Tigers Progress in Challenging Spring Season

After facing one of the nation's most difficult schedules in 2006, the Tigers continued to show great maturity as they faced a tough spring schedule in 2007, finishing with a 2-2-1 overall record. Highlighting the action was a hard-fought 2-1 victory over ACC power Wake Forest, which finished the 2006 regular season ranked as high as No. 19 in the country. The Tigers also crushed in-state rival Northwestern State, 9-1, while playing to a 2-2 draw against SEC rival Ole Miss. They opened the spring with a tough 2-0 defeat at the hands of national power Texas A&M, while also falling 2-0 to ACC power Duke. With its play over the past year, LSU head coach Brian Lee said that his young team has "proven to themselves that they can compete with the very best teams in the country."

Tigers Draw No. 12 Florida Gators, 1-1

With a berth in the SEC Tournament still on the line, the Tigers kept their postseason hopes alive on Oct. 22 as they battled the 12th-ranked Florida Gators to a 1-1 draw on a dreary afternoon at the LSU Soccer Complex. The game remained scoreless into the second half until LSU sophomore forward Roslyn Jones put the Tigers on top 1-0 in the 60th minute of play with her ninth goal of the season. The Gators rebounded with a goal of their own in the 78th minute to force overtime, but the teams were unable to break the tie as they failed to capitalize on their opportunities in the 15 minutes of extra time. The Tigers finished the season strong as they followed with a 1-0 shutout of Arkansas in the season finale on Oct. 27.

Jones' Late-Game Heroics Lift Tigers Past Kentucky

Perhaps there was no more memorable moment during the 2006 season than Jones' game-winning goal with three seconds remaining in regulation against the Kentucky Wildcats on Sept. 24. The Mandeville, La., native gave the Tigers their first SEC win of the season and first ever win against the Wildcats after collecting a 30-yard volley off the foot of freshman Katherine Lagow, splitting two Kentucky defenders at the top of the box and ripping a shot past All-American goalkeeper Anne Ogundele from 10 yards out for the 3-2 win. Jones' game-winner at the 89:57 mark of the second half was her fourth goal of the season and is the latest that the Tigers have ever scored in regulation in the 12-year history of the program.

Tigers Attract Near Record Crowd Against No. 14 Texas

The new era of LSU soccer under the direction of head coach Brian Lee has resulted in record turnouts at the LSU Soccer Complex in each of the last two seasons. The Tigers played in front of four of the top 10 crowds in stadium history a year ago, including a season-high 1,669 fans who "Crammed the Complex" when LSU played host to the 14th-ranked Texas Longhorns on Sept. 14. This nearly set an all-time attendance record in the 11-year existence of the facility as the current record of 1,689 was set on Sept. 30, 2005, when the Tigers welcomed SEC Western Division rival Ole Miss to Baton Rouge.

Makasini Makes Her Mark in LSU Record Books

In 2006, freshman midfielder Michelle Makasini cemented her place as the most decorated freshman in the history of LSU soccer as she tied the team's freshman scoring record previously set by former standout Stacy Bishop during the 2003 season. She helped fuel the Tigers' offensive onslaught by finishing the season as the second-leading scorer in the SEC with 11 goals and tying Bishop's LSU freshman record of 29 points. In addition, Makasini was tied for third in the conference with a total of seven assists, while she proved to be a constant threat to opposing goalkeepers by leading the league with 87 total shots and 39 shots on goal. The Eules, Texas, native is poised to build on her freshman success as she will lead one of the SEC's top offensive units in 2007.

Jones Makes Smooth Transition to Front Line

After starting 17 games as an outside defender during her freshman season in 2005, Jones made a seamless transition to the forward position as a sophomore as she proved to be one of the top scoring threats in the SEC in 2006. She finished the season as the team's second-leading scorer with nine goals and 21 points en route to earning All-SEC recognition for the first time in her career. In addition, she led the team in conference action with six goals and 14 points in 11 league matches as she ranked third and fourth in the SEC, respectively, in both events. Jones displayed an uncanny ability to put shots on frame as she finished the season with 20 shots on goal in 37 shot attempts.

Super Sophomore Clarke Sees Season Cut Short with Knee Injury

Midfielder Melissa Clarke was well on her way to having a breakout year in 2006 when her sophomore season was cut short after suffering a torn lateral collateral ligament in her right knee late in the second half against Villanova on Sept. 10. Clarke, who was the team's only returning All-SEC performer from 2005, started the first six matches of the season and was the Tigers' second-leading scorer at the time of her injury with two goals and three assists for seven points. The Norcross, Ga., native is looking to rebound with a big season in 2007 as she was awarded a medical redshirt by the NCAA and will compete as a sophomore this fall. She competed this summer with Texas-based club team TSC Challenge as she is working her way back to 100 percent.

