MEDIA INFORMATION

The 2014-15 LSU swimming and diving media guide was written to provide members of the media with statistics and information needed to cover the LSU swimming and diving teams. If you need further information or wish to setup an interview with head swimming coach David Geyer, head diving coach Doug Shaffer, assistant coaches Chris Ip or Jeana Fucillo as well as any of the student-athletes, please contact Brandon Berrio in the LSU Sports Information Department at (225) 578-8226/bberri1@lsu.edu

Team practices are open to the media, usually beginning at 2 p.m., and concluding around 4 p.m. Co-head coaches David Geyer and Doug Shaffer reserve the right to close practices at their discretion. Members of the media should contact Berrio at least one day in advance if they plan to attend practice. Members of the media with video cameras are only allowed to shoot practice in the grandstands on the east side of the natatorium (side closest to the tennis courts) or in the bleachers in front of the diving well near the west side entrance. Interviews are typically conducted following the conclusion of practice.

Admission to all LSU home meets is free, and no credential access is needed. Members of the media are asked to enter through the front entrance and sit in the grandstands on the east side. Meet notes will be provided on a table near the front entrance. Post-meet interviews will normally be conducted following the meet in front of the press box and diving bleachers. Athletes will be available upon request but may be unavailable until the teams are finished warming down.

THE SOUTHEASTERN CONFERENCE



Setting the Standard for Intercollegiate Athletics in Swimming and Diving

Over the course of several decades, the Southeastern Conference has been a constant force in swimming and diving.

Last season, the University of Georgia claimed its second consecutive and sixth overall national title at the 2014 NCAA Division I Women's Swimming & Diving Championships, while Texas A&M University finished in fourth place. The University of Florida came in sixth place, while the University of Tennessee took seventh place. On the women's side, eight titles were captured individually last season to take the SEC's total to 245 NCAA individual titles. Since 1982, the Southeastern Conference has placed 94 women's teams in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships.

At the 2014 NCAA Division I Men's Swimming & Diving Championships, Florida, Georgia and the University of Auburn each finished within the top 10 teams at the event, marking the 45th consecutive season in which the SEC has placed at least one men's team in the top 10. Since 1969, 118 SEC teams have finished in the NCAA's top 10. In addition, four individual titles were captured by an SEC student-athlete. The SEC now has an all-time total of 167 NCAA individual titles.

MEN'S NOTES

- The SEC has had 11 NCAA Men's Swimming & Diving Championships titles: Tennessee - 1978; Florida - 1983 & 1985; Auburn - 1997, 1999, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009.
- 2014 marked the 45th consecutive year that the SEC has had at least one team in the top 10 of the NCAA Men's Swimming & Diving Championships. The SEC has placed a total of 118 teams in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships since 1969.
- SEC athletes in men's swimming & diving have captured a total of 167 individual NCAA titles. Last season, Chase Kallisz of Georgia posted a winning time of 3:34.50 in the 400 IM, resetting the NCAA top time in the event. Florida's Marcin Cieslak earned individual honors in the 200 IM and the 100 butterfly, and Auburn's Kristian Gkolomeev won the 50-yard freestyle.
- In addition to the individual honors, Auburn won the 400-yard freestyle relay last year, with Marcelo Chierighini, James Disney-May, Arthur Mendes and Kyle Darmody finishing in a combined time of 2:48.33.

WOMEN'S NOTES

- The SEC has had 13 NCAA Women's Swimming & Diving Championships titles: Florida - 1992, 2010; Georgia - 1999, 2000, 2001, 2005, 2013, 2014; Auburn - 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2007.
- With the first-place finish of the Georgia Bulldogs at the 2014 NCAA Championships, an SEC school has finished either first or second in the Championships since 1999.
- Since 1982, the SEC has placed 94 teams in the top 10 at the NCAA Championships.
- 245 individual NCAA titles have been captured by SEC athletes. Georgia's Brittany MacLean set NCAA records last year in both the 500 free (4:32.53) and the 1650 free (15:27.84) en route to being named the 2014 Swimmer of the Meet, while teammate Laura Ryan was selected as Diver of the Meet after claiming the top spot in both the 1-meter and 3-meter diving events. Also earning individual championship honors at the 2014 NCAA Championships were Georgia's Olivia Smoliga (50 free) and Texas A&M's Breeja Larson (100 breast), Paige Miller (100 back) and Cammille Adams (200 fly).



LSU diver Matt Vieke left the Tigers as arguably one of the top scholar-athletes in the program's history. In 2011, he was named the Tiger Athletic Foundation Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was a recipient of the Wally Pontiff Jr., Academic Excellence Award. Vieke was LSU's male finalist for the SEC's H. Boyd McWorter Scholar-Athlete Post Graduate Scholarship in 2012.

Miko Malberg, a 2008 All-American and Olympian, graduated from LSU in the winter of 2008.

Nutrition First

LSU is one of the few schools nationally who maintain a state-of-the-art nutritional program for today's student-athlete. Senior Associate Athletic Trainer Shelly Mullenix and Jamie Mascari, coordinator of sports nutrition, work hand-in-hand with LSU dining services to provide a balanced training table diet.

LSU boasts the largest and most complete athletic training facilities in all of collegiate athletics with both the Operations Center and the Broussard Center for Athletic Training in Tiger Stadium. Both are furnished with the latest in technology and equipment. The Operations Center training room features a full view of the practice fields, two hot/cold jacuzzis and an underwater treadmill. The Broussard Center includes an on-site x-ray room, an in-house pharmacy and a hydrotherapy pool. It is also one of the few collegiate training centers with a full-service pharmacy, vision center and dental center.



Hydrotherapy Treatment

An integral part of rehabbing and developing LSU student-athletes is the operations center's hot/cold jacuzzis and an underwater treadmill in a fully equipped Hydrotherapy room. The Broussard training center boasts the largest hydrotherapy pool in both collegiate and professional sports.

The LSU strength and conditioning facility, located in Tiger Stadium, was built in 1997 and features the latest in both strength training and cardiovascular training equipment.



