The Next Step

A new sense of expectation welcomes head coach Brian Lee as he enters his third season at the helm of the LSU soccer program as he leads a young team that is poised to take the next step and contend for its first ever trip to the NCAA Tournament in 2007. The Tigers will compete with their most talented roster in the program's 13-year history and one of the top squads in the Southeastern Conference as they return 18 letterwinners and all 11 starters from a year ago.

"We're excited about the potential of this year's team and what it has the opportunity to accomplish in 2007," Lee said. "We're still a very young team, but we're more experienced after our large sophomore class played a lot of minutes for us as freshmen a year ago. I believe we have the parts in place with our returning players and some key newcomers to step on the field and contend for the SEC West and overall SEC titles this season."

Leading the way for the Tigers this fall is one of the SEC's top returning goal-scoring tandems in junior Roslyn Jones and sophomore Michelle Makasini. The duo combined to score 20 goals and 10 assists for 50 points in 2006 and will look to lead the Tigers' offensive attack once again this season. Sophomore Rachel Yenez also looks to figure into the equation as she was the team's third-leading scorer a year ago with five goals and 13 points.

"I believe we have the talent up top to create a lot of problems for opposing backlines this year," Lee said. "Roslyn and Rachel really started to develop chemistry during the spring as our primary forwards, and Michelle was one of the top goal-scoring threats in this league last year as a freshman. She'll once again play an attacking role in the midfield for us in 2007."

While the Tigers look to have a fierce scoring punch up top this fall, they will also feature one of the deepest and most talented midfield units in the SEC led by a trio of returning starters in sophomores Melissa Clarke, Katherine Lagow and Malorie Rutledge.

"We're looking forward to having Melissa back after missing most of last season," Lee said. "She's one of the best players in the country and should be back at 100 percent in the fall. When you add her to the likes of Katherine Lagow in the middle, Malorie Rutledge on the wing and Amanda Carreno also in the mix, then it's easy to see how we have the potential to have one of the top midfield units in the SEC this season."

Lee said he's also excited about the potential the Tigers have along the back line this season as the unit will be led by a number of returning standouts in senior Caroline Vanderpool, junior Casey Crawford and rising sophomore Chelsea Potts. Senior Valerie Vogler also provides stability between the posts after making 13 starts in goal for the Tigers last season.

Vanderpool is just one of three seniors on the roster, and she is coming off a banner year in which she was a starting outside back on the U-20 Canadian National Team at

the 2006 FIFA U-20 Women's World Championships. Potts enjoyed similar success as she established herself as one of the top young center backs in the country after being named a Freshman All-American, a Second-Team All-SEC selection and a member of the SEC All-Freshman Team.

"We're also very confident in the players we have coming back along the backline and in goal for us this fall," Lee said. "Last year was a little bit of a learning experience for this unit because we were starting as many as three freshmen in the back. They've matured over the past year and through the spring, and Caroline and Chelsea have proven why they are two of the best players at their positions in this league."

These returning stars welcome six newcomers to this year's team who look to challenge for starting spots as well as provide valuable depth at each position on the field. Leading the way are sophomore transfers Sarah Benson and Lindsay Lum, and incoming freshman Taryne Boudreau.

Lum looks to challenge for a starting spot in the midfield as she has transferred to LSU from Arizona after being named a Soccer Buzz Top 75 Recruit as a member of the Class of 2006. Boudreau will also help the Tigers establish one of the top midfield units in the SEC this season as she comes to LSU with an extensive international pedigree that includes stints on the U-16, U-18 and U-20 Canadian National Teams.

"The goal for this class was to tweak our solid nucleus of returning players with two or three elite-level recruits. We certainly did that this spring," Lee said. "Bringing in elite talent is a prerequisite to winning SEC championships, and in three recruiting cycles we've put ourselves in a position to achieve great things this season."

The Tigers kick off the season with nine non-conference games highlighted by a trip to Austin, Texas, on Sept. 18 to take on nationally-ranked Texas. The Longhorns proved to be one of the nation's top teams a year ago as they were awarded a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament before advancing to the Sweet 16.