Potts, Makasini Earn All-America Honors

Freshman defender Chelsea Potts and Makasini made their mark on the LSU soccer program in just their first season playing Division I college soccer as they became the first Tigers in the 12-year history of the program to receive All-America honors following the 2006 campaign. Potts was named a Second-Team Freshman All-American by Soccer Buzz Magazine, while Makasini was awarded Fourth-Team Freshman All-America honors by the publication. In addition to their All-America recognition, the duo was also named to the Top Drawer Soccer All-Rookie Team for their outstanding play in 2006.

Pair of Tigers Earn All-SEC Recognition

As a result of their individual success during the 2006 season, both Jones and Potts received Second-Team All-SEC selections prior to the start of the SEC Tournament in November. The duo helped lead the Tigers to their first winning season since the 2003 campaign as they finished with a 9-8-3 overall record against one of the most difficult schedules in the country, while they also posted their most wins in conference play since 2000 with a 4-4-3 league mark. A total of 15 student-athletes have earned All-SEC recognition in the program's 12-year history with Jones and Potts joining that select group of Tigers. In addition, the Tigers have been represented on the All-SEC squad three years in a row and have had at least two selections in four of the last six years.

LSU's Sensational Freshmen Honored by SEC

Much was expected of LSU's freshman class during the 2006 season, which arrived on campus last fall as the seventh-ranked incoming class in the country according to Soccer Buzz Magazine. That group backed up its lofty ranking by leading the Tigers to their first winning season in three years and providing a solid foundation for the future success of the program. Not only did Potts and Makasini receive Freshman All-America honors for their outstanding play in 2006, but they were also honored by the SEC as they were named members of the SEC All-Freshman Team along with fellow rookie standout Malorie Rutledge. Each earned the start in all 20 matches a year ago and are poised for another big season in 2007.

Tigers Battle One of Nation's Toughest Schedules in 2006

The Tigers competed against perhaps the toughest schedule in the country in 2006 as eight opponents finished the regular season ranked among the Top 30 in the Ratings Percentage Index, including No. 11 Texas, No. 12 Florida, No. 19 Villanova, No. 20 SMU, No. 21 Navy, No. 22 Auburn, No. 24 Tennessee and No. 29 Vanderbilt. Each of these eight teams made an appearance in the NCAA Tournament along with the Kentucky Wildcats, which qualified automatically by winning the title at the SEC Tournament. National powers Notre Dame and Santa Clara were the only teams in the country to play more games against teams that finished the regular season in the Top 30 of the RPI with nine, while North Carolina, Marquette and Connecticut equaled the Tigers' effort with eight.

LSU Enjoys Best Season in SEC Play Since 2000

Not since the 2000 season had LSU enjoyed as much success in SEC play as it did a year ago, finishing the 2006 campaign with a 4-4-3 record in league play to give the Tigers a total of 15 points for the year. In 2000, they equaled their highest win total in the program's 12-year history with a 5-4 record as SEC teams only played nine conference games at the time. Despite not qualifying for one of the eight spots in the SEC Tournament, this also marked the first time since 2000 that the Tigers finished a season without a losing mark in league action. The Tigers have also won more SEC games in the last two years with seven than they have in any two-year period in team history.

Makasini Earns SEC Weekly Awards

In addition to her many postseason accolades, Makasini was honored with five SEC Athlete of the Week honors during her record-setting freshman season in 2006. She was named SEC Freshman of the Week a league leading four times, while she was also named the SEC Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 4 after scoring a total of four goals and recording one assist in wins over UL-Lafayette, Sam Houston State and Houston the previous week. Makasini was named SEC Freshman of the Week on Sept. 4, Sept. 18, Sept. 25 and Oct. 30. The Texan has already received more weekly SEC awards with five than any athlete in LSU soccer history.

Pollock Named to SEC Good Works Team

The Tigers' success was not limited to the playing field in 2006 as they were also heavily involved in community service with the Shaquille O'Neal CHAMPS/Life Skills Program. Junior Sara Pollock was awarded for her actions by being named to the 2006 SEC Soccer Good Works Team in October. Pollock served as Vice President on the Student-Athlete Advisory Council at LSU and contributed to many community service projects with the 4-H University Club. She also visited the pediatric ward at Our Lady of the Lake Regional Medical Center on many occasions, while also participating in last year's Halloween BOOzar on campus and the ALS Walk that raised money to help fight against Lou Gehrig's Disease.