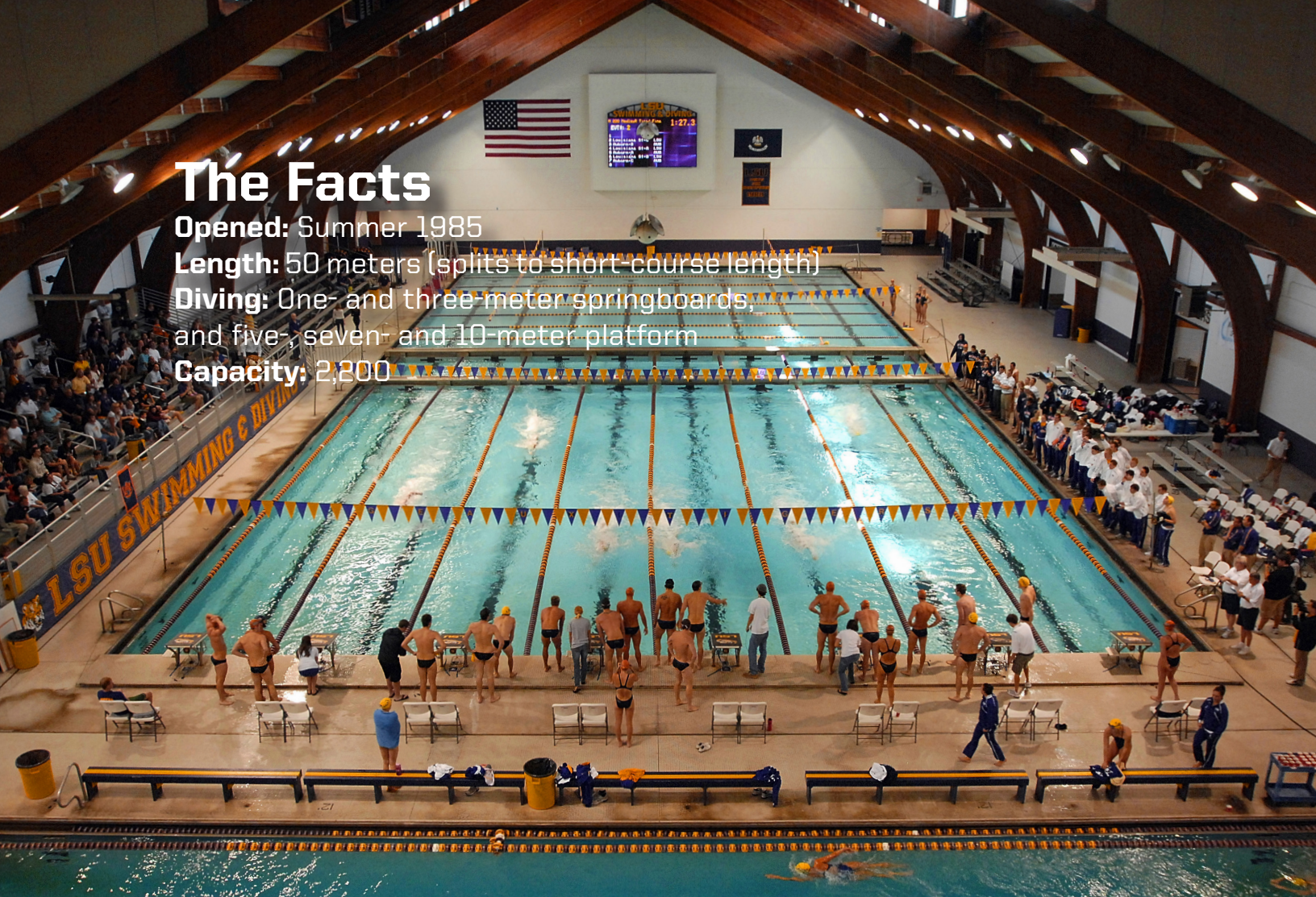

LSU Natatorium

Opened in the summer 1985, the LSU Natatorium has served as the exclusive home of the swimming and diving teams for the past 26 seasons.

The complex features a 50-meter pool, which can be converted into two 25-meter or 25-yard pools with the use of bulkheads. Furthermore, the facility houses a championship diving well, which was completely renovated in the summer 2003 with one- and three-meter springboards and five-, seven- and 10-meter platforms.

The programs added new graphics and signage throughout the venue in the fall 2011 and upgraded the scoring system in the fall 2008, unveiling a pair of state-of-the-art

videoboards. Refurbished locker rooms were also completed in September 1998. The spacious locker rooms feature separate varsity lockers, both for men and women, and include public showers and locker areas.

The facility has played host to several national competitions, including the 1985 National Sports Festival, the 1986 Men's Southeastern Conference Championships, the 1987 NCAA Diving Regional and the U.S. Diving National Championships in the spring 1987. The Natatorium was also the host facility during the 1999 NCAA Regional Diving Championships.

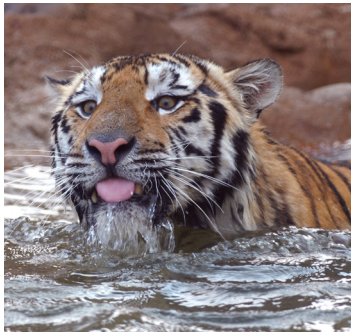
The landmark is located immediately north of the LSU

Field House and can comfortably accommodate 2,200 spectators. Admission to all LSU swimming and diving meets is free.

This season, LSU will host two dual meets, a quad meet and a diving invitational. The Natatorium underwent a \$1 million renovation over the summer. The renovation included retiling of the pool deck and resurfacing of the diving boards.

Last season, the women finished seventh and the men finished ninth at SEC Championships. The Lady Tigers return five NCAA automatic qualifiers in Kara Kocso, Cassie Weil, Alex Bettridge, Amber Carter and Caley oquist. Frank Greeff and Daniel Helm are the lone Tigers who have qualified for NCAA Championships.





On the Prowl

Mike the Tiger was recently ranked in the top three in a Bleacher Report poll of college football's top live mascots. Mike's habitat is one of the most visited attractions in the state of Louisiana located in the shadows of the north endzone of Tiger Stadium.



Mike THE TIGER

History of Mike

Few mascots in the country are as admired as Mike the Tiger. LSU's live Bengal mascot serves as the graphic image of all LSU athletic teams. The school has had six mascots, with the most recent, Mike VI, taking over the reign prior to the 2007 national championship football season. LSU veterinarian Dr. David Baker began the search for the young tiger after his predecessor, Mike V, died in May 2007 of renal failure at the age of 17. The nine-year-old Bengal/Siberian mix, formerly known as "Roscoe," was donated to LSU by Great Cats of Indiana in Idaville, Ind., a nonprofit sanctuary and rescue facility for big cats and other large carnivores.

Mike's ride through Tiger Stadium before home games in a travel trailer topped by the LSU cheerleaders is a school tradition. Before entering the stadium, his trailer on wheels is parked next to the opponent's locker room in the southeast end of the stadium. Opposing players must make their way past Mike's trailer to reach their locker room.

Tradition dictates that the Tigers will score a touchdown for every growl issued by Mike before a football game. For many years, Mike was prompted to roar by pounding on the cage. Objections of cruel punishment brought about the use of recorded growls

to play to the crowd before the games. That practice was discontinued shortly afterward and today Mike participates in the pregame tradition without provocation.