In the SEC, the Tigers welcome such perennial NCAA Tournament teams as Ole Miss and Tennessee to the LSU Soccer Complex, while they must go on the road to take on the likes of Auburn, Florida, Kentucky and Vanderbilt in one of the more difficult road schedules in the league this season.

"We've put together a non-conference schedule that will serve dual purposes for our team this season," Lee said. "It'll prepare us for the rigors of SEC play and will also put us in position to receive an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament at the end of the season. With five of our eight opponents coming from the ACC, Big 12 and Conference USA, we feel like this non-conference schedule will test our team and get us ready to make a run in the SEC."

"We know that every SEC game is going to be a battle for us this year. There's tremendous parity in the league right now. That was evident by the way the SEC race played out last year. The SEC is becoming a major player on the national stage, and we have a great amount of respect for everyone that competes in this league."

There's no question that the 2007 LSU soccer season is one that coaches, players and fans alike have anticipated since last November and could prove to be the springboard the team needs to catapult itself to the top of the SEC and be a postseason staple for years to come. Lee is committed to leading the Tigers to the pinnacle of college soccer as he seeks, "to build a program that annually contends for the SEC, qualifies for the NCAA College Cup and competes to win a National Championship."

Forwards

Junior Roslyn Jones and sophomore Rachel Yopez are poised to wreak havoc on opposing backlines during the 2007 season after solidifying their place in the Tigers' starting lineup following a strong spring campaign.

Jones made a smooth transition to the frontline a year ago after starting 17 games as an outside back during her freshman season in 2005. She was the team's second-leading scorer on the season with nine goals and three assists for 21 points, while also leading the way in SEC play with six goals and 14 points in conference action. For her efforts, Jones was named a Second-Team All-SEC selection following the season.

Yopez gave Tiger fans a glimpse of why she was one of the most highly recruited

forwards in the country for the Class of 2006 while displaying flashes of brilliance during her true freshman season. She wrapped up the season as the team's third-leading scorer with five goals and 13 points, but it has been her commitment to fitness during the off-season that has Lee believing she is ready to be an impact forward in the SEC.

"Roslyn and Rachel have solidified starting spots along the frontline, and they really started to establish a great chemistry together during the spring season," Lee said. "It's easy to see just by watching them play that they have a great rapport with one another. They just seem to set the tone for our entire team with their intense work ethic, and they come to play every time they step on the field."

While Jones and Yopez provide the Tigers a solid 1-2 punch in the starting lineup, they are not without quality depth at the position as sophomores Amanda Carreno and Kathleen Walsh look to make an impact coming off the bench. In addition, senior Sara Pollock will provide the unit with vital leadership as she is just one of three seniors returning to the roster in 2007.

"We feel like we have the depth in place at that position where we will feel little drop off when Roslyn and Rachel are not in the game," Lee said. "Amanda is a really creative and attacking player who can score from anywhere inside 30 yards, and Kat is able to use her speed to cause problems for opponents. We're excited about the potential that this unit has in 2007."

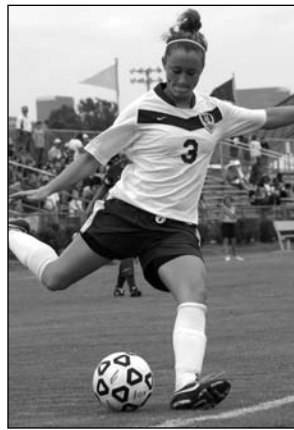

Midfielders

Perhaps the most talented position on the field for the Tigers will be in the midfield as sophomore Michelle Makasini returns after leading the team in scoring a year ago with 11 goals and 29 points in her rookie season. This tied an LSU freshman scoring record as she was named a Soccer Buzz Freshman All-American, a member of the Top Drawer Soccer All-Rookie Team and a member of the SEC All-Freshman Team for her efforts.