Vanderpool Represents LSU in U-20 Women's World Cup

Defender Caroline Vanderpool was without question the most traveled Tiger in 2006 as she competed with the Under-20 Canadian National Team last summer at the 2006 FIFA U-20 Women's World Championships in Moscow, Russia. The Quebec native cracked the starting lineup as an outside back in each of Canada's three matches in pool play while not missing a single minute of action. She also saw action in a total of 12 international friendly matches at the U-20 level leading up to the World Championships in such countries as Brazil, Canada, Finland and Mexico. For her efforts, Vanderpool was given the Senior Excellence Award by the Soccer Federation of Quebec in December to recognize her as the premier soccer player in the province for 2006.

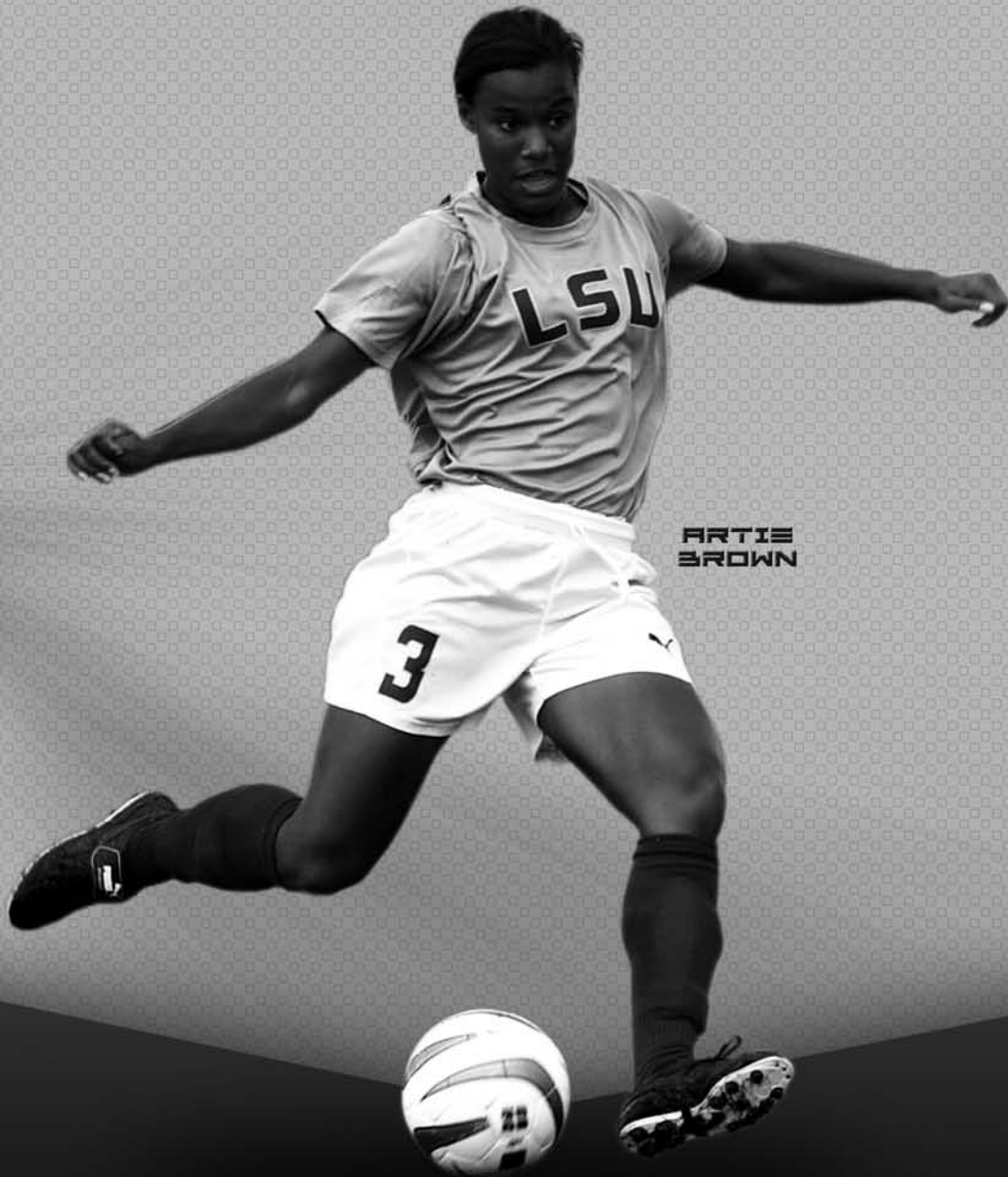