In the mid-1980's, pranksters cut the locks on Mike IV's cage and freed him in the early-morning hours just days before the annual LSU-Tulane clash. Mike roamed free, playfully knocking down several small pine trees in the area, before being trapped in the Bernie Moore Track Stadium where police used tranquilizer guns to capture and return the Bengal Tiger to his home.

The incident was reminiscent of a kidnapping of Mike I many years ago by Tulane students before a Tiger-Green Wave battle.

1936-1956

Mike I

The original Mike was purchased from the Little Rock Zoo in 1936 for \$750, with money contributed by the student body. Originally known as "Sheik" at the time of his purchase, his name was changed to Mike to honor Mike Chambers who served as LSU's athletic trainer when the first mascot was purchased. The first Mike was housed in the Baton Rouge Zoo for one year before a permanent home was constructed near Tiger Stadium. Mike I reigned for 20 years before dying of pneumonia.



Mike's Habitat

In 2005, a new environment (above) was created for Mike that is 15,000 square feet in size with lush planting, a large live oak tree, a beautiful waterfall and a stream evolving from a rocky backdrop overflowing with plants and trees. The habitat has, as a backdrop, an Italianate tower - a campanile - that creates a visual bridge to the Italianate architectural vernacular that is the underpinning of the image of the entire beautiful LSU campus. This spectacular habitat features state-of-the-art technologies, research, conservation and husbandry programs, as well as educational, interpretive and recreational activities. It is, in essence, one of the largest and finest Tiger habitats in the United States.



Sneaux Day

On Dec. 11, 2008, a winter storm blanketed Baton Rouge that hadn't been seen in decades. The early white Christmas gave Mike VI, LSU's live Bengal/Siberian tiger, a chance to relax and play in nearly two inches of accumulation.



1956-1958

Mike II

The second Mike served a brief reign, lasting only through the 1957 season before dying of pneumonia in the spring of 1958. He was born at the Audubon Zoo in New Orleans and came to LSU on Sept. 28, 1956. The young tiger was held overnight in Tiger Stadium and unveiled Sept. 29, the opening day of the football season.



1958-1976

Mike III

Just in time for the 1958 national championship season, Mike III was purchased from the Woodland Park Zoo in Seattle, Wash., following a "national search" by then-athletic director Jim Corbett. The student body contributed \$1,500 for the purchase of the tiger. Mike III served as mascot for 18 seasons, dying after the only losing season of his reign, as LSU posted a 5-6 record in 1975.



1976-1990

Mike IV

Mike IV reigned over Tiger athletics for 14 years after being donated to the school by August A. Busch III from the Dark Continent Amusement Park in Tampa, Fla, on Aug. 29, 1976. Born on May 15, 1974, Mike's age and health were determining factors in his retirement to the Baton Rouge Zoo in 1990. Mike IV died of old age in March of 1995 at the age of 21.



1990-2007

Mike V

Mike V was donated by Dr. Thomas and Caroline Atchison of the Animal House Zoological Park in Moulton, Ala. Dr. Sheldon Bivin of the LSU School of Veterinary Medicine traveled to Alabama and brought the baby tiger back to Baton Rouge. Born Oct. 18, 1989, the new tiger was introduced to LSU fans at a basketball game against Alabama in February of 1990. He officially began his reign on April 30, 1990, when he was moved into the tiger habitat across from Tiger Stadium. Mike V died on May 18, 2007, at the age of 17.

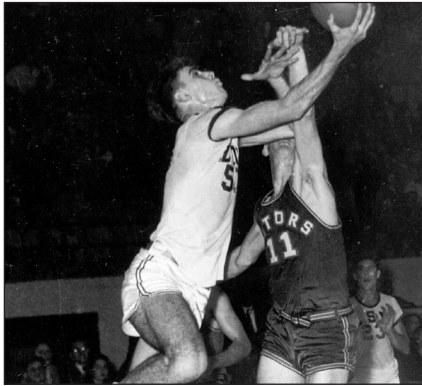
Mike VI

Mike VI arrived in Baton Rouge on Aug. 25, 2007, thanks to the donation by Great Cats of Indiana. He was officially designated as the successor to Mike V on Sept. 8, when LSU played host to Virginia Tech. Six days later, on Sept. 14, 2007, a ceremony was held to honor Mike V and dedicate the habitat to Mike VI. The nine-year-old Bengal/Siberian mix, formerly known as "Roscoe," reigned over a football national title in his first year and most recently, a 2011 Southeastern Conference championship and perfect regular season.

GREATS

The following nine individuals are the only athletes to have their jerseys retired by LSU. Men's basketball has retired the No. 23 for Pete Maravich, No. 50 for Bob Pettit, Jr., No. 33 for Shaquille O'Neal and No. 40 for Rudy Macklin. Women's basketball retired the No. 33 for Seimone Augustus. Football's only two retired jerseys are the No. 20 worn by Billy Cannon and the No. 37 worn by Tommy Casanova. Baseball retired the No. 15 in honor of longtime coach and former athletics director Skip Bertman and the No. 19 for Ben McDonald. Casanova, Macklin and McDonald joined the prestigious list in May 2009. Augustus became the first woman in LSU Athletics history to have her jersey retired in January 2010.



50 Bob Pettit

Pettit led LSU to its first NCAA Final Four in 1953 and he later became the first player in NBA history to exceed the 20,000-plus point barrier. Pettit is a member of the NBA Hall of Fame, and in 1997, he was named as one of the top 50 players in NBA history.



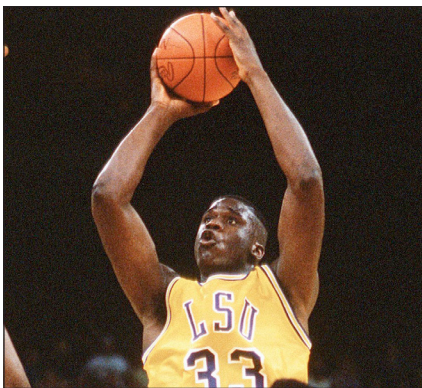
23 Pete Maravich

"Pistol Pete," Maravich still holds the NCAA record for career points with 3,667 and for career scoring average with 44.2 points a game. He was selected the National Player of the Year in 1970 after leading the Tigers to the NIT Final Four. He scored 50-plus points an amazing 28 times. He went on to a 10-year professional career and was selected as one of the NBA's 50 greatest players in 1997.