Joining Makasini will be the likes of sophomores Melissa Clarke, Veronica Godbolt, Katherine Lagow and Malorie Rutledge. Clarke - an All-SEC performer as a freshman in 2005 - looks to return to top form as she saw her 2006 season cut short due to a severe knee injury. Rutledge was also named a member of the SEC All-Freshman Team along with Makasini, while Lagow showed last season why she is one of the top

young center midfielders in the country.

"I am very excited about the talent and depth we have returning in the midfield this season," Lee said. "We feel like we have eight or nine players who will be in the playing rotation, which will give us a number of options in the offensive attack. I don't think there's any doubt that this unit has the potential to be one of the best in the country in 2007."

Lee is even more excited about the potential of this unit after adding the services of a pair of potential stars in sophomore transfer Lindsay Lum and incoming freshman Taryne Boudreau.

Lum comes to LSU after spending her freshman season at Arizona as she was a Soccer Buzz Top 75 Recruit for the Class of 2006. Boudreau has also earned distinction from Soccer Buzz Magazine as she was

named a Top International Recruit for the Class of 2007 as she has earned extensive international experience as a member of the U-20 Canadian National Team over the past year. Sophomore Sarah Benson and freshman Nazily Alcoser look to provide quality depth to this unit during the 2007 campaign.

"We felt like Taryne was quite possibly the top Canadian player to accept a scholarship to a Division I program for the Class of 2007," Lee said. "She's a difference maker on the field, and we're excited that she'll be a part of this program for the next four years. We're also excited about adding a player of Lindsay's caliber to this year's team. She'll step in right away and compete for a starting spot as she solidifies the unit as one of the most talented in the country."

Defenders

Sophomore Chelsea Potts established herself as one of the top young center backs in the country with her outstanding play during her rookie season, and she is poised to lead a defensive backline that returns all four starters who combined for a total of 74 starts a year ago.

Potts joined Makasini in becoming the first Tigers in the program's 13-year history to receive All-America accolades as she was named a Soccer Buzz Freshman All-American last fall, while she was also honored as a member of the Top Drawer Soccer All-Rookie Team, a Second-Team All-SEC selection and a member of the SEC All-Freshman Team.

"We as a coaching staff were not surprised

by the emergence of Chelsea Potts last season," Lee said. "We identified her as one of the nation's top defenders as a part of our signing class last year, and she definitely showed why she was considered one of the top players in the country coming out of high school. She's on track to have a great career here at LSU."

Potts will be joined on the outside by senior stalwart Caroline Vanderpool, who has been a starting outside back on the U-20 Canadian National Team for more than a year. Vanderpool represented her country at the FIFA U-20 Women's World Championships in Moscow, Russia, last summer, while she has appeared in a total of 12 international friendly

matches at the U-20 level since January 2006.

"Caroline brings a wealth of experience and international pedigree to our team," Lee said. "As a coach, it's nice to have the flexibility to insert a world-class player into any one of eight spots in the midfield or at the back and know you're going to get a top performance."

Rounding out the starting rotation along the backline will be junior Casey Crawford and sophomore Nikki Bush as each started all 20 matches for the Tigers a season ago. In addition, sophomores Brittany Lowe and Kennedy Richards will come off the bench to solidify depth at the position for the Tigers this fall.

With a wealth of experience returning from a year ago, the Tigers are also looking for improved play from their goalkeepers in the fall. Senior Valerie Vogler and junior Jackie Moseley return with starting experience in the SEC and give the Tigers the depth needed to keep opposing teams off the scoreboard in 2007.

"We as a coaching staff feel like we have two experienced goalkeepers who have shown that they can compete in the SEC," Lee said. "Both Jackie and Valerie have played a lot of minutes for LSU during their careers and have proven that they can get the job done and win in the Southeastern Conference. They will play a major role in our success this season."

