ending surgery and will receive a medical redshirt.

RHP Chad Vaught—Vaught has started just once this year, striking out eight in 6.0 innings against SLU on Feb. 12, but then went on the shelf just before his scheduled start at Centenary (the one Determann made) due to a sore shoulder. He pitched in the bullpen in the game against SLU in Hammond, but has yet to appear in a second contest this year. His status is uncertain.

C Dustin Weaver—Weaver will not make the trip to Auburn due to a pulled hamstring. He has not played since Mar. 23 at Ole Miss.

RHP Justin Hill—Hill threw for the first time in a game in nearly a year on Wednesday against the Zephyrs. He will not dress this week, but could see time in midweek games later this month.

LSU coach Smoke Laval
 Ray "Smoke" Laval may be following a legend at LSU in Skip Bertman, but Laval is no stranger to the LSU program, having served 10 years (1984-93) under Bertman as his top assistant and as a graduate assistant to Jack Lamabe (1979) before that.

Laval, who was named Bertman's successor on July 18, 2000, came back to Baton Rouge after seven successful seasons at Louisiana-Monroe. Laval guided the Indians to a 241-159 record from 1994-2000 and led ULM to three NCAA regional appearances, including the regional final in 2000 against LSU. He was named the Southland Conference Coach of the year in 1999 and led the Indians to the SLC crown in 1999 and 2000.

During Laval's tenure as Bertman's top assistant, LSU won 483 games, reached the College World Series five times, and won the national championship in 1991 and 1993. Laval worked with 24 future major league players during that time and recruited nine first-team All-Americans.

On deck for next week.

A renewal of an ancient rivalry in an unfamiliar setting and the end of the first half of SEC play highlight a busy week.

The Tigers will face Tulane Wednesday in the Superdome. LSU lost to the Green Wave 6-5 on March 5 at Alex Box Stadium, giving Tulane five of the last six meetings between the schools dating to last year. Now, the two old rivals will meet in the "world's largest room" for the first time ever in baseball in hopes of shattering the NCAA attendance records. The record for a single regular-season game is 21,043 for a Texas-TCU game in 1996 at the Ballpark in Arlington, while the record for a two-game College World Series session is 24,859 set when Miami played Alabama and Rice played Oklahoma State in 1999. The two schools last met in the Superdome for football in 1994 and basketball in 1980.

LSU returns home to host Georgia in an SEC series this weekend. The Bulldogs have won two of three from LSU each of the last two years, but LSU won every series except one (1987) between 1986 when the league resumed round-robin play, and 1999. Of course, Georgia had Ron Polk in its dugout the last two years, and with Polk back in Starkville, it's now up to young David Perno to keep up UGA's success against the Tigers. The series with the Bulldogs begins a stretch where LSU will play four series with the SEC East in a five-week span; the lone break is a home series in late April with border rival Arkansas.