20 Billy Cannon

One of the true legends of college football in the South, Billy Cannon was the 1959 Heisman Trophy winner and helped the Tigers to the 1958 national title. Cannon's most memorable performance came in 1959 against Ole Miss when No. 1 LSU trailed No. 3 Ole Miss 3-0 in the fourth quarter. He fielded a punt, broke seven tackles and returned it 89 yards for the 7-3 victory. He went on to a successful 11-year professional career.



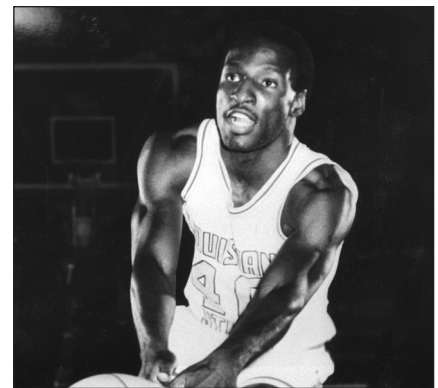
33 Shaquille O'Neal

Shaquille O'Neal was the first pick in the 1992 NBA Draft. He was named MVP of the league in 2000 and was a three-time NBA Finals MVP after leading the Los Angeles Lakers to three World Championships. At LSU, O'Neal averaged 21.6 points and 13.6 rebounds for his career, and in 1991, he was named the World's Amateur Athlete of the Year as well as SEC Athlete of the Year and National Player of the Year. In 1997, he was named as one of the top 50 players in NBA history.



15 Skip Bertman

A legend in the college baseball ranks, Skip Bertman created a dynasty at LSU, guiding the Tigers to five national titles in a 10-year stretch from 1991-2000. He also coached the United States to a bronze medal at the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta and was an assistant on the gold medal-winning U.S. squad in Seoul, Korea, in 1988. Bertman retired from coaching following the 2001 season and served as LSU's athletics director for seven years. Bertman was inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame in 2006.



40 Rudy Macklin

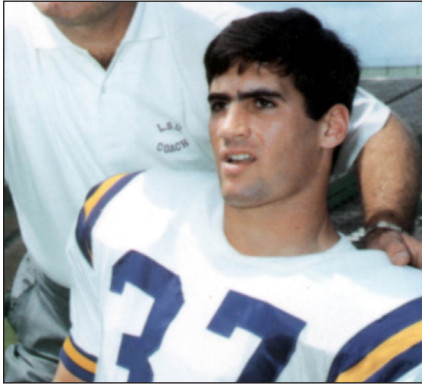
Rudy Macklin was a two-time basketball All-American selection during his Tiger career from 1976-81 during which time he became LSU's all-time leading rebounder with 1,276 boards and the second-leading scorer in school history behind only the legendary Pete Maravich with 2,080 points. He led the Tigers to two Elite Eight appearances and the 1981 Final Four in Philadelphia. He still holds the school single game rebound record with 32, a mark like some of the great records in any sport that may never be broken.

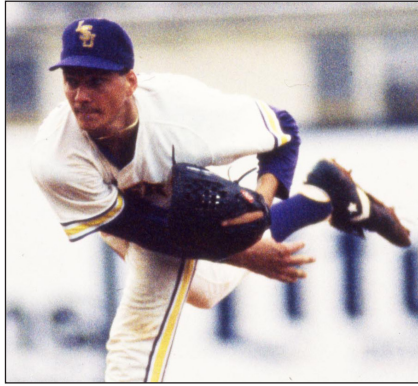
About LSU Retired Jerseys

The retirement of the jerseys of Casanova, McDonald, Macklin and Augustus comes under a new provision of the LSU jersey retirement bylaws that says the retirement of an athlete's jersey in a particular sport does not preclude a current student-athlete in that sport from wearing the jersey number in that or any other sport, subject to the discretion of the head coach. This provision applies only to jerseys retired after January 1, 2007, so the numbers worn by Maravich, Pettit, O'Neal, Cannon and Bertman may never again be worn by future student-athletes in their respective sports. To have a jersey retired at LSU, an athlete must have completed intercollegiate competition for LSU a minimum of five years prior to nomination. Athletes must have demonstrated truly unusual and outstanding accomplishments, exceeding and in addition to all criteria used for Hall of Fame selection. Nominees must have a unanimous vote of support from the Hall of Fame committee.



37 Tommy Casanova

Tommy Casanova is the only three-time All-American in the history of LSU football and is a member of the College Football Hall of Fame. During his Tiger career from 1969-71, Casanova personified versatility for his myriad of talents as he played offense, defense, returned punts and kickoffs. One of just two three-time All-SEC performers at LSU, he played six seasons with the Cincinnati Bengals of the NFL while earning his medical degree.



19 Ben McDonald

Ben McDonald won the prestigious Golden Spikes Award, given annually to the nation's most outstanding player, in 1989 and is a member of the College Baseball Hall of Fame. He led LSU to two College World Series appearances. In 1989, McDonald was named National Player of the Year by Baseball America, The Sporting News and Collegiate Baseball. He was selected by the Baltimore Orioles as the No. 1 pick in the major league draft in 1989 and went on to enjoy a 10-year major league career with the Orioles and the Milwaukee Brewers.



33 Seimone Augustus

Seimone Augustus is the only women's basketball player in school history to earn State Farm Coaches Association All-America honors three times: 2004, 2005 and 2006. Augustus became LSU's first NCAA National Player of the Year, and she claimed the honor twice in 2005 and 2006. A 2006 graduate of LSU, Augustus was the 2012 WNBA Finals MVP after winning a world title. She also led the United States to Olympic gold medals at the 2008 Beijing and 2012 London Games.

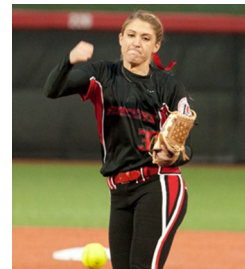

Shaquille O'Neal

A four-time NBA champion and 15-time All-Star, Shaquille O'Neal was one of the most dominant centers in NBA history. He announced his retirement from the NBA in June 2010 after a brilliant Hall of Fame career and has since become a television analyst on TNT. One of the most quotable figures on the planet, O'Neal earned his bachelor's degree from LSU in December 2000. In 2011, he penned his own biography, "Shaq Uncut, My Story," and then received his doctorate degree from Florida's Barry University in May 2012.

Lolo Jones

A three-time national champion hurdler at LSU, Lolo Jones continues to take the sporting world by storm. Jones became an inspirational figure as a two-time World Indoor Champion and the world record holder in the 60-meter hurdles with a time of 7.72. She competed in both the 2008 Beijing and 2012 London Olympic Games and became the first LSU athlete to ever grace the cover of Time Magazine in July 2012. A 2005 graduate of LSU, Jones is now a two-sport star. She was named to the U.S. National Bobsled Team that went on to claim gold at the 2013 FIBT World Championships and compete at the 2014 Winter Olympics.