Vogler is penciled in as the top returning

goalkeeper as she earned the start in 13 of 14 matches in which she appeared in 2006. The St. Louis native recorded a career high four shutouts a year ago with a goals against average of 1.14, and she will also be looked upon to provide the Tigers with valuable leadership as she is one of just three seniors returning to this year's team.

Moseley has been a key contributor for the Tigers in her two seasons in Baton Rouge as she has compiled six shutouts during that span while making 26 starts in her career. She started seven games between the posts a year ago. Incoming freshmen Cristiana Boutte and Amy Lester will provide the Tigers with valuable depth at the position.

Goalkeepers coach Daniel Brizard agrees

with Lee's assessment of the position and is excited to have the opportunity to coach two keepers with the pedigree of Moseley and Vogler.

"Val showed last year that she has the ability to become one of the top goalkeepers in the SEC as a senior this season," Brizard said. "We're also looking for her to be a leader on and off the field, and we believe she is more than capable of filling that role."

"We're also counting on Jackie to perform at her best. She's been a key contributor in goal for us for the last two years, and we're looking for her to have a big junior season. She's a great teammate on the field and an even better person off the field and is everything we look for in a student-athlete here at LSU."

The 2007 Southeastern Conference Soccer Tournament will feature the top eight teams from the slate of 12 league squads. The conference is divided into Eastern and Western divisions with the top team from each division will be seeded No. 1 and No. 2 based on conference records. Seeds No. 3 through No. 8 will be determined by conference winning percentage, regardless of division. Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, South Carolina, Tennessee and Vanderbilt comprise the Eastern Division, while Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, LSU, Ole Miss and Mississippi State make up the Western Division.

2007 NCAA Women's Soccer Tournament

The NCAA will select 64 teams from the more than 280 schools that sponsor Division I women's soccer to compete in the 2006 NCAA Tournament. The following 28 conferences will receive an automatic bid into the field: America East, Atlantic Coast, Atlantic 10, Atlantic Sun, Big East, Big Sky, Big Ten, Big South, Big West, Colonial Athletic Association, Conference USA, Horizon League, Ivy League, Metro Atlantic Athletic, Mid-American, Mid-Continent, Missouri Valley, Mountain West, Northeast, Ohio Valley, Pacific 10, Patriot League, Southeastern, Southern, Southland, West Coast and Western Athletic. The remaining 36 teams will receive at-large bids based on their performance during the season.

The tournament's first and second rounds are scheduled for Nov. 16 and 18 at regional sites yet to be determined. The third round will be held at undetermined sites from Nov. 23-25 with the quarterfinals following one week later from Nov. 30-31. The ninth-annual NCAA Women's College Cup will be hosted by Texas A&M in College Station, Texas, with the semifinals on Friday, Dec. 7 and the championship game on Sunday, Dec. 9 at the Aggie Soccer Stadium.

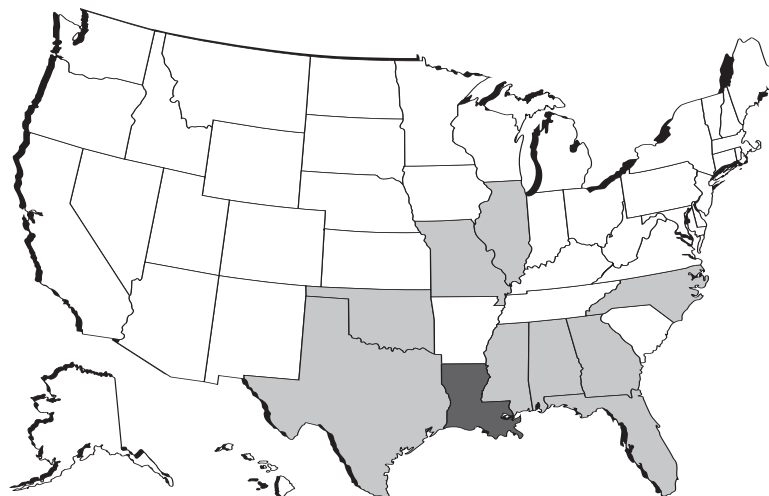