Eduardo Aguirre, Jr.

Named the first Director of U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) for the Department of Homeland Security in 2003, Aguirre, Jr., was the U.S. Ambassador to Spain from 2005 until 2009.



Lod Cook

Cook graduated from LSU with a bachelor's degree in mathematics in 1955 and then earned his Master's degree in petro engineering in 1955. Cook served as CEO of ARCO for nine years.



Seimone Augustus

A two-time NCAA Women's Basketball National Player of the Year, Augustus graduated from LSU in 2006. She is a two-time U.S. Olympic gold medalist and continues an All-Star pro career with the WNBA's Minnesota Lynx. She was named WNBA Finals MVP in 2012 after winning a WNBA title.



Carlos Roberto Flores

The president of Honduras from 1998-2002, Flores helped the nation recover after Hurricane Mitch devastated the country in 1998. Flores is married to the former Mary Carol Flake, also an alumna of LSU.



James Carville

Carville received both a bachelor's degree and law degree from LSU and gained fame in the 1990s as the chief campaign strategist for Bill Clinton and Al Gore. Carville also penned a best-selling memoir titled "All's Fair: Love, War and Running for President."



Jim Flores

Flores graduated with two bachelor's of science degrees; one in corporate finance in 1981 and the second in petroleum land management in 1982. Flores serves as both chairman and CEO of Flores and Rucks, Inc., a publicly held independent oil and gas company.

Dr. F. King Alexander

President/Chancellor, LSU



Dr. F. King Alexander was named the incoming president and chancellor of Louisiana State University, which has an annual budget of \$3.4 billion and more than 54,000 students. He was appointed to the position by the LSU Board of Supervisors in March 2013 and assumed the position on July 1, 2013.

Prior to being named the incoming president, Dr. Alexander was president of California State University, Long Beach (2006-2013), one of the nation's largest public universities located in Southern California.

During his more than seven-year tenure at California State University, Long Beach, Dr. Alexander was twice named the California State University Student Association (CSSA) "President of the Year," which represents all 23 California State Universities and its more than 440,000 students.

Prior to becoming president of California State University, Long Beach, Dr. Alexander was president of Murray State University in Kentucky (2001-2005) and was a faculty member at the University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana, where he was the director of the graduate higher education program.

A Kentucky native who grew up in North Florida, Dr. Alexander received his Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Madison in higher education administration with a focus on finance and educational policy analysis, and a Master of Science degree from the University of Oxford, Oxford, England in comparative educational studies.

As a teacher and administrator, Dr. Alexander has received many honors, including the University of Wisconsin-Madison School of Education Alumni Achievement Award (2002) and has research

university faculty affiliations at the University of Wisconsin-Madison Center for the Study of Postsecondary Education (WISCAPE) and Cornell University Higher Education Research Institute (CHERI).

Alexander is an internationally-respected expert in higher education finance and public policy and frequently publishes in national journals and for organizations in this field. He has served as a reviewer, an editorial board member, and a university instructor and faculty member, teaching courses in higher education finance, law, history and current events.

Dr. Alexander also has been asked to represent public higher education colleges and universities on numerous occasions to the United States Congress on issues of college affordability, student indebtedness, and institutional efficiency and effectiveness in efforts to address many of the growing challenges facing American higher education. Due to his national recognition and involvement on higher education issues, Dr. Alexander has served on numerous U.S. higher education and statewide organizational leadership boards where he remains very active.

Dr. Alexander and his wife, Shenette, have three children: Kylie, Savannah and Madison.



Dr. Bill Demastes

Faculty Athletics Representative

Dr. Bill Demastes, a professor of English at LSU, is in his third year as Faculty Athletics Representative. Dr. Demastes earned his Ph.D. in English in 1986 from the University of Wisconsin-Madison with a Field of Study of Drama as Genre and a specialization in 20th-Century American and British Drama. He

earned his masters in English in June 1979 from the University of Georgia in Athens, where he specialized in 19th-Century American Literature.

At LSU, he served as Associate Dean of the College of Arts and

Sciences from 2001-2004 and Director of Undergraduate Studies for the Department of English from 1999-2001 and 2010-11. He has also served as Associate Chair of the Department of English (1998-99), Director of the Master of Arts in Liberal Arts Program (1996-2004) and Director of Graduate Studies in the Department of English (1992-94; 2006-06).

He was honored with the LSU Alumni Association Faculty Excellence Award in 2000 and in 2002 won the LSU Distinguished Faculty Award. He was named in 2009 an LSU Rainmaker which is given to the top 100 LSU Faculty. In 2010 and 2013, he received the Tiger Athletic Association Undergraduate Teaching Award University College, and in the summer of 2011, he was named the Harry Ransom Summer Fellowship recipient by the University of Texas.



Joe Alleva

LSU Vice Chancellor/Director of Athletics



Joe Alleva continues to bring unprecedented national recognition to LSU as Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics. Under Alleva's leadership, LSU enjoys one of the country's premier athletics programs with success on and off the field of competition. Now in his seventh year at LSU, Alleva is dedicated to athletic and academic excellence, and he is committed to providing the opportunities and the resources necessary for student-athletes to excel in competition, in the classroom and in the community. Alleva joined the LSU family on April 4, 2008, after a highly successful tenure as director of athletics at Duke University for 10 years. Alleva's role at LSU was further expanded in August 2009 when vice chancellor was added to his title by the LSU Board of Supervisors. It is the first time in school history that the director of athletics has also held a vice chancellor position.

Alleva is currently serving a five-year term on the prestigious NCAA Men's Basketball Committee, enhancing his reputation as one of the most respected athletic administrators in the country. Alleva has been appointed to numerous national committees throughout his career, including the Football Bowl Certification Committee, the NCAA Division I Championships/Competition Cabinet and several Southeastern Conference and Atlantic Coast Conference committees.

Upon his arrival at LSU, Alleva unveiled a strategic master plan for the LSU athletics program – "LSU: Thru and True" – to ensure the advancement and future of LSU Athletics as an exemplary enterprise. The central mission of the plan is to create an environment for student-athletes to reach their ultimate potential, prepare them to be champions in life and to set out goals and values for the entire athletics program.

Living up to Alleva's mantra of "competition, classroom, community," LSU student-athletes in 2013-14 logged more than 4,732 hours in community service work across 21 sports through LSU's "Geaux Givers" program. And a total of 88 proud Tigers received their degrees from the university during LSU commencement ceremonies in December and May. LSU's overall graduation success rate for all student-athletes has grown from 69 percent in 2008 to 81 percent in 2013.

With a strong commitment to academics, Alleva ensures that the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes is a first-class facility that provides student-athletes the resources necessary for success in the classroom and personal development. And with an emphasis on community service and outreach programs, the implementation under Alleva's direction of the "Geaux Givers" fosters a relationship between the local community and LSU student-athletes, who regularly participate in philanthropic events. Alleva has bolstered the athletic department's L-Club program to reach out and connect with former student-athletes, and he has supervised the thriving "Project Graduation" program in which many former student-athletes have returned to LSU to earn their degrees.

Alleva's tenure has been distinguished by a number of significant athletic achievements, including four straight 10-win seasons by the football team, a

baseball national championship and two College World Series berths, two consecutive women's basketball Sweet 16 appearances, three gymnastics Super Six berths, a softball College World Series appearance and 15 NCAA Top 5 finishes indoors and outdoors by the men's and women's track and field teams.

LSU under Alleva's leadership claimed the 2009 baseball College World Series title, and the Tigers have earned 30 individual NCAA championships in the sports of men and women's track and field, gymnastics, men's golf and women's golf. LSU has captured 12 Southeastern Conference team championships, including the 2011 football crown, and the Tigers have won 80 individual SEC titles during Alleva's term. The Tigers in 2011-12 finished fourth in both the men's and women's Capital One Cup competition that identifies athletic excellence. LSU was one of only two schools in the country – and the only one in the SEC – to rank in the top four in both categories.

LSU's prominence was evident again in the final 2013-14 Learfield Sports Director's Cup standings that recognize the nation's best athletic programs, as the Tigers finished in the Top 25 for the ninth consecutive year. LSU was the only school in the SEC to post a 10 win-season (10-3) in football, a 20-win season (20-14) in men's basketball and a 40-win season (46-16-1) in baseball.

The 2013 LSU football team recorded its seventh 10-win season in nine years and defeated Iowa in the Outback Bowl, the men's basketball team earned 20 victories for the first time since 2009 and the baseball team won its fifth SEC Tournament title in seven years and was an NCAA Tournament National Seed for the third-straight season. The Lady Tiger basketball team earned his second consecutive Sweet 16 berth, and LSU gymnastics, led by National Coach of the Year D-D Breaux, enjoyed the finest season in its illustrious history,

finishing No. 3 in the nation.

The LSU men's golf team recorded its highest national finish since 1967 as the Tigers placed third at the NCAA Championships. The men's track and field team placed fourth and the women's team sixth at the NCAA Outdoor meet. The softball, volleyball, swimming and diving, women's tennis and women's golf teams each participated in NCAA postseason competition. The year was also highlighted by the inaugural season of the sand volleyball program, which gives more LSU female student-athletes the opportunity to compete at the intercollegiate level.

Alleva's vision will keep LSU among the nation's leaders in athletic facilities. In the fall of 2014, LSU opens the expansion of the South End Zone of Tiger Stadium – a project that adds premium seating, general public seating and two state-of-the-art video boards – continuing an effort to augment one of the most iconic venues in all of college sports. Since 2010, Alleva has directed an aggressive campaign to preserve and enhance the appearance of Tiger Stadium that has included the installation new windows, lighting systems, gating systems, and championship plazas.

Under Alleva's direction, LSU's world-renowned track and field program in 2010 received a new running surface in Bernie Moore Stadium, and extensive renovations to the Maddox Field House in the spring of 2014 give the Tigers a first-class indoor track and field venue. Alleva directed a major renovation to the University Club golf course that was completed in September 2010 and allows the LSU men's and women's golf teams to compete on one of the most challenging courses in the country. An overhaul of the LSU soccer facility was completed in the fall of 2011, converting the venue into fan-friendly venue that has attracted record-breaking crowds.

Future plans include a new gymnastics practice facility, a new tennis complex featuring indoor

and outdoor courts and a modern Nutrition Center for Student-Athletes, a facility that will house full-time chefs and nutritionists and provide the best dietary selections for all Fighting Tiger competitors.

Alleva is an innovator with bold ideas that benefit not only LSU but all of Greater Baton Rouge. He has been instrumental in the planning of the Bayou Country Superfest, a three-day country music concert and festival held in Tiger Stadium each spring. The event attracts more than 100,000 visitors to the LSU campus and makes a tremendous economic impact upon the local community.

Alleva became director of athletics at Duke in 1998 and his impressive tenure there propelled the university into the ranks of America's top all-around collegiate programs. Among his outstanding list of accomplishments includes the greatest 10-year period in Duke Athletics, winning more ACC and NCAA championships than in any other decade in school history.

Alleva, whose hometown is Suffern, New York, majored in Finance at Lehigh University and received his bachelor's degree in 1975. While at Lehigh, Alleva was the quarterback of the football team and team captain in 1974. Alleva also played on the Lehigh baseball team. He served as a graduate assistant football coach and earned an MBA in 1976.

While at Duke, Alleva played a key role in Durham's community sports scene. He started Little League Baseball in Durham over 20 years ago, and also began the American Legion baseball program.

He is a member of the North Carolina American Legion Hall of Fame, Suffern High School Hall of Fame and the Rockland County Hall of Fame.

Alleva and his wife, Annie, have three children, J.D., Jeff, and Jenny, and one granddaughter.



DAVID GEYER

Co-Head Coach
Head Swimming Coach
Fifth Season as Co-Head Coach (Tenth at LSU)

When Dave Geyer was promoted to co-head coach of the LSU men's and women's swimming and diving programs alongside Doug Shaffer in April 2010, he envisioned a pair of teams that could consistently compete among the top 15 in the nation and top five in the Southeastern Conference.

During the 2013-14 season, five total swimmers and divers qualified automatically for NCAA Championships. Four individual qualifiers and eight total qualifiers for the LSU women's team marked the largest group since the 2010-11 season and the most in at least 18 years. The men and women also combined to break six school records.

Kara Kopcsó erupted on to the scene during her first year on campus. The NCAA qualifier set the school record in the 200 fly in her first meet against Georgia. Kopcsó ultimately broke her own record against Texas A&M later in the season with a time of 1:56.12. The Mandeville, La. native also was a part of the team that set the 800-freestyle relay.

Kopcsó was named to the SEC All-Freshman team and earned a trio of SEC Freshman of the Week honors. Kopcsó finished first in the 'B' final of the 200 fly and first in the 'C' final of the 200 IM at SEC Championships. She also finished third in the 'C' final of the 100 fly at SEC's for the fourth-fastest time in program history (53.17).

Caley Oquist qualified for NCAA's for the second time in her career, this time as an individual. Oquist qualified in both the 100 and 200 back after setting the program record at SEC Championships. The then sophomore also swam the leadoff leg the 400-medley relay team that broke the program record at the SEC's.

Oquist also finished sixth in the championship final of the 100 back and took first in the 'B' final of the 200 backstroke at SEC's. The Monticello, Minnesota native also earned the fifth-best 200 IM time in program history in the 'C' final at the SEC's.

Last season, Amber Carter qualified automatically for NCAA's in the 100 fly. The Houston, Texas native swam the third leg of the relay team that set the program record in the 400 medley. Carter also won the 'C' final of the 100 fly at SEC's for the third-fastest time in program history.

Frank Greeff was the lone male to qualify automatically for NCAA Championships where he earned his second NCAA Honorable Mention All-America honor in the 200 fly. Greeff finished 10th in the 200 fly at NCAA Championships with a record-breaking time of 1:43.14. At SEC Championships, the South Africa native finished sixth and seventh respectively in the championship finals of the 200 fly and 100 fly. Also at NCAA's, Greeff earned the program's second-fastest 200 IM time (1:46.23) at the NCAA's and the program's third fastest 100 fly time (46.80) at the SEC's.

Prior to his promotion to co-head coach, Geyer spent five seasons as an assistant coach at LSU where he worked with all phases of the programs. He was instrumental in helping numerous athletes shatter program records and earn All-America honors while also playing a vital role in the recruitment of top-level international student-athletes.

In 2008, Geyer trained former LSU standout and Olympian Miko Malberg prior to the Beijing Olympic Games where the former All-American went on to set an Estonian national record in the 50-meter freestyle (22.37) and place 25th overall.

He also traveled to Croatia for the 2008 European Short-Course Championships as a member of the Estonian National coaching staff where he guided Malberg to a pair of national records and helped an Estonian relay qualify for its first championship final at that competition.

Geyer graduated from Shippensburg with a bachelor's degree in psychology in 1999 before receiving his master's degree in counseling in 2001. He is married to the former Lyndi Croft of State College, Pa. The couple has two daughters, Maddilyn (10) and Kayda (6).

DOUG SHAFFER

Co-Head Coach
 Head Diving Coach
 Fifth Season as Co-Head Coach (13th at LSU)

The LSU diving program is one of storied tradition, and no one has had a more profound impact in the Tigers' recent success than Doug Shaffer.

Entering his 13th overall season with LSU, Shaffer was promoted to co-head coach of the men's and women's swimming and diving programs along with Dave Geyer in April 2010 and enters his fifth season as head diving coach.

After four seasons, Shaffer and Geyer have LSU on the path to becoming one of the nation's elite programs. During the 2013-14 season, the men and women smashed three school records. Sophomore Cassie Weil also tallied a stellar postseason performance highlighted by All-American honors.

Weil qualified for NCAA Championships where she earned an NCAA First-Team All-American honor on platform behind a program record score of 311.55. Weil also earned her third Honorable Mention All-American honor, this time on three-meter. At SEC Championships, Weil secured bronze medals on both platform and three-meter and brought home a Second-Team All-SEC honor.

Alex Bettridge provided another solid year on the women's side, setting the program record on one-meter. Reached the finals of platform and one-meter with a fourth place and sixth place respectively. Bettridge also competed at the NCAA Zone 'D' Diving Regional where she finished fourth on platform with a two-list score of 584, fifth on the one-meter (632.60) and the sixth on three-meter.

Sean McKinney and Kevin Leong provided strong performances throughout their senior campaigns. McKinney posted career-high scores during all three events, which included a program record 425.70 on the three-meter. Notched the second-best platform score on platform during prelims of the SEC Championships. During postseason competition, McKinney finished fifth overall on platform at SEC's and at NCAA Zone Regional, finished fourth on one-meter, sixth on platform and 13th on three-meter

Leong ended his career by qualifying for NCAA Zones for a third straight year. He finished ninth on platform and 12th on one-meter. Leong just missed reaching the championships on platform at the SEC Championships but scored points on all boards at SEC's. He leaves the program with the second best one-meter score in program history (384.15) set against Oklahoma Baptist.

Allie Alter and Katie Lagarde also provided strong performances as underclassmen. Lagarde reached NCAA Zone Diving Regionals in her first season and posted a career high score of 244.20 on three-meter at the Alabama Diving Invitational for a sixth place finish.

Alter reached the finals on all three boards at the regional and finished seventh on platform with a two-list score of 540.50. Alter also finished 16th on the one-meter (530.65) and 18th on the three-meter (579.10) at NCAA's

Shaffer was no stranger to leading a successful collegiate diving program before taking the job in Baton Rouge. He was the head coach at UCLA in 1988-89 and then at the University of Minnesota from 1989-96.

Shaffer experienced a great deal of success at Minnesota as he was honored as Big Ten Diving Coach of the Year three times - twice on the women's side and once for the men's team. Shaffer coached 11 Big Ten champions, 29 All-Americans and two NCAA champions while at Minnesota. He was named NCAA Diving Coach of the Year in 1993. Shaffer also coached three Pac-10 champions and four All-Americans during his tenure at UCLA.

He has coached the United States in numerous international competitions since 1989, including the U.S. National Diving teams in China, Sweden, Spain and the United States. Shaffer served as the assistant competition manager during the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta and was recruited to be the head diving coach at the Sheffield, England, High Performance Center. There, he coached five Olympians on the Lottery Funded World Class Performance Program but declined a four-year contract extension for the opportunity to coach at LSU. Shaffer graduated from UCLA in 1986 with a B.A. degree in history. He

was an 11-time U.S. National champion, the 1986 NCAA Diver of the Year and the NCAA one-meter and three-meter champion in 1986 for the Bruins. One of the few divers to defeat the legendary Greg Louganis, Shaffer ousted the four-time Olympian five times in 1987, three of which were in U.S. National competition.

Shaffer was a silver medalist in the three-meter at the 1987 Pan American Games and won a gold medal at the 1987 USA-USSR dual meet in the three-meter competition. An Olympic Trials finalist in 1984 and 1988, he retired from competition in 1988 and moved into the nation's coaching ranks.

Shaffer is a native of Canton, Ohio and is married to Dr. Tracy Stephenson Shaffer, an LSU associate professor in communication

Jeana Kempe enters her third year with LSU after serving as an assistant coach at Northern Arizona University for two seasons. Kempe provides LSU with added expertise in recruiting.

Junior Caley Oquist has seen incredible growth in two years under Kempe. Oquist qualified for NCAA's for the second time in her career, this time automatically in the 100 and 200 back. Oquist qualified in both events after setting the LSU record at SEC Championships.

Oquist also finished sixth in the championship final of the 100 back and took first in the 'B' final of the 200 backstroke at SEC's. The Monticello, Minnesota native also earned the fifth-best 200 IM time in program history in the 'C' final at the SEC's.

Freshmen Colleen O'Neil and Silas Dejean also saw incredible success in their first year on campus. O'Neil swam three times fast enough for Top 10 marks in program history. O'Neil notched the fourth-fastest 100 breaststroke time (1:02.19) at SEC's, the sixth-best 200 IM (1:59.19) at midseason, and the fifth-best 200 breaststroke (2:14.66) times in program history at the Texas AGM Invite.

Dejean quickly emerged as one of the team's top breaststrokers under Kempe's watch. He swam the eighth-fastest 100 breaststroke (54.23) and 10th-fastest 200 breaststroke (1:59.50) in program history at the SEC Championships. Dejean also reached the 'C' final of the 100 breast and 200 breast at the SEC's.

At NAU, Kempe's swimmers posted 14 NCAA 'B' cuts and broke 14 school records. In addition, 28 program all-time top-five swims were registered.

NAU posted two top-three finishes at the WAC Championships with Kempe as an assistant coach, including a second place finish in 2012. Four NAU swimmers were named CollegeSwimming.com Mid-Major All-Americans

during the 2011-12 season. The swimmers won five individual titles during the 2012 WAC Championships.

During her time in Flagstaff, Kempe also worked with developing the training schedule and dry land programs, organizing recruiting logistics and coordinating alumni relations.

Chase Kreitler enters his second year with LSU after serving as an assistant coach and graduate assistant for Eastern Michigan the past two seasons.

In his first year as an assistant coach, Kreitler continued the development of All-American Frank Greeff. Greeff was the lone male to qualify automatically for NCAA Championships where he earned his second NCAA Honorable Mention All-America honor in the 200 fly.

Greeff finished 10th in the 200 fly at NCAA Championships with a record-breaking time of 1:43.14. At SEC Championships, the South Africa native finished sixth and seventh respectively in the championship finals of the 200 fly and 100 fly. During his junior campaign, Greeff also earned the program's second-fastest 200 IM time (1:46.23) and third fastest 100 fly time (46.80).

Megan Cox reached NCAA Championships in just her second season and led of the 800 freestyle relay to a program record. She also swam the second-fastest 200 freestyle in program history at the SEC Championships in 1:46.49 to qualify for the championship final.

Freshmen Brandon Goldman, Logan Rysemus, and Garrett House also developed under Kreitler in their first year. Goldman made an instant impact by setting three top 10 times in LSU history. He finished third in the 'C' final of the 400 IM at the SEC Championships with the fifth-fastest time in program history (3:51.55). Goldman also owns the seventh-fastest 200 backstroke (1:45.49) and ninth-fastest 200 IM (1:49.34) times in the LSU record book.

Rysemus owns three times on LSU's Top 10 list. He finished 14th overall in the 100 backstroke and 100 butterfly at the SEC Championships. Rysemus set the fourth-fastest 100 back (47.38), fourth-fastest 100 fly (47.15) and 10th-fastest 200 back (1:46.03) in program history during preliminaries at

SEC's.

House Contributed to the depth of the breaststroke and individual medley events in his first year ... Finished fourth in the 'C' final of the 200 breast (1:59.20) at the SEC Championships for the ninth-fastest time in program history ... Reached the 'C' final of the 400 IM at the SEC's and swam the 10th-fastest time in program history (3:56.30)

While at Eastern Michigan, the swimming and diving program won back-to-back Mid-American Conference Championships in 2012 and 201. The combined men's and women's programs also broke 20 team records. Kreitler also coached two-time All American Jacob Hanson.

While in Michigan, Kreitler also coached for the nationally renowned USA Swimming team, Club Wolverine. In the summer of 2013, he helped lead Club Wolverine to a first place team finish at the Central Zone Sectional Meet.

Prior to Eastern Michigan, Kreitler spent two seasons as an assistant coach for the Cal State Bakersfield men's program. During his two years working with sprinters, CSUB swimmers broke 10 team records. During the 2010-11 season, the team won the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation conference title.

Kreitler also spent the summer of 2011 in Fort Collins, Colo., as a co-director and coach at the Athletes in Action Colorado Swim Project. He trained collegiate athletes during an eight week high-altitude training camp.

Kreitler swam at California State Bakersfield from 2005-2009 where he was a co-captain as a senior and was named outstanding student in student exercise science.

Kreitler, a native of Valley Village, Calif., completed his undergraduate degree in exercise science from California State University, Bakersfield in 2009. He is currently finishing his master's degree in exercise physiology.

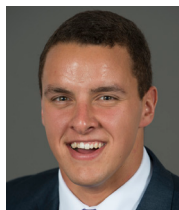

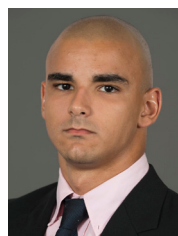

HIGHLIGHTS

• Eight women and five men qualified for NCAA Championships. All eight women and three men return to LSU this season. The five women automatic qualifier and eight total qualifiers ties the largest mark since the 2010-11 season and the most in at least 18 years.

• Diver Cassie Weil earned NCAA First-Team All-America honors on platform and Honorable Mention All-America honors on three-meter. It's the first time since 2007 that an LSU diver earned First-Team All-American honor on platform. It's her fourth All American honor since being on campus.

• Frank Greeff qualified for NCAA Championships and finished 10th in the 200 fly to earn his second Honorable Mention All-American honor. He became only the second male swimmer in school history to earn multiple All America honors in the 200 fly. Greeff also set the school record in the 200 fly at NCAA's. At SEC Championships, the South Africa native finished sixth and seventh respectively in the 200 fly and 100 fly.

• Freshman Kara Kopcsó set the school record in the 200 fly and qualified automatically for NCAA Championships. Kopcsó also was named the 2014 SEC All-Freshman team. The Mandeville, Louisiana native also was a part of the team that set the school record in the 800 freestyle relay.

• Junior Caley Oquist burst on to the scene at SEC Championships for the women's team. Oquist set the school record in the 100 back and 200 back at SEC's and finished sixth in the 'B' final of the 200 back. The Monticello, Minnesota native also was a part of the team that set the school record in the 400 medley relay.

• During the 2013-14 season, Lady Tigers added 27 new times to the school's all-time top 10 list. This also includes eight school records that were broken.

• Twenty Eight times were updated to LSU men's all-time top 10 list during the 2013-14 season. Seventeen of those marks were earned by newcomers to the squad.
